A careful examination of this timely information should increase our gratitude to God for his blessings, and likewise, stimulate increased activities in our unfinished task.

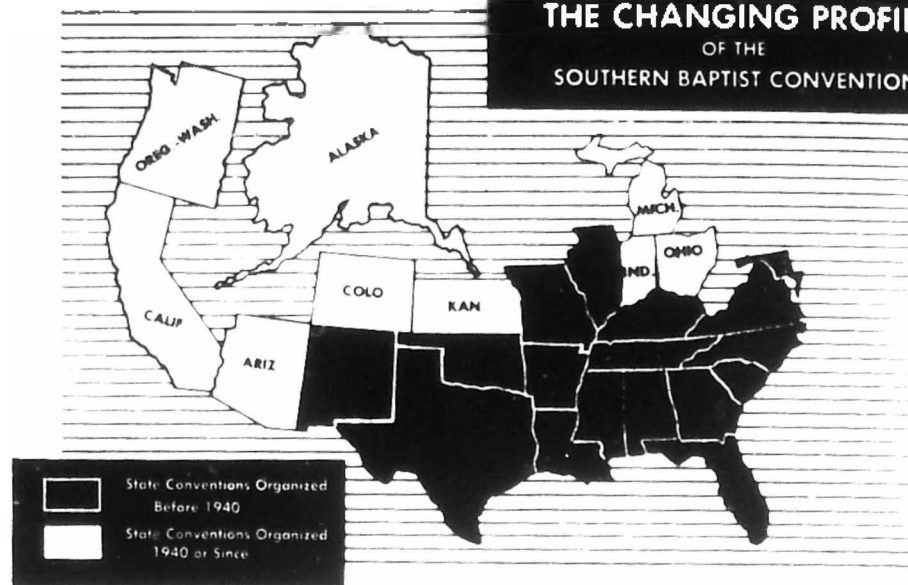

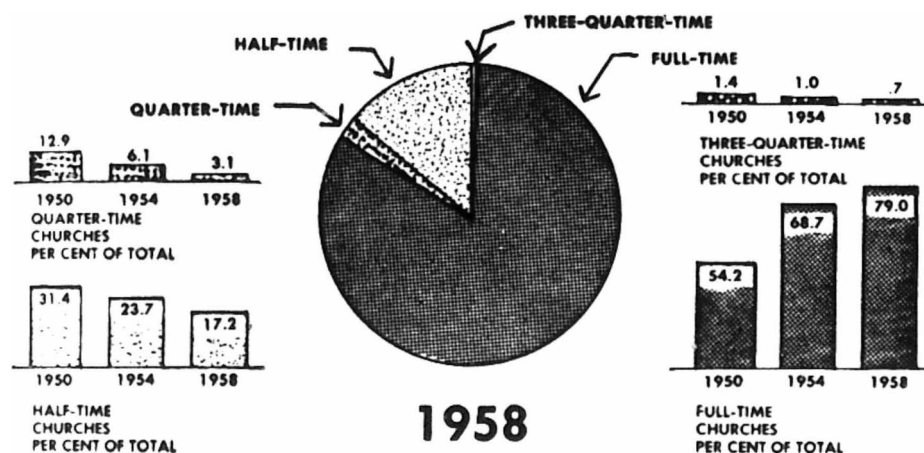

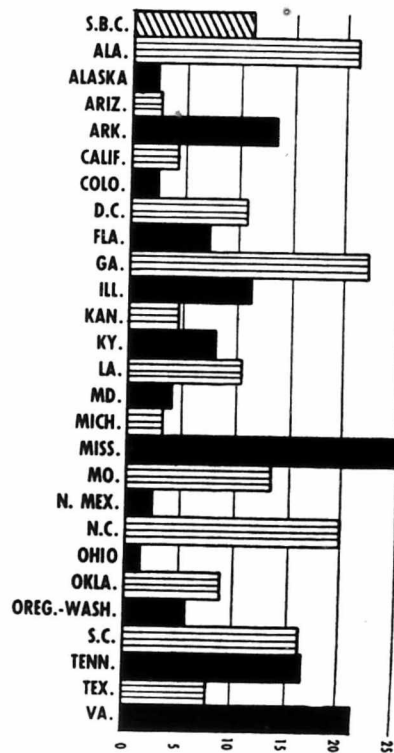

