



#### FIRST SESSION Thursday Afternoon, November 6, 1997 President George Sanders, Presiding

Susan Thomas, Director of Singles Ministries, BCPSJ, shared in song for the prelude to the 27th Annual Convention.

President George Sanders, Pastor, Altoona Church, Altoona, Pa., called the Convention to order at 1:30 p.m.

Tom Siddle, Pastor, First Southern Church, Williamsport, on behalf of himself and Sam Washington, Pastor, Antioch Church, Williamsport, co-hosts, welcomed the messengers and visitors to the Convention.

Harold Hawn, Mission Service Corps, BCPSJ, led the congregation in singing "All Hail the Power of Jesus Name," "Children of God," "My Jesus, I Love Thee" and "Victory in Jesus."

Dr. Andrew Lee, Director, NEBSM Theological Education, Staten Island, NY, conducted the Bible study based on the Convention theme "Start Something New" using Jeremiah 1:1-14 as his text.

# SECTION IV REPORTS

#### 1997 STATE CONVENTION REPORT

It is exciting to see the dream of A New Vision for a New Century become a reality!

The Baptist Convention of Pennsylvania/South Jersey has worked to follow God's leadership in reaching the lost in our convention and He has provided resources and people. Susan Thomas, volunteer director of Singles Ministry, three new directors of missions and new student workers have joined us in ministry. There is a sense of cohesiveness among the convention staff as we work together to help churches effectively minister in their communities. We have added Bob Hylton to our team as director of Church Development. It is with regret and sadness we say good-bye to Dr. An Van Pham who has been called to the Georgia Baptist Convention. He made a significant contribution during his time with us and he will be missed.

We added 31 new congregations including Anglo, African-American and Language churches and we had the second highest year of baptisms in our history. They were up 34% over last year. Our records indicated that 655 people came to know the Lord during an Inner City Evangelism Project during the National School of Evangelism held in Cherry Hill, NJ.

We continued to receive help from volunteers from our partner states, Virginia and Florida. Some of our churches were able to send volunteer teams to work in Virginia and Florida as well as other states. We continue to be grateful to those groups and individuals who come from our partnership states to work along side of us to share Christ with the lost in our convention area. We are also thankful for the continued support from the Baptist Sunday School Board and the North American Mission Board.

We are grateful for the support of our churches through the Cooperative Program. At this time our receipts are running .01% below a year ago and we are 8.08% below budget. We encourage you to continue to give sacrificially to our cooperative missions enterprise.

- 12. Heard a report from Dr. Waltz on status of search for individuals to fill staff vacancies.

- 13. Approved a job description from the Greater Philadelphia Baptist Association for "Associate Coordinator for African-American Ministry".
- 14. Hear report from President Cowan on his appointments to the "Foundation Study Committee".
- 15. Approved a date change for the 1997 Fall Student Conference.
- 16. Approved Howard and Jean Girard as the volunteer "Coordinators of the State Volunteer Missions Program".
- 17. Adjourned.

#### CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS COMMITTEE

The Constitution and By-Laws Committee met to consider a motion to amend the By-Laws brought by Dr. Ray Wise at the 1996 Convention meeting and was referred to the Constitution and By-Laws Committee. The Committee received comments on the matter from Ray Wise and Chuck Teague and asked for a report of the history of this issue from David Waltz.

The Committee thoroughly discussed the pros and cons of stating in the By-Laws that the Convention President must also be the chairman of either the Administrative Committee or the Executive Board Appointment Committee.

It was agreed not to make a recommendation to the 1997 Convention that the amendment be brought to a vote for the following reasons:

- 1. The structure to be amended is the expressed will of the Convention in its recent vote writing the By-Laws the way they stand now. The issue of the Convention President's influence was openly considered when the By-Laws were revised.
- 2. The current structure and procedures are built on trust for each other and for the trustworthiness of this system. We'll be in a sad shape if a Convention President is elected who doesn't already have considerable respect and influence, aside from whatever institutional power comes with the position.
- 3. The current system has considerable flexibility. The President of the Convention is still eligible to serve as President of the Board if elected by the Board, and may also fill any number of other leadership roles if chosen to do so by the elected Board members.
- 4. The current system maintains a reasonable and prudent balance of power and influence among the various elected leaders of the Convention. Progress and reform are easily accomplished, while precipitous action out of line with the will of the Convention is unlikely.

#### Looking Back

Looking back over the 1996 Church Development year, it clearly reveals that it has been a year of transition with the retirement of Harold Price after his long tenure on the state staff. Yet the year is highlighted with significant events such as the following:

#### Winter Bible Study Overview, November

The Winter Bible Study Overview drew 40 participants this year. Represented were 7 associations and a total of 23 churches with 21 pastors present. This overview prepares pastors for the book study that will be conducted in our churches in January or February.

# Growth Spiral Conference, April

The Growth Spiral is a conference focused on helping pastors and leaders develop growth plans and outreach strategies for their church. Daniel Edmonds of the Alabama Baptist Convention was the lead consultant at this year's conference which had 7 in attendance from two associations. Six of the participants were pastors of local churches.

#### Northeast Baptist Leadership Development Conference, August

This conference is co-sponsored by the Baptist Conventions of New England, New York, Pennsylvania/South Jersey, and Maryland/Delaware and the Canadian Convention of Southern Baptists. While attendance was lower than anticipated a great spirit prevailed. Calvin Miller of Southwestern Seminary was the key leader speaking on "The Empowered Communicator". Also Chuck Register of New Orleans Seminary led a specialty conference entitled "What Effective Churches Have Learned" and Billy Hanks, president of International Evangelism Association in Salado, TX conducted a specialty conference for pastors entitled, "Multiplication Evangelism Through Mentoring". Each morning participants could chose core conferences for specific skill development in adult, youth, children or preschool ministry. The purpose of this week long event is to provide a "Ridgecrest" type training experience in the northeast. The week long conference event is for inspiration, fellowship,

encouragement and practical training that improves the Christian's life and effectiveness in ministry.

