# CONSTITUTION OF THE NEVADA BAPTIST CONVENTION

#### ARTICLE I - NAME

The name of this body shall be the Nevada Baptist Convention hereinafter referred to as the Convention. The Convention is affiliated with the Southern Baptist Convention.

#### ARTICLE II - PURPOSE

The Nevada Baptist Convention exists to support, encourage, and strengthen churches in fulfilling the Great Commission and starting churches in partnership with local associations in Nevada and the Southern Baptist Convention.

#### ARTICLE III - AUTHORITY

This body recognizes the independence and autonomy of every church, and will not usurp authority over, nor interfere with, the internal affairs of the local church.

### **ARTICLE IV - MEMBERSHIP**

This Convention shall consist of messengers elected by cooperating churches, which regularly support the Cooperative Program and the work of this body, and are in harmony with doctrines and principles generally held by Southern Baptists. Churches desiring to affiliate with the Convention must submit a written request to the Committee on Credentials no less than 60 days prior to the first session of any annual meeting. Each church shall be entitled to messengers as follows:

- A. Five messengers from each church with up to fifty members.
- B. One messenger for each additional twenty-five members or major portion thereof.
- C. No church shall have more than fifteen messengers.

#### **ARTICLE V - MEETINGS**

The Convention shall meet annually as determined by the body. In case of emergency, the President, with the consent of the Executive Board, may call a special meeting or change the time and place of the regular annual meeting.

#### ARTICLE VI - OFFICERS AND DUTIES

#### Section 1 - Executive Director/Treasurer

The Executive Director/Treasurer of the Nevada Baptist Convention is the chief executive officer of the NBC, its personnel, ministries, and initiatives.

A. Selection Process. In the event of a vacancy in the office of the Executive Director/Treasurer a Search Committee shall be elected by the Executive Board. The Committee shall be composed of 9 members of the Nevada Baptist Convention churches in addition to the President and First Vice-President of the Convention. It will be composed of four members of the Executive Board and five who are not members of the Executive Board.

Consideration shall be given to both geographic and demographic representation. The President of the Convention will serve as Chairman of the Search Committee.

- **B.** Interim Executive Director. The Personnel Committee of the Executive Board shall make recommendation to Executive Board regarding the necessity for and selection of an Interim Executive Director/Treasurer.
- C. Resignation. The Executive Director/Treasurer should upon resignation give at least 30 days written notice to the Executive Board.
- **D. Removal.** The Executive Director/Treasurer may be removed by a three-fourths vote of the Executive Board. Members of the Executive Board and the Executive Director/Treasurer must receive written notice thirty (30) calendar days prior to the vote.

#### Section 2 - Other Officers

- A. The other elected officers of this Convention shall be: President, 1st Vice President, and 2nd Vice President, all of whom shall be elected annually. No employee of the Nevada Baptist Convention, or its Institutions supported by the Convention (exclusive of the local churches), shall serve as an elected officer of the Convention. Election shall be by ballot, except when there is a single nominee for an office. The officers shall hold tenure until their successors are elected and installed. The term of office for the President is limited to two (2) one-year terms, and a president shall not be eligible for reelection until as much as one (1) year has elapsed from the time a successor is named. No individual shall serve as president more than a total of four years.
- B. The President of the Convention will be chairman of the Executive Board. The First Vice President will serve as vice-chairman and as chairman in the absence of the President or the vacancy of the office. The Executive Director/Treasurer shall be an ex officio member without voting rights.
- C. It shall be the duty of the 1st or 2nd Vice President to preside at the annual meeting or any special meeting of the Convention in the absence of the President, or by his request.
- D. The Executive Director/Treasurer or designee shall keep the official record of the proceedings of the Convention and publish the same under the instructions of the Executive Board.

#### ARTICLE VII - EXECUTIVE BOARD

- A. The Executive Board of the Convention shall serve as the Convention ad interim. This Board serves as the Convention's operating board for its general programs not specifically assigned elsewhere. The Executive Board will have authority to act for the Convention between meetings except that it cannot impose its will upon the Convention by contravening any action of the Convention taken at its regular meetings.
- B. The Executive Board shall consist of 21 members, with no less than seven (7) laypersons and seven (7) ministers serving at one time, elected at the annual meeting. In addition, the President, First Vice President, and Second Vice President of the Nevada Baptist Convention will serve as ex officio members. The regular term of office shall be three (3) years. They shall be eligible to serve for two consecutive terms. A member, having served two full terms, shall not be eligible for re-election until after the lapse of one year. Two full years or more shall be considered a full term. One third shall be elected each year. Consideration shall be given both to geographic and demographic representation.
- C. The Executive Board of the Convention shall report annually to the Convention concerning the total Convention program, operating programs entrusted to the Board, and such other matters as the Board deems necessary and proper. The Executive Board shall recommend annually, to the Convention,

distribution of all undesignated resources of the Convention.

#### ARTICLE VIII - FUNDS

All designated funds accepted by the Convention shall be applied according to the designations of the donors. All undesignated funds received shall be distributed as directed by the Convention.

#### ARTICLE IX - AGENCIES AND INSTITUTIONS

The Convention may authorize new auxiliary organizations only after a comprehensive study by the Executive Board and favorable action by the Nevada Baptist Convention at the annual meeting.

#### **ARTICLE X - AMENDMENTS**

The Constitution shall not be changed or amended unless the proposed change or amendment is submitted to the Constitution and Bylaws Committee two months before the annual meeting so that the proposed change or amendment may be printed in the state paper one month before the annual meeting.

In case of a self-evident emergency which calls for a change in the Constitution, the same may be done by presenting the proposed change in writing in one session of the annual meeting and action on it in a succeeding session.

Any changes in the Constitution shall be passed by two-thirds vote by the messengers present and voting.

# BYLAWS OF THE NEVADA BAPTIST CONVENTION

#### ARTICLE I - PARLIAMENTARY LAW AND CUSTOM

- **Section A.** Robert's Rules of Order (Latest Revised Edition) will be recognized as the rule for parliamentary procedures and custom.
- Section B. The registration will be carried out by the Executive Director/Treasurer or designee. Messengers who present proper credentials will be duly enrolled. These messengers shall constitute the Convention. Any contention about seating messengers shall be referred to the Committee on Credentials.
- Section C. The officers of the Convention shall be elected on the morning of the last day of the annual meeting. They shall be installed and assume their respective duties at the conclusion of the NBC annual meeting.
- Each session will have a time for miscellaneous business. All items of miscellaneous business coming before the Convention that are duly moved and seconded shall be referred, without debate, to the Committee on the Order of Business for referral to the appropriate committee or scheduling in the Order of Business. The committee will not have authority to keep any matter from the Convention once it has been moved and seconded and referred to the committee. In the last session of the Convention, during the miscellaneous business period, no items of new business may be considered.

#### **ARTICLE II - COMMITTEES**

Committees may enlist non-voting participants as they deem necessary.

- A. COMMITTEE ON COMMITTEES. The President shall appoint the Committee on Committees, consisting of five members, for the coming year. The committee shall nominate for election by the NBC at the annual meeting the Executive Board and the following committees:
  - 1. <u>Committee on Resolutions.</u> Consists of five members. The committee shall be responsible for initiating, reviewing, commenting on, and recommending Convention action on all resolutions.
    - All resolutions presented from the floor of the Convention shall be in writing and referred to the Committee on Resolutions, without debate, prior to floor consideration.
  - 2. Committee on Order of Business. Consists of five members. The committee shall prepare the order of business, arrange for meetings, reports, and special events. The committee shall be responsible for recommending to the Convention the time, place and preacher for the annual meeting, no more than three years in advance. The host pastor for the next annual meeting shall be an ex-officio member of this committee.
  - 3. Committee on Credentials. Consists of five members. This committee shall work with the Executive Director/Treasurer or designee to register messengers and visitors, and examine the credentials of any messenger.

The Committee on Credentials shall carefully examine each church requesting affiliation with this Convention and, if the church meets the requirements of Article 4 of the Constitution of the

- Nevada Baptist Convention, the Committee will recommend the seating of their messengers at the annual meeting of the Convention.
- 4. Constitution and Bylaws Committee. Consists of five members. This committee shall keep the Constitution and Bylaws under continual study for needed revisions; and shall study any proposed changes referred to it and make recommendations to the NBC at the annual meeting on the merits of such proposals.
- 5. Historical and Memorial Committee. Consists of three members. This committee shall bring to the NBC at the annual meeting the names and pertinent information concerning individuals who have rendered distinguished service to the Convention. In addition, the committee shall advise the Convention regarding historical data, and encourage activities concerning the development of historical data, appropriate recognition of places, people, and events in our denominational history.
- A. STRATEGIC PLANNING COMMITTEE. Consists of the officers of the Convention, NBC Executive staff members, and the Directors of Associational Missions. The Committee shall create an on-going strategy (five-year long range planning document consisting of Convention) for achieving Convention Objectives and Goals. This strategy must be presented to the NBC at an annual meeting. This strategy will be used in developing the Convention calendar and budget.
- B. **ARRANGEMENT COMMITTEE.** Consisting of members from the host church and the Chairman of the Order of Business committee. This committee shall see to the arrangements of the annual meeting of the Nevada Baptist Convention.
- C. AD HOC COMMITTEES. The President of the Convention shall appoint temporary committees as necessary.

#### ARTICLE III - EXECUTIVE BOARD

#### Section 1 - Operation of Executive Board

- A. To be eligible for election to serve on the Executive Board, a person shall be a member of a cooperating Southern Baptist Church, affiliated with the Nevada Baptist Convention, for one year. They shall reside in the Convention territory.
- B. No employee of the Nevada Baptist Convention, or Institutions supported by the Convention (exclusive of the local churches), shall serve as a member of the Executive Board.
- C. Members of the Executive Board shall be expected to attend all meetings, unless providentially hindered. In such cases, notice shall be given to the Board. Two successive absences without notification shall give the Executive Board the authority to elect a new member. The Executive Board shall fill vacancies of the Board to serve only until the next annual meeting of the Convention.
- D. A member of the Board may be recalled for just cause upon a vote of two-thirds of the members, provided, however, that the Board shall notify such member of the time and place of any recall hearing and such member be given opportunity to be heard.
- E. The Board through the Executive Director/Treasurer is authorized to assist the churches of the Convention in, financing, and fostering new mission work.
- F. The Executive Board shall meet prior to the opening of the annual meeting of the Nevada Baptist Convention, and additionally at least twice during the year (spring and fall).

