The American Bible Society, at its anniversary meeting, May 13, 1898, endorsed the action of its Board of managers on the subject of the proposed Library, by approving of the following resolution:

Resolved, That it is appropriate that money for the printing of Bibles in foreign languages, the managers feel at liberty to encourage only such versions as conform to the principle of their translation to the common English version, at least so far as all religious denominations represented in this society.

This society was organized expressly for carrying on Bible work, and has produced a Bible in an English and Spanish edition. It is now thought best to so far reduce the number of our organizations as to make the Bible work a distinct department of the work of the American Bible Publication Society.
