Lacy, of course, will be in the conference and it is barely possible that Cheavens will also meet with us, because he will be in Saltillo in conference with the special Committee on the paper. We will go over the whole matter about our work in Mexico. Perhaps, discuss the question of whether one Board ought to withdraw or not. It is really a very important meeting. I hope you will remember us in prayer. I haven't the time to go down there now, but the matter is so important that the Board felt I ought to go.

I will visit a few Stations while down there, though I can't make an extended trip. I will, perhaps, go to Mexico City and Toluca. I will also spend a brief time at Torreon and Chihuahua.

I hope that the Christmas season will bring you baskets of blessing.