- G. A quorum of the Executive Board shall be defined as a simple majority.
- H. The Board is authorized to raise and collect contributions through the Executive Committee and disburse all accepted funds and properties.
- I. The Board shall authorize and require an annual certified compilation or review of the financial books of the Convention by a Certified Public Accountant.
- J. Convention books, records, and files (except confidential documents) shall be open for inspection by Convention officers and members of the Board. Any member of a cooperating Baptist Church in the NBC may review the audited accounts at convention headquarters by appointment during business hours.
- K. The meetings of the Executive Board shall be opened to the constituency which it serves, except for.
- L. The Executive Board shall meet the legal requirements in connection with the incorporation of the Convention.
- M. The Executive Board shall administer its cooperative work according to the policies of the Convention and shall recommend to the Convention an annual budget.
- N. The Executive Board shall employ such personnel as required to do the work of the Convention. No Board approved employee of the Convention shall be terminated without a full review and approval of two-thirds (2/3) vote of the membership of the Executive Board of the Nevada Baptist Convention present.

#### Section 2 - Officers

The officers of the Executive Board shall be the President of the Nevada Baptist Convention, who shall also be the Chairman of the Executive Board, and the First Vice President of the Nevada Baptist Convention, who shall also be the Vice-Chairman of the Executive Board. The normal and customary succession will take place in the event of a vacancy.

#### Section 3 - Executive Committee

**EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.** This committee shall be composed of the Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson of the Board as well as the Chairpersons of the Administrative, Missions, and Church Programs Committees. The Executive Committee shall serve as the Executive Board ad interim deciding on routine and emergency matters. It cannot impose its will upon the Executive Board or Convention by contravening any action of the Executive Board or Convention taken at their regular meetings. It shall also serve as the Personnel and Budget/Finance Committee.

#### **Section 4 - Standing Committees**

The following three standing committees and their chairpersons shall be appointed by the convention president. Each committee shall be composed of one-third of the Executive Board. Each committee shall be responsible for the sphere of its action and report/recommend action to the Executive Board.

- **A. ADMINISTRATION COMMITTEE.** This committee shall counsel and work in areas of promotion, plans, policies, and communication.
- **B.** MISSIONS COMMITTEE. This committee shall counsel and work in areas of mission development and initiatives (*programs*).
- C. CHURCH PROGRAMS COMMITTEE. This committee shall counsel and work in areas of church development and programs.

# **ARTICLE IV - AMENDMENTS**

The Bylaws may be amended by a majority vote of the members present and voting at a business session of the Nevada Baptist Convention annual meeting, providing announcement of such has been made at a previous session of the same NBC annual meeting.

#### BYLAWS NEVADA BAPTIST FOUNDATION

#### ARTICLE I MEMBERSHIP

Membership in the corporation shall consist of and be limited to the elected six trustees and ex-officio trustees - such membership to continue until their successors are elected.

# ARTICLE II ANNUAL MEETING

The annual meeting of the corporation shall be held in November for the purpose of electing officers and committees.

#### ARTICLE III OFFICER

The officers of the corporation shall consist of a President, a Vice-President, Secretary, and Executive Director-Treasurer. The officers shall be elected by the Board of Trustees. Newly elected members for the first time to this Board shall not be eligible for office prior to the conclusion of one year's service with this Board.

#### ARTICLE IV DUTIES OF OFFICERS

#### Section 1 - President

The President shall preside over all meetings of the Trustees, shall be their official spokesman, and perform such other duties as ordinarily pertain to that office.

#### Section 2 - Vice-President

The Vice-President shall act for the President in his absence or incapacity, and perform such other duties as the President may assign.

#### Section 3 - Secretary

The Secretary shall keep a record of all meetings of the Trustees and minutes of the procedures, and shall perform such other duties as ordinarily pertain to that office.

#### Section 4 - Executive Director

The Executive Director shall also be the Treasurer of the corporation. He shall have custody of the funds, securities, and property of the corporation, subject to the provisions hereof, and to such regulations as shall from time to time be prescribed by the Trustees, and shall deposit all funds and securities in such banks and with such fiduciaries as may from time to time be designated. The full title of "Executive Director-Treasurer" shall be used when signing legal documents. Said funds may be withdrawn only upon draft or order signed by the Executive Director or other officers, and countersigned by an officer or Trustee, who has been so designated by the Board of Trustees. Funds set aside for current expenses may be drawn on order of the Executive Director or other officer, and counter-signed by any person, who has been so designated by the Board of Trustees.

The Executive Director shall be responsible for accurate accounting to the Board of Trustees for all funds and securities in his custody and shall deposit with the Executive Director-Treasurer of the Executive Board of the Nevada Baptist Convention a bond for faithful performance of his duties, in such sum as may be fixed by the Board of Trustees, the expenses of which shall be borne by the Foundation.

#### Section 5 - Board of Trustees

- a. The Board of Trustees shall meet and organize as soon as practicable after their election which shall be the organization meeting. After the organization they shall hold at least two meetings annually, at such time and place as they may determine.
- b. Called meetings shall be held upon the call of the President or upon the call of three members of the Board of Trustees and the President and Secretary shall give sufficient notice of the time and place thereof.
- c. The Board of Trustees may, at any meeting, appoint from their own number such Committee or Committees and delegate to it, or to them, such authority as may be deemed advisable so long as the same shall be within their authority and discretion.
- d. A quorum of the Board of Trustees shall consist of four elected members, and all matters properly coming before them shall be determined by a majority vote of those present.
- e. The Board of Trustees shall have and exercise full authority with reference to investment, re-investment and administration of the principal of all funds and property devised, bequeathed, given or transferred to the Foundation, as well as the investment, re-investment and administration of all funds and property committed to it for such purposes as

agent or as trustee by the Nevada Baptist Convention, or its successor, or by the Executive Board of the Nevada Baptist Convention, or by any other corporation, agency, or Board fostered by and approved by the Nevada Baptist Convention and shall have authority to execute proper transfers, assignments, contracts, deeds, releases, receipts, acquittances, and any and all instruments that may be necessary in the administration of the property and assets of the Foundation, or in its capacity as agent or trustee, and the purchaser or transferee of the property, real or personal, notes, bonds, or securities, shall not be required to look to the application of proceeds so long as such instrument or instruments so delivered to him or them, is executed by the President, Vice-President, Executive Director or other officer so designated by the Board of Trustees, and as attested by the Secretary under the seal of the corporation and upon proper resolution of the Board of Trustees.

#### ARTICLE V AGENT

The Board of Trustees may select and appoint fiduciaries and fiscal agents to be given custody of all or any part of the properties of the Foundation and other properties administered by it, and they may be authorized to make and alter investments of the Foundation committed, to their custody, and to keep the financial books of the corporation so committed to their custody and to make such accounting to the Board of Trustees as it shall require, and receive such compensation from the Board of Trustees as it shall stipulate from time to time. The Board of Trustees may require bond of its fiduciaries and fiscal agents with such corporate surety as it deems advisable.

#### ARTICLE VI AUDITS

The books of the Foundation and of its fiscal agents shall be audited at least every five years by an auditor approved by the Nevada Baptist Convention or its Executive Board and a certified statement of the auditor showing the investments held by the Foundation, the amount of income during the period, the purpose for which the income has been applied, and the classified statement of the expenses shall be published in *The Nevada Baptist* or any other recognized organized organ of the Nevada Baptist Convention. An internal compilation shall be done annually and published in *The Nevada Baptist* or any other recognized organized organ of the Nevada Baptist Convention.

#### **CHARTER**

#### STATE OF NEVADA COUNTY OF WASHOE

BE IT KNOWN, That this day before me, the undersigned authority, a Notary Public in and for the above named County and State, and in the presence of undersigned competent attesting witnesses, personally came and appeared residents of the State of Nevada, whose names are subscribed hereto, who declared and acknowledged that under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Nevada, and particularly Chapter 81 of the Legislature of Nevada and Acts amendatory thereof, they do hereby and by these present associate themselves, their successors and assigns together to incorporate as an association not organized for profit and in which no capital stock is authorized or will be issued, for the purposes and under the corporate name hereinafter mentioned, and to that end they do set forth and make declaration as follows, to wit:

The name of the corporation is to be NEVADA BAPTIST FOUNDATION.

T

The legal domicile of this corporation shall be Reno, Washoe County, Nevada.

#### IΠ.

The purposes for which the corporation is formed are as follows:

- 1. To assist in the encouragement and motivation of the making of gifts, donations and benefactions, by deed, will, or otherwise, for the advancement, promotion, extension and maintenance of the various causes and objects, now or at any time hereafter, fostered by the Southern Baptist denomination in Nevada in its cooperative enterprises and under-takings as defined by the Nevada Baptist Convention, and to supply and provide an instrumentality for securing greater continuity and uniformity of powers and purposes in the control, management and distribution of such gifts, donations and benefactions, and obtaining increased efficiency and economy in the administration and control of property acquired and intended to be devoted to such purposes.
- 2. To receive, own, hold, administer, invest, manage, distribute and dispose of property of all kinds, as directed by the givers or donors, which it acquires through gifts, bequests, transfers, donations, devises or otherwise, for the benefit of, advancement, promotion, extension or maintenance of (1) institutions, agencies, causes, and objects, now or at any time hereafter, fostered or supported by the Nevada Baptist Convention; (2) Baptist churches cooperating with and supporting the Nevada Baptist Convention; and (3) institutions, agencies, causes or objects fostered or supported by the Southern Baptist Convention.
- 3. To assist, when directed to do so by the Nevada Baptist Convention, in the founding or maintenance of any institution or agency recognized by the Nevada Baptist Convention, or the body succeeding it, as being distinctly a Baptist institution or enterprise.
  - 4. To provide information on techniques and tax and legal advantages of giving to Baptist institutions.

#### IV.

The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by a Board of Trustees composed of six members who may be either men or women, but shall be residents of the State of Nevada, and shall each be a member in good standing of a Southern Baptist church in Nevada cooperating with the Nevada Baptist Convention, or body succeeding it, and not more than three or less than two of them shall be ministers of religion as recognized by the Nevada Baptist Convention. Trustees shall be on a rotating basis.

The President and Executive Director-Treasurer of the Executive Board of the Nevada Baptist Convention shall be ex-officio members of the Trustees.

At each annual session of the Nevada Baptist Convention it shall elect two trustees of this corporation, who shall hold office for three years or until their successors are elected and installed. At each subsequent annual session of the Nevada Baptist Convention, or the body succeeding it, two trustees who shall possess the qualifications for the office above stated, shall be nominated to the Convention by the Committee on Committees of the Convention. No member elected or appointed for a full term shall be eligible for more than two (2) complete successive terms. No members elected to serve as much as two (2) years of an unexpired term shall be eligible for more than one (1) full term of three (3) years.

The Nevada Baptist Convention, or the body succeeding it, at any regular session, by vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the accredited messengers of such session, present and voting, may, for cause, declare vacant any office of any or of all the members of the Board of Trustees of this corporation, and may elect successors to fill out the unexpired term or terms of the member or members of the Board of Trustees whose office or offices have been so declared vacant.

At interim, vacancies shall be filled by the Trustees of the Foundation, subject to approval of the Executive Board of the Convention.

#### V.

The names and places of residence of the trustees, who shall manage the affairs of this corporation for the first year and thereafter until their respective successors are elected and installed, and their respective terms of office.

