## CONSTITUTION

OF THE NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION U. S. A. ADOPTED  
SEPT. 1895, AMENDED SEPT. 1916, AND FURTHER AMEND-  
ED 1926 & 1927 RESPECTIVELY

Whereas it is the sense of the Colored Baptists of the U. S. A. convened in the city of Atlanta, Ga., Sept. 28th, 1895, in the several organizations known as "The Baptist Foreign Mission Convention of America," hitherto engaged in mission work on the West Coast of Africa, and the National Baptist Convention of the U. S. A., which has sought to look after the Educational interest that the welfare of the Kingdom of God requires, that the several bodies above named should unite in one body; wherefore, we do now agree to adopt the following constitution:

### ARTICLE I.

This body shall be known and styled, "The National Baptist Convention of the United States of America" (and other Territories acceptable to this Convention).

### ARTICLE II.

The object of this Convention shall be to correlate and cooperate with the many Baptist State and District organizations, and other general Baptist bodies, in doing Missionary, Sunday School and Educational work, and to promote, foster and stimulate the publication and circulation of religious literature through our several Boards and Auxiliaries, as may be herein after named.

### ARTICLE III.

Section 1. The messengers of this Convention shall be representative: It shall be composed of Orthodox Missionary Baptist Churches, State Conventions, and General Associations.

Section 2. Churches shall be represented in the Convention by the payment into the treasury of the Convention the sum of ten (\$10) dollars, and shall be entitled to one (1) messenger therefor; and ten (\$10) dollars for each additional member representing said churches.

Section 3. State Conventions and General Associations shall be represented in the Convention upon the payment of fifty (\$50) dollars, and shall be entitled to five messengers.

Section 4. Any individual member of any regular Baptist Church, in good and regular standing, may become an annual member of the Convention, with full privileges, upon the payment of five (\$5) dollars into the treasury of the Convention.

Section 5. All moneys brought up to the Convention, for any phase of the denominational work, shall be paid into the treasury of the Convention, and appropriated by the Convention for said work to the several Boards of the Convention. During the time allotted for the sessions of the Convention, no Board shall be empowered to collect any money.

### ARTICLE IV.—Officers.

The officers of this Convention shall be a President, first and second Vice President, Corresponding Secretary, Recording Secretary, first, second, third and fourth Assistant Recording Secretaries, Statistical Secretary, Treasurer, a General Auditor, and a National Reporter,—all of whom shall be elected annually, and hold their offices until their successors are chosen. The President of each State Convention; Moderator of each General Association cooperating with this body, shall be associate vice presidents.

### ARTICLE V.—Duties of Officers.

Section 1. The President: The president of the Convention shall be the presiding officer; he shall sign all calls for regular or special meetings of the Convention, or for the meetings of the Executive Board. He shall sign all orders drawn by the Secretary on the Treasurer for the payment of the obligations of the Convention, shall appoint all committees, commissions, etc., not elected by the general body and, in the interest of the convention, may make such visits to states, territorial or district conventions and associations as, in his judgment, will best promote the interest of the work. He shall be also the Chairman of the Executive Board.

Sec. 2. Vice Pres. The vice pres. of the Convention, by the direction of the President, may sit as the presiding officer of any session of the Convention's annual meetings, or the meetings of the Executive Board, and, in the absence of the President shall, in order of their election, assume and perform all duties of the President. In case of the death, resignation, or any other cause of the vacation of the office of the President, the first vice president shall become president of the Convention for the unexpired term.

Section 3. Recording Secretary: The Recording Secretary shall keep a faithful record of all of the proceedings of the annual meetings, and shall compile and distribute the minutes of the annual proceedings, and shall see that the minutes are sent to all members, whether they be representative or annual. He shall prepare and distribute the enrollment blanks, cards, etc., to enroll the members, shall draw all drafts on the treasurer, to be countersigned by the President. He shall keep all such proceedings together with the proceedings of the Executive (Board) meeting in a well bound book, and report the same at each annual session.

Section 4. Assistant Secretaries: The first assistant Secretary shall be the assistant to the Recording Secretary in making the records of the sessions of the annual meetings, or the meetings of the Executive Board; and shall render whatever service, being advisable, under the directions of the Recording Secretary, in compiling and preparing minutes for publications and distribution. The second assistant Secretary shall be the stated permanent secretary of the committee on credentials; he shall require the presentation of the properly authenticated and sign credentials by any messenger or representative seeking enrollment in the Convention; he shall make, or cause to be made, a true and proper record of the same, compile the enrollment, make report to the Convention and prepare his report for publication in the minutes. He shall work under the direction of the Recording Secretary.

The third assistant Secretary shall be the stated permanent secretary of the Committee on Finance. He shall keep a correct and intelli-

gent record of all moneys received from the enrollment or representation or any other source. He shall enter, or cause to be entered, in a suitable book of record, all data of the Financial Committee, shall compile his reports, read them to the Convention, and prepare them for publication in the minutes. All his duties shall be under the direction of the Recording Secretary.

The fourth assistant Secretary shall be the stated permanent secretary of the Committee of Accounts and Business. He shall keep permanent records of all the transactions of the committee. He shall secure from any and every source all the bills and obligations of the Convention, these shall be submit to the committee for auditing and verification, upon whose endorsement he shall submit the whole to the Convention or the Executive Board, with whatever recommendations as may be made by the Convention. The reports of the Secretary of this committee shall form the guide for the Convention and the Executive Board in the allowing and disbursing of all finances, and in discharging of all the Convention's obligations. The work of this officer shall be done under the direction or oversight of the Recording Secretary.

The Corresponding Secretary shall be the corresponding officer of the Convention. He shall, under the direction of the President, issue all calls for meetings for the Convention and the Executive Board, special or regular, and shall publish, or cause to be published all notices and announcements, etc., and shall receive and direct the whole of the correspondence of the Convention. He shall keep a full record of the same and report the whole of the activities of his office to the Convention at its annual meetings.

The President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, with the Chairman and corresponding Secretaries of the several Boards, shall constitute a committee of management, which shall have charge and direction of any and all matters arising in emergency between the meetings of the Executive Board.

Section 5. Treasurer: The Treasurer shall receive all moneys brought up to or collected at the annual meeting of the Convention, and shall, by order of the Convention, turn over the same to the Treasurer of the different Boards in accordance with the objects for which the moneys were brought up to the Convention, at the Convention.

The Convention shall say how all undesignated funds shall be used.

The Treasurer of the Convention shall make an annual report to the Convention of all moneys paid out by him, to whom, for what, and the amounts turned over to the Treasurer of the Boards, and shall receipt the finance committee and any messenger for all moneys turned over to him, and shall accept or take receipts, vouchers, cancelled checks, or other evidences to show money paid out, and keep his account in a well bound book.

Section 6. Statistical Secretary: The Statistical Secretary of the Convention shall, together with the Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary of each of the Boards of the Convention, gather the statistics of the denomination from year to year, and expect to make them as full as possible, the same may be printed in pamphlet form for distribution and information.

Section 7. The General Auditor of the Convention shall audit the accounts of the Convention, and shall pass upon the accounts of each of the auditors of the several boards. He shall make a report of his findings at each annual session of the Convention. Each auditor of the several boards shall make such reports to the General Auditor as

may be designated by the by-laws of the Convention and the by-laws of the several boards.

#### ARTICLE VI.—The Boards.

Section 1. The Convention shall elect at each annual meeting a Foreign Mission, Home Mission, Educational, B. Y. P. U., Publishing, Evangelical, Extension, Benefit Boards and Layman's League, and the Women's Auxiliary will also be a part of this Convention. The Boards shall continue in office until the next annual election, or until their successors are elected.

Section 2. The Board shall consist of one member from each state or territorial convention, represented in or cooperating with this convention.

Section 3. The members of these Boards shall be nominated by the messengers from the several states and territorial conventions and confirmed by this body. This general Board may be divided into two separate Boards to be known as the general advisory Board and the Board of Management.

Section 4. Each Board of Management shall have a Chairman, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and Treasurer. The Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer may be one and the same person. The duties of each board may be regulated by by-laws adopted by the Board and by-laws made and accepted by the Convention. The Recording Secretary of each Board shall keep a faithful record of all the meetings of the Board and of the Executive Committee of the Board. The treasurer of each Board shall receive and disburse all money of the Board. He shall keep a record of all money received and disbursed. He shall hold all deeds, bequests or other property of the Board. His books shall be open for inspection to any member of the Board. No money shall be paid out except by order of the Board from whose treasure it is to be drawn.

The Corresponding Secretary of each Board shall conduct the correspondence of the Board of which he is Secretary. He shall have general management of the work of the Board, but shall be subject to such by-laws as the Board may think best for the management of its work.

The officers of each Board, together with such members as may be designated by the by-laws, shall constitute the Board of Management to transact the business of the Board. The headquarters of each Board shall be conveniently located so that the Executive Committee may have monthly meetings, or meet more often when necessary. The Board of Management shall consist of not less than five members and shall hold quarterly meetings and shall have power to make such rules and regulations for the management of its business and its officers as they may think best. To each Board shall be committed during the recess of the Convention, the entire management of all the affairs relating to the objects with whose interest it shall be charged, all of which management shall be in strict accordance with the constitutional provision and by-laws made by the Board and adopted by the Convention.

Each Board shall have power to make such compensation to its officers and employees as its by-laws and regulations may specify, or as the Board of Management in its judgment think best. Each Board shall make an annual report to the Convention of all missionary, educational, publication and other work done by them during the year, together with the receipts and disbursements of all money.

#### ARTICLE VII.—Qualifications.

All agents, missionaries, district, field, and corresponding secretaries employed by the Board of the Convention must be members of some regular Baptist Church in union with the churches composing this Convention. They must, previous to their appointment, furnish satisfactory evidence of genuine piety, fervent zeal in the Master's cause, and talents which fit them for the service for which they are to be employed.

#### ARTICLE VIII.—Annual Meetings.

The Convention shall hold meetings on Wednesday before the second Lord's Day in September of each year, at such place as may be determined (by the vote of the Convention). But should anything occur to prevent the meeting at the time and place appointed, the Executive Board may arrange the time and place and publish the same to the denomination.

#### ARTICLE IX.—Executive Board of the Convention.

Section 1. The General Executive Board of the National Baptist Convention shall consist of all the elected officers of the convention, the Corresponding Secretaries and Chairman of each of the Boards of the Convention, together with the Associate Vice Presidents elected according to Article Four (4) of the Constitution.

Section 2. The General Executive Board shall have an Executive Board of Management, which shall consist of the President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, and Treasurer, elected at the annual meeting, and the Secretary and Chairman of each of the Boards. The Executive Board of Management shall meet at such time and place as it may be called by the president of the convention, or as it may be designated by the by-laws.

#### ARTICLE X.—Railroad Commission.

In order that there might be secured the most reasonable and advantageous transportation or other ministerial courtesies due from the railroads, there shall be organized a commission to be known as "THE RAILROAD COMMISSION," which shall consist of five members elected by the Convention, who shall have in its charge all those matters of transportation, transit and travel as will best suit the interest and convenience of the constituents of the National Baptist Convention. This commission at the order of the convention shall submit full and complete reports of its activities and transactions to the convention. Upon the organization of such commission or agency its personnel shall be filed with the several Clergy bureaus of the country.

#### ARTICLE XI.

All officers of this convention shall be honorary, and no money shall be paid for any service rendered that has not been ordered or approved by the convention.

#### ARTICLE XII.—Amendments.

This constitution may be altered or amended at any regular meeting of the convention by a two-thirds vote of the members present, provided the proposed alteration or amendment is presented on the first day and voted upon the last day of the session.

Any rule or by-law not in harmony with the foregoing constitution is hereby annulled.

**MINUTES OF THE NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION  
IN SESSION SEPTEMBER 5, 1928, AT SHREVE-  
PORT, LOUISIANA**

**WEDNESDAY MORNING SESSION**

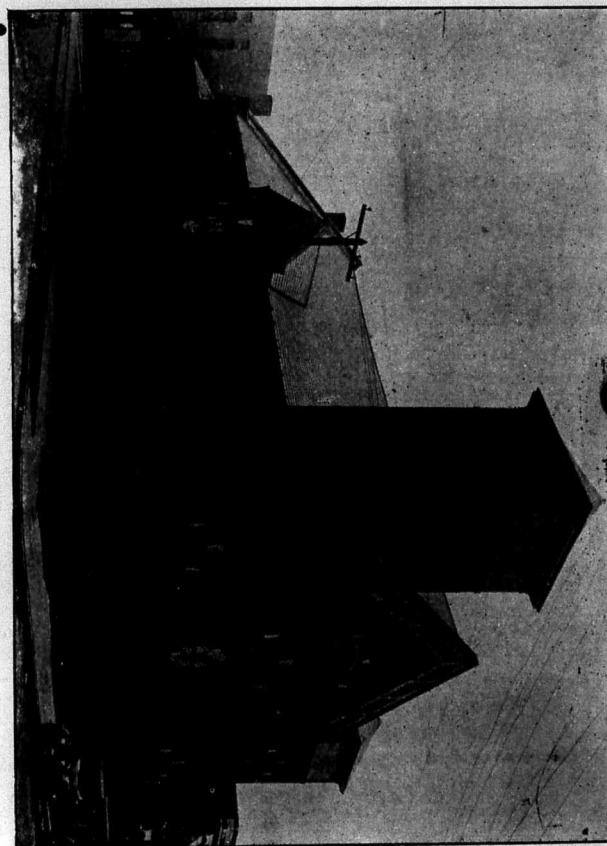
The Forty-eighth Session of the National Baptist Convention assembled in the auditorium of the State Fair Park under the auspices of the Galilee Baptist Church, Dr. E. S. Stills, pastor at 10:00 a. m., with Dr. G. C. Coleman of California, presiding.

Prof. H. B. P. Johnson conducted a very inspiring song service after which Dr. J. H. Wrenn of Alabama read the 23rd Psalm and prayer was offered by Dr. J. P. Reeder of South Carolina. The chorus sang, "A little talk with Jesus makes it right." Dr. Reeder lined and the convention sang "Amazing Grace."

Vice-President Coleman presented President Wood, who spoke briefly to the Convention saying that it was a joy to hear Dr. Reeder express a desire for the Holy Spirit to rule or dictate the course of our deliberations. The President said that he also hoped it was the desire of the membership of the Convention to have the Holy Ghost direct the work of the kingdom and let the Lord do big things through us.

The President then announced the Introductory Sermon would be preached at this hour. Dr. M. Sears, Alabama, read Prov. 29:1-12 for Scripture lesson. The chorus sang, "Let your light shine over the world." Dr. Sears then in a pleasing manner introduced Dr. G. L. Prince of Denver, Colorado to deliver the sermon of the hour. It was Dr. Prince's church that entertained the Convention in 1927. Dr. Prince brought greetings from his church to the Convention and said that the reaction upon his people was most favorably effective. He chose for a text, Prov. 29:18 and Hos. 4:6, "Where there is no vision, the people perish." Subject, "Perishing for Lack of Knowledge." Among the many things the speaker said was that colleges and universities do not make men. Men must be in direct communication with God if they would be great. Intellect is one thing and spirituality is altogether another. This Convention is one of the greatest representative forces of the earth. This conclusion is the result of observation made at the World Alliance at Toronto, in June. The world is

watching actions here today said the speaker. If our program is not different from that of the other brethren then a committee should be appointed to meet a similar one from them and seek union with them, but not so, for this group believes in the majority rule and not the dictation of an incorporated minority, and we also believe in racial possibilities, declared the speaker. The speaker paid a glowing tribute of respect to the sainted Dr. R. H. Boyd.

A solo, "I've been 'buked and scorned, children," sung by Miss Beatrice Foster, Shreveport, Louisiana.

A very fervent prayer was offered by Dr. Sears.

Collection taken amounted to \$124.53. The meeting was adjourned for dinner.

#### WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON.

At 2:00 o'clock the President called the Convention to order. Rev. P. D. Dennis of Kentucky and Rev. John Jackson of Ohio, J. I. Saunders, Indiana, being absent, Rev. J. E. Givens, of New York and Cr E. Evans of Mississippi, were asked to conduct devotionals. The National Chorus led in singing "Bye and bye when the morning comes." Dr. Givens read the 17th chapter of John. The chorister asked all to join in singing, "Am I a Soldier of the Cross?" Dr. C. N. Wise of Mississippi led in prayer.

The chorus sang, "Christian Hold Your Light." A communication from Dr. Charles W. Lewis, Assistant Secretary, Indiana was read and a motion passed to receive it.

A motion prevailed that Dr. M. L. Porter be elected to fill the unexpired term of Dr. Lewis. The journal of the morning session was read and adopted with minor corrections. Dr. S. S. Jones offered an amendment to the effect that the Convention meet with the Laymen movement to aid in perfecting a permanent organization.

The program was read and adopted.

Vice President Coleman presented Dr. J. E. Wood, President of the Convention, who proceeded to deliver his Annual Address. Dr. M. E. Robinson, of Texas, presiding. The President without preliminaries entered immediately into the delivery of a masterly address. He said that the only honor he asked was that he be allowed to do the will of the Master. He paid a fine tribute to the West in general and Denver in particular for the splendid reception given the delegates in the 1927 session. The greatest man in the world is the gospel



preacher, the speaker said. There is no possibility of union among Baptists without the spirit of equality of cooperation.

At the conclusion of the address, Dr. I. M. Hendon, Indiana moved the document to be received and the recommendations be referred to the proper committee. The motion was seconded by Dr. C. H. Clark and others. The motion was adopted. Dr. S. S. Jones made a motion that the rules be suspended and Dr. J. E. Wood be elected to succeed himself. The motion was seconded and adopted. (See President's address.)

The meeting adjourned.

#### WEDNESDAY EVENING SESSION.

At 7:30 the National Chorus having rendered several selections, Dr. E. S. Stills introduced Rev. J. H. Fobbs as Master of Ceremonies.

The master of ceremonies entered upon the rendition of the local program by calling upon Rev. S. W. Jackson to read the Scripture. Rev. Jackson asked the audience to quote with him the Ten Commandments. Rev. J. H. Carter offered prayer. The chorus sang, "Praise ye the Lord."

Welcome address on behalf of the Galilee Baptist Church by pastor, Rev. E. S. Stills. A paper entitled, "The Object of Religion" by Miss Flora B. Coleman of Friendship Baptist Church. The chorus joined by the audience sang, "Every time I feel the Spirit I will pray."

Welcome address on behalf of the city by His Honor Mayor L. E. Thomas. The address was indeed heartening.

Selection by the Sons of Harmony.

Welcome on behalf of the Baptists of the State by Dr. W. M. Grimble, President of the State Convention of Louisiana. This was a masterpiece.

Welcome on behalf of the Protestants of the State by Dr. G. W. Copeland, pastor of C. M. E. Temple was eloquently delivered.

Solo entitled, "Christ is all" by Miss Mary Ross.

Welcome on behalf of the Fraternal organizations of the City and State by the Honorable G. C. Williams, Grand Master, Most Worshipful St. John's Grand Lodge, A. F. and A. M.

Welcome on behalf of the Medical Association by H. C. Tate, M. D.

Welcome on behalf of the professional and business men by Rev. J. S. Williams.

Welcome on behalf of the Educators by Prof. R. P. Player.

Response to all welcomes by Dr. D. E. Over of Baltimore, Md. Dr. Over in a most masterly way responded to all of these fine addresses and the splendid music.

By request of the Mayor the audience sang, "On Jordan's stormy banks I stand" after Dr. A. A. Gundy of Texas had sung, "Lift Him Up."

The benediction was given by Dr. Hulse of Kansas City.

#### THURSDAY MORNING SESSION.

President Wood called the meeting to order at 8:55 and in a brief way emphasized the importance of the Bible Lesson Hour, asking that twenty-five minutes be given to the lesson notwithstanding the lateness of the hour. Dr. Ernest Hall led in singing "In the Garden." Prayer was offered by Dr. H. Nutter of Kentucky. "Glory to His Name" was then sung, after which Dr. Hall asked the audience to read in concert the 17th chapter of Matthew. He used for his subject, "A Transfigured Life."

The journal was read and adopted with the following corrections: Initials of Dr. M. E. Robinson, M. L. Porter and C. W. Wise.

The Corresponding Secretary, Dr. S. S. Jones read the report of the Executive Board. The report was a very elaborate and informative one. (See report.) Dr. E. W. White of New Orleans discussed the report. In commenting upon the report he said he saw in the report, values which he feared many had not seen. Upon the proper consideration of the matter set forth therein depends the full recognition of our great Convention. Dr. White showed that Baptists did less than any other group of Christians.

Dr. J. W. Anderson, Oregon, spoke on "Missionary Evangelism." The Home Mission Board made its report through its Secretary, Dr. I. M. Hendon, Indiana. (See report.)

Dr. E. W. Bowen, Pennsylvania was introduced to the Convention and spoke of his fight against the odds in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania and introduced Mr. N. Rathblott, a Jewish millionaire who stated his intention of meeting this body annually hereafter.

The President instructed the delegation to pass out to the front for the purpose of having a group picture of the Convention made.

Benediction by Dr. J. P. Robinson, Arkansas.

## THURSDAY AFTERNOON SESSION.

The house was called to order at 2:30 by Vice President Hurse of Kansas City, Mo. Rev. J. L. Lewis of Kansas City and Rev. A. L. Rainey of Los Angeles, California, conducted devotionals by reading John 17th chapter. Prayer was offered by Rev. A. Lively of California. Rev. J. L. Lewis led in singing "I Shall not be Moved." Rev. E. Taylor of Oklahoma offered prayer.

Vice President Hurse called for the Evangelical Board. Rev. Hurse introduced Rev. Haywood who in turn introduced Rev. A. A. Banks, the Secretary to make the report. Dr. Wood complimented the report and asked that a good collection be taken for the Board. Rev. I. C. W. Shelton, Cincinnati, Ohio, sang, "Sing On." (See report.)

Committee on President's Annual Address: I. M. Hendon, E. W. White, R. W. Woullard, Ernest Hall, C. J. Smith, W. R. Paynes, W. C. Barnes.

A collection of \$35.88 was taken for the Evangelical Board. (See report.)