Vacation Bible School (VBS) and Associational Consultant Training (ACT) Held in February at the East Shore Baptist Church in Harrisburg, the VBS leaders received information and training regarding the new and greatly improved VBS curriculum for 1997. The VBS conference had six associations represented with twelve churches and two pastors participating. A total of fifteen were in attendance. The Church Development Division will seek to attract greater participation of our churches in the future. Those participating were introduced to the totally revised and exciting curriculum called "Wild and Wonderful Good News Stampede". The Church Development Division is happy to report a dramatic increase in Vacation Bible School enrollment to 2,341 children across the convention with all eight associations reporting very positive results. VBS leaders must become well prepared to reach children and families for Christ.

The ACT Team Training was conducted concurrently. This conference totaled 21 in attendance with twelve churches and five associations represented.

#### **Looking Forward**

It is clear that the way church needs to be done today is not the same as the way church was done yesterday. Casting a new vision for the Church Development Division is an important ingredient in moving our division forward in its support to growing churches. The church laity, along with their pastors, must make a decision for the church to grow. Once the decision is made, attitudes, actions and activities must support that decision to grow and reach people for Christ

It is the vision of the Church Development Division to provide the very best growth strategies and resources to the churches and associations which ask our help. Therefore, the Church Development Division will become organized and structured to encourage and assist our participating churches in five functional areas of the church. The Church Development Division will help our churches grow

- warmer through fellowship
- deeper through discipleship
- stronger through worship
- broader through ministry, and
- larger through evangelism.

Based upon the ministry objectives outlined in the long-range planning document, "A New Vision for a New Century", the following four strategies will be employed to begin achieving our goals:

- 1. The Church Development Division will enlist partners and volunteers from churches within our convention and train them with the latest in small group assimilation and reaching strategies for discipleship and evangelism.
- 2. In the enlistment of these partners and volunteers, the Church Development Division will become reflective of and supportive of the expanding cultural diversity of our churches, thus becoming better equipped to serve effectively all our churches.
- 3. Seminars, conferences, workshops, and consultations will focus on high impact skill development training for our laity and pastors.
- 4. The Church Development Division will become supportive of the high priority objectives of starting new churches by working closely with our constituents to develop fast track educational materials and models for our emerging churches of tomorrow.

On a personal note, my first exposure to Pennsylvania was in helping a newly started church in Tamaqua as a volunteer during the summers of 1975, 1976 and 1977. My first exposure to South Jersey was as a participant in a missions conference in Atlantic City in the spring of 1982. Now in 1997, I am excited to be a partner once again with a skilled state staff and dedicated pastors seeking to reach people for Christ in the Northeast. My wife, Wanda, and I are rejoicing in what God is doing in our churches and are looking forward to significant milestones upon which we can serve Christ with you in the days ahead.

# EVANGELISM AND BROTHERHOOD

The Division of Evangelism exists to help churches fulfill the Great Commission. The work assignment includes Personal Evangelism, Mass Evangelism, Interfaith Witness, Renewal and Reconciliation, Tent Ministry, Baptist Men, Royal Ambassador Congress, Disaster Relief, Church Planning Guide Calendar, Church Consultation, and Strategy Planning for the local church. It is the local church that God has chosen to reach the lost and mature the saved.

Two major events are hosted by the Evangelism Division each year, the State Evangelism Conference and the Youth Evangelism Conference. The State

Evangelism Conference was held at Monroeville Baptist Church, Monroeville, PA with 180 in attendance from 52 churches, and all 8 associations were represented. The theme of the conference was *Celebrate Jesus 2000--In His Likeness*. Speakers included Dr. Dan Crawford, Dr. Bob Anderson, Dr. Kato Brooks, Dr. David Wheeler, and Rev. Matt Haskell, Sr.

The Youth Evangelism Conference was held at the Marriott Hotel, Harrisburg, PA with 739 present from 50 churches. All of the associations were represented. The theme for the conference was *More than Gold* with Rev. David Burton, Florida Baptist Convention, as Bible Study leader. The music was provided by the Praise Band, with Eric Lovett, from Liberty Baptist University.

The Baptismal record was up 34% over the year before. It was the second highest year for baptisms in the history of the convention. The top ten churches are as follows:

The National School of Evangelism was conducted by the Home Mission Board in Cherry Hill, NJ. An Inner City Evangelism Project was conducted in Philadelphia with the El Shaddai Baptist Church, Ebenezer Baptist Church, Second Pilgrim Baptist Church, and Grace Community Baptist Church. The record indicates 655 people came to know the Lord during this event. From the Baptist Convention of Pennsylvania/South Jersey, 24 men and women were trained in personal evangelism.

In partnership with the churches and associations:

- -25,000 tracts in English, Korean, Russian, and Vietnamese were distributed
- --Over 1000 people attended block parties, with 260 praying to receive Christ
- -People Sharing Jesus Crusade in the South Jersey Association, 50 laymen trained, 75 receive Christ as Savior
- --Over 125 people have been trained in personal witnessing
- --Four tents were used throughout the summer in 28 places

- --30 ministers and spouses received inspiration and encouragement at a special event
- --Record attendance at RA Congress, Temple Baptist Church, York. 185 present, 11 saved.
- --75 men and women trained in Disaster Relief
- -- Prepared and distributed Church Planning Guide
- -- 5 churches received \$1,000 by doing Strategy Planning
- -- Prayed for every church and pastor over the course of a year.

#### MISSIONS DIVISION

The Missions Division exists to assist churches and associations to provide contextualized New Testament congregations wherever needed through Pennsylvania/South Jersey. This vision is being realized through the implementation of a strategy that seeks to start 25 new congregations during 1996-97. This strategy includes fostering a climate that is supportive of new work, securing effective pastoral leadership and establishing a system that seeks to provide adequate support (spiritually, emotionally, educationally and financially) for pastors.

#### Associational Missions

The partnership with the eight associations is a vital part of the missions strategy for Baptist in Pennsylvania/South Jersey. Three new Associational Directors of Missions joined our missions team: Gerald Mounce, Northeast Pennsylvania Baptist Association; Ron Hale, Baptist Association of Southwestern Pennsylvania; and Tim McClure, South Central Baptist Association. Welcome! They join Frank Miller, Greater Philadelphia; Bob Tallent, South Jersey; Carl Anderson, Keystone; Doug Pilot, Conemaugh Valley; and Don Hulsey, Northwest. Bob Tallent celebrated 10 years of service in South Jersey. With the call of a new Director of Missions in the South Central Association, Rev. Jim Luck completed almost two years of service as Interim Director of Missions. We are grateful for his faithful service. Keystone, Greater Philadelphia, and South Jersey Associations conducted strategy planning this year with Leon Boyd, Emmanuel McCall, Everett Anthony and Bob Moore serving as consultants.

