Puget Sound Strategic Focus Area

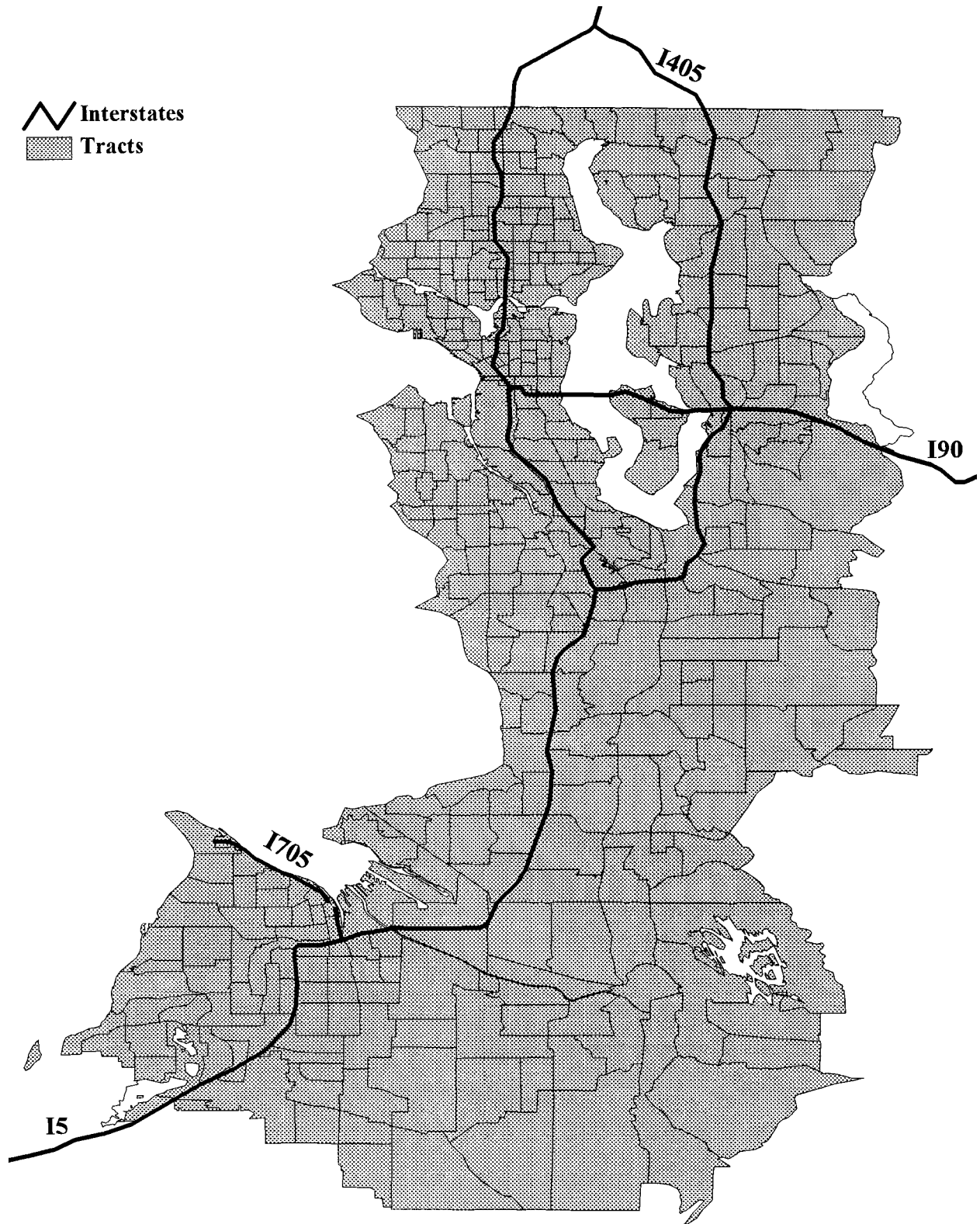

Puget Sound Strategic Focus Study Areas

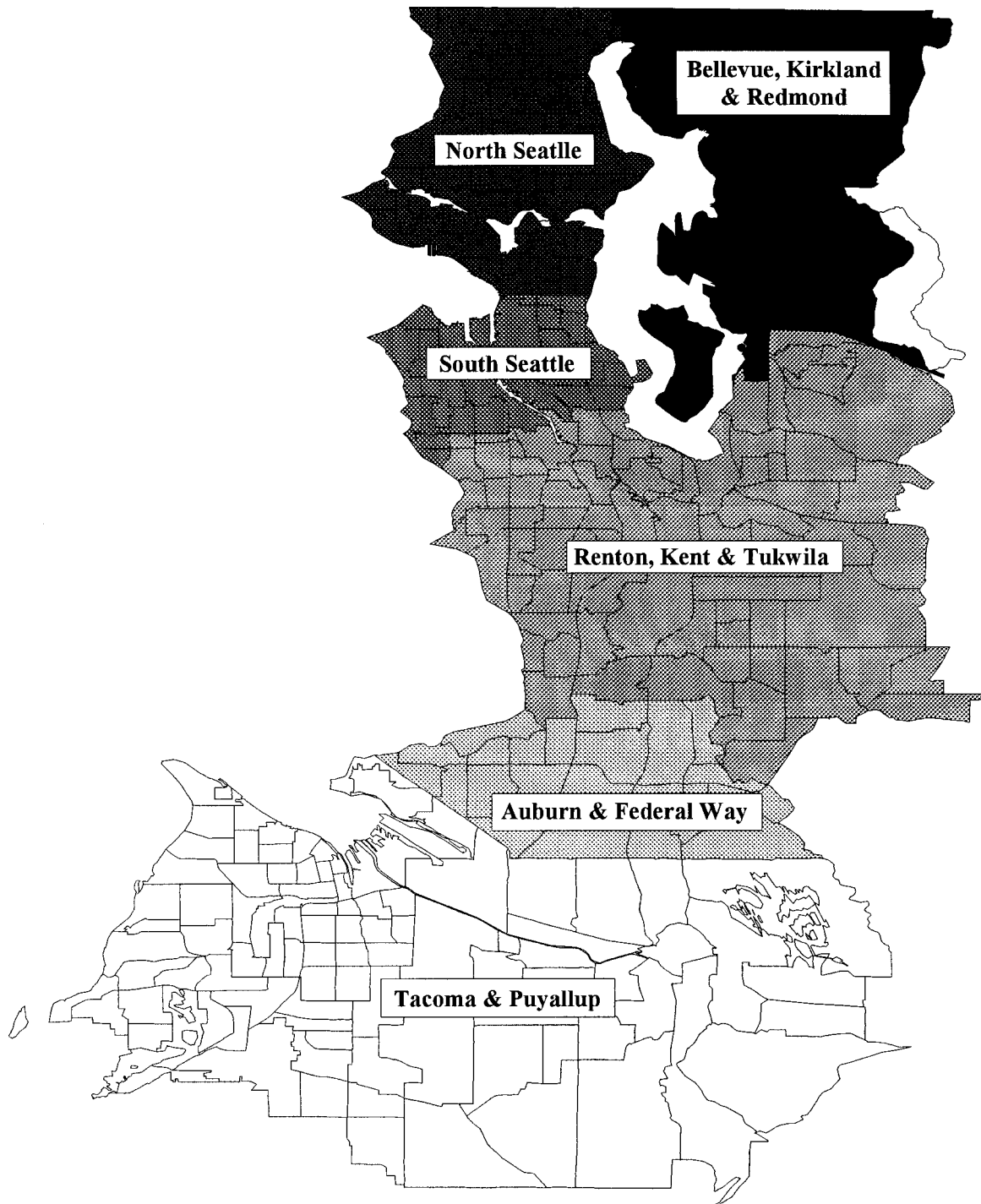

Congregations in the Puget Sound Strategic Focus Area

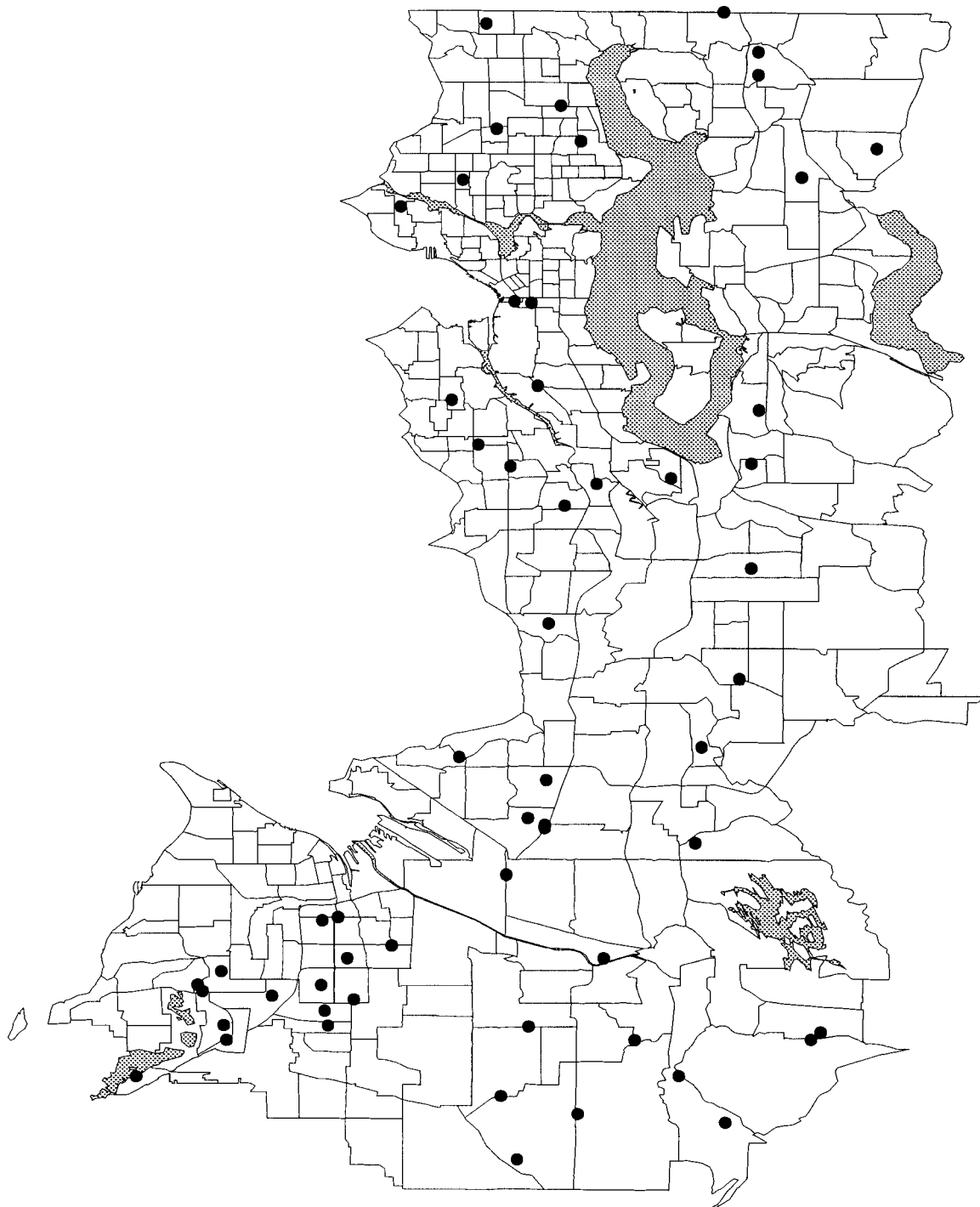

and 1999 to 2004

