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In a recent issue of a leading news magazine, a feature article was carried under the subject: "Whose Century? Will It Be Russia's? Will It Be Europe's? Will It Be America's?" The article was a development of the idea that America's place as the world's leader was fast being challenged by other nations, and that increased economic strength is necessary to maintain the lead among the nations of the world.

Christian leaders might well ponder the question, "Whose century? Will it be influenced by materialism, communism, or Christianity?" Christianity is being challenged here and throughout the world by forces that would destroy. Christian leaders must answer the question—"Whose century will it be?"

Southern Baptists are striving to answer that question. While we would be the first to acknowledge our limitations, our shortcomings, and our failures, we rejoice in the blessings of God which have accompanied our efforts. Since 1950, our membership has increased nearly two and a half million, a gain of 34 per cent. During that same period our Sunday school enrolment increased 44.8 per cent; Training Union, 81 per cent; and mission gifts 132 per cent. Similar gains were recorded in other areas of our Baptist work.

We are indebted to thousands of church clerks, associational clerks, state leaders, and a staff of competent workers for the information contained in this volume. We believe that church and denominational leaders may profit by a careful study of the statistical information presented. Such a study should awaken us to the challenge of our unfinished task, and should motivate us to claim this "century" for Christ.

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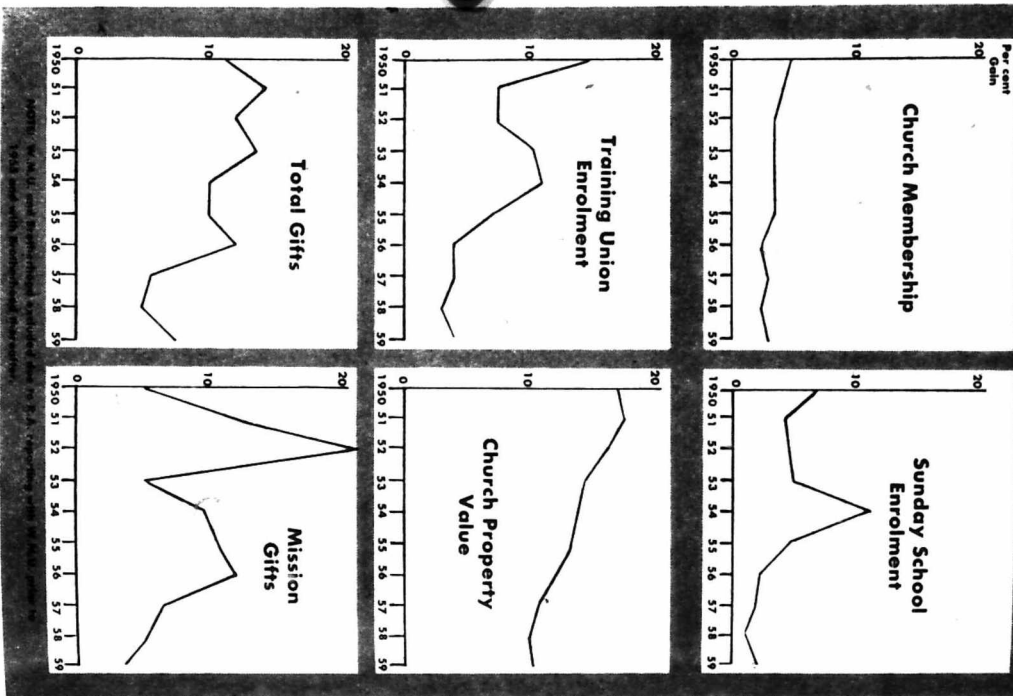

