THE AMERICAN BAPTIST RELATIONSHIP AND THE TEXAS BAPTIST (or at least a prominent correspondent) are somewhat exercised about the Theological Seminary, and especially, the preachers of Louisville, or all denominations, meet together once a month to discuss the subject of general interest.

The body has no connection with the Seminary whatever. At the invitation of these preachers, Dr. Broadus presented before them an essay on the inspiration of the Scriptures.

A Sorry Plight.

At the opening of our recent conference held at the Hotel Grand, that paper with candidness to give form its readers that there is "a considerable amount of truth" in the assertion that Mormonism was derived from Campbellism. When the affair had arrived at this beautiful state, we likewise entered our protest in connection with that of the Standard's "good brother." We now desire to ask whether the Standard, after such a precious performance, is not indeed a pretty preacher of morals and decency? Can it make pretensions to piety and piety such an act of "vainglorious" conduct? Let it survey the stains upon its own garment before it undertake again to itself up as a censor. Calling a few choice and elegant expressions from its own columns, we might be able to remind the Standard that in this "digressing affair" it is a "damning" of the Baptists, is guilty of a "mean device" and of a "vainglorious" act of a "wickedly sectarian" nature. How would the Standard like that paper to protest against it? Does it not really deserve a dose of salt? But we will not return railing for railing.

The Standard has gotten itself into a sorry plight. "They have dugged a pit, into the midst whereof they are fallen themselves."