"Christians Hold Your Light," was sung by the Convention chorus. President Wood introduced Dr. J. H. Winn, Chairman of the Foreign Mission Board, who spoke briefly of the work and then introduced Dr. A. A. Graham, the Secretary of the Cooperative Lott Carey Convention.

Dr. Graham in the course of his remarks, stated that this compact was the only group of our race which is doing work among other races other than our own, India, Russia and Haiti having been beneficiaries of our efforts. In enumerating the various sums contributed during the year it was seen that the National Convention had given \$2166.55. A rally was taken to the amount of \$417.35 for the work. (See report.)

The chorus sang, "None but the Righteous Shall See God."

A communication from Spokane, Washington, endorsing Miss L. H. Gray's work in the west was read by the Secretary.

Attorney L. A. Koger of Baltimore was introduced to the Convention and spoke briefly of his connection with the Christian work in his home church and the National work.

The benediction was pronounced by Rev. W. H. Cannon, Texas.

## THURSDAY EVENING SESSION.

At 8 o'clock the National Chorus favored the audience with a selection entitled "We will understand it better by and by." In the absence of Rev. I. C. Smith, Texas, Rev. Mack Allen, President of the Oregon Convention was appointed to assist Rev. N. Nichols of Arkansas in conducting the devotionals. Rev. Allen read ten verses of the third chapter of 1 Timothy. Rev. Nichols offered a fervent prayer. The chorus sang "I'm Leaning on the Lord."

Dr. Gilmore (white) of Shreveport, spoke of Pine Sanitarium of this city and stated that the sanitarium is an institution for the treatment of tuberculosis among colored people exclusively.

The chorus sang, "A little talk with Jesus makes it right." Prayer by Rev. P. A. Prince, Chicago, Ill. "Lift Him Up," was sung by Dr. A. A. Gundy of Texas.

The President introduced Dr. R. B. Porter of Kansas City, who was programmed to preach at this hour. He chose 1 Timothy 3:16 as a text. Subject: "The Incarnation of Jesus Christ as the Son of God." The speaker said that Christianity is undergoing an acid test as never before. The man who stands and preaches the gospel has a question to reckon with which did not confront the fathers, hence the grave responsibility of the present day ministry. He declared that a man who has not Christ in his heart is likely to believe anything and said such a man is likely to disbelieve any truth. The speaker made a strong plea for implicit faith in the Old Book, notwithstanding the claim of modern scientists. Jesus Christ is God, Jesus Christ is a man. He is both human and divine.

Prayer was offered by Rev. W. M. Clark of Texas. A great sermon followed by a most fervent prayer kept the audience in wrapt attention. A selection entitled "I've got good religion down in my heart" was sung by the Tulane Chorus, New Orleans, La. The collection amounted to \$14.60.

The benediction was announced by Dr. J. W. Hurse of Kansas City, Mo.

## FRIDAY MORNING SESSION.

According to program Dr. E. T. Offutt of Kentucky and Dr. D. J. Hull of Tennessee, taught the Bible Lesson. Dr. Hull led in singing, "What a fellowship." Rev. William Smith, Louisiana, offered prayer. "The inspiration of the Holy Scriptures" was the subject most ably discussed by these brethren.

At the conclusion of the lesson the president appointed Rev. William Alexander of Kentucky and Rev. S. Wilkinson of Texas to conduct the devotional services. Rev. Alexander read the first Corinthians 15:22. "Am I a Soldier of the Cross" was sung by the Convention. Rev. Wilkinson offered prayer. "On Christ the Solid Rock I Stand" was sung.

The journal was read and adopted with the following corrections: The initials of Rev. H. Nutter and Rev. McAllen, President of the Oregon State Convention. Collection for Evangelism \$35.88 instead of \$11.60.

After much discussion as to whether the minutes should be sold or given away a motion prevailed that the minutes of last year be given out free of charge.

The President presented Prof. G. W. Williams, of Texas, who spoke representing the Laymen's League. Prof. Williams related the history of the movement and introduced Prof. W. H. Fuller of Austin, Texas, who made a very inspiring address. Prof. Fuller made a plea for the enlistment of men. He said the kingdom movement is a man's job.

Prof. A. W. Jackson of Rosenberg, Texas, spoke ten minutes on the subject, "What it Takes for Laymen to Win." The laymen must convince the ministry that the laymen's intention is to aid and not hinder the pastor.

Mr. L. Landers, Nashville, Tenn., spoke on the "Relationship of the Laymen to Denominational Enterprises." He said, the laymen should be educated in the duty of soul-saving. Duty at home is to precede duty abroad.

Attorney Koger of Baltimore, Md., was the next speaker.

Dr. S. S. Jones of Oklahoma was asked to speak for the Convention. He expressed his approval of the movement.

Dr. Over of Baltimore, Md., spoke on the movement. He said that the pastors are ready and anxious to give laymen every opportunity to cooperate with the kingdom program, but they are not ready to be dictated to.

Dr. S. A. Pleasant, Houston, Texas, was the next speaker for the Convention. He said that we are all anxious for the

cooperation of laymen, the pastor the key man in the movement.

Dr. C. H. Clark of Chicago, Ill., closed the discussion in a very fitting address. A collection of \$24.20 was taken.

"I Shall not be Moved" was sung by the chorus.

The President invited the visitors to come to the platform. "None but the righteous shall see God" was sung by the Convention chorus.

The President introduced Rev. Kilpatrick, Miss.; Rev. G. W. Mills of Shreveport; Rev. J. M. Hill of Shreveport; Rev. E. T. Powell of Shreveport; Rev. J. M. Martin, Presiding Elder A. M. E. Church, Shreveport; Dr. J. W. Bailey, Supt. of Evangelism, Texas; Dr. J. S. Clark, President Southern University, State College for Colored, Baton Rouge, La.

Dr. Martin gave \$1.00 for education, also did Dr. Powell. All of the visitors made pleasing remarks. Dr. Clark made a fine address in the defense of Louisiana's progress in education.

Dr. Bailey in his remarks said that he believed it was the providence of God that brought about the division among Baptists of America, for he fully appreciated the great good being done by each. He wished that the brethren of his convention could look upon this great body at work. Not even a gavel is needed by the President to guide the deliberations.

Dr. H. E. Wilson, Paris, Ky., was also introduced.

The committee on the recommendation of the President reported. The report was unanimously adopted. (See report.)

Dr. E. W. Bowen of Philadelphia was introduced and after stating why he took a stubborn stand in a hostile city, he introduced Mr. N. Rathblott, a Russian Jewish millionaire of Philadelphia, Pa., who spoke to the Convention. Mr. Rathblott said that years ago when he began dedicating his life to the hold of humanity he watched the religious side of life. He expressed his desire to help colored people in all endeavors for human uplift.

Dr. S. S. Jones made a motion that we begin considering the reports already submitted in their order. The motion was seconded and adopted.

A motion was made to adopt the report of the Corresponding Secretary. The motion was so amended that the report be printed in pamphlet form. It was adopted.

A motion prevailed to adopt the Home Mission Board's report. The President ruled it to be understood that the charter is in harmony with the Constitution of the Convention.

Benediction by Dr. G. C. Coleman.

## FRIDAY AFTERNOON SESSION.

The Convention was opened by chorus singing, "Sing On." Dr. D. H. King, Toledo, Ohio, read 91st Psalm and prayer was offered by Rev. W. H. Cannon, Texas. The chorus sang, "Lift Him Up."

A motion was made that that portion of the Evangelical Board's report which had been made be adopted and a committee be appointed to adjust the portion in controversy. Adopted.

The President conformed to the order of the day and introduced Dr. E. R. Carter, Ga., chairman, who without preliminaries introduced Dr. A. A. Lucas of Texas, Secretary to make report of the Trustee Board of the Seminary at Nashville, Tenn. At the conclusion of the report a rally was taken for the Seminary, amounting to \$1613.00. (See report and rallies.)

Committee on the adjustment of the Evangelical Board Controversy: S. S. Jones, S. A. Pleasant and J. H. Eason.

A motion prevailed to defer the election of officers to Saturday morning.

Benediction by Dr. G. F. C. Curry.

## FRIDAY EVENING SESSION.

The evening session began by the chorus singing "We're Leaning on the Lord." Rev. D. B. McDodona, Pensacola, Fla., offered prayer.

The President invited the President and officers of the Women's Auxiliary to take seats on the platform. The chorus sang "I Couldn't Hear Nobody Pray."

President Wood introduced Dr. J. P. Robinson, Little Rock, Ark., Chairman of the Publishing Board, who in turn introduced Rev. Henry Allen Boyd, Nashville, Tenn., the Secretary, who made the report for the Board. In his characteristic manner which distinguishes him as the foremost young man of his day, entered at once upon his interesting report. Dr. Boyd made one of the most brilliant speeches ever delivered to the Convention. (See report.)

A solo by Mrs. Beatrice Foster of Shreveport, entitled "I've been 'buked and scorned."

Mr. John Ford made a short address concerning the Tuberculosis Sanitarium at the Pines.

A quartet from DeQuincy rendered a splendid number.

The chorus of the Women's Auxiliary directed by Mrs. Lula

May Hulse rendered a pleasing number, "The love comes trickling down." Mr. N. Kathblott made a fine address after which Dr. P. A. Prince of Chicago in a very eloquent manner read the amounts contained in checks of donations given by Mr. Rothblott to the causes herein described: Home Missions Board \$25.00, Church Extension \$25.00, Convention \$25.00, Women's Auxiliary \$25.00, Education \$100.00.

## SATURDAY MORNING SESSION.

After singing, "Am I a Soldier of the Cross," Rev. A. M. Tison of Alexandria, La., offered the prayer. "Blessed Assurance" was sung after which Rev. C. W. Merriwether, San Antonio, Texas read Exodus 3:6 and entered upon the discus-

sion of the subject: "The Personality and Self-existence of God."

Dr. S. A. Pleasants, Houston, Texas spoke from the first chapter of John. He stressed the necessity of a consecrated ministry. He said that the life of a minister spoke louder than words.

President Wood led in singing, "What a Fellowship," and called Rev. G. W. F. Floyd, Indiana to lead in prayer.

A committee was appointed to work in conjunction with the finance committee in adjusting the financial report of the Educational Board: Dr. D. H. Rankins, Texas; J. W. Halcomb, Calif.; Rev. Collins, Fla.

The committee on the adjustment of the Evangelical Board made its report. A motion was made to adopt the report. The report was adopted. (See committee report.)

A communication from the Caddo Baptist Ass'n., Shreveport, La., extending greetings was read. A motion prevailed that we return greetings to these brethren. We acknowledge greetings with great pleasure. We trust you will soon see fit to join in fellowship with us at an early date.

A communication from Brother R. McCorkle of Mississippi, was read and referred to the financial committee. A similar letter came from Rev. E. Rodgers of New Mexico. A communication from E. Kelly, Cincinnati, Ohio, was also read.

Mr. J. A. Jackson, a representative of the Department of Commerce of the government was introduced and spoke upon the commercial phase of racial life.

A motion prevailed that a vote of thanks be extended the speaker for the message and that the document be printed in minutes. (See report.)

Dr. E. D. Solomon (white) Secretary of the Executive Board of Louisiana Baptist Convention brought greetings.

Dr. E. Hall, Ohio, read a resolution asking the Convention to endorse the Republican party. The resolution was adopted. (See resolution.)

Dr. W. C. Barnes, Texas, Chairman of the Church Extension Board presented Dr. W. M. Grimble, La., the secretary to make the report. An offering of \$43.76 was taken for the Board. (See report.)

Dr. Leonard, Dallas, Texas, Chairman of the Benefit Board was presented and called for the Florida Quartet to render a number. They sang, "We won't be troubled any more." Dr. Leonard presented Rev. R. B. Canady, Austin, Texas, Secretary to make the report. (See report.)

Benediction by Dr. D. J. Hull.

#### SATURDAY EVENING SESSION.

After making some preliminaries, President Wood appointed Rev. J. S. A. Trower to conduct devotionals. The chorus rendered a number entitled, "He is coming soon." Rev. W. A. Sykes of Houston, read seven verses of the 21st chapter of the Revelations. Rev. Trower, Texas offered prayer.

Miss Beatrice Lee of Muskogee sang a solo.

Dr. J. O. Derrick of Michigan sang, "Asleep on the Deep."

Solo by Miss Julia Mae Kennedy.

Clarinet solo by Mr. Pinkney, Columbia, S. C.

Miss Odessa Jones of Muskogee, Okla., sang a beautiful solo entitled "I do don't you."

Dr. J. W. Bowen of Pennsylvania, who was programmed to preach at this hour selected Matt. 13:39. "The harvest is the end of the world." Notwithstanding disadvantages confronting the speaker on Saturday night when the congregation is completely exhausted caught up his audience which enabled him to preach a great sermon.

Rev. J. C. Dunbar of South Carolina prayed a very fervent prayer.

By request Sister Julia Mae Kennedy sang, "Stand by me."

Rev. P. A. Prince, Chicago, explained how Miss Kennedy had forsaken secular singing to take up service in the church. A collection of \$12.10 was taken for Miss Kennedy.

"This Train" was sung by the Progressive Quartet of Florida.

Mr. James Streeter, a globe trotter spoke of his experiences on his novel endeavor. He was given \$7.77 to assist on his way.

#### SUNDAY MORNING SESSION.

Dr. A. A. Graham of D. C., Secretary of the Lott Carey Convention was introduced and made a very strong plea for Foreign Missions.

A solo was sung by Miss I. Williams of Cincinnati, Ohio, entitled, "I went down into the valley on my knees."

Dr. Jones of Oklahoma endorsed the plea of Dr. Graham and urged that every person present sacrifice the eat and drink of the day and give the equivalent in the collection.

The chorus rendered a selection entitled "The Lord is my Shepherd." Mrs. H. B. P. Johnson sang "I'm seeking for the Kingdom."

#### MONDAY MORNING SESSION.

At 8:45 the President appointed Rev. G. L. Lillard, Ind., and Rev. A. Johnson, Ala., to conduct the devotionals. Rev. Lillard read 13 verses of the 10th chapter of Romans. Rev. Johnson offered prayer. "Lead On" was sung.

The journal was read and adopted with the correction of \$631.03 instead of \$611.73 for Foreign Missions; the initial of Rev. H. Hunn. The St. John Baptist Church sent \$67.00 instead of \$67.48. Rev. Rodgers comes from New Mexico instead of Illinois.

The Railroad Commission made its report through Dr. C. H. Clark, Chicago. Dr. M. E. Robinson motioned to have the

Commission report to the committee to give the members an opportunity to get together the report.

"O when the war is over, we shall wear the crown" was sung by the audience.

Dr. S. A. Pleasant, Houston, Texas, was asked by the President to lead in prayer.

Dr. Prince and Dr. Lucas took charge of the Educational Rally. Collection was \$689.79.

Two verses of "Steal Away to Jesus" were sung.

The President led in singing, "What a Fellowship."

A motion prevailed that we dispense with the committee on time and place and the selection be made from the floor.

An offering of \$30.00 was taken for Dr. J. A. Sharpe, Texas.

The President presented Mrs. M. A. B. Fuller, President of the Woman's Auxiliary, who spoke a few words and presented Dr. E. S. Stills, entertaining pastor to talk to Women's Meeting. In the course of Dr. Stills' remarks he stated that he had been able to bring thirty-six churches to the Convention. A free will offering of \$11.23 was taken for Rev. Stills as a token of appreciation for his services.

A vote of thanks was extended to the Galilee Baptist Church, associate churches, citizens, newspapers and citizens in general for the hospitalities extended the Convention.

The following cities were placed in nomination for the next setting of the Convention. The nomination was closed by motion. Dr. M. E. Robinson, Texas spoke for Philadelphia, Pa.; Dr. Ira M. Hendon, Indiana, spoke for Cincinnati, Ohio and Cleveland, Ohio withdrew in favor of Philadelphia, Pa. Dr. C. P. Madison, Norfolk, Virginia, spoke in favor of Norfolk, Virginia; Dr. E. W. Bowen, Philadelphia, spoke for Philadelphia.

The vote was taken on Norfolk and Philadelphia. Philadelphia 247; Norfolk 270. The vote was made unanimous.

The committee on finance made its report. (See report.)

The educational Board submitted its roster of officers. It was approved.

The Educational Rally as it stood corrected was \$721.29.

The Evangelical Board's roster was reported.

The Church Extension Board's roster of officers was approved.

The Laymen's League made its report which was adopted.

The Benefit Board made its report of officers and the report was referred.

The Railroad Commission made its report. Much discussion arose as to the personnel and authority of the commission. The report was tabled.

A motion prevailed to reconsider the motion to table the report of the Railroad Commission.

On motion Dr. Clark motioned to adopt the report was adopted.

A motion prevailed to hold a Board meeting at 5 p. m.

A motion prevailed to adopt the resolution expression appreciation for the selection of one of our group by the National Republican Speaker's Bureau. Dr. E. Hall was the character named by the Bureau. (See report.)

#### MONDAY NIGHT SESSION.

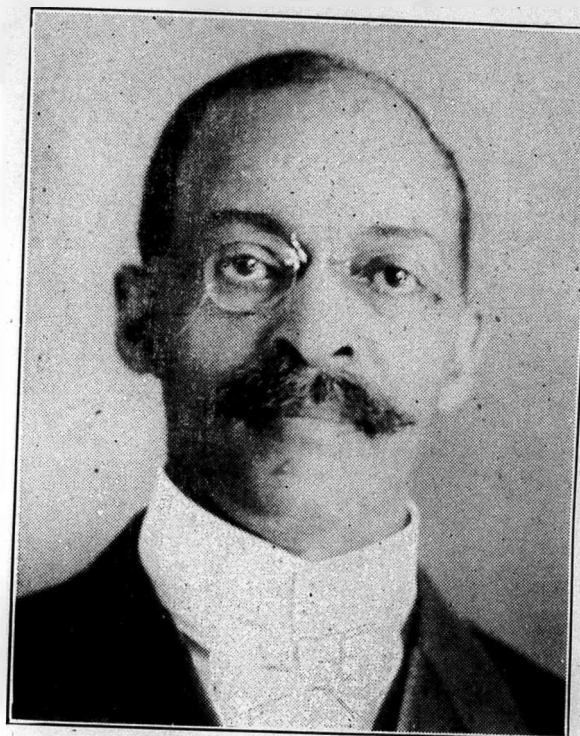
Devotionals were conducted by Rev. J. S. A. Tower of Texas.

## President's Address

ANNUAL ADDRESS OF J. EDMUND WOOD, D. D., PRESIDENT  
OF THE NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION OF AMERICA  
IN SESSION AT SHREVEPORT LA, SEPT. 5-10, 1928

### My Christian Friends:

This assemblage of the Lord's hosts presents a picture of beauty and sublimity which lend inspiration to the flinted rocks, cause the hills to clap their hands, and move the trees and flowers to shout for joy. I am rejoiced to greet in this gathering here the gospel herald who through the year flown by, has not ceased to sound the gospel bugle, to the passing multitudes, moving to the judgment; the college professor who has not slackened his task to mould the character of the youth that must make up the future citizenship of the nation; the professional man, the farmer, the mechanic, the laborer. They wear a wreath of love, unity, fraternity and equality, which pictures the common weal and the single purpose of the disciples of Jesus Christ who compose this convocation.

Before entering into a discussion of the matters vital to the life and progress of this Convention, and conducive to the success of this meeting, I pause to express to every messenger here assembled my sincere thanks for the loyalty and devotion with which you have supported the work. Looking back over the road we have come during the intervening months between the Denver meeting and this gathering, I am rejoiced when sweet memory brings to me the many kindnesses and courtesies with which my brethren and sisters have showered my pathway. We have traveled the country from the lakes to the gulf, visiting churches, associations and conventions in the states of Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Maryland, District of Columbia, Michigan, Missouri, Oklahoma, Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Tennessee, Florida, North Carolina, Colorado, Arkansas and the brethren where ever we have gone, have been sweet and cordial extending us the most generous hospitality. My thanks for these kindnesses can not be expressed in words. I would not be so egotistic as to regard these acts of kindness and brotherly love as honors to me personally but I know they were the deeds of love from hearts devoted to the work of the kingdom, who sought to honor the work and glorify God by entertaining His humble servant. In His name I express to you thanks.

We left Denver last September flushed with the triumphant victory, the most signal ever witnessed by an assemblage of Negro Baptists on this continent. The meeting so far West had caused many to doubt the ability of the Convention to carry a respectable following. But, all were agreeably surprised at the attendance of thousands. Forty-one ministers attended the meeting for the first time and twenty-eight were persons who formerly affiliated with the Incorporated Convention and one of these had been an officer of one of the boards of that Convention.

On every side the decorum, the personal, and the spiritual atmosphere surrounding the delegation were most highly commended.

The finances for all purposes surpassed all previous years. More money was raised for Home Missions, more cash was paid on the Theological Seminary debt, and more cash on the indebtedness of the Convention, than was paid in any previous year, of the forty-eight years of our existence. These achievements have not been won by the grumblers, the complainers and the fault-finders. Nor are they the achievements of any one person. But, thank God, there is a mighty host of twice born men, who in an unassuming, unswerving and faithful manner has "kayed by the stir" and put the program over. They may not be known for their much speaking and volubility; but their deeds have built a monument as high as the Himalayas, which shall keep their memory fresh, enshrined in the hearts of a grateful people while time shall last. I believe there is sufficient loyalty to Christ, sufficient loyalty to the work of this Convention, sufficient intelligence among its constituents, sufficient courage and self sacrifice to carry on the work begun till every foe is put to flight, and our educational work and mission work shall flourish as the Cedars of Lebanon.

There are certain virtues which must characterize every individual as well as every institution if he, or it, will live and bless society. Among these virtues may be mentioned honesty, courage, self-denial. It matters little what else one possesses, if he is wanting in these, he is a failure. This Convention has come through the storm. It has suffered the virulent attacks of supposed friends; and has stood the bombardments of avowed enemies; the old ship has, at times been allowed to drift into the shallows of doubts and skepticism; but there were safe and loyal sailors, aboard the ship, and the flag has never failed, nor the crew deserted the cargo.

