The official figures of the tobacco crop of Kentucky for 1887, as reported to the Auditor of Public Accounts in the Annual Report for 1887, were a decrease over the crop of 1886 of 138,900,738 pounds, or nearly 21,000,000 pounds more than the entire crop of 1886. Graves county raised the largest crop for both years, but for 1887 there was a diminished yield of 2,002,100 pounds. The greatest fall-off of it was shown in Daviess county, where the crop of 1887 did not equal the crop of 1886 by 7,700,500 pounds. Christian county showed a decrease of 4,082,500 pounds; Henderson, 2,850,700 pounds; Hopkins, 3,368,500 pounds; Owen, 3,368,500 pounds; Warren, 3,102,250 pounds; and Webster, 3,305,250 pounds. The following are the figures for the past two years: 1887, 2,553,900 pounds, and 1886, 2,747,100 pounds.

Preservation of Eggs.

Australian eggs are preserved in the following simple manner: The vessels in which the eggs are to be placed are glass jars with patent stoppers, vulcanized India rubber joints making them perfectly air-tight. As soon as the eggs have been collected the jars are placed in hot water for some time, and left until the air in them has become thoroughly warm and rarified. The jars, having been heated, the eggs are wrapped up in paper to prevent them knocking together, and placed in a warm receptacle, their pointed ends being uppermost. The jars are immediately closed, and then, and not until then, are removed from the hot water.

The great secret of success in carrying out the method described is no doubt to thoroughly heat the air in the jars. The eggs will stand a better chance of keeping if the paper in which they are packed is previously baked and used warm. Patent stoppered jars are not absolutely necessary, any stopper answering which will actually exclude the air. At the late Birmingham (England) show, prizes were offered for the best dozen of preserved eggs, and these were given, as was the case the year previous, to eggs which had been preserved in water, or packed in dry salt. Samples were shown covered with melted wax, lard, oil or lard, and all these were good. But, strange to say, one exhibit which had been preserved with pure vasoline as soon as laid was the worst of all. All the eggs were putrid.

There is nothing more palatable, wholesome, and medicinal than good ripe peaches. It is a tonic to the system, and is well eaten at breakfast. It would be better if our people would eat less bread and more fruit. In the morning there is an acid state of the secretions, and nothing is so well calculated to correct this as cooling acid fruits, such as peaches, apples, etc. The apple is one of the best of fruits. Baked or stewed apples will generally agree with the most delicate stomach, and are especially useful in cholera cases. Green or half-ripe apples stewed and sweetened are pleasant to the taste, cooling, nourishing, laxative, far superior in many cases to the aluminous cases of salt and oil usually given in fever and other diseases. Raw apples stewed are better for constipation than some pills. Oranges are very acceptable to most stomachs, having all the advantages of the acids alluded to; but the orange juice alone should be taken, not the fruit."

Potash for Fruit.

Apples trees are constantly taking up potash from the soil and storing a large portion of it in the wood, and as the wood decays it is lost to the tree. It is sometimes a death in fruitage, because of a scanty supply of this essential fertilizer available for use. Where trees have been standing for years deriving from the natural supply, it is not applicable, it is not at all surprising that there should come a time when the available supply is exhausted; not only the potash, but all other mineral plants. This is undoubtedly the case of trees in old orchards. As a rule, farmers are adverse to cultivating orchards, and at the same time seem to fall in the realization of the fact that during all the years the potash has been taken up from the soil for the supply of necessary food to trees there is nothing better nor more natural than ashes, and unless supplied, a course of failure is reasonably to be anticipated. Spreading broadcast brings the potash to the surface, and it is not difficult to see the roots of the trees and become at once available. A dressing in summer while fruit is forming will greatly aid in its development, and it seems to have a special effect in the refreshing process. —Exchange.
