## ■ CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS Constitution

#### ARTICLE I: NAME

This Convention shall be called the "Wyoming Southern Baptist Convention" (cooperating with the Southern Baptist Convention.)

#### ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

Section 1. This Convention is a non-profit corporation through which Southern Baptists may work harmoniously in cooperation in promoting all enterprises they deem necessary in carrying out the Great Commission.

Section 2. This Convention, in keeping with its stated purpose, shall not attempt to exercise control over the cooperating churches.

Section 3. This Convention is organized and will always operate exclusively for religious purposes, and no part of the net earnings of this Convention shall inure, or will ever inure, to the benefit of any private individual.

The assets of the Convention are irrevocably dedicated to and for Southern Baptist causes. Upon dissolution of the Corporation the Executive Board of the Convention will cause the assets of the corporation to be distributed, after the payment of creditors, to an organization which will use said assets exclusively for Southern Baptist causes.

#### ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP

Section 1. This Convention shall consist of messengers elected by Southern Baptist churches cooperating with and contributing to its work.

Section 2. Each church shall be entitled to two (2) messengers if the total membership is fifty (50) or fewer, and one additional messenger for each additional fifty (50) members or major fraction thereof, or one additional messenger for each \$250 given through the Cooperative Program during the previous year, provided that no church shall have more than a total of ten (10) messengers.

#### ARTICLE IV: OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of this Convention shall be a president, a first vice president, a second vice president, a recording secretary, and an assistant recording secretary.

Section 2. These officers shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Convention and shall be duly installed at the closing session of that meeting. These officers shall hold their respective offices until their successors are elected and installed, or until they move from the convention area, resign, or die. In the event of some officer vacating his or her office the Executive Board may appoint someone to fill the remaining portion of that term of office.

Section 3. The duties of these officers shall be those usually required in similar organizations.

#### ARTICLE V: EXECUTIVE BOARD AND AGENCIES

- Section 1. An Executive Board shall be elected as set forth in Bylaw III.
- Section 2. The Executive Board shall employ such personnel as is required to do the work of the Convention within the resources of the Convention.
- Section 3. This Convention may create such other agencies as may be required to promote its work and all such shall make annual reports to the convention. Mountain Top Baptist Assembly shall be an agency.

#### ARTICLE VI: COMMITTEES

- Section 1. The Convention shall have the following standing committees: Program Committee, Committee on Committees and Nominating Committee.
- Section 2. This Convention may elect any other committees necessary to carry out its work.

#### ARTICLE VII: MEETINGS

- Section 1. The Convention shall meet annually at such time and place as may be designated by the Convention at its previous annual meeting.
- Section 2. In an emergency, the president of the Convention, acting in cooperation with the Executive Board, may change the time and/or place of the regular meeting.
- Section 3. The Convention may meet at any additional time(s) and place(s) designated by the Convention at its annual meeting.
- Section 4. In an emergency the president of the Convention, acting in cooperation with the Executive Director, may call a special meeting of the Convention.

#### ARTICLE VIII: CONTRIBUTION AND FUNDS

- Section 1. The Cooperative Program shall be the chief means through which this Convention shall support its missionary endeavors.
- Section 2. All funds of this Convention shall be raised by voluntary contribution, provided this does not prevent the acquisition of funds or property by bequest, and provided that this does not prevent the use of any income from property that may be bequeathed to or purchased by the agencies thereof.
- Section 3. All designated offerings and special gifts accepted by this Convention shall be applied strictly according to the expressed will and direction of the contributor.

#### ARTICLE IX: AMENDMENTS

This Constitution may be amended in the following manner:

- (1) The proposed amendment(s) shall be presented in writing, with copies for the messengers, while the Convention is in session.
- (2) The proposed amendment(s) shall lie over until the next regular meeting of the Convention.
- (3) The proposed amendment(s) shall require a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the messengers voting for ratification.

#### ◀ Bylaws ▶

#### I -- TERRITORY

The Wyoming Southern Baptist Convention shall be composed of messengers from the cooperating churches in the State of Wyoming and other areas designated as a part of the Wyoming Southern Baptist Convention.

