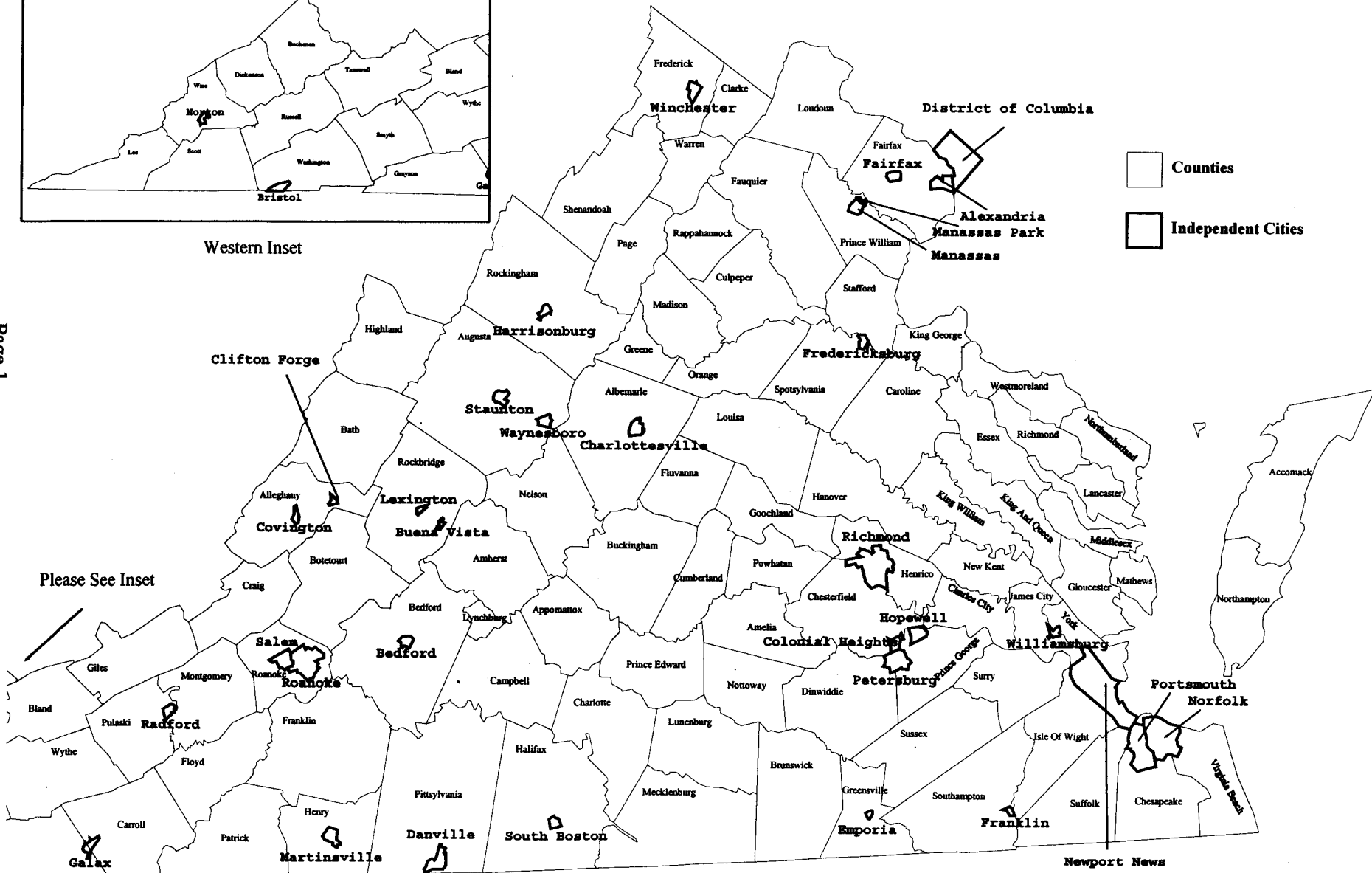

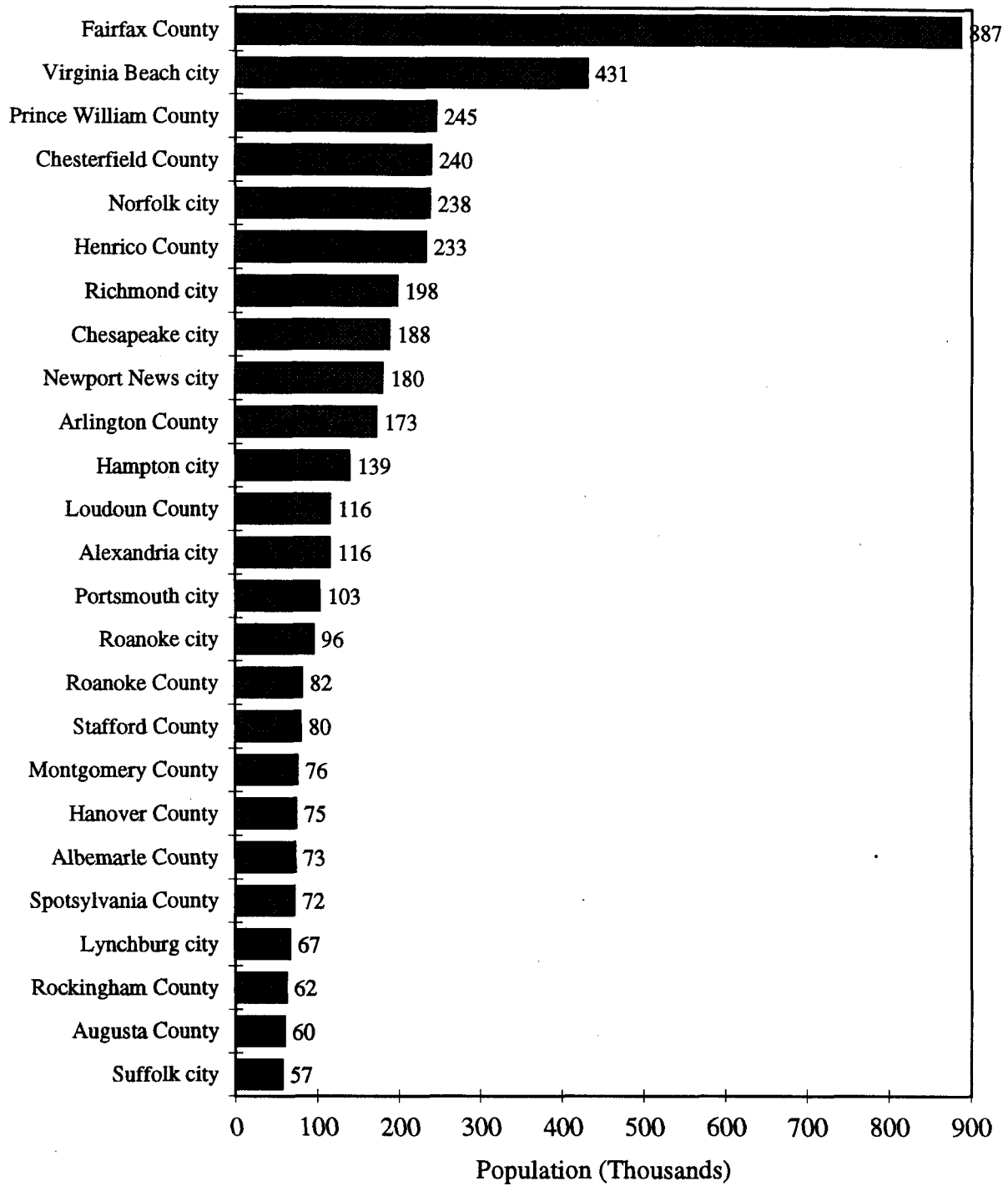