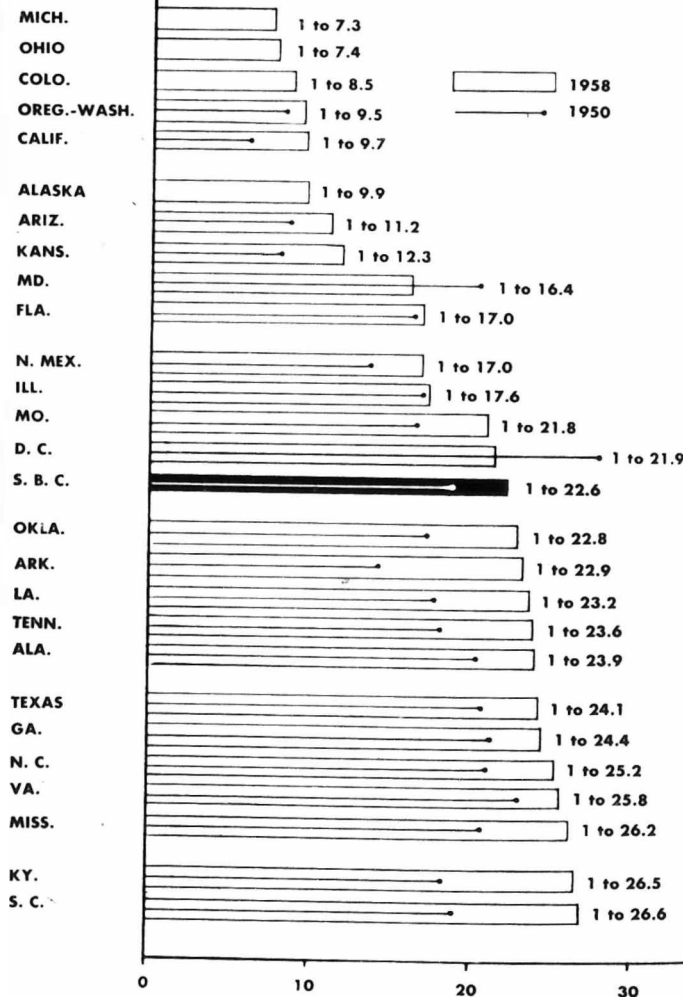

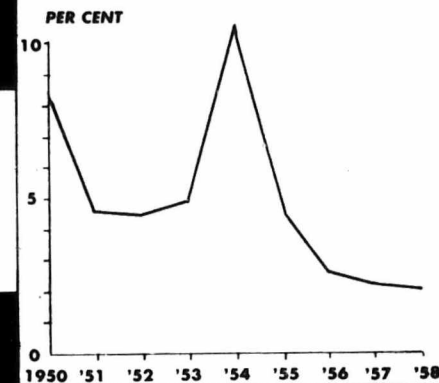

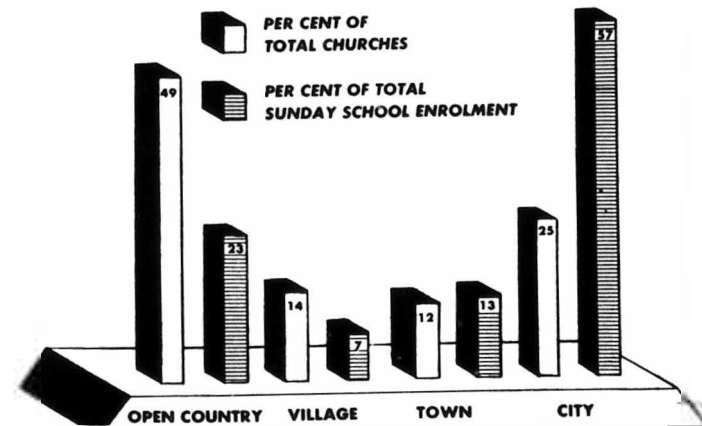

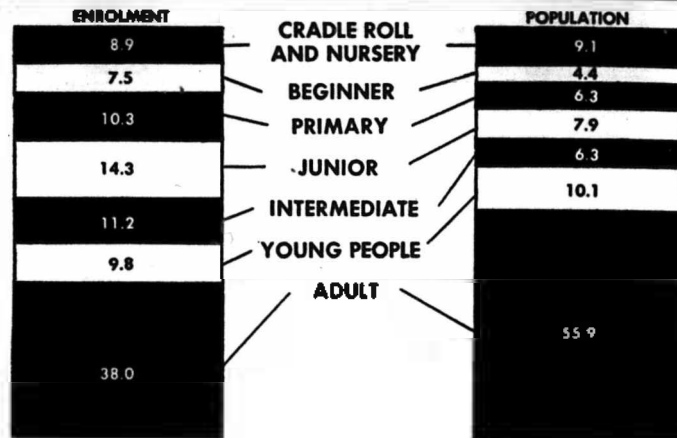

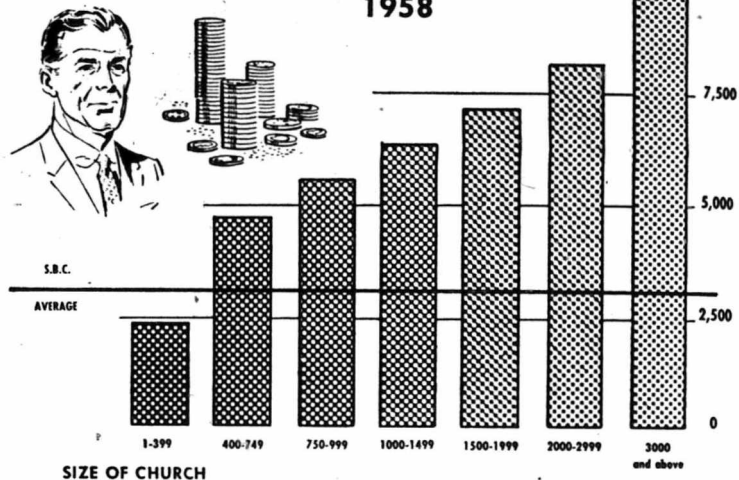

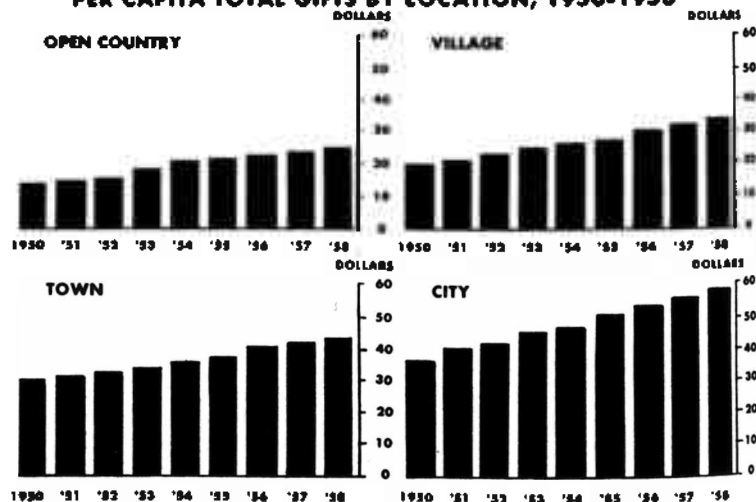

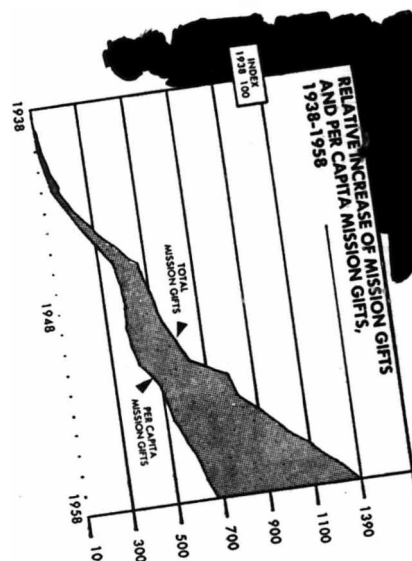

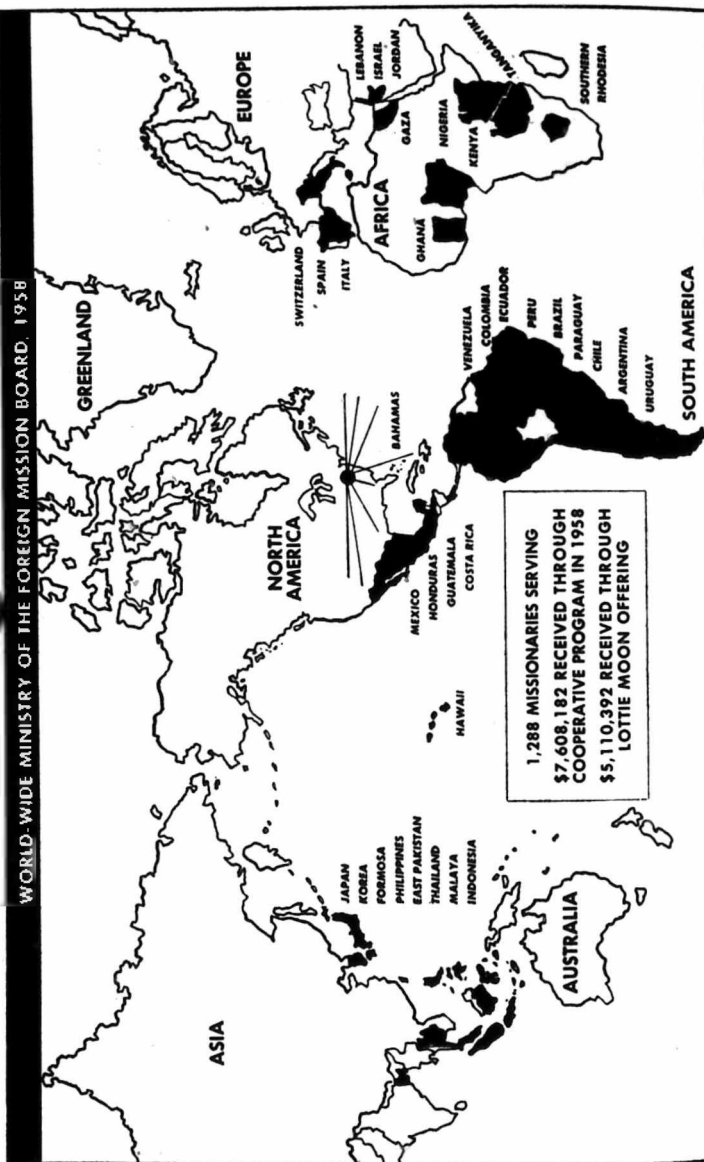

REVIEW OF HOME MISSIONS, 1950-1958



The work of the Home Mission Board has shown notable increase during the past several years.

Cooperative Program gifts for Home Missions increased from \$1,179,682 in 1950 to \$2,602,727 in 1958. The Annie Armstrong Offering also increased from \$664,476 to \$1,542,207.



Missionaries have increased to 1,386 serving in 42 states and 4 overseas areas. Likewise, summer student workers increased nearly 70 per cent.

An average of 410 Baptist chaplains in the Armed Forces reported over 12,000 confessions of faith yearly.



Since 1950 a yearly average of nearly 700 new missions were started.

