






April 5, 1886, an open letter to the Baptist Clergy and laymen was issued by the Rev. Wm. J. Simmons in the American Baptist asking if we should have a National Baptist Convention to discuss questions of interest to our beloved denomination. At that time the following reasons were given.

- 1. To promote personal piety, sociability, and a better knowledge of each other.
- 2. To be able to have an understanding as to the great ends to be reached by the Denomination.
- 3. To encourage our literary men and women and to promote the interest of Baptist literature.
- 4. To discuss questions pertaining to especially the religious educational, industrial and social interest of our people.
- 5. To give an opportunity for the best thinkers and writers to be heard.
- 6. That, united, we may be more powerful for good and strengthen our pride in the Denomination.

Having been solicited to write the call by many whose names and endorsement are hereunto affixed, the call is hereby made by their advice and solicitations for said Convention to meet in St. Louis, Missouri, August 25, 1886, 10:00 o'clock a.m. in the First Baptist Church, and the pastor thereof is hereby requested to serve as a Committee on Arrangement with power to select his associates. Wm. H. Seward, Louisville, Kentucky, and Rev. A. H. Cole, 2066 Goode Avenue, St. Louis, are hereby requested to serve as a committee on transportation,

Wm. J. SIMMONS

## CONSTITUTION

BAPTIST CONVENTION OF AMERICA

OF THE

## National Baptist Convention of America

We, the members of the Foreign Mission Baptist Convention of the United States of America, The American National Baptist Convention and the Baptist National Educational Convention; in order to form a more perfect United National Baptist Organization, to secure the blessings of unity for capable and efficient Foreign Mission. Home Mission and Educational work among ourselves and throughout of the world; do ordain and establish this Constitution.

ARTICLE 1. NAME: This Body shall be known as "The National Baptist Convention of America."

ARTICLE 2-NATURE AND FUNCTION SECTION 1. The National Baptist Convention of America shall serve as an Agency of Christian Education, Missionary and Church Extension; and combine the efforts of Baptist Churches and Organisations in extending the gospel both at home and to the Foreign fields; and propagate Baptist Doctrines of faith and distinctive principles throughout the world.

SECTION 2. It shall give its influence in maintaining and safe-guarding full religious liberty and spiritual independence on both the home and the foreign fields.

ARTICLE 3-MEMBERSHIP

SECTION 1. The membership of this Convention shall be annual. Orthodox Baptist Churches, District Associations. General Associations and State Conventions.

SECTION 2. Each Church shall register with One Dollar (\$1.00) per member, (minimum of Thirty-five Dollars (\$35.00) representa-

per member, (minimum of Thirty-five Dollars (\$35.00) representa-tion fee in this Convention), and be entitled to one messenger. Ten Dollars (\$10.00) shall be paid for each additional messenger. SECTION 3. Each District Association shall pay Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for representation and be entitled to two (2) messengers. Ten Dollars (\$10.00) shall be paid for each additional messenger.

SECTION 4. Each General Association and State Convention shall pay One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for representation and be entitled to five (5) messengers. Ten dollars (\$10.00) shall be paid for each additional messenger.
ARTICLE 4-OFFICERS

The officers of this Convention shall be President; First Vice President; Second Vice President; Recording Secretary; First, Second, Third and Fourth Assistant Recording Secretaries; Corresponding Secretary: Statistical Secretary; Treasurer; Auditor; Director of Public Relations; Historian; and Secretary of Youth Activities, Each officer shell be elected annually.

The President of each State Convention and Moderator of each General Association holding membership in this Convention shall be Associate Vice-Presidents.

ARTICLE 5-ELECTION OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The committee on the nomination of Officers shall be appointed by the President; and make its report following the report of Officers not later than the Friday afternoon session.

SECTION 2. The election of Officers shall be made by roll call

SECTION 3. The time for election in each annual session shall be set by the Executive Board and listed in the printed program.

SECTION 4. Only registered messengers shall have the privilege of voting in the election of officers in the National Baptist Convention of America.

SECTION 5. In no case shall an officer be eligible for reelection prior to his submission of an annual report from his office.

ARTICLE 6—EXECUTIVE BOARD

SECTION 1. The Executive Board shall consist of the elected officers of the Convention, the Chairman and Corresponding Secretaries of the Board, and the Presidents of the State Conventions.

SECTION 2. The elected Officers of the Convention shall be reimbursed for their travel expense to the Executive Board Meetings.

ARTICLE 7—FUNCTION OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD SECTION 1. The Executive Board shall transact the unfinished business of the Convention in the interims.

SECTION 2. The Executive Board shall arrange regional meetings and conferences as may be deemed necessary.

SECTION 3. If any chosen site for the annual session is found to be unsatisfactory, the Executive Board under the direction of the President shall select the place for the next annual session of the Convention to meet elsewhere.

ARTICLE 8-DUTIES OF THE OFFICERS

SECTION 1. The President: He shall be the presiding officer; authorize the calling of all regular and special meetings; sign all orders drawn on the treasurer; appoint or cause to be appointed all committees and commissions not elected by the General Body; and he shall be the chairman of the Executive Board.

SECTION 2. The First Vice President: At the request of the President or in case of resignation, death, or inability of the President to discharge the power and duties of said officer, the Vice President shall fill the office of the President.

SECTION 3. Second Vice President: He shall perform the dutler that are carried by the President and First Vice President as needs require.

SECTION 4. The Recording Secretary: This Secretary shall keep

a correct record of all the proceedings of the Convention in session: compile and distribute the minutes, prepare and distribute the enrollment cards; draw all drafts on the treasurer; (all drafts must be signed by the President) He shall make an annual report to the Convention.

SECTION 5. The First Assistant Recording Secretary: The Secretary shall assist the Recording Secretary in making the records of the Annual meetings and do whatever is required through the Re-

cording Secretary.

SECTION 6. The Second Assistant Recording Secretary: This Secretary shall record the doings of the Committee on Credentials, prepare his records for the minutes and do what ever is required through the Recording Secretary.

SECTION 7. The Third Assistant Recording Secretary: This Sec-

SECTION 7. The Third Assistant Recording Secretary: This Secretary shall record the work of the committee on Finance. He shall keep a record of all finance received into the Convention and do whatever else required through the Recording Secretary.

SECTION 8. The Fourth Assistant Recording Secretary: This Secretary shall record the work of the Committee on Claims and Accounts and do whatever is required through the Recording Secretary.

SECTION 9. The Corresponding Secretary: The Corresponding Secretary shall do all the Convention and Executive Board correspondence, as directed by the Convention through its President. He shall make an annual report to the Convention.

SECTION 10. The Statistical Secretary: This Secretary shall gather the statistics of the Convention and Baptist generally and report the same Annually.

SECTION 11. The Treasurer: He shall receive all finance of the Convention and pay or appropriate it as required by the Convention or the President. He shall keep his records so as to preserve perpetually for reference and report annually receipts and disbursements.

SECTION 12. Auditor: He shall audit all records of the Board and the Treasurer of the Convention; each of which shall be examined at least Thirty Days (30) prior to the Annual session.

SECTION 13. Director of Public Relations: The Director of Pub-

SECTION 13. Director of Public Relations: The Director of Public Relations shall give publicity to all of the aims and objectives of the National Convention and its Auxiliaries.

SECTION 14. Historian: He shall keep a correct history of the Convention, report annually, and preserve the history for future reference. The Historian shall also publish documented records of the Negro in the Baptist Churches.

SECTION 15. Secretary of Youth Activities: Secretary of Youth Activities shall serve as coordinator between the Parent Convention and the Youth Auxiliary Convention. The Convention holds him responsible for the full compliance of the Youth Auxiliary with its objectives and procedures.

ARTICLE 9. CONVENTION BOARDS AND THEIR DUTIES
SECTION 1. This Convention shall have the following Boards:

Home Mission, Foreign Mission, B.T.U., National Baptist Publishing Evangelical, Benevolent, Educational,

SECTION 2. Each Board shall be composed of one member from each State Convention and General Association, and approved by the Convention. Said election shall be annually.

SECTION 3. Officers: The Boards shall have a Chairman, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer, The officers of Corresponding Secretary and Treasurer may be combined

SECTION 4. Duties of Officers: The Chairman of Boards shall preside at all board meetings. The Recording Secretary of each board shall keep a true record of the proceedings of the board.

SECTION 5. The Corresponding Secretary shall be Secretary. Treasurer of each Board and do all the correspondence of the Board, being subject to all its rules and regulations. The Secretary Treasurer of each Board shall receive and disburse all finance, hold all deeds and other property as the Board may direct, and be gov. erned by the rules and regulations of the Board.

SECTION 6. Management: The Chairman, Corresponding Secretary and three (3) other members of the board shall constitute the Board of Management. Each board shall be subject to the Convention in all it does during the meeting of the Convention and during

SECTION 7. Reports of Boards: Each Board shall make an annual report to the Convention.

SECTION 8. The compensation of each officer and employee of the Boards shall be fixed by each Board. Compensations shall be limited to the Chairman, Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary.

SECTION 9. The compensation of each board is subject to the approval of the convention, and thus must be presented to the convention for proper authorization.

SECTION 10. Duties of Boards: The Home Mission Board shall seek to keep alive struggling Churches, maintain a Baptist Christian Witness, and seek to extend the work of the Kingdom in newly settled or densely populated areas in the domains of the Convention.

The Foreign Mission Board shall seek extended fields of the Great Commission in saving the lost wherever approved by the Convention.

The Educational Board shall give encouragement to those institutions endorsed by the convention and shall attempt to build as influence that the pulpit and leadership of the church will be more

The National Baptist Publishing Board shall have charge of all the publications of the Convention.

The Evangelical Board shall carry the program of Evangelium approved by the Convention.

That 1. The B.T.U. will give encouragement to the necessity of

trained church workers, well versed in the teachings of the New Testament and the practices of the church.

That 2. Church Study Courses should be encouraged by it's Executive or Corresponding Secretary through writings, visitations and the State representatives on the Board.

That 3. The Executive or Corresponding Secretary may wherever possible recommend a plan for developing leadership in discovered talents for leadership.

That 4. Associate members of the B.T.U. BOARD may be laymen whose activity have proven productive and may be assigned to any given city or cities

That 5. Training Seminars may be developed on Baptist College campuses or some central location in any given city or community.

That 6. That the B.T.U. Board would prepare tracts to be distributed throughout our Convention set-up. These tracts would be edited by the chairman and printed by our Publishing Board.

That 7. That the B.T.U. Board would revise and publish the new B.T.U. Magazine. The Chairman of the Board would serve as editor and the previous writers would be contacted to serve. This magazine would be printed by our publishing house and paid for by our Convention along with the sales of the book.

That 8. That all monies received by the Board will be dispersed upon the authorization of the Board by checks, signed by the chairman, secretary and treasurer.