#### VI.

The members, meetings, officers, their election, term of office and duties and certain regulations governing the conduct and the administration of the affairs of this corporation by the Board of Trustees are provided forth in a set of Bylaws adopted by the incorporators hereof concurrently with the execution of these articles of incorporation, which Bylaws are marked "Exhibit A" and are paraphed "No Varietur" for identification herewith by the Notary Public before whom this act is executed.

The officers or the Board of Trustees, who shall serve for one (1) year and until their successors are elected and qualified, and whose duties are set forth in the Bylaws.

The period of duration of said corporation shall be ninety-nine (99) years, with the right to terminate its corporate existence at any time in the manner prescribed by the laws of the State of Nevada.

#### VII

The said corporation may accept, receive and administer gifts, donations, and benefactions, subject to any lawful agreement between the corporation and the donor, and contract to pay an income to an individual or individuals for life or a term of years; and if any such gift, donation or benefaction be so accepted and received, such agreement shall be binding and obligatory upon the corporation until the expiration of such life or term of years, and thereafter any such gifts, donations or benefaction shall be held, administered, distributed or disposed of, for the objects and purposes herein set forth, or any of them.

The corporation may retain, hold, and administer any property, stocks, bonds, or other securities, acquired by it by gift, bequest, devise, or otherwise, so long as it seems to it advisable so to do, without any liability to any person for or on account of such retention; and it shall have power to determine whether money or property coming into its possession, undesignated, shall be treated as income or as principal, and to charge or apportion any expenses or losses to principal or income, as it may deem just and equitable.

Subject to any and all lawful conditions, limitations or restrictions, contained in any instrument of gift, whereby property may be acquired or received by the corporation for its objects and purposes, in the manner now or hereafter prescribed by law, may sell or exchange, transfer and convey title to any of its property, real, personal, or mixed, to promote or advance its objects or purposes, or for the purpose of reinvesting in other property, real or personal, to be denoted to its objects and purposes.

The donor or testator making gifts to the Nevada Baptist Foundation, may either designate the object or objects for which the gift shall be known as a designated gift, or else he may make his gift to the Nevada Baptist Foundation without designation, specification, condition or limitation, which shall be known as an undesignated gift.

In the case of a DESIGNATED GIFT, the corporation shall follow the direction, specifications, terms and conditions of the instrument of gift so long as it shall be possible and practicable so to do and when if ever, it shall become impossible or impracticable, in the judgment of the Board of Trustees, to follow the instrument of gift, said Board shall report the fact to the Nevada Baptist Convention at its next regular session, and it, the said Convention, shall instruct the Board as to the future administration of the gift.

In the case of an UNDESIGNATED GIFT, the corporation shall receive it and either administer it as a separate trust estate or add it to other undesignated gifts which are being administered as a single trust estate.

The Board of Trustees shall report in writing to each regular session of the Nevada Baptist Convention the amount of income then available for distribution and may recommend the object or objects to or among which it shall be distributed, and the Nevada Baptist Convention shall thereupon instruct the Board of Trustees as to the distribution of the income. If the Nevada Baptist Convention shall fail to instruct the Board, then the Board may distribute the accumulated income in accordance with its best judgment to and among the objects of the Southern Baptist denomination, approved and fostered by the Nevada Baptist Convention.

If necessary or expedient to do so, to advance or promote its objects and purposes, this corporation may subscribe to, purchase, or otherwise acquire or guarantee or become surety in respect to, the stock, bonds, or other securities and obligations of other corporations.

#### VIII.

This corporation shall have and may exercise all the powers conferred, or which may hereafter be conferred by virtue of the laws of the State of Nevada upon corporations of like character, now or hereafter created by the laws of said; and the enumeration of certain powers herein specified is nor intended as exclusive or as waving any of the powers, rights or privileges granted or conferred or which may be granted or conferred, by the laws of the State of Nevada, respecting corporations of like character.

#### IX.

No personal liability shall ever attach to any member of this corporation, his heirs, or his estate, merely by virtue of his being a member, trustee or officer of this corporation. Any liability of the corporation shall be a corporate liability except where the member specially assumes this liability, or as such liability may, under the law be affected by the conduct or fraud of any given member in connection with duties assumed by him.

#### X.

The corporation shall be subject to, and it shall be operated and its affairs administered in harmony with the provisions of the Constitution of the Nevada Baptist Convention. And it shall make annual reports of its operations and of its financial condition to the Nevada Baptist Convention and to the Executive Board of the Nevada Baptist Convention, and its operating expenses shall be subject to review by the Executive Committee. An official copy of the Charter and Bylaws of this Board, and copies of the official minutes of this Board, shall be filed with the Executive Director-Treasurer of the Executive Board of the Nevada Baptist Convention.

#### XI.

This Charter may be amended by two-thirds vote of the members of this Corporation, subject to the approval of the Nevada Baptist Convention at its next meeting, notice in writing having been given the President and Secretary of the Convention ten (10) days prior to the meeting, and requisite notices having been preciously published as required by the laws of Nevada, in connection with the amendment of charters of non-trading corporations.

- 7. Welcome Joe Taylor, Pastor, South Reno Baptist Church.
- 8. Report: Registration/Request to Constitute Ron Trummell, Chairman, Credentials Committee. 84 messengers registered. I move that those registered and all others who register later constitute this 28<sup>th</sup> annual meeting. All approved. Trummell I move that on behalf of the Credential Committee that we accept the following who are petitioning to be constituted. Cornerstone Baptist Church in Elko; Shiloh Church in Elko, and West Las Vegas Hispanic. All welcomed them.
- 9. Report: WMU Lorna Bius shared a video from Wanda Lee. WMU logo has changed for the first time in history. The "M" (for missions) stands out as the largest letter. She shared some of the resources available from WMU, including Missions Fest and Family Fest. WMU is working on a way to introduce missions into the AWANA program.
- 10. **Introduction of Resolutions** Ken Frizzell, Chairman of the Resolutions Committee Pg 4 of the Book of Reports explains how to submit a resolution.
- 11. Report: GuideStone Financial Services Chris Elkins reported that there has been lots of changes. We want to keep you as informed as possible. Please open the mail that you get from us.
- 12. NBC Staff Reports: See the 2006 Book of Reports for Terry Arnold, Director of Church Development Five great loves in my life Jesus, Doris, teaching Sunday school at South Reno Baptist Church and being an Elder there, the state of Nevada and the Nevada Baptist Convention, fishing. Five things I want to do for you. In 2007 I want to concentrate on Sunday school and small groups, discipleship ministry, minister relations, President in 2008 of state

minister relations, church consultations; congregational strategic planning initiative.

Eddie Hancock, Director of Leadership Development -Eddie talked about the life cycle of a halibut, he talked about the life change that was needed in a person and the growth in the area of discipleship...leadership development is about discipleship. Next year we want to train, equip, and release thirty lay leaders as church planters into the field. He talked about student ministry (Steve Timmons and Ryan Redwine); Ryan Redwine came to share what is going on in his area of campus ministry and a video; Bob Johnson, Native American Consultant - We have fifteen different reservations and twelve colonies (inside city limits). There are eighteen different tribal governments that rule over them. Only three Southern Baptist churches on them. There are barriers...past history...walls that need to be broken down. There are cultural differences; one of these differences is time. They don't look someone in the eye; they consider it an act of aggression. 13. Special Music: Wellspring from Granite Hills Baptist Church

14. Message - Joe Taylor. He told about an experience with Dr. Fish...will I be a voice or an echo for God. There is a lot of power, when you preach when God tells you that this is what He wants me to say. One does not have to be skilled, gifted or trained, just be willing to go. Revelation 3:7-11... The church of Philadelphia was a missions minded church. This was a commercially important place. In 17 AD the city was destroyed by earthquakes. Up until the earthquake they were a sending church. We have a story of a church that was rattled for some reason and God steps in and steadies the church. Who really is in charge? If we can grasp who is in charge your church and your ministry will never be the same. Three truths: (1) God is Holy. The Bible says that God is Holy, Holy, Holy. He alone is Holy. God in incapable of any impurity or wrong doing. Sometimes we have a hazy view of the holiness of God. (2) God is true (real). God is totally real, genuine and trust worthy. This is why we preach God on Sunday mornings. (3) He holds the key of David. When He opens doors, no one can close them. When He closes doors, no one can open them. The key of David was a literal key that opened the door to where the offerings were kept. At the very least, God and God alone has the authority to do something about the situation in hand, if He wants and when He wants. Nothing stops God. Jesus has the key. We don't

have the key. Job, Abraham, and Jeremiah got it. "What is impossible with men is possible with God." "Fatigue never reminds us that faithfulness, not nickels and noses, is what makes the headlines in heaven."-Dr. Blaine Allen. It's faithfulness to His word. In a moment, God could turn a key and everything could change. He tells about an experience he had in college helping a man who was stranded and four "non humans" crawled out of a car that squalled up to them. One of them was showing off his switch blade. I was scared and didn't know what was going to happen. It turned out that the man he was helping was a narcotics agent and had a gun. What changed my experience from fear to "this is cool"... I realized who he was. I realized the authority and the power that was his. When we have fear about what is going to happen or how are we going to make it, we calm when we realize God's holiness and authority.

15. Miscellaneous Business: Hoyt Savage

Budget Presentation: Hoyt explained some of the line items in the budget. Every year since NBC started we have increased the CP percent that we send to the Southern Baptist Convention. This year NBC is assuming \$10,000 of costs that was in the past covered by credits with Guide-Stone. Church starting...assistance we have \$407,000 in the budget for this item.

Adoption the Calendar: Hoyt brings the recommendation to adopt the calendar. It comes from committee and does not need a second. All were in favor.

- 23. President's Message Hoyt Savage: John 17. God has made us to count in this life and to the ends of the earth. Rom 8:28-29. God causes all things to work together for good... for who He for knew he also predestined... John 17. We were made to be the 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, ongoing child of God. We can fulfill the cause of Christ in the same way as Jesus. What if you and I came to the end of our lives and we prayed a prayer of thanks and praise to God? I think it would look a lot like John 17. God has made us a vessel of the Holy Spirit. Verse 1, Father the hour has come, glorify the Son.... You and I were made to count by glorifying Christ in our lives. It is the idea that when we are glorifying God we are putting a magnifying glass on Jesus himself. It enlarges it so much that it is

obvious...easy to see. Jesus, because of what I've done I bring glory to you...for your glory. I must increase so he can increase. We can not give away what we do not have ourselves. We need to be maturing so we can give it away ourselves. I think we are struggling with what's in it for us. He shared about someone who was looking for two technical people to fill positions but the quality he wanted more than technical was to have strong character...men of God...the technical can be taught. My challenge as a Pastor, man of God, is to talk the talk while walking the walk. John 17:6 I manifested thy name...they believe that thou didst send me. One of the joys of being in the NBC convention is to watch people be raised up. They aren't raised up by themselves. Who is going to prepare them? Hoyt shared how much he loves the military members at their church. He's had a number of families come to him and say they want to go be part of new church starts. They aren't unhappy...just following their call. We continued equipping, training, and rising up others. A year later God had replaced those who had left. We pray that those we invest in will also invest in others. Hoyt shared his experience with the International Mission Board. It's not just what you do through the Cooperative Program, it could be what God wants to do with you through world vision. Pray that God will put a place on your heart to go and invest. The disciples heard what God told them...the Holy Spirit came on them...they went out with a heart for the world. I enjoy working with men. Men regularly ask questions. (1) Am I choosing the right career? (2) mid 30s will this career take care of the responsibilities I have? (3) early mid 40s stuff starts to sag...hair falls out...have I missed anything and is it too late to get to it...can cause midlife crazies. (4) 60S & 70S DID IT MATTER THAT I LIVED or died? Are you investing in what God wants you to invest in? Is it like sticking you hand in water and pulling it out. After a little time no one can tell it was there. Are you leaving a mark for Christ? My challenge...know, love and never stop growing in God. Invest your life in someone. Help those in whom you can invest to have a world vision. Michael Rochelle said, "If you are not ready to reach the entire world, you are not ready to reach the people across the street." Christ said I have a plan for you...you were MADE TO COUNT.