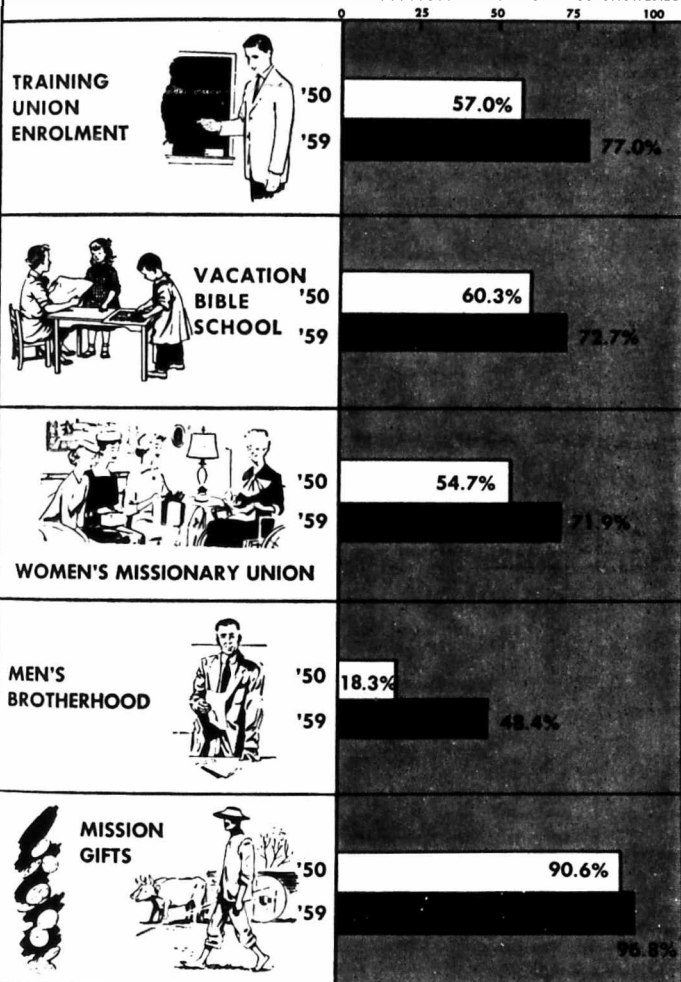

THESE ITEMS WERE REPORTED BY THIS PER CENT OF CHURCHES

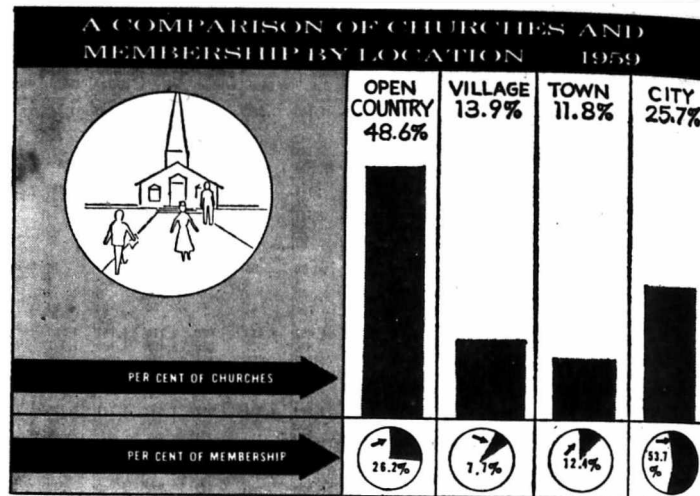

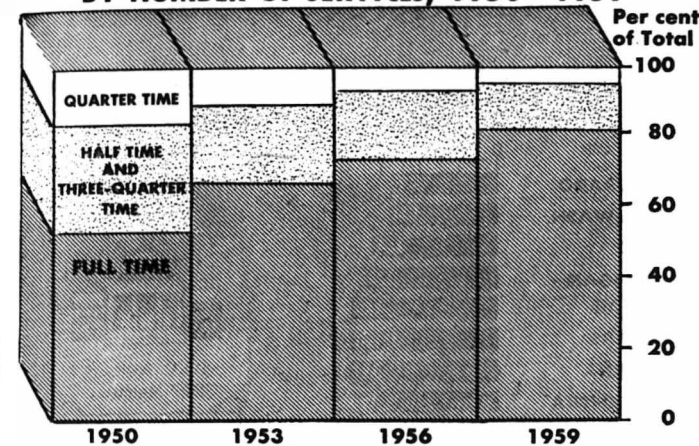

BY NUMBER OF SERVICES, 1950 - 1959**