#### II -- OFFICERS

- 1. The officers of the Convention shall be nominated from the floor and elected by ballot beginning on the first evening of the annual meeting. When there is only one nominee, the election may be by acclamation of the body, or the vote of the body may be cast by the recording secretary.
- 2. The officers of this Convention, except the president, shall be eligible to serve indefinitely; the president will be eligible to serve only one elected term at a time, the lapse of one year being required before being eligible to serve again.

#### III -- EXECUTIVE BOARD

- 1. The Wyoming Southern Baptist Convention Nominating Committee shall nominate to the annual meeting of the Convention active members of cooperating churches, including pastors and other personnel, for service on the Executive Board. They shall be elected by the Convention.
- 2. The following rules shall govern Executive Board membership:
  - (1) From each association reporting a minimum of four (4) churches and three hundred (300) members, there shall be two (2) board members. There shall be no board members from associations smaller than this minimum but the board may invite one observer to sit in the meetings from such associations.
  - (2) Executive Board members shall be on a rotating schedule whereby approximately one-third (1/3) of the members come up for election each year.
  - (3) The term of office for Executive Board members shall not be more than three
  - (3) years. The rotating schedule of (2) above will necessitate electing members

to lesser terms. Each member shall be eligible to serve an additional three (3) year term, provided that no member shall serve more than six (6) years in succession without the lapse of at least one year.

(4) The following shall be ineligible for service on the Executive Board: (a) Employees of the Executive Board; (b) Those persons who have resided within the Convention for less than six (6) months; (c) Members of churches contributing less often than guarterly to the Cooperative Program.

(5) Both the current president and the retiring president shall be member-at-large of the Executive Board, whose presence on the Board shall not diminish an association's representation as stipulated in (1) above.

(6) Executive Board members who move out of the associational areas from which they were elected shall immediately retire from board membership.

- (7) Vacancies occurring between annual sessions of the Convention shall be filled by nomination of the Wyoming Southern Baptist Convention Nominating Committee to the Executive Board and election by the Board. The Nominating Committee shall consult with the leaders of the association involved in arriving at its nomination. A person so elected shall serve only until said vacancy can be filled by vote of the Convention at the next annual meeting. Election by the Board to interim vacancies shall be reckoned as a full year against a person's six years of eligibility under (3) above.
- 3. The Executive Board has authority to act for the Convention between annual meetings, except that it cannot impose its own will upon the Convention by contradicting or rescinding any action of the Convention taken at its regular meetings.
- 4. The Executive Board shall meet semi-annually at the times and places recommended by the Executive director and approved by the Board in its organizational meeting.
- 5. The Executive Board shall hold an organizational meeting as soon as possible after its members are elected at the annual meeting of the Convention. At this meeting the Board shall:
  - (1) Elect a chair, a vice-chair, secretary.
  - (2) Elect from the floor a Committee on Committees for the Executive Board and designate a chair.
  - (3) Establish the times and places of its semi-annual meetings as per /4 above.
  - (4) Receive or arrange to receive as soon as possible the appointment of the Program Committee and the Convention Committee on Committees by the newly elected president of the Convention.
  - (5) Conduct business of urgent nature that cannot wait until the semi-annual meetings.
- 6. Fifty percent (50%) of the members of the Executive Board shall constitute a quorum.

- 7. Employees of the Executive Board shall be utilized as resource persons to the work of the Executive Board.
- 8. The Executive Board shall organize committees necessary for the fulfillment of the work of the Convention ad interim as follows:
  - (1) The Committee on Committees, in consultation with the Convention Executive Director, shall present a program of committees and persons to serve, with designations of authority and chair, to the three board officers and the Convention president, past president, and Executive Director, by whose vote shall the plan of committee work be constituted and authorized. Person(s) serving both among the above named officers and on the Committee on Committees shall not vote, except the Executive Director, who may vote in the case of a tie.

(2) The chair of the Committee on Committees shall expedite the work of that committee to allow the newly formed committees adequate time to function prior to the first meeting of the Executive Board.