Executive Director's Challenge Dr. Thane Barnes Our mission statement says we are going to reduce lostness (bold evangelism) by starting (new congregations) and growing (church health) and develop leaders. Our goal is to have 1,600 congregations by 2020. When I tell people that they look at me like I am out of my mind. How do you know that a goal like that is of God? We are talking about big things in Nevada. For whatever reason it is, God is giving attention to Nevada. He is granting us favor. I don't know way. I hope it's because we are being faithful. We are seeing things happen that only God can do. 2 Samuel 24, David is at the end of his life. He has done and seen it all...high, low, guilt, shame. I like when he is described as

a man after God's own heart. Not be Jesus...but to be like him...imitators of Jesus. In 2 Samuel 24 God is angry. God stirred up David to count the people in David's kingdom. David counts the people to see how many people he is mad at because if God's mad then he's mad. David stepped out of God's will when he did this. David got out ahead of God. David was aware of his sin...his conscious troubled him. He confessed to the Lord that he had sinned. He asked the Lord to forgive him. God gave him an interesting choice for the consequences of his sin. (1) Three years of famine (2) Three months of running from your enemies (3) Three days of plague. David had to choose. Even though he had confessed there were consequences. David finally realizes in verse 14 ...let me fall into God's hands instead of other hands. I can't choose...God choose. A plague hit and thousands of people died. David repented and turned back to God. God told David to build an alter. David went to purchase a place...the man wanted to give it to him, but David said, "We are going to buy the threshing floor. I can not give that which cost me nothing." It's not out of line to desire to make a difference for the kingdom of God while you are here on earth. There is a huge population of Muslims now on the UNR campus. Detroit is targeted to be the first Muslim controlled city...government, etc. If we are going to impact the culture and reduce lostness...it's going to cost us something as people, churches, and a convention. What I do for God is more vibrant and alive when it cost me something. It could come to a time in our country when that cost is our lives. God can you count on me? I want to be made to count. We have been made to make a difference for the glory of God.

29. Message - Ted Traylor, Pastor Olive Garden Baptist Church, Pensacola, FL. Isaiah 42:5-9 The church of the living God should be always aglow with the gospel. We need to burn brightly in this darkness. Thus says the Lord. "I am the Lord." We share, where I am a pastor, that ever member is a missionary. Every home and outpost for evangelism and fellowship. Every church a mission sending agency. Lord, he prayed...illuminate us. He read in a footnote of a book... "all believers should be world Christians. A world Christian is one so gripped by the glory of God's global purpose the he chooses to align his mission with God's mission to fill the earth with the knowledge of God's glory as the waters that cover the earth." If God has assigned it to us then why are our churches not doing the assigned thing. We have more churches in the SBC than ever before yet baptisms are on decline. When we get the ACS reports the money goes up and up and up, but the numbers of evangelism and outreach and baptisms go down and down and down. Why are we not the great illuminators that we have been called to be. In Isaiah 42 there are three things I want to show you. (1) When the Lordship of Jesus is settled then we will be world Christians. "I am the Lord, there is no other." When we settle the Lordship issue we will be on mission. Jonah is about missions...it is a baptism preacher who didn't want to go. He has to settle the Lordship issue. The issue is racism and selfishness. Some of our churches are anti-missionary because they are antiracism. At Olive some people told him they don't want that kind in our church. There is not a

kind...only saved and lost. If Jesus saves them they are a candidate for our church membership. They are precious in His sight...Are they precious in our site. Matthew 12:41..."One greater than Jonah is among us." He preached the righteous gospel. The Lordship issue was settled. You'll never be an illuminator until the Lordship issue is settled. (2) When the commission of Jesus is taken serious. "I have appointed you to be a light to the nations." We've got to reach America...over 300 million...only China and India having more. (Migration, immigration, and the aging boomers...babies born at a faster rate than boomers are dying.) We've got to reach this nation or we are going to loose them. We've got to reach the nations. The 10-40 window...Africa, etc. 3.2 billion people...95% lost. Rev. 7:9 Every tribe, every tongue, every nation will gather around the throne. (3) We become illuminaries when the power of Jesus is sufficient. Verse 5 People are afraid of getting sick so they don't go on missions. If God can take care of creation he can take care of you. You was special made. The God of creation said, "I will hold your hand." He shared about a family who's son is on mission...living in a tent...all he has is Jesus. Jesus is sufficient. If God can save a Muslim he can save the infantile across the street. He is sufficient. Traylor shared about his connection in Romania and the decisions for Christ there and a school that was built there with nothing. If God can do that...what could He do here if we became illuminaries. It'll take giving like never before. We've got to go. Prayer like we've never prayed. It'll take your church growing world Christians.

Help us be focused and on task when we have them with us. If they are going to know the Lord it will have to happen through their own people. We pray they will hear the gospel and want and desire it above anything else.

- 36. Message Ted Traylor Isaiah 42 (part 2) vs. 6-7 "I am the Lord I have called you in righteousness. I will hold you by the hand and watch over you." He shared the world Christian footnote, again. God saved me when I was 10 and called me when I was 17. He said when he was young the world was just what he could see. Now the world seems small. He shared about some of his college students who stay in contact with him from the mission fields around the world. If we are going to be a light to the nations... (1) You must be unashamed in this world. You simply share forth the gospel. He shared about a trip he had to Germany. There was a Pastor there asking him to

partner with them. The man had a Bible that belonged to his Father. It was hand written by his father while he was in prison as another man read it to him. After his father got out of prison he told everyone about Christ. The son is carrying on. Unashamed in the world. (2) "I will appoint you as a covenant to the people." You must be unstained by the world. We must have a covenant to the world. James 1:27; 2 Peter 2:20; What is it that stains us? 1 John 2:15 "Do not love the world nor the things in the world, if anyone loves the world the love of the Father is not in him." Vs. 16 "For all that is in this world the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the boastful pride... the one who does the will of God abides forever." What stains us? (1) Sensual pleasure...lust for the flesh. Sexual perversion that would come against us. (2) Selfish possession. We'd rather keep the possessions than be a light to the nation. (3) Stubborn pride of life causes us to elevate ourselves. On three occasions Jesus used this phrase. "He that exalts himself will be brought low, but he that humbles himself he will be exalted." We need to humble ourselves and be "common"...not someone on a pedestal. The light of the gospel goes out. 2 Peter 1:3-4 "...we are to be over comers of this world." I know I'm far from perfect. Inside of us resides our precious Savior, 1 John 5:4 "for whatever is born of God over comes the world....and this is the victory that has over come the world...we walk not by site in the world, but we walk by faith." By faith we said there is not a church in Bop Paul India. We are saying Lord here we are we are going to send teams, prayer walk and pay you will raise up a spark of faith in that city. He shared a church plant on one of the university campuses. This is what church planters do...they do it by faith...not by sight. Get your gaze off of the world and get your gaze on the heavenlies. God will raise you up with power and glory to do a great thing. I don't know when this preacher has been as encouraged as I have been in you through these days. I have seen men and women of fresh faith taking a stand for Christ. Don't let this culture stain you to the place that you are no longer a light to the nation. We need your light to burn brightly. I love you and I'll pray for you. You have blessed me.

37. Election of Officers: The floor is open to nominate someone for the office of President of NBC.

John Mark Simmons, Highland Hills Baptist Church, Henderson reminded everyone that we have the spirit of cooperation in Nevada. One example is the way we spread around the leadership in electing presidents from north and south. I'd like to nominate Mike Farris as president of NBC. I believe he is well qualified. Mike is a Pastor. Served at First Baptist Church in Tonopah over 11 years making a difference there. Mike is a leader in his associations. His church has been one of the top churches in baptisms and giving. He is currently Chairman of the search committee for a Director of Missions in Lahontan. He is VP of NBC right now. He has served sacrificially on the Executive Committee. Those who have served with him can attest to his heart for Nevada Baptist. Mike is a man who seeks Christ. He has a consistent walk. He is well qualified to be the president of NBC.

Johnnie Nance, Spring Valley Baptist Church, Las Vegas, says that things are changing and he feels we need someone who understands Southern Baptists. I nominate Bill

Potts. He listed his schools. He has served as chairman of finance for the Southern Nevada Baptist Association. His church has started 5 mission churches. He came to a church that was dying and he brought new life to that church. He has mentored and brought life to several young pastors. He loves NBC and he understands NAMB. His wife serves as a trustee on that board. He has served as president of the pastor's conference. We have grown to the point that we are sending missionaries...not just receiving. I submit Bill Potts.

Sam Stanton, First Southern Baptist Church in Fallon. I nominate Ted Kern. I have been in Nevada for 12 years and one of the first people I met was Ted. He has served here for 24 years and has served a field of churches. For the last 15 years he has done this. He has the heart of Southern Baptists...constant faithful service. Reaching out to people. He has served on the Executive Board. He has served on the Missions Committee. He has been the moderator for Northeast Baptist Association and carried on the responsibilities while they were without a Director of Missions. He graduated in 1981 from Golden Gate Theological Seminary. He is a strong family man who loves the Lord, his family, and Nevada Baptists. He represents the best of what we hope to be. When he speaks he has something worth listening to.

Hoyt Savage gave instructions: Please remove ballot #1, write your choice on the ballot. Mike Farris, Bill Potts, or Ted Kern. Please pass it to the center and they will be picked up.