NOTE: This sets forth the functions of the B.T.U. Board as adopted in the Executive Board in Alexandria, La. February 28, 1968.

NOTE: Articles--6-8 At the Executive Board in Phoenix, Arizona. Adopted by standing vote.

Brother President, Officers and Members, with deep concern and prayerful consideration and a firm belief in our living Christ and Lord and further believing that there is a more beneficial way of remembering the Saints of God than naming an organization of our living Lord after a finite creature, I suggest that we give careful and prayerful consideration to the Following: That Article 10, Section 1, as recommended by a special Committee on Constitution September 6, 1968, will read as follows under Auxiliaries:

A Jr. Women's Auxiliary; A National Baptist Brotherhood Union Auxiliary;

National Baptist Ushers Auxiliary;

A National Baptist Nurses' Corps Auxiliary;

All Auxiliaries of the National Baptist Convention of America. If Section 1, Article 10 is accepted, I suggest Article 9, Section 10

that it be resolved that paragraph 2 under Foreign Mission read thus: That a special day be adopted by this Convention dedicated for Foreign Mission in honor of and be known as the M. A. B. Fuller

Brother President, this is suggested in honor of the great work Mrs. M. A. B. Fuller has done in the Missionary cause and that a special offering should be sent under your designation either to the Convention Treasurer or the Foreign Mission Board in perpetuating the efforts made by her.

On the M. A. B. Fuller Day a special offering across this Nation should and could be taken and forwarded under your designation.

These recommendations are offered after much prayerful thought and I hope will find sympathetic consideration.

## ARTICLE 10-AUXILIARIES

SECTION 1. There shall be a Senior Women's Auxiliary National Baptist Convention, Junior Women's Auxiliary, National Baptist Convention, National Baptist Brotherhood Auxiliary Convention and Nurse Corp National Baptist Convention.

SECTION 2. All messengers to the Auxiliary Convention shall be appointed and certified on the official letter of the Convention by the Churches of the Convention.

SECTION 3. All Auxiliary Conventions are subject to the action

of the National Baptist Convention of America.

SECTION 4. Each Auxiliary Convention shall elect a President, Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Treasurer, and such other of cers as may be required.

SECTION 5. All officers elected by the auxiliary conventions must be submitted to the National Baptist Convention for approval.

SECTION 6. All auxiliary conventions shall report all of their receipts and disbursements for the conventional year at the annual session to the National Baptist Convention of America.

SECTION 7. All monies collected by auxiliary conventions at the annual session must be reported and turned over to the Finance Committee of the General Body of the National Baptist Convention of America daily.

SECTION 8. The auxiliary conventions will report their bills and expense to the National Baptist Convention of America for approval, which shall, under no circumstances, exceed 40 per cent of the total

SECTION 9. The auxiliary conventions may accept representation fees from any and all auxiliaries of the local church, included in their work, subject to their approved constitutional regulations.

## ARTICLE 11—COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. The Registration Committees of the National Bap-

tist Convention of America and its Auxiliaries, working jointly with the Finance Committee shall open the office of registration the Tuesday, 12:00 Noon prior to the opening of the Convention.

SECTION 2. There shall be three (3) committees appointed by the President to take care of the business of the convention.

(a) Finance Committee: Shall receive and be responsible for all finance coming into the convention, and report the same to the convention daily.

(b) Committee on Bills and Accounts: Shall receive and investigate all bills, accounts, and recommend the amount to be paid by

the Convention.

(c) Credentials Committee: In keeping with SECTION 3. There shall be a standing Budget Committee: Responsible for preparation and current revision of a working budget for the National Baptist Convention and all its Auxiliaries.

## . ARTICLE 18-MEETINGS

The Convention shall begin its meeting Wednesday before the Second Lord's Day in September and close the following Sunday Night. The place shall be selected by the convention in annual meeting with places chosen two years in advance of next current session.

ARTICLE 13. Representation in other organizations: The National Baptist Convention of America shall hold membership in the Beptist World Alliance and may hold membership in such other organisations as it from time to time elects.

ARTICLE 14. Commissions: There shall be a Commission on Transportation, Christian Education, Social Justice and Army and Navy Chaplains.

(1) The Railroad Commission shall consist of (5) members, elected annually and shall have charge of all transportation.

(2) The Commission on Christian Education shall consist of nine members, elected annually and shall plan and promote the Educational program of the Convention.

(3) The Commission on Social Justice shall consist of five (5) members and shall plan and promote such programs as will provide

Christian concern for the welfare of oppressed peoples.

(4) The Commission of Army and Navy Chaplains shall have charge of recommending Chaplains for the Army and Navy and shall consist of three (3) members.

ARTICLE 15. This Constitution may be amended at any time by a majority vote of the Convention in the annual session provided written notice is given on the first day of the session,

## BY-LAWS

#### 1. Salaries of Officers:

- Officers of the convention and all auxiliaries, officers and members of all boards shall be members of a Baptist Church holding membership in the Convention.
- 3. Measengers enrolled upon presenting proper credentials from the churches, state conventions and general associations shall constitute the convention. The enrollment of measengers may begin 10 days prior to the conventions annual meeting.

#### 4. Pinance:

- (a) An approved bookkeeping system of receipts and disbursements shall be kept by the treasurer of the Convention, the treasurer of all auxiliary conventions, and secretary-treasurer of each board.
- (b) The following system shall be used in the handling of convention funds:
- (a) All funds received by the Finance Committee of the Convention and the executive board shall be receipted with three (8) carbon stubs; one for the secretary of the committee and one for the auditor of the convention.
- (b) The finance committee shall issue a daily report signed by the chairman and secretary of the committee and the treasurer of the convention.
- (c) All funds shall be deposited each day in a convention depository through a local bank where the convention is in session.
- During the annual session, the Auditor of the Convention shall check and compare the receipts with the funds each day.
  - (e) All funds shall be paid out by check.
- (f) The treasurer of the convention, the chairman, secretary and treasurer of the Finance Committee shall be bonded.

(g) The auxiliary tracerers shall deposit daily with the finance committee and take its resulpt.

(b) The auxiliaries of the convention shall not use more than forty percent of funds collected for operating expenses.

(i) The convention shall have the right to designate only undesignated funds. All designated funds must be turned over to the causes for which designated.

(j) The salaries of the officers of the Convention shall be separated from the expenses and all expense itemized.

The Railroad Commission will be paid \$100.00 Annually.

The Committee on Orthodox will be paid \$50.00 each not to exceed two members.

The Committee on Social Justice \$150.00.

BAPTIST CONVENTION OF AMERICA

The Musical Directress and Organist are to be paid \$25.00 per day during the session of the Convention, plus \$5.00 per day for board and lodging.

The enrollment Committee is not to exceed six members, and shall be paid \$10.00 per day total sum for the committee not to exceed \$800.00.

The Chairman to be paid \$15.00 per day not to exceed \$75.00.

The Finance Committee is not to exceed six (6) members, be paid \$10.00 per day not to exceed \$800.00.

The Chairman of said board to be paid \$15.00 not to exceed \$75.00. A total for the committee \$275.00.

The Committee on Accounts is not to exceed five members (5) with two working days of the convention, Same are to be paid at the rate of ten (\$10.00) per member per day and \$15.00 per day for the chairman.

All claims will be filed with the 4th assistant secretary who will report to the General Secretary. Said general secretary will be responsible for filing all claims with the committee and to write vouchers therefore. As directed by the President.

## NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION OF AMERICA

In the year 1895, on the 28th day of September in Atlanta, Georgia, three Black Religious Conventions came together and formulated a plan that would unite them into one great congregation governed by one Constitution. The name National Baptist Convention was adoped, thus making it the largest Black organization in America, with a membership numbering in the millions. This, however, was a new name but not a new organization. It had its roots as early as 1880 in the form of the

Baptist Foreign Mission Convention. Also involved were two other Conventions, The American Baptist Convention and the National Baptist Educational Convention. These three Conventions would meet simultaneously in the same location and worked in accordance with each other but had separate Constitutions. Therefore, the National Baptist Convention accepts 1880 as its starting date.

In 1896, Dr. Richard Henry Boyd established an institution in Nashville, Tennessee for the Publication of literature desired by the Sunday-School of the Convention. This also has become the oldest and largest Black owned and operated religious Printing Plant in America with a standing Book order of 5,100,000 books annually.

In 1915, a Convention split occurred from which an incorporated segment was born. The Mother Convention has always been unincorporated from the days of its very beginnings. This incorporated segment also has a Publishing House located in Nashville. Even after this tragic split in 1915, the National Baptist Convention (unincorporated), is still one of the largest organizations of Blacks in the Western hemist-liere with a membership of 3,500,000 people.

Each year the Convention meets in September in a selected major city. It is composed of seven boards and seven auxiliaries. The boards consist of: The Foreign Mission Board, the Benevolent Board, the Baptist Training Union Board, the Evangelical Board, the National Baptist Publishing Board, Home Mission Board, and the Educational Board. The auxiliaries consist of: The Woman's Missionary Auxiliary, the Woman's Missionary Auxiliary No. 2, the Junior Women's Missionary Auxiliary, the Brotherhood Union, the Church Ushers, The Nurses Corps and the Youth Convention Auxiliary.

The National Baptist Publishing Board sponsors a National Sunday School and Baptist Training Union Congress as a school of methods for the constituents of the National Baptist Convention of America. It is also held in a selected major city annually in the month of June. The attendance for the three day class session exceeds 8,500, requiring an extremely large facility.

The overall purpose of the above mentioned organizations according to the Convention Constitution is to do mission work in the United States, Africa, and elsewhere abroad, to foster the cause of Education and to promote the Publication and Circulation of religious literature.

The ninty-third annual session of the National Baptist Convention of America was opened at 10:00 A.M. with inspirational singing led by Mrs. Virgie DeWitty, the Convention chorister of Austin Texas and Mrs. Geneva Daniels of Los Angeles, California at the organ. The devotions were conducted by Rev. C. E. Wilder of Oregon, Rev, Lemuel Smith of Texas and Rev. J. B. Blount of Florida.

Vice-President M. L. Price presented Rev. T. Carter of Texas for the discussion of the theme. This message was enjoyed by all. Dr. Prince of California sang "Blessed Assurance." Vice-PresidentsPrice presented the National President, Dr. J. C. Sams of Florida, President Sams gave directions for the organization of the 93rd session of the Convention. A period of one hour was given for the meeting of state delegations and for enrollment of churches. The Convention re-assembled at 11:45 A. M. by Vice-President Price. Partial state reports was given. In preparation for the preaching of the Introductory sermon the Convention was led in singing by Mrs. Virgie DeWitty. Vice-President Price presented Rev. Robert H. The Evangelical Board report, by it's chairman, Rev. E. H. Branch. The convention stood and offered prayer for the Rev. H. H. Robinson of Florida, Secretary of the Evangelical Board due to severe illness. The Recommendations, with reports were approved (see section on reports.)

