News in General.

CITY.

STATE.

Arthur captured the Mason and Merrett Republican county convention. An "Report and Resolutions Association" was formed Thursday by a large meeting of delegates at Crutcher, Ky., the capital being fixed at Ellettsville.

Major John Ripper died at Frankfort. The Kentucky House of Representatives will meet to adjourn the 15th.

The House passed the bill appropriating \$5,500 to the Kentucky Institution for the Blind. A bill to prevent the spread and introduction of infectious diseases among cattle was passed by the House.

The Senate began the consideration of the Naval Appropriation bill, and a general disposition in favor of liberal appropriations for small defense was manifested.

In the House of Representatives, Monday, the bill for the relief of C. C. Corcoran, of Ohio, in respect to the duty on wool was defeated by a vote of 125 to 118.

The Senate has passed the Educational bill. The measure as passed provides for the distribution among the States in proportion to their share on the basis of population of 100,000, a part of the money to be extended over a series of eight years.

New York City's total debt is \$25,774,721.40. Gov. Crozier, of Montana, reports that many of the Indians in that Territory are on the verge of starvation.

Northern capitalists are busy buying up the pine lands of Eastern Texas. As the forests of the North disappear, new crops of sugar beets and other crops are due to Western States.

A profit item in the case of Hon. J. B. F. H. has been secured for its 10th anniversary. Mr. Stanley will have the Congo on a prolonged foreign trip. He will go to England in an hour.

The measles are reported to be very bad in several Southern States. It is estimated that 4,000 people left East Texas for the W. at during the past winter. Last year there were 30,000 deaths in New York City and 25,000 in Florida. The city is thus shown to be somewhat dependent upon outsiders for its future population.

The distillers since their defeat in Congress, have revived the project of exporting their whisky, and, returning it, put it into the warehouse again for another two years.

Two building contractors at Cincinnati have agreed that the Court House of that city can be returned to its good condition in a few weeks for the sum of \$100,000.

Chairman Morrison, of the Ways and Means Committee, has announced that an effort will be made on Tuesday, the 15th inst., to call up the tariff bill.

Eight prisoners escaped from the Green county, Ark., jail by assaulting the jailer. Three of them perished there, and in the jail which followed one of the prisoners was killed and three others wounded and captured.

The nation of Confederates and Federal soldiers and others met at Shiloh, battle ground on the 10th of October, for the first time, the battle fought there on the 6th of April, 1862. A number came from the North, from Kentucky, from the South and Ohio, about 40,000 people in all.

Over 200,000 worth of apples are now on hand in Tallapoosa county, Ala., during the present week.

The steamer Schomachers arrived at Baltimore with the grand breeze states of Martin Luther.
