

CONSTITUTION OF THE CANADIAN SOUTHERN BAPTIST CONFERENCE

Article 1 Name: This body shall be called "The Canadian Southern Baptist Conference."

Article 2 Purpose: This Conference is a co-operative body which furnishes a channel for closer fellowship among Canadian Southern Baptists: through mutual encouragement seeks to strengthn our initiative in our Master's work; and seeks to foster a spirit of expansion.

Article 3 Doctrinal Statement: Refer to
The Baptist Faith and Message, adopted by
the Southern Baptist Convention, 1963.

Article 4 Membership:

- (a) This Conference shall be composed of messengers elected by Baptist churches co-operating with the work of this Conference, providing that the church electing the same shall subscribe to and be in harmony with the constitution of this Conference.
 - (b) Each co-operating church may send the pastor and two messengers for the first 50 members or fraction thereof, and one additional messenger for each additional 50 members or fraction thereof, providing no church shall have more than 10 messengers inclusive.

- (c) Messengers from new churches may be seated at any Annual Conference Session by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote. Co-operation is voluntary and any church may withdraw at its discretion.
- Article 5 Officers: The officers of this Conference shall be President, First and Second Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, and Historian. Other officers may be elected as is deemed necessary by the Conference. The officers shall transact any and all business of the Conference between its sessions, providing that nothing shall be done by the officers contrary to this Constitution or the expressed will of the Conference.
- Article 6 Committees: The Conference shall elect or the President appoint such sommittees as are deemed necessary or advisable to facilitate the work of the Conference.
- Article 7 Sessions and meetings: The Conference shall meet annually at such time and place as it may determine, or at the call of the officers.
- Article 8 Baptist Horizon: The official publication of the Conference shall be the Baptist Horizon. The editor shall be elected for indefinite tenure and be responsible to the Conference.
- Article 9 Amendments: This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the messengers present at any annual session, providing that the proposed amendment is published to the churches at least 30 days in advance with this exception, that .

it may be amended by a unanimous vote at any annual session.

Article 10 Parliamentary Procedure: All parliamentary procedure, except as provided for in this Constitution, shall be governed by Kerfoot's Parliamentary Law.

Footnote: The above constitution is as amended at Sixth Annual Session, Kamloops, May 7-9, 1968.

We had only nine members. At present
we have 72 enrolled in Sunday School
with an average attendance of 38. We
now have 21 church members. We will

have our V.B.S. in late August and staff the shoool ourselves.

Rev. Bob Shaddox, Crossroads Baptist' Church, Prince George, B. C. The past three weeks have been the most thrilling in my work there. I have baptized 3 up until then. I have baptized 2 the last three weeks. There are seven others waiting. Average Sunday School attendance is 71. I can see spiritual growth in some of our people. There is . a warm feeling we have not enjoyed in the past. We received a call from Bear Lake saying "come and help in a bible teaching ministry." Work is being done that I did not have anything to do with. I see an increase in prospect visitation. I think this is happening because I have a new spirit in my life.

Rev. John Cunningham, Cambrian Heights Baptist Church, Calgary, Alta.

Early in my ministry I made a startling discovery. "The church is what I am." Last year, was the first year we have gone a full year without a single baptism. God did two things in my church last year.

- 1. Some young people came from Saskatoon and held a youth retreat. Our youth were wonderfully blessed by it.
- 2. The O.B.U. Encounter came, our youth were again blessed. We have had a baptism each Sunday in April.

Report from Armstrong Avenue Baptist Church

Armstrong Avenue Baptist Church has had no pastor for over a year now. Ben Evertt has been interim pastor.

Last summer the church held a Vacation Bible School but none is scheduled for this summer. It is possible the church will have a Youth Revival for one week. One of the possibilities for Armstrong is in youth work. Gus Evertt has a good youth band at the church and their music has been enjoyed by the other churches as well. A regular Sunday School continues and Sunday services attendance ranges from 15 to 25. A weekly Bible study and prayer meeting is also held.

Recently the church sold the two houses it owned on the adjacent properties netting the church \$33,990 and reducing the church debt to \$1,631 as of March 22,1972. One of our members, Mrs. Elizabeth Stannard was deceased this church year, leaving our membership at 39.