- (3) The chairman of the board shall be an ex officio member of all board committees. The Convention Executive Director shall be an ex officio, non-voting member of all board committees.
- (4) Vacancies occurring on committees after their initial formation shall be filled by appointment by the chairman of the board in consultation with the Convention Executive Director.
- 9. The Executive Board shall be the authorized legal agent in transacting business of the Convention. The chairman or vice-chairman of the Executive Board and the Executive Director of the Convention are authorized by the Executive Board to sign all legal papers for the Convention.

The nature of the business of our said corporation and the objects and purposes to be transacted, promoted and carried on, and for which our said corporation is formed, and the powers of our said corporation are as follows:

In the carrying out of the business of operating the Wyoming Southern Baptist Convention, its facilities and other properties, by purchase, grant, gift, devise, lease or otherwise; and to own, hold, enjoy and improve real property and all kinds of personal property to be used in connection with the objects of the corporation; and to acquire by purchase, subscription or otherwise, and to own, hold and dispose of stocks, bonds, or other obligations of any corporation for the purpose of aiding this corporation in its business; to borrow money, and to issue and sell notes, bonds, and debentures of the corporation; to secure the payment thereof; to pledge, mortgage, or otherwise encumber the franchises and property, real and personal, or any part thereof, owned by said corporation; to become the owner and holder of distinctive insignia; and, in general, to do all things necessary and proper in the discretion of the Executive Board. The objects, purposes and powers mentioned are

by no way of enumeration, and are not to be considered as a limitation upon the powers and objects of said corporation, it being intended that it shall have power to engage in all activities conducive to the spiritual welfare and religious life of its members, without limitation, and to have and exercise all the powers now or hereafter granted to corporations not for profit by the State of Wyoming.

10. The chairman of the Executive Board, in consultation with the Executive Director of the Convention, may call special meetings of the Executive Board for the transaction of business. Likewise, the chairman, after consulting with the Executive Director of the Convention, may cancel a meeting of the Executive Board. In the event of a cancelled meeting, Executive Board members shall be notified as soon as possible.

#### IV -- AGENCIES

- 1. Agencies of the Wyoming Southern Baptist Convention shall have not fewer than five (5) directors or trustees, nominated from among the active members of cooperating churches, including pastors and other staff personnel, by the Nominating Committee, and elected at the annual meeting of the Convention. These Directors or Trustees do not have to be members of the Executive Board.
- 2. The following rules shall govern service as a director or trustee of any Convention agency:

(1) Elected directors and trustees of all agencies shall be on a rotating schedule whereby approximately one-third (1/3) of them shall come up for election each year.

- (2) The term of office for directors and trustees of all agencies shall be not more than three (3) years. The rotating schedule of (1) above will necessitate electing directors and trustees to lesser terms. Each director and trustee shall be eligible to serve an additional three year term, provided that no director or trustee shall serve more than six (6) years in succession without the lapse of at least one (1) year.
- (3) Only active members of Baptist churches cooperating with the Wyoming Southern Baptist Convention shall be eligible to serve as directors and trustees.
- (4) Vacancies occurring between annual meetings of the Convention shall be filled by nomination of the Convention Nominating Committee to the Executive Board and election by the Board. The Nominating Committee shall consult with the directors or trustees and committees of that agency in arriving at its nomination. A person so elected shall serve only until said vacancy can be filled by vote of the Convention at the next annual meeting. Election by the Board to interim vacancies shall be reckoned as a full year against a person's six (6) years of eligibility under (2) above.
- (5) Every agency shall organize itself by the election of appropriate officers as soon as possible after its directors or trustees are elected at the annual meeting of the Convention. Every agency shall organize such committees as are necessary for the fulfillment of its responsibilities, and determine the authority of each

3. Mountain Top Baptist Assembly shall be an agency of the Wyoming Southern Baptist Convention. The trustees of Mountain Top Baptist Assembly, in consultation with the Convention Executive Director, shall assign a staff employee of the Wyoming Southern Baptist Convention to administer the assembly, executing the policies of the trustees.

