HISTORICAL REFERENCE

April 5, 1886, an open letter to the Baptist Clergy and laymen was issued by the Rev. Wm. J. Simmons in the American Baptist asking if we should have a National Baptist Convention to discuss questions of interest to our beloved denomination. At that time the following reasons were given.

- 1. To promote personal piety, sociability, and a better knowledge of each other.
- To be able to have an understanding as to the great ends to be reached by the Denomination.
- 3. To encourage our literary men and women and to promote the interest of Baptist literature.
- To discuss questions pertaining to especially the religious educational, industrial and social interest of our people.
- 5. To give an opportunity for the best thinkers and writers to be heard
- That, united, we may be more powerful for good and strengthen our pride in the Denomination.

Having been solicited to write the call by many whose names and endorsement are hereunto affixed, the call is hereby made by their advice and solicitations for said Convention to meet in St. Louis, Missouri, August 25, 1886, 10:00 o'clock a.m. in the First Baptist Church, and the pastor thereof is hereby requested to serve as a Committee of Arrangement with power to select his associates. CONSTITUTION

OF THE

National Baptist Convention of America

We, the members of the Foreign Mission Baptist Convention of the United States of America, The American National Baptist Convention and the Baptist National Educational Convention; in order to form a more perfect United National Baptist Organization, to secure the blessings of unity for capable and efficient Foreign Mission. Home Mission and Educational work among ourselves and throughout of the world; do ordain and establish this Constitution.

ARTICLE 1. NAME: This Body shall be known as "The National Baptist Convention of America.

ARTICLE 2-NATURE AND FUNCTION

SECTION 1. The National Baptist Convention of America shall serve as an Agency of Christian Education, Missionary and Church Extension; and combine the efforts of Baptist Churches and Organizations in extending the gospol both at home and to the Foreign fields; and propagate Baptist Doctrines of faith and distinctive principles throughout the world.

SECTION 2 It shall give its influence in maintaining and safeguarding full religious liberty and spiritual independence on both

the home and the foreign fields.

ARTICLE 3-MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1. The membership of this Convention shall be annual. Orthodox Bantist Churches, District Associations, General Associations and State Conventions.

SECTION 2. Each Church shall register with One Dollar (\$1.00) per member, (minimum of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) representation fee in this Convention), and be entitled to one messenger. Ten Dollars (\$10.00) shall be paid for each additional messenger.

SECTION 3. Each District Association shall pay Fifty Dollars (\$50 00) for representation and be entitled to two (2) messengers. Ten Dollars (\$10.00) shall be paid for each additional messenger.

SECTION 4. Each General Association and State Convention shall pay One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for representation and be entitled to five (5) messengers. Ten dollars (\$10.00) shall be paid for each additional messenger

ARTICLE 4-OFFICERS

The officers of this Convention shall be President: First Vice President; Second Vice President; Recording Secretary; First, Second. Third and Fourth Assistant Recording Secretaries: Corresponding Secretary; Statistical Secretary; Treasurer; Auditor; Director of Public Relations; Historian; and Secretary of Youth Activities. Each officer shall be elected annually.

The President of each State Convention and Moderator of each General Association holding membership in this Convention shall

be Associate Vice-Presidents

ARTICLE 5-ELECTION OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The committee on the nomination of Officers shall be appointed by the President; and make its report following the report of Officers not later than the Friday afternoon session.

SECTION 2. The election of Officers shall be made by roll call of states.

SECTION 3. The time for election in each annual session shall be set by the Executive Board and listed in the printed program.

SECTION 4. Only registered messengers shall have the privilege of voting in the election of officers in the National Baptist Convention of America

SECTION 5. In no case shall an officer be eligible for reelection prior to his submission of an annual report from his office.

ARTICLE 6-EXECUTIVE BOARD

SECTION 1. The Executive Board shall consist of the elected officers of the Convention, the Chairman and Corresponding Secretaries of the Board, and the Presidents of the State Conventions.

SECTION 2. The elected Officers of the Convention shall be reimbursed for their travel expense to the Executive Board Meetings.

ARTICLE 7-FUNCTION OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

SECTION 1. The Executive Board shall transact the unfinished business of the Convention in the interims.

SECTION 2. The Executive Board shall arrange regional meet-

ings and conferences as may be deemed necessary,

SECTION 3. If any chosen site for the annual session is found to be unsatisfactory, the Executive Board under the direction of the President shall select the place for the next annual session of the Convention to meet elsewhere.

ARTICLE 8-DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The President: He shall be the presiding officer: authorize the calling of all regular and special meetings; sign all orders drawn on the treasurer; appoint or cause to be appointed all committees and commissions not elected by the General Body; and he shall be the chairman of the Executive Board.

SECTION 2. The First Vice President: At the request of the President or in case of resignation, death, or inability of the President to discharge the power and duties of said officer, the Vice

President shall fill the office of the President.

SECTION 3. Second Vice President: He shall perform the duties that are carried by the President and First Vice President as needs

SECTION 4. The Recording Secretary: This Secretary shall keep a correct record of all the proceedings of the Convention in session: compile and distribute the minutes, prepare and distribute the enrollment cards; draw all drafts on the treasurer; (all drafts must be signed by the President) He shall make an annual report to the

SECTION 5. The First Assistant Recording Secretary: The Secretary shall assist the Recording Secretary in making the records of the Annual meetings and do whatever is required through the Re-

SECTION 6. The Second Assistant Recording Secretary: This Secretary shall record the doings of the Committee on Credentials. prepare his records for the minutes and do what ever is required through the Recording Secretary.

