Dear Mrs. Blount:

Dr. Howard has turned over to me for answer your letter of October 24th, with reference to feeding a hungry child for \$3.00 per month.

We have had several inquiries about this. The information did not go out from our office, and I do not know just where it originated. We do not have here in our office any lists of children, though we do have names of Baptist families, many of whom have children, which we give to those who wish to send food packages, clothes or CARE packages. The most inexpensive way of sending food to Europe is through the CARE packages. I am inclosing a circular which will show you the various kinds of packages you can purchase. We can give you the name of a family and you can send the money directly to CARE, or if you wish, you can send the money to us and we will order the package for you.

If, however, you wish to send the \$3.00 per month for feeding some child, I do not believe we could handle that for you. I would suggest that you write to the Foreign Mission Board, 2037 Monument Avenue, Richmond, Virginia. It may be that some of their missionaries could provide you with a name, and tell you just how the money should be sent.