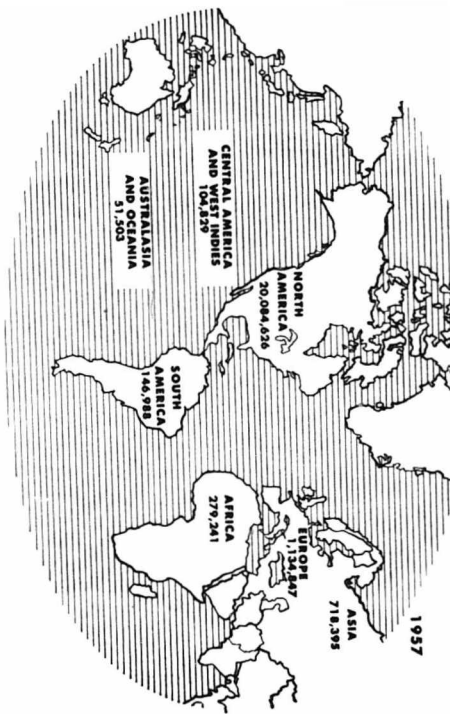
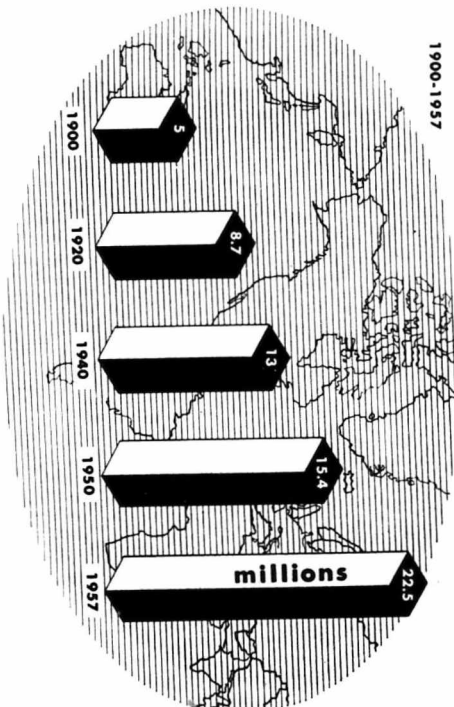

