(Author's Note: This is the first in a series of articles intended to acquaint our Baptist supporters with those dedicated men and women who are serving them on the staff of American Baptist Theological Seminary.)

Dr. Primrose Funches, Director of Promotion

Few if any Baptists need a long introduction of Dr. Primrose Funches. Her long years of service and devotion to the cause of National Baptists has endeared her to Baptists everywhere and has caused her name to become a household word. For that reason the author feels that she should head this series of presentations of our staff to the nation.

Dr. Primrose Funches, born in Crystal Spring, Mississippi, received her elementary and high school education in that state. Her higher education was received in New Orleans University in Louisiana, and Moody Bible Institute, Northwestern University Extension School, and Chicago College Preparatory School all in Chicago. The degree Associate in Religious Education was earned in American Baptist Theological Seminary. As the crown of several years of illustrative service to the Baptists, Arkansas Baptist College of Little Rock, Arkansas conferred upon her the degree, Doctor of Humanities. Among her many contributions to National Baptist life she has served as the Western Director of Young People of the Woman's Auxiliary to the National Baptist Convention for 24 years. She developed and built the Finance De-

partment for young people of the National Baptist Convention. Also director of Young People of Illinois; served as Field Director of Foreign Mission Board of National Baptist Convention for 10 years, at which time she traveled over America; worked as a member of the Bond Committee for the Sunday School Publishing Board; Associate Promotional Director, Finance Committee, National Baptist Convention; Business Manager, National Baptist Missionary Training School, Nashville, Tennessee; Chairman of Press Publicity and Radio Committee of National Baptist Woman's Convention. At present, she is Director of Promotion, American Baptist Theological Seminary, Nashville, Tennessee and National Western Director of Young People's Department, National Baptist Convention. She established the "Monthly Regular" system at the Seminary and last year \$11,757.03 was raised in donations alone from Churches, Associations, State Conventions and Individuals; a total from National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc., 1956-57 \$32,977.23. She also established the "Pantry Shower" at the Seminary. The churches and missionary societies are responding too.

She has raised more money for the Foreign Mission Board than any other representative; and for such splendid service the new wing of the Carrie V. Dyer Hospital in Africa is named for her.

She volunteered and planned a "Pantry Shower" for the National Baptist Training School, Nashville, Tennessee; she also sponsored the Lethia L. Craig Scholarship Fund for worthy students in both schools with far above 20,000 in it for the Young People's Department of the National Baptist Convention.

Dr. Funches turned aside from a successful career in business to do the work of the church. Prior to her career in religion she was head of the Bonding Department of Binga Bank, Chicago, Illinois and also employed at other times at the Lincoln State and Douglass Banks. Then too, she was owner of the Scarboro Funeral Home in Chicago.

In her busy schedule she has found time to travel extensively throughout Europe and the Holy Land. She has also been a delegate to three meetings of the Baptist World Alliance.

Dr. Funches is a member of the Olivet Baptist Church in Chicago and she worships at Fifteenth Avenue Baptist Church, Nashville, Tennessee.

30 Colleges, Universities, and Seminaries Join in the Inauguration of Dr. M. P. Turner, Jr. as Sixth President of American Baptist Theological Seminary

The administration of the sixth president of A.B.T. Seminary was officially begun December 10, 1957 with an all day series of stirring programs. Highlighting the morning program was a masterful and prophetic message delivered by Dr. W. Herbert Brewster of Memphis, Tennessee and newly elected chairman of the Educational Board of the National Baptist Convention U.S.A., Inc. Dr. Brewster called upon Christians to meet the challenge of evil head-on. Faculty, students, and alumni supported Dr. Brewster in this session. Remarks were also brought by the Reverend C. L. Dinkins representing the Sunday School Publishing Board, N.B.C., U.S.A., Inc.; the Reverend Harold Gregory, City Superintendent of Missions for the Southern Baptist Convention; the Reverend C. R. Williams, Baptist Training Union Board of the N.B.C., U.S.A., Inc.

The world of education and religion declared their esteem for Dr. Turner and the Seminary as they joined the Board of Directors in the climaxing service at 7:30 in the evening in the Fisk Memorial Chapel. Principal speaker for the occasion was Dr. R. E. Penn, pastor of First Baptist Church, Gary, Indiana and member of the Board of Directors of the Seminary. Dr. Penn's message will live long in the hearts and lives of all who heard it. Dr. Morris Burrell, pastor of Greater Mt. Zion Baptist Church of New Orleans, and member of the Board of Directors, officiated over this deeply impressive ceremony with marked dignity. Following a warm presentation of the president-elect by the Chairman of the Board of Directors Dr. I. H. Henderson, Jr., pastor of Friendship Baptist Church, Kansas City, Missouri, Dr. Homer Lindsey, pastor of First Baptist Church Jacksonville, Florida inducted the president into office. A most challenging charge was given Dr. Turner by President M. K. Curry of Bishop College, Marshall, Texas. The inaugural prayer was offered by the Reverend Kelly Miller Smith, pastor of First Baptist Church, Nashville, Tennessee.

Greetings were extended by Dr. Morris Burrell from the Board of Directors; the Reverend C. L. Dinkins from the National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc.; Dr. L. S. Sedberry from the Southern Baptist Convention; Major Robert Crawford from the A.B.T. Alumni; President Stephen J. Wright of Fisk University for the Learned Societies; President W. S. Davis of Tennessee A & I University for the Institutions of higher education in Nashville; President Harold West of Meharry Medical College, for the professional schools of Nashville; and Mr. Davis representing Mayor Ben West of Nashville.