SECTION 7 The Third Assistant Recording Secretary: This Secretary shall record the work of the committee on Finance. He shall

keep a record of all finance received into the Convention and do whatever else required through the Recording Secretary.

SECTION 8. The Fourth Assistant Recording Secretary: This Secretary shall record the work of the Committee on Claims and Accounts and do whatever is required through the Recording Sec-

SECTION 9. The Corresponding Secretary: The Corresponding Secretary shall do all the Convention and Executive Board correspondence, as directed by the Convention through its President. He shall make an annual report to the Convention.

SECTION 10. The Statistical Secretary: This Secretary shall gather the statistics of the Convention and Baptist generally and

report the same Annually. SECTION 11. The Treasurer: He shall receive all finance of the Convention and pay or appropriate it as required by the Convention or the President. He shall keep his records so as to preserve perpetually for reference and report annually receipts and disbursements.

SECTION 12. Auditor: He shall audit all records of the Board and the Treasurer of the Convention; each of which shall be examined at least Thirty Days (30) prior to the Annual session.

SECTION 13. Director of Public Relations: The Director of Public Relations shall give publicity to all of the aims and objectives of the National Convention and its Auxiliaries.

SECTION 14. Historian: He shall keep a correct history of the Convention, report annually, and preserve the history for future reference. The Historian shall also publish documented records of the Negro in the Baptist Churches.

SECTION 15. Secretary of Youth Activities: Secretary of Youth Activities shall serve as coordinator between the Parent Convention and the Youth Auxiliary Convention. The Convention holds him responsible for the full compliance of the Youth Auxiliary with its

objectives and procedures.

ARTICLE 9. CONVENTION BOARDS AND THEIR DUTIES SECTION 1. This Convention shall have the following Roards: Home Missian, Foreign Mission, B.T.U., National Baptist Publishing,

Evangelical, Benevolent, Educational. SECTION 2. Each Board shall be composed of one member from each State Convention and General Association, and approved by the

Convention Said election shall be annually.

SECTION 3. Officers: The Boards shall have a Chairman, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer. The officers of Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer may be combined. SECTION 4. Duties of Officers: The Chairman of Boards shall

preside at all board meetings. The Recording Secretary of each board shall keep a true record of the proceedings of the board.

SECTION 5. The Corresponding Secretary shall be Secretary-Treasurer of each Board and do all the correspondence of the Board, being subject to all its rules and regulations. The Secretary-Treasurer of each Board shall receive and disburse all finance, hold all deeds and other property as the Board may direct, and be governed by the rules and regulations of the Board

SECTION 6. Management: The Chairman, Corresponding Secretary and three (3) other members of the board shall constitute the Board of Management. Each board shall be subject to the Convention in all it does during the meeting of the Convention and during the interims.

SECTION 7. Reports of Boards: Each Board shall make an annual report to the Convention.

SECTION 8. The compensation of each officer and employee of the Boards shall be fixed by each Board. Compensations shall be limited to the Chairman, Recording Secretary and Corresponding

SECTION 9. The compensation of each board is subject to the approval of the convention, and thus must be presented to the con-

vention for proper authorization.

SECTION 10. Duties of Boards: The Home Mission Board shall seek to keep alive struggling Churches, maintain a Baptist Christian Witness, and seek to extend the work of the Kingdom in newly settled or densely populated areas in the domains of the Convention.

The Foreign Mission Board shall seek extended fields of the

Great Commission in saving the lost wherever approved by the Con-

The Educational Board shall give encouragement to those institutions endorsed by the convention and shall attempt to build an influence that the pulpit and leadership of the church will be more

The National Baptist Publishing Board shall have charge of the publications of the Convention.

The Evangelical Board shall carry the program of Evangelism approved by the Convention.

ARTICLE 10-AUXILIARIES

SECTION 1. There shall be a Senior Women's Auxiliary National Baptist Convention, Junior Women's Auxiliary, National Baptist Convention, National Baptist Brotherhood Auxiliary Convention and Nurse Corp National Baptist Convention,

SECTION 2. All messengers to the Auxiliary Convention shall be appointed and certified on the official letter of the Convention

by the Churches of the Convention.

SECTION 3. All Auxiliary Conventions are subject to the action of the National Baptist Convention of America.

SECTION 4. Each Auxiliary Convention shall elect a President, Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, and such other officers as may be required.

SECTION 5. All officers elected by the auxiliary conventions must be submitted to the National Baptist Convention for approval. SECTION 6. All auxiliary conventions shall report all of their receipts and dishursements for the conventional year at the annual session to the National Baptist Convention of America.

SECTION 7. All monies collected by auxiliary conventions at the annual session must be reported and turned over to the Finance Committee of the General Body of the National Baptist Convention

of America daily.

SECTION 8. The auxiliary conventions will report their bills and expense to the National Baptist Convention of America for approval, which shall, under no circumstances, exceed 40 per cent of the total

SECTION 9. The auxiliary conventions may accept representation fees from any and all auxiliaries of the local church, included in their work, subject to their approved constitutional regulations.

ARTICLE 11-COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Registration Committees of the National Baptist Convention of America and its Auxiliaries, working jointly with the Finance Committee shall open the office of registration the Tuesday, 12:00 Noon prior to the opening of the Convention.

SECTION 2. There shall be three (3) committees appointed by the President to take care of the business of the convention.

(a) Finance Committee: Shall receive and be responsible for all finance coming into the convention, and report the same to the

(b) Committee on Bills and Accounts: Shall receive and investigate all bills, accounts, and recommend the amount to be paid by

the Convention.