- 38. Church Planting video Hoyt Savage, Foothills Southern Baptist Church, Las Vegas. We are partnering with Utah/Idaho Convention and some churches in California.
- 39. Introduction of new pastors, former presidents & wives. Dr. Thane Barnes
- 40. **Presentation** Thane Barnes presented an appreciation plaque to Hoyt Savage. He has made a difference. He is an expert administrator. It has been a joy to work with him. Hoyt. "Every decision we make we have to consider how it plays in the small places in Nevada?"
- 41. **Presentation** Thane Barnes presented a plaque to William C. Webb. He has served for 42 years as pastor of 2<sup>nd</sup> Baptist Church. We are so grateful for you. William Webb, "I receive this on behalf of my wife and the fine people at 2<sup>nd</sup> BC. I never thought I'd be there that long. It was know as a church for firing pastors. Thank you all for your prayers."
- 42. **Élection results**: 105 messengers registered...78 voted. The new president is Ted Kern.
- 43. Floor is open for nominations for 1<sup>st</sup> VP. We will go ahead and do staff reports while you think about it.
  44. NBC Staff Reports:

James Vaughn, State Director of Missions. We talked about having 1,600 churches by 2020. Our mission statement .... The church planting vision for Nevada...By 2020 we see an army of 1,600 churches claiming 24% of Nevada's population worshiping and serving the most high God. Every healthy congregation in Nevada reproducing themselves every four years. If you subtract -25% attrition rate...in 2004, 180 congregations; 2008, 315; 2012, 515; 2016, 965; 2020, 1687. So far in 2006 we have started 20 new congregations. By January 2007 we should be at

279 churches. We are 57 behind schedule. But, as we have been building bridges and laying foundations not all churches are on board yet. This past Monday night we had a Partners in Church Planting Banquet. We have signed up fifteen Pastors and churches to be partners in church planting. We do not have enough money to fund all of these churches. The seminaries can't produce enough pastors. In 2007 we will identify and train thirty lay church planters equipping them to multiply. We will continue to multiply Flagship, Regional, Community, Neighborhood, House, and Multi-housing Churches. We will continue to plant churches in faith. Many of our churches have church planting strategies. Here are some tools: Prayer strategy; partners in church planting (PICP); Strategy planning for local churches; Acts 1:8 Global Strategy; Center for Missional Research. Think exponentially as we follow hard after God in obedience. God is the Key! We need to remember to multiply. Reproduce intentionally. Every church can participate in church planting at some level. The results are 1,600 churches. No way...but God can. We follow in obedience and go forward in faith. 78% of all who will come to Christ in the next few years will be lead to Christ by people who are not yet saved. If we stay like we are we will only reach 22% of our goal. Center for Missional Research - Jerry Chamness: We do research and we produce tools. On the website we have a fact file...culture across the US...lots of data on the website. People groups website helps you know how to reach people groups. Demographics reports...we can put in an address and get a study of that area...ages, income, population...it's free. The Missional Network went live Oct. 1. You can share information on that site.

Lorna Bius, Director of Women's Resources It is so humbling to be in a room of such greatness. I want to thank our missionaries who are with us. I am so thankful to be able to represent the love of Christ here. Dr. Fish said on a previous trip to Nevada, "This is not a post modern area, it is a pre Christian area." Lorna read 2 Timothy 3 the Bible speaks of godlessness in the last days. Verse 6, Speaking of godless people...they are the kind who worm their ways into homes. The temptation for us is that we could have women who indeed have a lot of knowledge about ministry, the Lord, the church, but yet walk around every day dealing with evil desires, becoming tainted. I'd love to see our women walk as spirit filled women. Spirit fill women ...not weak willed women. We are able to connect women to several resources through our partners...IMB, NAMB, WMU, LifeWay, etc. Resources start with enrichment. We need to reach the women coming to the church to be able to reach those outside the church with evangelism becoming the relational intentional lifestyle of all women. One of the ways we serve women is through conferences. We focus on Pastors' Wives...we want to encourage them. Pastors' email me and let me know your wives passions and ministry. We also emphasis our Hispanic Women's conference. Summer Missions camps...our future pastors are now in our church camps. Anything I can do for you let me know...nothing is too small or too big. Glenn Rogers, Director of Evangelism and Prayer: Chaplaincy, Disaster Relief, and Ministry Evangelism has

been added to my list. The Evangelism Conference will be

at Green Valley Baptist Church in January. Jesus is inter-

ested in Evangelism...when you are full of Jesus you will be interested in what He is interested in. Genesis 3 (Don't loose lostness) As you share with people deal thoroughly with people's lostness. When God approached the first lost people, Adam and Eve, the first thing he said is, "Where are you?" (location) People need to see themselves as lost. "Who told you you were naked?" (Lost people suffer from bad information) "Have you eaten of the tree....?" "What is this you have done?" (He presented the consequences.) When we present Christ was are talking about a "Saving Invasion". He comes into your heart to take over. Make sure lost people understand just how lost they are. Make sure they know Christ is not coming in to take residence...He's coming to be ruler.

46. Golden Gate Baptist Theological Seminary. Joe
Taylor, a trustee at Golden Gate Baptist Theological Seminary, introduced Dr. Jeff Iorg, President. It is a bright day
at GGBTS. South Reno Baptist Church has 6 students at
Golden Gate. Please welcome Dr. Iorg.

**Dr. Jeff Iorg:** GGBTS e-campus is fully accredited ... adding more and more courses each semester. 100% online courses. Transcript does not say online; it simply says accredited, transferable anywhere. CLD for pastors who are lacking education background.

47. Partnerships: Craig Culbreth: All partnerships are not successful. But this one is. Our partnership is first with God. A good partnership has a good plan. I believe we have that plan...evangelism, church planting, developing leaders. It is a journey of faith. It's important to us to understand that the partnership we have is about sharing the good news. It's a God size thing. He invited anyone who was interested to join them for their Brazil partnership. You have good people here on your state staff...good people who are committed to doing what God has called them to do. God has blessed this state with some of the most wonderful people to work with. The future looks bright. He introduced Bill Shepherd.

Bill Shepherd: If we are not about God's business then we aren't doing missions. I'm excited about what is happening in Nevada. It's my joy to visit with your pastors. It's not about what Florida can do for Nevada or what Nevada can do for Florida, it's about what God wants to do. When churches become prayer partners things start to happen. President Kennedy said, "Don't ask what your country can do for you, but ask what you can do for your country." Ask God, "What is it you would have me to do for you today." Anyway Florida can help you...get in contact with me through your association.

48. Offering for Silver State Missions. – Special Music 49. Message: Dr. Roy Fish - maintaining your spiritual passion. If we look at middle age men and women... there is so often no spiritual fire. It usually comes when one has found their nitch. It comes in perceptively as spiritual lethargy sets in. Oh, to keep the burning bright to the end. (1) 2 Tim 1:6 (NKJ) "Therefore, I remind you to stir up the gift of God which is in you through the laying of my hands." Keep alive the gift, fan the flame of that special grace, stir into flame the fire of the divine gift. Keep the fire burning within your heart. How do you maintain it? Passion—deep feeling. Men and women on fire for Jesus Christ. How do we keep it on fire? (By taking in the Word

of the Lord.) Jeremiah 15 "Lord your words were found and I ate them...the joy and rejoicing of my heart' Jeremiah 20:7 "Oh Lord, you induced me and I was persuaded you are stronger than I ....every one mocks me...I will not make mention of him or speak anymore in his name, but his word was in my heart like a burning fire...I couldn't hold the word back..." Jeremiah was put in the stocks and ridiculed...he told God, every time I preach they become violent. I'm not preaching anymore. But because he had taken in the Word of God he had to preach... he had to go on...he couldn't stop. People quit when crisis comes...people quit and go back to selling insurance, teaching school...the drop out rate has been alarming high. Be sure you have taken in the Word of the Lord. (2) Keep up your walk with the Lord. Luke 24:30-32 "It came to pass as Jesus set at the table with them ....their eyes were opened and they knew him...and He vanished from their sights...didn't our hearts burn while we talked with Him." The light is a walk with Him. Keep up your fellowship...your walk with Jesus. Spill your guts to Jesus...you won't shock Him. (3) Take in the word of the Lord, keep up you walk, major on your witness to the Lord. Romans 1:15 "For as much as is in me I am ready to preach the gospel." This comes from two words in the original Greek. It could be translated, I have a burning in me that makes me want to tell others about Jesus. On the days that I would find myself on bottom, I would take some prospect cards and knock on doors and try to win someone to Christ. I'd come back so excited. If you are not letting his life flow through you instead of just in you then you have a case of spiritual cramps. Take his word in consistently, keep up your walk, share His word with others.

- 54. Report: NAMB (Video) Presentation of a plaque to NBC for leading the way in church planting. Dr. Roy Fish...We live in the only continent where the church is not growing. Three out of every four people do not have the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. Every week there are 25 churches that are closed in the US. We live in a country that is loosing ground as far as the spreading of the faith is concerned. There is not one single county in the US that has a larger % of Christians today than it had ten years ago. I have a daughter who serves IMB in Thailand. We're reaching the point where the mission field is coming to us. Eleven million citizens of the US were born in Mexico, eight million from other countries, one and a half million born in the Philippines. We have over 300 students from Korea at the seminary I teach at. Culture reinvents itself every five years. The founding fathers founded this nation

on a Christian ethic. We have gotten away from what our founding fathers wrote into legal documents. 67% of freshmen entering college do not believe in moral absolutes. There has been little change since the 50s in baptisms (except for five years in the 70s) We have not labored in evangelism in this country for 30 years. 1904, 1950, and the Jesus revolution of the 1970s were larger. What are we doing at NAMB to meet the challenge? I have been amazed at the number of facets of ministry there are at NAMB. So many things are going on. Annie Armstrong Offering \$56 million + set a record this year. NAMB thrust - Evangelism, starting churches, getting missionaries out on the field. Half of them are Mission Service Corp (MSC)...raising their own salary. We have 2,500 NAMB endorsed chaplains. We served over five million meals with domestic hunger funds. Through the feeing we have seen over 32,000 people come to Christ. As a new comer I am having trouble keeping up with it. Our sea farers ministry. It sees to it that people coming from other countries get Bibles when they dock in Jacksonville. We realize that we need to teach the message in a different context to reach the people of the 21st century. NAMB is an anchored group. We are anchored to Jesus Christ and an infallible Bible...unchangeable aspects of our ministry. We are geared to the times as well and aware that relevance needs to be shown in this culture.

55. Message - Dr. Roy Fish: For God to use us we have to adhere to certain priorities. Luke 10... "Lord, don't you care that my sister has left me here to serve alone... Martha, Martha you are worried and troubled about many things, but Mary has chosen that good part that can not be taken away from her." Lets look at the players. Martha: She welcomed Jesus into her home, but after he was there she had no time for him...no opportunity take to fellowship, listen or talk to him. Martha was not afraid of work... clean house, flowers, loved to cook, but she had a problem with priorities. Remember only once in history did God invade human history. Martha was busy basting the roast instead of spending time with Jesus. Jesus said, "Martha you are encumbered (distracted) with many things." Martha's motives were as pure as could be. Her priorities were out of order. This leads to frustration and finally anger. "Lord, why don't you ask Mary to help." "Martha, you have an inter kind of turbulence." "Lord, don't you care that she's left me to do all of the serving?" Mary: Mary was sitting at Jesus feet and listening to His word. Mary is in the place of receiving humble instruction from Jesus. Another time Mary fell at his feet when Lazarus died. And there was the time she poured the expensive perfume on his feet. Mary learned more about Jesus dying than the 12 disciples in the three years Jesus tried to teach them. Mary understood that Jesus was going to lay down his life. One point: Jesus is the appraiser of the situation. He has been watching Martha and Mary. "Martha, you are troubled and worried.... but one thing is needed and Mary has chosen that good part and it won't be taken away from her." We have the age long battle between flesh and spirit. The good part...fellowship with Jesus.