## WEDNESDAY EVENING 7:30 P.M.

The session was opened with congregational singing led by Sis. Virgie DeWitty, Vice-President Price presented the devotional committee, Romans 12 was read by Rev. Robert Hayles of Ohio. Prayer was offered by Rev. R. L. Washington of Texas. The reports of states were continued by Vice-President Price. The Convention was led in singing "Saviour More Than Life to Me" by President Price who presented the Rev. Luke W. Mingo to preside over the welcome program. The music was rendered by the choirs of the Morning Star Baptist Church. Welcome Expressions were made; In behalf of the host church, the Morning Star Baptist Church and it pastor by Mrs. Malery; On behalf of the Illinois Baptist State Convention By Rev. F. K. Sims; On behalf of the clergy of the city and vicinity by Cardinal Coty; On behalf of the many other organizations of the city by Rev. William Johnson. The response to the welcome was given by the Rev. J. F. Hargrett of Orlando, Florida. Rev. James Flakes of Indiana was presented for the evening sermon. A great sermon was preached and enjoyed by all. An offering was taken, announcements were made and the session dismissed. The benediction by Rev. Flakes.

## 10:00 A. M. THURSDAY MORNING

The Convention assembled at Orchestra Hall on South Michigan

Avenue. Devotions were led by Rev. R. L. Robertson of Texas, Rev. Rogers O. Tyler, Sr. of Mississippi with singing led by Sis. Virgie DeWitty assisted by Rev. Butler of Chicago.

The theme was ably discussed by Rev. H. F. Dean of California. Solo by Rev. T. E. Gainous of Florida. The report of the Home Mission Board was made by Rev. O. B. Williams of Oregon with Chairman L. W. Mingo, presiding. The report was approved and an offering taken for the Board. The report of the Foreign Mission Board was made by Secretary E. S. Branch. Chairman D. D. Johnson presided during the report. An offering was taken for the Board. The report was approved. The Convention prepared itself for the President's annual message. All officers of the Convention and the auxiliaries were invited to the platform. Flowers were presented to the President and his wife and to all the officers of the Convention and the auxiliaries. Rev. Price of California sang a solo. Several other presentations were made to the President by Rev. A. Charles Bowie of Texas.

A telegram from Mayor Richard Daley of Chicago was read to the Convention. Vice-President B. O. Byrd of California presented President Sams for the message. The report of the Committee of Social Justice was made by the chairman Rev. E. E. Jones of Louisiana. The report was well received and approved

The Convention was led in singing by Sis. DeWitty in preparation for the evening message. Rev. C. F. Williams of Washington. The message was well delivered and inspiring. An offering was taken, announcements were made. The session was dismissed with benediction by Rev. Williams.

## 9:00 A. M. FRIDAY MORNING

The session was opened with congregational singing led by Sis. DeWitty, Rev. Butler and Rev. Brookins. The devotions were conducted by Rev. R. D. Reed of Texas, Rev. T. R. Nealy of Texas and Rev. J. E. Jackson of Florida.

Rev. J. E. Weacher of Oklahoma presented Rev. O. C. Jackson of Texas for the morning message. A great message was delivered.

The report of the Educational Board was made by Secretary W. E. Hausey. Chairman P. S. Wilkinson presided. The report was approved.

Rev. S. M. Lockridge of California made the report for the office of Statistician. Rev. Lockridge requested more assistance from the states in preparing a more accurate report. The report was approved.

Rev. F. Benjamin Davis made the report of the committee on Orthodoxy. The report was approved. Directions were given for the

afternoon session by the presiding officer. The session was dismissed with benediction.

## 2:30 P. M. FRIDAY AFTERNOON

Devotions were led by Rev. F. L. Maxwell of Florida and Rev. Benjamin Tolbert of Illinois with the singing led by Sis. DeWitty. The theme was ably discussed by Rev. A. R. Blake of South Carolina and Rev. W. S. Hartsfield of Missouri. The Convention was led in singing by Sis. DeWitty.

The "Golden Age" hour for ministers over seventy-five years of age was conducted. Rev. D. B. Barnes of Mississippi was presented for the message. A great sermon was preached. ## 9:00 A. M. SATURDAY MORNING

The Convention was led in singing by Sis, Virgie DeWitty, Devotions were conducted by Rev. B. W. Hubbard of Oklahoma, Rev. Frank Morrison of Oklahoma and Rev. J. S. Ross of Oklahoma.

The theme was ably discussed by Rev. Bennie E. Bland of Pennsylvania. Rev. J. W. Jones, Sr. of Arizona was presented for the morning message. A great sermon was preached. Following the message Rev. Robert C. Campbell was presented to bring greetings from the Arizona Baptist Convention.

Vice-President Price presented Rev. Aaron Blackman of Detroit, Michigan who extended an invitation to the Convention to hold the 1976 session of the Convention in the city of Detroit. Rev. Frank L. Lewis of New Orleans extended the invitation for the city of New Orleans. A vote was taken. The invitation from the city of Detroit was accepted for the 1976 session. A motion was made and carried that the 1977 session be held in the city of New Orleans.

The Youth Convention under the supervision of Rev. Earl Pleasant of California presented its usual fine program. Several papers were read and musical numbers rendered. Rev. A. Carruthers was presented for the morning message. He delivered a stirring message. President Sams took charge of the session to hear reports from all officers, committees and auxiliaries. The report of the Corresponding Secretary was made by Rev. Robert H. Wilson and approved.

The report of the committee on permanent organization was made and approved. The reports of all auxiliaries were made and all officers recommended were approved. President Sams made remarks concerning the work on the mission fields and the aims of the President in promoting the mission work of the Convention. His requests for this effort was granted. Rev. H. J. Johnson made a finance report to the Convention. Total monies received was reported as \$160,771,34.

The report of the committee on claims and accounts was read and approved.

The session was dismissed by President Sams.

The Saturday evening session was under the auspices of the Evangelical Board who held an inspiring worship service.

## 9:00 A.M. SUNDAY MORNING

As usual, a great sermon was preached and enjoyed by all. The offering was taken and the service dismissed with benediction by President Sams.

## 3:00 P.M. SUNDAY AFTERNOON

The afternoon and closing session of the Convention was under the auspices of the Foreign Mission Board. Rev. F. D. Johnson of Chicago presiding. The message was preached by the Rev. Frank K. Sims of Chicago. The message was enjoyed by all. An offering was taken for the Foreign Mission Board. Announcements were made. A resolution was read by Rev. J. W. Toomer of Orlando, Florida expressing thanks to Rev. L. W. Mingo, the members of the Morning Star Baptist Church, the sister churches of the city and to the Illinois Stare Convention for the fine entertainment given to the Convention. Following appropriate remarks by President J. C. Sams, the 1973 session of the National Baptist Convention of America was adjourned to meet in the next annual session with the churches of Nashville, Tennessee in September 1974.

It is always a pleasure to be able to fellowship with you in our National Baptist Convention and to serve you in the capacity of Secretary-Treasurer of the Benevolent Board.

The report sent in to the auditor gave account of money received and paid out up to June 30, 1973. It showed a grand total receipts of \$10,849.56, grand total disbursements of \$9, 725.82 and a balance of \$1,123.74.

Since June 30, we have paid four claims of \$300.00 each which amounted to \$1200.00. This leaves a deficit of \$76.26. The report sent in on June 30 had a total of 26 deaths but the total deaths today is 30.

I should like to remind all of you that when an individual dies who is a member of the Benevolent Department, you should send the death certificate along with your receipt for the fiscal year payment. When I receive the notice, I write the check and send it to President Sams, he signs it and then sends it to Dr. Boyd who signs it also and returns it to me. Then I send it to the beneficiary.

Sometimes I am out of the city when the notices come and at times Dr. Sams and Dr. Boyd are not immediately available and we have to wait several days before we can process the claim.

Please be considerate and do not spend money or use time in writing about your claim. I am sure you know by now that the Convention stands behind all claims and yours will be paid as soon as the claim is processed.

# Remember, your benevolence is not in force unless you pay the \$12.00 membership fee each year.

Greetings:

To our President, Dr. Sams; Vice Presidents, Dr. B. O. Byrd, Dr. M. L. Price, and Chairman, Dr. Luke W. Mingo, of our National Home

Another year has come and gone since we last met for our annual report. Blessings on each of you assembled; and I wish to thank God for this another year's witness in reporting for our Home Mission Board. The years come and go, but the mission of the Church remains the same — Salvation of souls. Even though there are many scientific advancements, and as the caption saying of the Astronauts, says, when

they were preparing to go to the moon, "They said it couldn't be done." However, with all things man can do and has done, having had his first step on the moon, thousands of miles away, yet hatred, jealousy, prejudice, envy and selfishness are still working in men's hearts. Man on the moon is still man unfilled, and man in the need of God. Many may conquer outer space, but only God can give that inner peace and strength that makes life worth living. The Watergate affair is a perfect example. Over 1900 years have passed since the risen Lord gave the Church its marching orders to give the gospel to the world.

- Love for Christ's people.
   "Little children let us not love in word or speech, but in deed and in truth,"
   Divine love sees, feels and acts.
- 3. Jealousy for Christ's name.
  "The Lord whose name is jealous, is a jealous God." Exodus 34: 14. A right jealousy is "A love which will tolerate no unfaithfulness in the beloved object."

God's jealousy is pure and holy. In Greek, "zeal" and "jealousy" are the same word. Now Brother Preachers, teachers, and laymen alike, how much "zeal" or "jealousy" do you have for the churches who are burdened with financial problems? How much will you give to help the mission pastors to feel secure to carry the Gospel? Yes, I realize some churches the Lord has richly blessed — many members and well supported. Won't you now feel the compassion to help the Home Mission to grow and be able to give greater support? Those who are giving, we do appreciate; however there are many others who could do so. I plead with you now for your loyal support. As your secretary of the National Home Mission Board, I have spread your contributions over the many states to as many churches and mission pastors to help in a small way, as far as it could go.

May I thank you, Brother President, and also the Convention for the trust you have placed in me to do this job in the name of Christ. Might I add too, that our Chairman Mingo, in his Christ-like way, is a wonderful chairman, cooperative and loyal. Plans have been presented to you for greater support. May I ask you now, State Presidents, will you have in your state a National Home Mission Day, specially to raise funds to support your National Home Mission Board? Will you make your monthly pledges now? Will you send your pledges in? The Board is doing the best it can, according to the support it is given. Remember, "Charity begins at home and then spreads abroad."

Ask yourselves, HAVE I GIVEN ANYTHING TODAY? Have I helped the needy soul on the way? From the dawn to setting sun, Have I wounded anyone? Shall I weep for what I've done today?

