Remarkable Peruvian Cotton. Heretofore mentioned, with some apparent doubts in his own mind, that the best productions of India was a kind of wool which grew on trees.

Which is becoming noted in commerce as the specific product of the department of Piura in Peru. It first came into the market as a result of the heavy rains caused by the civil war in America, when early in the month of February rose from 330,000 pounds to 4,000,000 pounds in 1865.

Since then, owing to its singular qualities, the demand has constantly out-distanced a continual increase in its production, and the indications are that an enormous development of this industry will take place in Piura within the next few years, aided by irrigation works and systematic colonization.

This cotton is of the "long staple" variety, the fibers, however, being of an extraordinary length, and in their crinkly character possessing so close a resemblance to wool that a microscopic examination must be made to show that it is not a wool to distinguish one from the other. It is this quality which has made the fame of Piura cotton, since it is an invaluable commodity for the manufacture of goods.

When combined with wool in the warp it gives additional strength without affecting the texture of the cloth, and is used by the makers of the best of the cotton market, but with the value of wool, and on an average it is worth about one-half as much as wool. It is now being raised in five cents per pound more than the highest grade of other cottons.

Piura is the easternmost western city of Peru, and is situated on the banks of the Piura river. The western part is a semi-desert, similar to the western coast of Peru, but the rivers of the region are very fertile, and the soil is of a rich, loamy nature.

Once in every seven years, with the phenomenal regularity, heavy rains visit the region, causing the overflow of large tracts in the river valleys, and in these years the production of cotton is increased to double its usual amount.