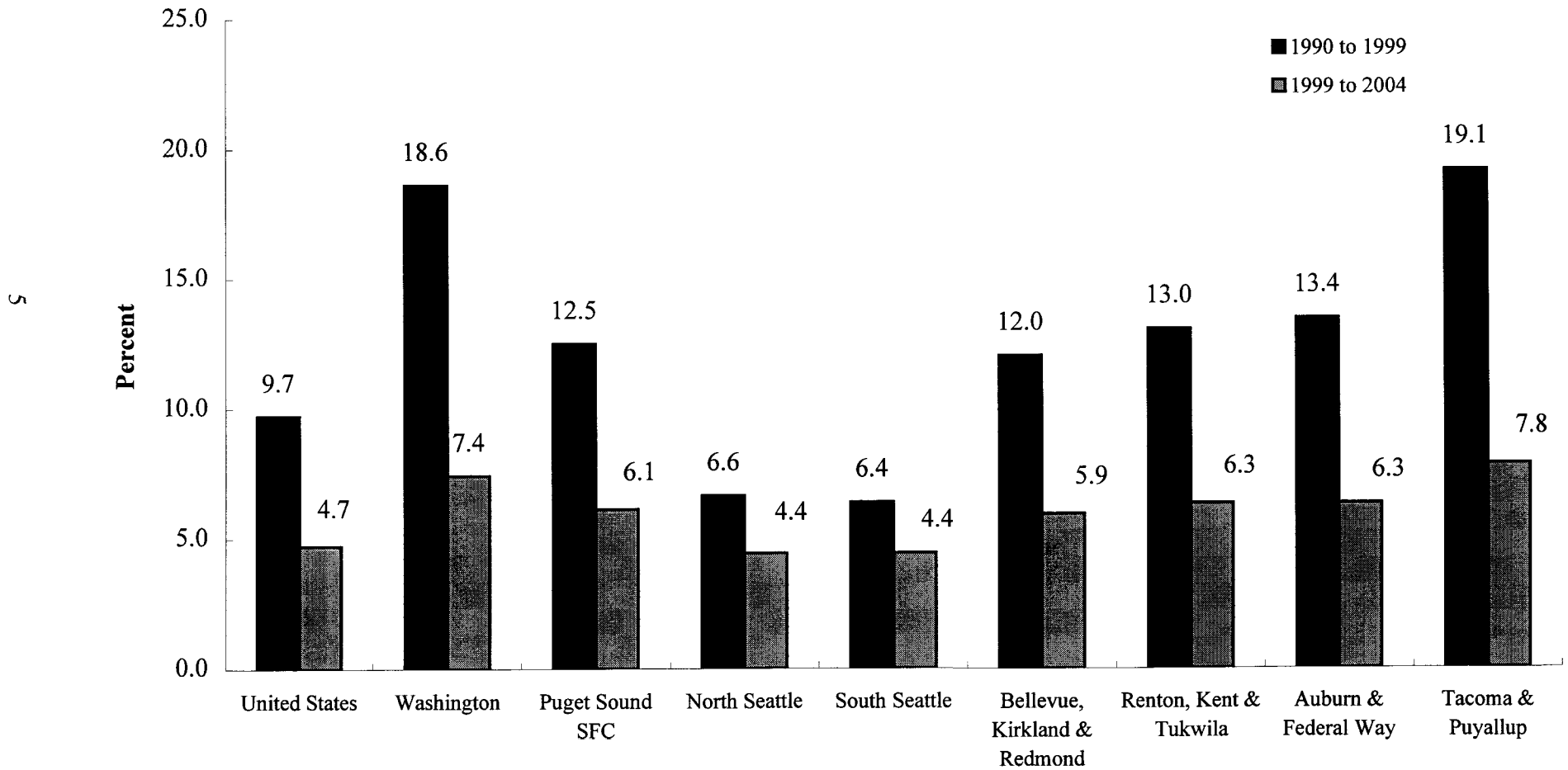

Estimated Total Population, 1999

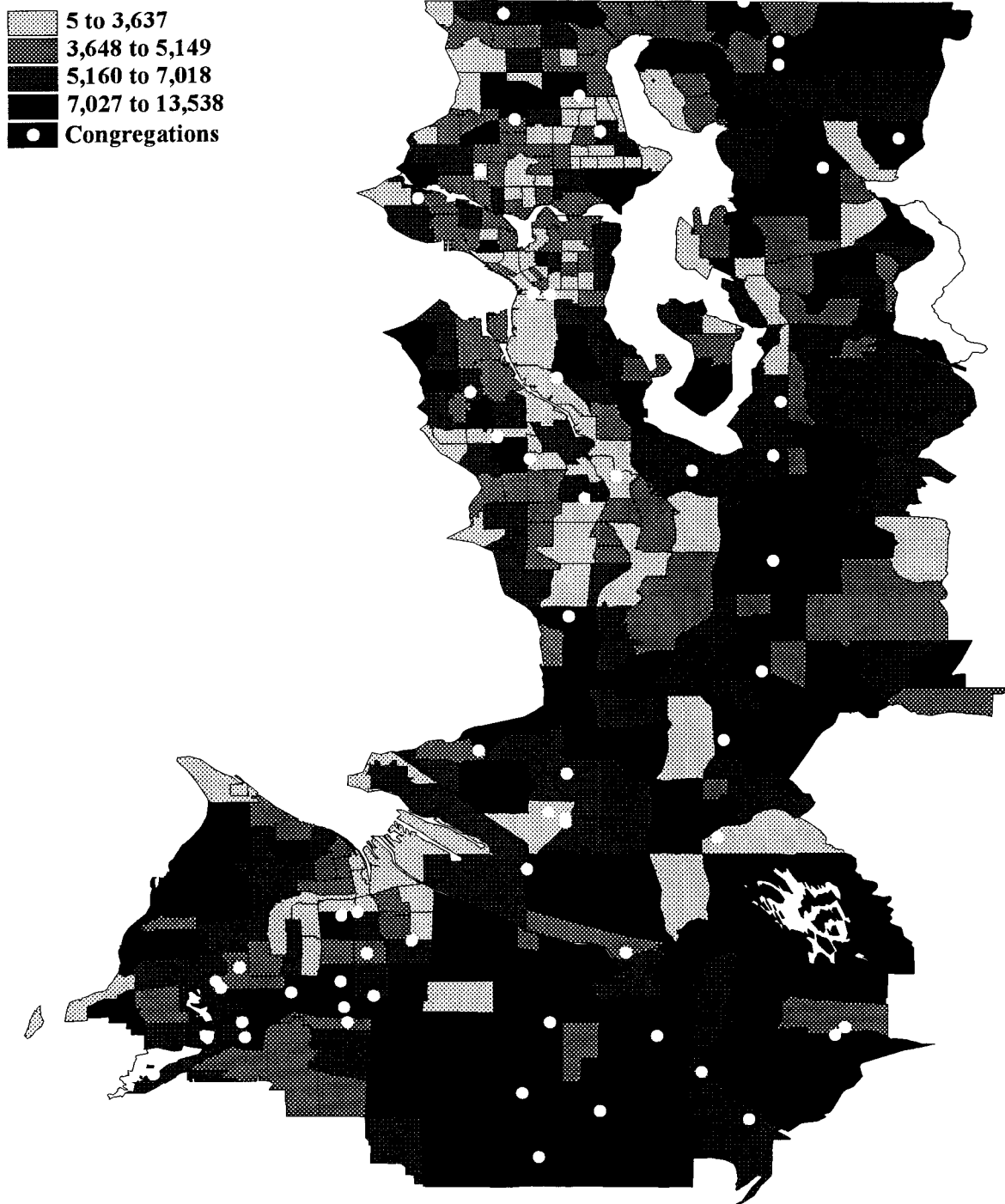

Estimated Anglo Population, 1999

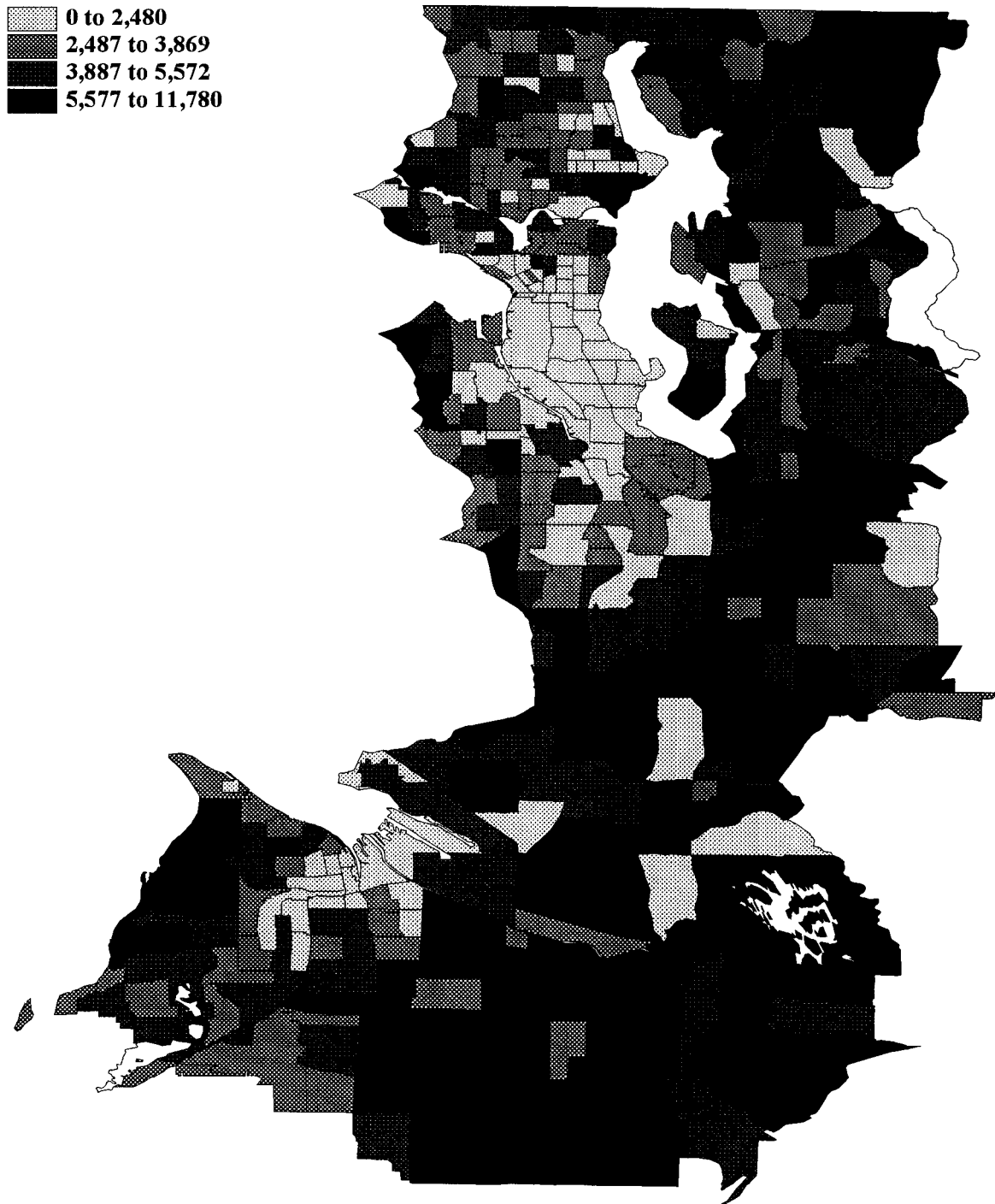

Projected Net Change in Anglo Population, 1999 to 2004

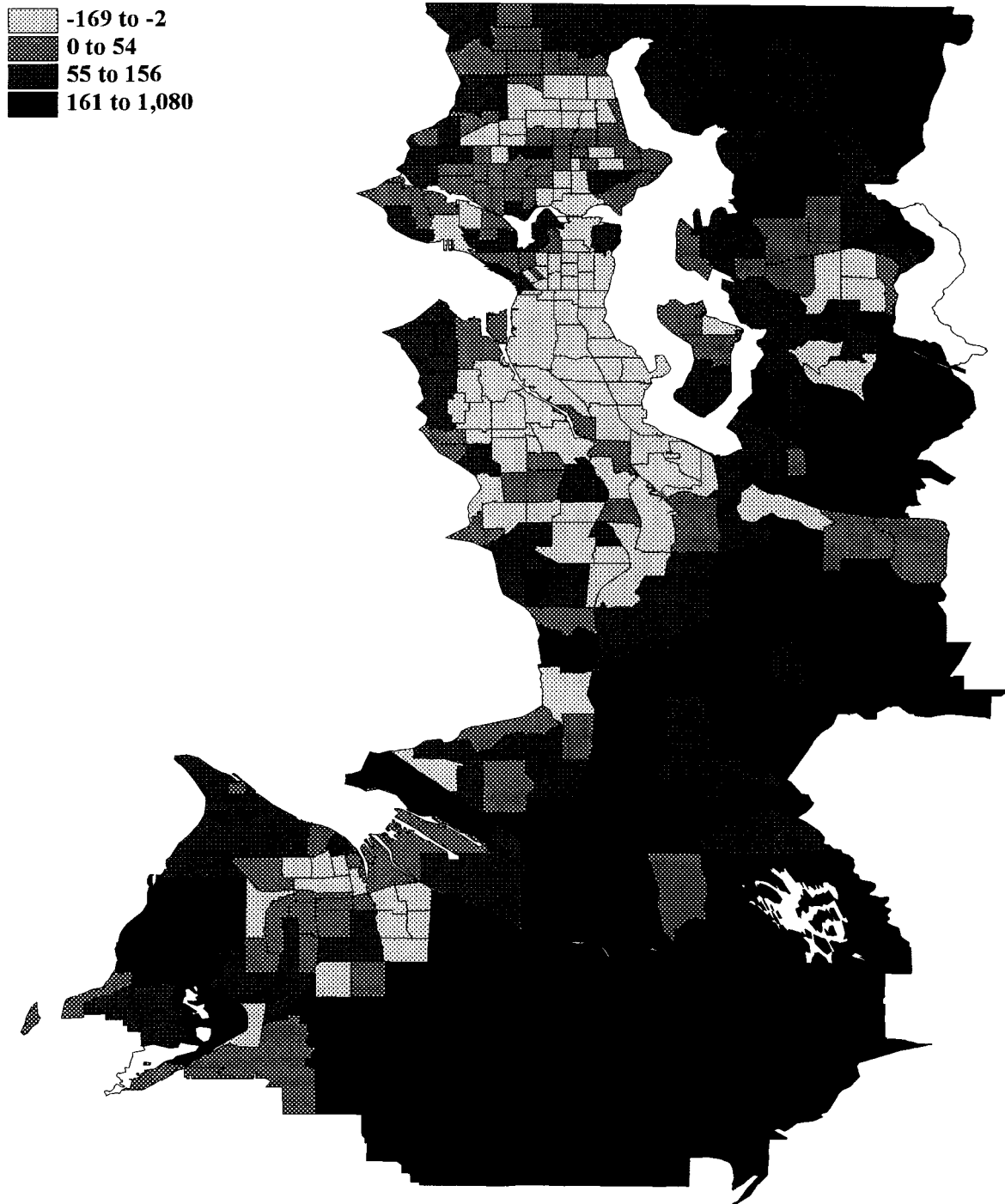

