THE COOPERATIVE PROGRAM AT WORK IN GREEN HILL

Under the railroad trestle, through the sparkling waters of Silver Creek, and up the narrow, winding path, the Green Hill Baptist Mission stands as peaceful as the towering tulip poplars and pines that surround it. This Green Hill Mission, an arm of the Beatyville Baptist Church, is only one of many missions your Executive Board of the General Association of Baptists in Kentucky is helping to support through its Church Centered Mission program. Had it not been for such support at various times in the past, Green Hill might be no more than a memory today.

When the coal mines on this area of Lee County were closed, depressed economic conditions would have forced the church to close its doors had the Beatyville Church not agreed to accept both members and property of this church.

Students from Georgetown College made the 170 mile round trip each Sunday, holding Sunday school and preaching services at this and several other mission points. They were paid only expenses by the State Mission Board. When these young men graduated the

work seemed to wane until, by 1957, no services were being held there.

Bill Curl, another Georgetown student, served as summer missionary to Beatyville and, with the pastor and others from the church, held a Vacation Bible School there in June of 1957. They found many children and adults who were not attending Sunday school or church services anywhere. When several from the Bible School professed Christ as Saviour and were baptised, it was felt that Sunday school should be held at Green Hill.

Along with Bill Dempsey, Sonny Murray, a senior at Lee County High School, who serves as associate superintendent, and several teachers, classes are held each Sunday with an average attendance of about thirty-five.

The pastor at Beatyville is a county missionary who is partially supported by the State Mission program. He is directly responsible for the various missions established by the mother church. With such a program, your Cooperative Program dollar is carrying the good news of Christ to Green Hill, to Tokyo, to Nyassaland, to Lagos, to wherever our pastors and missionaries are sharing their lives in His service.

The Church Treasurers Can Help

Several church and associational treasurers have asked the question "What can we do that will help when we send in our contributions?" This co-operative spirit is encouraging, and briefly, there are a few things which will be of great help in the realm of time-saving.

1. Use the printed remittance blanks when transmitting contributions to your office. (These are furnished you upon request.) These remittance blanks provide space for all the information we need to post to our records and to disburse the contributions to the causes which you desire. There is the space for "the Cooperative Program amount" and the most commonly used "Designations." Blank spaces are provided for Designations which are not listed.

2. Always show correct church name. There are so many different churches with almost identical names that it is important (even necessary) for you to show the exact name on the remittance blank which accompanies your check or Money Order.

3. Furnish the name of the association with which your church is affiliated. This is extremely important due to the fact that so many churches have the same identical names. For example, there are 23 churches in our state named "Liberty"; 21 named "Salem"; 14 churches named "Providence"; 8 named "Antioch"; 7 named "Bethany"; 7 named "Harmony." There are 25 named "Bethel" or with Bethel as part of the name. There are 36 churches with "Oak" as a part of the name. Thus, you readily can see how important it is to get the exact name and association. In many cases the only difference is the association's name.

4. Make your check or Money Order payable to W. C. Boone, Treasurer. Any other payee makes it necessary to return it or forward it to the one to whom it is made payable and request its endorsement and return.

5. Send in your church's contributions in time to reach us before the last day of the month. This helps us to close out our monthly report on a more satisfactory basis. It is evident that when the contributions from all the churches for a particular month are entered into our records the same month, the picture portrayed by our records is much more meaningful and helpful. This effort on your part would certainly be a welcome favor to the Treasurer's and Accountant's offices.

6. Address the envelope clearly and correctly in order that no delay will be encountered on the part of the Post Offices handling your letter. The correct address is:

Kentucky Baptist Building

7. Make one check to cover everything on the Remittance Blank.

8. Where Special Designations are included in your contributions, be very definite in the explanation; giving the mailing address if known, etc. For example where an individual is involved in your designation, the name and his field of endeavor are important factors in delivering your gift to him quickly. If we must make research (we often have to do much research) before transmitting it to him, this naturally causes some delay.

Cooperative Program contributions from the W. M. U. organizations should be transmitted to W. C. Boone, Treasurer, and may be included with your regular church check.

However, Designations from your W. M. U. Organization should be put on a separate check and made payable to Mrs. W. H. Jaegle, Treasurer. These should be mailed to her at Kentucky Baptist Building, Middletown, Kentucky.

9. When a new church treasurer is elected, please send us his name and address immediately. We have no way of finding out his name and address unless you tell us.

Stanley Lowell Answers
Jesuit College President**

WASHINGTON 6, D. C. — For ten years we have been predicting this; now here it is: The statement issued by Father Edward B. Rooney for the Presidents of American Jesuit educational institutions issued at Georgetown University, January 4, 1958,* that "federal aid should be made available on an across-the-board basis," for Roman Catholic students and schools, is a blueprint for discord in America. The fact that nation-wide hysteria over sputnik has been used to cloak the real aim of this manouever will not deceive the American people. It is familiar practice to exploit crises to obtain public funds for private purposes. This is a call to arms for all who believe in our historic principle of Church-State separation.

We see nothing in the President's program that either contemplates or justifies a sectarian demand of this kind. As we read the recommendations federal aid is proposed for public education only, quite in harmony with our country's tradition.

If Roman Catholic schools are to receive grants for the testing and counseling program outlined in the President's proposals, for salaries of additional faculty members and for subsidies to existing faculty salaries—then the First Amendment will have been side-tracked and the laws of most of our states cavalierly over-ridden.

This is something of even greater concern to non-Catholics of this country. If tax funds were allocated to Roman Catholic schools, Protestants and others would find themselves in the impossible position of being required to pay toward the support of an educational system which teaches that their own religion is "counterfeit" and "false" and has no real right to exist. Their government would be subsidizing with their funds a clericalism which actually suppresses Protestant education in many lands. The demand of the Jesuit educators comes, almost to the day, on the second anniversary of the closing of Union Theological Seminary of Madrid. Closed by police action, it has never received permission to re-open. Protestant pastors and their congregations in many instances suffer worse disabilities in Roman Catholic lands than in lands under Communist domination.

If we accede to the demands of Father Rooney and his colleagues, we shall be well on the way to education by competing sectarian enclaves and its sure outcome—the enfeebling and undermining of our country's unity based on its excellent system of public schools. Once this discredited business of church subsidy commences here, it may go to its full measure of inter-

creedal strife. The best way to avoid such a disgraceful chapter is not to open it.

*—The actual quotation as issued by the Jesuit Presidents reads: "If these objectives can be attained only through federal aid, then that aid should be made available on an across-the-board basis, for all students and for all institutions."