Have I made some person glad today? Did I help someone who lost his way? Did I counse! with the sad, Try to make some poor heart glad, And share with them what I had today? Have the Saviour's name I hailed today? Have my feeble efforts failed on the way? If I failed some soul to guide, Deep in peace and love abide, I find joy to know I tried today.

O today, O today, O today, Have I failed some great acclaim on the way? Just to know I've done my best As I go to take my rest, Let my name be with the blest, today.

#### **BAPTIST MEMBERSHIP ON RISE**

Baptist total world membership rose by 10.7 percent during the period 1968-1973.

According to a statistical review released at Baptist World Alliance headquarters in Washington, the communicant population throughout the world grew by 3,176,954 in the five-year span.

The new worldwide total is now set at 32,804, 398, Religious News Service reports.

Much of the growth came in North America—most particularly in the United States. And Europe alone showed a decline in Baptist membership.

## THE REVEREND DR. A. RAY APPELQUIST

The Reverend Dr. A. Ray Appelquist is Executive Secretary of The General Commission on Chaplains and Armed Forces Personnel with offices in the Chaplains Memorial Building in Washington, D.C.

The General Commission is a permanent conference of Chaplaincy representatives of forty constituent and affiliated religious bodies and agencies, comprising sixty million church members. Since 1917, the Commission has been in liaison with the Federal Government in matters affecting chaplaincy standards and programs, and the moral religious welfare of armed forces personnel and veterans. Dr. Appelquist, a native of Kewanee, Illinois spent more than eight years in two tours of duty as an army chaplain assignments in Germany, Korea, on sea duty, and at various installations in the United States. In addition to Chaplaincy service he has had civilian pastorates in Superior, Wisconsin; foilet, Illinois; and Worcester, Massachusetts.

He received his B. A. degree from Roosevelt University, Chicago, Illinois; and a B. TH degree from Bethel Theological Seminary, St. Paul, Minnesota, and has taken additional studies at the University of Chicago, Judson College, Elgin, Illinois has conferred on him an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree.

Since 1962, he has been editor of the CHAP, a bi-monthly professional journal for Chaplains of the Armed Forces, Veteran Administration and Civil Air Patrol, and Executive Editor of the Link, a monthly magazine for service personnel.

Dr. Appelquist is the compiler and editor of "Church, State and Chaplaincy," a book of essays and statements on church-state issues in the American Chaplaincy System.

## CHAPLAIN MAJOR GENERAL ROY M. TERRY

Chaplain, Major General Roy M. Terry, Chief of Chaplains, United States Air Force, serves on the special staff of the Chief of Staff, United States Air Force. He advises the Chief of Staff on matters pertaining to the religious and moral welfare of Air Force personnel; is responsible to the Chief of Staff for establishing plans, policies, programs for Air Force personnel and their dependents in the areas of:

Personnel, procurement, manpower, training, professional programs, ecclesiastical and public relations, chapel and chaplain material, funds and religious facilities.

Chaplain Terry was born in Brooklyn, New York. His home town is Danbury, Connecticut. He was graduated from Syracuse University with a bachelor of science degree in 1937 and from Yale University Divinity School in 1942 with a bachelor of divinity degree. He received an honorary doctor of laws degree from Atlanta Law School in 1963.

Chaplain Terry is a pastor of New York Conference of the United Methodist Church. From 1939 to 1942, when he entered the chaplaincy, he served as pastor of the Georgetown Connecticut Methodist Church, Since 1942 his military career has been interrupted only by a three-year assignment as headmaster of Jessee Lee Academy in West Redding, Connecticut.

During service that has ranged around the world and in numerous capacities, he was named "Air Force Chaplain of The Year," in 1957 by the Reserve Officers Association and received the Pour Chaplains Award from B'nai B'rith in 1970. Wherever he has served, Chaplain Terry's duties have been augmented by his hobby as coach of base and youth athletic teams.

Chaptain Terry entered active military service in July 1942 and attended the Chaplain School at Ft. Benjamin Harrison, Ind. His first assignment was to Drew Field, Fla., and he went with the 325th Fighter Group to the European Theater of Operations and served in Tunisia. North Africa; Sicily; and Italy from 1942 to 1944. He was Command Chaplain for the XV Fighter Command in Italy from 1944-1945. He returned to the United States in February 1945 and was assigned to Headquarters Air Transport Command, Washington, D.C. In January 1946 he was released from active military duty.

Chaplain Terry was recalled to active duty in June 1949 and assigned to Maxwell Air Force Base, Alabama. In November 1951 he was

assigned to Clark Air Base, the Philippine Islands.

He served as Chaplain at Offutt Air Force Base, Nbr. from 1954 to 1955; Westover Air Force Base, Mass., 1955-1956; Headquarters Military Air Transport Service, Scott Air Force Base, Ill., 1956-1958; Headquarters United States Air Force, Office of the Chief of Chaplains Professional Division, Washington, D.C., 1958-1962; Staff Chaplain Headquarters Fifth Air Force, Japan, 1962-1965; Command Chaplain, Headquarters Aerospace Defense Command, Colorado Springs, Colo., 1965-1967; Command and Protestant Cadet Chaplain, United States Air Force Academy, Colo,, from 1967-1968; Deputy Chief of Chaplains, United States Air Force, Washington, D.C., 1968-1970.

Chaplain Terry was appointed Chief of Chaplains, United States Air

Force in August 1970.

His military decorations include the Legion of Merit with one oak leaf cluster; Bronze Star Medal; Air Force Commendation Medal with one oak leaf cluster; Army Commendation Medal with two oak leaf clusters; and Distinguished Unit Citation Emblem with one oak leaf

He was promoted to the temporary grade of major general effective August 10, 1970, with date of rank February 3, 1966.

Chaplain Francis L. Garrett, USN, an ordained minister of the Methodist Church was awarded the honorary degree of Doctor of Divinity by Wofford College, Spartanburg, S.C., on June 4, 1967. PRESIDENT SAMS, FIRST AND SECOND VICE PRESIDENTS BYRD AND PRICE, MEMBERS OF THE CHAPLAINCY, CLERGY, SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN CHRIST AND VISITORS:

We the members of the Chaplains Commission, serving as endorsing agent for the National Baptist Convention of America, wish to make our Annual report to this body now in session here in Chicago, Illinois, meeting in the Palmer House Hotel.

We have attempted to supply each of you with copies of our report, therefore, we shall not read all material included, but shall attempt to give high points only.

About nine years ago The National Baptist Convention revived its Chaplaincy Endorsing Agency and appointed me chairman of its commission. At that time, I was completely lacking knowledge of my duties and of the function of the agency. I made a trip to Washington in order to visit the General Commission on Chaplaincy of the Armed Forces of the United States.

It was during this visit I had the pleasure of meeting a most distinguish Christian Gentleman by the name of Dr. A. Ray Appelquist, Executive Secretary of The General Commission on Chaplains and Armed Forces Personnel. It was through him I was acquainted with my new position and started me on the road to a better understanding of the roll I was to play as Chairman of the Endorsing Agency for the National Baptist Convention.

I am grateful to Dr. Appelquist for arranging many over-seas trips for our agency. These trips included such places as Weisboten, Germany Air Base, Frankfort Germany; Berlin Germany. The Torrejon Air Base in Madrid Spain, Nato in Belgium. At Nato we had clergy visitors from the United States, the Rev. Joseph Wells and Rev. Edward Blair. In 1969, I had the honor of being invited to accompany Major General, Edwin R. Chess and other distinguish Clergymen to Goose Bay Air Base in Labrador, Sandestron and Thule Air Bases in Northern Greenland. In 1970, Dr. Appelquist arranged our visit to the Air Base in Tokyo, Japan. As chairman of our commission, I am most appreciative to Dr. A. Ray Appelquist, Executive Secretary of the General Commission on Chaplains and Armed Forces Personnel for the fine job he did in helping us to obtain pictures and biographies of the Chiefs of Chaplains of the various divisions of the Armed Forces, which appear in this report. We salute these dedicated Clergymen for the noble service they are giving to their country and fellowman.

In July, 1972, I was invited by Major General Chaplain Leroy Terry to accompany him and his party of noted Clergymen on another most interesting tour, covering three bases here in the United States. The bases visited were Orlando Naval Base, Orlando, Florida; Maxwell Air Base, Montgomery, Alabama; and Fort Knox Army Base, Fort Knox Kentucky.

At each of these bases conferences and workshops were held, which involved chaplains and endorsing agents who were informed of techniques used in preparing service men and chaptains for their duties.

I am of the opinion that the majority of the American People are not fully aware of the total responsibilities of the men who are serving in the capacity of Chaplains. It was after visiting these installations, taking an active roll in various Chaplains's Conferences that I became aware of the tremendous role chaplains play in the Armed Services.

First of all, I come to realize that Chaplains are men, God called to preach the Gospel, give Spiritual guidance, and to make known the will of God in every walk of life. These men of God are not limited to their concern cross the service line borders into the realm of human needs.

I had the distinct honor of reading the Military Chaplains's Review - Volume 1, No. 4 on Social Concern, which was published - November, 1972.

In this volume Dr. Douglas Ewing Jackson, PH. D., Professor of

Sociology of Religion in Southern Methodist University Perking School of Theology said in his Article Theories and Approaches To Community Problems, "As Clergymen all of us want to be involved in social action. We should be willing to take risks to help people, improve society. We have come out of a prophetic tradition which suggests that Christianity is a prophetic teligion. Admittedly, no church exists in which a man can be a prophet without risking his neck. —We should never be prophets just to be prophets, however we need to be issue-centered rather than self centered. Progress is too often undermined by the person who becomes the issue and thereby obscures the real issue."

Dr. Jackson, goes on to say, "my suggestion to Chaplains is that the most prophetic role they can assume within the military bureaucracy is that of conciliation and expediency - persons who understand the system and make it work more effectively in bringing justice to the people they serve."

I was very much impressed by the Keynote Address delivered by Rear Admiral Francis L. Garrett, Chief of Chaplains, U.S. Navy. The address appeared in the 1973 Winter issue of the Navy Chaplains bulletin. In that address, Chaplain Garrett said, "First and foremost we are men with a mission who stand in the tradition of prophets and apostles. Men commissioned by the living God with no less of a task than establishing God's Kingdom in the hearts and lives of men.

It is in the ministry of our Lord and His Apostles that we find the clue to our identity and our own task as proclaimers of liberty. If their ministry was one of liberation bondage — so, too, must be our own."

Chaplain Garrett seems to be deeply convinced that where ever the people who they serve are in bondage to the demons of our time, then God is calling upon the Chaplains to become the liberators.

Again, I like to quote Chaplain Garrett as he says, "Whether the bondage is the terrible burden of guilt produced by unforgiven sin or the despair that arises from a lack of selfworth the awesome awareness

of drug dependence, or alcoholism, or the frustration and hostility – caused by racial discrimination. Our God given mission is to proclaim the freedom of life in God's Kingdom."