Lloyd chairman of the housing committee, Mr. T. Q. Brooks chairman of the decorating committee, Mrs. Enoch Jones chairman of the reception committee, and Mr. Ransom Howard, chairman of the usher committee.



Dr. Harrison Henry Humes, president of the General Missionary Baptist State Convention of Mississippi and chairman of the National Baptist Bathhouse Commission, Hot Springs, Arkansas expired.

Impressive last rites for a noted nationally known Baptist leader were witnessed January 7 by an audience of

6,000 friends and associates.

Dr. Harrison Henry Humes died suddenly January 5, 1958. At the time of his death he was moderator of the Washington County Baptist Association, president of the General Missionary Baptist State Convention of Mississippi, member of the Board of Directors of the National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc., and chairman of the National Baptist Bathhouse Commission, Hot Springs, Arkansas.

He had also served as editor and publisher of the "Delta Leader" Newspaper for the past 20 years.

Dr. Joseph H. Jackson, pastor of Olivet Baptist Church, Chicago, president of the National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc., delivered a stirring eulogy at the funeral held in the auditorium of Coleman High School, Greenville, Mississippi. Many other prominent Baptist and civic and educational leaders paid final tributes to Dr. Humes.

Survivors are a wife, Mrs. Mary Chandler Humes; one daughter, Delano Faye; one son, Larry Jerome; two brothers, James and A. J. Humes; and two sisters, Mrs. Juliette Thompson and Mrs. Beatrice Baldwin.

The Baptist Ministers' Conference of Nashville and vicinity met at American Baptist Theological Seminary, Monday, February 3, 1958 and heartily endorsed the program of the seminary, that is to support Founders' Day which is April 29, the Garnett-Nabrit Lectures April 30-May 2 and the "Missionary—Religious Vocational Seminar And Work Shop." The speaker for Founders' Day will be the Reverend J. Royster Powell, Joliet, Illinois. Founders' Day, this year, will open the Garnett-Nabrit Lectures. The speakers will be: Institute Preacher—The Reverend William James Harvey, III, Pastor Macedonia Baptist Church, Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; Dr. Clyde T. Francisco, Professor of Old Testament, Southern Baptist Seminary; Dr. Henlee T. Barnett, Dean of Southern Baptist Seminary; Dr. W. Kendrick Grobel, Professor of New Testament in the School of Religion, Vanderbilt University; Dr. Robert E. Penn; and Dr. L. H. Henderson, Jr.

The Ministers' Conference will also serve as the Steering Committee for the second annual "Missionary—Religious Vocational Seminar And Work Shop," June 6, 7 and 8, 1958. Plan now to send delegates, missionary workers and choir leaders. Our churches need help in the training of women, young people, and musical directors. We believe we have the answer. Some of America's foremost Baptist leaders from many parts of the United States, specialists in missionary work and training of young people of both races will be here to inspire and counsel with them. It is our hope that many young people will dedicate their lives to Christian service, some in the ministry, others to missionary endeavors or Christian education. The speakers will be: Dr. D. E. King, Louisville, Kentucky; Dr. T. J. Jemison, Baton Rouge, Louisiana; Dr. W. A. Johnson, Chicago, Illinois; Dr. E. L. Harrison, Washington, D. C.; Reverend Kelly M. Smith, Nashville, Tennessee; Mrs. Marjorie Moore Armstrong, Springfield, Missouri; Mrs. Anna Mae Hunt, Kansas City, Kansas; and Mrs. Fred Terry, Cameron, Missouri.

Someone will say, why have so many "Missionary—Religious Vocational Seminars And Work Shops?" But most people need to be inspired, need to advance in their church

work and leadership; and we feel that we can not have too many of them. The better trained a person is, the more effective their work will be.

The enrollment fee is \$3.00, which includes room and board. Register now. The deadline is May 15. The American Baptist Theological Seminary is your school and we believe Baptists should train Baptists.

We are also happy to announce that the National Baptist Convention, U.S.A., Inc. voted in Hot Springs in its Adjourn Session to lease to the American Baptist Theological Seminary the National Baptist Training School building and the President's Home for a dollar a year. This, of course, is a step forward because we needed housing for the number of young women that are entering the seminary for Christian training. It was utterly impossible to house the young women with the young men. We are grateful to the National Baptist Convention and Dr. Jackson for coming to the rescue of the seminary. We look forward to a larger enrollment next year.

J. C. Miles Chair of the Bible

The high contributions to American Baptist Theological Seminary here by the late Dr. James Clarence Miles have been permanently assured a place in the seminary's history by establishment of a "J. C. Miles Chair of Bible" by his family.

Combined endowment funds made available by the proud family living here and by the seminary opens the new teaching opportunity. Seminary officials have announced plans to the "J. C. Miles Chair of Bible" position into operation as soon as possible. Money provided by the endowment will pay the salary of a new professor to come in and teach the Bible.

Dr. Miles died August, 1957. He had been connected with the seminary since 1930.

During these 27 years he had been founder and Director of seminary extension and correspondence; started the library about 1940 and served as librarian until 1949; set up the farm operation which furnished work for students and dairy products and food-stuffs for the dining hall, an activity he directed for about eight years; professor of Old Testament, Greek and Hebrew, and had taught nearly all courses in the curriculum at one time or another; secretary of the faculty; professor of the Old Testament at the time of his death.