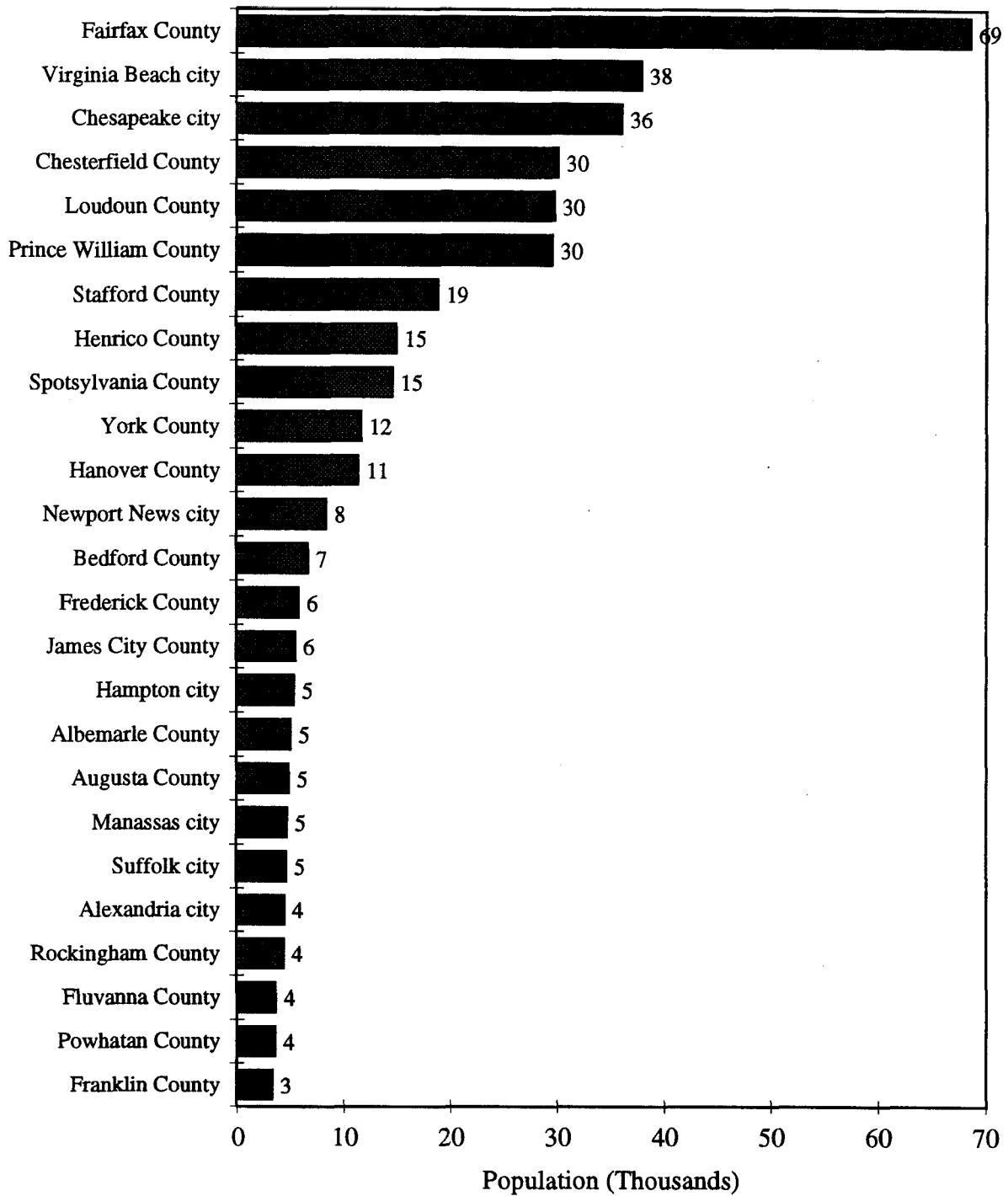

Largest Counties and Independent Cities in