Convention Reflections

The Southern Baptist ship of affairs sailed triumphantly through slightly stormy waters in the 1959 Convention and reached the destined port missing only one or two scheduled stops enroute. This voyage might not be the most memorable in Southern Baptist history but several significant events marked the journey.

In spite of the selection of a new captain, the hero of the Convention was the retiring captain, Brooks Hays. It seems regrettable he is giving up the helm in view of his calm head, his generous heart, and steady hand and the prospect of troublesome waters ahead. His successor has big shoes to fill but is a big man.

Hays' address was not matched by many other addresses in this or any other Convention. Not designed for eloquence or denominational self-commendation, Hays' words were addressed to current Southern Baptist life and problems. In subsequent Baptist history the words of Hays might rank with those of William Carey in turning Baptists to world missionary endeavor and with other prophetic utterances in the critical epochs of Baptist history.

Baptists should be thankful and humble for the splendid reports from the agencies and institutions. Certainly there is no room for pride, however, in view of the assigned task and our present performance.

Good, indeed, was the determination of the messengers to stay in the center of the charted course and stay out of the reef-filled shallows. This was especially true in the case of the most explosive issue in Southern Baptist life today—the race question. When a resolution was presented which was interpreted by some as leaning toward integration sanctioned by the Convention, it was modified to relieve any fears. When an attempt was made to endorse segregation, no sympathy whatsoever was manifest. The Convention has already gone on record on this matter and there is no need for further pronouncements from the Convention, especially since no Convention action is binding upon any church.

The Survey Committee brought its arduous task of several years to a climax and was rejected on only one of its proposals. This was the matter of charging tuition to seminary students which was not of monumental consequence either way it went. Several recommendations were deferred on technical grounds.

The slightly stormy seas during miscellaneous sailing resulted mainly from one ill wind, but even an ill wind blows some good. It serves to remind us to keep the ship in shape from stem to stern that no damage might result from an unfriendly blast.

Longest remembered about the 1959 Convention likely will be the successful centennial celebration of Southern Seminary, the forthrightness and extraordinary fairness of Brooks Hays, the creation of the Stewardship Commission and the decision for a Baptist unofficial observer in the United Nations.

The most difficult session to sit through—Southern Seminary graduation in academic regalia.

The most exciting moment—Presidential runoff between Ramsey Pollard and Roy McClain.

The most disappointing arrangements—Facilities for the Pastors' Conference.

The most difficult task performed—Franklin Owen's handling of the Order of Business.

The most disappointing attendance—Friday night and the magnificent address of Walter Judd.

Among the things Louisville and Kentucky Baptists can be most proud of:

The amazingly adequate arrangements by local committees.

The absence of a parade of Kentucky preachers to the speaker's stand.

The selection of W. R. Pettigrew as vice-president.

The sterling performance of the massed choirs on Friday evening.

The press coverage by the local newspapers. The special section on Kentucky and Louisville Baptists was judged by many the best ever done in this respect.

Radio and television coverage.

The courtesy of police and parking officials.

The spacious accommodations of the Fairgrounds.

The overwhelming hospitality of Louisville homes. Some rooms offered were never taken.

The best platform joke—Two fellows were playing cards in Arkansas when one said to the other: "Now play 'em fair, Reuben, I know what I dealt you."

The most typical Baptist joke heard in the corridors: Following a devastating nuclear explosion, it seemed only three people were left in the entire world. Meeting and taking stock of themselves, they were amazed to learn they were all Southern Baptists. Immediately they organized, electing a president, vice-president, and secretary and set a goal of four for Sunday School the next Sunday.

An old-fashioned church-wide picnic will be conducted Saturday afternoon at the local Winchester High School grounds.