#### Can Baptists Get Together?

No worthy union and co-operation among Negro Baptists can obtain so long as deception, hypocrisy and falsehood hide the hairy hand beneath the seductive smile of flattery, trickery and the siren's song. Men high in the councils of Baptist affairs have gone through the land proclaiming Baptist unity and calling for the Conventions to come together; while secretly they sow the briars and thistles of discord, and strife. They point to this organization as "splitters," "rebels," "heretics." The only terms of union they have ever offered is the terms the Master offers the slave; the sovereign offers the rebel. The have sung it to the Baptist world that this Convention does not exist; have pointed us out as a handful of the disgruntled. There can be no offer of terms co-operation till all Baptists are accorded absolute equality, and recognized as Christian brothers. Till then, we shall ever question the rights of Czars and Monarchs to prescribe the course we shall pursue. The intelligent religious world is awakening. Thoughtful Baptist leaders, and other thinking Christians are asking: "If the incorporated Baptists have the numbers, and the wealth and the wisdom and the piety, why it is that they raise annually less than half the money for Education and Home Missions raised by the Unincorporated Baptists, and why is it, that, of all the money they report as raised for Foreign Missions they send less to the Foreign Fields than their brethren send? Believing that the virtues before referred to—honesty, courage and self-sacrifice—form an armor bright, which no poisonous dart of the slanderer and traducer can penetrate, we meet the expounder of falsehood and misrepresentation in the arena of public opinion and refute

all of his false statements. We speak in the most kindly spirit; we gauge the battle by the eternal truths of God; we make the Bible our standard of brotherhood and the Golden Rule our code of ethics; and we appeal to Baptists everywhere to compare our accomplishments with others anywhere, and judge our right to the commendation of an intelligent public by what we have done.

And, yet, we come in no boastful spirit. We cry: "Not unto us; not unto us, but unto Thy name be all the glory." We are humiliated and hide our faces when we consider how great things He has done for us, and how little we have done for Him. I am mistaken in the spirit, the gratitude, the thankfulness of the persons who make up this Convention if we fail to put into the Lord's treasury at this meeting, the largest contribution we have ever made to the causes for which we stand. What God has wrought through us, should move every Baptist here to rise up and honor Him in his deeds.

We can not rejoice at the shortcomings of others; we can not measure our progress by others' failures; we must measure our gifts by God's blessings. How much shall we give since He has done so much for us? If each one here will measure his donation in this meeting by the Lord's favors to him, we shall have funds sufficient for all our causes.

#### The Baptist World Alliance.

This gathering of World Baptists from every nation met in Toronto, Canada, June 23 to 27, 1928. A very elaborate program was arranged and much information and inspiration were gained by those who attended its sessions. As President of this Convention we issued credentials to all persons desiring to attend the Toronto meeting. We heard that one person to whom credentials were issued was not registered under the credentials. We know several who were registered under them.

Your committee met the Executive Committee of the Alliance in King Edward's Hotel, Sunday afternoon, June 24, and presented evidence showing, we were a duly and regularly organized Baptist organization and under the constitution of the Alliance were entitled to membership in that body. There had been objections raised to our admittance and the matter was referred to a committee for final disposition.

In July we received the following letter from Dr. J. H. Rushbrooke, Secretary of the Alliance, dated July 21, 1928:

I write as General Secretary of the Baptist World Alliance to notify you formally that the Executive Committee has entrusted to a special Subcommittee, consisting of Dr. Gray, Dr. Maddrey, Dr. Abernathy, Dr. Van Ness and Dr. Scarborough, the responsibility of further investigating the question raised by your application for membership in the Baptist World Alliance. You are fully aware that this Committee is appointed in no unsympathetic spirit, but with the hope of finding an entirely satisfactory solution.

#### Our Boards.

The provisions in our constitution creating boards to look after certain definite phases of the work are the out-growth of the wisdom and judgment of the fathers. They felt if all the work of the denomination were vested in any one board many phases of the work would suffer. Therefore, they established an Educational Board to take charge of the educational work; a Home Mission Board to have charge of the mission work within the United States and her territories; a Foreign Mission Board to supervise the extension of the kingdom in foreign lands; the Evangelical Board to create and stimulate interest in soul saving throughout the world; a Church Extension Board to build churches and assist in building churches; to establish a loan fund for the purpose of helping struggling congregations to build church edifices and to pay off church building debts; a Benefit Board to provide a fund for worthy ministers in their hour of infirmity and old age; a Baptist Young People's Board to publish literature and establish societies for our young people, provide them with capable, competent lecturers who will instruct them in the doctrines, polity and history of the denomination; a Publishing Board to create and publish sound a helpful literature and disseminate Baptist sentiments among the nations. No one board is the Convention, but every board an integral part of the Convention. Every board owes the Convention something. It should be loyal to every phase of the Convention's work; it should show the spirit of harmony, and fellowship, and service to all. Then the Convention owes much to these boards. To manifest preference and a spirit of favoritism for certain boards is as a mother showing partiality toward a favorite child. It leads to jealousy and hate on the one hand and pride and arrogance on the other. It will be a sad day for this Convention when our boards begin to strive the one against the other; and to beat and devour one another. These boards were created to do a definite work in extending the kingdom. Love, pure and undimmed is necessary to the performance of that task. We may have talent, culture and refinement, but if we have not love; not only will we be unfit to help others, but our own enterprises will shrivel and perish. There is not a board in this Convention so powerful and resourceful that it can live on and grow great,

by taking the advantage of her sister boards. There is not a man in this Convention who can advance very far and endure very long who seeks to climb to prominence and honor through jealousy and spite and insincerity. Love is the only fair maiden that will lead to unfading glory, and she always leads by the way of the cross, down through the valley of humiliation and the dungeon of self-denial. Two brothers planted a wheat field, and harvested the wheat and gathered it in shocks. They divided the field and set an equal number of shocks on either side. That night in bed they began to think, each of the other. Said John, "brother Will has a wife and seven children to support. I have no one but myself. He needs more than I do. I shall go and take some of my wheat and put on his side of the field." Will was thinking in his bed and he said: "brother John has no wife and children to comfort him; he must be lonely and cheerless. I shall comfort him by taking some of my shocks and put them on his side of the field." So they both started at the same time to give his brother some of his shocks and they met on the dividing line each with an armful of bundles for his brother, and their neighbors erected a monument on the spot where they met and dedicated it to fraternal love. God gives us love which "vaunteth not itself;" "seeketh not her own," "heareth all things."

#### The Call To Duty.

Never before has such a challenge been made to the true followers of Jesus Christ. The world asks of the church: Show us that you have a better life program than is offered by other institutions—the fraternities, the Urban League, the industrial unions, politics, the sororities. Five thousand and five hundred students at Syracuse University have organized their own church. No university officers or persons connected with any outside church have anything to do with it. No prayers except silent prayers are offered in the services and they refuse to meet in any church house though several local congregations offered their edifices. They select their own preacher, usually a different one for each service and pay him by personal offerings lifted in the congregation. This action on the part of more than five thousand intelligent young men and women, emphasizes among other things the failure of our church worship to grip the soul of the sincere seeker for truth and the lack of a program to which the budding manhood and womanhood may look for a solution of our spiritual and social and civil problems. How long will the masses be held in a church when all which can be said of the services is the sermon was scholarly, the music was fine and the worship was orthodox? There are certain Baptist gatherings the only virtues of which they boast are their big crowds, their old stand-pat leadership and their ability to manipulate phrases so as to conceal their true character and disguise their intent and purpose.

We must give the people a program of purpose and achievements. We must give them more than a dead skeleton of theories and meaningless phrases. We must clothe these skeletons with flesh and blood and news of performances and breathe into them the breath of vital accomplishments till they shall stand upon their feet and live. If you have not faith enough in your own proposition to risk your money, and your reputation, and all your future in it, you are simply camp followers and may never be depended upon to fight the battles of the hosts.

The world cries to Christ's followers, tell us what your faith has accomplished? Has it made you happier and braver, and a greater burden

bearer and a better and more useful member of society? A National Convention or any other religious organization, is of little value unless it is known among men as a factor in winning men to the useful and helpful life and inspiring higher Christian ideals. To this cause are you called and to this task we must dedicate our all.

#### *Christian Citizenship.*

When the Great Teacher said, "Render unto Caesar the things which are Caesar's and unto God the things that are God's." He laid upon the believer in Jesus Christ the obligation of supporting good government, and maintaining a clean, wholesome administration of the law. While it is not my purpose to enter into a discussion of the political problems which claim the attention of our citizenship today; yet, the on-rushing tide of crime, lawlessness and disrespect for constituted authority which threaten to engulf the nation, demand that the alarm be sounded and that all Christian citizens who love the government founded by Washington, and for which Lincoln died, accused to arms to beat back the foe who would tear down our bulwark of liberty, destroy the citadel of the traditions of the fathers and drag into the mire of broken pledges and unkept promises the stars and stripes for which our fathers died.

My appeal to you is to study the problems which today agitate the nation, seek the wisdom which comes from above in choosing the course to pursue in this crisis, and when you are called upon to cast your vote, vote as you pray.

The preacher is not primary a politician. He is not a ward healer, a money grafter nor an office seeker. He is a Christian statesman, like Elijah warning the people against corruption which threatens a nation, or a Joseph who in Egypt paved the way to preserve life and peace in the years of famine, or a Daniel who saved Babylon against her own voluptuous living, pleasure seeking and blasphemy. Living the Christ life in the community—humility, kindness toward all men, peace, self-control and righteousness—will prove more powerful in winning favor and respect, than bayonets and rapid firing guns. We are going to win in this country by industry, honesty and helpful, useful living among our neighbors. "The fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace, long suffering, gentleness, goodness, faith, meekness, temperance: against such there is no law."

#### *In This Sign Conquer.*

In Jesus Christ, through Him and with Him this Convention shall win. I am not half so much concerned as to whether the rich, the learned, the vast numbers shall be with us as I am to know that the King of the heavens, the Ruler of nations is on our side. "It is better to trust in the Lord, than to put confidence in princes." If we have faith in Jesus Christ, as much as we have in farms, and oil wells, and banks and insurance companies, we shall win the day. "Not by might, nor power, but by My Spirit, saith the Lord Almighty."

I have seen the spread eagle orator sway the multitudes by a recital of our achievements in the world of commerce and finance. He lifted his hearers to heights of ecstasies when he told them of their holdings in homes and real estate, and factories and bank accounts. We live in the richest country in the world; and we as a race have made unparalleled progress since our emancipation.

I saw somewhere recently that we produce 40 per cent of the iron and steel of the world; 30 per cent of the world's wheat supply; 40 per cent of the silver; 50 per cent of the zinc; 52 per cent of the coal; 60 per cent of the aluminum; 80 per cent of the copper; 60 per cent of the cotton; 75 per cent of the corn; and 85 per cent of the world's supply of automobiles. America stands at the head in her production of wealth; how does she stand in the production of treasures in heaven? If you and I are unwilling to consecrate our holdings to the Lord to be used to redeem and bring back to Him a wayward and sin polluted world, failure, vanity of vanities will be the suitable epitaph for our sepulchre.

I would close my Bible today, and step down from the sacred rostrum, and never again lift my voice in defense of the cross, if I could believe that railroad stocks and government bonds, and Congress and the Supreme Court and the Constitution could save and perpetuate this United States. If this nation is to stand as the leader of nations, and perpetuate the principles of liberty, charity and fraternity it must be done in the name and spirit of the crucified Christ. In hoc signo vinces, is the battle cry of the army of the Lord and in His name we shall win the world.

I rejoice with all patriotic citizens in the achievements of the American people. I glory in the history of the Negro group. Like a golden thread running through the warp and woof of the nation's progress from Jamestown to the day when Perry pinned Old Glory on the North Pole, the Negro's part is interwoven with the nation's history. In industry, in education, in military service, in religious development he has been identified with the best traditions and service of the nation. We are told that he has been given to us to teach her religion. When I think of America's religion I am reminded of the country boy who went courting a city girl. He asked his mother how he might win this girl. His mother said to him you must seek to win her mother first. Speak complimentary of what you see and praise the acts of the mother. At dinner butter was served in individual dishes. The boy being reared on the farm had seen the butter served on large plates, so desiring to say something complimentary, he said: "This is mighty good butter what there is of it," and noticing from the expression on the faces of those at the table he had not said the proper thing, he amended his remark by saying, "and there is plenty of it such as it is." When I study America's religious program today I insist that there should be more of the New Testament religion and that it should be of a better brand. Let the light of love and loyalty to Jesus Christ burn in our soul till we are moved to bring our talent, our earthly goods, ourselves and lay them all on the altar to be used of Christ our King to bring the world under His rule.

#### *Recommendations.*

1.—I recommend that here and now red-blooded, upstanding Baptist men and women, rise up in this meeting and lay upon the tables money enough to wipe out the debt of our Theological Seminary on the property at Nashville. If this can not be done; then, I recommend that the debt be reduced to the minimum and the Board of Trustees advised to provide for carrying the remainder at a reduced rate of interest.

2.—I recommend that every board of the Convention, organize as soon as the new members are elected in this session; and hand to the Recording Secretary of the Convention the full list of members, including the newly elected officers of the board.

3.—Believing that the Theological Seminary should be kept before the public throughout the year, I recommend that the Trustees of that institution be called upon to consider the advisability of electing a President at a creditable salary who will devote his time to soliciting funds and advertising the school till such time as the school may be opened for classes.

4.—We recommend that the Foreign Mission Board investigate the status of the charter under which the board was organized, to ascertain if said charter is still in force and report its findings to the next session of the Convention.

5.—We recommend that one field man be placed on the field in the territory of this Convention to awaken interest in our Foreign Mission work, and that the churches be appealed to for a more liberal support of our foreign missionaries.

#### Conclusion.

We stand today midway the mountain slope. At the base below are thousands who started on the journey but have fallen by the wayside. In that, unsightly and discouraging multitude are the "I can'ts," the "I won'ts," we look ahead to the mountain top, and on its summit we see millions who pressed on in the race till they reached the goal. John Baptist, Paul, John of Patmos; Chrysostom, Huss and Savonarola; Carey, Judson and Livingston; George Lisle, John Jasper and Wm. J. Simmons; R. H. Boyd, C. T. Walker and L. Lee Campbell; and myriads of others forming a company which no man can number. They scaled this mountain height, won in the race and have taken their stations among the world's notables. They beckon us from their eminence. Shall we catch inspiration from the holy picture they form in the skies, and with renewed strength go forth to victory in the name of our Lord?



### ANNUAL REPORT OF THE SECRETARY OF THE NATIONAL BAPTIST PUBLISHING BOARD OF THE NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION OF AMERICA, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JULY 31, 1928.

*To the Chairman and Members of the National Baptist Publishing Board of the National Baptist Convention of America:*

Dear Christian Friends:

May I claim your indulgence and your patience while I submit to you this, the Thirty-second Annual Report of your Board, which embraces the work of the Board for the fiscal year that closed on the 31st of July? Knowing your deep interest and your abiding faith in the denomination as such, through its organized Boards' activities, and, knowing that the present religious work is a challenge to our day and generation, I am conscious of the fact that this work that we have endeavored to carry on has claimed the attention of a large and progressive group of religious workers.

I am to submit, and do submit herewith, not only the mechanical operation of the Plant, but the financial operation of the same. Time after time I have made a request to the denomination to pray for me while I endeavored to carry on to the glory of God and to the advancement of our denominational cause. I repeat this request in the outset of this Report, and I thank an All-wise Father for health and strength during the past year that I have enjoyed in a large measure.

We have been unusually fortunate in that we have been able to keep going. In spite of the many difficulties and the financial condition of the country, we are proud to be able to count our blessings one by one, so that as I face this magnificent presence and this august body, I do so knowing that I have the prayers of a host that we might call legions.

#### OUR EVER-INCREASING TASK

Thirty-two years ago the late Dr. R. H. Boyd saw the invisible when he organized this National Baptist Publish-

ing Board and established this printing plant in the city of Nashville. From the day it began its operation until the present, its one aim and purpose has been the extension of the Kingdom, the simplifying of the gospel and the disseminating of religious literature and tracts that would lift up the Christ; your humble servant knowing this to be the outstanding cause and the burning desire of his predecessor, not only in the Secretary's office, but the Board members who have gone on before were enamoured with the same burning zeal, have endeavored to carry on and to make this institution in its rendering incomparable service a pronounced success to every phase of our denominational work. No day has been too long, no night too dark for us to endeavor to answer the call of the denomination, and to measure up to the requirements, meet the needs and extend the service.

#### THE SECRETARY'S OFFICE

The Master said: "He that would be great among you, let him be your servant." You have honored me with the position as Secretary to fill the shoes of my lamented and distinguished father, but I have only partially filled the bill. He was a giant oak, he was a master thinker, he was a splendid organizer, he was a secretary worth the while; hence, in approaching this position that he filled so honorably and with such distinction, I have done so with fear and trembling, but I have endeavored to keep the office on a high standard, to be an executive that could be approached, thinking, working and acting always to the glory of God and for the advancement of the denomination. The office has been kept open every work day in the year. It is equipped as best it could be under conditions, and we have held ourselves ready and willing to go forward in the exercise of our duties with good will toward all and malice toward none.

Some new machinery has been added during the past fiscal year; for example, one Mergenthaler Linotype Machine at a cost of \$5000.00 was installed, to take the place of one that had seen its best days; one new Typewriter has been placed in the stenographic office; two new fireproof File Cabinets installed in the bookkeeping department, and one Graphotype Machine in the addressograph department.

The Board has authorized the secretary to purchase other needed machinery, but he has been very slow to en-

cumber the Board with debts or obligations without seeing his way clear to meet these responsibilities and obligations. What we have in the way of printing machinery which is being used continuously, is rendering valuable service. Much of this machinery was purchased some years ago, and it is doing what it was made to do. It functions in proportion as the operator is able to manipulate it. However, if business continues to improve, we promise with your permission to install a sufficient line of new and improved machinery in departments where necessary.

#### IMPROVEMENTS AND RENOVATIONS

Notwithstanding the financial depression that has been prevalent in the United States recently, or during the past year was felt by all big business firms, your Secretary has been able to make some improvements on your buildings. All of the buildings have been painted outside, the roofs repaired, down pipes and gutterings fixed, smoke stack painted and some repairs in carpentry, brick masonry and stone made.

The administration building got a new floor covering down stairs and papered throughout, so these improvements, these repairs and these renovations make it look like a new Institution. Hundreds of visitors took advantage either during their stay or passing through Nashville, to see and inspect the Plant. I am glad to state that this money spent in this work was good investment, even though it was at quite a sacrifice that it was spent.

#### OUR LITERATURE, BOOKS AND PUBLICATIONS

In keeping with the purpose and plan of the Publishing Board, it has continued, through its Plant, to publish, print, bind and send out a full line of religious literature, B. Y. P. U. and Organized Class supplies, church helps, etc. It has endeavored to disseminate the doctrine of the denomination and the gospel of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ through the printed pages, knowing all the while that the revenue direct from the sale of literature is small, due to the fact that when individual or schools send in their orders and do not pay for them, then we sustain a loss; or if they do not get their package and we are forced to duplicate the order, we sustain another loss; however, the supplies have been printed and circulated each quarter.

This past year has not been as good a year as we desired, because hundreds of Schools were forced to sustain

great losses; hence, your Secretary cannot report an increased circulation as a whole, but he is delighted to state that hundreds of churches that have not heretofore used your literature, are gradually coming in, and each quarter finds a list of new patrons accepting the service that your Board offers.

#### THE NATIONAL BAPTIST UNION-REVIEW

In spite of the tremendous cost and the big deficit incurred in publishing a religious, weekly newspaper, the National Baptist Publishing Board has continued to see to it that the National Baptist Union-Review is printed and mailed every week. A deficit of more than ten thousand dollars has been sustained this year, because the Union-Review has not been a paying proposition.

While we do not mean that a paper can run on subscriptions, yet if the pastor, the superintendent of the churches and schools would see to it that the members subscribed for and paid for the paper regularly, this deficit could be overcome.

The National Baptist Union-Review has been ably edited, it has been correctly printed, it has been mechanically held on a high standard. Dr. Jno. H. Frank, the editor, has been fearless in his editorial writings, courageous in his pronouncements, which have been at all times to defend the principles of the denomination and to espouse the cause of the Convention. The National Baptist Union-Review is carrying out a great mission.

#### THE BAPTIST YOUNG PEOPLE'S UNION DEPARTMENT

Your Board sensed the need of a Young People's Department operated from the headquarters here, espousing the principles of the New Testament Church and subject to the local church, and not independent. We have been compelled therefore, since you so requested it, to take the Baptist Young People's work over, in preparing and offering to them B. Y. P. U. literature. This has been done with clock-like regularity, and a B. Y. P. U. Constitution, modern, and in keeping with the ideas set out has been furnished and written. New object and Wall Charts have been made, two B. Y. P. U. magazines published regularly, viz., the Senior and the Junior magazines. Topic Cards, Pledge Cards, B. Y. P. U. Pins, paraphernalia of various kinds,

like pennants, arm bands, etc., are issued and can be had at headquarters.

We have stimulated enthusiasm which has worked for good in the B. Y. P. U.'s of America, and in connection therewith, we have given them place and a section in the Sunday schools. We would recommend however, that we be allowed to continue and elect some one as a field or editorial secretary for the B. Y. P. U. Department.

#### BUILDINGS AND THEIR PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

You are still occupying the same buildings located at Second Avenue North and Locust street, that you were occupying last year. We have not erected any new ones, we have not added any floor space to the old ones, but we have three two-story buildings, one three story building and three one-story buildings that house your Plant. Some of these buildings have been joined together, which improvement was done as a time-saver and to cut down the overhead so that passage from one building to the other can be made in bad weather without having to go out of doors. We would recommend, however, that our plans which you accepted several years ago, be carried out, and that some additions be made, as we are in need of more buildings and more space. We are crowded and our growing needs must be met.