Projected Percent Change in Anglo Population, 1999 to 2004

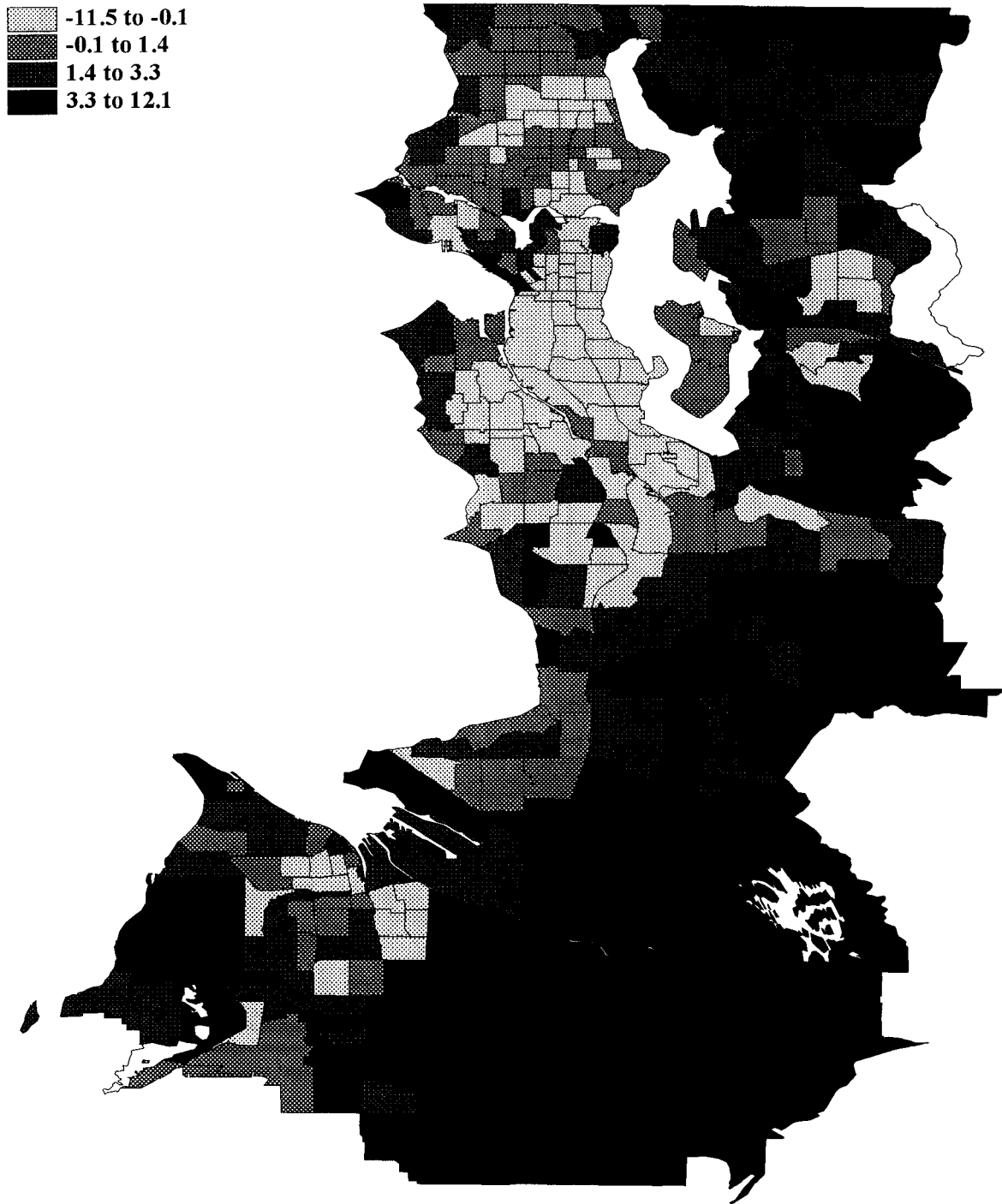

Estimated Anglo Population as a Percent of Total, 1999

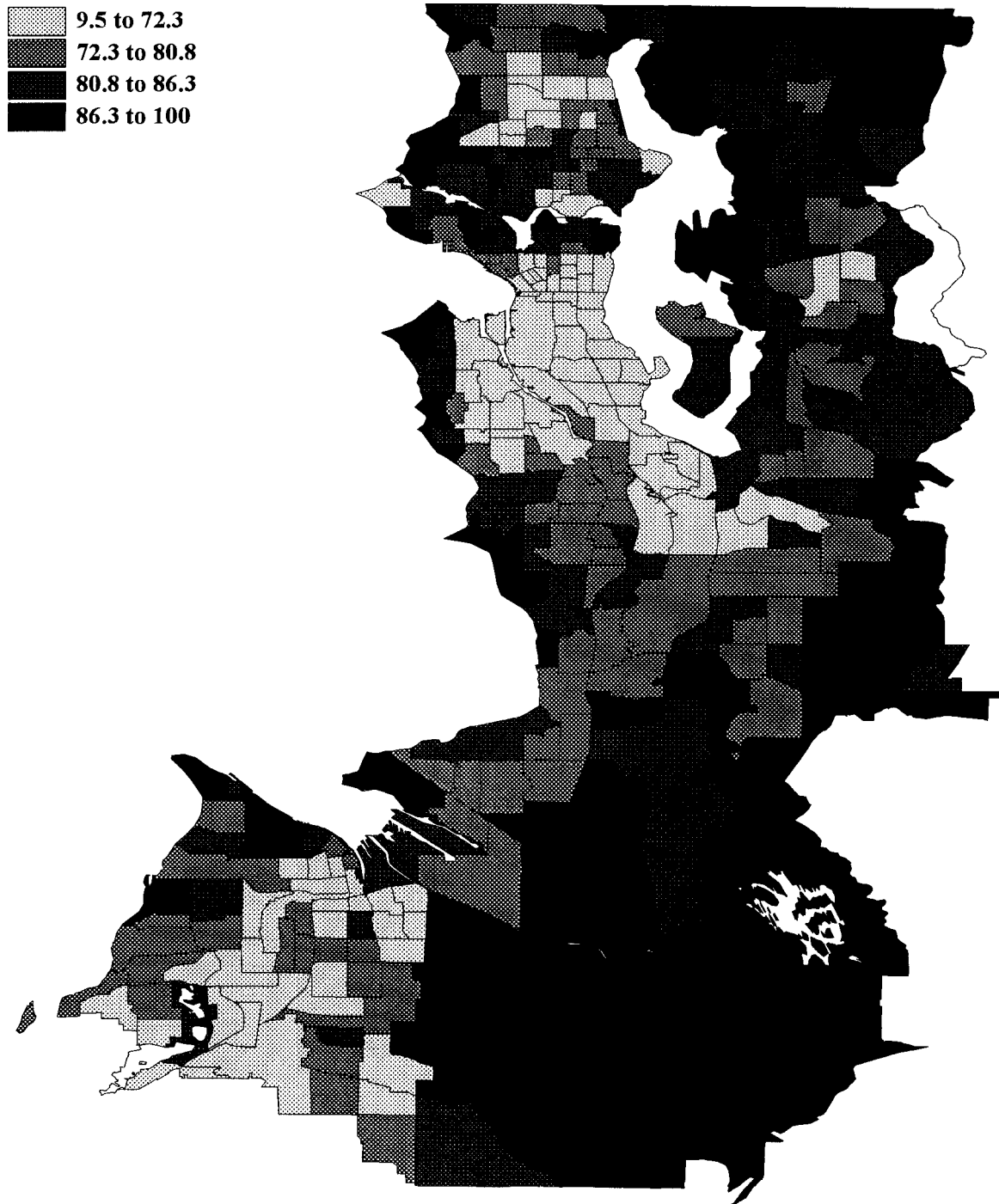

Estimated African-American Population, 1999

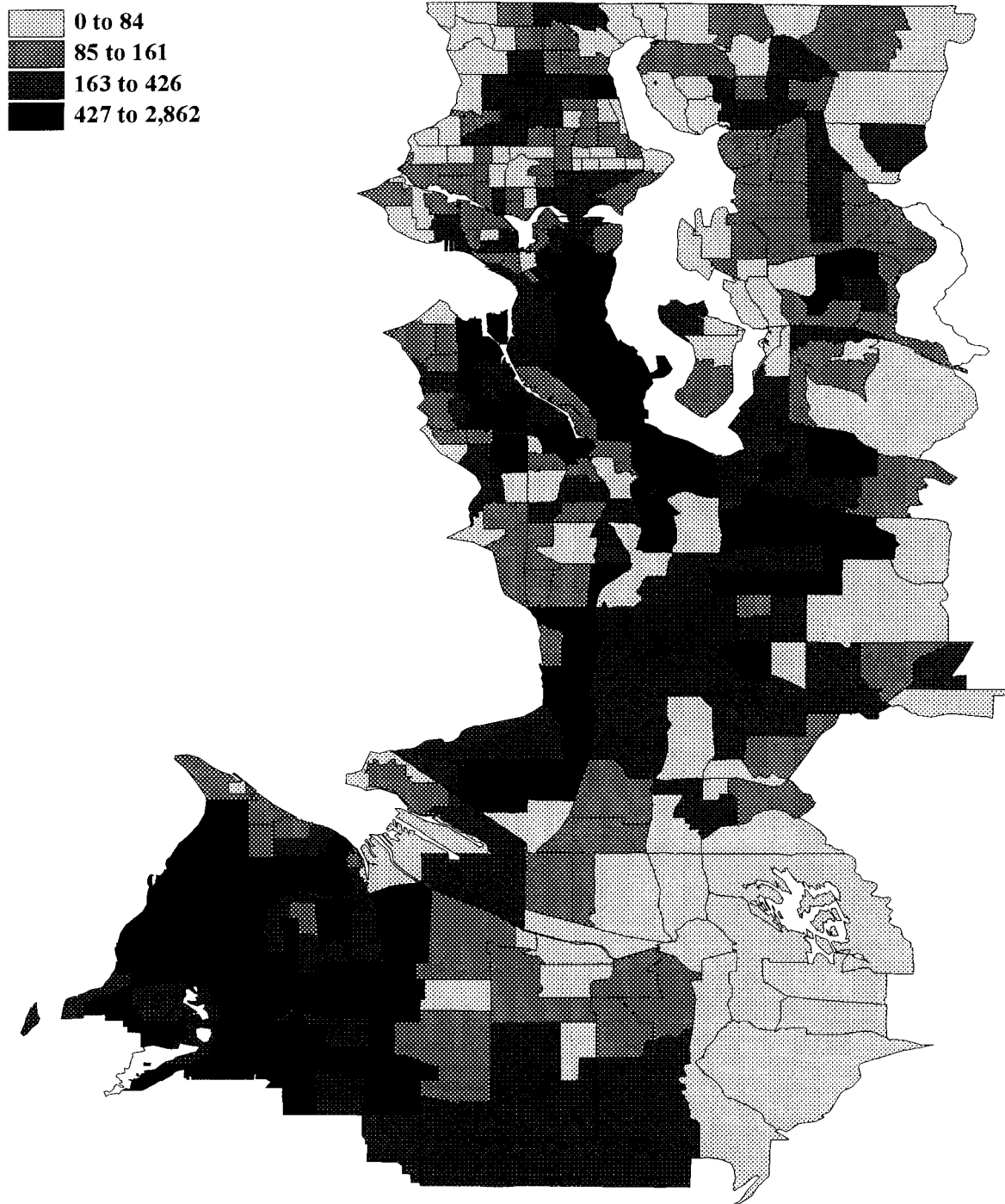