(c) Credentials Committee: In keeping with SECTION 8. There shall be a standing Budget Committee; Responsible for preparation and current revision of a working budget for the National Baptist Convention and all its Auxiliaries. ARTICLE 2-MEETINGS

The Convention shall begin its meeting Wednesday before the Second Lord's Day in September and close the following Sunday Night The place shall be selected by the convention in annual meeting with places chosen two years in advance of next current session.

ARTICLE 13. Representation in other organizations: The National Baptist Convention of America shall hold membership in the Baptist World Alliance and may hold membership in such other organizations as it from time to time elects.

ARTICLE 14. Commissions: There shall be a Commission on Transportation, Christian Education, Social Justice and Army and

Navy Chaplains.

(1) The Railroad Commission shall consist of (5) members, elected annually and shall have charge of all transportation.

(2) The Commission on Christian Education shall consist of nine members, elected annually and shall plan and promote the Educational program of the Convention.

(3) The Commission on Social Justice shall consist of five (5) members and shall plan and promote such programs as will provide

Christian concern for the welfare of oppressed peoples.

(4) The Commission of Army and Navy Chaplains shall have charge of recommending Chaplains for the Army and Navy and shall consist of three (3) members.

ARTICLE 15. This Constitution may be amended at any time by a majority vote of the Convention in the annual session provided written notice is given on the first day of the session.

2. Officers of the convention and all auxiliaries, officers and

members of all boards shall be members of a Baptist Church hold-

ing membership in the Convention. 3. Messengers enrolled upon presenting proper credentials from the churches, state conventions and general associations shall constitute the convention. The enrollment of messengers may begin 10 days prior to the conventions annual meeting.

4. Finance:

(a) An approved bookkeeping system of receipts and disbursements shall be kept by the treasurer of the Convention, the treasurer of all auxiliary conventions, and secretary-treasurer of each board.

(b) The following system shall be used in the handling of con-

vention funds:

- (a) All funds received by the Finance Committee of the Convention and the executive board shall be receipted with three (3) carbon stubs; one for the secretary of the committee and one for the auditor of the convention.
- (b) The finance committee shall issue a daily report signed by the chairman and secretary of the committee and the treasurer of

the convention.

- (c) All funds shall be deposited each day in a convention depository through a local bank where the convention is in session.
- (d) During the annual session, the Auditor of the Convention shall check and compare the receipts with the funds each day.

(e) All funds shall be paid out by check.

- (f) The treasurer of the convention, the chairman, secretary and treasurer of the Finance Committee shall be bonded.
- (g) The auxiliary treasurers shall deposit daily with the finance committee and take its receipt.

(h) The auxiliaries of the convention shall not use more than

forty percent of funds collected for operating expenses.

- (i) The convention shall have the right to designate only undesignated funds. All designated funds must be turned over to the causes for which designated.
- (j) The salaries of the officers of the Convention shall be separated from the expenses and all expense itemized.

The Railroad Commission will be paid \$100.00 Annually.

The Committee on Orthodox will be paid \$50.00 each not to exceed two members.

The Committee on Social Justice \$150.00.

The Musical Directress and Organist are to be paid \$25.00 per day during the session of the Convention, plus \$5.00 per day for heard and lodging.

The enrollment Committee is not to exceed six members, and shall be paid \$10.00 per day total sum for the committee not to

exceed \$300.00.

ADOPTION

Regeneration begins the new life in the soul; justification deals with the new attitude of God towards the soul, or perhaps better, of that soul towards God; adoption admits man into the family of God with filial joy. Regeneration has to do with our change in nature; justification, with our change in standing; sanctification, with our change in character: adoption, with our change in position. In regeneration the believer becomes a child of God (John 1:12, 13); in adoption, the believer, already a child, receives a place as an adult son; thus the child becomes a son, the minor becomes an adult, (Gal. 4:1-7).

I. The Meaning of adoption: Adoption means, the placing of a son. It is a legal metaphor. It is a Roman word, for adoption was hardly, if at all, known among the Jews. It means the taking by one man of the son of another to be his son, so that, that son has the same position and all the advantages of a son by bith. The word is Patione, not Johannine. The word is never once used of Christ. It is used of the believer when the question of rights, privileges, and heirship are involved. It is peculiarly a Pauline word (Gal. 4:5; Rom. 8:15, 23; 9:4; Eph. 1:5). John uses the word "children," not "sons," because he is always speaking of sonship from the standpoint of nature, growth, and likeness (cf. 1 John 3:1 R.V.).

Exodus 2:10 and Heb. 11:24, furnish two splendid illustrations

of the Scriptural sense and the use of adoption.

The time when adoption takes place, in a certain sense is eternal in its nature. Eph. 1:4, 5-Before the foundation of the world we were predestinated unto the adoption of children. We need to distinguish between the foreordaining to adoption, and the actual act of adoption which took place when we believed in Christ. Just as the incarnation was foreordained, and yet took place in time; and just as the Lamb was slain before the foundation of the world, and yet actually on Calvary. Why then mention this eternal aspect of adoption? To exclude works and to show that our salvation had its origin solely in the grace of God (Rom, 9:11; 11:5, 6). Just as if we should adopt a child it would be wholly a gracious act on our part.

It takes place the moment one believes in Jesus Christ: 1 John 3:3—"Beloved, now we are the sons of God," Gal. 3:26—"For we are all children of God by faith in Jesus Christ." See also (John 1:12— "But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the

sons of God, even to them that believed on his name.")

Sonship is now the present possession of the believer. Strange as it may be, inconceivable as it may seem, it is nevertheless true. The world may not think so (ver. 1), but God says so, and the Christian believing it, exclaims, "I am a child of the King. Formerly we were slaves; now we are sons.

