Extracts from a letter from Germany to the Editor of the Archives de christianisme, translated from the French Recorder.

Christians in France are familiar with the names of Lutz and Donau-moos. It has been announced that Lutz has returned to the bosom of the papal church, but what became of the pastor who embraced the truth under his ministry?

In consequence of the efforts of Lutz to place a Testament in every family in his parish and to teach them to read it with profit, he was cited before the ecclesiastical authorities and censured.

His situation in the Tyrol was often bad and refused. He reported that he embraced Protestantism, and his example was followed by many of his flock, and several of him were loved the Saviour.

He had been forced to leave Carlsbad, but amidst persecutions of every kind the little flock was not abated. They raised them up a minister full of life, of faith, humility and devotedness, in the person of George Paechner, who at the request of Lutz himself, was appointed pastor of the new reformed parish of Carlsbad.

There was neither temple nor paragon in the village. He established himself there, and the first time in March 1829, he received the communion agreeably to the usage of the evangelical churches, and not without those who were lively and zealous, which bind the pastor and his flock together.