56. Change in the agenda. Report: SBC - Jack Wilkersen needs to catch a plane. Ken Frizzell is Nevada's representative. There are 82 on the SBC Executive Board. We act on behalf of the convention on all matters not as-

signed to other entities. Administrative responsibilities and program responsibilities. Cooperative program (CP) promotion, Baptist Press, convention relations, disbursement of monies. What makes SBC so different? No only do we have conservative theology, but we have cooperative methodology. The year that closed on September 30 for the first time in history Southern Baptists gave 200.6 million dollars through CP. 6.1% increase in missions giving. In CP giving you giving increased 6.1% in CP giving. In Nevada's mission 18.1% increase in mission giving. Here's the challenge...the percentage of giving from the individual churches has decreased from 10% to 6%. We publish SBC Life to help you. The current issue has a CD included that explains the CP. Thank you, Nevada.

- 57. **Miscellaneous Business** Hoyt Savage: No miscellaneous business can be brought. Nominations for 1st VP: Johnny Nantz nominated Bill Potts for 1st VP Mike Farnham nominated Frank Bushey for 1st VP Ballots were collected.
- 58. Budget Vote: Hoyt Savage: See page 30 in the Book of Reports. Hoyt reviewed the CP part of the proposed budget. I challenge you to change this...sacrifice more at home to make more available worldwide. You can not out give God. He'll see your heart and bless it. I put a motion to you that we adopt this budget. All in favor please stand. Unanimous.
- 59. Report: LifeWay Tom Hellams. He presented new Bibles to Thane and Susan Barnes and Hoyt and Donna Savage. One of our LifeWay trustees in Nevada is Tony Forehand. We have a renewed emphasis on Biblical depth. (1) We have begun to go deeper as we provide resources. (2) We strive to be relevant for different cultures, age groups, etc. (3) Emphasis on LifeWay of being a ministry over business. We receive no CP funds. We contribute to CP. We earn money from sales of materials, retreats... Rick Warren has produced an Invitation CD...he goes through the plan of salvation. The CD is selling it for \$1. (4) Renewed interest in evangelism at LifeWay. We plan a new launch of FAITH. LifeWay Research.
- 60. **Voting Results**: Frank Bushey is 1<sup>st</sup> VP Frank Bushey nominates Bill Potts as 2<sup>nd</sup> VP. Joe Taylor called for nominations to be halted. There was a verbal vote. All approved.

63. Message - Dr. Jerry Rankin, IMB President Colossians 1:6 All over the world the gospel is multiplying and bearing fruit. He shared an experience from a mission trip where he went to such a remote area he felt he had gone to "the ends of the earth" and there were 3,000 people there shouting Jesus is Lord." Ephesians: "One day every knee will bow every tongue will confess..." We have 5,100 missionaries impacting 184 countries. In our wildest dreams we never thought there would be personnel in China...now we have as many as 30,000 a day coming to Christ in China. Doors opened to the Soviet Union that we thought would never happen. We recognized that the Muslim world was the only place left. Our missionaries there are now saying that the people there are showing doubts in their religion and looking for answers. He shared of missionaries who refused to come home just because their lives were in danger because God had called them there.

In a mere 70 years of Soviet domination Muslim religion was eliminated from the area. Now it was ready to receive the good news of Jesus. God was moving in province and power to fulfill his purpose. As we've moved into the 21st century we are seeing God move in a mighty way. Last year 17,000 new churches were started around the world. This year 23,000 started. Matthew 24:14... "the gospel of the kingdom will be preached to the whole world....and then the end will come." It's not for us to know the time....we are to go. These missionaries we are sending out could very well be the last ones we send out. They could reach the last unreached people group. Jesus will return when all have heard. We need a vision to reach the nations if we are going to complete the task. If we don't do it, who will. We are called here to reach Nevada...but we still need to reach the nations. It's a balance. It's not an either or. God has blessed us to be a blessing to the nations. It's not I, but Christ. We need to acknowledge our weakness and inadequacy. We must have a vision and we must offer what we have to God. He told of a report that has every people group listed and tells how many missionaries, believers, Bibles, etc. are in each people group. It has marked which ones have no believers or people working in that area. Every people group will be represented around the throne of God. Are we going to be faithful to go?

### STAFF REPORTS

### STATE MISSIONS James Vaughn, Director

In 2006 we are continuing to plant churches as a result of the implementation of State and Associational Church Planting Strategies. Here is a brief history of church planting for the past few years:

2006	-	16 as of September 24th

This is a total of 63 new churches as reported by our associations in the past four years. The Nevada Baptist Convention received a certificate of appreciation and honor from the North American Mission Board in August of 2006. It was for our "commitment to expanding the kingdom of God, demonstrated by a cumulative church planting index of 113% for the years 1999 to 2005; second in NAMB Region IV for the ratio of new church starts to existing churches."

Although these numbers may be impressive to some for a state our size, it will not result in accomplishing our vision of seeing 1600 churches by 2020. We are presently working on a separate strategy for a Church Planting Movement that will result in a multiplication process. It is always exciting to see God move in ways that are impossible for man.

Bob Johnson is our Native American Consultant and in 2007 will be serving three-quarter time. He will be full time in 2008. (Please read his report.)

In 2006 we enlisted J. and Nicky Ballard to be our State Mission Service Corp Coordinators. We look forward to an expansion of volunteers in our state. Please contact them through the Nevada Baptist Convention if you are interested in service as a Mission Service Corp Missionary. Training is available.

Northeast Baptist Association has called Paul Harwood to be their Director of Missions. His first day is October 24, 2006. We welcome Paul and his wife Jerry to Nevada. Please pray for them as they begin serving in this position. Lahontan Baptist Association is in the search process. Please pray for them as they seek God's face in calling a Director of Missions.

International Missions trips are growing in Nevada. We have seen 40-50 individuals participate in an international trip during the past year. I am convinced that this will help us to penetrate lostness more effectively in Nevada. We praise God that He is using Nevada to make an impact around the world.

Our state to state partnership with Florida continues to be a blessing. Our partnership has been extended through 2010. In 2007 we will continue with ten Florida/Nevada events across our state. In 2008 we will focus on Sierra Baptist Association but will still have state wide events. In 2009-2010 will focus on Southern Nevada and rural Nevada using 2008 as a basic model.

Our Global Impact Missions Conference in May had around 200 participants at Hope Baptist Church in Las Vegas. God showed up in a big way and made an impact on Nevada. It was a very encouraging time as we heard from God through the speakers, breakout conference leaders, as well as our praise time.

We are in the process of receiving our 2006 Silver State Mission Offering. In 2005 we received our second highest amount ever (even in the midst of disaster relief giving for Katrina victims). Our goal was \$40,000 and we took in \$37,399.89. Be obedient to God as He directs your giving to the 2006 State Mission Offering for the purpose of:

### CHURCH DEVELOPMENT Dr. Terry Arnold, Director

#### LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

Leadership development is perhaps the most publicized of the three task areas of the Nevada Baptist Convention's Church Development Resources, because it is the foundation of all NBC endeavors to do to assist Nevada Baptist churches fulfill the Great Commission and plant new congregations.

I am pleased that the NBC Executive Board has called Eddie Hancock to be the Director of Leadership Development. He will have primary responsibility in the area of leadership development. I will assist him by providing leadership training opportunities that relate directly to church health and religious education endeavors sponsored by the Nevada Baptist Convention.

I am certified to lead all the Next Level Leadership Workshops.

They are: Leadership Greatness, The Coaching Leader, Forged by Fire, Mastering the Mystery of Visionary Leadership, The Servant Principle, Building Powerful Ministry Teams, Mastering the Art of Communication, Transforming Conflict: From Strife to Synergy, High Performance Meetings, Powerful Decision Making, Developing and Managing People, and Personal DISCernment.

I have taken *Personal DISCerment* and developed a second level of DISC based conferencing. It is *TeamDISC*. It takes the *Personal DISCernment* material to a new group level. Certification as a workshop leader in these offerings has allowed Nevada Baptist Convention to schedule Next Level Leadership offerings around the state.

Eddie Hancock will be the primary facilitator in the future and I will be his backup. Eddie Hancock and I attended the *Emerging Regions Leadership Think-Tank*, February 2-3, 2006 in Phoenix, Arizona. This roundtable meeting is invaluable to Nevada Baptists because it allows us to network with our peers about what is taking place in pioneer states in the area of leadership development.

Eddie Hancock and I invited the *Think-Tank* to meet in Nevada in February of 2007. It will be a major network meeting on our calendars next year.

We continue to work towards taking leadership training on-line as part of the E-quip.net ministry started by the Canadian Baptist Convention. We project this ministry will be on-line before January 2007. It will allow Nevada Baptists to receive workshop training in almost any area of ministry on-line, at their convenience, and without cost.

I continue to be a Life Way Christian Resources nationally certified facilitator for their Executive Leadership (Personal and Professional Growth) Seminar.

We held a Deacon, Elder, Pastor and Wives Steak Dinner at First Baptist Church of Carson City, April 1, 2006 with 76 attendees. Spike Hogan, Lead Pastor at Chets Creek Church, Jacksonville, Florida was our speaker. Chets Creek Church is the fastest growing Southern Baptist Church in the Florida Baptist Convention.

I am thankful to God for the opportunity to serve you in

this leadership capacity. Please contact me when I can be of assistance.

#### **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION**

Religious education is one of the three primary tasks of the Nevada Baptist Convention's Church Development Resources. It includes what LifeWay Christian Resources is currently referring to as open groups and groups in LifeWay Ministry and Practices (MAP).

Sunday School is the primary expression of open group Bible study in Nevada Baptist churches. NBC Church Development Resources provides a variety of training opportunities for congregational Bible study leaders.

The August Las Vegas LeaderTrain trained 240 Bible study leaders in 10 core and numerous elective workshops. Fifty people were trained in Reno and Hawthorne on September 16 and 23 respectfully at Sunday School Age Level Training. We are looking forward to the same training in Elko and Winnemucca November 3 and 4, 2006.

I attended the National State Sunday School Directors Association meeting in Boston, Massachusetts in May. The meeting helped with strategy development for starting new open groups Bible study units. I was elected Western Regional Vice-President of the Association for 2006 through 2008.

I participated in a number of informal Bible study consultations throughout the year. Please call the NBC office when you have a need in this area. We will be honored to serve you.

A vital part of providing Bible study leader training is to equip Associational Consultants Teams (ACTeams) to do quality Bible study training in all four of your associations. Our ACTeams do the highest quality Bible Study leader training in their respective associations. They have recruited quality teams who serve without pay or recognition to make a real difference in the quality of Bible study programs all across Nevada.