# **Church Starting**

Baptists in Pennsylvania/South Jersey kept pace with the goal of a ten percent increase in the number of congregations for 1996-97. We added 31 new congregations including Anglo, African-American and Language churches. These churches have taken on a variety of forms and styles. Two Praxis teams

(Faith and Forrest Broome and Amy and Chris Twilley) assisted in the development of new work in Dover and Somerset, Pennsylvania. Contemporary approaches have been used in developing the new congregations in Mullica Hill, New Jersey and State College, Pennsylvania.

#### **Church Multiplication System**

The concept that a mature church is a church that reproduces itself through the starting of new churches has taken a strong place in the values and understanding of many of our churches. The Missions Division is coordinating a plan to implement this concept fully--the Church Multiplication System. In 1997 three components were initiated. In January 25 ministers from Pennsylvania and South Jersey attended a conference on mentoring in Houston, Texas. The strategy is to provide a mentor for each new church start so that each new pastor has a support person to encourage and guide through the process of starting a new church. In addition to the one-on-one mentoring relationship a further support system will be the Church Planters Network--a gathering of mentors and church planters. Eight persons traveled to St. Louis in August to be trained as facilitators for the convening of these networks. Another component of this strategy is a process to appraise the potential church planter's gifts and skills in church planting. This Assessment process is used prior to placing any church planter on the field. Three persons are now trained to conduct the assessment process. The goal of this Church Multiplication System is to provide more effective new church starts in Pennsylvania/South Jersey. During the coming year the next phase will be developed--cultivating churches that will be multipliers of new church starts.

# **Training**

An old tool was renewed and upgraded and brought out again this year-Church Extension Conference. On September 5-6, 120 mission pastors, ministers of missions, pastors, missionaries and spouses gathered in Morgantown, Pennsylvania for the first extension conference including Anglo, African-American, and Ethnic work. The conference provided separate tracks for each group including conferences offered in Korean, Haitian, Ukrainian, Vietnamese and Spanish. Corporate worship experiences were highlighted by the use of a variety of cultural forms--African-American, Korean, Ukrainian, and Generation X. Dr. Cecil Seagle, Director, Missions Division, Florida Baptist Convention brought the messages and also brought a presentation to the

Associational Directors of Missions. The Anglo track included presentations on: Casting a Vision for the New Work and the Effective Use of Publicity and the Media by Ed Stetzer, How to Lead the New Work to Grow by Scott Beeman and How to Reach Generation X by Scott Elkins. Almost 40 spouses of ministers participated in a separate conference led by Gail Hallman and Diann Douglas.

#### North American Mission Board

With the close of the annual meeting of the Southern Baptist Convention in June 1997, the Home Mission Board, Radio and TV Commission and the Brotherhood Commission ceased to exist and the North American Mission Board was born. The partnership with the old Home Mission Board was vital to our ability to evangelize and congregationalize in Pennsylvania/South Jersey. The new North American Mission Board is still in the process of adding staff and developing strategies. With the availability of increased funds, a renewed commitment to closer partnership and the ability to bring the resources of the three previous agencies into one strategic mission agency, we look forward to the new opportunities emerging with the North American Mission Board.

#### **Black Church Extension**

The Black Church Extension department continues to gain momentum. This has been an exciting year of ministry for us.

Dr. Henry Nash officially began his work as the Afro-American Coordinator for the Greater Philadelphia Association and has done a commendable job in that new role

We are presently working with the International Mission Board to have a state coordinator to help stimulate more African American involvement in international missions efforts

We continue to have good success with African American work in Philadelphia with affiliations and new starts. Our Harrisburg new work, led by Todd McKey, is beginning to see good progress in recent weeks. We are also in the process of doing a new work in York, PA.

We continue to cultivate relationships with several churches to help them to fulfill their mission of starting new churches.

In keeping with our extension strategy, about six of our pastors have been trained as mentors and/or convenors.

Our African American involvement in the first Church Extension Conference was a huge success.

We anticipate the starting of our Church Planting Institute in early 1998 and will continue to work with Dr. Bob Hylton on theological education options in the Philadelphia/South Jersey area.

Thank you for the privilege to serve you in this important work.

#### Language Church Extension

The ethnic population in Pennsylvania and Southern New Jersey is growing rapidly. In many areas this population doubled and even tripled in the last decade. The experts estimate that many more millions of ethnics will move into our cities before the year 2000, and more than 90 percent of them are of a non-Biblical background.

Today we do not need to travel around the world in order to preach the gospel in many languages, in many nations, to many colors, with many cultures anymore. God is sending them to us. The world has come to Penn-Jersey through migrants, immigrants, International students, seafareres, refugees and many more.

To minister to ethnics, the Baptist Convention of Pennsylvania/South Jersey focuses on:

- 1. New Work: Seven language new works have been added to our convention. These made a total of 63 language churches, chapels, fellowships, and units including 16 languages and dialects.
- 2. Bible Contribution: This year, Language Church Extension has distributed hundreds of Bibles in many languages, such as Arabic, Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Spanish, and Vietnamese. Language Bibles are available for personal evangelism and new works.
- 3. Ethnic Leadership Development: To equip the leaders for language congregations, the Penn-Jersey Baptist Theological Center began its Fall Semester for 1996 at the Greater Philadelphia Baptist Association with five departments: Ukrainian, Vietnamese, French for Haitians, English for Multiethnic students, and Spanish. This School of Theology is sponsored by the Baptist Convention of Pennsylvania/South Jersey, the North American Mission Board and the Boyce Bible School, a division of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. The enrollment for the Fall 1997 semester is 82 students who have come from seven language churches and five associations. Our goal by the year 2000 is to have at least fifty percent of our language leaders finish the Associate of Arts program, to qualify them for teaching and starting new works.