Virginia, 1995



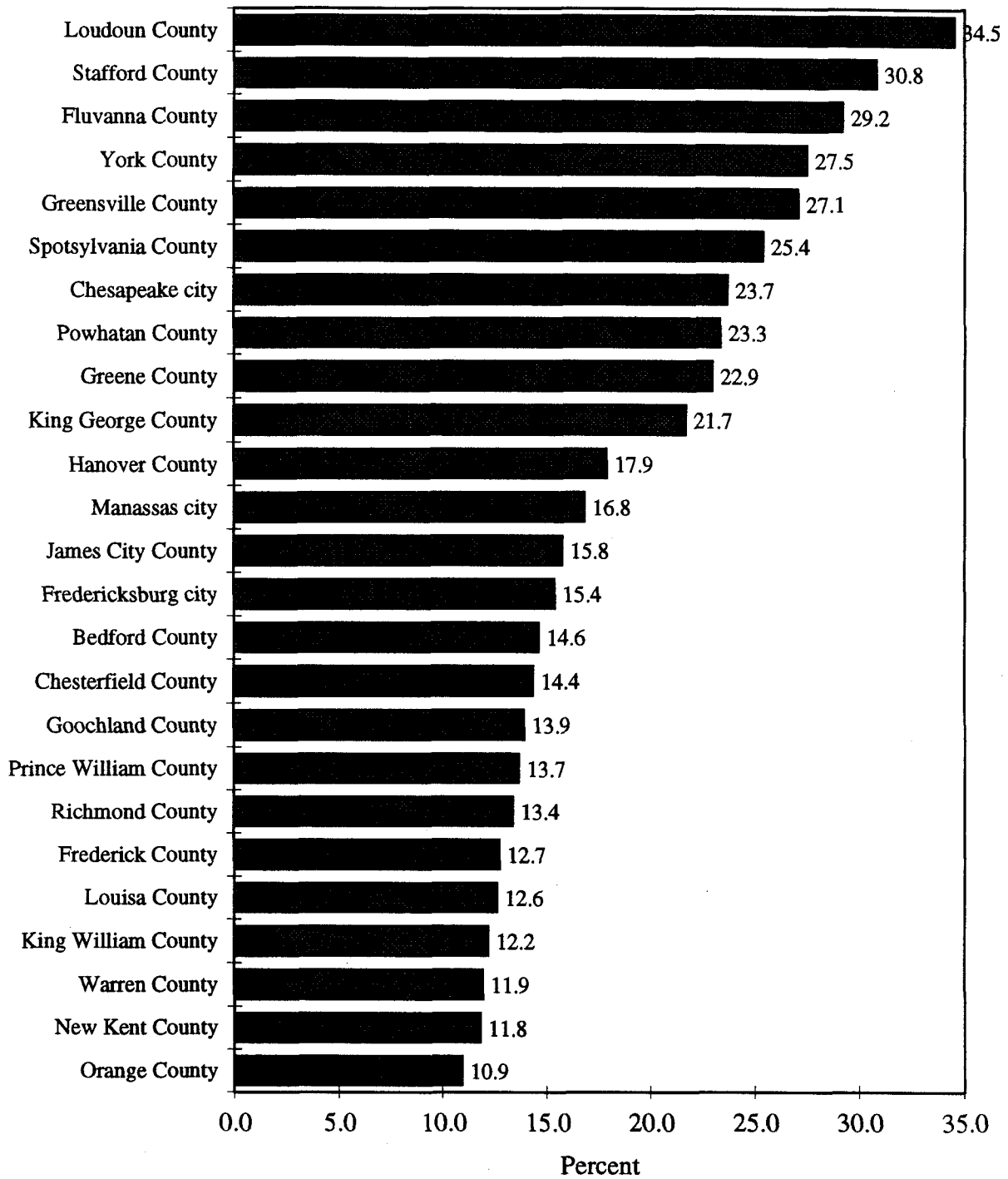

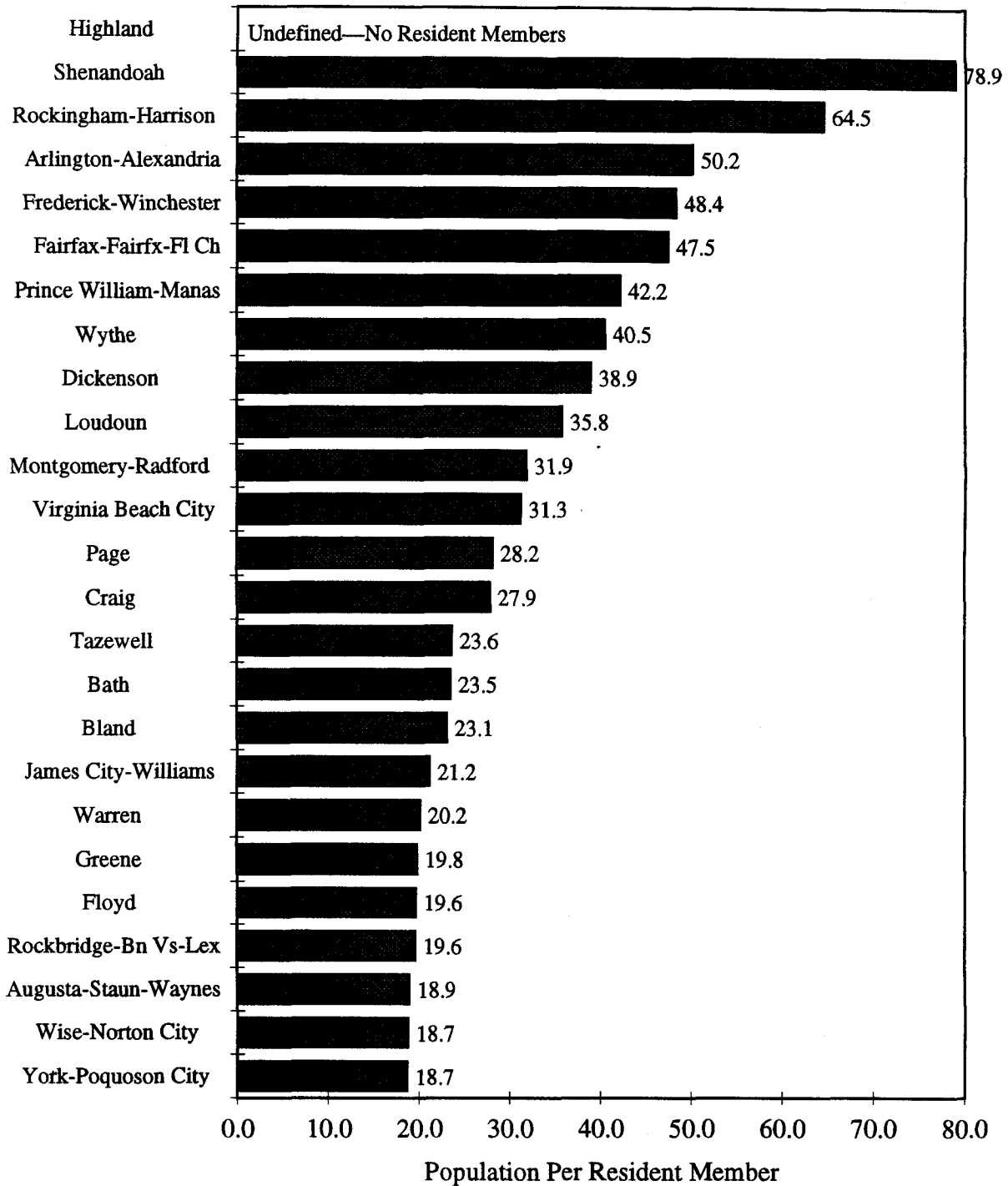

