John, "can't fill her ome." Nor can they be changed without changing the truth of God itself. And if the old tabernacle and the service of religion stood unchanged, how much more should the New Testament church and its ordinances stand unchanged.

(9) It is furthermore clear that there is an institution in existence which Christ recognizes as his church; for he says, "Upon this rock will I build my church," and that it is a definite something that men can know is evident from his instructions in the care of persistently rebellious members. "Tall it into the church." Besides all this, if the church have no definitely outlined constitution in the Scriptures, if it be any organization that men may choose, to set up, why not, as the Old Testament church, or a Manichee lodge or church and have it so recognized? How, on such principles as these, can any one know whether he has submitted to it or not?

The whole weight of Scripture testimony, as also the dictates of reason, bear us to the conclusion that Christ has established a church, and outlined its constitution and its laws. We are not saying in this article which of the religious bodies is patterned after the divine model. We are only saying that the model is perfect; furthermore, that every Christian is patterned after Christ. If Presbyterians are, others are not. If Baptists are, others are not. If we stand on solid ground. We can not stop it. This is our "peculiar-ity."

Give Them Something to Do. The young converts we mean. It is an old saying that the devil always finds something for idle hands to do, and it is a true saying; and the reason why there so many loose and dissipated and inefficient in our churches, is that the members are not put to work. If we would keep Christians out of the world—away from places of worldly amusements—give them work to do for Christ, and the time to begin it, when the young converts are gathered into the churches. The first six months of a Christian's life, ordinarily, will determine as to whether he is a Christian worker. If he is brought into a given church, and there sits down in idleness, he naturally begins to feel that there is nothing expected of him. Others will do the work. He simply exists, and is carried along by the church all his life. And right here is one of the evils of once a month preaching among our country churches. "The preacher in charge," in most cases, is not a pastor. He is simply a supply. He visits the members of the church only once a month. He can not shepherd the flock. He can not plan for the long term of communion to Christ. He can not put himself into the work of the church. He can not train the young to work for Christ. As a result they grow up without any felt sense of responsibility. They go to the house of God when they feel like it. Beyond that, they do nothing. We are not quite clear as to how we are going to get out of this. But this we know, we must get out of it. We must get out of our churches will die. Churches can not live on fatal, epidemic revivals of religion once a year. There must be systematic work done all the year through. Plans must be laid; the forces must be organized; the young converts must be trained to work for Christ, then the churches will begin to reveal their power, everywhere pushing forward in the pathway of conquest and victory.