Our sonship will be completed at the resurrection and coming again of our Lord Jesus Christ: Rom. 8:23—"Waiting for the adoption, to-wit, the redemption of the body." Here in this world we are incognito; we are not recognized as the sons of God. But some day we shall throw off this disguise, 2 Cor. 5:10—"For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things done in his body, according to that he hath done, whether it be good or bad."

It doth not appear, it hath not appeared what we shall he; the revelation of the sons of God is reserved for a future day. (See also 1 John 3:1-3)-"That which was from the beginning, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked upon, and our hands have

handled, of the word of life; (For the life was manifested, and we have seen it, and bear witness, and shew unto you that eternal life, which was with the Father, and was manifested unto us); That which we have seen and heard declare we unto you, that ye also may have fellowship with us; and truly our fellowship is with the Father, and with his Son Jesus Christ.

The blessings of adoption: The blessings of adoption are to numerous to mention save in the briefest way. Some of them are as



REPORT OF THE COMMISSION ON CHRISTIAN MINISTRY

By Rev. C. A. Holliday, Chairman San Antonio, Texas-Sept. 5, 1968

President J. C. Sams, Officers, and Members of our National Bapin Convention of America. It is indeed a happy privilege to bring to your annual report on the Christian ministry. Since we met last ye it was my pleasure to attend a Midwest-Consultation on Yes Ministry in Tulsa, Oklahoma Nov. 1-3, 1967 with emphasis on read ing the "Now Generation."

BAPTIST CONVENTION OF AMERICA

You have heard brief statements from other members of the commission. I shall confine my report to emphasis on a continuing educa-tion of professional leadership in the National Baptist Convention of America.

of America.

The most urgent demand of our day is to offer guidance and directions along which the denomination may move with the high purpose of development of an adequate approach to a life long professional growth and training for its leadership. "Professional Leadership" as used here refers to ordained, commissioned, or lay persons who are employed for a major part of their time by the denomination or mostly by some of our large institutional churches—viz. Ministers of Education, Music, Youth Directors, Counselors, Evangelists, and other dentities the successful. administrative personnel.

THE MINISTER'S CHANGING ROLE

The role of the ministry today is changing and ambiguous. Men and women called to professional leadership in the church find themselves bewildered by the varieties of expectations people have of them and confused by their own conflicting concepts of ministry. It is not surprising that this situation should exist; many professions are undergoing redefinition in response to radical changes in the values and structures of society. It is surprising that the church until recently has not taken seriously the difficult emotional, intellectual, and social tensions created within the minister who is seeking to discover his role and equip himself to handle it responsibly.

Among the factors that are influencing a redefinition of Christian ministry are:

1. A rediscovery of the place of laity in the church;
2. The emergence of the concept of church as mission; A contemporary emphasis upon involvement as a way of life;

The affirmation of the secular as the context in which life and ministry must be conducted:

The acceptance of cultural change as inevitable and as a factor affecting religious values and practices:

The recognition that man is a prime mover in the control and direction of change;

The development of a highly educated and highly specialized

population in America; The thrust of the civil rights revolution;

The rapid movement toward an urban society.

This is a priority list for the Christian Ministry today.

In the light of these realities professional leaders of the churches are ompelled to re-examine their identity and perhaps to seek retraining n order to better fulfill their functions in today's world.

Continuing education is set against this background. Its urgency rises out of the need to facilitate essential change and growth in he church's leadership in a time that calls for strong, sensitive, vell-informed, and competent ministers. It is aware of a world that equires a far more adequate view of ministry than the church now possesses. It is also aware of men and women in ministry frustrated by their own sense of inadequacy and ambiguity. To assist the thurch in its response to the world's need and to undergrid ministers n their quest for clarity and competence, an ongoing series of learning experiences is required.

THE PURPOSE OF CONTINUING EDUCATION

The purpose of continuing education in our National Baptist Convention should be geared to assist these leaders to find and fulfill their roles in the church and in the world with personal integrity and professional competence by engaging them in a life-long experience of learning.

This objective is realized at several levels. For all professional persons it involves

a) The development of daily personal disciplines of study, observation, and evaluation that makes it possible to learn from life and work. It means also

Frequent participation in short-term study away from home. In addition it requires for some

c) The development of a program of accredited graduate study. A major concern of our NBCA in continuing education should be to discover and to develop and promote educational resources that will help ministers achieve this objective at each of these levels. Make full use of all of our church related schools and semmaries.

THE NEEDS OF MINISTERS

I see 10 or more penants on the walls of this auditorium, viz— The development of continuing education must be regulated by the needs of the church and of the world, but it must also be sensitive to the needs of persons who are ministers. A number of surveys made by other denominations and by foundations have helped to define the areas of need experience by the minister. The needs of minister may be described under four headings:

AREAS OF LEARNING FOR CONTINUING EDUCATION

In response to these needs ministers will seek learning experience in a wide variety of disciplines. Significant areas of study and

exploration may be classified under four headings.

A. Areas of learning that are primarily Biblical and Theological. Reference is made here to what is often referred to as the "conveniented with the convenience of the cological education including Bible, Theology, and Church History. It is, of course, urgent that a man in ministry keep up-to-date on developments in these three basic fields related to the interpretation of the traditions of the church. However, it should be made clear that the reference is not primarily to theology in the systematic sense or to Biblical study in the Academic sense. The minister is in need of studies that engage him in a reflection upon his own life, the lives of his parishioners, and the world in which they live from a biblical and theological perspective. He needs help in relating academic approaches in theology, Bible, and history to the living issues with which he and his parishioners deal daily.

