Good News. We have good news from Mexico. The Governor of the State of Coahuila, and other liberal citizens of that Republic, offer to give four Southern Baptist Convention property to the value of \$150,000 for the use of schools and orphanages in that country. The property is said to be well adapted, and also offer to give the Convention \$50 a year on every orphan cared for in these institutions, that sum being ample for all the wants of a child in that country. This large and valuable property is offered to our Convention on condition that we expend \$20,000 in furnishing the institutions, and keep them up, which will require an outlay of about \$8,000 to \$10,000 annually thereafter.

Rev. W. D. Powell, our missionary at Saltillo, the capital of the State of Coahuila, is now in Richmond in conference with our Foreign Mission Board about this matter. He is accompanied by two distinguished officials of his State, Don Severo Fernandez, Mayor of Saltillo, and Don Jose Maria Cardenas, Superintendent of Public Instruction. These distinguished gentlemen are sent hither by the Governor, at his own expense, to give any information and assurance that our Board may want in regard to this very liberal and unexpected offer. They are also here to study our institutions and customs, especially our almshouse institutions.