#### OUR TERRITORY

We have not hesitated to find new territory and to reach out for new patrons and patronage. One State Convention voted unanimously since last year, to join the patrons of the National Baptist Publishing Board's Plant and to use their literature. Three Associations, with more than forty churches and B. Y. P. U.'s voted likewise, to use the literature printed by the National Baptist Publishing Board's Plant in Nashville. Scores of churches have followed this same example. We have expanded our territory. We are now supplying literature in states that never before were so thoroughly covered as they are today with the publications from the National Baptist Publishing Board's Plant. Not only is this true with the Sunday school literature, but with our denominational books and church helps.

#### OUR SWEET HOUR OF PRAYER

We feign no modesty, we ask no apology, we do not feel that we have transcended any laws of ethics when we say

that we have revered the memory of the late Dr. R. H. Boyd, the founder of the Plant, and to whom the Secretary points with pride, as his father. So much so that we have found increased interest in the Sweet Hour of Prayer. We hold the chapel services regularly. Dr. Boyd's picture is suspended over the rostrum, we revere his memory and honor his work, and we think one of the best ways to do it is to have interest created in the prayer services where the employees of the plant can serve God, the God of Dr. R. H. Boyd, under their own vine and fig tree. So these prayer services are being held and kept up with the most rigid regularity and punctuality.

#### THE PERSONNEL OF THE BOARD

There have been no changes made in the personnel of the National Baptist Publishing Board since we last met, and we submit to you the following members of the Board:

Rev. J. P. Robinson, pastor of the First Baptist Church of Little Rock, Ark., is the Chairman; Rev. G. B. Taylor, of Nashville, Tenn., pastor of the Second Baptist Church, is the Vice Chairman; Rev. H. A. Alfred, pastor of the Tabernacle Baptist Church, Nashville, Rev. E. R. Carter, pastor of the Friendship Baptist Church, Atlanta, Ga., Rev. H. M. Burns, pastor of the True Vine Baptist Church, Nashville, Rev. J. B. Ridley, pastor of the Mt. Olive Baptist Church, Nashville, Rev. J. L. Harding, pastor of the Third Avenue Baptist Church, Nashville, are members of the Board.

Your Secretary has untiringly had to act in the missionary capacity, and remain the secretary. We wish to compliment every member of the Board for the interest they have manifested in the denominational work as fostered by this National Baptist Publishing Board.

#### GROUP INSURANCE

Nothing has proven so helpful in generating personal interest in the Plant as the group insurance policy that your Board has given to each employee and Board member. While it is a new departure, and is almost unknown among institutions operated by our group, it is a great contribution, it is a beautiful spirit and a worthy effort, showing the attitude of your Board in desiring to render personal service to these employees by this insurance feature.

There were three deaths this year, one in the person of the General Foreman, Mr. L. S. Gray, whose widow was paid the one thousand dollars as a result of his death. Mr. John Clark and Mr. Dave Davidson whose beneficiaries also received this amount. We recommend a continuance of this group feature for another year.

#### THE BUSINESS OF 1928

In submitting herewith, a tabulated report of the combined circulation of Periodicals and Publications issued by your Board in the past fiscal year, it is done merely as information to you. We predict that the new slogan, "A Piece of Baptist Literature in Every Baptist Home", will materially increase the circulation.

## THE CERTIFIED ACCOUNTANT

In keeping with the established rule of your Board, your secretary has authorized the Homer K. Jones, Certified Accountants, to continue as Certified Accountants to go over the books and audit the Plant, which audit is accepted by the biggest banks and trust companies of this city. In addition to this, the auditor of the National Baptist Convention was engaged by your secretary to audit the books for the year, and his statement is a part of this report.

## APPRAISAL

The Plant has been appraised as usual by the Llyod Appraisal Bureau of Chicago. They are the recognized Appraisers of printing plants, factories and large institutions. We are pleased to state that they have made their report, and the auditor's and certified accountants' statements of the condition of the plant is in the possession of the secretary, and is a part of his records.

## OUR LESSON COMMITTEE

One of the most important departments of the National Baptist Publishing Board is the Lesson Committee. This committee heads up in the Editorial Department, and is composed of men aside from the Secretary who have been selected because of their outstanding ability in the literary world, as theologians and business men. The committee is composed of Rev. D. J. Hull, A. M., D. D., Editorial Secretary, Nashville, Tennessee; Rev. Ernest Hall, A. M., D. D., Cleveland, Ohio; Rev. E. R. Carter, A. M., D. D., Atlanta, Georgia; Rev. A. A. Graham, D. D., Phoebus, Virginia; Rev. David E. Over, D. D., Baltimore, Maryland, and Henry Allen Boyd, Nashville, Tennessee. It is the duty of the Lesson Committee to carefully select the texts and scriptural matter for the lesson for each quarter. The matter from the International Lesson Committee goes first to our Committee to be approved, so that if it contains anything not strictly and purely Baptist and not in keeping with the doctrines of our denomination it can be corrected, or if there happens to be any extraneous matter in any of the subjects sent out by the International Committee, it can be made adaptable for our denomination or omitted altogether. The Lesson Committee has functioned admirably in the past, and we predict that in the not far distant future they will evolve a greater service for the entire denomina-

tion, as they are constantly making improvements that have proved helpful throughout. We, therefore, recommend the retention of the Lesson Committee by your Board.

#### EDITORIAL DEPARTMENT

Subdivisions: Teacher Training Department, Correspondence Course Department

While it may sound unusual to have a triple feature in the Editorial Department, we have felt it necessary and in keeping with strict economy to blend these three in one. We realize the financial stringency that is always apparent, and because of this the Editorial Secretary has been placed at the head of these three departments, which have been blended into one and called the Editorial Department. The work, however, has been so allotted that that of the Teacher Training devolves upon Dr. J. A. Sharpe, and that of the Correspondence Course Department on Dr. D. J. Hull.

We shall first deal with the Editorial Department proper. The Editorial Secretary and work is directly concerned with the Sunday school periodicals and denominational helps. It has directed its energy toward meeting the demand made upon it by growing constituents to be found in the Sunday schools, B. Y. P. U.'s, Organized Classes and various Auxiliaries that have been constantly becoming a part of the Sunday school; such as, the Boy Cadet Movement, the Campfire Girls, etc. They have succeeded this year in placing the manuscript for these periodicals in the hands of the printers so thoroughly written, well edited and literarily correct that no unnecessary delay has been created that would hinder the periodicals from being placed on the shelves in time for mailing. The Department closely guards the every interest of the denomination. So far as the periodicals are concerned, it has not allowed itself to deal in matters that would cause the slightest questioning from a denominational point of view. The whole plan and purpose of the Editorial Secretary's office with its large number of contributors, therefore, has been to indoctrinate the patrons of the National Baptist Publishing Board into the fundamentals of our religious work in literature from a Biblical standpoint. We take pardonable pride without making comparisons odious in saying the Editorial Department has been maintained in such a way that will compare favorably with that of any denomination issuing a series of religious literature. We have thought that it was not

conducive to the best interest of our fast-growing denomination to attempt to issue any Sunday school literature except that of the International Series. This conclusion was reached after a careful investigation and sober deliberation on the part of the Lesson Committee. It was their recommendation handed to this department through the Secretary of the Board that enabled us to arrive at this conclusion, and to continue what we term a safe and sane policy, which we feel will meet the hearty approval of the constituents of the great National Baptist Convention of America.

We wish to deal with some of the periodicals that we prepare for our constituency.

1. "THE TEACHER" has maintained its position from a literary standpoint. Each quarter it has gone forth with articles of our best correspondents. These articles have been of a high order and have met the approval of our constituents throughout the length and breadth of the land. The editorials have been fresh, timely, suggestive and of a nature to arouse thought. The subjects treated have been vital. The references to the church and her activities along educational, and missionary lines, have touched the right strings, so that the sounds have been clear and unmistakable. The exchanges and poetry have been carefully selected for their didactic features. Nothing has gone in the TEACHER but what we at first carefully reviewed the same.

2. Following closely in the track of the "TEACHER" has been the "METOKA AND GALEDA MAGAZINE" designed for the Young people of the church. The MAGAZINE has maintained an editorial department, a contributing department, exchanges and poetry, selected with the same care as the matter contained in THE TEACHER. We are sure that the organized classes have an abundance of material if they take care of what they secure.

3. The "SENIOR QUARTERLY" has been utilized by the young people covering the ages of 18 to 20. The continued demand justifies the continuance of its issuance. It seems to meet a popular demand and the orders as they come from time to time justify the Board in issuing and arranging for improvements as rapidly as it is possible.

4. The "ADVANCED QUARTERLY" has retained its hold upon the forces who use it. It seems to me one of our popular periodicals. No complaint has been registered against it, and its usefulness is manifest.

5. The "INTERMEDIATE QUARTERLY" occupies an important place among our periodicals. The arrangement is good, with The Approach To The Lesson, The Lesson Explained, and What The Lesson Teaches. The various divisions compass the whole lesson. It occupies an important place among our periodicals.

6. The "JUNIOR QUARTERLY" seems to meet the approbation of all who use it. Where the teacher is active and resourceful the children will be better qualified for promotion. The children will like the idea of weekly research and by virtue thereof will become better acquainted with the Bible. The JUNIOR QUARTERLY meets a long felt need. The arrangement is simple, yet elaborate enough to be studied by older students.

7. The "PRIMARY QUARTERLY" with its simple arrangement and short lessons has become a fixture. It will be some time before any change will be demanded in the PRIMARY QUARTERLY. The Uniform system of lessons is followed and where the teacher studies the Sunday School Lesson Commentary, there is no reason why she should not tell a good story, and make interesting the lesson, that they might become interested in the whole subject.

8. The "BEGINNERS QUARTERLY" continues to fill its place acceptably. This as all the lower grade quarterlies, demands a complete teacher, one who will study to make the lesson story attractive and effective. Nowhere are competent, zealous, untiring and intelligent teachers needed more than in these lower grades, it is the season of acquiring knowledge, noting events, asking questions and beginning investigations. They must not be poorly taught.

9. The "JUNIOR AND SENIOR B. Y. P. U. MAGAZINES" are gotten out through the Editorial Department. Since the B. Y. P. U. MAGAZINES have been placed in the hands of the Editorial Department there has not been a quarter in which the magazines have failed to appear. The increase of orders, and the general approbation, are signs of a healthy sentiment with reference to these magazines.

#### TEACHER TRAINING DEPARTMENT

The work of Teacher Training has been on the heart and in the plan of your Board for a number of years, hence, we feel that the capital that has been necessary to employ a

Superintendent of the Department and to equip the Department for its proper functioning has been money well-spent. We believe that trained Teachers are a necessary adjunct to the growth of the Sunday School. We are conscious of the fact that the young people of today with their inquiring minds and their growing intelligence must be directed in the proper channels, not only on Sunday, but every day in the week. This can only be done in a religious way by trained teachers. Our Teacher Training Course offers these advantages and will bring about these necessary improvements. The Teacher Training Superintendent has traveled much. He has held Institutes in many States. Hundreds of certificates and diplomas have been issued by this Department, the greatest number of these was given out at the last session of the Sunday School Congress held at Louisville, Kentucky, where he was given one hour each day to lecture and to make ocular demonstrations of the Teacher Training work. Not only has the Board been able to maintain the headquarters and Teacher Training Department, but it has evolved a correspondence course for Teachers, thereby making it possible for the rural district Sunday School, the small town Sunday school Teacher as well as those remotely situated from the metropolitan centers where churches have every advantage to enjoy the modern methods. This Correspondence Course of the Teacher Training Department has received a great reception on the part of the denominational Sunday school forces, and there seems to be an unlimited future for it. Special books and literature have been prepared for the Correspondence Course, and we invite the Sunday schools of the Convention to accept this new form of service in the way of training Teachers that they may better themselves and improve the Teaching Corps in the several Sunday schools throughout the confines of the denomination.

#### OUR CORRESPONDENCE COURSE FOR MINISTERS AND RELIGIOUS WORKERS

Believing in the necessity and knowing the growing demand for an intelligent and enlightened ministry with better equipped religious workers, your Board recommended and adopted by your acceptance, a Correspondence Course for Ministers and religious workers. This department of the Editorial Secretary's office has been in operation for one year. The experiment has justified the approbation,

not from a monetary standpoint, for in that way it has not been paying, but from a denominational source, it has been satisfactory. Under a direct supervision of a Dean, four courses of study have been prepared. The course is offered to those who are not able to attend Seminaries and Theological Institutions to improve themselves, but remain at home and study the word of God. They are offered in this Correspondence Course, the following Courses: Biblical Introduction, Exegesis, Homiletics and Systematic Theology. The cost of this has been placed so low that it does not amount to five cents per day. When the Correspondence Course was announced, we felt that it would be at least two years before it could be thoroughly understood and generally accepted, but we were erroneous in such a conclusion, because hundreds of inquiries have poured into this Department and a large enrollment has already been a result therefrom. We predict that within the next twelve months there shall be such an enrollment and such a rush on the part of our ministers and religious workers taking advantage of this splendid opportunity to improve themselves that we shall have to add instructors to our corps of workers and find other quarters for it, because we will have outgrown our present quarters, which are even now inadequate. Simplified lessons for the beginners starting in the right way, teaching and guiding the pupil in a gentle yet positive way, so that she or he will at once grasp and appreciate these advantages has already been extended and has been specialized in.

#### SUNDAY SCHOOL MISSIONS

Struggling Sunday Schools scattered throughout the states, as well as Foreign Countries, are being helped from time to time. They, along with Associations, District and State, are being visited. That is the object of the Secretary of your Board, as he is very desirous of extending the service in a missionary way, such as organizing Sunday schools, reviving those that have been suspended, erecting organized classes and lending encouragement in every way. But the Secretary is not able to make every visit, hence, the Sunday School Missionary Department, with the Rev. S. J. Dixon as the Sunday School Missionary has been continued.

It is the hope of the Secretary to continue these activities and to make special effort in the Sunday School Missionary work, seeing to it that no Sunday school is without literature within the confines of this denomination.

## THE OFFICE SECRETARY

Unlike many Institutions, this Plant maintains no Executive Secretary and has no Assistant Secretary, but has prospered and functioned through the regular Secretary's office, assisted by an office secretary, whose duty it is to keep the Secretary well-informed on matters pertaining to the Plant, and to serve in the capacity of private secretary. This position is held by Miss Sadie Wilson who began her work in the Plant as a piece hand in the Book Binding Department. She has remained with the Institution, filling various positions, working in nearly every department of the Publishing House, receiving promotions because of efficiency until her present position was secured as office secretary. The letters and correspondence not taken care of by other Departments or Divisions come to the Secretary's desk and the office secretary immediately takes charge. She has supervision over the daily reports that are placed on the Secretary's desk each day, and keeps the Secretary advised by letter, wire or log distance phone, irrespective of in what part of the world he may be, on that day.

## BOOKKEEPING DEPARTMENT

The strength of the Institution lies in the Bookkeeping and Accounting Department, because the records are kept here. The cash is received here. The accounts, ledgers, cash books, tally sheets and all of the paraphernalia of the Bookkeeping Department are kept here. For the first time in the history of the Plant, the Bookkeeper happens to be a lady. While this is not an apologetic statement, we wish to say that the placing of the young lady in charge of the Bookkeeping Department was in the course and regular way of promotion. She was the senior when the bookkeeper resigned, and as recognition of her faithfulness and honest service, she was promoted. She is a Mrs. Zula Campfield. She has finished a thorough Bookkeeping Course from one of the largest Commercial Institutions. The work of the Department has not been lessened but rather increased, due to the fact that more and more improvement in the policy of Bookkeeping has been worked out by Homer K. Jones, certified accountant, as well as the auditor of the Convention, who has been employed each year by your Board, to audit the accounts. The work of the Bookkeeping Department might be less voluminous or burdensome if the Sunday

schools and individuals who send in their orders for books and supplies would always accompany their orders with cash or if check is sent, to see that it is certified. There is to be found in this Department, a battery of ledgers, six in number, that are absolutely necessary in keeping the records accurate. There will be found also a complete filing system, an index card system, as well as a system of tally sheets, enabling the Bookkeeper to give the number of each order received each day in the year, the amount the order contained, whether in stamps, post office money order, Bank check or cash, and at the same time enable the Department to tell the very day that this order arrived. Much other modern equipment necessary for bookkeeping and accounting is to be found here, such as an electric letter opener, because at seasons in the quarter more than a thousand letters come each day, and this electric letter opener is a time saver. It facilitates the opening of letters rapidly, and opens them in such a way that it prevents mutilating any orders, checks, stamps or cash. There is a Burroughs Adding Machine, one of the most modern types, a Monroe Calculating Machine, which adds, subtracts and multiplies, an Underwood Typewriter, a pair of latest improved mailing scales to weigh letters, a Check writer or Check Protector, recommended by the certified accountant, calculated to prevent the raising of checks and a Diebold Iron Safe, not to mention files, for all invoices, statements, receipts, letters, checks and notes, desks for stenographers and cashier and ledgers and journal for the entry of transactions. A force of young women in this department are assistants to the Bookkeeper and Cashier. The Bookkeeping Department, therefore, is always ready with its records to give the necessary information that the Secretary may call for from time to time, relative to the particular standing of the entire Plant. Regular statements and balance sheets as well as a tally record of receipts and disbursements are kept. Each check written emanates from this Department, and a notation on each check, showing what the check was issued for, is made. The Secretary has never written a check. His particular office being to sign the check when properly drawn up, after the necessary voucher has been approved.

## STENOGRAPHIC DEPARTMENT

Modern business methods and the present commercial operations have demanded in these improved times efficient

and competent groups of workers. This fact makes it necessary for your Board to maintain a Stenographic Department with a force of trained shorthand writers who can master this particular art and at the same time manipulate the various types of typewriting machines.

The Heads of every Division are allowed to dictate their letters and contracts, keeping up with such writings of their department as may be expected to be demanded. These stenographers are sent to the various departments from time to time. They keep a carbon copy of each letter written, and are expected to keep well informed on the commercial methods of dispatching their work. They take articles, sermons and edit manuscripts in connection with their regular duty of answering their correspondence.

#### FIRST CLASS MAILING DEPARTMENT

In order to handle the large number of orders that come to your Board by mail every quarter, there was created a First Class Mailing Department, whose duty it is to read every letter, calculate every order and make out the labels for these orders. This work is under the supervision of Mr. L. Landers, who is experienced and who has given a number of years to this particular kind of work. Not only are these incoming orders under his supervision, but the enquiry division, the lookup section and the addressograph and multigraph departments. The list of Sunday schools, the names and addresses of Sunday school superintendents or senders of orders are constantly changing, new post offices are being established. The head of the First Class Mailing Department must be well-versed on all these and must know whether the person has sent enough money, made out the order correctly and what they are entitled to for the money sent. A force of clerks is constantly and regularly employed in the First Class Mailing Department.

#### SECOND CLASS MAILING DEPARTMENT

After the literature has been prepared in manuscript form, printed, folded, trimmed, bound and delivered as finished stock, it goes to the Second Class Mailing Department to be counted out in various orders as requested by the thousands of Sunday Schools, wrapped and addressed. It must be distributed into the mailing bags by states. It must be weighed. Care must be exercised with each order. For instance, a Sunday school that will order one-half dozen or more of each periodical expects to get their order correctly and properly

filled, as well as promptly. Such is the work of the Second Class Mailing Department under the management of Mr. George P. Baker. Millions of copies of literature are sent out from this department each year to the post office. Millions of copies of the National Baptist Union-Review are mailed out from this Department each year. A complete list of copies mailed out is to be found in the Second Class Mailing Department. Not only is the Sunday school literature and the Union-Review counted, wrapped and sent out, but that of the B. Y. P. U. and Organized Classes as well. This has been a splendid year, and improvements better than any year in the past history have been witnessed. The Foreman of this Department declares that it has been the best since his connection, which reaches over seventeen years. The complaints have been less, due to the fact that a duplicate plan has been worked out that enables them to know exactly the clerk who counted out and dispatched each order. It enables them to keep a correct record of every order filled, and to give the exact hour in the day that each package was dispatched to the post office. Our dispatching system is so complete that the number of the order is placed upon a sheet and a carbon copy is made containing all of these facts and the date of the dispatch with its hour to the post office. The original carbon copy goes to the Secretary's office, the duplicate remaining in the Mailing Department. This obviates and makes impossible any guess work. By having such a system, we have been able to keep a carefully trained force of workmen on the job. Since our last report, we have developed two skilled workmen for this department. Every member of the force has had for their slogan, "A satisfied customer is one who receives his order properly filled, in good shape and on time," and they work to that end. During the past fiscal year, we have counted, wrapped and dispatched to the post office every order that has been received in this Department from the First Class Mailing Department.

#### OFFICE OF GENERAL FOREMAN.

The many Divisions and Departments of the Institution need a supervision and close executive management, consequently the Board has felt the need of maintaining and keeping what is known as a General Foreman.

It is the duty of the General foreman to recommend the purchase of all supplies, even to the machinery, to head up the safety council, to take care of complaints, making ad-

justments in so far as it is possible. When it is not possible these matters are referred to the Secretary. The General Foreman must meet practically every drummer, must make estimates on all jobs, and be prepared to keep the Plant abreast with the present time on the cost system idea. Mr. Joseph Boyd has been employed in the Plant for a number of years, coming up from the ranks as an assistant workman until he has reached his present position.

#### COMPOSING ROOM

Composition and makeup are the prime factors in the printing establishment, that is the hand type setting and paging on the stone, machine type worked into pages plus the cuts that become a part of the form—all of this is called imposition. This is one of the largest departments in the Publishing House. More money is tied up in the metal, cuts, type and other paraphernalia than will be found anywhere else. The Composing Room is under the management of Mr. Daniel Rufus Fenton. In connection with the Composing Room is the Linotype Division. In this division will be found five Mergenthaler Linotype Machines. The operators, all of whom have been trained in the Plant, as it has been impossible to secure trained operators elsewhere, consequently our Board has had the arduous task for the past twenty-five years of having to train operators for other Institutions not that we lay any claim to the high honor of a School of Printing, but in the Linotype Department, like in other Divisions of the Plant, it appears that most establishments wait until we train a good workman, and then they bid for that individual. Your Board has never bid. It has not entered into the competitive field in that manner. The Composing Room and Linotype Division have measured up in a very splendid way with that of other Institutions.

