Make a plain batter of half a pound of wheat flour, add three eggs, yolks and whites, and a table-spoonful of sugar. Stir the mixture well with a wooden spoon. Then add slowly a cup of cold milk. Beat the batter thoroughly until it is perfectly smooth and light. For an apple fruit cake, pour enough of the batter into a tiffin-pan to cover the bottom, and spread a layer of stewed apples on it. Let it cook for about three minutes on the top of the stove, then slip the frying-pan in a hot oven to bake for five minutes. For an orange pancake prepare the batter in the same way. Cut the orange into thin, round slices, cross wise, remove the seeds, cover the bottom of the frying-pan in the same way, and spread the orange slices on the bottom, then add a little of the uncooked batter. Finish it in the oven in the same way as the apple.

The Blackberry.

Among the most profitable of berries is the blackberry. Hardy in culture and prolific in bearing, it is well adapted to cultivation, it should have a place in every garden.

When raised for market purposes, the berries are successful after the blackberry and raspberry, and the berry-grower, being equipped with crates, stands and baskets, can add the blackberry to his other fruit crops with but little expense and trouble.

The price in market is, if anything, less liable to fluctuation than the prices of the strawberry or raspberry. Even when the wild blackberry is selling for four or five cents per quart, the cultivated variety seldom falls below ten cents.

Blackberry is a good keeper, and is more easily picked than the raspberry. We have always found the pickers two cents per quart for picking the wild blackberry, and one cent for the berries, and the pickers always give the blackberry the preference.

In buying plants, see that you get stock that are not dry. That is, the roots should have three or four inches of the stalk attached to the roots. Layers are long roots cut into pieces from six to eight inches long. They will grow and make good vines, but are much slower in throwing out buds from the root than the stalk plant. Consequently, the first year's growth is very apt to be stender and upright, and, as this wood is what will produce fruit the next season, it is obvious that a stocky, shrubby growth is the one to be sought for.

Give the plants a little room between the rows, and also in the row, than you would when planting the strawberry, for the second year the vines will multiply enormously and need more space than the usual given to raspberry cultivation. Growers have tried to plant them closely, but have failed. This is also true with raspberries, as Davidson's thornless raspberry testifies to any that have tried it.