I need not point out to my constituency that we are living in destructive times. Never in the history of our civilization have there been such a moral and spiritual let-down as we witness today. We are embroiled in a fierce struggle against the forces of secularism with all of its soul damaging effect upon both young and old alike.

However, as I gaze into the Crystal Ball of the future, I see a spark of hope, and that hope is in Christ Jesus. For I am reminded of that "certain day" when our Lord went into a ship with his disciples: and aid to them, let us go over unto the other side of the lake. While on their way the human man Jesus fell asleep: and there came down a storm of wind on the lake; and they were filled with water, and were injeopardy. After someone in a state of fear awoke Jesus — He arose and rebuked the wind and raging of the water and they ceased, and there was a calm. Then I hear Jesus as he spoke to them as they stood on deck of the ship amazed...."Where Is Your Faith?"

In spite of the stormy times in which we live, there is hope! — we must at all times have faith in Jesus — As he calmed the raging wind and waters nearly two thousand years ago, he can calm the raging winds of Sin in this age and time.

This is what the ministry of the chaplaincy is all about. All around us are problems to be faced. Stormy seas to encounter, therefore, Chaplains must seek to relate their vacation to the problems or the world. They must be willing and ready at all times to tell a dying world that is so warped in sin that Jesus Christ is the answer. For he is able to speak in these times and say, "Peace Be Still."

In 1970 during our convention in Shreveport, Louisiana the message on Social Justices was entitled "A Black Finger Pointing Upward." In 1971 in San Francisco the title of the report was "The Conflicts of our Age and Their Pressures on People of Minority Groups." In 1972 in Dallas. Texas the title of the report was Reviewing the Preview. I have re-read each of these reports to regain a view of prophecies that I made. In 1970 one of the paragraphs in the message had this to say about Black people in particular: "Where do we go from here? We go forward and upward. We must not forget the roads that we have trod. We must not forget how we have come nor from where we have come from. Often we have been in revolutions but the cause was right! Often there has been bloodshed, but the cause was right? We must lay our pistols, aside for this is wrong. We must stop pointing the finger at others whom we feel have retarded our progress. The truth of it is nobody is in our way, not if God is with us. We must meet the challenge of our responsibility by condemning wrong in high places and praising right when it is done. We must meet our responsibilities by never for a moment letting up in allowing our White Brother and especially our White Preachers Brothers to forget that segregation is wrong, even in the church where he preaches. We must never forget that the Christ we serve was casted aside and abused for a cause and died for that cause.

In 1971 I had these words to say: "There are not too many good words that can be said for this present administration. This is regretable too, because the ground was indeed fertile for producing good at a strategic time. We are at the point of retrogress. The President does not know which way to twist his mouth. Perhaps the best thing maybe for him to keep it closed. In another paragraph I said the church must teach and preach righteousness. Whether we want to be involved with politics or not, we are. Church people cannot stand idly by and allow people with no Christian conscious to occupy high offices. Our communities, our states and our nation will be totally unsafe places to live. We must demand and encourage Christian lawyers educators, and businessmen to run for public office. Even at this point the Christian minister in the black community need to run and occupy some of these offices, because of his role in being in the fore-front of the fight for Civil Rights.

In 1972, I had this to say: The church cannot divorce herself from the affairs of the community. The voice of the church has been heard while other voices remain silent. As long as injustices shall cry out whether they be in the White House or in the out-house, the voice of the church must be heard! The voice of the church can be heard! The voice of the church must say to the people of our congregations and the community that the time is out for us to have stab-ins and shoot-outs. The voice of the church must be heard to say that we want more out of a president than talk about clearing the welfare rolls, we want jobs in America. We want dignity and we want respect. The voice of the church must continue to cry out as long as the stomachs of black and poor people are without food from one day to another. The title of the report that I shall give tonight is "WHAT IS WATERGATE SAYING?"

While there has been a denouncing cry about the time being used for the Senate Watergate Investigation, and while voices all across America are seeking ways to hide their pride in this present administration. I for one feel that the Senate Watergate Investigation is a word to all of America. For those who would decry the senate investigation, let me remind you that nothing is wrong with the investigation, the trouble is in the White House. I as many of you have had the chance to sit and watch the white haired Senator from North Carolina rap the gavel for a number of days to open and close these hearings. Some parts of the investigation have been quite amusing, other parts quite confusing. Senator Sam Irving while in North Carolina a few days ago, was making some statements relative to the Watergate case said, there were two persons who agreed to come and testify before the committee without being asked to do so. They were a Mrs. Martha Mitchell and some person who called himself a preacher. The name Martha Mitchell in more recent days carried with it a great deal of jest, and people often start laughing when her name is called, but I could suppose that were she allowed to testify that the cap would really be blown off of the kettle. Senator Irving said of the preacher, that the preacher said, he had had a revelation from the Lord about Watergate and he knew all about watergate and he wanted to come and testify about Watergate. The Senator said that he hardly knew what to say to the preacher, but finally he ended up by saying to the preacher, "I don't know about your coming, but I sure would welcome the Lord down to testify." It

appears that from the way that the Watergate is going around in circles that only the Lord knows. But, I am convinced that more than the Lord knows. Richard Milhouse "Tricky Dick" Nixon knows.

Mr. Nixon ran his first campaign on Law and Order. There is nothing wrong with law and order. Church people must believe in law and order above any other group in the world. This platform won many votes for him, because his idea of law and order was to subdue Black folk and poor white folk. He declared that he would take crime out of the streets, he did just that, and took it to the White House where he could watch and supervise it. It would be well to note that no matter who became the president at the time that he did, massive demonstrations would have ceased. The point had been made. Black people were beginning to realize that the great hurt was being inflicted upon themselves. He found another way to exterminate us. He played with the war in Vietnam. In the name of national security, he played with the lives of our young men. He perpetuated the war in order to show control of the military industrial complex. Many people made money at the expense of war. Poor people and black people were sold for a buck.

Last year I decried the all "Volunteer Army" concept. I said then, I say now, this is a bread and butter concept for Black people and poor people. The army will be made up of young men and women who have been forced by poverty, lack of jobs, and lack of skills to donate their lives for America. America is not founded on that principle of the few defending her boarders, but, rather where the rich and the poor share alike in her safety.

Why King Richard did you seek to dismantle the program of the "Great Society?" Was it because such programs as the Community Action Agency was helping poor people pull up by their boot strings? Was it because you wanted to be king instead of president and have servants instead of free men? Is it because the black man was arising too fast? We are not blind. We see how you have stacked the Supreme court with conservatives. We are not blind, we see how you have talked about people on welfare rolls and we have watch you take tax payers money and spend thousands on what you call security. We are not blind, we have watched every step that you have made. You want to be greater friends with the enemies of America than you do with the Blacks and poor in America. We see how you have designed a carefully schemed

plan to return the power to the states in terms of revenue sharing. Before the poor can share it, it has all been shared by monsters in your dynasty.

America has been rapidly moving toward a police state that is likened only to that of Adolph Hitler's Germany. The power of control had virtually shifted to the White House. This is evidence by Watergate. This is evidenced by the President's plan to completely dismantle the Office of Economic Opportunity. The office had been created by Congress, but the president was going to announce its desistance. This is the power of a ruler. I am grateful to the people of Chicago who took him to task in court. The program is alive, but it needs some medicine, it is sick. Do you know who suffers most? The poor.

I tremble now when I think of what this country would have come to, if there had been no Watergate. Mr. Nixon and the people around him wanted him to win big. They could declare this clear mandate from the people for the perpetuation of his warped sided rulerahip. If Watergate had not come, King Richard would really be wielding an iron hand. He surrounded himself with people of the same mind. They wanted him to win so big, they lost all consciousness for right and wrong. They stopped at nothing! Nixon would have won without a single wiretap or any other kind of tap. But, the greedy is never satisfied with a little, he wants more and more.

If Mr. Nixon is clear, why is it he doesn't want to turn the tapes over to the Senate Investigation Committee. He turned one of them over to one of his aides. Will these tapes prove that he master minded the entire Watergate scandal? How will what is said affect our nation's security, if he or his aides did not speak out of terms? Do these tapes hold the keys to whether or not the witnesses that have come before this committee prove they are telling the truth or lying? What's wrong Mr. President with being an example of the doctrine that you preached, LAW AND ORDER? If you are not involved, then turn over the tapes so that we can be on with the business of this country. Isn't that what you want? I grant you this is what we need!

Where has meat gone? The cost of living is jumping every day? Plants are closing down daily. You don't want to put people on Welfare. What are we going to do King Richard? Maybe we had better tet Martha Mitchell have her say. After all she was man-handled in California. She has suffered enough to speak a little. I for one would like to hear what she has to say.

Black people for the most part did not vote for Mr. Nixon. This convention last year dared not give its endorsement to an administration that we were reading as clear as a first grade reader. This history of the last four years gave us hind-sight to see ahead destruction that cannot be paralleled in American History, no not even a Watts, Calif. I want to thank this convention for its stand last year in Dallas, Texas. Our stand today is no weaker. There is much cause for it to be stronger and even more outspoken. Not because a man is down! Not because a man has fallen! Not because we delight in seeing our country torned to pieces! But, because our stand was right to begin with, because our prophecies are true, because we are loyal Christians and great Americans, because we believe more than anything else that God is busy at work in the affairs of this nation; we view Watergate as a blessing, not in disguise, but, just for what it is.

Even as I stand here my heart goes out to some of our middle class Black Americans whose hearts and minds have forgotten the enslaved poor in the Ghettos. I hurt even more when I think of that number of influential number of Black middle class Americans who supported a man who was literally taking bread out of the mouths of the poor. The inflictions are deep when we reflect the Miami Convention and remember when Mr. Nixon went to where a black entertainer was (one of the most popular in America) and was making a speech that was choaking him and the entertainer threw his arms around him and the look on Milhouse's face showed up as if something unclean had touched him. This convention want to see our black brother do well. Go to the surburbs if you like. Become a powerful politician if you like! Sing for the president if you like! Go and preach in that 30 minute service at the White House if you like! All that I am asking you is, when things go well with you. . remember your brother. The rats have not stopped biting children in Chicago, Shantys are still standing in Shreveport and all over America. Thousands are going to bed hungry every night. Sleep well my middle class Black friend, but when you awake. . help your

brother.

A word to the black youths of America. Personally, I am not worried about you wearing short dresses and long hair. These are fads, they will soon pass away. I am well aware of the challenges of this society that you are having to grow up in. There are many things around you that sound much better to you than the church, but, let me tell you that

there is nothing in this world as sound. Two things you will need to control the greenback that you will have in your pocket. They are God and knowledge. You need to know. Learn-baby-learn. Learn all that you can. School is no joke. Drop your switch blades and grab a hand full of books. Lay off pot and lay in knowledge. You need it now. This is a world where you will have to think for yourself. No leader can do your individual thinking. Wake up baby...wake up! Use your brains, they are there. Stop filling jails, start filling colleges and high schools. If you have not heard about the economy, you need to. WE MUST FIGHT OUR OWN APATHY AND GET up and believe that we have the capacity to make dreams become realities. This present administration delights in seeing you drift backwards. PROGRESS iS FORWARD.