#### V -- COMMITTEES

- 1. The Program Committee shall consist of the president (chair), and at least four (4) other members appointed by him at the organizational meeting of the Executive Board following the annual meeting of the Convention or appointed at such a time as shall be agreed upon by the Board, as per Bylaw III, 5, (4) above.
- 2. The Committee on Committees shall consist of at least five (5) members, including the designation of the chair, appointed by the president of the Convention. This committee shall nominate to the annual meeting of the Convention for service in the coming year the members and the chair of the Nominating Committee, and all other committees authorized by the Convention, for election by the Convention. This committee shall also appoint, in the opening session of the annual meeting of the Convention, those committees operating during the annual meeting, including the Resolutions Committee and the Time, Place, and Preacher Committee. Vacancies occurring in the Committee on Committees after initial appointment shall be filled by appointment of the President of the Convention.
- 3. The Nominating Committee shall nominate to the annual meeting of the Convention, members of the Executive Board and the directors and trustees of all agencies. The Nominating Committee shall also nominate to the Executive Board, persons to fill vacancies occurring ad interim of the annual meetings of the Convention. Nominations for interim vacancies shall be made with the consultations specified above. (Bylaw III, 2, (7) and Bylaw IV, 2, (4). Vacancies occurring in the Nominating Committee between annual meetings shall be filled by appointment of the President of the Convention.

#### VI -- CONVENTION EMPLOYEES

- 1. The Executive Board shall employ all Convention employees, except office secretaries.
- 2. The Executive Director shall employ all office secretaries in counsel with staff directors.
- 3. The Executive Director shall give general supervision and/or counsel to the work of the Convention through its departments and agencies. He shall receive and retain in the Convention office all historical data.
- 4. The Executive Director and all staff directors shall present a written report of their stewardship to the annual meeting of the Convention, and to the semi-annual meetings of the

Executive Board.

5. The Executive Board shall contract with all employees, except office secretaries, on an indefinite time basis. Thirty (30) days notice of desire to terminate the contract shall be given by either party, except by mutual agreement.

#### VII -- AMENDMENTS

These Bylaws may be amended in the following manner:

- (1) The proposed amendment(s) shall be presented in writing, with copies for the messengers, during any session of the annual meeting of the Convention except the final session.
- (2) After presentation, the presiding officer shall, in coordination with any adopted program, designate the time in a subsequent session when a vote will be taken.
- (3) The proposed amendment(s) shall require a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the messengers voting for ratification.

#### VII -- RULES OF ORDER

The New Testament and <u>Robert's Rules of Order, Revised</u> shall govern the conduct of the proceedings of this Convention, not otherwise provided for in the Constitution or Bylaws.

## ■ Executive Director's Annual Report by John W. Thomason

It was a very good year. We learned that Southern Baptists had become the largest evangelical denomination in Wyoming. We learned that from 1990 to 1992 our resident membership grew by 10.3 percent.

During the year the Eastgate Baptist Church, Torrington, affiliated with the Frontier Association and then merged with the Goshen Baptist Church to become the Emmanuel Baptist Church.

On October 3, 1993 the First Southern Baptist Church, Kaycee, constituted with 35 charter members.

We had some personnel changes. Norman and Flo Wagoner joined us in May as Mission Service Corps volunteers. He is Brotherhood director, building consultant and will coordinate volunteer groups. Last year he directed the work of our assembly. Flo has helped in numerous ways, but especially in hosting meals and as food coordinator for camps.

Lori North resigned after nine years. We are now operating with the two full-time support staff.

Bob and Marlene Robbins have agreed to give two more years as Mission Service Corps volunteers as caretakers for Mountain Top Baptist Assembly.

Our two partnerships are developing well. Five persons from the WSBC went to Paraguay in May. We will conduct our first project there over Thanksgiving. The partnership is for three years.

Three persons from Missouri came to Wyoming in August. On October 26 their convention approved a three year partnership. Plans are already underway for projects.

Our audit by the Home Mission Board showed we operated in the black in 1992. Through September of 1993 Cooperative Program receipts were up 2.5 percent over the same period in 1992. We are in the black by a small margin in 1993. Thanks be to the Lord.

The WSBC Foundation became functional with a constitution and by-laws. The Foundation is incorporated. It now manages assets of about \$60,000.

WSBC Horizons circulation grew to over 2,000 for the first time.