4. Seamen's Ministry: The Director of ministry for the Seamen's Ministry, George Ratz, has reported that he has visited 745 ships in 26 ports at the Delaware River in the past year, during which he met with 3,600 seamen from 45 different countries. Scriptures in 32 languages have been distributed at worship services and aboard ship.

#### **Missions Team**

In the record of Scripture and Church History, when God is preparing to initiate a new movement in the advance of His Kingdom. He raises up key leaders. The ministries of Dr. An Van Pham and Rev. Hal Hopkins, along with that of our eight Associational Directors of Missions bear testimony that God is preparing us for such a time. We are grateful that as well that on March 1, Margie McKey, formerly on the staff of the Ministries Section of the Home Mission Board, joined our team. She brings skills and missions awareness that have enhanced the work of the Missions Division. Darlene Dunn continues to provide competence, skill and a joyful spirit through her work as a part-time secretary. Our team also suffered a great loss (but again for the Kingdom) when Brad and Gretchen Roderick continued a journey to overseas missions that had been at the heart of their original call to ministry. Brad served as our first Coordinator, New Church Extension and laid a good foundation through innovative methods of church starting, development of the minister of missions concept and teaching through the NEBSOM center. In December they began service through the International Mission Board (formerly the Foreign Mission Board). We are looking forward to their return to our area during furloughs. Maturity as churches and a convention is demonstrated by being a "sending out" ministry and not just a "receiving" ministry.

#### Stewardship Development

With the closure of the Stewardship Commission in Nashville, Tennessee and the incorporation of the stewardship development and capital fund-raising assignment into the work of the Baptist Sunday School Board, this has been a year of transition in stewardship. Worship Life, a special emphasis on giving and worship launches last year, was highlighted as a statewide stewardship emphasis. Pastors Stewardship Luncheons were held in six of our associations. Special plans are in place to offer a new resource in Christian Money Management during the coming year.

#### **Looking Ahead**

In the coming year a special focus will be brought on bi-vocational ministers. Plans are in place for the formation of a statewide fellowship network and an annual retreat. At present 40% of our churches are led by a bi-vocational

minister. We are grateful for these faithful ministers. Also, further efforts are anticipated to strengthen the network of chaplains serving in our convention area. Almost 30 men and women serve in a variety of military, medical, correctional, and other institutions providing a valued Christian presence where it would be difficult if not impossible for others to go.

#### LITERACY:

Literacy continues to be a positive ministry opportunity. Training conferences were held in Southwestern Association and Keystone Association this year under the leadership of Debbie Toone, Ella Moore, and Larry Theisen. We have trainers certified in Adult Reading and Writing, Conversational English,

under the leadership of Debbie Toone, Ella Moore, and Larry Theisen. We have trainers certified in Adult Reading and Writing, Conversational English, and Tutoring Youth and Children. They are available to lead conferences in these areas of ministry.

#### WMU/WOMEN'S MINISTRY:

The emphasis in Woman's Missionary Union in 1996-97 has been "Hand in Hand". WMU continues to lead in the promotion of the special missions offering. Promotion materials for the Lottie Moon Offering for foreign missions, the Annie Armstrong Offering for home missions and the Ed and Mary Price Offering for state missions were mailed to each church. The 1996 state missions offering goal was \$35,000 with the theme "Start Something New". The offering was used this year for Volunteer Ministries, Reaching the Cities, and Emergency Assistance for Churches. The national ministry project for WMU this year was Project HELP: Child Advocacy.

Dawning, a women's conference, was held this year at Country and Town Baptist Church with 463 registered. The theme was "He Is Faithful". Participants included Kathy Burns, preschool consultant, WMU, SBC; Jane Bishop, associate, Ministry Division, Home Mission Board; and Dawn Phillips, minister's wife and author, Chillicothe, MO.

An extended area of ministry this year has been the work with the wives of ministers. A highlight has been the launch of a quarterly newsletter for ministers' wives. Another expansion of this ministry has been the wives' conference during the New Staff Orientation each quarter.

# DEPARTMENT OF STUDENTS, DISCIPLESHIP, AND FAMILY MINISTRIES

#### **Student Ministry**

The Student Ministry Department exists to fulfill the Great Commission by encouraging, equipping, coordinating, and providing ministries to the many college and university students who live in our midst.

Students are a strategic focus for evangelism and discipleship. First, students are in a crucial period of their lives. They are making important decisions in the areas of lifestyles, sexuality, relationships, values, and most importantly, faith. They deserve an effective Christian witness at this crucial juncture of life. Second, students are present in such large numbers in Penn/South Jersey. We have in our midst over 850,000 students on about 225 campuses! We cannot fulfill the Great Commission and neglect this large number of people who need the Lord.

Our strategy is basically twofold:

- •Providing a team of trained campus ministers on selected campuses across our region
- Equipping churches to reach out to students on nearby campuses and within their fellowships

#### **Personnel Expansion**

The past year has seen some of the most significant developments ever in the area of personnel. First, it has been our goal to put in place in metro Pittsburgh a campus ministry team to reach out to the many campuses in that association. This effort was to be led by an experienced Metro Campus Minister who would coordinate a comprehensive strategy for reaching students in that region.

Those who have been following student work in our area will note that this has been a matter of intense prayer for at least the past four years. We praise God that this summer our prayers were answered! Ken Harmon, formerly Campus Minister at the University of Idaho, and his wife, Dondi, were appointed by the North American Mission Board as career missionaries to the Baptist Association of Southwestern Pennsylvania in the area of Student Ministry. Accompanying the Harmons are Gary and Kimberly Myers, who relocated from Mississippi to serve as US-2 missionaries, with a primary focus on the Pitt and Carnegie-Mellon campuses. The Harmons and Myers are off to a great start this fall and are the first of what is expected to be a team of 10-12 persons for that region.

Significant changes have also taken place in other settings as well. After four years on the Lock Haven campus, Brian and Karen Morphonios relocated to State College to work alongside Johnny and Kathy Pons in reaching out to the 40,000 students at the Penn State Main Campus. They were followed at Lock Haven by Todd and Alisa Cravens, who will work for a one-year assignment on that campus as seminary interns from Southern Seminary and as Semester Missionaries for the North American Mission Board.