This convention will do little to improve your intelligence if you feel that there was a real threat against the president in New Orleans, a few weeks ago. While it may be true, it is difficult to convince me and thousands of other Americans that it was no more than a "hog wash." It was in my estimate no more than a plan to take the limelight off the wrong doings in the White House. There is no great suspicion in this nation about Louisiana. People from all over the world come to Louisiana, because they believe that we do a thing down there called, "Fix you." (smile).

I am very sentimental. My thoughts are often, "poor Mr. President, O how Watergate and your friends have made you age. The burden of this great office must be more than any of us can imagine. The furrows are showing in your face. Some people are telling you to step down. Others are saying impeach the president. I know that it must be hard for you to get a good night's sleep." I do not want the president to step down, I do not want the president impeached; I want him to stay right there where the people have put him and work hard to straighten up his own mess and be about the business of this country. Stay there! The rest of his life will be a daily reminder of Watergate. LONG LIVE THE PRESIDENT.

## **THE BLESSINGS OF WATERGATE**

The shock is good for America. The legislative branch of the government will now be strengthened as it should be.

Watergate came in time to stop Nixon from completely dismantling the Great Society Programs.

Watergate will give rise to new leadership for America.

Watergate will serve as lessons to government and church bodies that you cannot do wrong and get away with it.

Watergate serves as a warning to Americans relative to the infringement upon human rights.

Watergate has served to clear out the White House of the machinery who was trying to slow things down.

Finally, my brothers and sisters, delegates to this August body, we must remember these lessons of Watergate. We must make sure that our responsibility is carried out where ever we live and in whatever we lead, with honesty and integrity. We may escape the wrath of the people. Newspapers and National Television may not spend countless amounts of money in an effort to know the truth. We must be reminded that the Lord will not come to testify in our small watergates, but one day we must go up before Him. Our records are already written in our own handwriting. While I have scolded Mr. Nixon and his administration, I stand here with words of warning to myself as well as you. Be careful, it is coming up again. It will not be before Judge Schrica, nor the Supreme Court of America. No jury will have to pass upon it. John writes, in Revelation 19:11-16.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. That the National Baptist Convention of America set up a disaster relief board for the purpose of helping people in the times of disaster. This board will formulate policy or formula whereby assistance will be given to people or countries who are hit by hurricanes, earthquakes, etc. especially consider churches of our connection who are sometimes victims of such disasters.

2. That this convention go on record as sending a telegram to the Honorable Sam Irvin commending the Senate Watergate Investigation Committee for its continued probe to find out the truth about Watergate.

3. That this convention go on record as sending a telegram to all of the Major Television Networks for having made it possible for all Americans to trace step by step the workings of the Watergate Committee.

#### ORTHODOXY REPORT by F. BENJAMIN DAVIS

#### God's Salvation Today

There is urgent need to know afresh the meaning of the Biblical faith of salvation. In these days of religious uncertainty and spiritual depression, nothing is more needed than a sane, clear, Biblical interpretation of what redemption really means. During the past few decades our world has experienced the progressive and alarming breakdown of institutions and structures of society. Established ideas, traditional structures, and rules for living are all being questioned, and many have been discarded. Disorder and violence seem to reign. There is great similarity between our day and the time of Noah. Truly, we are living in a world in transition. There seems to be the actual emergence of a single world culture with great fear for the survival of the human race.

Science, technology and managerial skill have performed miracles in solving particular problems, but have not been able to provide answers to the fundamental questions of quality and order in human life. In fact they have often become tools which dehumanize life and productive of glaring inequalities in living and increased the number of victims from oppression. Today is an era of religious pluralism in which many reborn religious are presenting competing claims. Many religions are making an increasingly explicit claim that they provide the answers for men everywhere. This kind of claim is being voiced now by Buddhism, Islam. Hinduism and also by many of the new faiths such as Baha'i, which claim to be more inclusive still. Many black people are being aggressively approached by Black Nationalism, Black Muslims, and the like, offering the only way of salvation for black folks. Many individuals, rejecting the older faiths, are trying to fill the vacuum by experiments in the occult, spiritism, and other novel religious practices which seem to offer understanding of the unknown and bring salvation.

Without doubt, ours is a time of lostness. In may ways we are all strangers, without compass or guidepost. Our previous life styles, religious practices, political structures and basic assumptions are seemingly inadequate. Yet, this very sense of lostness which marks our

generation is one of the most helpful aspects of this hour, because it leaves men open for a word from the Lord to replace smaller voices no longer adequate. Through various movements of our time, the Holy Spirit is liberating men and women to enter into a life more fully human. It is time to proclaim God's Salvation which affirms that it is possible to be fully human and to live with hope. God's Word declares the belief that God provides a way which gives joyful significance both to the life of the individual human person and to the history of mankind as a whole.

At this time the Churches must manifest within the Christian community the vigor, excitement and power of the life-giving Christ about whom we preach. We must restore to the world the true image of the magnificent vision of the Christ through whom God reconciles the whole universe to himself. We must not substitute our own activities for a dynamic contemporary obedience.

Today, Church membership is often a casual and lightly held tie. Participation in worship is occasional, and the Church is "used" mainly for baptism, marriage and burial services. Church membership is in many cases just a part of social respectability.

This type of Christian and Church must recognize that God works out his salvation not only through the Church but also outside and beyond the Church. The Bible is full of instances of God's saving power reaching outside the circle of his chosen people.

We must never forget, however, that the power of salvation is always God's. God is a God of salvation. This is the gospel of the Christian faith. God has saved his people and will save them.

The words of frequent occurrence throughout the Bible are "Salvation," "save," "Savior" and especially the verb "to save." They range in meaning from the most ordinary, everyday or secular sense to the most profoundly theological and religious; the context alone enables us to determine the sense, as in so many Biblical instances of everyday words and phrases which have come into technique.

Biblical faith is not at all concerned with asking in what salvation consists or in recommending techinques, whether mystical or ethical, by which salvation may be attained. It is concerned rather with the proclamation of the fact of salvation, and thus it differs from all "religions" by being kerygmatic in character. The Bible is concerned with the fact that God actually has in concerne historical fact saved him

people from destruction; and it proclaims that the historical salvation thus attested to is the foreshadowing or "type" of the salvation that is both historical and eschatological.

Salvation is the central theme of the whole Bible and as such is related to every other Biblical theme. Among the other themes one should especially consider are atonement, deliverer, reconciliation, redeem, justificiation. In its widest sense, the doctrine of salvation comprehends every thing that God has said and done for the prupose of bringing sinful man back to Himself. It touches and is touched by almost every aspect of Christian truth. It is like a golden thread running through all the areas of Christian doctrine and uniting them together.

Salvation is related to the doctrine of Revelation, for God's revelation of Himself is a saving act. It is related to the doctrine of the Trinity, for it is the Father who savingly loves, the Son who savingly redeems and the Holy Spirit who brings about the experience of salvation in the heart of the sinner. It is related to the doctrines of Man and Sin. Person and Work of Christ, the Church, and also the doctrine of the Last Things, for salvation reaches beyond the present and finds its consummation in the blessedness of the life to come. The Gospel of Christ is definitely concerned about the problem of human sin and all its consequences; however, it is concerned on the bases of eternal values. Social welfare, economic development and all moral reform are very good for the present, but do not help men and women beyond the grave, and the grave is not the end of man. He has an undying soul that goes on and on and on into eternity. The Salvation that God has accomplished through Jesus Christ provides for that undying soul of man and brings it into an unending, infinitely glorious and blissful state. Please do not confuse this statement with the idea that salvation of the soul has no social, political, economic and "secular" aspects and utility in this present world.

However, to examine the doctrine of Salvation to the extent mentioned above would require a large and complete work of systematic theology. It is customary, therefore, to think of the doctrine of Salvation in more closely-defined terms and thus to limit it to a statement of those acts of God which have to do with the application of salvation. Although here and there notice has to be taken of truths which relate to the origination of it.

In the New Testament as in the Old Testament, salvation is

understood to be accomplished by an act of God in human history. Man is saved not by wisdom or right knowledge which is Gnosticism. Not by merit or right actions this is Judaism and several other religious systems. Not by mystical absportion into deity which is Hellenistic Mysticism.

Man is saved by faith in the act of God in the birth, life, death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus Christ.

Accordingly the Christian message is not a philosophy, nor an ethical code, nor yet a technique of mystical practice: it is kerygma, preaching evangel in the Isaiamic sense of proclaiming the fact of liberation (Isa. 40:9; 52:7; 61:1-2). The title Savior which in the Old Testament is a name for God, is applied to Christia: the New Testament. (Luke 2:11; John 4:42; Acts 5:31; 13:23; Phil. 3:20; 2 Tim. 1:10; Tit. 1:4, 2:13; 3:6; 2 Pet. 1:1. 11; 2:20; 3:2; 18; Eph. 5: 23; I John 4:14).

The death of Christ is set forth in the New Testament and celebrated in the Church as the means of our salvation, but the death was always regarded as a moment in the whole act of deliverance.

It should be noted that the act of salvation or reconciliation, which God has accomplished through Christ, is not limited to the human race; salvation in the New Testament is a cosmic conception. Eph. 1;10; Col. 1:20:2 Cor. 5:17.

God is Eternal, in Him are eternal values and apart from Him there are no such values. As there are no eternal values apart from God, man can come into possession of these values only as he becomes related to God. Man cannot of himself through any reformation that he might bring about or by any of his good works return to God. There is but one way for man to come to God and that is through Him Who came down from heaven and into the world as the Saviour of men. It is through the salvation that God offers in Jesus Christ, and only so, that man may become related to Him and thereby partake of His eternal values.

Jesus said, "I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly" John 10:10. This life that Jesus came to give to man is eternal and the abundance of it is eternal in its values.

This is a great salvation. There is deliverance from the reign of Satan, called the power of darkness, and redemption from the curse or penalty of God's holy law. All trespasses are forgiven, He who is saved becomes reconciled to God and is brought into a state of peace with Him. He is

bom again of God with an eternal life. He is made part of a new creation in Christ Jesus. The Holy Spirit is given to dwell within him forever and he is also sealed by the same Spirit. He is given a perfect standing before God because of the merits of Jesus Christ and is placed under the keeping and providing care of God for all his spiritual needs. Provision is made for deliverance from sin in his earthly life. He becomes the object of the intercession and advocacy of the Son of God before his Father. He becomes subject to the Father's chastening. For him there shall be deliverance of the body from corruption and mortality. He shall be conformed to the image of the Son of God and made one with God the Father and God the Son. He shall be before God in love throughout all etemity.

