Sacrifice and Atonement.

I was much reminded of my essay on the Difference between the Sacrifice and Atonement of Christ, read by me before the Kentucky Baptist Ministers' Meeting at Hopkinsville, on reading a sermon preached at Henderson, Ky., June 18, 1883, by my beloved brother, B. T. Taylor, of Brownsville, Mo.; and I am gratified at your publishing it. There are some things in that sermon that need correction; and had Bro. Taylor read my essay, he certainly would not have made them. Bro. Taylor says, in describing the tabernacle or temple, that "the larger apartment was called the sanctuary. Into this gathered, once a year, on a solemn day, the pious Jews, who, connected with the preparations prescribed by their ritual." Where, in all the Scriptures, is this to be found? My word is not rather infer, from reading the Word of God, that the holy place was only entered by the priests and Levites, daily (and not only on the day of atonement), to offer incense at the time of morning and evening prayer, and to renew the lights on the golden candlestick; and on the Sabbath to remove the oil shewbread, and to place the new on the table. See Lev. Num. 3:5-10, 13:1-7, 16:9-10, etc.; Lev. 24:5-8, etc.

Speaking of the great day of atonement, he says: "On the occasion to which the text refers, the high priest dressed in the robes of his office, bearing the blood of the atoning sacrifice, had entered the holy of holies. The devout Jew, kneeling or standing in the sanctuary, joined with their priest in his atoning intercessions." This my beloved brother learned not from Lev. 16:17, where it is said, "And there shall be no man in the tabernacle of congregation when he goeth in to make an atonement in the holy place, until he come out, and have made an atonement for himself, and for his household, and for all the congregation of Israel." All places were cleared, when the high priest went in to make an atonement in the holy place, to teach men that there is no partnership in making an atonement for sin, which was typical of the fact that atonement for sin is made only by Christ our high priest, and that none can help or assist him. I know that, upon a moment's reflection, Bro. Taylor believes that.

Again, in his arguments, he is calculated to make the impression that Christ was crucified on the day of atonement, rather than on the preparation day of the Passover, which is the only day on which the atonement was made for the sins of the people. Now, I do not believe that Christ was crucified on the day of atonement, but on the preparation day of the Passover. I agree with him in the other passages cited in this part of his sermon, but not in I John 2:2, for a word equivalent to the word atonement is here used by the apostle, and therefore we are not permitted to apply it to the sacrifice, as Bro. Taylor did. John wrote to Christian Jews, and to them he says, "I do not for ours only," who believe in Christ, but also all Gentile believers. The Jews very commonly use the word atonement when writing about the sacrifice, and therefore the apostle addressed to them the Roman epistle (I John 2:2), that there is no propitiation for the Gentiles, is erroneous. When the Jews used this phrase, without any reference to the sacrifice, it was always used in a limited and restrained sense; as when they say, "it happened to a certain high priest that when he went out of the sanctuary, 'the whole world' went after him"—i. e. the people of the temple.