B. Areas of learning that are primarily concerned with broadening the minister's understanding of people and of the world around them.

The minister is in constant need of expanding his horizons of knowledge, increasing his understanding of man and of man's world, and comprehending the meaning of culture and cultural change.

Emphasis must be placed here upon learning experiences that acquaint the minister with developments in a wide variety of disciplines. It must also be placed in a less academic sense upon tearning experiences in which the minister becomes increasingly familiar with the life and work and meaning of the men and women to whom he ministers.

C. Areas of learning that are directed toward increasing a minister's competence in his professional skills.

Theological education in the seminary has placed increased emphasis upon the academic preparation of men for ministry. A minimum of

ime is available in most B. D. programs for emphasis upon the evelopment of professional skills. One of the reasons for this has een the awareness that skills are often best learned on-the-job or fter one has had some on-the-job experiences. Continuing education, herefore, will need to help the minister develop his competence as ounselor, teacher, administrator, preacher, leader of worship, leader groups, etc. It will also be necessary for continuing education to rovide ways of retraining men in new skills for new kinds of esponsibilities when they move into urban centers or when they e called to executive posts or accept other changes in their function. D. Areas of learning related primarily to development of personal

insight and the improvement of human relationships. The ministry more than most other vocations requires an inividual to enter into intimate human relationships and to deal halpully with the emotional depths of individuals. Often the frustrations and conflicts, the fears and angers of the minister himself prevent im from hearing or responding helpfully to those to whom he unisters. Senset v.ty training designed to help an individual develop height into his own being and human relations training directed at eveloping skills in relating to other persons provided a basic part

f continuing education.

"Although the pastoral office has many facets and each enhances he brightness of the jewel, there is no facet more challenging, more enanding of thought and skill, than preaching. In a day when reaching is being downgraded and when ritual and counseling are a the spotlight, I still maintain that a church is strong and great to the degree to which its pulpit has a message for the times, even with all the authority of God's word. A message that is used f God to bring light and comfort and conviction. There are brokenearted, tempted, and discouraged people in every congregation. There are self-satisfied intellectuals who worship only at the shrine f scholarship. All are in need of help. It is a high privilege to comfort those in sorrow and help to tone up the jaded faith of others. But to think that some may be persuaded to open their hearts to Christ, receive him as their Lord and Saviour, and enter into newness if life—this is the greatest joy of preaching."

Youth Ministry in Tulsa, Oklahoma Nov. 1-3, 1967.

The earth is peopled by more than a billion and a half human eings under twenty. Members of the "now" generation—analyzed and psychoanalyzed, used and abused, anxious and uncertain, often pampulated by those who control vast power structures—are the ope of the future or the legion of the damned, depending upon the irection they take, the ideologies they embrace, the values they herish

Modern young people tend to suspect their elders. They take little or granted and do not hesitate to challenge ideas accepted unquesioningly for decades. Quick to say what they think, they also

uickly detect the phony and hypocritical.

In less time than we realize, this "now" generation will become the dult community. The younger generation has a new idealism. But or the person who is unreached by the gospel before age twenty, he statistical chance of becoming a Christian is fractional. In a eadly sense it is now or never for the church in its outreach to outh.

The church then, had better "get with it," for this harvest will

not wait. How can we reach young people? In the last hundred years, scores of Christian organizations have come into being to minister to youth. Many specialize, ministering aumost exclusively to children, high schoolers, or collegians. These groups along with regular church efforts have helped many thousands of our young regular church efforts have helped many thousands of our young people find Christ and a high purpose for life. But agencies like youth for Christ, Young Life. Campus Crusade, Inter-Varsity Christian fellowship, child evangelism, and scores of others will need to expand their scrivities. Significant as these efforts are, the problem must be faced in an even bolder way.

First, we must rehabilitate the Sunday School and make it an effective educational and evangelistic agency. Many denominations need to rewrite their curricula so that they will lead pupils to addition for Christiand teach treatment the scale trianger.

decision for Christ and teach teachers to be soul-winners. This will

help conserve young people now in the churches.

Second, every church should seek to add paid staff workers whose attention would be given outside the church confines to high school and college youth. Churches should encourage their high school and college teachers, moreover, to act as a bridge between the church community and youth leaders, supporting them in a campus outreach. Young people should be trained for personal evangelism among their friends.

High-school and college students can use the "cell" principle advantageously Small groups of active Christians, gathered in their institutions for fellowship and Bible study, can readily invite others. Christian homes should be opened to these cells, refreshments provided, and opportunities created for dislogues with youth workers and adults. As a further step, church buildings should be made available to provide social, recreational, and spiritual opportunities.

Third, every church should promote evangelistic efforts among children within the church. Grade-school children have the fewest outside agencies seeking to reach them with the gospel. A ministry to children in the community could serve the children both of church members and of non-church members.

Fourth, in some cities radio and television programs directed to specific age groups may be fruitful. These should be prepared by those who speak the language of youth, understand their problems, and can offer counsel.

These projects will succeed only as adults put their shoulders to this task by freely offering their gifts, labors, and prayers. Today's youth are tomorrow's leaders, and they must be evangelized now.