#### PROOF ROOM DEPARTMENT

Reading a proof, making corrections, whether made by the printer, linotype operator or author is a distinct service that your Board offers to each patron of the Institution for which there is no charge entered, as it has often been said that it is almost impossible to estimate the cost of proof reading. While most of us term it as proof reading your Board has been forced to not only do proof reading, but in the main to edit practically all of the copy that comes in, except that from our Editorial Department. The Proof Reading Department

is under the management of Miss Nell E. King, whose ability in that particular line has never been questioned. This Department has been able to lend cooperation to a number of splendid writers, Secretaries of Conventions and Associations, because it has kept out errors, corrected mistakes and made suggestions about the literary matter in various manuscripts.

#### OUR PRESS ROOM AND PRESSES

Without any show or attempt at ego, we make the broad statement that the Press Room of the National Baptist Publishing Board leads that of any other operated by a Negro religious Publishing House. The variety of presses covers a wide range of sizes and prices. There are to be found any kind of a press from the old Washington Hand Press that was used a century ago and which is still serviceable to the Scott's All-Size Rotary Book Press. There are to be found only a few first class pressmen who have specialized and become efficient in doing press work, color work on a press and the like. There are but few, we reiterate, who have visualized the importance of making themselves worth while as pressmen. Scarcely will there be found an apprentice. In our press room will be found three large Optimus Presses, one Miehle Printing Press, one Scott's All Size Rotary Book Press, one Washington Hand Press, one Duplex Newspaper Press and three small job Printing Presses. These ten printing presses are speeded up, so that it has enabled the press room to keep up with the demand made upon the Plant by the growing circulation, both in Sunday school literature, Standard books and commercial printing. The presses are adjusted to make impressions all the way from two thousand to ten thousand per hour, and even with this your Board has found it very difficult at times to meet the growing demands of increased output necessary in this Department, and we feel the need of more presses and more room. The press room has also, through its Foreman, Mr. George S. Davis, who has been in the Plant for more than twenty years, having come there as a boy, endeavored to train young men of the race to become finished pressmen. Former employees and workmen of this particular department, who have finished their training, have found profitable employment in many large printing establishments in the North and South, East and West. The entire force of this Department is members of the Race and have proven themselves to be consistent workmen.



## BOOK BINDING DEPARTMENT

This Department claims an unusual distinction in that it is the only one of its kind operated by Negroes in the world. It is a complete book bindery, under the efficient management of Mr. Ernest Jordan.

This Department, for the fiscal year, ending August 31, 1928, is adequately equipped with necessary machinery to meet the present demands. We operate very successfully the machinery listed below:

With the above equipment we have been able to meet the steady growing demands along all lines, with regards to the denominational and commercial work, which far surpasses the out-put for the previous year. While we haven't installed any new machinery, our help has become more efficient, thus enabling us to dispatch the work of this Department more rapidly than heretofore.

We are pleased to state that we have been able to so systematize the work of this Department that we bind and finish all of the Sunday school periodicals before time, thus making it possible to supply our customers without any delay. Believing, as we do, that a satisfied customer is the best advertising medium obtainable, we put forth this effort, which is proving to be very successful.

Our bindery has grown from a very small beginning to be the only one of its kind among our people doing spring-back, blank book, Divinity circuit, flexible binding, gilding, stamping, edge rolling and embossing.

## CHURCH SUPPLY AND CABINET DEPARTMENT

Supplying Church needs, whether it be with periodicals, Bible, Song Books or furniture of various kinds, has always been a specialty of your Board. The Church Supply Department, therefore, has functioned in a way and in a manner unexcelled. Anything from a wooden collection plate to church pews, in the furniture line has been offered. Some of the most magnificent churches in the confines of the Convention have been furnished.

This Department is under the supervision and management of Mr. Charles Watkins. This Department employs expert finishers and cabinet makers, and the agreement with your Board has enabled it to meet a present demand, and to occupy a large portion in the field of church supply manufacture.

## RAW AND UNFINISHED STOCK DEPARTMENT

More than eight carloads of paper have been required during the past year to keep the presses busy and to supply the amount of religious literature, standard books and commercial work that the presses have turned out. This Stock Room Department is in the charge of a young man who has been brought up in the Plant. He came there as a boy in the person of Mr. R. H. Boyd, III. It is his duty to receive all paper from the paper mills, classify paper and to distribute this out to the press room or any Department when the proper requisition is submitted to him. He has been thoroughly trained and knows how to classify the various grades of paper whether it be a piece of blotter, or a piece of news print or finest grade of linen or bond, whether it be the regular paste board or card board, and he is required also to know the grading of various glues and pastes. In fact, all raw and unfinished stock goes to this particular division.

## FINISHED STOCK AND BOOK DEPARTMENT

More money is on the shelf in this particular Department than the average eye and mind can conceive. Thousands of copies of finished publications repose there and await orders. Whenever a Standard publication is finished up, it is sent to the finished stock room. Whenever there is a need for



thousands of volumes of various publications to be kept in stock purchased from another publisher, immediately upon their receipts, they come to this particular division. An accurate record is kept of all of the books on the shelf, whether they be our publication or whether they are purchased from some one else.

In the Division all packages of books are wrapped, stamped and sent to the express office, freight office or post office. This division is in charge of Mr. Joseph Watkins, whose long service with the Board has shown his worth as a workman.

Now Mr. Chairman, and members of the Board, after having given this report, I respectfully urge that it be adopted by you as the net result of my stewardship of this one million dollar Plant being operated by your Board as a part of the work of the great denomination through our Convention.

#### THE WORLD'S SUNDAY SCHOOL CONVENTION

Your Secretary attended the World's Sunday School Convention that was held in Los Angeles, California, July 11th to the 17th. Through the farsightedness of your Board he was authorized not only to attend the Convention, but to take with him his wife, his daughter and office secretary, and to put an Exhibit of the publications out on the Pacific Coast.

These three persons, with the secretary, made the journey, attended the Convention, installed the Exhibits, and we feel with pardonable pride when we say that we made an indelible impression upon the representatives of sixty-five nations that were gathered in the great California city during the period of the Convention.

We were fortunate in being able to rub shoulders with and to have personal contact and conversation with those outstanding Sunday school leaders of the world of the various nations. While we could not converse with some in their mother tongue, we got inspiration from the vast throngs that were in attendance.

The high point of the meeting, aside from the instructions given out and the information obtained, was the wide-spread interest shown by the people of the world in the literature that your Board produces, the editorial matter contributed and the manufacturing skill displayed by the members of the craft in their pursuance of the art preservative as printers, typesetters, bookbinders and manufacturers.

You were registered with the other nations, and you helped to make up the great World's Sunday School Roll. At the same time, we visited the Convention we took an occasion while on the Pacific Coast, to do some ground work for the National Baptist Convention of America, and visited seventeen states while away from the office, covering a period of about six weeks.

#### THE PANAMA WORK

As a result of an urgent appeal made to this Board by Rev. R. H. Thorbourne and wife, from Ancon Canal Zone, the Board came to the rescue of these missionaries and saved an embarrassing situation for our Convention, by sending these missionaries back to their field of labor after they had remained in the states for more than eight months. The money was secured for their transportation from Louisville, Ky., where they were headquartering, to their home on the Canal Zone. The Secretary went to New Orleans and placed them on Board the ship and bade them Bon Voyage. This however, was not until Rev. Mr. Thorbourne brought to this Board the correspondence from the Home Mission Board, under which Board, he had been laboring, which disclosed the fact that the Home Mission Board was not financially able to return these missionaries to their field of labor.

We got in touch with the President of the National Baptist Convention, with the chairman of the Home Mission Board, and with every member of the Publishing Board, and after prayerful consideration of the matter, the Board thought it would be doing a real missionary service to come to the relief of the Convention by perpetuating this work down in the Canal Zone where forty-two nations mingle and make up a cosmopolitan population.

The missionaries were returned to their home in February, and since that time they have received their salaries as regularly as the clock ticks. A number of churches pledged monthly donations to sustain the work, among which churches was the Mt. Zion Baptist Church at Knoxville, Tenn., Rev. J. W. Haywood, pastor. This church is already one month in advance of its pledge. The following other churches pledged donations also: The Friendship Baptist Church, Atlanta, Ga., Rev. E. R. Carter, D. D., pastor; the Zion Baptist Church Denver, Colo., Rev. G. L. Prince, D. D., pastor; the Providence Baptist Church, Baltimore, Md., Rev. David E. Over, D. D., pastor. In addition to these pledges a number of churches made healthy donations: notable among them being the Ebe-

nezer Baptist Church, Rev. C. H. Clark, D. D., pastor, Chicago, Illinois, who gave a \$50.00 library and \$25.00 in cash.

The Secretary of the Board not only sent these missionaries back to their field rejoicing, but purchased a washing machine for Mrs. Thorbourne and sent it on to Panama with them, and advanced nearly one thousand dollars in railroad fare, steamship transportation and salaries for these mission workers.

#### THE SUNDAY SCHOOL CONGRESS

"More and Better Sunday Schools," "Front Line Sunday Schools and How to Build Them" has been emphasized this year as heretofore, in the Sunday School Congress, which is the denomination's Summer School of Methods, where Sunday School work, B. Y. P. U. Study Course, Organized Classes and other religious activities are demonstrated, continues to be the work of the Board.

The last session was held at Louisville, Ky., and was pronounced by all as the acme of all former efforts. The denomination really reached its peak in Extension Sections as well as in Departmental Meetings.

The Story of the Congress, as it appears in several periodicals, is herewith, submitted for your prayerful consideration and acceptance.

#### AN ABBREVIATED RESUME OF THE SUMMER SUNDAY SCHOOL OF METHODS STENOGRAPHICALLY REPORTED BY THE OFFICIAL STENOGRAPHER, WITH APOLOGY FOR ANY OMISSIONS OR ERRORS

Louisville, Ky., June 6, 1928.

#### WEDNESDAY—Morning Session.

The Twenty-third Annual Session of the Sunday School Congress convened in the Mt. Lebanon Baptist Church at 10:20 a. m., Dr. J. P. Robinson, the Chairman, presiding. He declared the Congress opened and the Summer Sunday School of Methods ready to perform its duties. Prof. H. B. P. Johnson, the National Chorister, directed the chorus in singing, "Hail the Baptist Congress." The chorus was supplemented by the Sunday School Congress Band from Nashville, Tenn. Prayer was offered by Rev. Homer Nutter, Jr., of Lexington, Ky., then the chorus sang "Christians Hold Your Light," from the National Jubilee Melody Song Book. Dr. Robinson made remarks and then introduced the Secretary of the Sunday School Congress, Rev. Henry Allen Boyd, who was given the chautauqua salute. After making a few preliminary remarks, he read telegrams, communications, made announcements and read the

Themes for discussion for the five days, introduced the conductors of the various departments, the pastor of the church, Rev. V. W. McLawler and Rev. T. Timberlake, who extended a cordial welcome to the great concourse of Sunday School and B. Y. P. U. workers. The chorus sang from the Jubilee Melody, "How Did You Feel." Dr. A. A. Graham, the secretary of the Lott Carey Foreign Mission Convention, Phoebus, Va., was introduced by the Secretary, and delivered a short address. The Congress Secretary then presented Dr. C. H. Clark of Chicago, Illinois, former Chairman of the Sunday School Congress, who delighted the audience with a timely address. The Congress Band played "On, On, Metokas and Galedas," joined by the chorus and the congregation. After announcements by Chairman Robinson, benediction was pronounced by Dr. A. A. Graham, and the meeting adjourned.

#### WEDNESDAY—Afternoon Session.

The meeting opened at 2:30 p. m. with devotions conducted by Rev. D. J. Hull of Nashville, Tenn., the Editorial Secretary of the National Baptist Publishing Board. Prayer was offered by Rev. J. P. Robinson. The Congress Secretary, Henry A. Boyd, made announcement and assignment of the Departmental Meetings. The various conductors with the members of their departments immediately dispersed, and for two hours general instructions were given, pertaining to the work in their specific departments or sections.

#### WEDNESDAY—Night Session.

This was local night, and was under the auspices of the entertainment committee, Rev. G. F. Watson, Chairman. Rev. Dr. Watson, who is Chairman of the State B. Y. P. U. Convention, extended a welcome on behalf of the entertainment committee and the citizens of Louisville in general. Prof. H. B. P. Johnson then directed the Congress Chorus in singing a selection after which prayer was offered by Rev. D. J. Hull. Rev. C. T. Isom, Executive Secretary of the Baptist Association of Ohio, was introduced by the Congress Secretary, and made a short talk. Revs. C. P. Madison of Norfolk, Va., J. Francis Wilson of Louisville, Ky., who spent two years in Africa as a missionary worker and twenty-five years as a B. Y. P. U. worker, J. O. Derrick of Detroit, Michigan, M. P. Parrish of Grand Rapids, Michigan and Mr. H. W. Russell of the Atlanta Life Insurance Company, Atlanta, Ga. A vocal solo was rendered by Mrs. McGavock, after which Rev. P. H. Pinckney of Columbia, S. C., played a clarinet solo, then a selection was rendered by the Lula Mae Butler Hurst, a Chorus and Orchestra of Knoxville, Tenn., composed of children, under the leadership of Deacon Luke Matlock, of the Mt. Zion Baptist Church. Song and prayer. Benediction was pronounced by Dr. J. P. Robinson.

#### THURSDAY—Morning Session.

The Bible Conference opened at 8:30 with devotions led by Rev. D. J. Hull for a half hour, then Rev. Ernest Hall, D. D., of Cleveland, Ohio, the Bible Conference Conductor, delivered a Biblical Lecture and conducted the conference for one hour. Rev. L. A. McIntyre of Evansville, Ind., the conductor of the Home Department, sang, "Lift Him Up," after which he discussed the Home Department for one hour. His lecture was inspiring, elevating and informational.

Rev. C. H. Parrish, D. D., President of Simmons University, was presented and spoke, then Rev. W. P. Offutt, Moderator of the General Association of Kentucky, was introduced and delivered a short welcome address. President J. Edmund Wood of the National Baptist Convention of America, was next presented and addressed the body, after which Mr. J. A. Jackson, of the Department of Commerce, Washington, D. C., was introduced and delivered a timely address. The National Chorister, Prof. H. B. P. Johnson, led the chorals and congregation in singing, "Christians Hold Your Light" from the Jubilee Melody Song Book. Papers were read on the following subjects: "What are the Qualities of a Competent Sunday School Teacher?" by Mrs. Mary Nicholson, of Nashville, Tenn.; Miss Goldie Hammond of Louisville, Ky., and Miss E. S. Higgins of Evansville, Ind. "How Should a Sunday School Teacher Regard Her Work?" by Mrs. Dora Zeigler of Little Rock, Ark., and Miss Lovie Wood of Nashville, Tenn. Mr. J. A. Nobles of Chicago, Ill., presented a paper on "What are the Qualities of a Competent Sunday School Teacher?" Then Mrs. Mary D. Ramey of Jeffersonville, Ind., read papers on "What Should be the Highest Aim of the Sunday School Teacher?" and "What are the Qualities of a Competent Sunday School Teacher?" Mrs. Eliza Elmore of Lexington, Ky., read a paper on "What are the Qualities of a Competent Sunday School Teacher?" Mrs. Ophelia D. Grainger of Nashville, Tenn., presented a paper on "What Should Be the Highest Aim of the Sunday School Teacher?" while Mr. W. T. Curry, superintendent of the Morning Star Baptist Sunday School, Chicago, Illinois, read a paper on "Outline the Qualifications of a Competent Sunday School Superintendent." Mrs. Lula Mae Butler Hulse of Kansas City, Mo., led in singing, "How did You Feel," from the Jubilee Melody.

The next important feature was the Teacher Training Section. Rev. J. A. Sharpe, the conductor of the Teacher Training Department, held sway for one hour, giving instructions and blackboard demonstrations. He was assisted by Mrs. Clara James of Kansas City, Mo. The Congress Secretary made announcements, then the meeting adjourned with benediction by Rev. D. J. Hull.

#### THURSDAY—Afternoon Session.

Promptly at 3:00 o'clock the Departmental Sections opened in the various rooms or places provided for them, and for two hours conductors instructed the messengers in their particular line of work, such as the Metoka and Galeda Classes, the Advanced Teachers, Ministerial Department, Intermediate and Primary Teachers, Cradle Roll and Infant Department, A. F. Cadet Department, B. Y. P. U., Laymen's League, Department of Music and the Ministerial Department.

#### THURSDAY—Night Session.

This was Literary Night, and a musical and literary program was rendered, composed of the talent among the Congress messengers. Long before eight o'clock the Mt. Lebanon Baptist Church, the scene of Congress activities, was crowded to overflowing, to witness the program that was under the direction of Prof. H. B. P. Johnson. The concert was pronounced a wonderful success.

#### FRIDAY—Morning Session.

At 8:30 the Bible Conference was opened, Rev. D. J. Hull led the congregation in singing, "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms," prayer was

offered by Rev. J. P. Robinson, then Rev. Ernest Hall, the conductor of the Bible Conference Department, again delivered a soul-stirring address that grasped the audience for one hour. Rev. L. A. McIntyre, the conductor of the Home Department, next took charge, taught and demonstrated how to conduct a Home Department in the Church and Sunday School, at the conclusion of which he sang, "Lift Him Up" by request, joined by the congregation. Rev. J. T. Brown of Nashville, Tenn., Editor in Chief of the Sunday School Publishing Board, was introduced by the chairman and spoke, after which Rev. G. E. Stewart, D. D., of New York, was presented and delivered an inspiring address, then Prince J. E. Elayechetai of Abyssinia was introduced and gave a short history of his life and conditions in Africa, after which he sang a solo in the African language.

The Chairman called for the reading of papers, and the following responded: "What is the Church's Responsibility with Regard to the Sunday School and B. Y. P. U.?" by Mrs. Ora Lee Payne of Guthrie, Ky., and by Mrs. Anna Neal of Dayton, Ohio. "What are the Functions of the Organized Classes?" by Mr. R. H. Burnett of Chicago, Ill. "How Shall We Meet the Requirements of the Teen Age?" by Mrs. Emma G. Broadnax of Detroit, Mich., and Mr. Charles J. Lunderman of Paducah, Ky. Mrs. Margaret Brown White of Lebanon, Ky., favored the audience with a solo. At the conclusion of this number Rev. J. A. Sharpe, the Teacher Training Conductor, gave an instructive lecture for a half hour, then Miss Margaret Donnell of Murfreesboro, Tenn., rendered a solo. The Teacher Training period was concluded with discussion and blackboard demonstrations by Mrs. Clara James, assistant to Dr. Sharpe. Mrs. Georgia Hall of New York sang a solo; remarks by Rev. J. P. Robinson, then benediction was pronounced by Dr. Hull.

#### FRIDAY—Afternoon Session

From 3:00 to 5:00 o'clock the Departmental Sections were conducted by the following conductors: Metokas, by Dr. R. M. Reddick and Mr. J. W. Welch; Galedas, by Mrs. L. B. Fouse and Miss N. E. King; Advanced Teachers, by Prof. J. P. Eugene and Mr. W. M. McIntyre; Primary Department, by Mr. G. P. Baker and Mr. L. E. Brown; Intermediate Department, by Mr. E. D. Tucker and Mrs. Clara James; Department of Music by Prof. H. B. P. Johnson, Mr. N. S. Landix, Miss R. Lillian Carpenter and Mrs. J. W. Hulse; Superintendents' Department, by Mr. H. W. Russell, Prof. W. H. Fort, Mrs. E. W. White and Prof. H. F. Jones; B. Y. P. U. Department, by Rev. T. B. Livingston, Mr. F. Marshall, Mrs. Marie Tansil and Mr. G. W. Millsaps; Cradle Roll, by Mrs. Idella Hardin; National A. F. Cadets, Major A. W. Woodruff; Ministerial Section by Rev. David E. Over, of Baltimore, Md.

#### FRIDAY—Night Session

This session was under the auspices and management of the Organized Classes, the Metokas and Galedas, and is styled as the Metoka and Galeda Night. An excellent literary and musical program was rendered, after which Mrs. R. H. Boyd, the wife of the late Dr. R. H. Boyd the founder of the Sunday School Congress, was presented to the audience by Miss N. E. King, one of the conductors of the Galeda Department. Mrs. Boyd made a few remarks, then in a very unique way she shook hands with every one in the audience, using the famous maneuver of her son, Henry Allen Boyd, the Secretary of the Congress. She re-

ceived great applause. A Biblical Pageant that was much enjoyed, concluded the program.

#### SATURDAY—Morning Session

At 8:30 the Bible Conference was opened by Rev. D. J. Hull, who conducted the devotional exercises for a half hour, after which Dr. Ernest Hall delivered the last of his series of lectures for this Congress period. His Biblical knowledge, his teachings and his instructions have made Dr. Hall one of the prominent figures in the Sunday School Congress Movement.

The Home Department was next in order, and Rev. I. A. McIntyre, the conductor of this Department, after leading the congregation in singing, again delivered one of his instructive lectures which was fraught with much information. Miss Glover of Chicago, Illinois, favored the audience with a solo, after which papers were read on the following subjects: "What Is the Church's Responsibility with Regard to the Sunday School?" by Dr. R. M. Reddick of Atlanta, Ga. "How Shall the B. Y. P. U.'s Prepare for Real Service?" by Miss E. M. Loggins of Oklahoma City, Okla., and Miss Clara Z. Bales of Danville, Ill. "The Junior B. Y. P. U., What Does It Mean to the Church?" by Miss Ollie Hill of Kansas City, Mo. "Training the Young People of the B. Y. P. U." by Mrs. K. Higgins of Spartanburg, S. C. "The Qualifications of a Competent Superintendent" by Mr. R. H. Dabney of Portsmouth, Ohio, superintendent of the Pleasant Green Sunday School. "The Place of Worship in the Sunday School", by Mr. Ewd. Threadgill of Mound Bayou, Miss.

