Paul's love + hope for Israel - 9:1-3 10:1-3, 9, 10, 13;

Those who reject Christ - multitudes - all ages - horde
Infinite number - Their variety - kinds - a handful -
Jew or Gentile - who have rejected? What hope?

a burning vital matter with Paul -

How much he loved Christ! How he longed for heaven
"accursed"! "Damned!" - An oath!

He is desperately trying to find how they
may be saved.

It is God who chooses - God is free to act - man free to decide -
God's one object is to have mercy on all -

Everything depends upon God's sovereignty.

"I will have mercy on whom I choose to have mercy -
He has left acceptance or rejection in man's hand

Paul argues desperately for the salvation of his friends

His sovereign will set on man's salvation -

God assumes the responsibility of man's salvation.

God's divine sovereignty can never be defeated.

Paul reasons from his own experience -

{ "If he saved me - He can save anyone.

" " could save any one - He calls everyone
He will finally be all-victorious -

The terrifying power of sin to enslave -

The moving offer of salvation by faith to all men -

Every man has the ability to resist every
persuasion of crucified love -

But God will not be defeated

His persistent grace seeks until he finds -

"Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved"

The Sheep is lost.
 Will it surely be found?
 That depends on the sheep.

It will surely be found —
 for The Good Shepherd will go after the
 one which is lost, until he find it.