Projected Net Change in African-American Population, 1999 to 2004

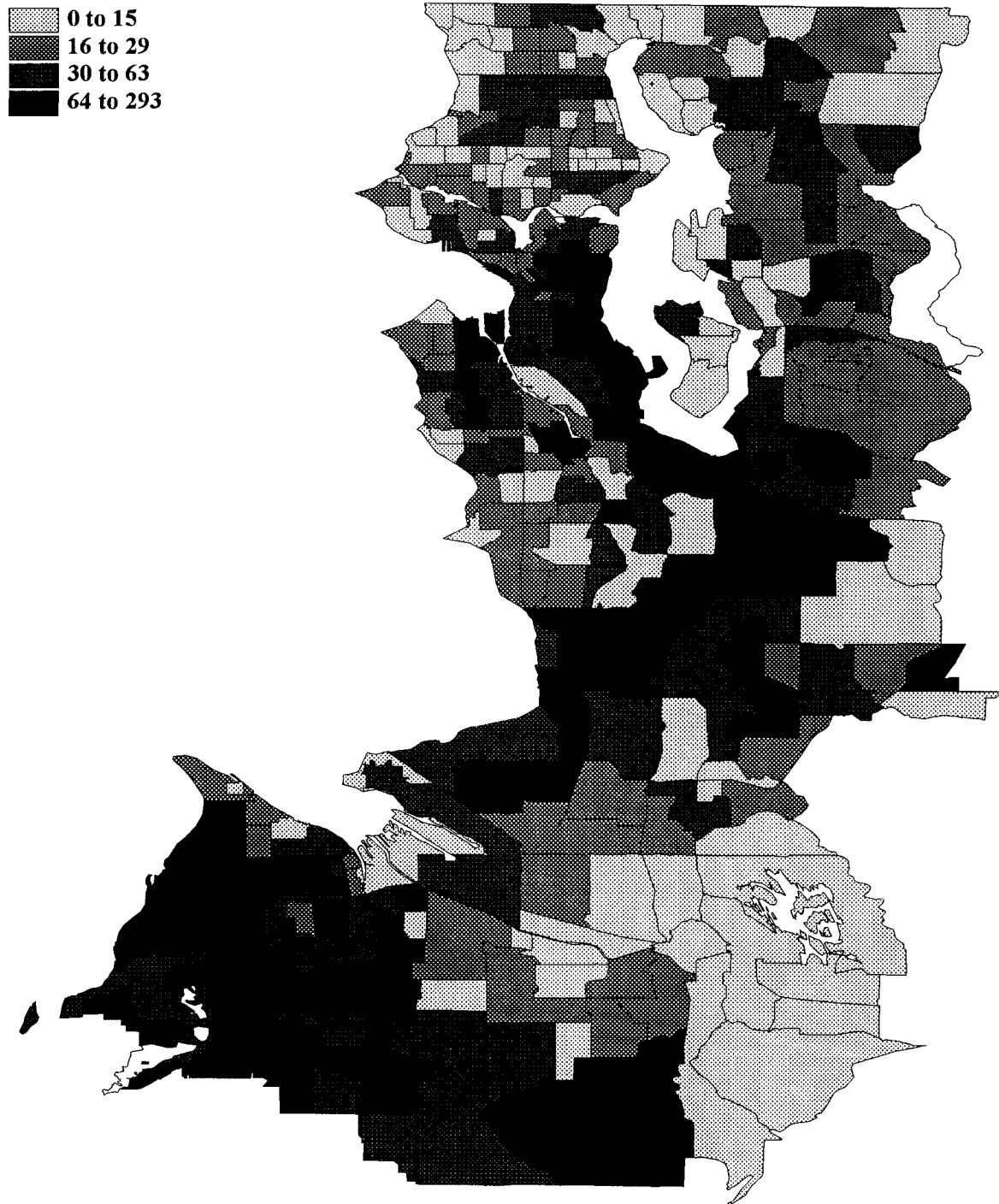

1999 to 2004

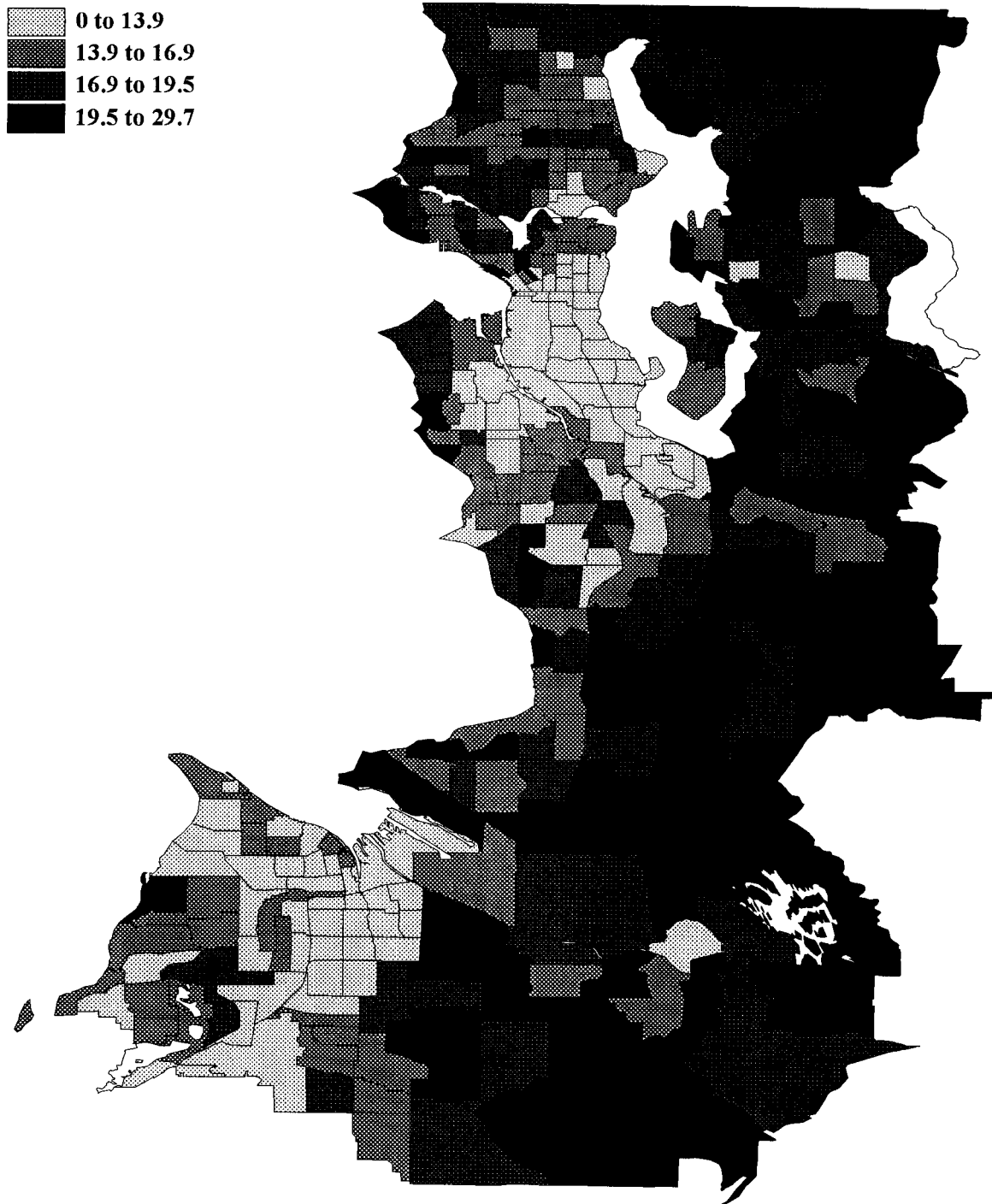

Estimated African-American Population as a Percent of Total, 1999

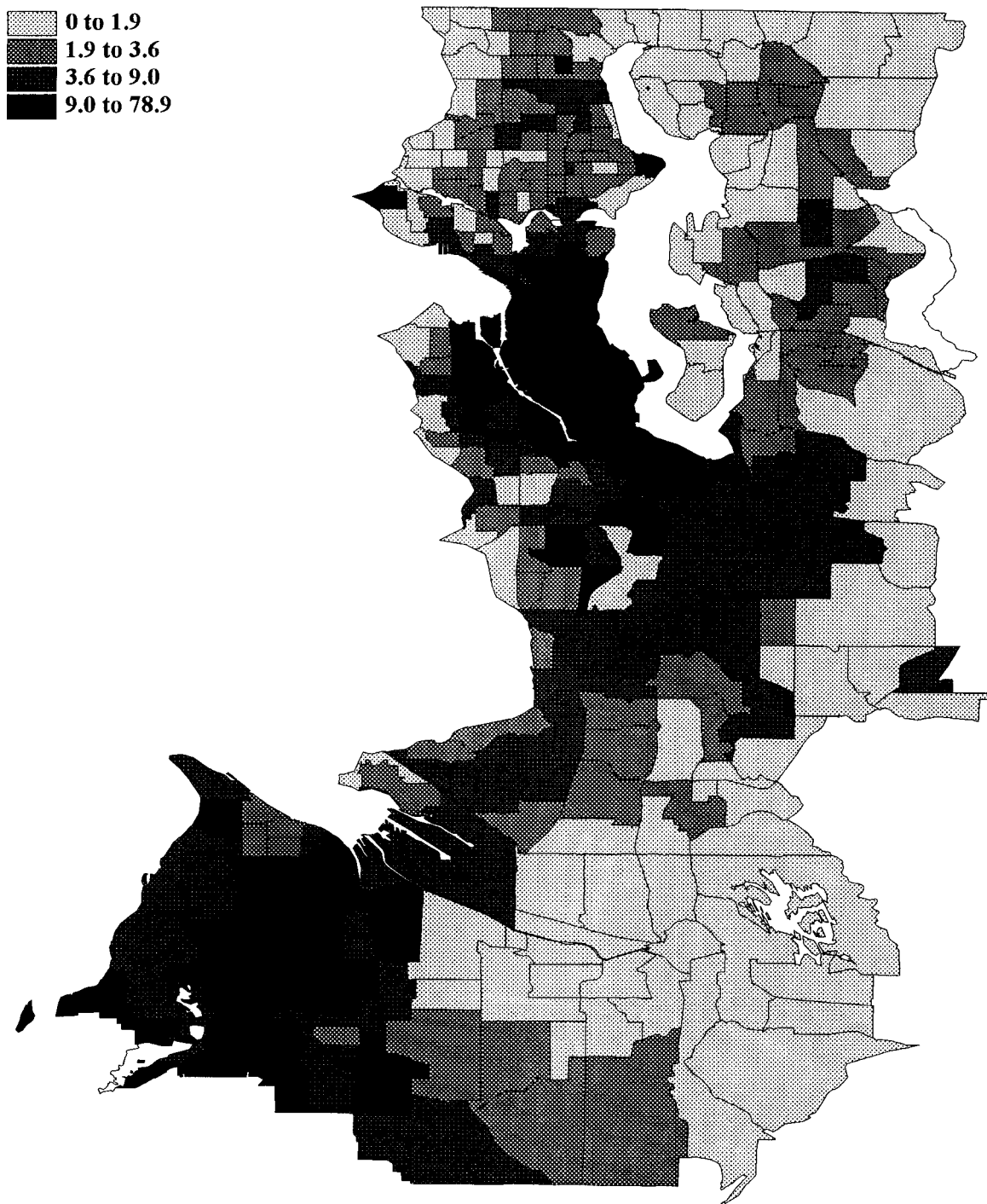

Estimated Asian and Pacific Islander Population, 1999

