1. Any person who takes a paper regularly from the post-office, whether directed to his name or another, or whether he has subscribed or not, is responsible for the paper.

Newspaper Decisions.

2. If any person orders his papers discontinued he must pay all arrears owing or the publisher may continue to send it until payment is made, and collect the whole amount whether it is taken from the office or not.

Newspaper Decisions.

3. The courts have decided that refusal to take newspapers or periodicals from the post-office, or removing and moving them unsealed for in prima facie evidence of intentional fraud.