Brother President, Officials and delegates to this August body, National Baptist from across America have met in this Hemisfair city where gaiety expresses itself almost in a fashion that causes one to feel that we are without problems in America. This Commission again presents itself to this body, that we may evaluate and revaluate our witness as relate to areas of injustices imposed upon people and especially upon minority groups. We cannot be carried into a state of ecstasy, because of the glowing lights of this hemisfair city and the galety that surrounds the activities of even our Convention, America and the world is weighted with problems that almost seem unsolvable. Neither can we content ourselves with the idea that racism is being completely cradicated. We must be ever mindful that the old problems still exist in new forms, because racial hatred continues to pop up in disguise attire with poisonous effects. This commission's report is intended to escort you on a tour of present pressing problems, with the hope that you will be struck with the seriousness of our time; that we will as a Convention decide on positive ways our witness can be known as a composite, and that each of us will as an individual, and a united church go back to our communities to represent the Christ we have esteemed at this Convention, who is the Christ of this world. The Christian Church must involve herself in touching problems. We must take a stand for that which is right in the eye of God regardless of who thinks it is wrong. This predominately Negro National Baptist Convention of America must not struggle with the problems of social justices, as our white counterparts representing one of

the largest church groups in America had to do in Houston, Texas carlier this year. Thank God for it. There may not be much in our house but the world needs to know that our doors are opened. "WHOSO-EVER WILL." This Convention must let the world know that even though we have been oppressed as black people, we are indebted both to the learned and the unlearned; to the wise and to the foolish; to the Greeks and to the Barbarians; to the whites as well as the Black. This Convention must let the world know we are aware of the major problems that rest heavily upon the Government of America today. We must also let America and the world know that we know the main cause behind all of our problems, which are related and interrelated to our problems of right relationship one with the other. The major problem in America and the world today is SIN.

WAR ON POVERTY

This Commission exhorts the Membership of this Baptist Communion to listen with keen ears to the accusations against the war on poverty. One of the major political parties in America, there is a strong urgency for "Law and Order." There is nothing wrong with a call for "Law and Order," in itself, but, behind this call is the scheming to keep poor people poorer and the rich become richer. The whole idea as interpreted by many current expoundents of Law and Order is based primarily upon oppressing minority groups in America. While many did not agree in fact with S.C.L.C.'s "Poor Peoples March on Washington," and some of the tactics employed in that march, we must agree in principle that eyes were opened to unholy sights. A great portion of America's people are poverty stricken. We must agree farther that the cry for "Law and Order," is aimed at keeping the poor people from dramatizing their plight in America. We farther agree that the march did in fact dramatize to the world, poverty and the honest concern of minorities who are trying to lift ourselves out of this slow death.

In 1963, 10.7% million people in America were poor. In 1960 substandard housing showed a ratio of 44% non whites living in substandard housing, only 13% of white America lived in substandard housing. Our nation must know that we as Negroes are not looking for an easy horse to ride, Neither are we looking for a different horse to ride, but we are looking for the same horse that any other American rides with the same saddle. We need jobs and we need them badly. There is no cry to just give us iobs. The cry is that we have earned our rights to have good jobs. WITH GOOD JOBS WE WILL REMOVE OUR OWN GHETTOS, take ourselves off the Welfare rolls, decrease the statics on substandard housing, because we will build better houses for ourselves; we can decrease the millions who are now poverty stricken in America, because we can eat of the fruits of the land, earned by our own hands. America must know that we no longer will work all day for nothing and we are tired of coming home in greasy clothes. No more do we sing, I'm coming, I'm coming for my head is bending low, I hear these gentle voices calling Old Black Joe. The Negro sings a new song now, I ain't coming and my head ain't bending low, I'm here to tell you, I am America's new Black Joe.

THE VIET NAM WAR

More than we realize we are greatly affected by the Viet Nam war. Negroes have always remained loyal to America. We have never ceased to have thoughts of how we give our life's blood on the fields of battles on foreign soils and yet in America we have been treated as

uncontrolable Aliens and step-children. There are some Negro Antiwar demonstrators, but it is not the Negro who demonstrates against

the war the most, even though we don't like it.

In 1965 there were 21,519 Negroes participating actively in the war in Viet nam. The Newspapers are constantly peppered with the pictures of Young black faces, who have given their lives in the battle to make America free indeed. This I am afraid is where our conflicts come in, while we seek to make America free in Viet Nam. age old prejudices and hatreds continue to arise within people who would desire things remain as they were 50 years ago. America is ripped down the center because of this ugly, ungodly war. While the Christian church cannot sanction war, it must clearly be understood that she cannot hold respect for those who fail to offer Ceasar his just due. If any body else fights on Foreign soils to keep America free, Negroes will too.

VOTER REGISTRATION

This Commission farther believes that full freedom will not come to all people of America, until we will have considered the basic rights of all men. High on the list of pre-requisites that will guarantee these basic rights is VOTER REGISTRATION. In 1966 the number of Negroes who were of voting age were 5,000,422. The estimated number who had registered to vote was 2,592,000. It may also be interesting to know that VOTER REGISTRATION in the Southern States within the past few years have risen to more than 40% for all of the states in the South, except Mississippi whose Negroes' Voter Registration is about 27.8%. However, in Tennessee Negroes are leading in Voter Registration in the South by 71.7%. Not until we realize the full worth of the ballot will we come to know the full freedom which should be the lot of every person. Because of this new rise in Voter Registration among Negroes in the South, black people who were once considered, boys, aunties, uncles and if you wore a suit, Preacher has suddenly caused white politicians to address black folk by suitable titles. This new rise of Voters among black Americans and America's need for a better image for America, have caused Cleveland to elect Carl Stokes, Mayor of Cleveland, Andrew Hatcher is elected Mayor of Gary, Indiana, Edward W. Brooke to the highest elected office since the days of reconstruction, the United States Senate from Massachusetts, Such men as William Washington and Thurgood Marshall to Mayor of Washington, D.C. and United States Supreme Court respectively. We must give God the Praise.