(John 1:29; 3:16; 6:33; 12:32; Rom. 5:18, 2 Cor. 5:19; 1 Tim. 2:4; 1 Tim. 2:6; Tit. 2:11; 1 John 2:2; Heb. 2:9, 1 John 2:2; 4:14.)

Salvation is of God through Jesus Christ.

There is Salvation in no other and the Black Church must proclaim this fact.

"God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself."

There is no other way of Salvation . . . other than faith in the revelation of God.

#### THE BLACK PREACHER IN THE LIBERATION STRUGGLE

#### Marvin C. Griffin, Historian

The Black preacher is a strange phenomenon on the American scene. He plays many roles in sundry times and in divers manners. He is prophet, priest, politician, builder, administrator and organizer. He has been in the forefront of the black struggle for liberation, leading his people out of the Egyptian bondage through wilderness wanderings on the way to Cannan.

The black preacher has possessed his soul with patience, enduring 300 years of travail, anguish and agony. Three hundred years ago, he was not really considered a person but only 3/5 of a person. He and his parishioners were sold like cattle and counted as property.

The black preacher has been the leader in the development of a black mystique—"soul."

"Soul is the toughness born of hard times and the compassion oppressed people develop after centuries of sharing a loaf that is never enough. It is a special brotherhood of those set apart from their fellows, made visible by physical appearance, and different customs. Soul is the graceful survival under impossible circumstances."

The soul of black folk is personified by the black preacher. As a leader of organized protest against slavery and a significant contributor in the liberation struggle, the role of the black preacher has been misinterpreted and distorted by those who have chose to ignore the facts of history. In recent years he has been called a compromiser, exploiter of his people and an enemy in the liberation struggle. Several years ago, Black Panthers declared that black preachers and black churches were enemies in the struggle for black liberation and set about to put them out of business.

Recently, a Black Panther leader declared that they made a mistake; that they were returning to the churches and that they should not have left the church.

Blacks accepted from their oppressors a religion their oppressors hoped would make them satisfied with their servitude and used it as a technique of survival and a source of strength.

"They have taken a Jesus Bag shaped like a noose and refashioned it into a black comucopia of spiritual riches."

Richard Allen was born a slave in Philadelphia and became a leader in the liberation struggle along with his brother, he purchased his freedom in 1777. He was converted and became a methodist preacher. When Allen Absolom Jones and William White were dragged from their knees by white officials of St. George Methodist Church in Philadelphia and told to get to the rear of the gallery, they protested and left, never to return. In 1794 Allen organized the Bethel African Methodist Episcopal church and Jones organized the St. Thomas Episcopal Church in Philadelphia.

Peter Williams, a black priest, became vocal on the question of abolition, the bishops of the Protestant Episcopal Church silenced him "with a decree that he should preach merely the gospel without interfering with the political affairs of the times." 3

Nat Turner, a Baptist slave exhorter, called the Prophet, in Southhampton County, Virginia is remembered for his role in the struggle for black liberation. Born in 1800, his mother, an African—born slave, could not bear the idea of bringing a slave into the world and was "so wild that she had to be tied to prevent her from murdering him." Nat survived and demonstrated his hatred for slavery by leading a bloody insurrection which he believed to be inspired by God.

Nat Turner's revolt was a landmark in the history of slavery and was the forerunner of the great slavery debates which resulted in the abolition of slavery in the United States.

Fredrick Douglas as a slave was taught to read by his mistress. He was given spiritual guidance in his struggle for liberation by Rev. Charles Lawson, a slave preacher. Rev. Lawson could not read. Fredrick Douglas taught Rev. Lawson the letter and Rev. Lawson taught Douglas the spirit.

Rev. Lawson said to young Fredrick, "The Lord has work for you to do." Fredrick would say, "How can these things be? What can I do? His simple reply was 'Trust in the Lord.'" Fredrick Douglas would say, "I am a slave for life." Rev. Lawson would quietly answer, "the Lord can make you free, only have faith in the Lord, ask and it shall be given.

A. Clayton Powell, Jr., New York City Councilman and U. S. Congressman and a leader in the liberation struggle, was a Baptist preacher and the son of a Baptist preacher. Martin Luther King, Jr., prophet of social protest and crusader for peace and recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize was a Baptist preacher and the son of a Baptist preacher.

Malcolm X, another leader in the liberation struggle, was the son of Rev. Earl Little, a Baptist minister and a dedicated organizer for Marcus Gravey's Universal Negro Improvement Association. R. H. Boyd, Henry Allen Boyd, S. R. Prince, G. L. Prince, A. A. Lucas, D. D. Petjaway, J. C. Sams, Jesse Jackson and Ralph Abernathy are preachers who have demonstrated outstanding leadership in promoting the doctrine of self help in the black liberation struggle.

Imbused by the liberating influence of the gospet, the black preacher is God's own creation. He is an angel of ebony hue. He has developed a language. He has produced a literature. He has created his own music. Through his sermons he has presented to the world his own

interpretation of the Christian faith. He has by the help of God carved his own niche in history as a leader in the liberation struggle. These words beautifully express the role of the black preachet:

but in the old grief-soul that stared through his eyes at me.

a secret knife within his hand.

a secret bullet in his eye.

#### YOUR COMMISSION ON THE CHRISTIAN MINISTRY By: Rev. C. A. Holliday, Chairman

PRESIDENT SAMS, VICE PRESIDENTS. OFFICERS, MESSENGERS AND FRIENDS OF OUR NATIONAL BAPTIST CONVENTION OF AMERICA

Our presentation today is on the theme: "BRIDGING THE GAP THROUGH A POSITIVE MINISTRY."

We are faced today by what is often referred to as a generation gap. Some would say we are faced with a breakdown in communication: It is our thinking that whatever the issues are, we can bridge the gap through a positive ministry.

I. We can structure a meaningful dialogue-between age groups and our sister churches of different National or State Convention preferences of the same faith and order.

We are bound by heredity, our environment, and our habits of thinking. The only way for us to settle our differences and arrive at sensible conclusions is through honest discussion, with integrity of purpose and mutual respect. . . (Dialogue)

All this has special meaning for us right now. If we expect to find the right answers to the grave problems we face today, we must give our minds a chance by exposing them to all valid points of view. In short, we must dedicate our hearts, minds, and spirits to the search for truth, not only as citizens of the world and members of the human race. Then, and only then, can we reach the kind of decisions that will make us truly free.

#### ONE BODY, MANY MEMBERS

The church has an even greater responsibility to function in dialogue, since we Christians are already deeply related to each other through Christ, Paul inspires this dialogical perspective when he says: "For just as you have many members in one physical body and those members differ in their functions, so we, through many in mumber, compose one body in Christ and are all members of one another." (Rom. 12:4,5)

If we are honest with ourselves, however, we must readily admit that

there is a significant dialogue gap with the comtemporary church. Our situation is very much like that of Thomas Carlyle, who said after visiting with his close friend John Sterling: "I spent nearly the whole day with Sterling, and in everything except opinions we agreed perfectly."

Today's church is experiencing an intense struggle between theological and ideological positions, and often the left and right hands of the body of Christ find themselves pulling away from and against each other.

#### A CHALLENGE...

On the one hand, there is a new breed of thinkers and doers within the church who are highly critical of what the church has been in the past. Their position is put quite precisely by Archie Hargraves in his booklet on church renewal entitled, "Stop Pussyfooting Through a Revolution." He lists eight criticisms of the church which are typical of the thinking of the new breed of Christians:

1. The church too frequently worships the false God of the status quo-the church as it is, the community as it is, and the world as it is. The local church, it is charged, won't change and consequently, is unable to bring about changes in the society that surrounds it.

2. The church has entered a period Gibson Winter calls it "suburban captivity." Residential churches have fled the deteriorated areas of the inner city and have become contemporary temples for the glorification of the middle class. Church members are accused of being more interested in architecture than in the gospel and in maintaining the edifice than in extending God's Good News.

3. While the church seeks to be popular, taking the Christian gospel seriously would require, or at least render likely, its unpopularity. To be a Christian today is to be respectable and well-received in the community, a far different state of affairs (say its critics) from that of New Testament times, in which a "parish" was a "body of aliens in the midst of any community."

4. The church exists primarily for its own members instead of for the outside world. Congregations that quickly approve the purchase of an organ costing thousands of dollars may argue for hours over whether or not some local community-action projects should be supported. This introversion antagonizes the youth of today, who turn to the Peace Corps or Civil Rights activities for a sense of mission.

5. Most members of most churches use their places of worship as they would a filling station a place to go occasionally in order to refuel. The contemporary church, say many among the new breed, is only a place where one learns how to think positively and finds "peace of mind."

6. Church members regard God as the Great Psychiatrist, a resource in times of Crisis and a worthy friend if a loved one dies, but a convenient absentee at other times. The local church is thus accused of running a spiritual ambulance service, treating suffering when it arises but rarely trying to influence the power structure that might have caused the suffering in the first place.

7. The church as an agent of Christian education fails to nurture the spiritual growth of its members. For the vast majority of the church members, Christian existence begins and ends with their participation in

the Sunday-morning worship service.

8. The local church allows its life to be governed by traditions that are long out of date. Persons who suggest changing the time of worship from 11:00 a. m. to 10:30 a. m. encounter strong resistance, as the members of the church overlook the fact that the eleven o'clock hour was set up originally by an agrarian society to avoid conflicting with the time for milking cows.

Armed with these criticisms, the new breed have committed themselves to a new kind of Christian life-style. They have given themselves to social and political action designed to change the conditions in the world that oppress and isolate men, all in the name of bearing witness to Christ in the world. They spearhead attempts to overcome racism and end the sin of war. In all of this they want the church to be as flexible and ready for change as this world-transforming mission may require.

#### A POSITIVE RESPONSE

On the other hand there are many in the church today who feel that the position of the new breed is an over-reaction. Christians agree that the church should not stand still, but they are, for the most part, ready to defend many of the church's accomplishments and methods of operation. They feel that a few minor modifications may be needed to make for greater effectiveness, but, in their way of thinking, the church's traditional life style rests squarely on Christian theology.

Christians are concerned about the lack of personal faith which seems to accompany the new emphasis on social action. They feel that Jesus worked primarily with individual people and sought to change society by changing persons. If the church would only dedicate itself to extending this ministry of Jesus to individuals, these individuals would in turn change the world. Those who take this position come to worship on Sunday seeking spiritual strength and a personal challenge so that they can fulfull their Christian discipleship in the world, and they have great difficulty responding to calls for corporate social and political action in areas where they feel the church as a corporate body may not be knowledgeable or capable.

