CONVENTION HI-LIGHTS -

102nd Southern Baptist Convention during 114 years meeting at Louisville, reported 18,000 strong with approximately 12,000 messengers. Ample facilities for Convention - often room to rattle around.

WMU and Pastors Conferences well attended. W. O. Vaught of Little Rock elected president and Wayne Dehoney, Jackson, Tenn., vice-president.

Commencement for Southern Seminary graduating class of 259, with impressive ser-

vice, featured first night.

Nominated for president, W. R. White of Baylor - E. Westmoreland of Houston -James Westberry and Roy McClain of Atlanta - Carl Bates of Amarillo - Wallace Bassett of Dallas.

Elected President, Ramsey Pollard of Knoxville, Tenn. - Vice President, W. R. Pettigrew, Louisville - 2nd Vice President, Bruce H. Price, Newport News -Kendall Berry, Chairman, Executive Committee, Blytheville, Ark.

Sustained the former 1954 action regarding Supreme Court ruling on school inter-

Declared War on obscene literature after presentation of samples from Louisville newsstands.

Adopted resolutions regarding world peace - recial tension.

Reported - 31,498 churches - 9,206,758 members - 407,892 baptisms - \$1,825,474,318 total gifts; with \$74,750,699 given to missions.

Appointed "observer" to United Nations meetings.

Voted to meet - Miami 1960 - St. Louis 1961 - San Francisco 1962 - Kansas City 1963

Atlantic City 1964, jointly with American Baptist Convention.

Adopted Budget of \$18,500,000. for its 20 agencies of which \$16,386,900 is needed for operating and capital needs.

Discussed again, the seating of messengers from Canadian Baptist churches. This would make necessary a change in constitution.

Continued conferences to promote cooperation with other Baptist groups.

Carver School not merged with Southern Seminary but to expand its program of work. Established new Stewardship Commission under Executive Committee. Gave Southern Seminary a healthy vote of confidence.

Foreign Missions night presented world challenge to full house. 1283 missionaries.

Home Missions night program was presented effectively with visual aids. Large crowd and presentation well received - 1282 missionaries plus 447 summer student workers.

The Convention stayed close to the heart of Baptist life, namely: evangelism, stewardship, and missions. Very few gloried in the sensational - Fewer were the "mike-happy" brethren. A minority group insisted on convention declaring statements regarding conflicts in social order, national and international affairs. Traditionally Southern Baptists have not entered this field.

Chaplains Commission - Excellent Booth in Exhibit Hall with record number of visitors. Excellent cooperation from Ft. Knox chaplains. Louis B. Parks, Houston, Texas represented Central Office. Spot on Convention program presented Baptist chaplain serving in Cuban Army with Robert P. Taylor, Deputy Chief Air Force Chaplains as speaker. "Outstanding speech of the Convention" said several.

Southern Baptist Chaplains Association luncheon attended by 182. Ladies of Beechmont Church supplied excellent meal. Dr. Wayne Oates of Southern Seminary leading panel which was new type of program and well received. Fellowship tops. Elected as President, Harry McKnight (AF Res) pastor, Briggs Baptist Church, Washington, D. C., Louis B. Parks, V.A. Chaplain, Houston, Tex. as Vice President, Robert Herndon (Army) on duty at Ft. Carson, Colo. as Secretary. President, W. W. Herrin, pastor Europa, Miss., and Director Geo. W. Cummins deserve commendation for this event.