With our debt reduced to a minimum we hope to be able to get a pastor in the near future.

Report from Ridgecrest Baptist Church

Report to Canadian Southern Baptist Conference meeting in Penticton, April 25-27,1972.

The past year has been a unique year at Ridgecrest in that it was one of only two times since her beginning that she has changed pastors. Rev. Allen Schmidt came from Royal Heights Baptist in Delta to take up the reigns of leadership at Ridgecrest, October 9, 1971. The ensuing months have been largely a period of adjustment for pastor and church. For the pastor it is the first time he has come to an established church. For the church its a new experience relating to a new pastor....

A number of significant occurrences and accomplishments have been registered during the past year. Four persons have followed the Lord in baptism. two others are presently preparing for baptism. In January 1972 we started a mission at the new mining town of Logan Lake. 35 miles over the hills west of Kamloops. There are 50 enrolled in the Sunday School there and we are averaging in the twenties in attendance. The pastor and a number of teachers go out to Logan Lake every Sunday at 2:30 for Sunday School. Every second Sunday we conduct a worship service at 3:30. On the alternate Sundays the United/ Anglican ministers from Merritt conduct worship. Each Thursday afternoon the pastor goes out to visit. Next week we will begin a Bible study in a home Thursday afternoon. In this we hope to reach some adults who "leave town" on the weekend.

Last November the Ridgecrest Review was revived and put on a regular publication schedule. This good news piece is mow mailed out each month to

all of our Canadian pastors as well as to other friends of the church in Canada and the U.S.

The church completed a partial telephone survey of the south shore of Kamloops in March. We have begun follow-up and visitation on this. We have slated an all church visitation night twice a month.

Last year Ridgecrest had no V.B.S. (no pastor then, either). This year we plan for three schools: one week at Logan Lake, one week at Rayleigh, and one week in the church.

This summer (May through August) we will have Jamie Osborne working full time with us as an assistant to the pastor with primary responsibilities in V.B.S. surveys and youth programming. In addition to being a real help to the work of the church this will give Jamie a good introduction to the work of a pastor as he contimplates God's will for his life.

Worship service attendance is growing and the church's spirit and outlook appear to be improving. However, there remains a definite need for some renewed vision and a deepr committment to our Lord and His mission among many of our people.

One of the more exciting things relating to Ridgecrest is not happening to the church but the city. Kamloops is presently probably the fastest growing area in Western Canada. New mining claims are being staked and properties developed all around the city at a great rate. The most spectacular of these right now is Afton Mines, a large new copper discovery right along Trans-Canada Highway 10 miles west of town. This will likely bring several thousand new people to Kamloops.

In addition to mining other major industries are planing to move in. To accommodate these people several major new real estate developments are now under way. The largest of these is on the old Cordonier Ranch... 1,000 acres on the bench above Valleyview. These developers plan to build ultimately for 20,000 to 30,000 people. Another development is to be underway in Brocklehurst shortly to provide housing for 8,000 to 10,000 people. And there are others.

Greater Kamloops has at present 50,000 population. The total shopping area includes about 73,000. These figures are expected to double in the next six to ten years.

Ridgecrest Baptist, along with the other churches of Kamloops, will need to call on the resources of heaven through the power of the Holy Spirit to faithfully minister to these multitudes of new people. Pray that God will make us able to rise to the challenge.

The building will cost us \$97,000. We borrowed \$45,000. Thanks to the wonderful birth given by by the Cambrian Heights church we perhaps had the finest start of any mission in Southern Baptist work in Canada. The day they gave us \$47,000 for the building was great. Their love and leadership have never been measured. We thank God for them and Pastor Cunningham. May we get pregnant as a church and have a baby mission and give it a fine birth soon.

We organized May 13, 1971. We broke ground for the basement Sept.28th. We had fine newspaper coverage and also a 22 minute TV documentary on how the church was contructed. We have had ex-convicts work over 1,000 hours. A winter works grant paid them. Our membership worked over 1400 hours of donated labour. All glory and praise to the Glorified Son.