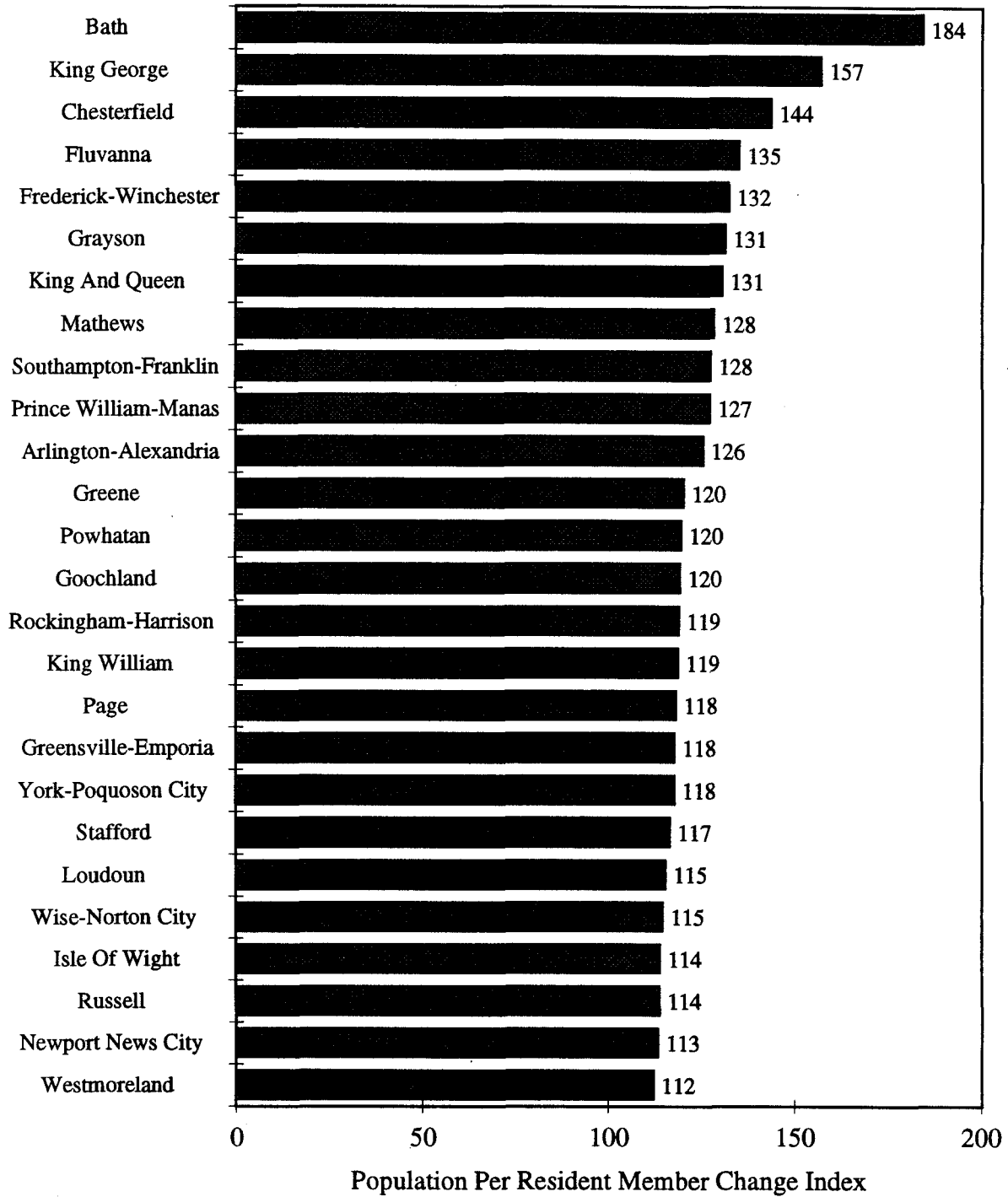

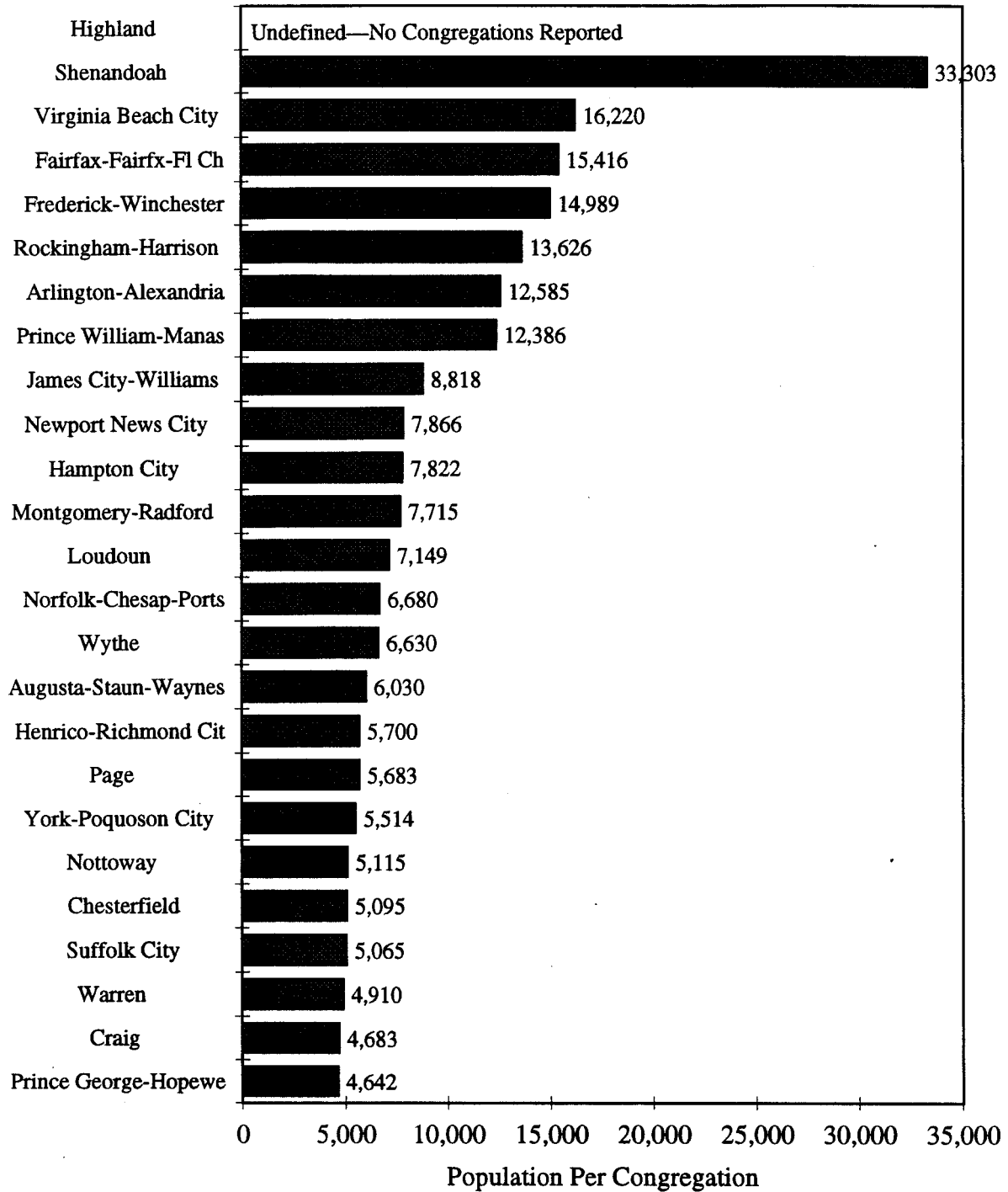