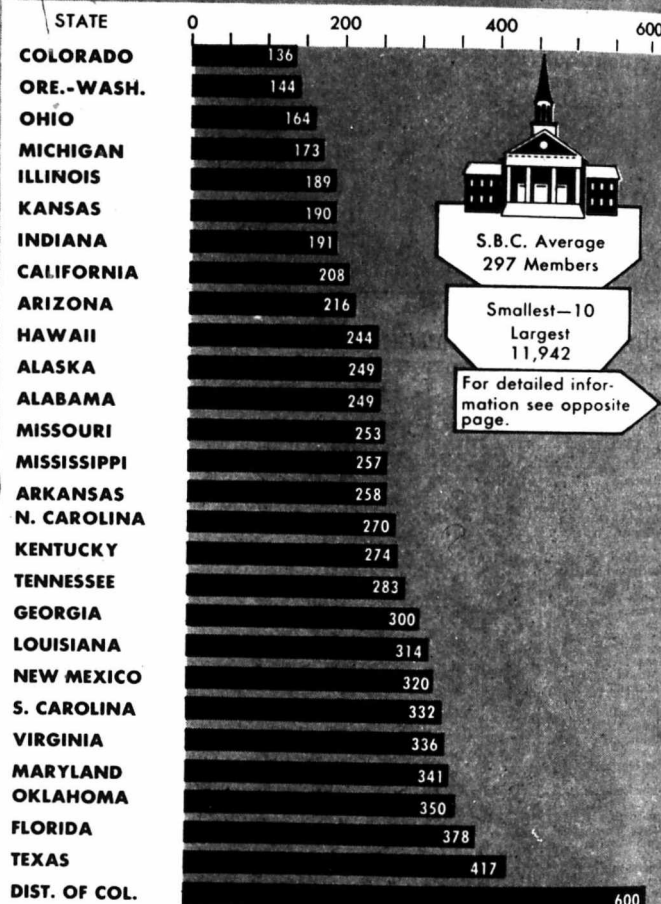

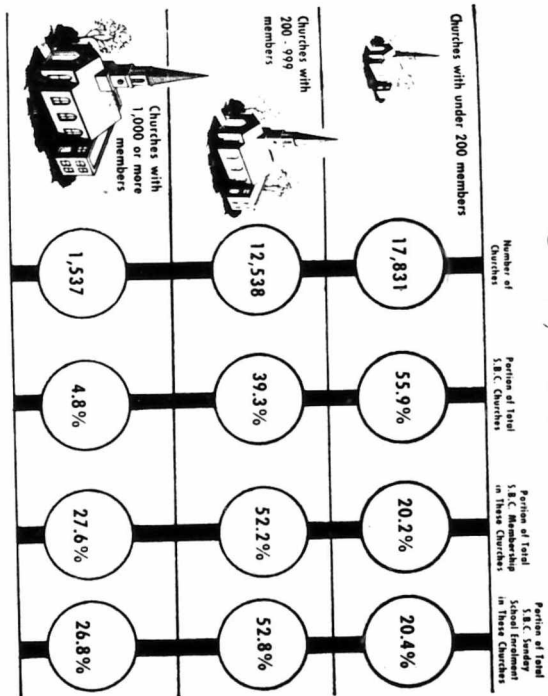

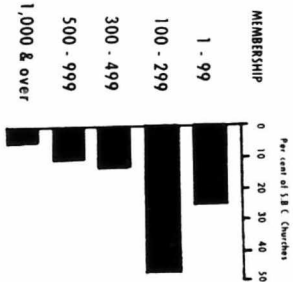

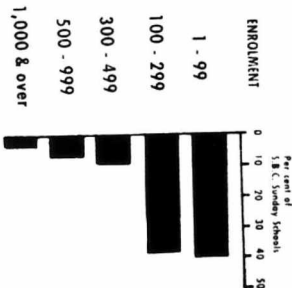
Size-Relationships of Churches SBC, 1959

