There are many who are in favor of a more elaborate system of criminal jurisprudence, and go back to the simpler and ruder methods of punishment. The method of hanging, which is the only one that is left, is a relic of a barbaric age.

What is imperatively demanded is that our present Legislature shall devise some plan which will give practical and permanent relief. If additional Penitentiaries or new ones are required, let them be all means be built, and that at once.

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them. If they work and save a living themselves, they add to the total of human production and relieve others of the burden of their support. On the other hand, these criminals do not work, the rest of us must work just so much harder, or, what is the same thing, pay just so much higher taxes to sustain them in idleness.

It is a thief, by the fact of his being one, entitled to any such consideration? Ought honest men to be compelled to work to support him? These are the real questions which laboring men everywhere ought to ask themselves, instead of listening to the silly twaddle of those "labor reformers" who prate about the "rivalry of convict labor."

Second, by supporting convicts in idleness, we are practically encouraging the very propensity and continuing the very system of things which in nine cases out of ten make more criminals, and which it is the business of State prisons not to encourage, but to exterminate.

Third, the desire to live without work—to get something for nothing—lies at the very foundation of a very large proportion of the crime in the world. One of the most heathful corrections of the criminal intellect is hard work, and nothing encourages that instinct more than idleness voluntarily or enforced. Indeed, the experience of prison managers the world over indicates that steady employment is one of the most necessary elements in prison discipline and most important adjuncts in prison reform.

Idleness is a crime, and is always bad, early, unmanageable, and are certain to grow worse; while, on the other hand, are teachable, and when the amount of labor is apportioned and divided by enlightened judgment, are much more likely to become useful citizens when the term of their imprisonment has expired.

Indeed, the arguments in favor of keeping prisoners who are actually employed are so overwhelming that it is astonishing that at this day the voice of the demagogue should be heard in the land repeating the absurd cry of "rivalry." There is no "rivalry," there can be none between honest and criminal labor. In the last place, it is well known that the convicts are now, to some extent, employed by contractors inside the prison. Indeed, we have been informed that, with what has been said, can not say that the convicts are sometimes driven to their work when they are not physically conditioned to perform their tasks.

But the greatest evil is the rivalry of the two classes of labor. It is a rivalry which is a source of much trouble to the prison management. If a convict man goes to a shoemaking shop, he knows very well that he may not work at shoeing; if he may labor in a honp factory, he may not be allowed to work in building up a dam, or in clearing a river.