U. S. CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

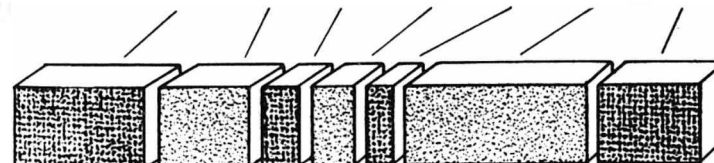
AS A PER CENT OF

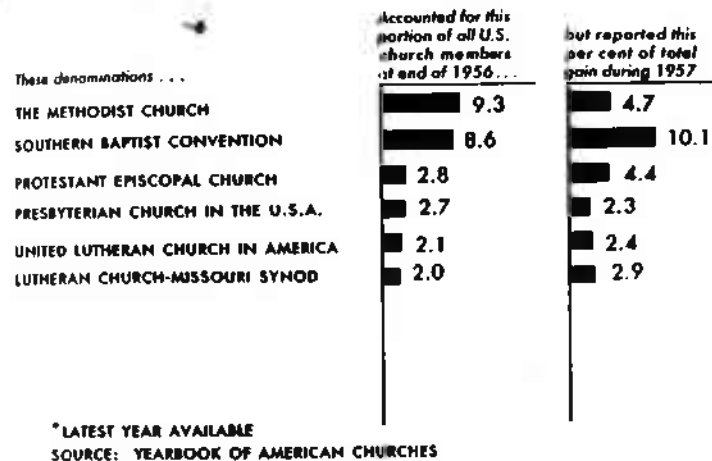

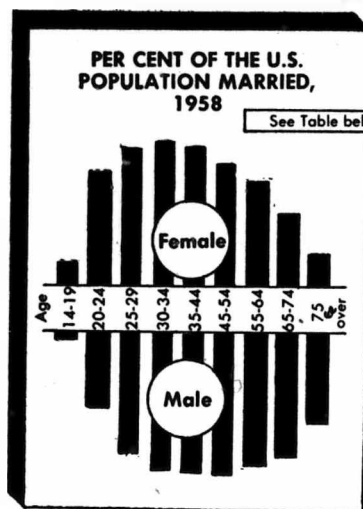

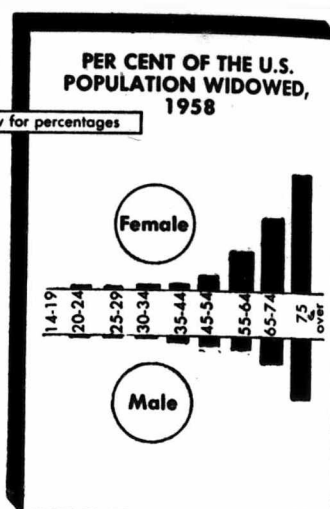
Characteristics of Families, 1958

Per cent of the U. S. Population Married, 1958

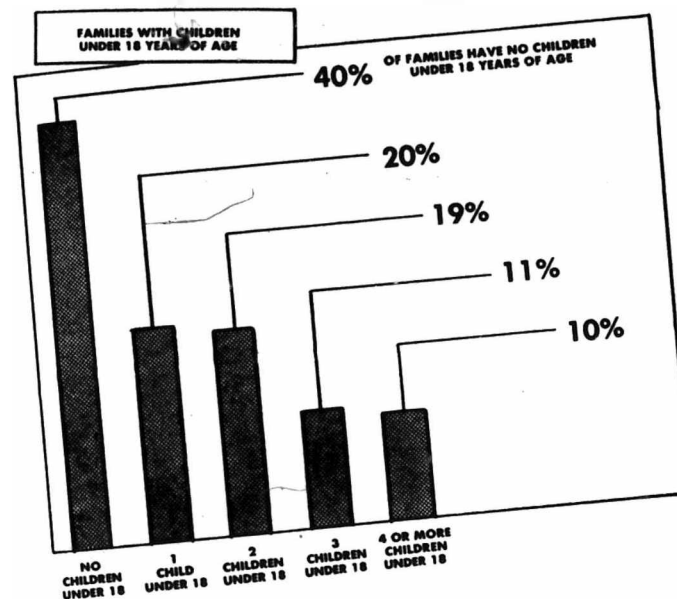

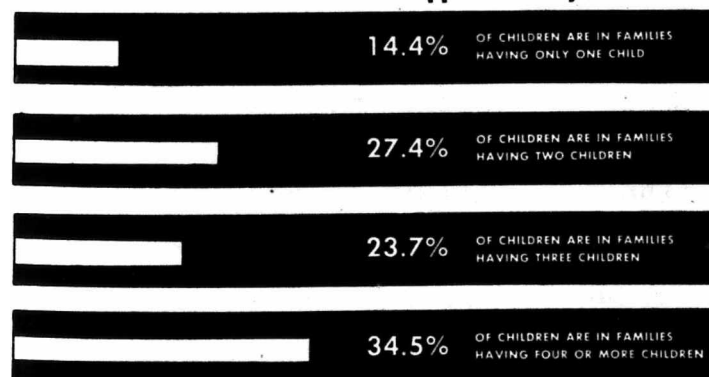

HOW MANY CHILDREN DO U. S. FAMILIES HAVE?