The Congress Secretary made announcements and gave instructions concerning the parade for Sunday afternoon and for the big mass meeting. Mrs. Lula Butler Hurse, the sweet gospel singer of Kansas City, Mo., led the congregation in singing several Spirituals from the National Jubilee Melody Song Book. Following this was the Teacher Training period, and Dr. J. A. Sharpe thrilled the audience with his lecture which brought to a close these beneficial instructions and demonstrations until the next Congress session. Mrs. J. C. White of Columbia, S. C., rendered an effective solo, then the benediction was pronounced by Dr. J. P. Robinson and the meeting adjourned.

#### SATURDAY—Afternoon Session

Three o'clock found the messengers assembled in their various departments, which were schools of thought and beehives of practical and religious information. These sectional meetings continued until five o'clock when the benediction was pronounced.

#### SATURDAY—Night Session

This session is always given over to the Boy Cadets and Campfire Girls, and their programs usually draw a large audience. These Companies had been having their practices, drills and military tactics each day during the week under the command of Major Woodruff of Nashville, Tennessee, Major General S. S. Jones having been called to his home in Muskogee, Oklahoma on account of serious illness of his daughter. An interesting program was rendered, and the drills and maneuvers pulled off were on the highest order and showed skilled training on the part of the Cadets and Campfire Girls.

#### SUNDAY—Morning Session

Promptly at ten minutes past nine the Model Sunday School was opened by Prof. J. P. Eugene of Beaumont, Texas, acting superintendent, singing, "There is sunshine in my soul". Prayer by Mr. M. F. Somerville of Media, Pa., singing "Onward Christian Soldiers." The classes were then divided off by states and the teachers took charge of the classes at half past nine, the lesson being taught for forty minutes, after which Rev. S. A. Pleasant, Jr., of Houston, Texas, gave a review of the lesson that will live long in the minds of the messengers and visitors. Prayer was offered by Rev. J. A. Sharpe, then the superintendent called for the report of the classes which had been vying with each other for the capture of the banner. The reading of the reports by the Congress Secretary resulted in the state of Kentucky having the largest collection and thereby was pronounced the winner of the national prize banner. The Sunday school closed with prayer by Dr. Pleasant.

The eleven o'clock services were opened with singing by the Congress Chorus, prayer was offered by Rev. J. Edmund Wood, the President of the Convention, after which scripture reading by Dr. D. J. Hull; Mrs. J. C. White of Columbia, S. C., sang, "It pays to serve Jesus", then the Congress Sermon was preached by Rev. J. C. White, D. D., of Columbia, S. C. His soul-stirring message and his eloquent delivery coupled with spiritual fervor made a lasting impression upon the vast audience. The chorus rendered a selection, and the benediction was pronounced by Dr. White.

#### SUNDAY—Afternoon Session

At one-thirty the parade was formed, composed of workers, men, women and children, pastors, superintendents and teachers, organized class workers from the various churches and Sunday schools, the Sunday School Congress messengers and the Sunday School Congress Band supplemented by a city brass band, the Boy Cadets, Campfire Girls, Sunday School Congress Officials, the Sunday School Congress Chorus and Sunday school workers from all walks of life. The parade formed in two sections of the city, but met at a central point and marched to the Armory where one of the largest mass meetings in the history of the Congress Movement was pulled off. The program was under the direction of Prof. H. B. P. Johnson, the National Chorister, and some of the best talent among the messengers and in the city was displayed. The program consisted of musical selections, solos, addresses, selections from the bands, the awarding of diplomas from the Teacher Training Course and the Correspondence Course, which closed the meeting. This parade and mass meeting were pronounced the largest and the best that the city of Louisville had witnessed.

#### SUNDAY—Night Session

Sunday night found the visiting ministers filling the various pulpits of the city, delivering the last gospel messages for this Congress session. After the regular B. Y. P. U. service at the Mt. Lebanon Baptist Church, the Congress headquarters, the eight o'clock services were conducted, at the conclusion of which the curtains fell on the 1928 session of the Sunday School Congress, and by Monday morning all the messengers had practically boarded the trains for their homes.

## OUR FINANCIAL OPERATION

The blessings of our Father have not been confined only to health and strength, but He has permitted us to enjoy a reasonable portion of financial support. We have secured no donations, have solicited no funds in the way of contributions, for the operation and maintenance of the Plant, nor have we called upon a single church and Sunday school or Auxiliary to advance one penny to meet the obligations of the National Baptist Publishing Board in any way. We have not made an appeal to help save the property or to pay off any of the indebtedness, but we have addressed ourselves to this task as our own work, without disturbing the denomination.

It is true that the Secretary has extended thousands of dollars worth of credit to the denomination through its individual members, churches and schools, B. Y. P. U. Societies, various organized Boards of the Convention. Associations and even to the National Baptist Convention. Most of these have used their credit to finance their respective organizations, but in spite of this, our report shows that the gross business of your Board for the fiscal year just ended, was \$307,937.73, as attested by the attached statement, by months.

### CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT For 1927-1928.

To the President, Officers and Members of the National Baptist Convention of the United States of America, I beg to submit the following on behalf of the Officers and the Executive Board.

For the year ending August 30, 1928, beginning at the close of the Convention held in Denver, Colorado, this month one year ago, one of the best if not the best session ever held in the history of the Convention. We were agreeably surprised at the large number in attendance from all parts of this country. The meeting was peaceable, instructive, highly enthusiastic, wonderful and helpful to the delegates and the citizens of Denver in general. Zion Church, Dr. Prince and their friends covered themselves with glory in the entertainment of God's workers.

The moneys raised this session was in every way satisfactory to the Boards and Officers.

A few of the high points are as follows:

1. The Introductory Sermon by Dr. Ira Hendon was a masterly effort and seems to have made beautifully impressed and spirit lashed throughout. (So all the speakers follow).
2. Twenty-three (23) new members joining us at this meeting from Ohio, Texas, Alabama, Colorado, Illinois, Arkansas and Michigan.
3. The great mass meeting in the City Auditorium led by the noted Drs. Winn and A. A. Graham in the interest of Foreign Missions.
4. Raising \$5,251.73 for Education.
5. The Adoption (with amendments) of the Committee's report on revision of the Constitution—they worked three years on this one document. It is indeed the proof of wonderful minds working together.
6. Authorizing the Home Mission Board to incorporate itself in harmony with the rules and regulations of this Convention.

The cash amount of money raised at this session was \$8,518.21. The grand total raised during the year will appear later in this report—the amount paid out will have to be given by the Recording Secretary, as circumstances occurred over which I had no control and likewise kept me from attending the Executive Board meeting.

Under the directions of the President, I have worked and travelled all the year trying to get the business and historical end of the Convention right-side up. As hard as I worked on the Historical Records in 1925, having made a trip to Washington, D. C., also to Boston, Mass., I got every thing straightened out in the Department of Commerce—Bureau of Census and reported all to this Convention at the Indianapolis meeting. But 1927, it seems that something went wrong again at the Departments or some misrepresentations were filed, some misrepresentations had to be off set with facts and figures. This cause us to have to go over the work we had done in 1926 again in support of our Historical Records in the Department of Commerce—Bureau of Census, the worse handicaps we had, was some of the leaders of the Boards of this Convention—some State Leaders, Moderators and Pastors absolutely refused to assist either your Secretary or the Departments and would not make out any reports or answer any correspondence on the matter, and I had to go many places to get the information. Finally after months of hard work and gathering information in this state Dr. Park's help by the assistance of Dr. Henry A. Boyd, we got the Historical facts collected and got them O. K. and filed, with the Directors. See Exhibit "A" and "B," and made a part of this report. (Read).

Just before we undertook the Historical task, we open correspondence with the Home Mission Board Secretary, Dr. Ira M. Hendon, touching the proposed Charter of his Board and asked him on behalf of the Executive to amend or strike this document and construct one that would in every point be in harmony with this Convention—and in general to all. Dr. Hendon readily agreed. See correspondence and Article, also other Home Mission matters marked Exhibit "C," and made a part of this report.

In compliance with the orders of the Convention, I made out the new Official Staff of the Convention and caused the same to be published weekly in the Union-Review. See Exhibit "D."

I have been in constant correspondence with Honorable V. A. Wilson, the ——— Colgate Historical Collection of Hamilton (Hampton) N. Y., I am still working with them. See Exhibit "E."

The orders given me by the President to call boards, send out information and make trips to State meetings where he could reach ..... and sent out minutes, etc., is here marked Exhibit "F," and (may be a part of this report) I turn aside here to suggest that State Presidents should hold a Conference. See if the times of some State Conventions cannot be changed so as to help National Representatives.

### BOARD MEETINGS.

The first Board meeting was held with the churches of Cincinnati, invited by Dr. C. W. Williams. Untold good was accomplished at this meeting. It looked more like a National Convention than it did a Board meeting. This pastor had Prof. Johnson there who gave us a large and enthusiastic chorus. The Board was largely attended by the National Leaders, Pastors and Workers (Both male and female). Cash \$848.89 was raised for all purposes: Paid to Dr. Pitt for Education, \$402.00; for back bills and incidentals \$412.36; balance on hand from this \$34.53. The following budget for the year was approved:

May the great Head of Churches crown all of our labors with an abundance of success.

## By-Laws

AS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF MISSIONS, NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION, U. S. A.

## Preamble.

This corporation, organized and existing under the laws of the State of Indiana and other States comprising the territory of the National Baptist Convention, U. S. A., for the purpose of diffusing the knowledge of the religion of Jesus Christ by means of Missions throughout these United States and the world, purchasing, maintaining property and other holdings his pursuant to the power bestowed on it by the National Baptist Convention, U. S. A. in its annual session, adopted the following By-Laws:

## ARTICLE I.—MEMBERSHIP.

The Membership of this body shall be composed of: Annual members appointed by Baptist State bodies affiliating with the National Baptist Convention U. S. A., who are credited messengers to the Annual Session and Baptist Churches in States where there is not a State body representing.

## ARTICLE II.—OFFICERS.

Section I. The Officers of this Board shall be Chairman, Vice Chairman, Recording Secretary and one or more administrative secretaries, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer. All of whom shall be elected an-

nually by the Home Mission Board and approved by the Convention. The administrative Secretaries to be elected by the Board of Managers.

Section 2. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Board, in case of his absence, his duties shall be performed by the Vice Chairman.

Section 3. The Secretaries, the Treasurer and such officers as the Board may appoint, shall be subjected to the direction of the Board, and shall discharge such duties as may be defined by its regulations and rules of order.

Section 4. The Treasurer shall give such security for faithful performance of his duties as the Board of Managers may direct.

Section 5. Each officer elected at the annual meeting shall serve from the close of the annual meeting at which he is elected, to the close of the next annual meeting, and until his successor is elected.

#### ARTICLE III.—BOARD OF MANAGERS.

Section 1. The Board of Managers shall consist of the Chairman of the Board and eight others elected at its annual meeting. At the meeting at which these By-Laws shall be adopted, one-third for three years, to the end that thereafter, as nearly as practicable, one-third of the whole number of managers shall be elected at each subsequent annual meeting to fill vacancies caused by the expiration of term of office.

Section 2. The Board of Managers shall meet annually at the time and place of the National Baptist Convention U. S. A., Local Board may meet monthly or such other times that the body may direct. At its Headquarters.

Section 3. The Board of Managers shall have the management of the affairs of the Home Mission Board; shall have the power to elect its own chairman and Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary-Treasurer, to appoint the recommendation of the Corresponding Secretary the administrative secretaries of the Board and such additional officers and agents, field workers and missionaries as it may seem proper, and to define duties of each; to appoint its own meetings; to adopt such regulations and rules as to it may seem proper, including those for control and disposition of the real and personal property of the Board, the sale, leasing or mortgaging thereof, provided they are not inconsistent with the act of incorporation or its by-laws; to fill all vacancies in the Board of Management and in any office of the Board until the next meeting of the Board; to establish such agencies as may be necessary and to appoint missionaries and remove same when condition warrant or may seem proper by a three-fifth vote of all members present and voting at the meeting when said vote is taken; it being understood, however, that in case of missionaries of the Board an absolute majority of the Board shall be necessary for suspension and a two-third of the whole Board for dismissal; to fix the compensation of officers, agents and missionaries; to direct and instruct them concerning their respective duties; to make all appropriations of money; and at the annual meetings of the Board, and at the annual meetings of the National Baptist Convention, to present a printed or written full detail report of the proceedings of the Board and its work during the year.

#### ARTICLE IV.—ELIGIBILITY OF APPOINTMENT.

All officers, all members of the Board of Managers and all missionaries must be members of Baptist Churches in good and regular standing cooperating with the National Baptist Convention U. S. A.

## ARTICLE V.—ANNUAL AND OTHER MEETINGS.

The Board shall meet annually on Wednesday afternoon in September during the session of the National Baptist Convention unless for some special reason another time shall be fixed by the Board of Managers in conference with the Executive Managers of the National Baptist Convention. All annual meetings shall be held where the annual meetings may be held at any time and place upon the call of the Board of Managers or Chairman.

## ARTICLE VI.—RELATIONS WITH NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION.

Section 1. With a view to unification in general denominational matters, the National Baptist Convention at each session in the election may present in its selection the members of the Home Mission Board as recommended from the various State Bodies and churches co-operating with the Convention. If in any state there be no state convention, any church may represent and have one member or vote.

Section 2. The National Baptist Convention upon the agreement of the President and Executives of the Convention may arrange suitable quarters on the first day or the opening of the Convention for the collections of missionary funds, disseminating of information, annual subscription and final report of agents and missionaries.

Section 3. The annual report of the Board, as soon as it shall be prepared, shall be forwarded to the president of the National Baptist Convention and others authorized to receive it.

## ARTICLE VII.—AMENDMENTS.

These By-Laws may be amended by a two-third vote of the members present and voting at any annual meeting of the Board, provided written notice of the proposed amendment shall have been given at the preceding annual meeting of the Board, or such amendment shall be recommended by the National Baptist Convention.

## REPORT OF THE HOME MISSION BOARD.

To the National Baptist Convention, U. S. A. Greetings:

The activities of the Home Board may be found in greater detail in the report of work done, as contained in the report of the Field workers and compiled in the report of the Field Secretary, since there has been such full, harmonious, and unified actions between the workers and the Home Office.

Since the regular meeting of the Board held last September at the close of the National Baptist Convention in Denver, the Local Board has been active in its meetings and plannings. As far as was in the power of the Board, every order was obeyed, even the articles of incorporations as passed by the Convention, filed.

The program of the Home Mission Board indicated by the closing year is not "blind optimism, but determined foresight." The weakest thing a denomination can do is to drift towards something hoped for, but for which definite plans fail to be made. The freedom of the organic condition surrounding the average Baptist church easily develops a spirit of independence and such independence weakens the kingdom.

growth as well as the denominational purpose. To "go it alone" is past history. To federate our common Baptist interests in country, towns, larger cities and States is the trend of future accomplishments. We are seriously anxious about programs and Funding campaigns appealing to but few of our pastors and churches, a few of the smaller at that. The communities are not touched.

The divorce of needed men and needed monies for popular schemes in the community by leaders having no denominational responsibility, has serious dangers when reduced to its last analysis. We must begin to encourage a greater faith and a wholesome and constructive trust in all our Baptist relationships. We must build up a very clear and definite interest in our churches of like faith and order. The failure of one is the dismay of all. The growth of all is the blessing of each church. In the science of building the contractor organizes his material in groups, and then proceeds to build in an orderly and efficient way. In the science of religious building we have been under the impression that if we scatter the denominational units into confused piles we shall make greater headway. We should be conscious of the positive values of strengthening rather than weakening the denominational groups. It has been ours in these last years to attempt at organizing well. Our particular task has been for three years past in this organization back and is back to the limit of our denominational enterprises and organizations. We must reinstate in unmistakable terms our confidence in our leaders. We must trust ourselves to manage. If not, then we must say gracefully, but clearly, we have neither money nor men to waste in maintaining machinery which lacks spiritual productiveness.

#### General Review of the Year 1927-1928.

The observer of today and the historian of tomorrow will agree that the work of missions is not ended.

The New Testament minister is alert to the fact, that God depends upon him to send the gospel to earth's remotest bounds. This year has been more of sentiment making than money getting. Seed sowing. Nearly every section of the country has been touched some way and some how God's name be praised. The improvement and enlargement of our work in various sections, in cooperation with State Conventions, City Missions and the Woman's National Baptist Convention, and the progress that has been made in spiritualizing these important contacts with new territories is outlined in Dr. J. W. Anderson's report.

The progress of the work in the West including both Southern and Northern California, the taking over many of our churches, and the organizations of New Associations and States Conventions will be heard in the reports of Drs. G. C. Coleman, A. P. Ramsey, J. H. Brown of California. New Mexico's steady progress is credited to the sacrificing efforts of Dr. J. A. Williams, whose strength has been augmented by the coming of Dr. J. E. Rogers, who is now located at Las Cruces, and the honored President of the New Mexico Baptist General Convention, Mrs. Alice Wells is leading the women.

The East, as far away as New York seems to be waking up. Secretary Henry Allen Boyd of the Publishing Board tells that New York is now in our column, verified by Dr. G. E. Stewart of New York City. Recording Secretary of New York State Convention, who will report at this meeting.

The South, Southeast and Middle West in fact every section of the country shows marked improvement in the work of the kingdom.

#### Our Board.

Our Board has worked faithfully and lovingly through the year, their cooperation locally has been excellent, notwithstanding Dr. Seymour, the local chairman, has been indisposed the whole year. We pray his speedy recovery.

#### Incorporation

The Denver Convention ordered by motion, made by Dr. S. S. Jones, of Oklahoma, that the Home Board be incorporated. This the Board set out to do among the first things after the closing of the convention. We secured an attorney who arranged the document and filed for the Charter, which charter was recorded January 20, 1928. During the session of the Executive Board held in Cincinnati, Ohio, January 19, 20, said articles were read to the Board at the request of the President of the Convention, at which time some objections were filed but too late to stop the filing of said charter. However our Board feels that if there is a single objection, an amendment will be made subject to the orders of the Convention. The Board is but an agent of the Convention.

#### Our Fifty Thousand Dollar Funding Campaign.

The Fifty Thousand Dollar Campaign launched by the Board as set out in the budget submitted by the Convention's Board, was attempted. Every method was used to arouse, enlighten, enlist for enlargement, the Baptists of this entire nation. The Secretary's office, by correspondence and appeals, the distributions of campaign literature, the untiring efforts of many of the field workers and the pages of the Union-Review were used to the last limit to reach our leaders and constituencies; several contributions were made by our workers to urge cooperation in this worthy effort. Not much funds raised as a result, but the sentiment made was far above the ingathering of heaps of money, for there has been a favorable stir from New City to San Francisco. Dr. S. S. Jones, D. D., of Muskogee, Okla., was the first to respond favorably to the appeals with pledges and finance, followed by Dr. Chas. H. Clark, D. D., of Chicago. Some of the floor leaders seemingly can not be reached only in the direct causes they represent officially. This is pitiful.

#### Our Secretaries.

Dr. J. W. Anderson, D. D., our Western Regional Secretary and Transportation Manager, who has served long and faithfully with supervisory responsibility in the States of his division, and with advisory relations for both Home Missions and the transportation of workers to various sections in the West, thereby saving the denomination many hundreds of dollars and the same time getting across the Lord's program. His wide acquaintance and long experience in the West has providentially prepared him for this great task to which he has ever been called. As he is mostly on the field, it is well that we give you his residence address, 429 Tillamook St., Portland, Oregon. His assistance to the Corinthian Baptist Church at headquarters last April netted \$15,567.00, exclusively from other large sums elsewhere.

Dr. G. C. Coleman, D. D., of Oakland, California, the pioneer of Negro Baptists freedom and lover of Negro religious enterprises has done more to stimulate our causes in the west than any of his predecessors or followers, notwithstanding the empty pledges of White Baptists and corporationists, the work under his leadership in the west moves forward. If some money could be given this giant, Baptists rights, redemption would soon come. He is ably assisted by such men as Drs. J. H. Brown, A. P. Ramsay, D. C. Knox, Lively and Watkins.

Dr. John Jackson of East Liverpool, Ohio has been the mainstay of our work in the East this year. Like a steel belt, his reports have had the right ring. Our Regional Secretary, Rev. L. H. Walker, of Pittsburgh, suffered from a fall or wreck by an automobile, hence unable to render services this year. Dr. Jackson, the District Secretary had to fill both stations. He did it well.

Rev. John D. Fears, of Clarksville, Texas, our Regional Secretary from the Southwest, reports that the strained relations in Texas among our Baptist family hampered him greatly in his efforts.

Among the most active and successful workers on the field covering States and Districts: Mrs. E. J. Toomer of St. Joseph, Mo.; Dr. C. T. Dorroh, Jacksonville, Fla.; Rev. G. P. Barksdale, Pineville, Ky., leads them all, followed by Revs. C. C. Phillips, Illinois; T. H. Broadus, South Carolina; E. J. Jacobs, Mo.; T. H. Walker, J. A. Parsons, Miss E. O. Price, Indiana; J. A. Williams, New Mexico; A. P. Ramsay, Calif.; Frank Clark, La.; N. Nichols, Ark.

#### Evangelical Missionaries.

Our Evangelistic Staff under the direction of the Board served well. Dr. D. Webster Bowen, D. D., of Chicago, Illinois; Mrs. S. Evangeline Hicks, Pittsburgh, Pa.; Rev. Anthony D. Hendon, Galveston, Texas; Rev. J. T. Highbaugh, Indianapolis, Indiana. These people administered to the spiritual needs of the people in various sections. The story of their work will be told in their reports.

#### Operative and Cooperative Relationship.

While doing our own work, we have been in close fellowship and fruitful cooperation with all other Boards of our Convention.

We have cooperated with Publishing Board, the Women's National Board, the Foreign Mission Board, and all agencies of our Baptist group. Both the Northern and Southern Baptist Mission Boards have in a way offered to cooperate with us.

There is a fine and congenial spirit of cooperation between our Board and the representatives and churches of the Lott Carey Convention, they are of the right sort.

We have a feeling that both the Northern and Southern Baptists will cooperate with us on the fifty fifty basis when we are ready.

Our extensive mailing list makes it possible to reach thousands of Baptist laymen and preachers quickly, and we have at all times been ready to cooperate with our various denominational groups and local organizations in placing before them such information as will inform them of our fields and forces and the character and needs of our work. Somehow they won't answer.