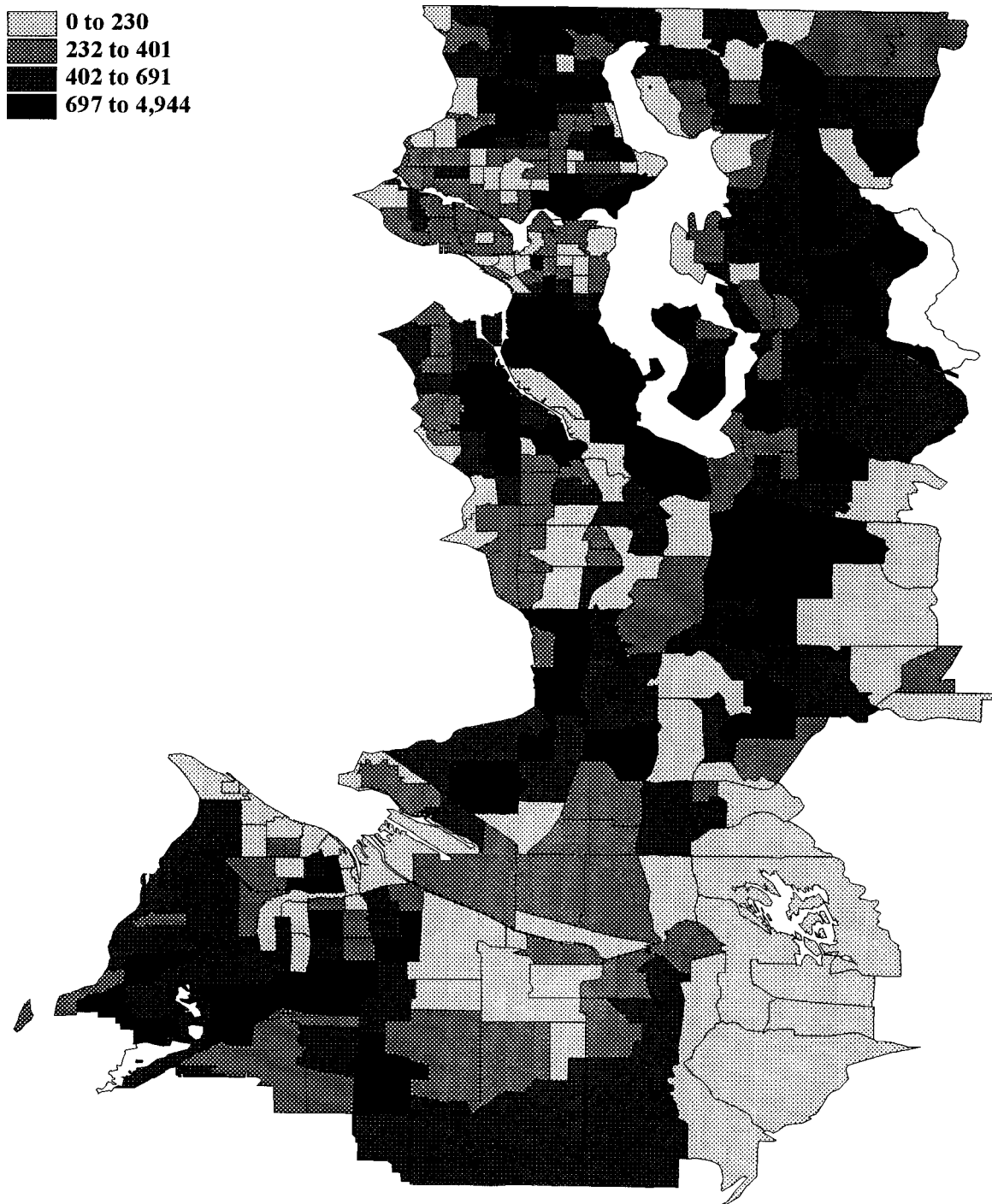

1999 to 2004

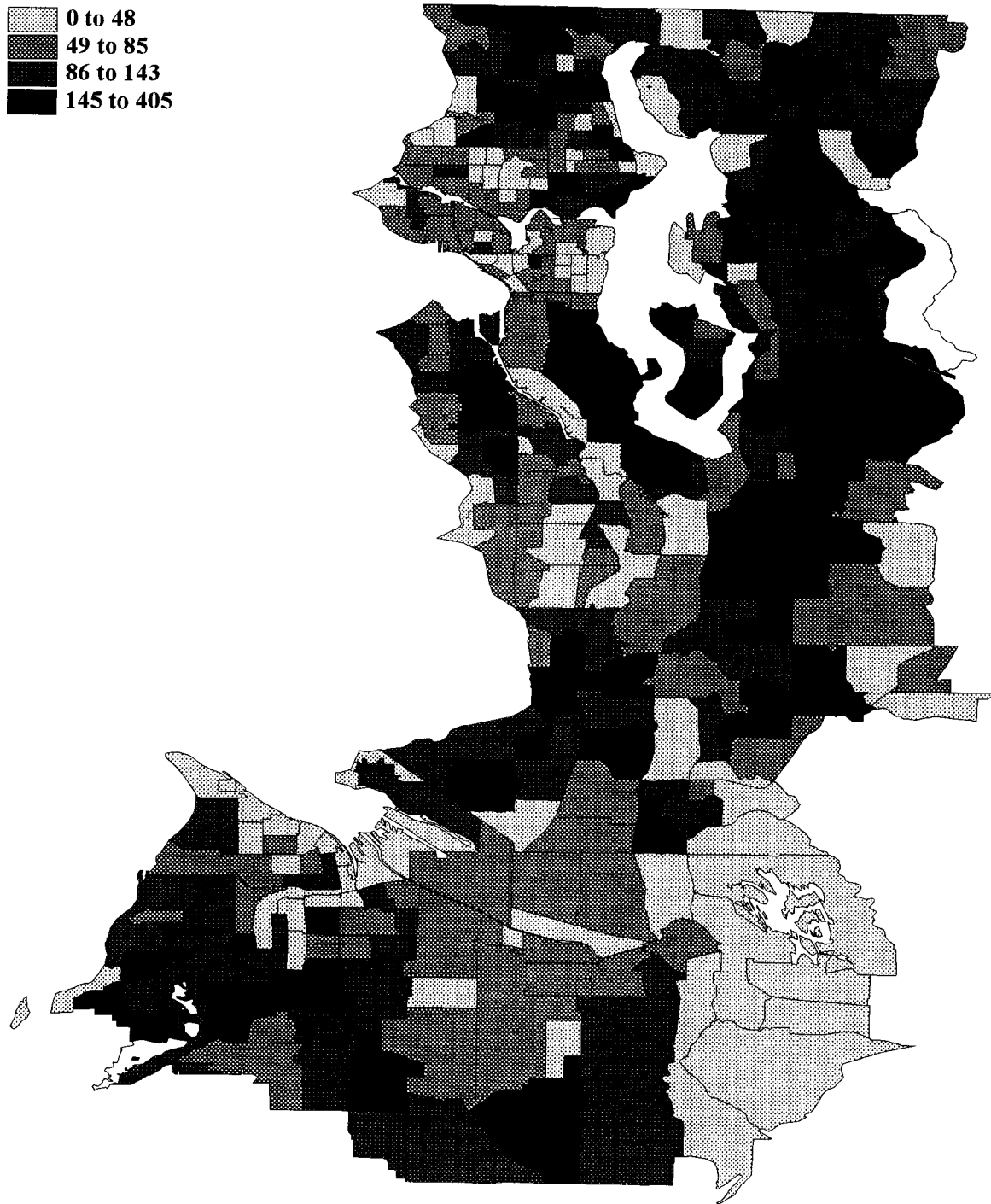

1999 to 2004

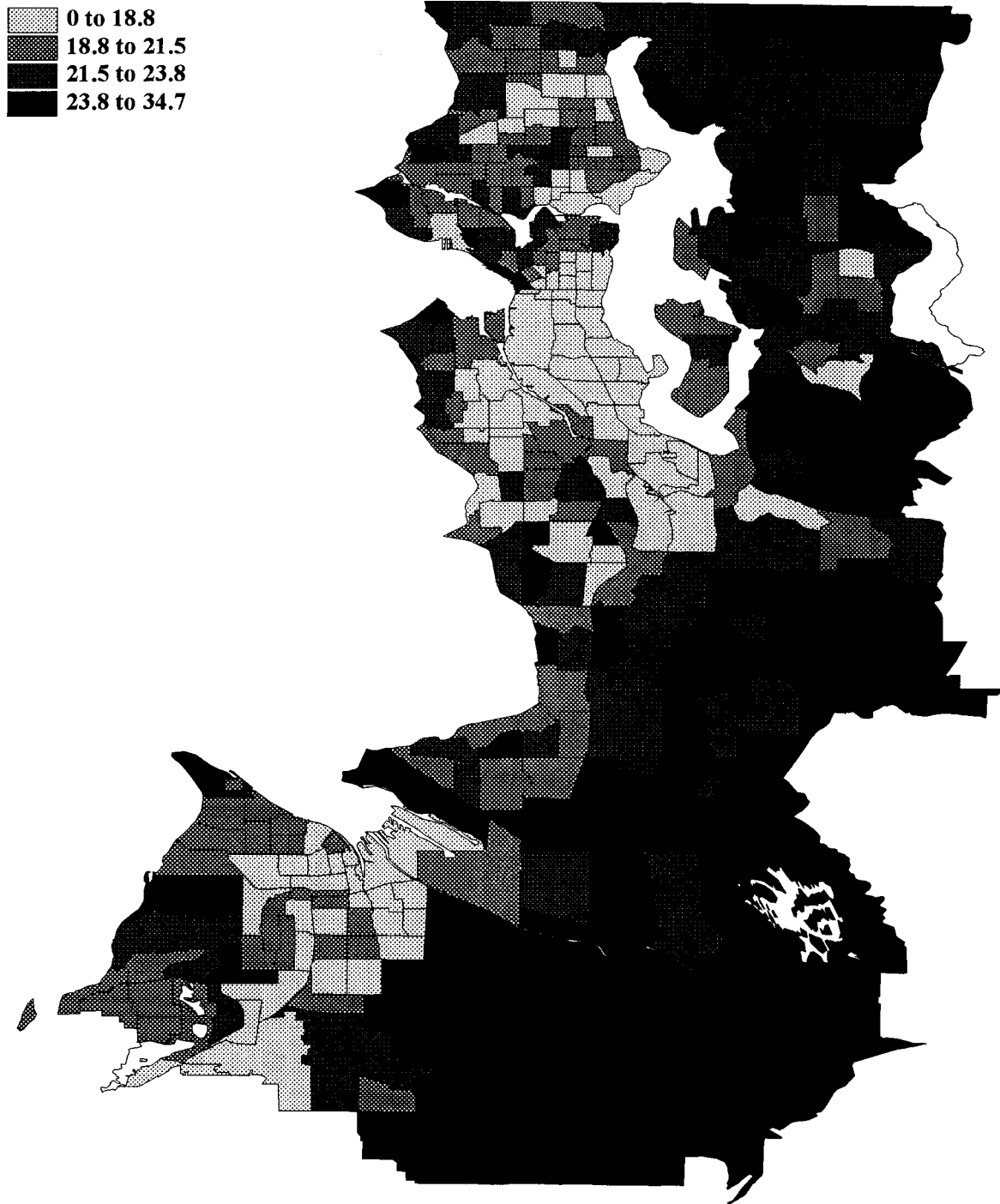

1999

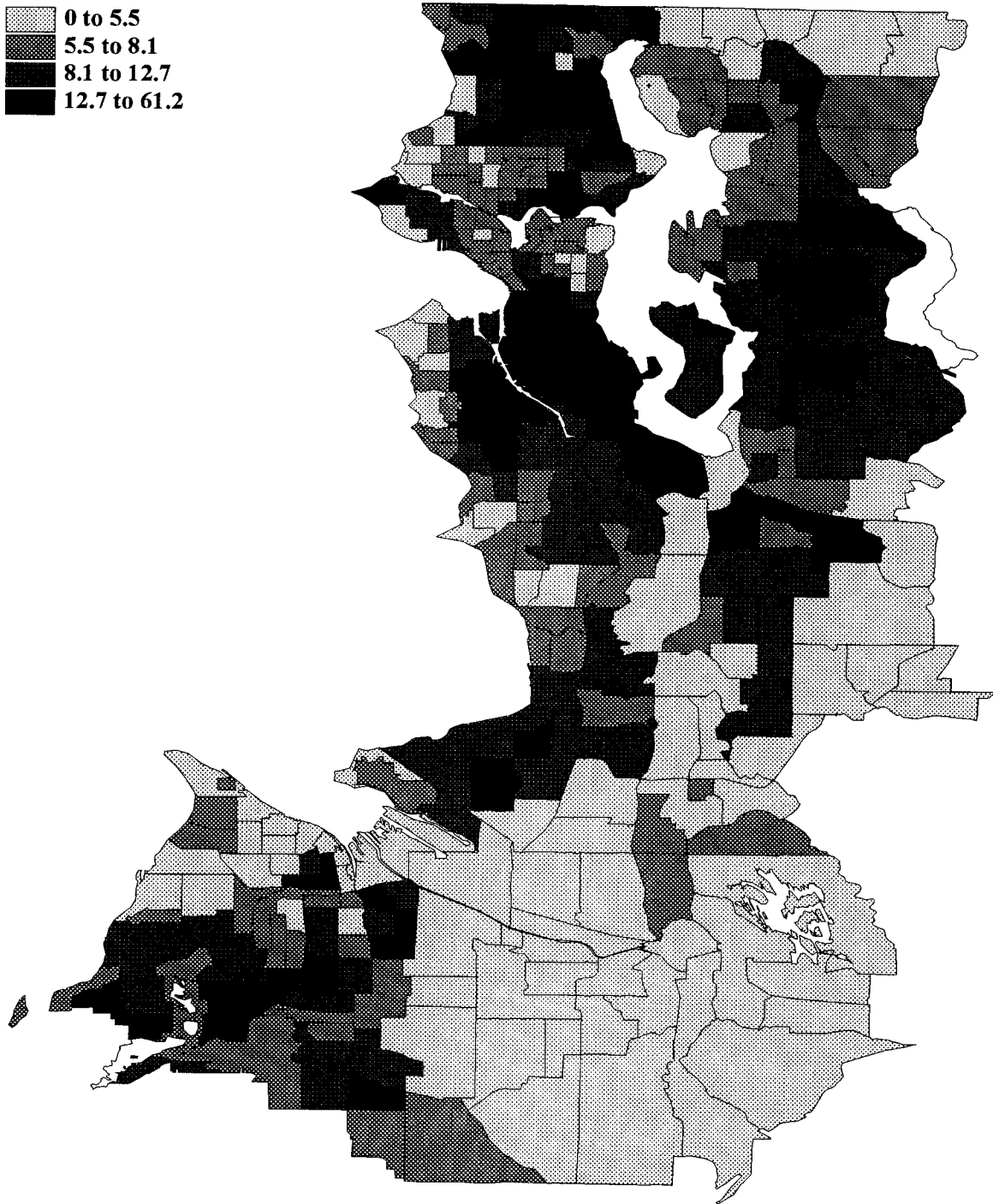

Estimated Hispanic Origin Population, 1999

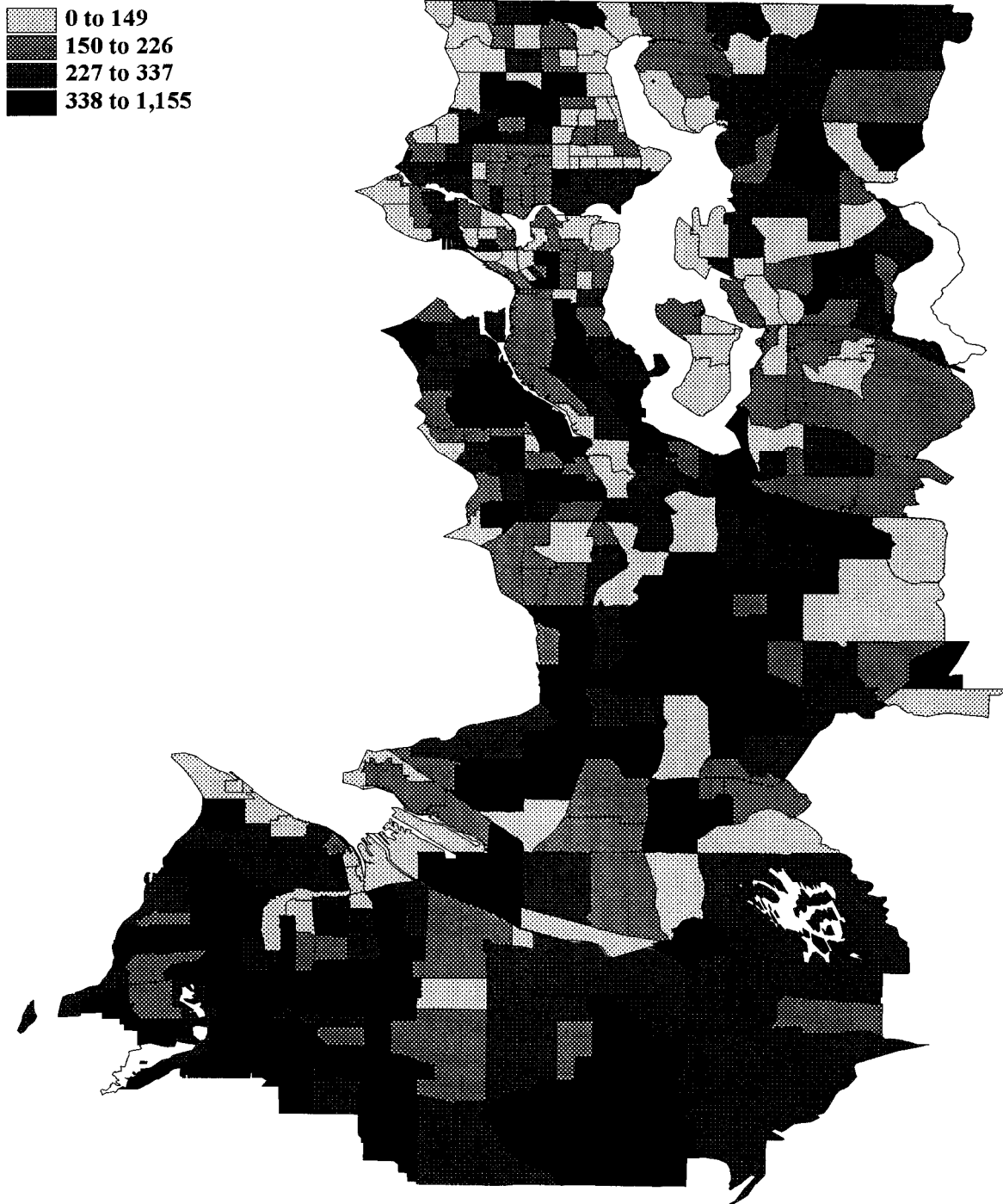

