We have observed a change in the conduct of revival meetings which seems to us unhealthy. There is lively singing and vigorous preaching to be sure, but there is less emphasis on the word of prayer. It is as if the word of prayer were a word of power, as if it were to be reduced to a mere nothing. Only a "word of prayer" is not interesting for the people, so wrestling with God in earnest supplication. He seeks about the prayer and have it over, so do it in a way that will please the sinner and incline him to accept the invitation to come forward to be baptized in the holy room, or to do whatever he is asked to do. The purpose seems simply to persuade men to accept the Gospel, as if the only parties to be considered were the preacher and the sinner.

Formerly there was more prayer in the meetings, the brethren believing that the important thing was to be our God's presence and power. They felt that regeneration was the work of the Holy Spirit, and that it was not to be procured by man's efforts. If the Spirit did his work on the hearts of the people, there would be a revival, and so the brethren relied upon the Spirit, trusting in a good deal of time praying for his coming. It was no "word of prayer" with them, and they felt it was more important to please God than to please men.

We used to expect our dependence on God. "Except the Lord build the house they labor in vain who build it." It is needful to persuade men, but so man will be persuaded to repent without the Holy Spirit. Men do not convert themselves by "sounding brass." The Holy Spirit is the power converting that is done. Let there be more earnest prayer in our meetings. This has been said that the way to have a genuine revival is to have men labor to "get up a revival, but to pray our own."