The Semester Missionary program of NAMB continues to be a significant source of help to us. Semester Missionaries this past year included James Blevins, who served at Penn State, and Karen Langenbach, who served at West Chester University. Semester Missionaries for 1997-98 include the Cravens, Nayjuana Woodberry, serving at West Chester, and Ryan Schenk, serving with the Millcreek Community Church in Erie in its ministry to students.

In addition, we had two persons work in the area of ministries to International students, provided for by the Foreign (now International) Mission Board. Trisha Manarin served as International Student Ministry Catalyst for the Greater Philadelphia Baptist Association, and Holly Nobles served in the same capacity on the Penn State campus.

#### Fall Student Conference

"ID Required: Your Identity in Christ" was the theme of the annual Fall Student Retreat, held at Mt. Lou-San Bible Camp near Harrisburg in October of 1996. Scott Markley, Minister to Students at FBC, Durham, NC and formerly Campus Minister at Temple University in Philadelphia, was the keynote speaker.

"The World at Your Doorstep" was the theme of the Spring Conference, which took place in April at the Country and Town Baptist Church. Conference leaders included Mike Lopez of the Foreign (now International) Mission Board, and Lawson and Pam Lau, International Student Ministry Coordinators at the University of Illinois-Champaign/Urbana. The entire focus of the conference was on ministries to international student, a first for such Baptist student conferences in our nation.

#### Student Missions

Students from Penn/Jersey campuses continued to serve as student missionaries across our land. Places of service this summer included:

Gatlinburg, Tennessee; Billings, Montana; Williamsport, Pennsylvania; Guatemala; and the Ukraine. Students from Penn State participated in "Beach Reach", an evangelistic outreach to spring break students at Panama City

Beach, Florida, and a team from West Chester University ministered in Jamaica for a week following finals in May.

# **Church Ministry to Students**

In addition to our strategy of placing campus ministers on target campuses, a major part of our overall strategy involves equipping churches to reach out to students on campuses within their mission fields. Several churches were assisted in beginning or strengthening their ministries to students this past year.

The campuses that we target for ministry are determined in large part by the status of supporting churches in the area. Student ministry is impossible without the support of local churches. We are coordinating new works with the church extension strategies adopted by our associations, while all the time seeking to initiate ministries on campuses near churches that have indicated an interest in ministering to students.

All activities and ministries of our department are carried out in partnership with the Baptist Sunday School Board and the North American Mission Board. Many of our campus ministers serve via the Mission Service Corps of the NAMB, and must raise financial support form across the nation. Without these partners, and our churches who provide local funds through the Cooperative Program, our work could not take place.

# Discipleship and Family Ministries

The Discipleship and Family Ministry Department exists to assist our churches in the process of helping their members grow in faith, lifestyle, and ministry; in other words, the process of making disciples of Jesus Christ.

#### We do this through:

- consultations
- •training events and workshops
- providing and suggesting appropriate resources
- •special events (ie, Centrifuge, State Bible Drill and Speakers' Tournament, etc.)

Discipleship is one of the essential tasks of the church (along with worship, evangelism, ministry, and fellowship). A church leading its people in discipleship is not optional! Our goal is that every Southern Baptist Church in Pennsylvania/South Jersey would have an intentional, ongoing, and effective ministry of discipleship training in place.

Evangelism and discipleship are essential co-components of a church's ministry and mission. A heart for souls without an accompanying vision of seeing these souls to maturity in Christ is short-sighted and unbiblical. A discipleship ministry that neglects this primacy of evangelism will soon run out of Christians to disciple.

#### **Doctrinal Training Clinic**

The annual Doctrinal Training Clinic was held in conjunction with the State Evangelism Conference in March. Dr. John Gilbert led participants in a study of "The Baptist Faith and Message".

#### Bible Drill and Speakers' Tournament

The annual State Children's Bible Drill took place in March at the Colonial Hills Baptist Church in Bedford. The Youth Bile Drill and Speakers' Tournament took place in conjunction with the State Youth Convention in April. Tiffany Leed of Quarryville was our Bible Drill winner and represented us at Discipleship Week at Ridgecrest this summer. Todd Strader of Mechanicsburg was the winner of the Speakers' Tournament.

#### Centrifuge

One of the best offerings of any kind by our State Convention each year is Centrifuge, which continues to be extremely popular among our teens and leaders. This year 280 teens and leaders gathered at Lycoming College in Williamsport in late July to worship, study, celebrate, recreate, and grow in their faith. "Extreme! Living Dangerously in God's Will" was the theme.

#### Family Ministry

The family is the first institution established by God, remains the foundation of any society, and is the primary arena through with the process of discipleship occurs. Family Ministry seeks to assist churches to minister to family units within their spheres of influence, so that all persons can experience the health, security, nurture, and faith that healthy Christian homes provide.

A "Growing Churches-Strengthening Families" Workshop took place in February at Temple Baptist in York and Monroeville Baptist near Pittsburgh. Phil Waugh, Family Ministry Specialist from the BSSB, led participants in discovering ways churches can reach out to families.

Family Ministry also seeks to equip churches to minister specifically to *single* adults and senior adults. Perhaps the most significant development in the area of Family Ministry this year was the addition of Susan Thomas as our volunteer Director of Single Adult Ministries.

#### **Summer Missions**

An additional responsibility of this department is the coordination of the summer missions program that secures students from across our nation to minister in our area and through our churches each summer.

This summer 27 students ministered in our state convention in 17 different mission assignments, from Erie in the northwest to Ocean City along the Jersey shore. The students worked in a variety of ministries, including inner-city day camps, church starting, surveys, VBS and Backyard Bible Clubs, church construction, weekday recreation, apartment ministry, youth and children's camps, and personal evangelism.

# ANNUITY BOARD

The seventy-ninth year of Annuity Board ministry ended December 31, 1996. For the first time in history, retirement and relief benefits exceeded \$200 million in a single year. Annuitants receiving benefits established for periods of five years or longer received a permanent five percent increase on January 1, 1996.

The Annuity Board operated within the budget approved by the Board of Trustees and funded all operating expense from earnings on assets. No Cooperative Program money is used in the operation of the Annuity Board; all Cooperative Program money we receive is used for the Relief Ministry Assignment of the Southern Baptist Convention.