Estimated Hispanic Origin Population as a Percent of Total, 1999

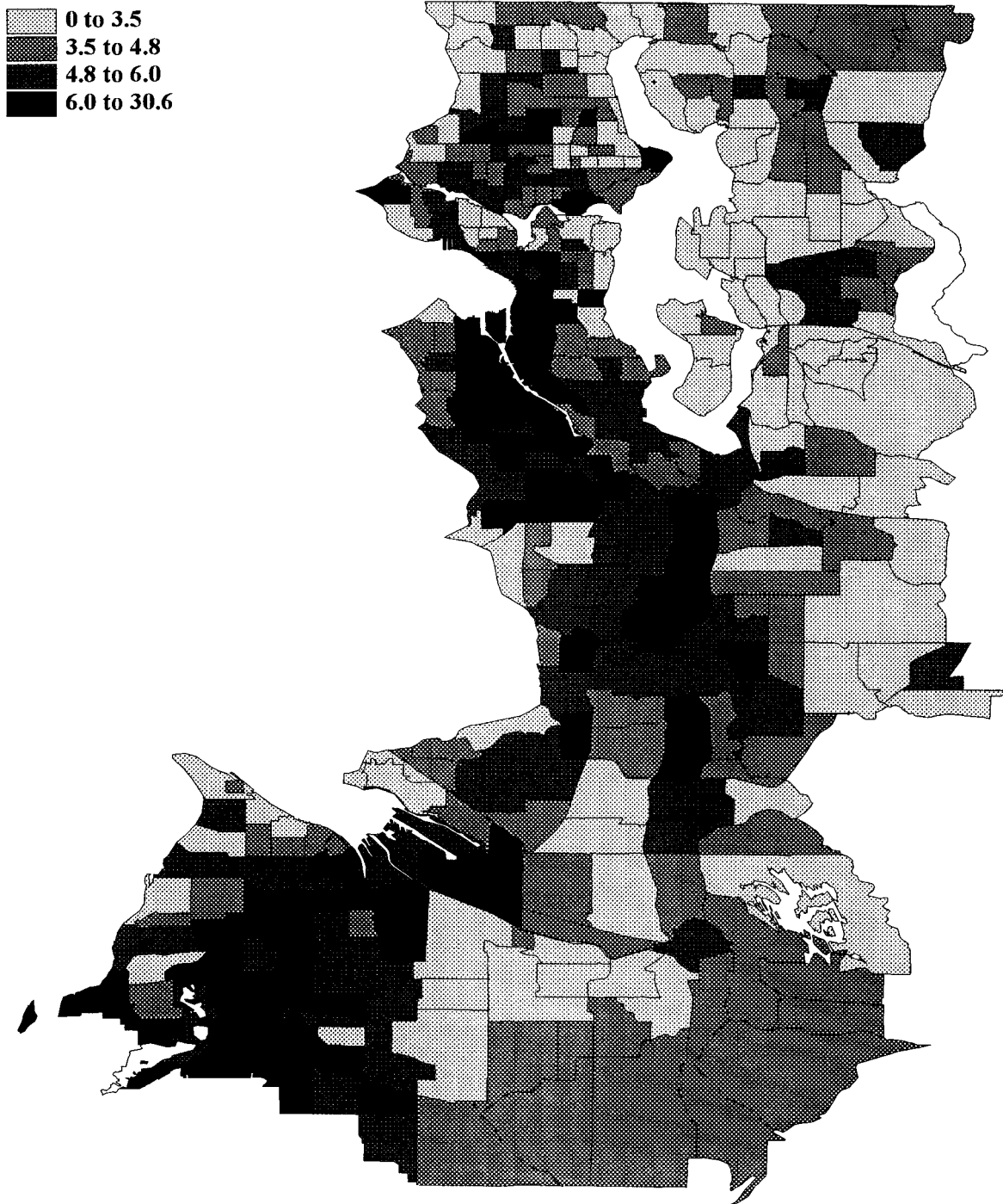

Estimated American Indian Population, 1999

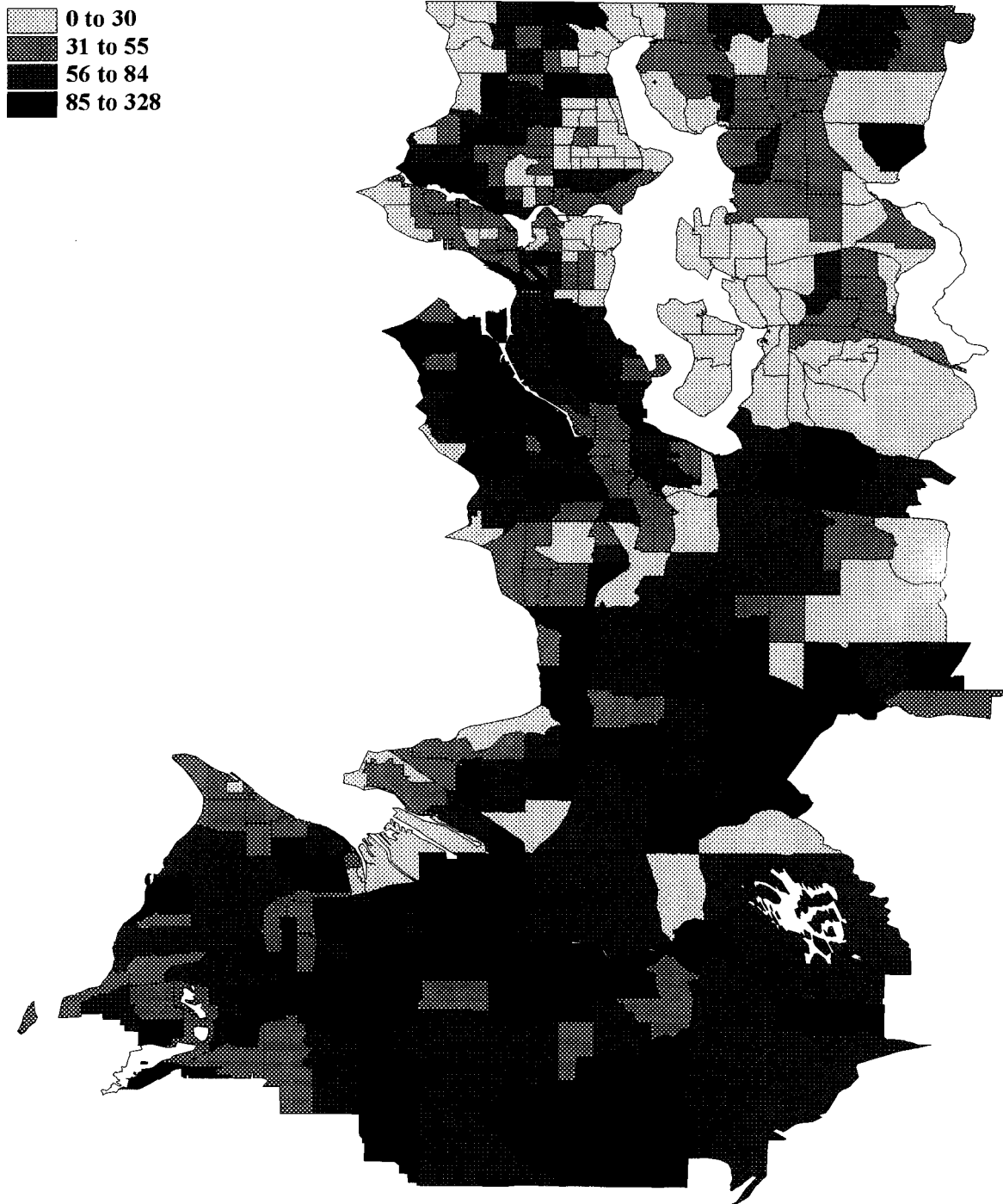

1999 to 2004

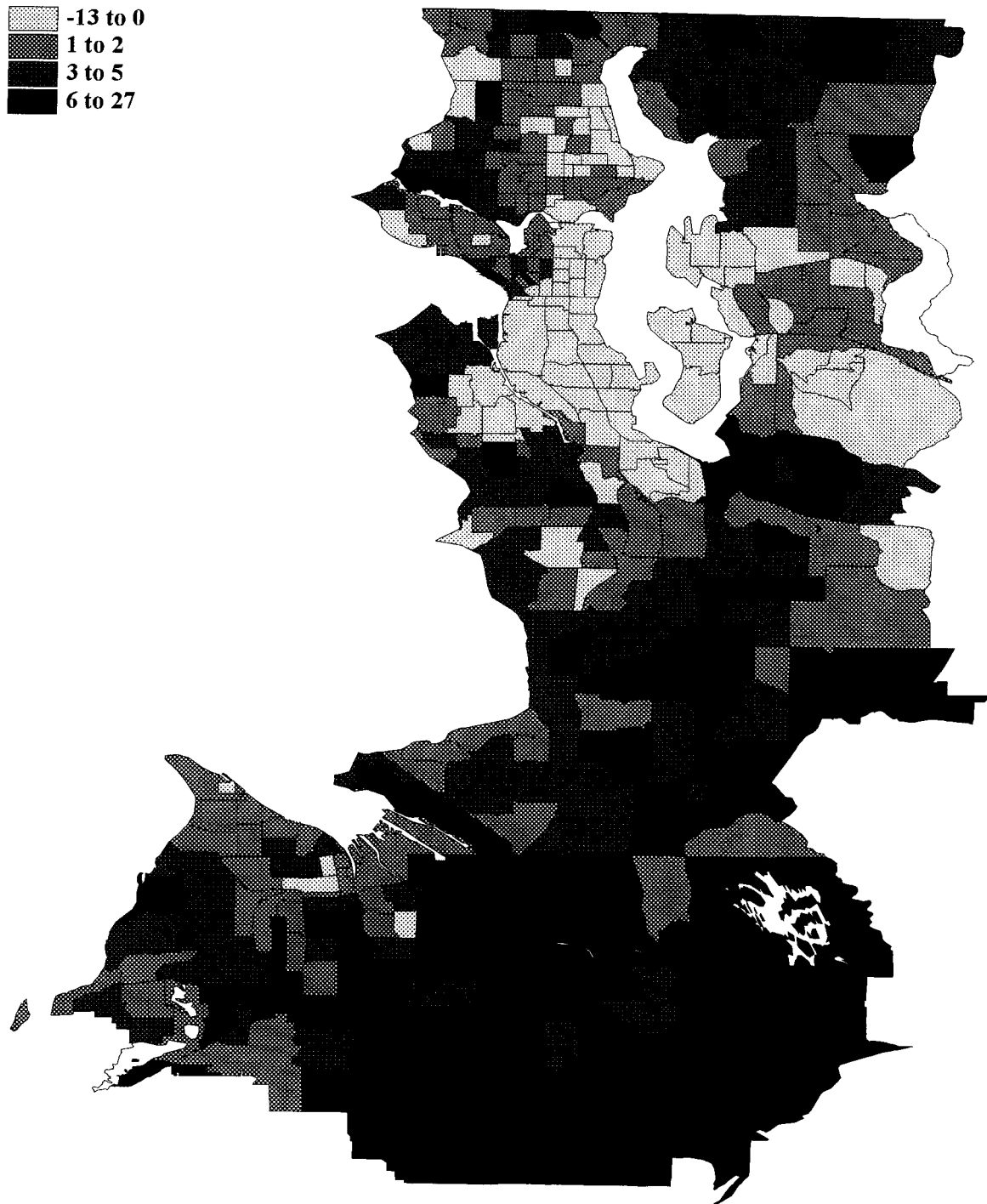

1999