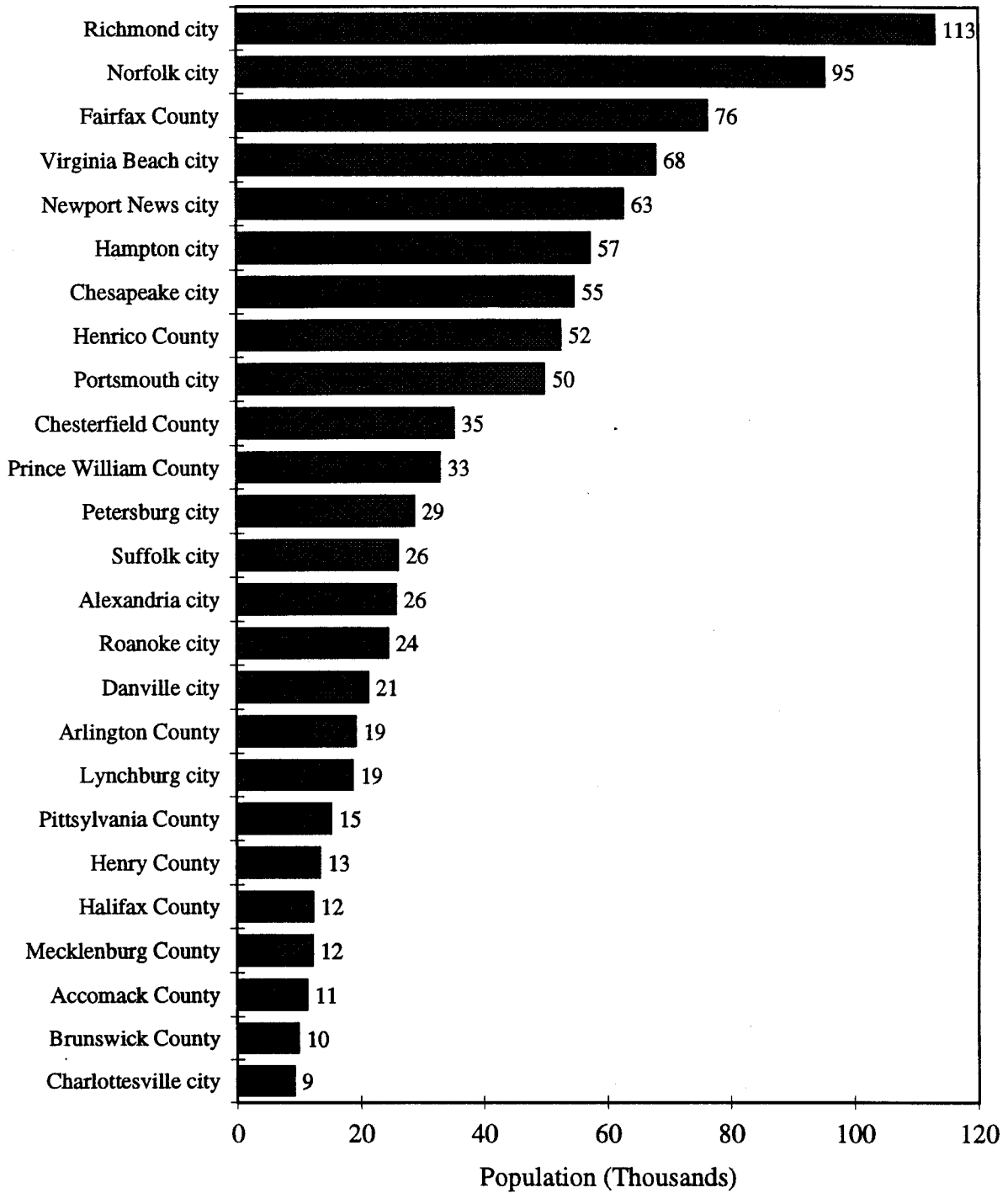

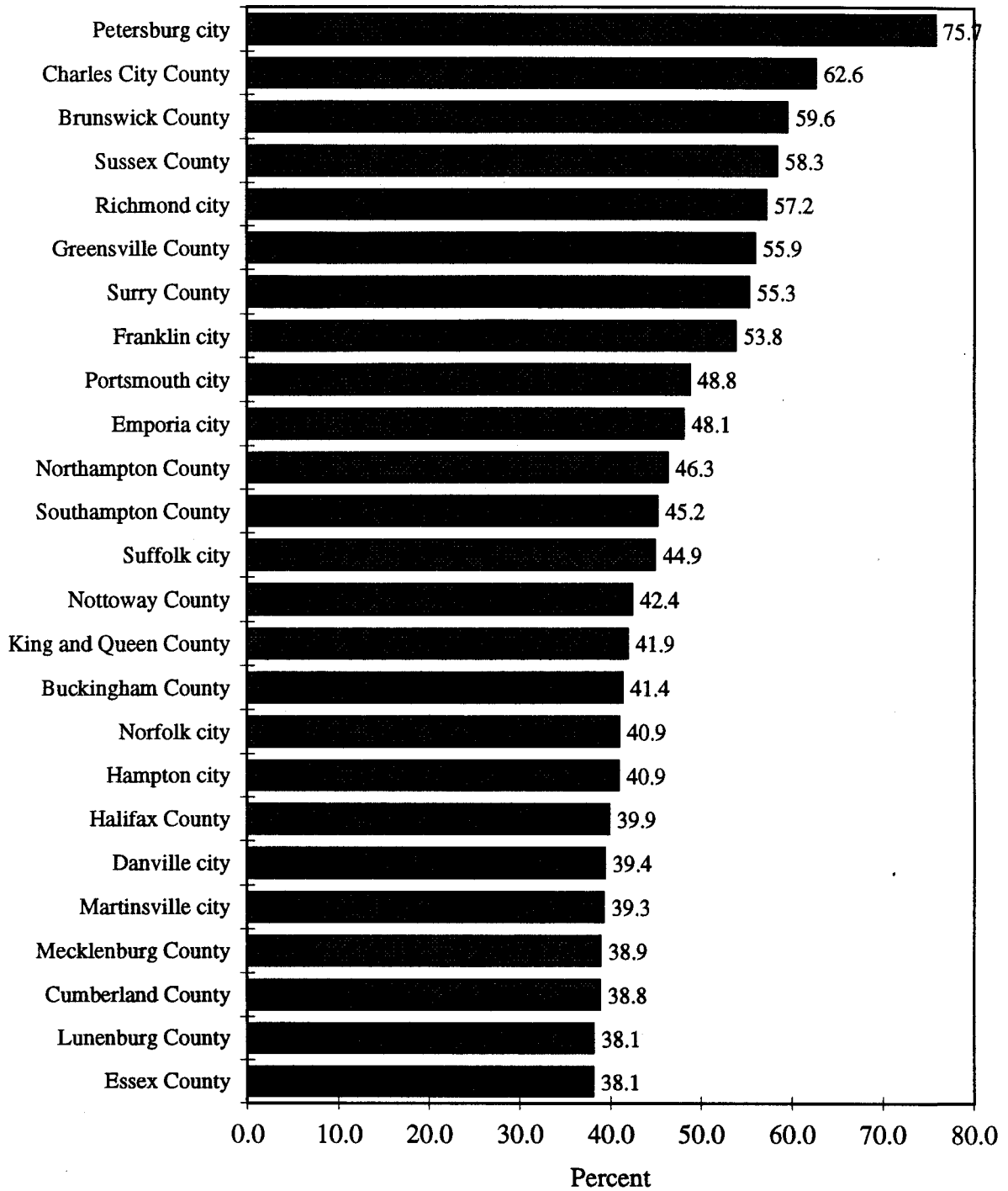