The Negro better than anyone else knows that he has had to climb the rough side of the mountain. We know full well the struggles which come with oppression. We know what it is to have the very thing or person taken away from us, who can do us the most good. If we did not know God better, we would declare that we've been robbed by the death of John F. Kennedy. We just know God better than that. Our years have known great tragedies, 1968 is no different. Every decent American was struct with sorrow during the California Democratic Primary, when Robert Kennedy, United States Senator from New York was felled by an assassin's bullet. These two (2) Kennedy brothers paid the supreme price, their life for America. Both Kennedy's proved in action they were concerned about God's choice Handiwork (man). We have lost two friends. But somewhere, somehow, God has someone to be our friend and we shall overcome Someday.

The Negro's wound was already raw from grief and frustration on that dark and terrible April 4, 1968 at 7:05 p.m. when America's Black Moses, an humble Raptist Preacher, an apostle of non-violence

lied a violent death at Loranes Motel in Memphis, Tennessee, by a white assassin's bullet. It is always interesting for me to note that o matter how mean, how hard, nor how segregationist inclined State overnment officials may have been, no Negro is guilty of Assassinaon. Dr. Martin Luther King was killed by a white racist.

The days following became days of racial outbreaks. Violence flared p across America. Tears were shed by people from all walks of life. uildings burned and America was shaken in her boots. The cause ir this violence arose from people who had no hope. Dr. King had en as much white America's friend as he had been to his own cople. He stood in between and absorbed the licks from both sides. eople without hope declared that "if they do this to one who is intent helping America, by being non-violent, then it is apparent what ey will do to us. I personally knew Martin well enough to know at he would declare to Black America, "to put up your aword, for who fights with the sword, will perish by the sword."

While there is much nasty talk about burning, looting and Guerrilla ctics during these hetic days from Watts several years ago until atts just a few days ago, we must remember that all of the Negroes' ad habits have been taught him. Don't get me wrong, we deplore irnings and destructions, we deplore looting and stealing, regardless who is doing it. Back in Mississippi, Louisiana, across the south nd and even in Texas-Negroes in many places because they were ogressive have been bombed, their houses and barns set on fire. That my book is burning. Black folk have worked on farms shareopping and made 70 and 80 bales of cotton, and Old Bodd Man tells m. "If you had made one more bale," you would have broken even." is is looting on another order.

No wonder Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. at the March on Washington clared, he had a dream. In this dream Dr. King foresaw keys that locks every door to integration. Thank God he lived to see much that dream unfold. On the day before his death day, he declared have been on the Mountain. I declare unto you it is good to dream. t let my declaration be even stronger now, it is better to go on the

buntain.

Today we are on the mountain. America must realize that there room for us all here. From time to time we hear foolish statements out sending the Negroes back to Africa. I would not mind this so uch if, whoever advocate the plan would be fair. America is my me, I was born here, I intend to die here. But let the exodus plan

"THE BLACK CHURCH IN HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE"

By Marvin C. Griffin, Historian, National Baptist Convention of America September 6, 1968, San Antonio, Texas The presence of the black church is vague and obscure in hist accounts of early American life. Black people in this country were, for the most part, slaves, forcibly consigned to the role of being newers of wood and drawers of water.

This special place which was arranged for black people in American ociety was enforced by law, sanctioned by social custom and given theological approval by the white church,

Legally, the black individual was not regarded as a whole person but only 3/5 of a person. Only isolated instances have come to us concerning organized protest against the brutal system of slavery by black people. Foremost among these accounts which have been pre-served is that of the Reverend Nat Turner, an influential black preacher in Jerusalem. Southhampton County, Virginia. His is the first instance in our recorded history of an open rebellion by slaves.

when Nat Turner was apprehended his captor was armed with shot gun well charged. Nat's only weapon was a light sword which he quickly surrendered and begged that his life might he pared. In his confession, Nat Turner accepted full and complete slame for contriving and executing the conspiracy designed to gain reedom from slavery.

With only an elementary education, but a preacher of natural bility. Nat Turner enlisted the aid of seven companions which later increased to 53 members, took the lives of his master's family and mook the lives of 55 men, women and children before the bloody inurrection was finally suppressed.

Nat Turner who sparked the revolt was hanged. His body was elivered to doctors who skinned it and made grease of the flesh. money purse was made from his hide. For many years his skeleton ms in the possession of a doctor of Southhampton. (Drewry, "The outhhampton Insurrection")

This first recorded revolt against slavery in 1831 was organized, romoted and led by a leader of the black church. The action of lacks and whites reflect the determination for freedom and the fill to maintain slavery,

The story of Nat Turner indicates the deep roots of the black hurch in protest against slavery even under the most difficult and ying circumstances.

The recent organization of the National Committee of Negro hurchman, which occured less than a year ago, is an expression the continuing concern of the black church in the freedom struggle, Much has been said about the negative aspects of black power. The ack church is concerned with exerting a positive and Christian fluence in relating the black community to the mainstream of merican life.