These Christians also sense what they call a dramatic lack of biblical theology in the current social activism, as though the church were becoming just another social-service agency. They fault the emphasis of the new breed on action to relieve social and political problems at the point where such action seems to lack any appeal to win new people to Christ, which they feel is the central responsibility of Christians. If we are trying to help people without converting them, if our goal is something other than bringing people to Christ, then it is not of the gospel.

#### A DIALECTIAL DIALOGUE

While there are many people who stand somewhere between these two positions, the fact remains that today's body of Christ is significantly polarized. It seems, further, that such polarity will be a fact of church life for sometime.

#### LISTENING VS. HEARING

People do not need to win an argument in order to have a secure sense of being. They need to relate to and listen to each other. It is in this encounter that truth really happens.

This puts a very high premium on the ability to be open to the other side. Today's dialogue gap may well be caused by a situation similar to that of an excited little boy who was telling his father a story. "Slow up, son, you're talking too fast," the father said. "On, no, Daddy, I don't talk too fast, You just listen too slow."

#### KEEPING IN TOUCH

One way to bridge the communication gap is to stay with, to stay in touch with, people who hold different theological views. The book, The Dialogue Cap, by Thomas Mullen, puts this in a penetrating way:

"The new breed needs to be understood, but it also need to understand the (traditional) church. Both camps have been making a common mistake: They have been turning each other off and turning each other out. Both have made a basic error: They have forgotten that today's revolutions are tomorrow's orthodoxies.

... The local church no longer can afford the luxury of simply being on the defensive. It has to listen to what the new breed is saying or it will very likely lose its growing edge and quietly fade away into a stained-glass sunset... It needs to be more selective in its rejection of radical ideas and radical proponents of ideas, choosing carefully on the basis of considered judgment and not in terms of angry frustration. It needs to listen with its hearing aid turned up so as to discern fairly whother it is God or man speaking.

The new breed needs to be at carefully critical of itself as it has been critical of the traditional Church, for in the fantastic outpouring of ideas and practices which have come forth in the name of "Christian relevance," common sense assures us that truth and faddism are undoubtedly intertwined.

The new breed needs the perspective of history. One of its most serious dangers is its suspicion of tradition and its too-easy embrace of that which seems contemporary and, therefore, acceptable.

We must allow the now generation the freedom to be what they are. The purpose of dialogue is not to get other people to agree with our opinions, but to openly relate to others, to hear them into being, to call forth the Spirit of God that is already within them.

And remember Paul's challenging advice: "Don't cherish exaggerated ideas of yourself or your importance..." and Don't become set in your own opinion." It's the only way we will ever find God and His truth.

We wish to re-affirm our recommendations of last year:

1. That our convention, would make a serious study of a program that would provide greater benefits for a home and retirement benefit for ministers when they become incapacitated and be forced to retire from an active pastorate.

2. That we set forth a period of recognition and celebration of the 200th anniversary of our country.

3. That we would have an evaluation of the contribution that the

Black Baptist have contributed to the growth of this nation spiritually

4. That cur a invention would make a reasonable allocation of funds to do a commendable job for the National Baptist Convention of America with an allowance at this session for promotional work.

Upon the home going of the late Dr. H. W. D. Stewart, the President, through his kindness and the people of the Convention, I have been permitted to serve in this capacity. I felt that to get the most people possible to attend the Convention at the least possible cost, therefore, we proceeded to make contact. We went to the American Express office in Houston, Texas and an appointment was made for me to see Mr. Foster whose office is in the Houston Inter-Continental Airport, I wanted to get reductions for all our constituents just like clergy certificates that the Railroad Commission uses.

This was not possible at that time. Then through Better Tours and Travel, a local travel agency, I tried to arrange an appointment with Senator Lloyd Benson, the junior senator from Texas. The senator has an office in Houston in the Federal Building. He is also a member of the transportation committee of the U.S. Senate.

BAPTIST CONVENTION OF AMERICA This Houston office was going to arrange for me to talk with him in Washington, D. C. since I was representing a convention of some four

million people. But then came what is known as "Watergate" and this gave us a great setback.

Then we preceded with the group method for this year, but I trust by the will of God that next year we shall have more of what we need in transportation. We want to register the people to see by what means they got to the Convention... whether by train, air, bus or private travel. By this we will have some statistics to work with. We ask the Convention to help us in this matter.

## WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 5, 1973 - Morning Session

BAPTIST CONVENTION OF AMERICA

The Seventy-Third Annual Session of the Woman's Auxiliary National Baptist Convention assembled in the Red Lacquer Room of the Palmer House Hotel, State and Monroe Streets, Chicago, Illinois, Rev. At the close of the message, Vice President Vaught asked what is the pleasure of the Convention? Sister Elverta Jones of Phoenix, Arizona moved that the address be accepted and published in our national paper, Sisters McEory of Fort Worth, Texas and Odessa Reed of Los Angeles, California, seconded the motion, the vote was Unanimous. Sister Mamie L. Turner and the committee for the President's love token was in charge, after the offering Vice President Vaught ask for the report of the Nominating committee. Hicks extended the invitation for discipleshin. hymn used "Pass Me Not." Special offering in honor of Sister Anna Washington, (Sunday School Offering), President Thompson thanked Reverend Calaway for a spiritual message. We order and pay for merchandise in good faith that it will be delivered. There are countless acts in our daily lives that are based on a blind and unquestioning faith. This faith is placed in the integrity and honesty of our fellowman.

But what has happened to our faith in our all sufficient God? Maybe we don't know what faith is all about. We must expose the Counterfeits and clearly define what Biblical faith really means. The time has come to make an urgent appeal to the Christian world to really re-examine our grasp of the fundamental basis of our Christian Religious faith.

1. If we could get rid of fear. Fear is over powering our faith. If we eliminate all fear from the human mind and exercise our God given faith, move into a divine unfolding of our failures and glories, we would become new beings here and now.



"CHRISTIANS COMPASSION REACHING TOWARD ALL PEOPLES" St. Luke 7:12-14; St. Matthew 9:36-38

Both passages of Scripture refers to the deep compassion Christ Jesus had for the people on earth.

Christian: Since the days when the disciples of Jesus were first called Christians at Antioch, this has been the name most frequently applied to His followers. A Christian must feel the challenge of following Christ in all relationships of life.

Christianity is the only religion which is a religion of love God is revealed as one who loves and asks love of his people. Love is simply the response of the soul towards others, expressed in kindness, goodwill, and service.

Christians we must love without reservation; with the heart He want our affection, with the mind, our obedience and companionship; with the body He wants our service.

Perhaps the most outstanding characteristic of Jesus was love. Lowe explains every great deed in His noble life. Without love He could not have been the Saviour, He would never have consented to come to earth on his redeeming mission had he not first loved us. He had a deep love for mankind. To Him love was real. It leads him to die for the world which His love had embraced. His love was not racial. It was not geographical, nor was it limited to any one generation or civilization.

Just before ascending to the Father in Heaven Jesus gave unto the

disciples the great commission. It is very apparent that this was for all Christians, for a dozen men could not cover the world, and no angel bands were ever sent to make known the plan of salvation.

Matthew 9: 37-38 states—"Then saith He unto his disciples, The harvest truly is plenteous, but the labourers are few: Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest."

One of the most amazing things in the religious world today is the unwillingness of people to tell others about Christ; yet, all that is finest and best in America is definitely the results of Christianity. Where the gospel is not known, people live in ignorance, superstition and fear; contrast the Christian nations with those in Africa, India, China and other parts of the world. It is not because we are (in America) that we have a great civilization, for our ancestors have always oeen wnite; yet for thousands of years until the gospel came to them, they were coarse barbarians. So after nineteen-hundred years of Christianity, the gospel has only reach about one third of the world, and we are told that five hundred million people actually die in every generation without so much as even having heard of Christ.

Christians Dedication: As a Christian Nurse want you to choose to make more than a living—to make life. When we make an honest effort to get the heart of Christian benevolence, we discover that its real meaning is identical with that of prayer. Whenever a soul is on fire with love and compassion for others the, most important work of the Christians engaged, is what we call the "benevolent side" of Nurses Corps Mission is twain, it is creating an atmosphere in which hope, faith and love can live, and by feeding and clothing the body, and relieving human misery. Your sympathy and devotion can overcome indifference among all people.

Don't engulf in racial problems as there are many in the world today, have heartfelt compassion on all peoples'.

Pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you, "Matthew 5:44, Christ said, It is easy to pray for those we love, and who loves us. It is another thing to pray for those who hate us and abuse us. On Caivary Christ prayed 'Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do!' "

Love—in—prayer for those who hate or hurt us may be hard at first.

Once we taste it and experience the release from tension and misery, we

know that we have taken a long step toward growth in likeness of Christ which is the aspiration of every disciple.

By example, Jesus taught us to pray for one another. Every Christian stands in need of prayer. We are in the world to continue the work which Christ began. There is no act we perform, no word spoken, no service rendered that it does not reflect on Him who called us to follow.

We may not as individuals; nor as an auxiliary be able to go into all parts of the world, but we can have compassion for all peoples, and to support the cause for Chirst. A Christian may conclude a job, but he does not retire from the work of the Master! You will want to give generously according to your means, thus putting your money to work where you can't go; and you will want to remember the Kingdom of God in your will. The wise person is going to realize that he will need some "treasures in heaven" when he gets there and will deposit some earthly coin to his credit in the Bank of Heaven. Redemption cost so much in blood, sweat and shame. (By compassion to others).

The ability of Jesus to feel the deep needs of humanity is compassion. The Bible also suggest that we pray without ceasing. In everything we do, we should include the approbation of our Father.

The scope of prayer is most wonderful, you can cross oceans in an instant, you can pray for multitudes with the same breath as you pray for one. There is glorious adventure in prayer. It has miracle working power, Pray always according to the will of God, and in the Name of Jesus.

Faithful service with compassion is rewarding: A cup of water! That doesn't seem like much. Certainly it would seem scarcely worth a reward. But the Lord Jesus promised a reward just for giving a cup of cold water. "Mark 10:36-41" Have you thought of what was involved in giving a drink to a thirsty passerby in those days? It was not a matter of opening a refrigerator door and reaching for a pitcher of ice water, or running water from the faucet until it ran cold.

Water: "Matthew says" Cold Water was a precious commodity. The trek to the well was a daily chore. Sharing that water would be a mark of unselfishness, love and compassion. Clearly the Lord Jesus was teaching that any special effort you put forth in His name will not go unnoticed. That hour you sacrifice to do a favor for one who is helpless and the pains you take to be gentle and kind, rather than brusque, with

the people committed to your care will not go unnoticed by the Lord.

Things that may seem trivial to you, if they are honestly done in the Name of the Lord will be credited to your account.

You may not be able to do anything spectacular, surely you can give a cup of cold water, surely you can have compassion for all peoples' through prayer and service.