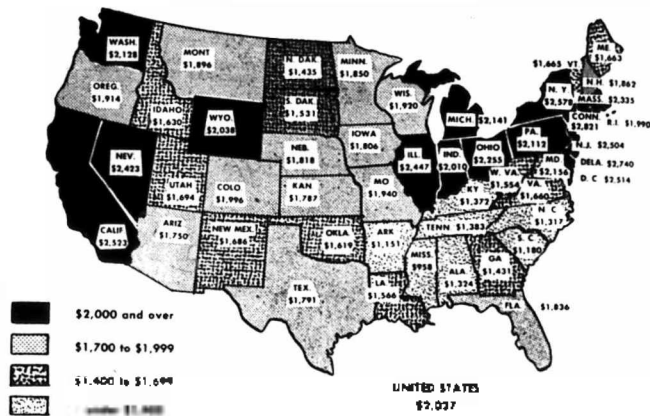

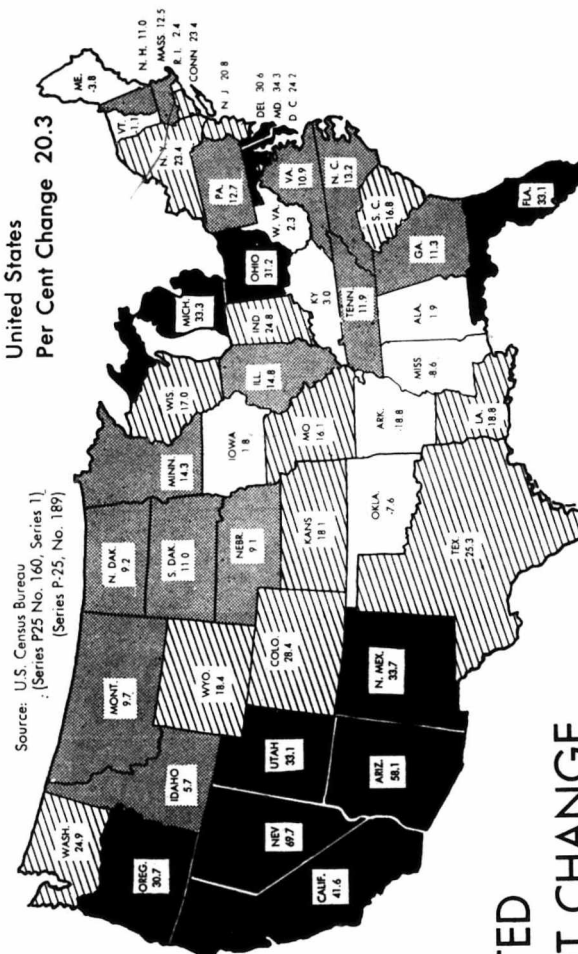

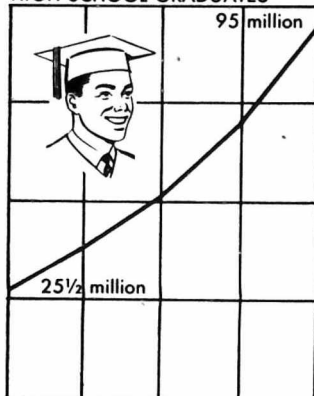

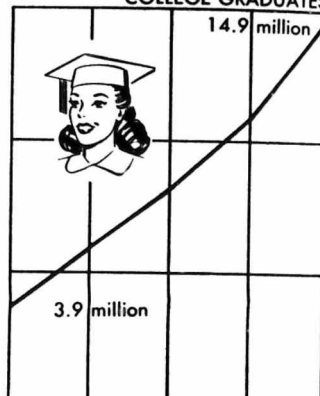
PROJECTED PER CENT CHANGE IN TOTAL POPULATION OF STATES, 1958-1970

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES



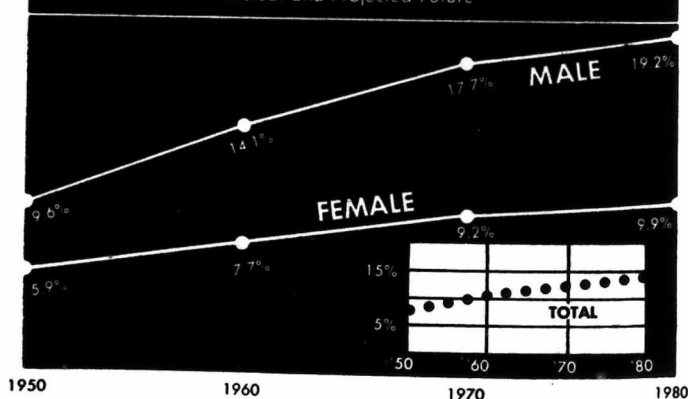

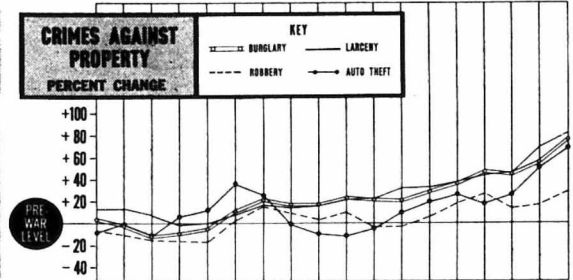
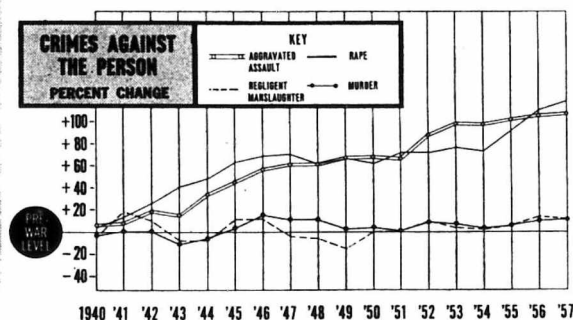