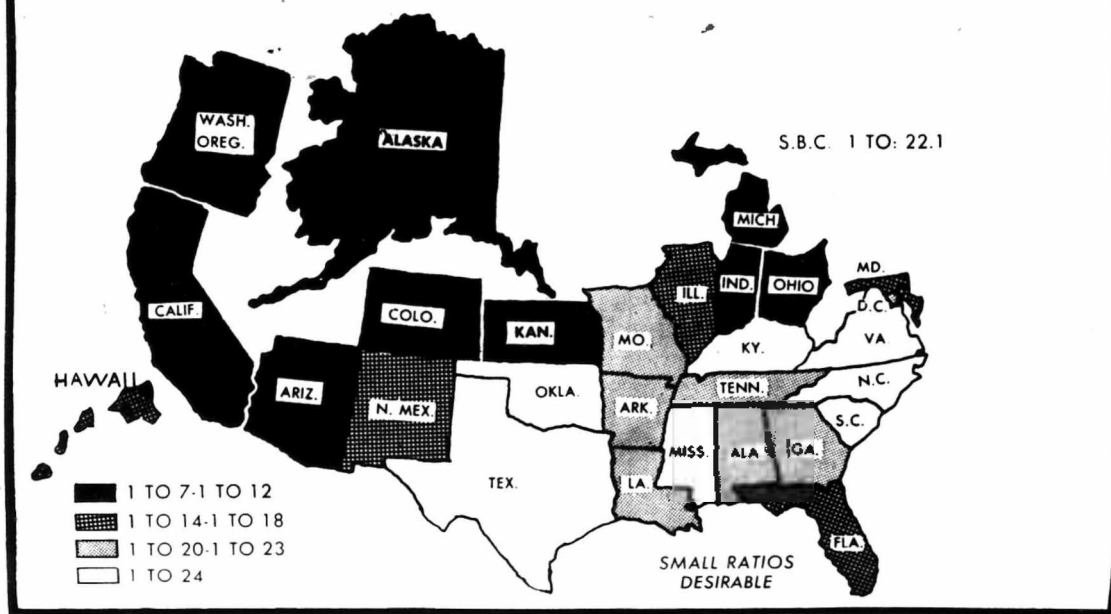

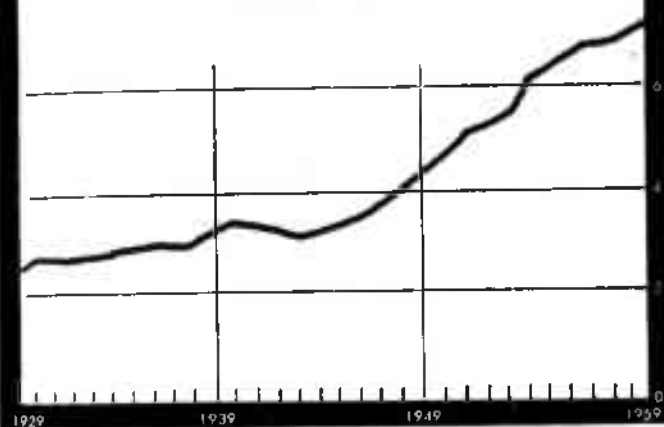

SUNDAY SCHOOL ENROLMENT, SOUTHERN BAPTIST CHURCHES, BY LOCATION—1959-1958

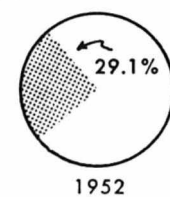

SOUTHERN BAPTIST SUNDAY SCHOOL ENROLMENT, 1929 - 1959

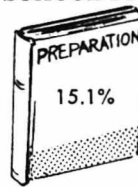
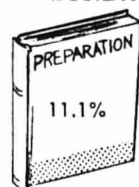