Assets under management and administrative control for the participants in our plans stood at \$5.6 billion on December 31, 1996. This was an increase of \$499.2 million over the same date a year ago.

Earnings allocated for the benefit of the participants totaled \$589.9 million.

Contributions to Retirement and Relief totaled \$253.8 million. Retirement and Relief benefits and withdrawals from accounts in 1996 totaled \$307.2 million.

At year end the Church Annuity Plan had 39,431 participants in 20,848 churches. The Convention Annuity Plan had 37,542 participants in 250 agency accounts. Qualified Plans had 1,362 participants, and the Voluntary Annuity Plan had 2,023 participants.

The Annuity Board received \$1,167,430 from the Cooperative Program and \$27,262 in designations. Earnings on the Retired Ministers Support Fund paid all the expenses of the Endowment Department and contributed additional money to the Relief Ministry. The Total spent for Relief was \$1,510,238, an increase of 17% over 1995. The Relief Committee of the Board of Trustees approved a \$200 Christmas check to every Relief recipient on the roll December 1, 1996. more than half the Relief recipients receive no other benefit from the Annuity Board because their churches never enrolled them in the Church Annuity Plan.

The Board's Adopt an Annuitant ministry provides an extra \$50 each month to annuitants whose regular benefit is insufficient for security and comfort. At year end there were 9,598 annuitants receiving \$200 a month or less. Of these, 4,142 were receiving no more than \$100 a month. At year end, funds were available to adopt 2,850 of these soldiers of the cross. All money for this ministry comes from designated gifts, and once an annuitant is enrolled, it is probable the need will continue for life. Total cash contributions for Adopt an Annuitant were \$2,008,954.

The Personal Security Program Indemnity and Point of Service Medical Plan required a 7.6% increase in rates on January 1, 1996, but no increase was applied at the review for July 1, 1996, nor will there be an increase January 1 or July 1, 1997. Total benefits paid in all insurance plans were \$107.8 million.

The Property and Casualty program, endorsed by the Annuity Board and marketed by the Preferred Risk Group of West Des Moines, Iowa, had 6,663 accounts written with Southern Baptist churches and institutions. Total package premium was \$24.9 million.

The Annuity Board motto is "Servicing Those Who Have Served the Lord." Churches, institutions, and agencies of the Southern Baptist Convention have entrusted the Board to receive, invest, and manage more than \$5 billion to provide secure retirement benefits and protect from financial disasters caused by illness, accident, disability, and death. The spiritual calling of this facilitating ministry is an exciting challenge, a sacred fiduciary responsibility, and a legal obligation handled according to the highest business and accounting principles. Every person with an account, every annuitant receiving our promise of benefits, and every employer receives our deep gratitude and our pledge of continued fidelity to our responsibilities.

# INTERNATIONAL MISSION BOARD

It is indeed a privilege to have been elected to serve as a Trustee to the IMB this past June. I can't fully express what a humbling experience this has been. I am also aware I have very "big shoes" to fill following Karol Wise who faithfully and ably served in this position for the past nine years.

Having to date attended two Board Meetings and two New Trustee Orientation sessions, I find although I thought I knew a lot about the mission work of our denomination, I have volumes yet to learn.

I can tell you this however. It was immediately obvious to me that our international missions work is being led by Godly committed men in the persons of Dr. Jerry Rankin, President, Dr. Don Kammerdiener, Executive Vice President, and Dr. Avery Willis, Senior Vice President. These men comprise the Senior Executive Team and are extremely capable administrators to be sure, yet they are not just "Professional Christians." During these times the missionaries share their testimonies and offer prayer concerns and we trustees get to ask any questions we might have. This is followed by a time of prayer with the trustees laying hands on the missionaries and praying for their needs. I was told by a "seasoned" trustee to bring plenty of tissues to the meeting. I could have used a towel! Just hearing how God has intervened in the lives of these people and how He has guided them to this pivotal point in their lives is a real testimony to

His awesomeness. It makes your heart very tender toward them and thankful to Him that such God fearing and able prepared people are responding in obedience to His call on their lives. I wish each of you could be a part of and witness to this process.

# SECTION VI

# CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS THE BAPTIST CONVENTION OF PENNSYLVANIA/SOUTH JERSEY

# ARTICLE I-NAME

The name of this body shall be The Baptist Convention of Pennsylvania/South Jersey.

#### ARTICLE II-PURPOSE

The purposes of this body are as follows:

- (a) Furnish cooperating, autonomous Baptist churches a means whereby they may effectively participate in the mission purposes of the Southern Baptist Convention.
- (b) Serve as a channel of communication and assistance between the associations, the churches, the Southern Baptist Convention and its boards and agencies.
- (c) Provide assistance and encouragement to the associations and the churches in winning, nurturing, and ministering to people.
- (d) Provide an organization whereby the associations and churches may perform tasks which cannot otherwise be completed.

#### ARTICLE III-MEMBERSHIP

# SECTION 1

This Convention shall consist of messengers elected by cooperating Baptist churches, who regularly contribute to the work of this body, and who are in harmony with doctrines and principles generally held by Southern Baptists.

# **SECTION 2**

The messengers shall be elected by the churches as follows:

- (a) Three (3) messengers from each church with membership up to fifty (50).
- (b) One (1) messenger each additional fifty (50) members or major portion thereof. The membership of a chapel shall not be counted in determining the number of eligible messengers of a sponsoring church.
- (c) No church may elect more than ten (10) messengers.
- (d) A chapel shall be entitled to two (2) messengers in addition to the messengers of the chapel's sponsoring church.

# ARTICLE IV-OFFICERS

#### SECTION 1

The officers of this convention shall be: President, First Vice President, Second Vice President, Executive Director-Treasurer, Recording Secretary, Assistant Recording Secretary, Historian, and Parliamentarian.

#### SECTION 2

The President and Vice-Presidents shall be nominated from the floor. The Recording Secretary, Assistant Recording Secretary, Historian, and Parliamentarian shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee. These officers shall be elected annually by the body and shall be duly installed at the closing session of the convention. They shall hold their offices until their successors are elected and installed.