#### The Panama Work and the Thorbourne's.

In 1925 during the Sunday School Congress in session at Beaumont, Texas, the Executive Board called a session to arrange the program for

the Kansas City meeting. The present Secretary had just been appointed over the work of the Home Mission Board, uninformed as to plans, holdings or obligations, a stranger and foreigner to any of the previous plans, perfectly green, but was advised by Dr. Henry Allen Boyd, that the Panama Work belonged to the Home Mission Board, and it was the abounding duty of the Home Board to look after that Field, this the Secretary without hesitancy set about to do, forgetting that doing the process of litigation of the denomination, it was brought out that the deeds of the Panama work or property was in the hands of the Publishing Board because of the fact the Home Board was not an incorporation, hence could not hold property. The Home Board beginning in 1925 rendered support to this Field in keeping with its financial ability up to January in this year. In June, 1927 led a campaign which resulted in bringing to the States, Rev. Thorbourne and his family. Several hundred dollars was raised for them itinerary made under which the Baptists of our Convention rendered support such as was their ability to do.

It was rumored that these worthy missionaries were neglected by the Board and scorned by the president at the Denver meeting, and many other things reported to have been said by Dr. Thorbourne. The Board takes this method of clearing if possible these clouds, using the statements of both Rev. and Mrs. Thorbourne at the Woman's Convention in Denver, quoting the remarks verbatim of Mrs. Thorbourne: "The Home Mission Board, under the secretaryship of Dr. Hendon, has done more for our work in Panama, than all of the workers since the work of the late Dr. Boyd." The Board paid the fares and expenses of both Dr. and Mrs. Thorbourne to Denver, borrowing the money from a widow woman in Corinthian Baptist Church, Indianapolis—Mrs. Lillie M. McKay, and the Woman's National Baptist Convention raised \$66.27 at the report of the Board's secretary, Rev. Hendon, and returned the borrowed money in the convention assembled. The women raised \$51.00 on Sunday evening of the Convention, turning same to Sister Thorbourne, to the credit of the Board. Many others gave freely and constantly. Quoting an article in Woman's National Baptist publication regarding two hundred garments given through the Board and acknowledged by Mrs. Thorbourne is as follows: "Work in Panama Zone aided by the Home Mission Board helped in bringing the Missionaries home from the Zone. Spent 7 months at home recuperating and soliciting help and making friends to further the work in the Zone—of the eleven hundred articles collected for Foreign Fields, in September during the annual session at Denver, Colorado, more than 200 were given to Mrs. Thorbourne and family." Aside from a book written entitled the Missionary Informer and the many things given through this agency to these workers, the Woman's National Baptist Convention at the request of the Home Board aided wonderfully in bringing the missionaries home. The Board is not commercial as others, its work as an agent is to direct the missionary work of the Convention from every point of view.

Knowing our duty as we do, the Board made efforts one after another to maintain its relation with the workers on this field, but they refused, and we learn that the Publishing Board and Tennessee's State Mission Board looks after them. Its the privilege of any local church or Board to care for work or workers, but be it remembered it isn't the rights of them to draw from other fields or states that should function with the organized Board of the Convention during a definite line of work. This office is authentically informed that such has been done. Majoring the work with all of the agencies of the convention, the Home Board stands ready to even assist this field cooperating with these agents in charge.



## Department of Publicity.

Our congratulations go to the National Baptist Union-Review. The management under the wise direction of Dr. Henry Allen Boyd and the business staff. They have been generous to us in the publicity of our affairs. Our work has not been subjected to criticism or ridicule and we appreciate the respect given our work from this department of our denomination—nothing escapes the discerning eye of the Secretary in keeping us well informed as to trend of things here, there and yonder. From time to time, as has seemed necessary we have placed paid advertisements of our work. They carried a charge account for us to get our program across.

## Department of Finance.

The time has come now when we must meet frankly our future finances. Our plans as they stand now is not sufficient to maintain our hold and will never be until we can awaken a better cooperative basis with our leaders and organizations. The spirit of cooperation must be both active and sincere. We suggest that a committee be appointed to work jointly with a like committee of all the Boards of the convention to discuss frankly and work out intelligently an elastic financial plan for future days.

## The Work Should be Extended.

There is such a demand for enlightenment along all lines of our denominational life especially our convention, it is becoming that we specialize in designated gifts to the most needed sections, for instance, New Mexico, California and the Northwest, where the wrong influence holds sway. New Mexico is asking now for young ministers thoroughly prepared, single men preferably because of the financial conditions and small congregations. Washington, Idaho and Oregon, appeal for finance to care for one or two missionaries and many other points make similar requests.

## Special Commendations.

In closing, the Secretary wishes to call attention to important matters which the Convention should give serious consideration.

A. The past three years has developed an unprecedented building fever and an awakening along with the return of many to our fold. The condition of the work in the west and east also demanded correction and an appeal for both enlightenment and funds through the Board. The Revs. J. W. Anderson, John Jackson, G. C. Coleman, A. P. Ramsay, C. T. Darroh, F. H. McQuater, D. W. Bowen, have aided the Board very materially in these needs and necessary funds. We congratulate them.

B. The secretary desires in closing this report, Mr. President, to bear testimony to the happy, effective administration of the local board elected for the fiscal year now ending. The finest kind of cooperation has existed, the most spiritual approach has been taken by this board on every question. Money has been applied always with the realization that we have been stewards of the King. It is possible some changes made this year may effect this happy fellowship, but the prayer of the Secretary is that God may richly bless his co-workers and co-laborers in this great enterprise. In spite of the frailness of our local Chairman, Dr. Seymour, he has met us repeatedly for council and contributed in no small measure by his experience and sane judgment.

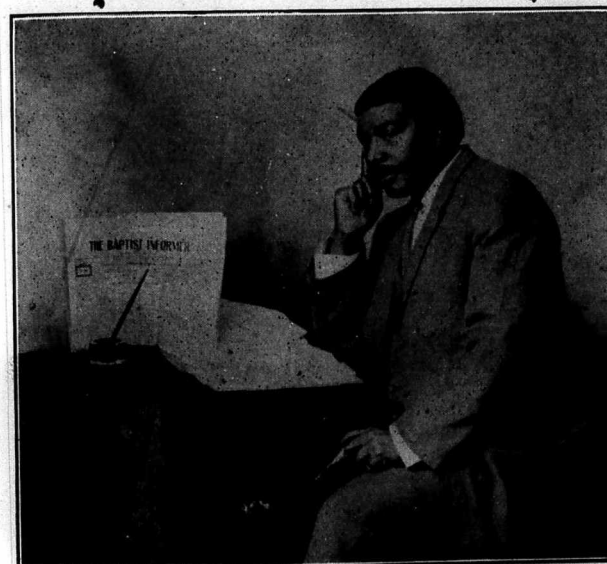

Take ye heed every one of his neighbors and trust ye not in any brother for every brother will utterly supplant, and every neighbor will walk with slanderers. And they will deceive every one of his neighbors and will not speak the truth; they have taught their tongues to speak lies and weary themselves to commit iniquity. Their tongue is as an arrow shot out; it speaketh deceit; one speaketh peaceably to his neighbor with his mouth, but in his heart, he layeth his wait.

Jeremiah the weeping prophet, although he prophesied more than 2500 years ago, gives the awful picture of the condition of the world in this, the glorious 20th century. Surely, we are living in a serious age, an age of indecency, anti-modesty. The women and girls have almost deserted womanly looks and feminine beauty, and have struck for masculine looks, mannish bobbing, whorish apparels, which consist of extreme low necks that display their nakedness, sleeves, dresses that expose their entire arms, extreme short dresses above their knees that expose their general make-up, underwear; garters and nakedness inasmuch that decent men who desire to do right are forced to never look directly at them, especially during the summer months, because they are so thinly clad they look like they have dressed to take a bath in a bathing pool or undressed to go to bed. We are forced to exclaim, where has the modesty of our women gone? And where can decency be found? And have the majority of our women both in the world and church lost their self respect? And are there any women on the order of Sarah, Rebecca and Lois? Whose adorning was outward, adorning of the hair, and of the wearing of gold and fine clothes, but

was of the heart, the real women which consisted of a meek, quiet spirit, obedient to their husband and the wife of one husband. Women as just described, are assets to the home, community, church, State and Nation, but they are very hard to find in the serious sinful age of debauchery and crime, inasmuch until we are forced to agree with the great practical writer, Lemuel, who can find a virtuous woman? For her price is far above rubies, the heart of her husband doth safely trust in her, so that he shall have no need of spoil, she will do him good and not evil all the days of her life. The above words give the high standing of a true wife and should be printed in large golden red letters and placed in an easily seen place in every room in every home, where the wife could read it daily during the serious age of infidelity of wives and husbands. This serious age demands Holy lives to guide this erring generation to steer this old ship of Zion from the gall of Sin and confusion and put her in the clear blue deep water of fidelity and safety.

This serious age is pleading and demanding Holy lives like Enoch the walking Evangelist, who walked all the way to Heaven—Noah who saved his family, Abraham who offered his only son, the son of promise in order to please God. Jacob who had visions to aid him, and wrestled with an angel which completely changed him; Moses the Mountain Top Seer that crossed the Red Sea and interceded for God to save his nation, Joshua that crossed a swollen Jordan and played hide and seek with Kings who were enemies to God's people, chained suns and halted beautiful moons to save the day for God's people. Gideon who completely defeated the Midianites. Samuel and Hannah who with their prayer won battles for God's people and turned crisis into Christmas. David who accepted Goliath's challenge, the church's great enemy and severed his head from his body, and turned defeat into victory for God's people. Daniel who roomed with hungry lions rather than to deny his God. Elijah who lived in the cliffs of the mountains and defeated Baal on Mt. Carmel and established the true worship of Jehovah. Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Daniel, Hosea, Joel, etc., who warned the people. Nehemiah who rebuilt the wall, God's Wall. Evangelist Ezra the great reformer who brought about reformation in the homes of his people. John the Baptist who preached repentance and lost his head because he preached against adultery. Paul who was stoned almost to death, placed in prison for preaching the truth. John who was sent to Patmos Isles for preaching the Gospel. Now we can see that in every age there are Holy ones to guide. Now what are we to do today? Who will lead out in our race? In our convention who will do right regardless of friends or foes, money or reputation? Indeed this age is calling for Holy lives. Read Ro. 12:1-2 and you will find out what God requires of you.

My Dear Messengers, is it very alarming when we face the actual conditions of our churches of today from a spiritual standpoint and when we say that 50 per cent of our churches of today are offensive, corpse to the community in which they are situated, which is an advertisement to all to stay away. 45 per cent of our churches are ice boxes which would almost chill the spirit of John the Baptist, the wilderness orator and old fashioned country Evangelist. Only about 5 per cent of our churches measure up to the New Testament idea in churchology because of the conditions just stated. We are suffering today with a spiritual dearth. Now let us state the sure signs of a dearth in the natural way of speaking. 1. Flying high clouds that will not hold water.

2. Heavy artificial clouds that look promising but with no results. 3. The withdrawal of rain and dew. We have given you the signs of a natural dearth. Now let us give the sure signs of a spiritual dearth. 1. An indifference to known duties. 2. No new recruits for the water. 3. No returning of the blackaliders. 4. An increasing disregard for God's day, God's people, God's word. 5. No appetite for prayer meeting or covenant meetings. 6. A permanent strike on all church worship, including giving. 7. A clean cut desire for worldly things, plus a continual wholesale birth of missionaries and ministers for Satan with the destructive earmarks for movies, base ball, dancing and other worldly pleasures minus real missionaries, young ministers and Evangelists with the spiritual earmark of Jesus Christ being born.

Now we have diagnosed the church's case and found that she is suffering with a complicated case of a spiritual dearth. Now there is a cause for every effect and we shall now state the causes or the ways of the spiritual dearth of our churches of today.

1. A general falling away from the old time county protracted meeting, thus quenching and resisting the Holy Ghost, the misunderstood member of the firm. The new recruits born in such meetings were always glad to testify for Jesus, and could give an acceptable reason for their hope in Christ.

2. The magnifying of immediate salvation minus repentance which carries with it a penitent soul crying and pleading forgiveness; which accomplished produces a complete change, plus forsaking of the old boss Satan for the new friend Jesus Christ. Note John the Baptist preached repentance, "Repent ye for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand." As preparatory for the coming of Christ; when Christ came to take up the Evangelical work where John left off, the following was his text: "The time is fulfilled and the Kingdom of God is at hand; repent ye, and believe the gospel. If the ministers of today would emulate Jesus Christ, the world's greatest Evangelist instead of emulating the preaching of some noted modern Evangelist, our church of today would have more heartfelt conversions.

3. Too much boosting for a large membership with historical and head faith religion minus heart and trusting faith. This kind of give me your hand religion and you got religion, come on and join the church, is contrary to the evidence that Evangelist Paul gives.

4. Too much preaching that sinners cannot, do not, and should not pray without substantial explanation, and as Peter, Paul, Phillip nor Christ made no argument against the sinner praying nor for the sinners to pray, let us preach the gospel of complete repentance, regeneration and personal faith in our Christ's resurrection by his father plus a public confession of same, and inasmuch as we do not know at what place the sinner is, and his general makeup for fear, we will have a miscarried baby in the Kingdom, realizing that prayer is a sincere desire unuttered or expressed and no one can be saved unless they desire salvation, and that even as Christians, we seldom pray, but we continue trying to pray let the sinner try to pray if he desires and by so doing I am sure it will do him no harm.

5. TOO MUCH PREACHING OF ONCE IN CHRIST, AND NEVER OUT, AND TOO LITTLE PREACHING OF NEVER IN CHRIST AND ALWAYS OUT. Let us fully explain the ins and outs of Christ.

6. Scarcely a little fasting and a very little consecration, is seldom pity that only two per cent of Christians of today fast and consecration is seldom really fully understood or thought of by the average church members.

7. Too many dry cleaned church members and not enough wet cleaned recruits.

8. TOO MUCH IMPROVEMENT ON THE SALVATION OF OUR FOREFATHERS AND NOT ENOUGH IMPROVEMENT ON OURSELVES. If we would spend the time we spend on trying to be called smart by improving on ourselves we would have better Christians than we have.

9. Too much preaching of the Gospel of what some poet, doctor or writer said, and not enough preaching of the common gospel of Jesus Christ. We must preach the word instead of science, no salvation in any of the stars, but the bright and morning star, no salvation in any of the flowers but the lily of the valley, and the rose of Sharon, no salvation in any of the animals but the Lamb of God, the scape goat and the lion of the tribe of Judah.

10. Too much saying of prayers and not enough of genuine praying. It is alarming when we realize that the art of prayer is almost lost and only a few persons in the world pray. If there ever was a strike there certainly is a prayer-strike on, in which 95 of all the church members including the ministers are busily engaged, and if anyone can persuade our churches of today to get on their knees and pray, he would go down on record as the 20th century's greatest reformer for accomplishing such Herculean tasks.

11. Giving of the Holy Spirit little or no consideration in our homes, churches, associations and conventions, plus his elimination in almost all of our deliberations.

12. An irregularity of the taking of the Lord's Supper, minus the spirit that it should be taken generally.

13. An almost unanimous vote against the family altar with few objections.

14. Too many factions in the church because of the office fever, plus a general strike against leadership.

15. Too many knowers in the church from birth and not from the guide nor God's word. Ignorance is a crime, my people are being destroyed for the lack of knowledge. Too few leaders who are willing to make sacrifice of living right or specializing in their work.

16. Too many short retail soul saving campaigns and not enough wholesale long Soul Saving Campaigns.

17. TOO MANY DRY CLEANED SERMONS AND NOT QUITE ENOUGH WET FRESH SERMONS.

18. Too much stress put on the preparation, looks, money that our leaders possess and not enough stress put on their character and right living.

A membership that will carefully study the Bible, daily, systematically and at least practice some of it. 6. The tithing and free-will offering which is God's plan for financing the Kingdom adopted instead of the present day mammy made scheme that we have manufactured and have to continue improving, but God's plan needs no improvement and the church financial ills will never be cured until we adopt the plans that God has given us, neither will we prosper. Read Malachi's indictment to the church and you will agree with what we have said, Malachi, 3rd chapter. 7. A membership that will spend at least 60 minutes each week out of the 10,080 minutes loaned them by the great time lender and owner, God, at prayer-meeting one night each week. 8. A church that has enough men and women with backbone enough to properly discipline their members so as to not have the entire membership disgraced because of some members, who do not care for what they do and only use the church for its influence and to hide their filth and dirt. 9. My regret No. 2, is that we have so many weak, faithless men and women in the Church and some prominent leaders who think we are crazy to talk about saving a million souls and raising a million dollars. My regret No. 3, is that so many of our people with Ministers included, are so little that they will not assist with any movement other than the movement that revolves right around in their community. My regret No. 4, is that our people have such small vision that they cannot look and behold the many promises of encouragement as given by our leader Jesus Christ.

Now, why isn't it possible to save a million souls and raise a million dollars in five years, when Henry Ford has already sold more than 15,000,000 cars and if he can sell and has sold more than 15,000,000 cars and if the orders and insurances can and do double their membership in 2 or 3 drives, and if Wrigley, the chewing gum magnate had to build larger factories in order to produce the gum for the millions of gum fans, and if Raskob, head of the General Motors Company, and now chairman of the Democratic party has an incubator hatching out millionaires having already hatched out a mighty group and has several in the incubator, pecking, trying to get out, and if the movies, baseball games, dance halls, etc., make their money by the millions and disciples likewise and build their million dollar buildings when they please, and if Dempsey and Tunney can accumulate a million dollars by fighting another man for thirty or forty minutes a few times, then why is it an impossibility for the Church which is right with God already in line to raise a million dollars and save a million souls in five years? Really if she cannot, she ought to close up and go out of business because she is a laughing stock for the world, and why is it that we can organize and kill many million in war in less than five years? And then cannot save a million in five years, Ah, Ah, give me some of the money that they gave during the World's War and I will show you what I will do for my people and my God. I dare America, the home of Washington, Lincoln and Roosevelt, to give me a chance and I will with my God to help me, redeem this old world of sin and woe, and if we can find a man that will take us up we will deliver the goods. The first reason that we can do it is because we have the souls to save by the millions, and the money by the billions, and have both



the million souls to be saved and the million dollars to save them with at a ratio of saving one soul with one dollar, why can't we do it? Note what Jesus said, "Therefore said He unto them, the harvest truly is great but the laborers are few; pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that He send forth laborers into his harvest." Lu. 10:2. Now my friends you see it is a necessity that we save a million souls because they are on the field; in other words, we have the souls to save.

The second reason that we ought to save a million souls and raise a million dollars is because this is the psychological time to do and why? Why, the world is now latent with inventions and possibilities; Lindy, the Lottie Eagle, has already accomplished the impossible and for doing so has received more honor in America alone than Jesus received in all Palestine for dying for a lost world, indeed we are living in an age of mysteries, impossibilities and wonders. A few days ago when Dempsey and Tunney were fighting in Chicago, the Windy Cosmopolitan City of the East, when some of the terrific blows were heard all over the civilized world and while the excitement was high because one had knocked the other one out, and as the radio and boxing fans were listening with much interest, all became so excited that eleven died during the fight from excitement and were thousands of miles away, and with all of our cities getting on the Air Route, and with aeroplanes playing merry-go-round in the air like birds on a spring evening, and the loud speaking radios growing more numerous every day, and the millionaires have become as common as the post-man almost, if we cannot save a million souls in five years with all this convenience we certainly cannot do so. But listen, Messengers from a thousand churches, in the words of that lowly Nazarene at Jacob's well, just before he open one of his most successful campaigns. Ah, with a heart yearning to save a world he exclaims, "Say not ye, there are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? Behold I say, I say unto you, lift up your eyes and look on the field; for they are white already for harvest." Jno. 4:35. Now perhaps we will find some millionaire that would like to be instrumental in saving a million souls because I am sure he cannot build a more lasting monument than to have to his credit having saved a million souls, which is possible and also probable, because they have given millions for education, for science, for Pathology, etc., now let us have a millionaire that will give one million for Evangelology. We ask God that He inspire some one to give us the money or all the people to give us; we do not try to dictate how it shall be done or who shall give it, just so we get the million dollars and save the million souls in five years.

Our fifth and last reason that we should save a million souls in five years and raise a million dollars, is because God is willing and ready and has given the only begotten son to save us, Jno. 3:16, and is yet pleading through the Holy Ghost trying to woo man back to his original state of right. The Lord is not slack concerning his promises as some men count slackness, but is long-suffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish, but that all should come to repentance, 2 Peter 3:9.

#### All Pioneers and Mammoth Programs Have Been Fought.

Now my friends, I am aware of the fact that this, the Evangelical Board has been and is being and will continue to be fought and the bone of contention and why should some one continue trying to destroy this Board more so than any other Board at this time? His institution, the church, was organized as a Soul winning station for the purpose of winning the world. What a mighty program, and unless we think as Jesus thought, we cannot conceive such a mammoth program. Hearing him giving his marching orders to the church from the great Green

Slope of Olivet heights and after all his last message before he bid this old world good-by. Listen to his program, and see if we are wrong in announce the FIVE YEAR ONE MILLION SOULS FOR CHRIST CAMPAIGN. Go ye therefore, and teach all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen. ## ADDRESS BY JAMES A. JACKSON TO THE NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION SHREVEPORT, LOUISIANA

SEPTEMBER 5-10, 1928.

Mr. Chairman, assembled ministers and visitors: At the request of Rev. Henry Allen Boyd, I have come seventeen hundred miles to talk a scant half dozen minutes with you. I am here because it is felt that this meeting provides an outstanding opportunity to deliver a message of vital importance effecting the comfort and immediate general welfare of not less than three million people. The officials of the Department of Commerce recognize a change in the economies of our day as compared with processes which have prevailed in other years; and the far seeing head of your own publishing interests sees, eye-to-eye with the business specialists who represent the government, that the further progress of the American public—including this and every other group—depends not so much upon direct personal savings on the part of the business man, but discretion in spending—in taking profits from increased business transactions.