PER CENT OF SBC CHURCHES REPORTING JANUARY BIBLE STUDY

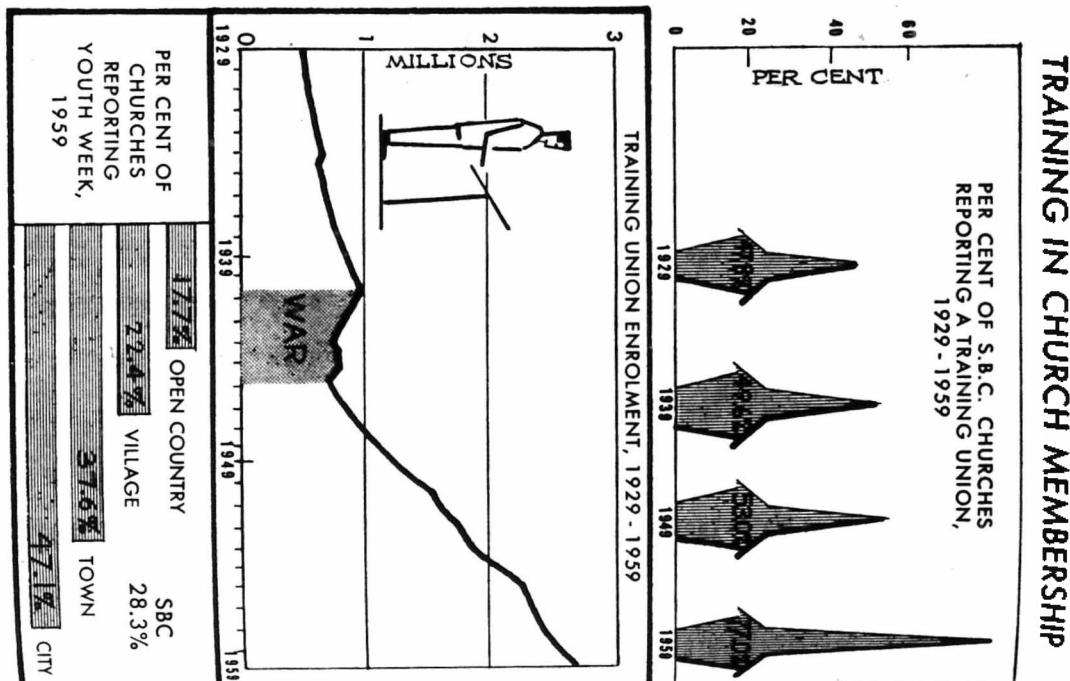

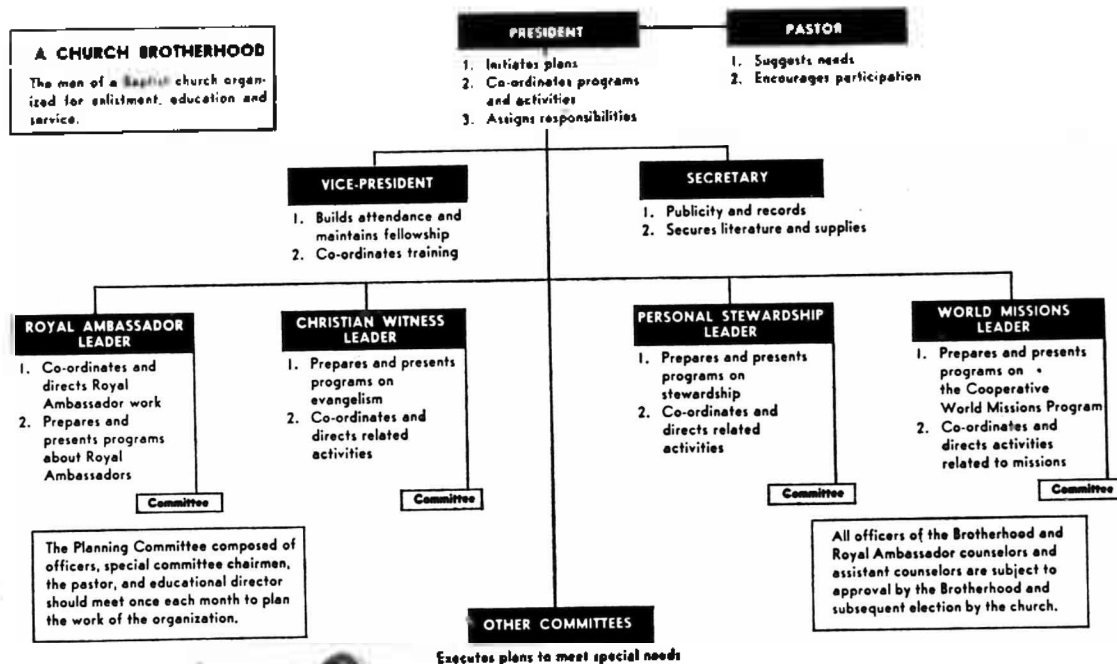

WMU ENROLMENT, SOUTHERN BAPTIST CHURCHES, BY LOCATION—1959-1958

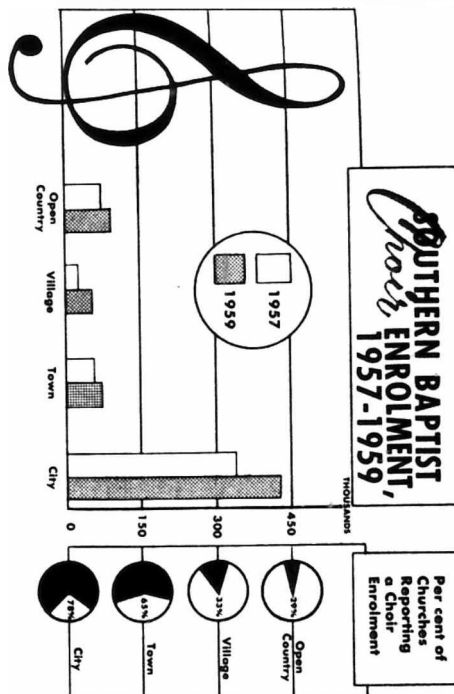

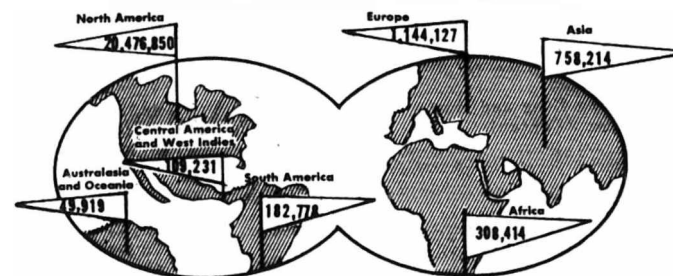

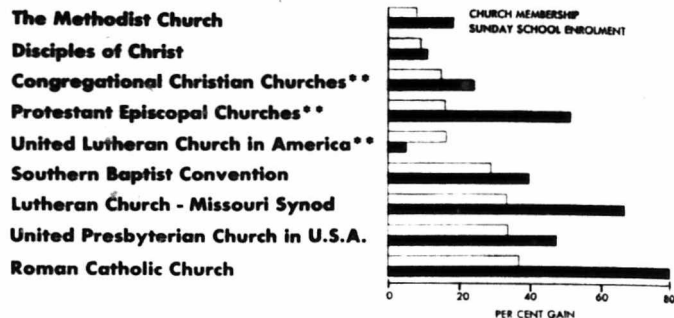

SELECTED* DENOMINATIONS, 1950 - 1958

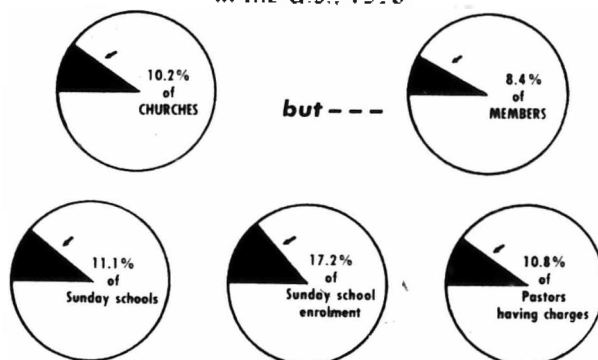

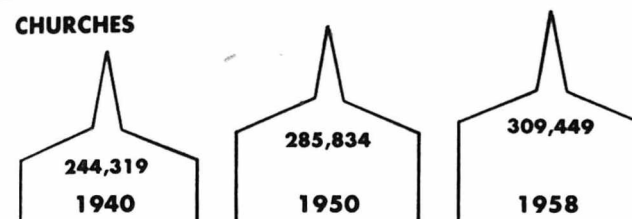
SOUTHERN BAPTISTS

in the U.S., 1958



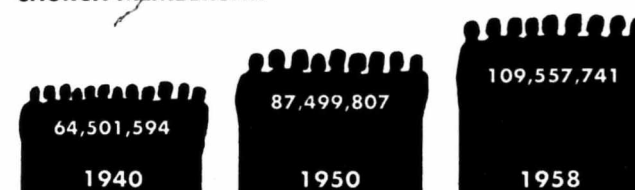