- (a) No President shall be eligible to serve more than two (2) consecutive terms.
- (b) The election shall be by secret ballot when two (2) or more persons are nominated for the same office.
- (c) The President shall be elected before the Vice Presidents are nominated, and the First Vice President is to be elected before receiving nominations for the second vice president.

# **SECTION 3**

The Executive Director-Treasurer shall be employed by the Executive Board for an indefinite period of time.

#### ARTICLE V-MEETINGS

This Convention shall meet annually as determined by the body. In case of an emergency the President, with the consent of the Executive Board, may call a special session.

# ARTICLE VI-EXECUTIVE BOARD

#### SECTION 1

This Convention shall elect an Executive Board which shall consist of two (2) members from the churches of each associational area for the first 1000 church members or fraction thereof. One additional member shall be elected from each associational area for each additional 1000 members in the churches, not to exceed five (5) members from any one association.

MEMBERSHIP: Approximately 50% of the membership of the Board shall be drawn from laypersons. The balance shall be drawn from vocational ministers or their spouses.

# **SECTION 2**

The President, Vice Presidents and Recording Secretary of the Convention shall serve as members of the Executive Board. In the event that such officers are employees of the convention they shall be non-voting exofficio members

#### SECTION 3

The regular term of office for each member of the Board shall be three (3) years with two (2) years or more constituting a full term. Board members may serve for two (2) consecutive terms after which one (1) full year must elapse before this person is eligible for reelection. Approximately one-third of the Board shall be elected each year.

Members of the Executive Board shall take office at the close of the annual meeting at which they are elected.

#### **SECTION 4**

The Executive Board shall be the corporated body of the Convention. It shall conduct the Convention's business between sessions, but shall not contravene action of the Convention.

#### ARTICLE VII-TRUSTEES AND COMMITTEES

# SECTION 1

This Convention shall have the authority to elect such trustees and committees as needed.

# SECTION 2

These trustees and committees shall make reports to this Convention on all responsibilities assigned to them.

# **SECTION 3**

This Convention shall retain the authority to approve, alter or reject any transactions made by these trustees and committees.

# ARTICLE VIII-FUNDS

# SECTION 1

All designated funds accepted by the Convention shall be applied according to the designation of the donors.

# **SECTION 2**

All undesignated funds received shall be distributed as directed by the Convention.

### ARTICLE IX-AGENCIES AND INSTITUTIONS

# SECTION 1

Agencies and institutions deemed necessary to fulfill the general purposes specified in Article II shall be established, owned and operated by this Convention.

# **SECTION 2**

No institution or agency of this Convention shall launch any program or enterprise calling for expenditures of money apart from usual operating expenses without prior approval of the Convention.

# **SECTION 3**

Any proposal relating to Sections 1 and 2 above must be presented to the Executive Board for study and published through the Penn-Jersey Baptist at leas sixty (60) days prior to the annual meeting of the Convention.

# ARTICLE X-PROCEEDINGS

The proceedings of this Convention, the report of the Executive Board, and such other useful information as the Secretary may be able to obtain, shall be published and distributed annually among the churches.

# **ARTICLE XI--AMENDMENTS**

This Constitution may be amended at any regular annual meeting by two-thirds of the members present and voting, provided that notice of the proposed changes shall have been published sixty (60) days prior to the annual meeting, and provided changes shall have been presented to the Convention at the previous annual meeting in writing.

#### **BY-LAWS**

# **ARTICLE I - DUTIES OF OFFICERS**

# SECTION 1

The President of the convention shall preside over the sessions of the Convention. During the first three months following election, the President shall appoint a Committee on Committees consisting of one member from each associational area. The President may appoint other committees when directed by the body, and shall fill any vacancies that may occur on the Committee on Committees and on any other committee that the President has appointed. In case of the President's death or incapacity to serve, the vice presidents shall succeed in order.

#### SECTION 2

The Executive Director-Treasurer shall serve as Executive Director-Treasurer of the Convention and the Executive Board.

#### **SECTION 3**

The Recording Secretary shall record and preserve the proceedings of the Convention and shall have the same printed and distributed in accordance with Article X of the Constitution. The Assistant Recording Secretary shall serve in the absence of the Recording Secretary and assist as necessary.

#### **SECTION 4**

The Historian shall gather and preserve all appropriate papers and documents pertaining to the Convention, the associations, and the churches.

#### SECTION 5

The Parliamentarian shall be familiar with the rules of parliamentary procedure set forth in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order and shall provide counsel to the presiding officer and to the Convention as may be needed to maintain correct and orderly procedure in the conduct of convention sessions.

# **SECTION 6**

The President and the Executive Director-Treasurer shall be non-voting ex officio members of all Convention committees, agencies and institutions.

### **ARTICLE II - COMMITTEES**

### SECTION 1

The Committee on Committees shall nominate for election by the Convention the committees named in Section 2 of this article and other committees as may be assigned to it. Prior to May 1 the chairperson shall convene the committee for the purposes of familiarizing themselves with their work and establishing procedures and timetables.

### **SECTION 2**

The convention shall elect the following committees to report to the next regular session of the Convention. In the event a vacancy occurs between the annual sessions, the officers of the Executive Board shall nominate a replacement to be elected by the Board.

- (a) Resolutions Committee, consisting of five members: The committee shall be responsible for initiating, reviewing, commenting on and recommending Convention action on all resolutions. All resolutions presented from the floor of the Convention shall be in writing and referred to the Committee on Resolutions, without debate, prior to the floor consideration. By two-thirds vote of the messengers present on the first day of the Convention, the rules may be suspended and a resolution be taken up for immediate consideration.
- (b) Program and Arrangements Committee, consisting of five members: The committee shall be responsible for recommending to the convention the time and place for the next annual meeting of the Convention. The committee's recommendation on time and place shall seek to offer plans that are at least two years in advance of the Convention to which it reports. The committee shall prepare for the annual session to which it reports the annual order of business, it shall arrange for all speakers including the president's address and the annual convention sermon, it shall provide for reports and special events that inform the Convention on the activities of its various programs and future plans. The host pastor for the annual meeting being planned shall be an ex-officio member of this committee.
- (c) Nominating Committee, consisting of one member from each associational area: The committee shall nominate members of the Executive Board as outlined in Article VI of the

Constitution and such other nominations as designated by the Convention. On or before March 31, the chairperson shall convene the committee for the purposes of familiarizing themselves with their work and establishing procedures and timetables.