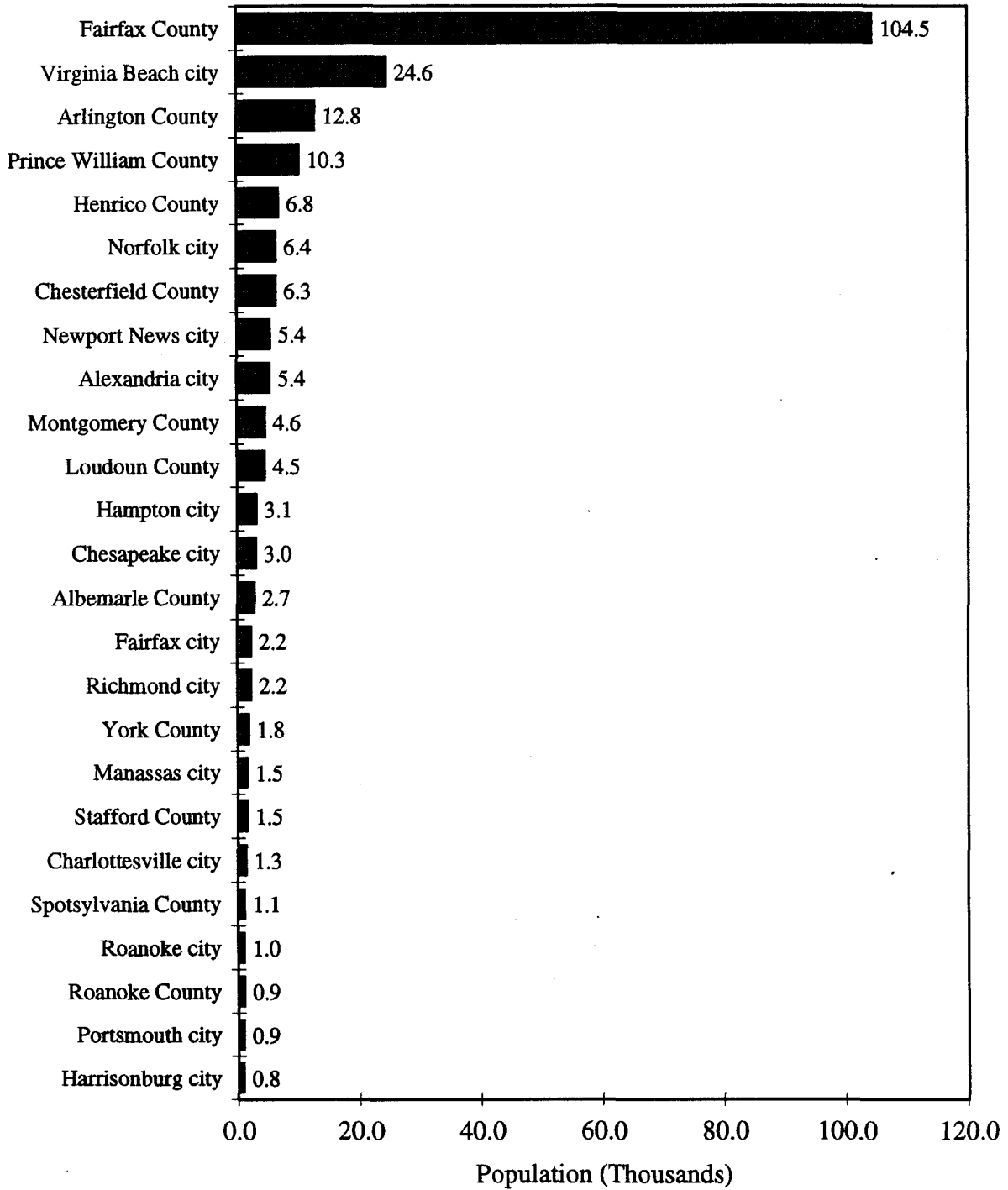

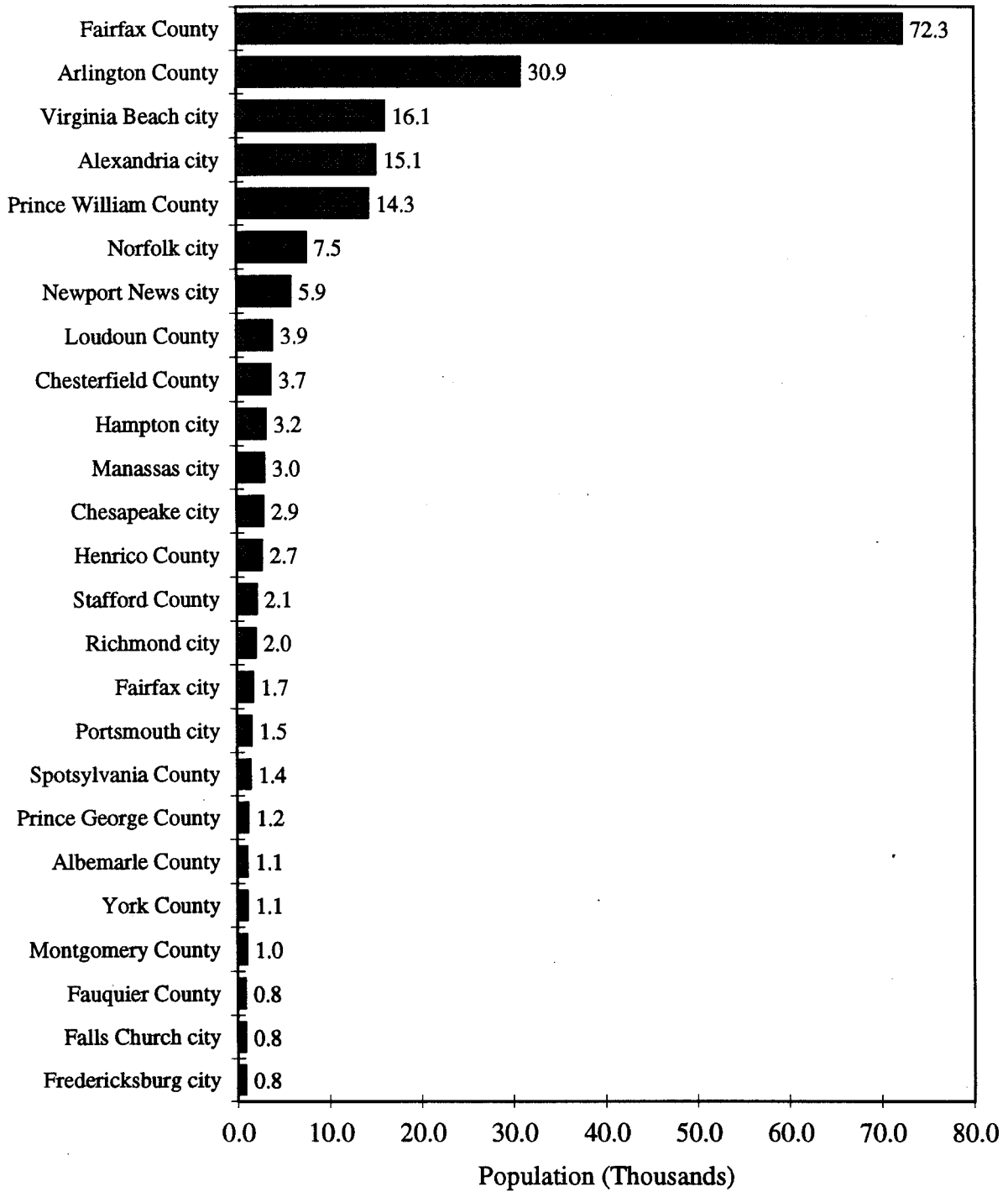

