Gov. Brown's donation, if certain conditions are complied with, secures for all time the support of a single Professor in the Seminary. But it will not pay a dollar of the Seminary's expenses. The immediate necessities of the Seminary are in no wise relieved or lessened by it.

ANSWERS.

1. To the first question we answer, they ought not. Letters of dismission should, in all cases, state that the dismission member is in full fellowship with his church, and how can that be truthfully said when he is at variance with other members of the church? It is the duty of the church to see that members who are at enmity with each other are reconciled, and it should not avoid responsibility by dismissing in good standing one who is not in fellowship with his brethren. In so doing the church would make itself a party to the wrong.

2. To the second question we must answer in the negative. Persons can not be received into membership on the credit of letters from other denominations, and so letters can not properly be given to unite with a church of another denomination. It would be manifestly inconsistent for one church to dismission or recommend its members to unite with another church with which it did not hold fellowship. In fact, a church can not do such a thing without indorsing what it believes to be error.

3. To the third question we say, there is but one thing that a Baptist church can do with such members, and that is to withdraw the hand of fellowship from them. They have violated covenant obligations; they have "denied the faith"; they have profaned the Baptist name; they have placed themselves, in some important particulars, in direct antagonism with Baptists and deserve to be excluded. By neglecting or refusing to exclude such members, a church gives a quasi indorsement to their error and becomes a partaker of their evil deeds.
