### ENROLLMENT PASSES 600

#### FIVE NEW COURSES HAVE BEEN

##### ADDED

Dr. H. E. Turlington, of Southern Seminary, has written the syllabus for New Testament II. The texts will be, Epochs in the Life of Paul by A. T. Robinson, and also New Testament History by H. F. Rall, a text used in New Testament I.

Christian Worldwide Missions is an historical study of missions. Dr H. C. Goerner of Southern Seminary is the author of the syllabus. The text is Forward Through the Ages by Basil Matthews.

Old Testament III, a study of the Psalms and Wisdom Literature has been developed by Dr. Clyde T. Francisco of Southern Seminary. The texts for the course are: Introducing the Old Testament by Francisco and Preaching from the Psalms by Dr. Kyle M. Yates.

Theology II was written by Dr. Charles Trentham of Southwestern Seminary and is a continuation of the study of the text, Christian Doctrine, Conner. This course majors on the Doctrine of Redemption.

Church Organizations was written by Professor John K. Durst, of New Orleans Seminary. It is an examination of the methods of the various units in the local church. The manuals of the various organizations form the texts for the course.

The Seminary Extension Department, beginning one year ago in Jackson, Mississippi, with no students, no courses, no office space, has seen its work grow to more than 600 students. Five hundred of these are correspondence students while 123 are enrolled in Extension Centers. Within a period of ten months 35 courses have been completed, with 18 re-enrollments.

The courses have been offered on the general level of college work with credits toward a Diploma in Theology. Our first student was Wayne Upton, who enrolled in Old Testament in September, 1951; he is a service man now overseas.

The total who have enrolled in Old Testament I is 340. 139 have begun the study of New Testament I, and 181 are enrolled in Sermon Preparation. Other courses are: Evangelism with 14 enrolled, Church Leadership with 75 enrolled, Theology I with 19 enrolled, Hebrews with 22 enrolled, and 6 who have re-enrolled in Old Testament II. The Department has sent out a total of 796 courses.

#### PROFESSORS CHANGE SCHOOLS

Dr. S. A. Newman, Chairman of the Commission, and Dr. R. T. Daniel have joined the faculty of our new Seminary, Southeastern. Both were formerly with Southwestern.

The director has just returned from a series of conferences with associational, and state leaders in North Carolina and Oklahoma. It is possible that additional centers will be established in both states. Tulsa, Winston Salem, and Ardmore each had representative groups to hear the director speak about the organization and function of the Seminary Extension Center.