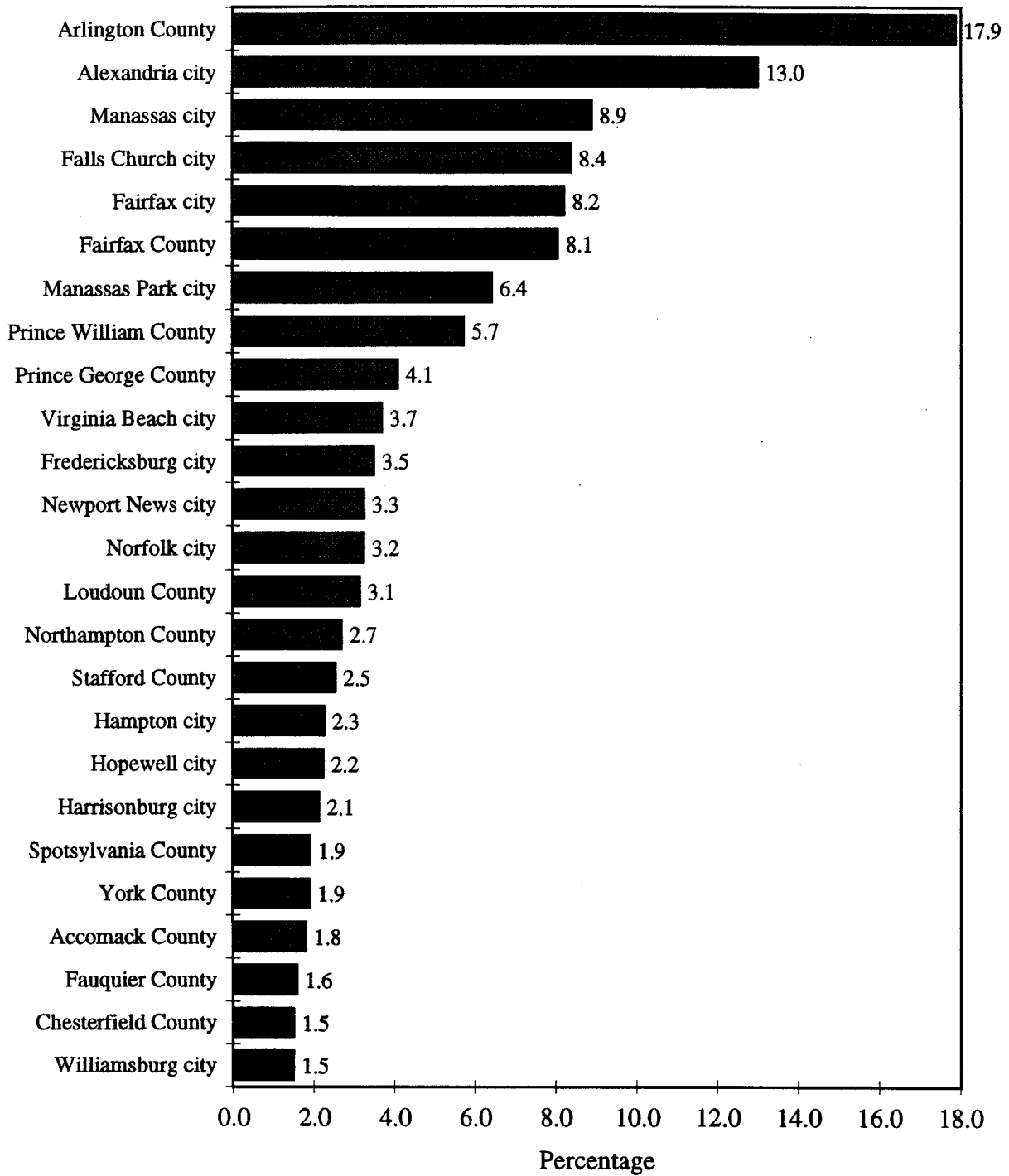

Age Category As A Percent of Total Population