The black church has been the one place where black people ould feel at home in a strange land. Kenneth Clark points out that e black church has served as a haven of comfort for the black

Within the church a black porter or maid can assume responsibili-es and authority not available to him elsewhere. Only there can engage in political intrique and participate in financial decisions en to whites in many other aspects of their lives. It was in the church that black people found personal affirmation

The Negro was required to finance and build his own churches. He hired and paid his ministers without any major help from the white community. In all other aspects of life-in all economic, educational, and other institutional contacts even under a pervasiva and rigid birarial and segregated system, the Negro was still

dependent upon white financial control. His schools were controlled by white authorities or white philanthropy. His job, his business. and his home were controlled by white industries and banks. His rights as a citizen were determined by white politicians and government officials. Only in the most segregated of social institutions, the church, was he able to exercise the degree of perso al and racial freedom necessary for the initial stages of an effective campaign against racial injustices. The Negro church, therefore, cannot be understood primarily in traditional theological terms, but rather in terms of the religion of race. For the Negro, his church is his instrument of escape, his weapon of protest, his protective fortress behind which he seeks to withstand the assaults of a hostile world and within which he plans his strategies of defiance, harassment, and, at times, his frontal attacks against racial barriers. The ministers and laymen of the white Christian churches are responsible for making the Negro churches effective as vehicles of racial protest by their historic unwillingness to incorporate Negroes into their houses of Christ and by their inability to share with the Negro his passion and action for justice and equality. One of the earliest civil rights controverses, dating back to the beginning of human slavery in the New World, was the argument whether the African slaves should be taught to read and converted to Christianity.

"Given the special origin of the Negro church and Negro personal need, one must be prepared for the possibility that in spite of very compelling religious and idealistic reasons for desegregation of American churches, the church is likely to be the last of the social institutions to be effectively integrated. Paradoxically, bedrock resistance to desegregation may be found more among Negroes than among whites, for only in the church have many Negroes found a basis for personal worth. If one demands that the Negro give up the Negro church before total integration is achieved, on-the grounds of consistency with the goals of the civil rights movement the demand will be rejected, for the Negro has managed to salvage some personal self-esteem from his church, and until he achieves such self-esteem elsewhere he will not give up this, his

last and only sanctuary. (2)

The historical perspective to which Kenneth Clark calls attention is directly related to present day activities of black churchmen. Rev. J. Metz Rollins, Executive Secretary of the National Commit-

tee of Negro Churchmen, Inc., says:

"In a period of black awareness and black consciousness in the larger black community . . . the witness of the black church is meaningful only as it becomes a militant advocate of the cause of justice and dignity for black people."

As the Kerner Report indicates, America suffers from racism which has created two separate societies, one white, the other black

The crisis we face, threatens the survival of our nation.

We must admit that the crisis is due largely to the failure of while and black churchmen to accept each other as equals as brothers as children of the heavenly father.

The Third National Conference on Black Power held in Philadelphi (September 1, 1968) adopted a recommendation calling for the creation of a "separate, free, independent, nation for black people

in five Southern states by arms if necessary," The black church has been and still is deeply concerned about justice and dignity, not only for black people but for all people It sees itself not as a separatist movement but as part of the whole

On occasions the black church has resorted to radical measures in order to emphasize its dignity and mission.

BAPTIST CONVENTION OF AMERICA

The following story is told concerning a Baptist church in Mobile. Alabama right after the Civil War. The church had about a thousand members and only about three hundred of them were white. The pastor was white. The pastor told his people that in a Baptist church the majority rules. His members believed him. At the next church service the black members turned the white members out of the church-including the pastor. The blacks kept the church house and the white had to start all over again.

The chasm which separates white and black churchmen today has

its roots in slavery.

In 1844 the Georgia Baptist Convention requested that James E. Reeves, a slaveholder, be appointed as a missionary. The commissioner of the Baptist Convention declined the appointment of Reeves because he was a slaveholder. Baptist leaders in the South, many of them slaveholders themselves, could not accept slaveholding as a basis for refusing to appoint a man of high character,

The Virginia Baptist Foreign Mission Society called a meeting of Southern Baptists. About 300 messengers from churches in eight states and the District of Columbia gathered in Augusta, Georgia, on May 8, 1845, and formed the Southern Baptist Con-

In that same meeting the new convention appointed two boards for missionary purposes, the Foreign Mission Board and the Board of Domestic Missions. On the last day of the first covention, the following resolution was adopted:

"Resolved that the Board of Domestic Missions be instructed to take all prudent measures for the religious instruction of our

colored population."(3)

Although blacks were kept as slaves by Southern white Churchmen, provisions were made to preach the gospel to the captives.

Today white and black churchmen suffer from a crisis in communication. White churchmen do not see the black church in historical perspective in its desire to be free independent and equal. Free of

paternalism to enjoy fraternalism.

A statement on urban Mission adopted by the Board of Directors of the National Committee of Negro Churchmen, April 5, 1968 eloquently expresses the position and goal of the black church. The document holds it to be a tragic mistake for predominately white churches to by-pass the black church "in an effort to relate to and invest in the urban ghetto."

It calls for a reappraisal of strategies of urban mission and expenditures in the inner city and spells out the programmatic basis upon which black churches and white churches can work through the black caucuses and the NCNC in evangelism and urban ministries

and in ghetto economic development programs.

This is set forth to enhance the contribution and participation of black churches in the larger Christian fellowship which transcends rucial lives. W. E. B. DuBois said that the problem of the 20th

century is the color line

The Rev. Vernon Johns in an address more than 30 years ago told of a cartoon which appeared in a popular journal. It showed a celebrated white evangelist, of the rather pronounced and militant type, waging a terrific onslaught against sin. The preacher had knocked booze under the ropes; gambling had taken to its heels; Sunday movies and baseball were on the run, and a score of other sins lay prostrate and mangled in the wake of the divine tirade. But in the midst of these battered and broken evils there stood a huge, gawky giant marked "race prejudice," holding in his hands. "discrimination—corruption—unequal wages—ropes, torches," and the like, as he grinned complacently and said concerning the holy warrior; "He never even looked at me!"

The history of the white and black church in our time will be determined by how we deal with race prejudice.

San Antonio, Texas September 5,1968