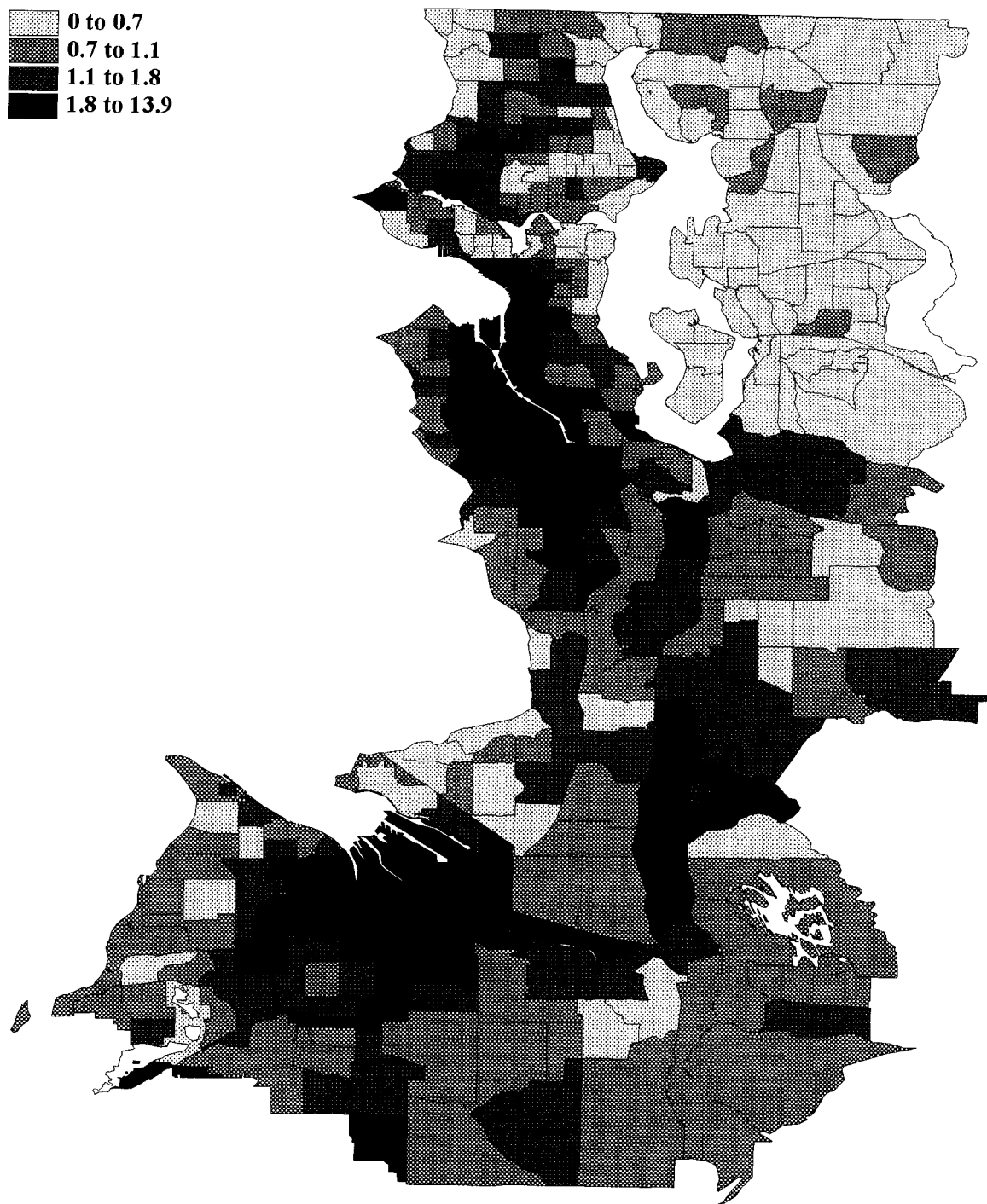

Estimated Age 65 and Over Population, 1999

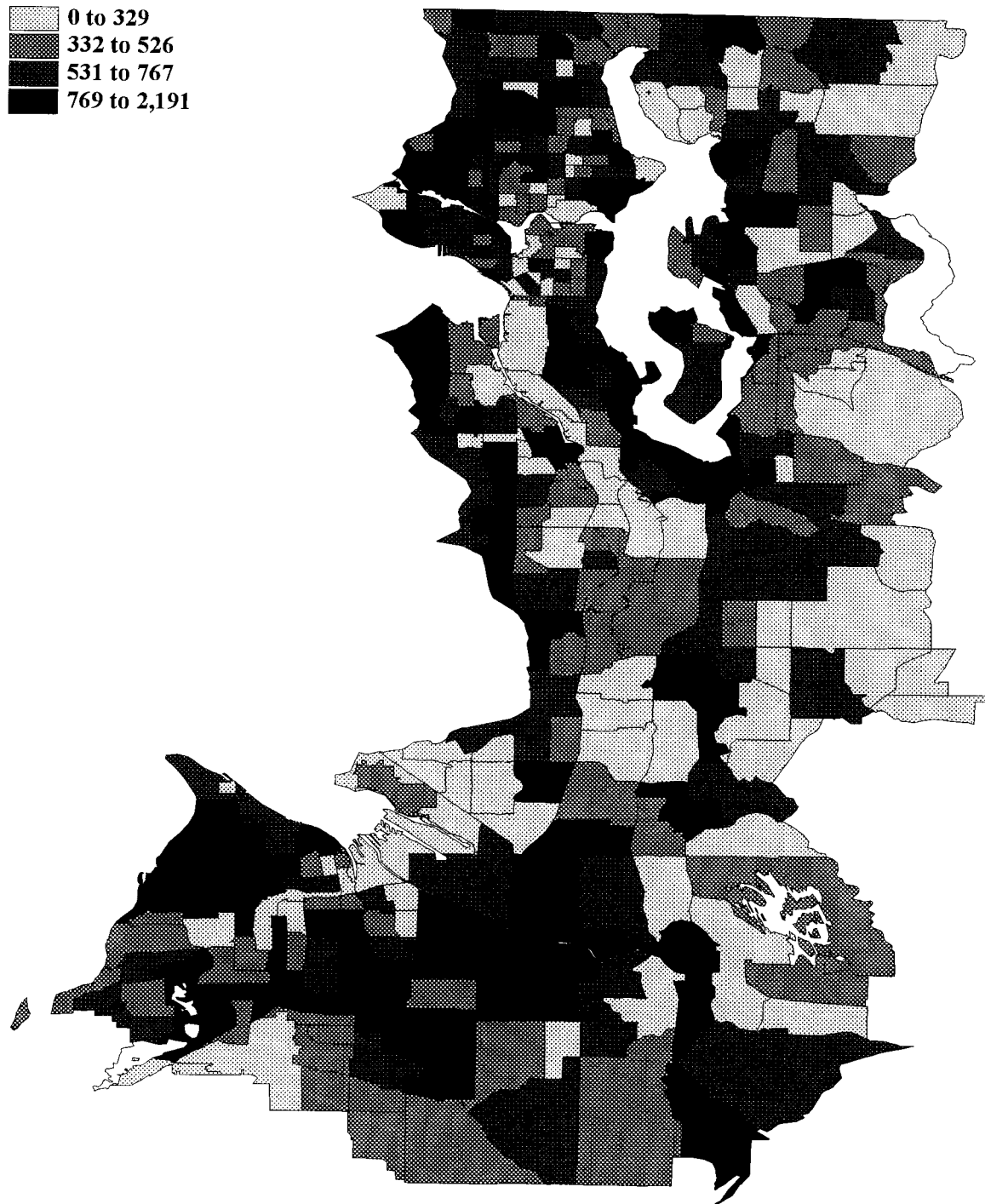

Estimated Population Age 65 and Over as a Percent of Total, 1999

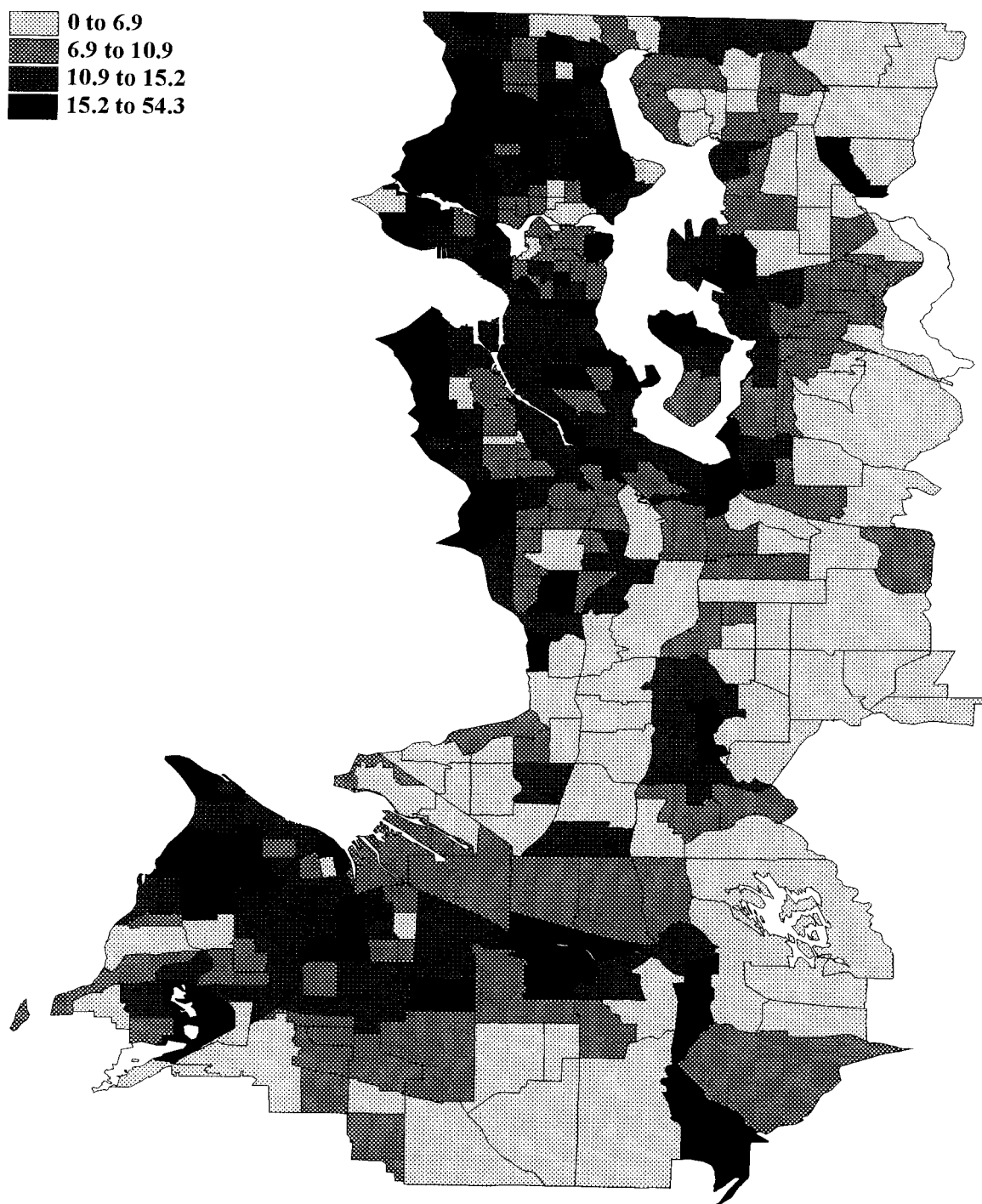

Estimated Under Age 18 Population, 1999

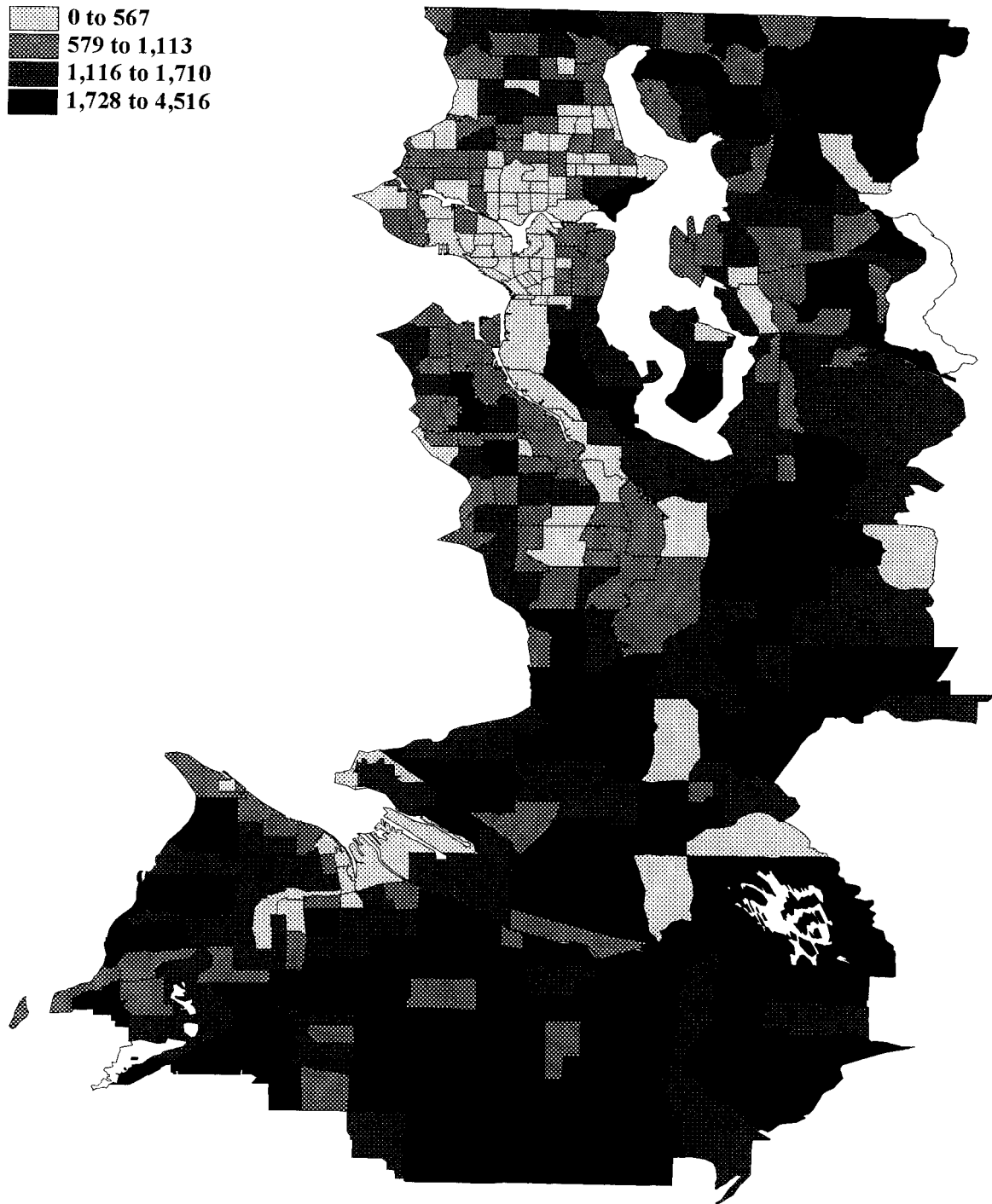