Twelve Nevada ACTeam members attended *TeamWest IX* in Denver Colorado, March 2-4, 2006. Participants from the state Baptist conventions of Montana, Wyoming, Colorado, New Mexico, Arizona, Utah-Idaho, Alaska and Nevada participated in worker training that equipped the TeamWest participants to do consultation work in local churches. I had the privilege of teaching the *Pastor-Leader Workshop* for LifeWay Christian Resources at the Denver meeting.

We had the opportunity to have a LifeWay consultant come to

Fallon, August 24 and Las Vegas, August 26 to teach LifeWay Sunday School growth principles to our Hispanic leadership.

On a personal note, I continue to teach a couples, fifty and above Sunday School class, at South Reno Baptist Church. It is a joyful ministry. My class is organized so that when I am away on NBC business or supply preaching, the class continues on without a skipped beat.

We have some of the best teachers to be found anywhere in Nevada. We have developed a class organization S.T.O.M.P. The "S" is for our Social Team that handles Sunday morning hospitality and regularly scheduled fellowship activities.

The "T" is for the Teaching Team of five teachers who share the teaching responsibilities. The "O" is for Outreach which includes maintaining our prospect file and spearheading visitation outreach. The "M" is for ministry to class members and others who are not members of our class. The "P" is for Mission Projects both local and global.

Vacation Bible School continues as Southern Baptist's number one evangelistic tool to reach children and their families with the Good News of Jesus Christ.

I took twenty-four Nevada Baptists to the 2006 Life-Way Vacation Bible School Institute at Glorieta, New Mexico. These people came home and led our four association's VBS Clinics to do the Arctic Edge VBS curriculum.

I attended the Nevada Baptist Convention Evangelism Conference in Reno January 23-24, 2006 and made a VBS evangelistic presentation. Lorna Bius, our NBC Women's Ministries Director is assuming responsibilities for VBS coordination for 2006-07. I will continue to assist in VBS, targeting pastors and church staff members with special attention and training.

Discipleship activities are crucial for a church to train their people in Christian growth.

Discipleship includes Marriage and Family, Senior Adult, Single Adult, and Men's Ministries. Mitch Bryant served as a volunteer discipleship and family ministries consultant until his retirement this past summer. He did an excellent job and will be greatly missed.

However, I continue to be available to consult with your congregation and provide training on a request basis. I have enjoyed opportunities to participate with churches and associations as a speaker at senior adult luncheons, men's retreats, and discipleship emphasis rallies.

Lyn Estep serves as Administrative Assistant in Church Development Resources. She is a joy to work with. We count it a privilege to serve Nevada Baptists in the vital area of Religious Education. If your church has needs in the area of Religious Education, please call us at your earliest convenience.

#### CHURCH HEALTH REPORT

Church health and development is one of the three primary tasks of Nevada Baptist Convention's Church Development Resources.

This includes administering the business of a congregation, preaching and worship, pastoral ministries, healthy church issues, and congregational long range planning. Church Architecture falls under the category administering the business of a congregation.

Building and architecture requests are handled on an individual basis in cooperation with the church architecture department at LifeWay Christian Resources. I have a very helpful DVD produced by Church Communication Network entitled *Church Facilities Development: Nightmare or Dream*, which every congregation planning to build should review. Please contact me when your church has building and property needs,

Jim Griffitts continues to serve as the NBC Volunteer Music Consultant. He did a number of consultations around the state this past year. He accompanied a LifeWay Christian Resources consultant on a *Small Church Music and Worship Workshop* tour in 2006. He also led a large group of Nevada Baptists to LifeWay Christian Resources *Music Week* at Glorieta Conference Center this past summer.

I am grateful Jim is our State Music Consultant. He does an excellent job for Nevada Baptists. Please call him when you have need of his services.

I had the privilege of serving First Baptist Church of Carson City as Transitional Pastor until May 1, 2006. It was an excellent learning experience for me, allowing me to put into practice the *LifeWay Transitional Pastor Training* I received a couple of years ago.

It was good for me to "be back in the trenches" for awhile. Pastoral Ministry is not the same as it was when I left the local pastoral role to serve on the NBC staff eighteen years ago. I have a renewed sensitivity and empathy for those in a pastoral roll, especially bi-vocational pastors.

South Reno Baptist Church has invited NBC Church Development Resources to utilize their Church Communication Network subscription to provide members with church health and leadership development video seminars. We will work with South Reno Baptist Church to publicize dates and times for these seminars so that any interested Nevada Baptist may participate.

I am pleased that Dr. Tommy Starkes serves the Southern Nevada Baptist Association in the area of Church and Leader Development.

His competency, joy, and enthusiasm are tonic for the soul.

Spike Hogan, Lead Pastor of Chets Creek Church in Jacksonville, Florida, toured the state of Nevada with me and taught a wonderful church health/growth seminar in four locations around our state.

This was one of the most beneficial seminars concerning church health that we have ever had. We are currently negotiating with the Chets Creek Church to bring a team of church health/growth people to Nevada sometime in the near future.

In November, 2004 I attended the Church Central Church Consultant Training in Los Angeles. The training gave me a good introduction to organizing and systematizing various facets of church consultation activities and packaged the process in a manner helpful to Nevada Baptist churches.

It was at this training that I learned of the pioneering work that the Healthy Church Group of California Southern Baptist Convention was doing in church consultation.

In August 2005, NBC Church Development Resources and the Healthy Church Group of the California Southern Baptist Convention entered into a strategic alliance. The Healthy Church Group agreed to assist us to become proficient in congregational consultation.

Tom Belew of the Healthy Church Group partnered with me to do a full consultation in a Nevada Church. The final report was presented to the Nevada congregation in November 2005.

The consultation report contained demographic geocoding, congregational statistics, church surveys, interviews, and observations. The report identifies critical areas of need and recommended solutions to address these needs. Since then, I have contracted with eight additional Nevada Baptist congregations to work through the previously described consultation process. Five of these churches are ready to receive their final consultation report and recommendations, as soon as their information is put in a published format and a meeting date calendared.

One congregation is approximately midway through the consultation process and two others are in the initial stage of data collection and surveys. Four to six consultations per year seem to be the maximum number of consultations that can be effectively and efficiently executed by the Church Development Resources staff.

Long range planning is an essential ingredient for a church to reach its full growth potential. For a number of years, Church Development Resources has used *Celebrate Your Church!* as its long range planning tool.

A few Nevada Baptist congregations have used the process primarily to strengthen their Bible teaching and discipling programs. This process continues to be available. Please contact me if your congregation is interested.

Recognizing the tremendous need in the long range planning area, Church Development Resources is pleased to announce the availability of Strategic Planning: a Process Designed to Assist Nevada Baptist Congregations to Fulfill the Great Commission. This initiative is based on Aubrey Malphurs' book entitled Advanced Strategic Planning: A New Model for Churches and Ministry.

It is a consultant led commitment for a congregational team of pastors, staff, and key lay leaders, who volunteer one Friday night and Saturday morning a month for six months and work through a process of defining core values, crafting a mission statement, and developing a comprehensive vision.

They will develop strategies in the five areas: 1) discovering ministry community, 2) making mature disciples, 3) building a dream team, 4) determining the best ministry setting, and 5) raising the necessary finances. Church Development Resources is currently ready to enter into a *Stra*-

tegic Planning Consultation Covenant with four Nevada Baptist congregations for 2007.

During the process of consulting with numerous Nevada Baptist congregations and preparing to engage in strategic planning, it has come to our attention of the tremendous need for helping congregations deal redemptively with conflict.

Through our TeamWest partnership, we were introduced to PeaceMaker Ministries. They have helped us gain proficiency in assisting churches experiencing substantive conflict.

I have successfully completed four levels of Peace-Maker Training: 1) personal peacemaking, 2) peacemaker church, 3) conflict coaching, and 4) mediation. The training has been put to immediate use in a number of situations in Nevada Baptist churches. PeaceMaker Ministries has asked me to participate in their highest level, by invitation only, Consultant Level Certification process in 2007.

Church Development Resources will be offering conflict resolution, conferencing and consultation opportunities to Nevada congregations in the future.

One of the most personally satisfying ministries is to work with pastoral staff and their families, especially in emergency and stress situations. I am truly humbled by the opportunity to come alongside God's servants in these times. There seems to be an increasing number of these situations each year. I had a wonderful opportunity to participate with the nationwide organization of Baptist Church Minister Relations people. In fact, I am their President Elect for 2006-07 and will serve as president for the 2007-08 year.

I am frequently honored by opportunities to be pulpit supply in Nevada churches. I also had an opportunity to preach a revival meeting at Spring Creek Baptist Church this past year.

These engagements provide me with wonderful opportunities to thank you for allowing me to serve you as part of the Nevada Baptist Convention staff. Please call me when I can serve you and your congregation.

### LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT Eddie Hancock, Director

This year the Nevada Baptist Convention embarked on a journey to develop leaders for the 1400 churches that will be planted in the next 13 years. Leadership Development is no longer the responsibility of the Office of Church Development. It is now a complementary emphasis bridging Church Development and Missions Resources focused on developing leaders who will help churches penetrate the lostness in our state.

This is an immense undertaking requiring the development of many leaders through Nevada churches. Vocational leaders will develop leadership efficiencies as they apply principles for team and leadership greatness and volunteer leaders will learn to take the Gospel into their personal spheres of influence. The goal of the office of leadership development is to facilitate growth in both areas.

#### Leadership Development

The North American Mission Board (NAMB) in concert with Triaxia Partners has developed a series of workshops designed to help ministry teams become more effective as they conduct the tasks assigned them by their local congregations. The tools can be surveyed at <a href="https://www.nextlevelleadership.com">www.nextlevelleadership.com</a>. I have acquired certification in Building Powerful Ministry Teams, High Performance Team Meetings, Mastering the Art of Team Communication, and Developing and Managing People. I will become certified in Turning Strife into Synergy and Powerful Team Decision Making in October of this year.

NAMB has also developed workshops focused on the personal development of the leader. These are: *Leadership Greatness* and *The Servant Principle*. I will complete the certification process for these leadership development resources in 2007.

Our goal is to develop a team of up to 10 facilitators to provide this equipping to churches.

It is apparent there are many resources focused on the development of leaders. I will continue to discover, review and, ultimately, make available materials which will help us accomplish our convention goal of 1600 churches by 2020.

NAMB has also developed tools to help church planters. These resources include Basic Training for Church Planters, Mentoring, Assessment and Supervision workshops. 2007 will be the year for equipping in those areas including gaining necessary certifications.

#### Lay Involvement in Church Planting

A vigorous discussion is underway around the country about ways to extend the Kingdom of God in North Amer-

ica. In one form or another, involving the people of God at a different level is always a priority. As mentioned above, many rightfully desire that we grow more effective at developing and encouraging the leaders in our churches to make an impact through local church ministries. Others desire leaders to move through our local congregations to begin new works in communities, homes, and workplaces. One such strategy is churches meeting in homes. Our dream is to see these churches saturating our ministry fields. This will require the multiplication of volunteer leaders who will shepherd these congregations. I have entered into discussions at NAMB and key leaders in Nevada in order to discover and implement effective equipping mechanisms for these leaders.

