

well formed habit of study, yet they all seem to possess a wonderful ability to absorb the truth. And the truth which they so readily receive from the lips of others they almost always preach to the people of their respective congregations. It was estimated by those who were good judges that much of the instruction given during the six days of the Savannah Institute to the forty-seven ministers and eighty-two deacons would be repeated with more or less accuracy to not less than twenty thousand people. What a glorious privilege to preach by proxy to so great a multitude!

I need not say, under these circumstances, that I enjoy my work. I can conceive of no earthly work that yields more pleasure as the time it is being done, or that promises a richer reward hereafter, than that of teaching those whom the Lord Jesus has called and ordained to the work of preaching the gospel.

I am glad to learn that you have undertaken the publication of a religious weekly paper for the special benefit of the colored Baptists of the South. It is something that is very much needed. Such a periodical, "free from all sectionalism and from all party bias," full of sound gospel truth and religious news from all parts of the field, would be of incalculable value, and ought to have a circulation at once, of at least one hundred thousand, among the intelligent pastors and membership of the colored churches.

My general plan of work is to devote one month to each State. This month (November), I give to Alabama, December to Mississippi, January to Louisiana, February to Texas, March to South Carolina, April to North Carolina, and May, perhaps, to Kentucky; holding about four institutes in each State.




