I shall leave the disposition of the \$208.69 to you, and we enclose our check for that amount. This is the night (October 31st) when the "spooks and gobblins" will be on parade, therefore, I want to be sure and finish my office routine and get home before dark. I am affraid, however, my children will not allow me to stay in seclusion, therefore, I expect to be on the move tonight with a clown and a witch.
