Dear Brother:

I had the "Flu" and then complications which just about laid me up for the past five or six weeks. I seem to be about over it now. So many things have had to wait.

One of them is this Social Security nonsense. I had it up one side and down the other with incompetent Government employees --new men on the job, it seemed--until at last here is their final decision. I had hoped to convince them that we were clearly exempt under the Act, but they decided against me. I got a friendly lawyer here to help me, and finally they backed up and decided it was up to you over at Richmond to get this matter settled. The inclosed letter is self-explanatory.

Just as soon as possible I am going to write my report and then will write you a long letter about the work here of the past year. The Lord has been good to us as you will see when I write you in detail about the year of 1936.

✓ I am inclosing a Draft from Buenos Aires which please hand to Mr. Buxton, asking him to send us a negotiable draft--that is, one we do not have to ^{pay} quite a penalty on to cash. He has done it for us repeatedly and understands. We try to save every penny we possibly can, to be used in making over this old Publishing House and getting out some literature for our workers--just a small part of what we ought to be publishing to be sure, yet more than for several years past.

Wish I could see you at the Mexican Convention in N. Laredo but cannot go, since I am so far behind with work, after my spell of sickness.

You will be hearing from me in a few days again.