(d) Credential and Enrollment Committee, consisting of five (5) members: The committee shall provide registration cards for messengers and visitors and examine the credentials of all messengers.

#### SECTION 3

Constitution and By-Laws Committee consisting of three members: The committee shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee. Terms of committee members shall be for three years; one member shall be elected at each annual session. The Chairperson shall be named by the Nominating Committee. The committee shall receive and review all proposed amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws and shall formulate whatever other amendments it may consider proper and report them to the Convention in the manner prescribed in the Constitution and By-Laws. The Nominating Committee shall nominate for election by the Executive Board persons to fill vacancies that may occur between annual sessions of the Convention.

### SECTION 4

Higher Education Committee shall consist of four elected members plus the Executive Director-Treasurer as a voting ex-officio member. The four elected members of the committee shall be nominated by the Nominating Committee. Terms of the elected members shall be for four years; one member shall be elected at each annual session. The chairperson shall be named by the Nominating Committee. The five members of this committee shall serve as the members of the Northeast Baptist School of Ministry from the Baptist Convention of Pennsylvania/South Jersey. The committee shall serve the Convention on matters pertaining to higher education as may be assigned to it. The committee shall report to the Convention at each annual meeting. The Nominating Committee shall nominate for election by the Executive Board persons to fill vacancies that may occur between annual sessions of the Convention

### **ARTICLE III - EXECUTIVE BOARD**

### SECTION 1

Members of the Executive Board shall be expected to attend all meetings unless providentially hindered. In such cases, notice shall be given to the Board. Two (2) successive absences without notification shall automatically terminate one's membership.

MEMBERSHIP: Approximately 50% of the membership of the Board shall be drawn from laypersons. The balance shall be drawn from vocational ministers or their spouses.

### **SECTION 2**

MEETINGS: The Executive Board shall hold at least four (4) meetings during the convention year, including the meetings immediately prior to and immediately after the annual convention, with the other two meetings well spaced during the year; the meeting place and agenda being determined by the President and the Executive Director-Treasurer or by the Administrative Committee. A majority of the Board members shall constitute a quorum.

### SECTION 3

OFFICERS: The Officers of the Executive Board shall consist of a President, Vice President, and Recording Secretary to be elected annually at the first meeting of the Executive Board following the annual session of the Convention.

### **SECTION 4**

### COMMITTEES

- 1. STANDING COMMITTEES. Following the election of officers of the Executive Board and prior to the next meeting of the Board, the Executive Board Appointment Committee shall appoint a chairperson and members to serve on all standing committees. Whenever possible no more than one-third of each committee shall be replaced each year.
  - (a) Administrative Committee. This committee shall be composed of approximately one third of the membership of the Executive Board and will include the President, Vice President and Secretary of the Board, the President of the Convention and others as appointed by the Executive Board Appointment Committee. The President of the Executive Board shall serve as chairperson. The Administrative Committee shall serve as the Executive Board Ad Interim

deciding on routine and emergency matters between sessions of the Executive Board and on all other matters referred to it by the Executive Board including public relations, long range planning, legal matters, program review and personnel.

- (b) Budget and Finance Committee. This committee shall be composed of approximately one-third of the membership of the Executive Board. This committee shall counsel, plan and work with matters of budget planning and control, audits, resource development, loans, and special offerings.
- (c) Operations and Property Committee. This committee shall be composed of approximately one-third of the membership of the Executive Board. This committee shall counsel, plan and work with matters related to overseeing the properties, automobiles and insurance and contracts.
- (d) Executive Board Appointment Committee. This committee shall consist of the President of the Convention and the officers of the Executive Board. (President of the Board, Vice President of the Board and Recording Secretary of the Board.) This committee will decide the makeup of the board committees each year, will appoint the chairpersons make recommendations to fill vacancies on the Executive Board that occur between Annual Meetings, and appoint persons for special committees of the Board. The President of the Board shall serve as chairperson.
- SPECIAL COMMITTEES. Special Committees may be formed as needed. Their duties shall be those assigned to them when the committee is authorized.

### **SECTION 5**

DUTIES: The Executive Board shall administer its cooperative work according to the policies set forth by the Convention, maintain oversight of Convention agencies and institutions and recommend to the Convention an annual budget.

The Executive Board shall employ such personnel as required to do the work of the Convention.

### **SECTION 6**

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR-TREASURER: The Executive Director-Treasurer is the spiritual and administrative leader of the Convention and the

Executive Board. He is employed by and is accountable to the Executive Board, serving in accordance with a position description adopted by the Executive Board. When a vacancy occurs in the office of Executive Director-Treasurer the Executive Board shall elect an Executive Director-Treasurer Search Committee. A majority of at least seventy-five percent of the Executive Board members present and voting shall take place at a regular or a special called meeting of the Executive Board. At least two weeks' notice is required for this special called meeting.

The Executive Director-Treasurer Search Committee shall consist of the Convention President, the Executive Board President, one additional member from each association of the convention, and three members-at-large. The Administrative Committee also shall nominate the chairperson and vice chairperson of the Search Committee for election by the Executive Board. All members of the Search Committee shall be members of churches affiliated with the convention. No more than fifty percent of the Search Committee shall be members of the Executive Board.

The Administrative Committee shall be guided by the principle of board representation in nominating the associational and at-large members of the Search Committee. The Search Committee shall develop and implement procedures as they deem wise.

### **SECTION 7**

No persons employed by the Executive Board or agencies of this Convention shall be eligible for election to this Board

### ARTICLE IV - AMENDMENTS

The By-Laws may be altered by a majority vote of the messengers present and voting at the business session of the same Convention, providing announcement of such has been made at a previous session of the same Convention.

### ARTICLE V - PROCEDURE

The Rules of Order for the sessions of the Convention shall be "Robert's Rules of Order, Revised," but in cases where the meaning may not be clear, the President shall exercise his discretion, subject to appeal to the Convention.