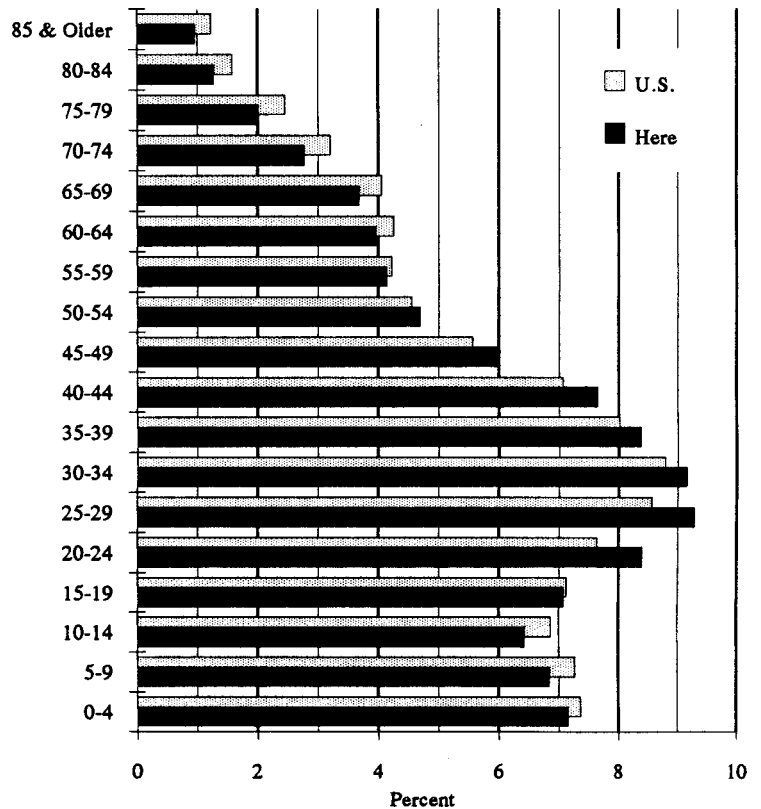

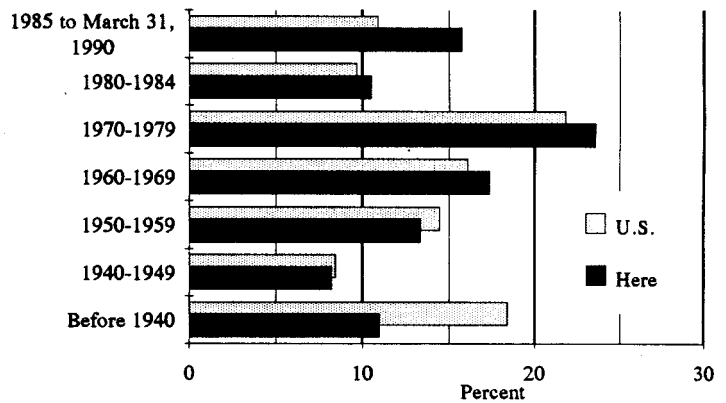