Estimated Population Age 18 or Under as a Percent of Total, 1999

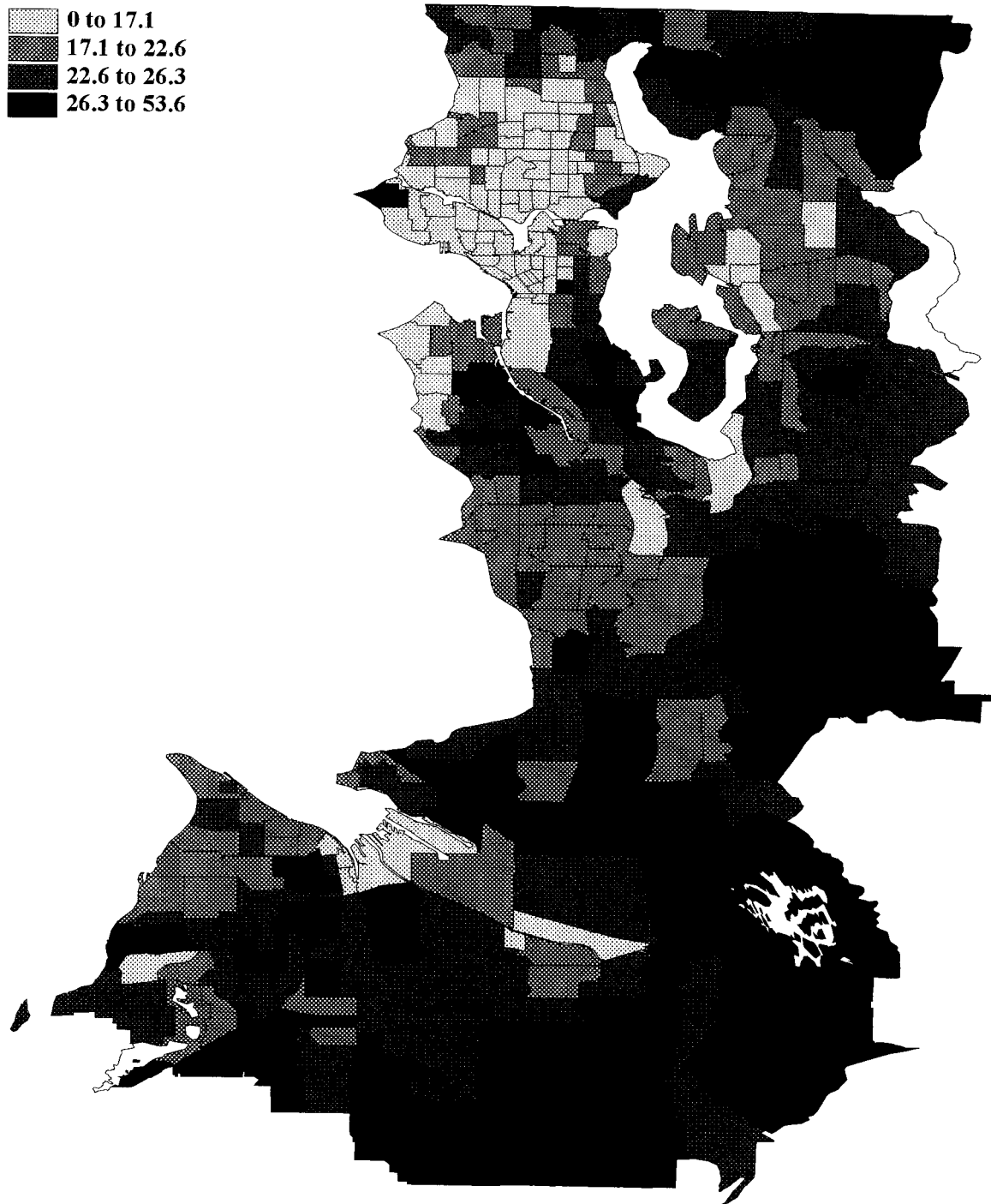

Estimated Median Household Income, 1999

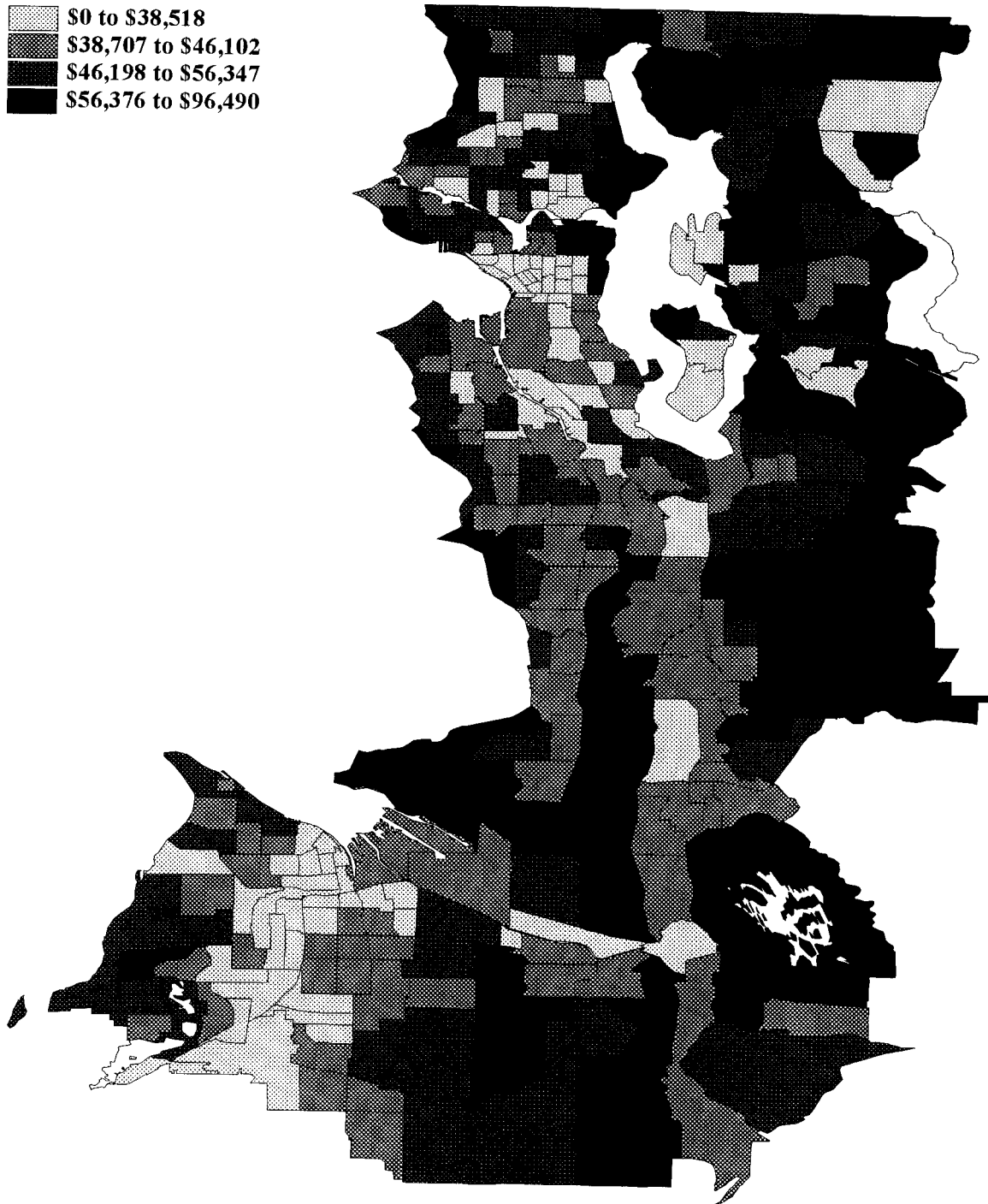

Non-Family Population as a Percent of Total, 1999

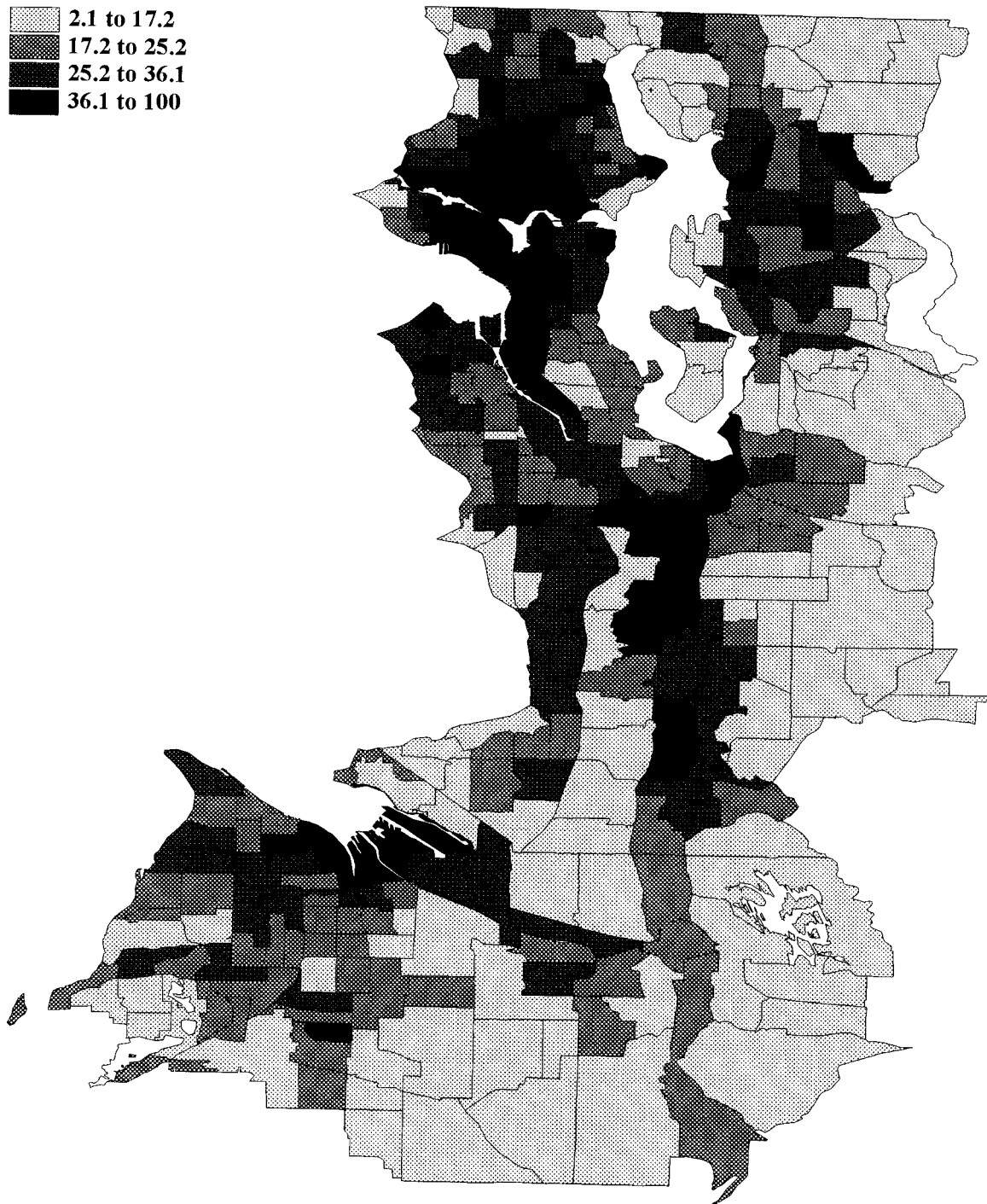