Stewardship education and development are still great needs in our churches and

missions. We are seeing some progress, but the potential is staggering.

It  $\underline{\text{was}}$  a very good year. We thank the Lord for what He is doing in and through our people, churches, associations and convention.

### ■ Evangelism/Missions Department Annual Report ► John Herrington, Director

Right now Southern Baptists are gearing up for the Here's Hope witnessing effort/harvest revivals of early '95. A Wyoming steering committee has been organized and will meet in early November to get plans rolling. This steering committee is made up of the state staff and six pastors and laymen.

Several churches are reporting increases in baptisms and it looks like we will have a good year. Right churches have booked the Wanda Jackson team for evangelism rallies the first week of October. Two of our churches have reported witness training events, the College Heights WMU and the First Southern Church in Worland.

Youth Encounter enrolled 160 campers with a total of 182 on the grounds. This year the youth camp was conducted twice. After a good evaluation of this strategy by all involved, plans are to again have two Youth Encounter camps next year.

The summer missions program brought 26 missionaries to our state. Out of this program, some 60 professions of faith were recorded. One of our hispanic couples reported 32 professions of faith in Casper.

In missions some exciting things are happening. Brother Ted Yarbrough was employed earlier this year as Church Starter for the new Northwest Community Baptist Church in Cheyenne. This has been an exciting development and the work there is growing.

Three hispanic couples worked in mission efforts across Wyoming this summer. New works were begun in Casper, Evanston, and Rawlins. These beginnings came out of <u>lasers</u> conducted in these areas. (A laser is a language new work probe.) Pastors are being sought at the present for hispanic work in Torrington, Cheyenne, and Kemmerer/Evanston. Curtis Boland is giving excellent leadership in this language work. Brother Boland was honored as "Catalytic Missionary of the Year" by the Home Mission Board.

We also are excited about new work starts in Woodruff out of Cokeville and the expansion of rural ranch ministries across the state: in north Albany/east Carbon counties,

and in the northeast area of the state. John Rose has come to the area north of Sundance as a Mission Service Corps volunteer to do a rural church ministry in that area.

All in all it looks like a good year.

# → Religious Education Department Annual Report ► Ben Early, Director

Another year has all too swiftly flown by. It has been a great year of learning, of accomplishment and challenges.

In December, Wyoming received an award from the BSSB for starting one new Sunday School per nine existing churches. We were also recognized by the Discipleship Training for the largest percentage increase in Christian Growth and Service Awards.

We trained the State ASSIST and VBS leaders and had excellent clinics. We plan to keep adding new names to our list of workers. VBS has moved to an all time high this year, many churches led their own VBS for the first time.

Church Architecture has been turned over to Norman Wagoner, who is a Mission Service Corps volunteer. In Family Ministries, Jimmy Stiles has served as our consultant and will become our state specialist. Lois Tribbett is state specialist for media library and won an award for her work at Paradise Valley, in starting a new library. Donna Guillot will serve as state specialist for Bible Drill Speakers Tournament.

Sunday School enrollment has been steady (hopefully a 10% increase) but we need to continue to work on enrollment and attendance.

We hosted 23 singing churchmen from Illinois who led conferences and served in our churches and associations. Two state future plans coming from this meeting will be a children's music camp and the formation of the Wyoming Singing Churchmen.

I have tried to hold more training conferences in local associations, plus I conducted a Sunday School Tour, an ASSIST Tour, and a Discipleship Training Tour. I've led Marriage Enrichment retreats, and Deacon and Wife Training events in local churches. In August I led a conference at Glorieta in witnessing for deacons. Also we hosted the BSSB for 1 of 13 listening sessions held in the Southern Baptist Convention. We worked with an intern from Southwestern Baptist University in the area of Religious Education.

Great Commission Breakthrough has helped many of our churches. Robin Gray has been selected as a special consultant to go and explain to churches the GCB process. We trained 15 new leaders and several others were re-trained.

BSM had a convention in Powell. Joe Sizemore is doing an excellent job.

Centrifuge enrolled 123 campers and counselors. Five were saved 21 made rededications and one surrendered to missions.