#### **Student Missions**

This year Nevada hosted four student summer missionaries. They served in northern and southern Nevada helping churches with Vacation Bible School, house to house evangelism, backyard Bible clubs and youth ministries. They expressed gratitude to Nevada Baptist churches that hosted them graciously and helped them sow seeds of the Gospel into the lives of children and youth. Steve Timmons and Ryan Redwine are the point men for this aspect of student ministries. It has been a pleasure working with them to send laborers into Nevada's field. This year has been one of learning the student placement processes including orientation, supervision and evaluation. I have consulted with NAMB staff in order to help this team build on past successes.

#### Resume Management and Church Planter Recruitment

This has been a year of investigation and discovery. I am investigating church planter recruitment processes through SBC seminaries. I am also discovering other friends and partners eager to help us staff church plants in Nevada through various networks and our resume processes. We have standardized the resume process in the NBC office in order to provide expeditious access to candidates expressing interest in serving in Nevada. It is a joy to learn that Southern Baptists around the country are willing to get involved in some way to see workers placed in significant ministries.

It has been a joy serving this year. I thank you for this wonderful opportunity! Please pray for the leaders in our churches who will continuously become better at what they do for God's glory. Please pray that we can recognize at least 30 volunteer leaders who will be willing to start a church in their sphere of influence in 2008.

### **EVANGELISM & PRAYER Glenn Rogers, Director**

"Sharing the Gospel message of Jesus Christ in an effort to win people to faith in Christ while asking Jesus to send laborers into His harvest."

So far we have not been able to "Double Baptisms", however, many churches have reported an increase in baptism. Yet this blessing seems to move from church to church or area to area. Efforts are continuing in training people towards evangelism and emphasizing baptism.

The Y.E.S. - You Equipped to Share evangelism training continues to be used by many churches. In the last two years almost 400 people have been trained with this simple plan. Churches also continue to use Sharing Jesus Without Fear, and the One Day and One Hour Soul Winning Workshops provided by our Southern Baptist North American Mission Board.

Our ministry here is still about equipping churches to obey the Great Commission of our Lord Jesus Christ. (Matthew 28:18-20)

The February Evangelism Tour across the state with our partners in Florida proved, again, to be a significant time. Mark Johnson met with us in Las Vegas, and Jeff Hessinger traveled towards the northern part of the state meeting with pastors, exhorting them, and training them in evangelism.

Our State Evangelism Conference in January was another blessed event as Junior Hill, James Merritt, Fred Wolfe, Bob Pearle, and Chris Norris ministered God's Word to our hearts.

Brent Crowe (from Orlando, Florida) and Travis Walker (Pastor of Smith Valley Baptist Church) led us in the Youth Evangelism Conference held at Calvary Baptist Church in Elko. This event ended up being more like a retreat and God gave us a very meaningful time together. The EvangeCube was used to train over a hundred young people in personal Evangelism.

#### Prayer:

We continue to get good reports across the state of churches strengthening their prayer ministries and we do all we can here to preach, teach, and provide materials and inspiration towards this strengthening. Our partners in Florida are helping us tremendously for the late September conference on having powerful corporate prayer ministries in churches.

We still need revival in our churches and spiritual awakening in our nation. Please join us in asking God for these blessings.

### WOMEN'S RESOURCES Lorna Bius, Director

It has been a great joy for Women's Resources (WR) to partner with associations, churches and their leaders in the past years to strengthen missions and ministry in local settings. Connecting the needs of our state to the resources within our convention and within the Southern Baptist Convention has yielded Kingdom harvests in many ways.

Along with what we have received from such partnerships, Nevada was recognized for its giving by the International Mission Board. The collective offering of Nevada churches totaled over \$145,000 to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering (LMCO) which made the Silver State fifth in the nation for increased giving to the LMCO during the 2004/2005 period.

The desire of Women's Resources is to help churches offer healthy ministries to women thereby equipping them to strengthen the church family they are apart of, to engage the community they live in and to reach the world they are called to.

As noted by the graph, our national Southern Baptist entities enable us to resource Nevada in the areas of enrichment, evangelism and missions. By working with church and associational leadership, we are able to connect the resources each ministry provides to the unique needs of local churches.

Resourcing, training, consultations and conferences have all been important factors in successes we have seen throughout the state.

Our Lending Library continues to grow which allows us to send more materials such as video/DVD Bible studies and books to groups for free use.

The Women's Resources page on the Nevada Baptist Convention website continues to be expanded to offer online resources.

Together with associational leaders and our Women's Resource Executive Board (WREB) training in specific areas of ministry has been offered throughout the state.

Work is presently being done to strengthen associational teams who can be a greater resource to area churches. Women's Resources ministries are carried out through the participation and leadership of women in every church of our convention. Our desire is to resource churches and associations in the vision God has given to each.

As I have traveled around the state, it has been tremendous to see God's work in His church. We are a vast and varied convention.

It is my continuing joy to serve as a connecting point in Kingdom provisions for Nevada and Kingdom people in Nevada. Please let me know how I can assist you in whatever setting God has placed you.

### **NATIVE AMERICAN MINISTRIES Bob Johnson, Consultant**

Native American Ministries is a new function of the Nevada Baptist Convention which begun in September of 2005

My responsibilities include developing a strategic plan for reaching the Native American people of Nevada, to help strengthen existing Native American ministries, and to assist churches and Association in the planting of new ministries.

Our Vision is as follows "We see the day when Native American disciples share Christ with their own people resulting in a culturally relevant expression of the Christian faith. We also see the day when the Christian faith permeates the Native American cultures of Nevada having a positive impact upon the peoples lives while celebrating the uniqueness of their cultures." And our Mission is "... to catalyze the planting and development of indigenous, lay led Native American churches throughout the State of Nevada that are self reproducing..."

For the last four months of 2005 one-fourth of my time was allocated to this function and for 2006 one-half of my time has been spent in this area.

During this past year demographic information has been collected on the Native American population of Nevada. I have also visited with a representative from each of the Associations and the existing Native American churches. In addition, I have had the opportunity to make windshield surveys of a number of the reservations and colonies.

The State contains fifteen reservations and twelve colonies under the jurisdiction of eighteen separate tribal governments. According to the 2000 Census these areas contained 10,217 individuals and the population has been growing. In addition, almost 30,000 Native Americans live in Clark and Washoe Counties, most in an urban environment.

Currently, there are only three Southern Baptist ministries to these people; Owyhee Baptist Church on Duck Valley Reservation in the Northeast Association, Walker River Baptist Church and Yomba Baptist Church on their respective reservations in the Lahontan Association.

A draft strategic plan for reaching these people with the Gospel of Jesus Christ is under development. The Associations, NBC staff, and NAMB staff will be given the opportunity to comment before the final version is published.

I have also established a nationwide prayer network to pray for Native American Ministries in Nevada. If you would like to be a part of that prayer network please let me know.

### SIERRA BAPTIST ASSOCIATION Dr. Eddie Miller, Director of Missions

The year has been busy and somewhat effective in some areas and extremely successful in others.

From the fall of last year we continue to see planting churches through everything from Bible studies to full blown church plants. This has been a year of significant challenges to church planting with funding shortages and difficult locations. Translation...everything is normal. We continue to pray that God will open a door of support through partnerships and the work of other systems beyond the normal channels available. Stace Cupples and James Collins work to plant and assist in planting churches among all people groups here in our area.

The most successful event in the history of Sierra Baptist Association in terms of attendance was our On Mission Celebration in early February. Over 2700 people were face to face with real live missionaries in the five day event that included a mission's fair, church service all over the association, special events for pastors and pastors' wives and rallies over the association of churches. Paula Colquitt led in organizing this event and proved invaluable in promoting this powerful event.

Melanie Lawler continues to lead out through training and equipping churches to do everything from ministry evangelism events to ministries like English as Second Language in our churches. Our churches are really becoming active in these kinds of ministries but so much remains to be done so that all may hear the Good News.

Student ministry at this time focuses on the work at the University of Nevada, Reno. Ryan and Stacy Redwine have seen significant success and considerable challenges in this first full school year of work and the work today is still very much in the infant stages. We need the support of all Southern Baptist churches in Nevada to encourage their students coming to UNR to get involved in this ministry. The student population continues to grow while the ministries on the campus are relatively static. The lostness of the campus is even more significant than the lostness of our community in general. Ryan is doing a great job of encountering lost

students with the Gospel through special efforts on campus weekly. Pray for him as he works in this very difficult field and send him your students. He can be contacted at ryan@sierrabaptists.com.

The Northern Nevada Theological Center is the most significant Leader Development thing that has happened here this year. This is a training school directly connected to the Golden Gate Baptist Theological Seminary and we believe that we will graduate our first student this December through transferring credits obtained through the Seminary Extension in Nashville, Tennessee. Seminary Extension continues to have an impact in the southern end of the association. Sierra Super Train was held this spring and touched over 100 participants in everything from legal issues to age level work, to basic stewardship.

The association is the churches and our churches continue to be faithful in their mission to change the world. Our first major overseas medical mission happened this year. Our churches are partnering with churches inside and outside the association in more ways every year. Churches and pastors are celebrating years of ministry together and continue to make a difference. However, all our churches need revival. We operate in one of the most hostile locations in the U.S. and we are some of the few who continue to try to reach out in these communities.

For the future the state partnership with Florida Baptist Convention plans to be focused on SBA in 2008. This means that next year we will be working to connect the churches of SBA to partners in Florida. The call to prayer for SBA cannot be over emphasized. Thanks for your prayers and support over this last year. We stand ready to assist any church in NBC in any way we can because we are family.

In January, 2006, we purchased the building at 1490 E. University Avenue to be used as a church planting incuba-

tor. An incubator is a place for new congregations to get a start, then move on when they are established enough to be on their own. It was the former First Spanish Baptist Church. Our goal is to have at least three congregations using this building on a weekly basis. Currently we have one church meeting there. Additionally, the Women's Resource Center (a crisis pregnancy ministry) is occupying about ½ of the building. Since the First Spanish Baptist is on longer using the 1482 building on Sundays, we are able to use it for church planting. Currently, we have two congregations in this building our goal is to have three congregations in this building as well.

This has been the busiest year ever for training, too many events to count. We try to offer something for every-body. People pick and choose from the over 100 training events offered each year. It makes me tired just to look at the calendar. Then I realize, no one does it all, but each event ministers to the needs of some our churches. If we are missing something let us know, we aim to please.

Church planting continues to be a major thrust of our Association. At least two vision tours were held for groups of pastors from the South considering planting churches in Southern Nevada. Ten new congregations were formed. We are penetrating the darkness as evidenced by the ratio of churches to population.