As a race, we have developed wonderfully; but some certain phases of our growth have not kept pace with either the general advance of the country, or with some of our own other developments. It is to emphasize

this fact that I am here. It is to make you appreciate a grave situation that I am before you. It is my hope that six minutes hence, your sympathetic understanding will have been enlisted and that every minister present will be prompted by his own conviction to co-operate even more than has been his custom in creating a business foundation upon which our race may erect a material worth commensurate with the religious strength of a God-fearing people that is yet enduring its Gethsemane.

It is a known fact that if one desires to reach the American Negro with any idea or proposition, it is highly essential to obtain the co-operation of the church. Virtually every advancement of the race group has made progress in just such degree as has been the church interest commanded. Our every success has been predicated upon propaganda from the pulpit.

You men of the cloth talk daily, or weekly, to the largest number of our people in the country. Your parishioners represent a market of many millions of dollars in weekly payrolls. Among them are many merchants and potential merchants. The gross profit upon ordinary retail transactions is approximately 20 per cent, one fourth of which sustains with wages those who serve in stores. Nine per cent of the profits upon business is, as a rule net income to those in business, beyond what is required for a living for the merchant and his family, that represents what may be spared for business improvements, for social life, for charities, for investment in other enterprise and for cultural advancement for himself and family; and for the support of the religious institutions favored by the merchant.

As, so far, ascertained by the group of surveyors who are making a study of the Negro merchants and markets of the country at the expense of the National Negro Business League and operating with official consent and in complete harmony with the U. S. Department of Commerce Division, the Negro is doing less than 3 per cent of the business originating with race group. Because of that the race as a whole is without 97 per cent of the mercantile profits that could be theirs if they conformed to the average of the rest of the country, figured in terms of dollars and cents, the sum lost to the group is staggering.

It is to start you to thinking about improving that condition that I have come before you. Will you accept the responsibility of helping your government to create bigger and better merchants within the group?

We have come far since the responsibility for our own well being has been placed upon us as a people with the abolition of slavery, but we have yet far to go. We have made distinct educational advances, and we have established a social order comparable to that of other peoples of our day and time. The church of God has been firmly established within our hearts and the evidence of that firmness may be seen in the many structures devoted to religion that abound in the land. We have mastered trades and professions, and we have established homes.

However, our cycle of usefulness to ourselves, to the world in which we live and to the great Almighty who placed us here to serve Him, is by no means complete, nor can it be until we have comprehended the complexities of business and made certain of our having the titles with which to register the expected service to the church. It is because of that that I am here to talk business. For business enters into every activity of the life of today. Your own organization with its great Baptist Publishing house is itself one of the finest examples of big business our country knows.

Gigantic as it is, it cannot endure unless it is sustained by a great individual and collective business among the people involved with its future. It is to you, the ministers of the race that the group, and the nation look to reconcile good living, good business and such good works as will make of us worthy citizens of this land while living and worthy inheritors of a place in the kingdom that is to come.

It was once said that no race was better than its women. It may as well be stated that no people can be greater than its business. We must have business, not mere "Colored Business," but business that is susceptible of measurement by the same standards as describes the business of all people.

If I can send each of you back home with a mental resolution to do all that you can to better business conditions in your respective communities, I will have contributed a useful service to my people, will have advanced the interests of our government and made the way easier for right living for many people.

In creating the section devoted to small business units in the Domestic Commerce Division, Dr. Klein, the Director, of the Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce was actuated by the fact that 90 per cent of our entire national commercial interest is in the field of domestic business. Since this is true the success of the whole business fabric of the nation is to an important degree dependent upon the nationally scattered small merchants. This section is designed to serve as a clearing house for information pertaining to these concerns.

Our especial interest in the section is based upon the fact that in that group may be found more than 40,000 Negro merchants together with an unknown number of businesses founded upon personal services that taken altogether mean a tremendous lot to the economics of the race.

The government interest in these businesses is not an especial interest, but the logical recognition of the fact that all business is more or less related and impossible of complete division upon race or group lines. The interests of all require the protection of every unit of the whole.

The government wants every business man to benefit from the market research surveys, from the statistical information it gathers, from the business practices that have been proven good and to know that there is a source to which his problems may be addressed with the assurance that every available bit of information that may help him will be forthcoming.

I shall briefly sketch for you some few of the services the government is providing for the small business men and women that are available to you as to any other group of citizens of the country, in the hope that the ministerial leaders here assembled will relay the information to the business people of their respective congregations.

The government, through the Department of Commerce, has assumed to do those things for the small business man that no one individual business could afford to do for itself. It has taken over the large tasks of ascertaining the facts which underlie all business; the job of assembling data and compiling statistics upon which the business man may found his judgment as to the study of market trends to guide either in buying stocks of merchandise or in the selling end of the business. It has created and organized research groups for the survey and analysis of whole trade areas and whole territories to the end that every merchant may have a broader grasp of the commercial world in which he must exist.

It has established an inquiry section sustained by Research agencies and an immense library of commercial information always ready for con-

sultation by a staff of trained clerks whose sole duty is to be able to obtain the answer to every legitimate question the merchant or prospective merchant may propound. Should the desired information not be found in government publications, reports or library, the response to one's question will take the form of definite directions as to just what institutions, organization, or publication may be in position to meet one's need.

The fact that more than eighteen thousand questions originating with merchants all over the country have been answered testifies to the value of this service.

The Domestic Commerce Division extends to each of you an invitation to avail yourselves of every service it has to offer. Your request for information releases will be granted; Bureau publications will be sent to those desiring them; and every courtesy possible will be accorded you when visiting Washington or at the many District Offices, one of which may be found in about thirty of our principal cities. Material for special sermons will be cheerfully supplied.

In turn the government will appreciate your co-operation in conveying word to the mercantile interests that there is a government agency that is neither taxing nor regulatory at their service. Help us teach better business methods; and help us assemble more accurate and more definite business information about the group in order that marketing possibilities may be adequately evaluated to the general public.

You can render a particularly useful service in making clear to your charges that the survey now being conducted by the National Negro Business League deserves their full co-operation for their own benefit. For the more complete the picture of race progress revealed by the report of this survey, the greater will be the public estimate of our importance in the typical American terms of measurement, dollars and cents value.

One advertising agency has said in the offices of this Bureau that if an accurate estimate of the Negro market can be obtained he can interest 800 different advertisers in Negro newspapers. The Department of Commerce will gladly cooperate with any editor in publishing or providing facts destined to help the little fellow develop a better business. If this material accomplishes its objective of making merchants more aggressive, those same people will profit in several obvious ways.

An inefficiently operated business is not only a personal misfortune, but it is a loss upon the line of business concerned; a detriment to its community; and a liability to society at large. It is the recognition of these things that prompts the government to render every reasonable assistance to the small business man that he may instead become an asset to himself, to his community and the nation.

Your help is needed to inform the struggling business men that somewhere private or government research and survey has, perhaps, solved the problem or problems that are vexing him or collected the data by which a solution can be found; and that he may obtain the results of these surveys by the simple expedient of asking for them. Specific questions are freely answered by the Domestic Commerce Division. Some publications are sent out free, and others have a very small cost attached. Sometimes, publications from other sources may best serve, and if so, the Division directs attention to them and informs the inquirer as to where they may be obtained.

You are in better position than anyone else to encourage the timid merchants who may be fearing competition. You can scatter the gospel of efficient business methods; and you can arouse the material instinct to the point of putting into practical use the energies of our youth com-

bined with the financial reserves of the elders to the betterment of all concerned.

There are many engaged in merchandising whose early opportunities failed to provide them with as much training as they might have desired; or whom fate or circumstances, has obliged to keep so everlastingly at the duties incident to their business as to deny them time for much study of modern methods, the latest devices and newly discovered practices. The government service as presented by the Department of Commerce is a boon to such as these. We ask you to tell them about it.

In the many publications compiled and released by the Domestic Commerce Division may be found one, or more, of particular interest to persons in almost every line of business. These publications, in some instances, are given free distribution; and in no instance do they cost more than a comparative pittance when one considers that each contains a liberal education upon some specific phase of business.

Each person within my hearing, and all to whom they feel inclined to mention the matter, are invited to consult with your humble servant and take with you, so long as they last, the leaflets I have with me descriptive of such publications as may interest you.

Should you desire to learn more about advertising appropriations, community advertising, budgeting your business, retail store leasing, warehouse contracts, wholesale trade territories, meat markets and the handling of meats, to know the market research organizations of the country, something of traffic as it affects trade, store types, or something of trade association activities, your government has printed matter that will be helpful to you. You may thus be introduced to something that will be instrumental in increasing business, something to facilitate the conduct of business with greater efficiency and make someone a greater contributor to the general welfare of the country.

You may be helpful, too, by directing thought to the need for our schools and colleges to devote more attention to the practical application of the lessons they teach in economics and business administration by the conducting of market surveys, commodity studies, distribution methods and similar activities that besides giving real training, create recognition for the schools, their faculty and students because such reports find their way into business channels.

If our students are to find place in the larger business activities of the country, or if they are to be of genuine service to you and to our other industrial and commercial interests, this training must be emphasized. Some institutions might take a leaf from the work of Prof. W. C. Mainey, Director of the school of Business administration at Bluefields Institute, West Virginia who has evolved a laboratory method of teaching business that has been approved by some eminent authorities. It may be advisable that our business institutions give thought to co-operating with the schools and endowing research for them as has been suggested by a recent editorial in a Washington, D. C., newspaper.

These are matters that deserve your interest. They concern our future from the viewpoint of the good citizenship.

I wish to emphasize the fact that your government and its services are as available to women as to men. It is asked only that a bona fide interest is to be served and that sincerity rather than idle curiosity prompt the inquiries that are sent into the Bureau.

For some time our group has been concerned with the proportion of insurance of the group that is being carried by our own insurance companies. Lack of definite accurate, and complete, information of a sta-

tistical character has heretofore nullified arguments, pro and con, on this matter. Recognizing the basic value of authoritative charted data upon a subject that so greatly effect all of our business because Insurance is at present our dominant interest, the Domestic Commerce Division in conjunction with the National Negro Insurance Association is now surveying that field, so you may be assured that the doubtful days of emotional argument concerning insurance with us will soon be succeeded by facts founded upon the certain premises of statistics.

The Bureau of Foreign and Domestic Commerce has acquiesced to every request for a representative to explain its workings, to present new business viewpoints and to help advance efforts toward bigger and better business; and to educate the people to recognizing the necessity of abandoning the idea of doing business upon emotional grounds, by appeal to distinctions instead of doing business upon established principles that apply to all people alike. With your cooperation and intelligent utilization of these services as an encouraging influence the Department of Commerce hopes, not only to continue existing services, but to expand its already extensive machinery to the end that all business may become more efficient; and because of the interdependence of the Commerce of the Nation that the whole country will be bettered thereby.

Business management, as a subject commands no less than one hundred and twenty-four major phases, each of which is the subject of a recognized library book.

No less than nine thousand different organizations of local, state and national character serve to make practical the spirit of cooperation with which the American public as a whole approaches the problems of bettering business.

In the main, we have been without these helps. The fault is not entirely our own.

Not all of the handicaps may, however, be attributed to race attitude. We ourselves, are in a measure at fault for some of the strictures our business endure. Unchristian envy and devilish jealousies together with crass ignorance have conspired to obstruct our business ventures.

Haphazard ventures into things we know not of, is perhaps the father of most of our difficulties. Lack of capital is another, yet there is much money in our group. The financial phase is too great to be treated as part of this brief talk. Our problem is not so much to create more capital, but to use to greater advantage what funds are in hand. The trial and error system has prevailed too long with most of us. The time has come to call a halt upon this method of business because it is too costly for us to continue practices that came into vogue because we know of no other way of doing things at the time we began business.

Between the ministry and the government service I believe a better day is drawing. In closing may I thank you for your attention, and state that I have with me here some publications that you might care to look over. So long as they last, you are welcome to them. Take them along home, peruse them at your leisure rather than to permit their intruding upon the time intended for the business of the convention. Better still write to the Domestic Commerce Division asking for publications covering such subjects as may interest you. I thank you.

Brother President and brethren of the National Baptist Convention:

We have come at the close of another year's work to submit to you our report as auditor.

It is indeed a pleasure to report that Dr. Henry A. Boyd, the Secretary of your Publishing Board always welcomes the auditor to the

Publishing House, and turns over to him all books and accounts that are to be audited. We found the books correct.

It is also gratifying to note a large increase in the volume of business and a decided decrease in the indebtedness of the Publishing Board. Dr. Preston Taylor says that business white men who are financiers have expressed to him their surprise at the successful way in which Dr. Boyd conducts the business of the publishing plant.

But brethren I regret that we are making the work doubly hard for our secretary when unpaid accounts stand on the books today totaling the staggering amount of \$40,522.78.

The sum of \$15,081.49 is owed for literature alone. And \$17,958.37 for printing. Brothers it is also sad to relate that we owe our own publishing house \$4,358.14, for which we have given our notes and yet fail to cancel. In the further discharge of my duties as auditor I audited the books and accounts of the Home Mission Board. The secretary, Dr. J. Hendon has kept the books in a simple, accurate system, for which he deserves much credit.

Next we audited the books of the Women's Convention Auxiliary to the National Baptist Convention and found them correct. They were kept with scrupulous neatness. Mrs. Hendon uses a simple but recent form of book keeping.

After carefully examining the books and vouchers belonging to the treasurer of the Educational Board we found them to be correct also.

I did not succeed in securing the books of any other of our boards. Bro. President each board of this convention makes a plea each year for financial aid, regardless of the amount, you rule that the books of each board should be examined by the auditor. Despite the efforts made by the auditor there has been no opportunity to inspect the books of the Foreign Mission Board, Evangelistic Board, Layman's League Board, nor the books of the Benefit Board of the convention and Church Extension Board.

That we enter into a Compact in the interest of harmony among the Negro Baptists of America, and under the terms of this Compact The Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Missionary Society, U. S. A., will be made the agency for the propagation of all the work on foreign fields for the

two Conventions, namely: The National Baptist Convention, Uninc., U. S. A., and the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Missionary Society, U. S. A.

## II.

That the National Baptist Convention, Uninc., will have the full responsibility of promoting the full program of the home work of the constituents of the two Conventions, namely: Education; Publications; and Home Missionary work.

## III.

That under this Compact neither organization shall surrender its sovereignty or autonomy.

## IV.

That the question of the regulation of the union of the foreign missionary work of the two organizations shall be submitted to a joint-commission for adjustment. That said commission be appointed, respectively, by the National Baptist Convention, Uninc., and The Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Missionary Society. The said commission shall consist of ten members, five appointed by each body.

## V.

That the churches of the two Conventions, insofar as they can be influenced by the respective bodies, under the terms of this Compact, shall assume their full proportionate share of all the activities of both.

## VI.

(a) That members of each Convention, by the terms of this Compact, may become officers in the officary and boards of the other Convention, as delegates, and under the terms of the constitution, respectively, of each Convention. (b) That the National Baptist Convention, Uninc., shall have proportionate representation on the Executive Board of the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Missionary Society, and the boards of The National Baptist Convention, Uninc., shall give adequate representation to the constituency of the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Missionary Convention.

## VII.

This Compact shall bind each Convention to work in good faith for the success and prosperity of the other. They shall be absolutely one in the program devised by both.

## VIII.

It is further agreed under the terms of this Compact, that any disposition to change or amend any of the conditions of this Compact by either Convention will be formally submitted in writing, giving reasons for the same, to the other body.

(Formally adopted by the vote of the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Missionary Convention, Washington, D. C., September, 1924; and ratified by the vote of the National Baptist Convention, Uninc., Chicago, Ill., September, 1924.)

# MINUTES OF MEETING OF JOINT-COMMISSION, NATIONAL AND LOT CAREY MISSIONARY BAPTIST CONVENTIONS

Indianapolis, Ind., Nov. 12th, 1924.

The Joint Commission of the National-Lot Carey Baptist Conventions, appointed for the purpose of working out methods of adjustment in the unification of the missionary work of the two bodies, pursuant to the terms of a certain Compact, adopted by the Lot Carey Baptist Missionary Convention and the National Baptist Convention at their September, 1924 meetings, respectively, met on the above date, at 11:15 a. m. with the Mt. Paran Baptist Church, Indianapolis.

The following members were present:

National Convention—D. E. Over, S. S. Jones, J. E. Wood (Proxy for Frank), J. W. Hurse, J. P. Robinson, J. H. Frank (Later).

Lot Carey Convention—A. A. Graham, W. T. Johnson, O. S. Bullock, W. H. Stokes, C. S. Brown (Proxy).

The meeting was organized by the election of W. T. Johnson, Chairman and D. E. Over, secretary. The chairman then stated the purpose of the meeting and asked J. W. Hurse to offer prayer.

The Compact, existing between the two Conventions, was read and the chairman asked for suggestions relative to articles of agreement by which to unify the work. Tentative articles were submitted by the commissioners of the National Baptist Convention and were, by common consent, accepted as a working basis for argument and discussion and agreement.

After a full period was consumed in consideration of the proposition, the following was adopted by the Commission:

## The Corrected Articles.

It is to be noted that the composition or ratio of the membership making up the reorganized Boards is left in blank and a special committee, composed of A. A. Graham, D. E. Over and J. E. Wood, was appointed to consider the matter and report to the next meeting of the commission.

Extended verbal statements were made by Secretary Graham, of Lot Carey Board, and W. B. Wood, of National Foreign Board, relative to the work and assets of the two Boards, respectively.

The meeting then adjourned at 2:30 p. m. for dinner.

At 3:30 p. m. the commission was again called to order by the chairman. The minutes of the morning session were read and approved.

Having gone carefully over the agreements made at the morning session they were formally ratified by the unanimous vote of the commission.

After some further discussion, a committee of three, A. A. Graham, D. E. Over and J. H. Frank, was appointed to publish the agreements of the Joint-Commission to the churches of the two convention.

The Joint-Commission then adjourned and dismissed with prayer.

# ARTICLES OF AGREEMENT EFFECTED AND RATIFIED BY THE JOINT-COMMISSION OF THE NATIONAL BAPTIST AND LOT CAREY BAPTIST FOREIGN MISSIONARY CONVENTIONS FOR THE PURPOSE OF UNIFYING THE FOREIGN MISSIONARY EFFORT AND INTERESTS OF THE TWO ORGANIZATIONS, INDIANAPOLIS, INDIANA, NOVEMBER 12TH, 1924.

Pursuant to the terms of a certain Compact, ratified by the Lot Carey Baptist Foreign Missionary Convention in annual meeting, September, Washington, D. C., and the National Baptist Convention, in annual meeting, September, 1924, Chicago, Illinois, the Joint-Commission, appointed by the two conventions, composed of five members from each, agree to the following:

FIRST—That in order that all the Foreign Missionary work of the two Conventions may be ultimately committed to the Foreign Missionary Board of the Lot Carey Convention, it is agreed that the personnel of the said Board of the Lot Carey Convention be so reorganized as to contain a membership representative of the two Conventions at the ratio of .....

SECOND—That the proposed reorganization of the said Lot Carey Board be effected at the next annual meeting of the Lot Carey Convention. And further, in order that the interests of the two Conventions be fully balanced and conserved, it is provided that at the next annual meeting of the National Baptist Convention, all the Boards of the said National Baptist Convention be reorganized so as to contain a like representation of the membership of the Lot Carey Convention.

THIRD—That when such reorganization shall have been fully effected and each Convention shall have received full and proportionate representation on the Boards of the other, the whole of the Foreign Missionary interests of the two Conventions be committed to the control and direction of the LOT CAREY FOREIGN MISSIONARY BOARD.

FOURTH—That for the term of the present conventional year, each of the two missionary boards shall operate under their present existing organizations, but in the full co-operation with the secretary of the Lot Carey Foreign Missionary Board; all moneys gathered by the Foreign Missionary Board of the National Baptist Convention shall be appropriated to the treasury of the Lot Carey Foreign Missionary Board; and that the said Lot Carey Board shall immediately assume the direction of the work now being operated by the National Baptist Foreign Missionary Board.

FIFTH—That this Joint-Commission shall charge itself with the duty of making full and complete inventory of all the property, real and personal, together with a full list of stations, activities and workers of each of the two Boards and that copy of the same, reserving title as now

held, be placed on file with each the National and Lot Carey Conventions; but that all subsequent acquisitions, following the proposed reorganization of the said Lot Carey Foreign Missionary Board, shall be placed in the title of the said Lot Carey Board.

SIXTH—That as immediate as it is conveniently possible, there shall be furnished to the secretary of the Lot Carey Board a full list of all the churches, associations and conventions comprising the National Baptist Convention and that a similar list of all the churches and organizations comprising the Lot Carey Convention shall be furnished by the secretary or other officer of the Lot Carey Board or Convention to the executive secretary of each Board of the National Baptist Convention.

SEVENTH—That these several items of agreement become immediately operative; and that these agreements, together with the original Compact now in force between the two Conventions, be published in the church press, and that copies be sent through the mails to all the churches of the Lot Carey and National Baptist Conventions.

The following proposition is referred by the Joint-Commission to the Lot Carey Foreign Missionary Board when the above provision shall have been put into effect:

Following the proposed reorganization of all the Boards of the National and Lot Carey Baptist Conventions, for the purpose of the most convenient expedition of the Foreign Missionary work of the two Conventions, the field shall be divided into three or more districts, bounded and determined after careful survey and study by this Joint-Commission, each under a superintendent working under the direction and subject to the full oversight of the executive secretary of the reorganized Lot Carey Board of Foreign Missions.

Adopted and ratified by the Joint-Commission of the National and Lot Carey Foreign Missionary Baptist Conventions, November 12th, 1924, Indianapolis, Indiana.

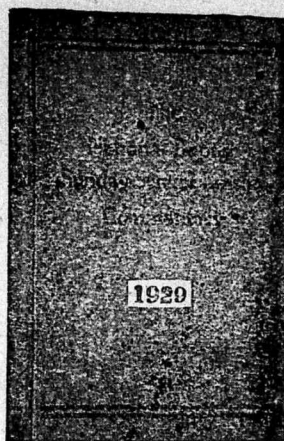