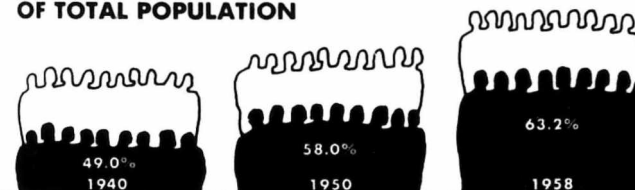

CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

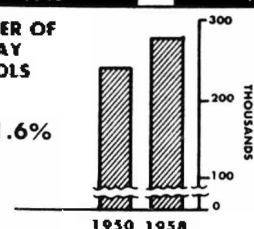


MEMBERSHIP AS A PER CENT OF TOTAL POPULATION



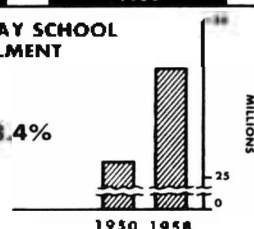
NUMBER OF SUNDAY SCHOOLS

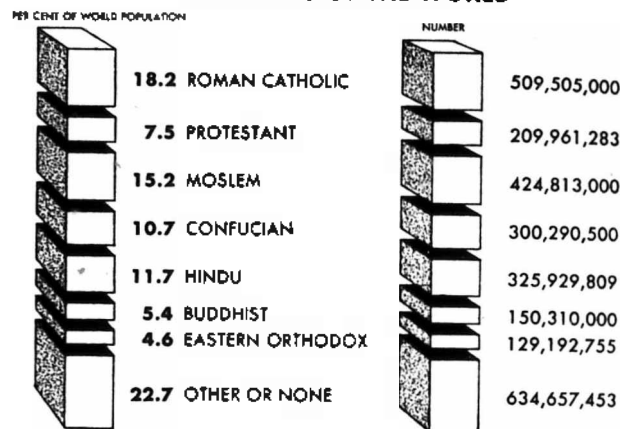

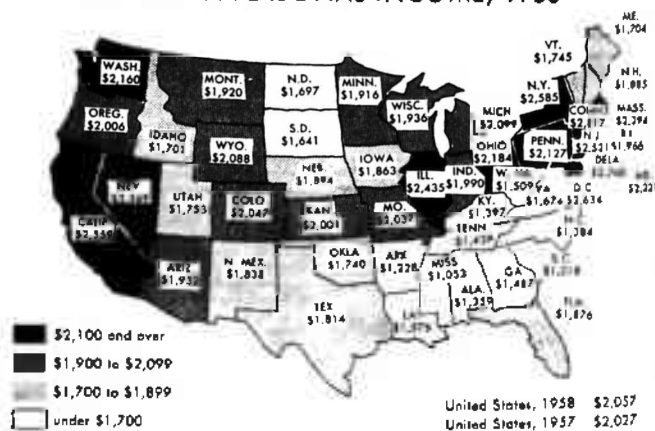

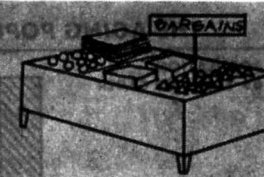

There are more drug addicts in the United States than in any other country in the Western World—perhaps more than in the other Western nations combined! They are increasing at the rate of 1,000 a month, and 13 per cent of all addicts are twenty-one or under. The narcotic traffic costs \$500 million a year.



It pays to go to college. Figures based on facts from the Census Bureau reveal the following: Lifetime earnings of a college graduate, \$266,000; of a high school graduate, \$165,000; and of an elementary school graduate, \$116,000. Four years of college has been worth \$103,000 more in a lifetime than a high school diploma, and worth \$152,000 more than elementary school. The 1960 census will show an even wider gap.

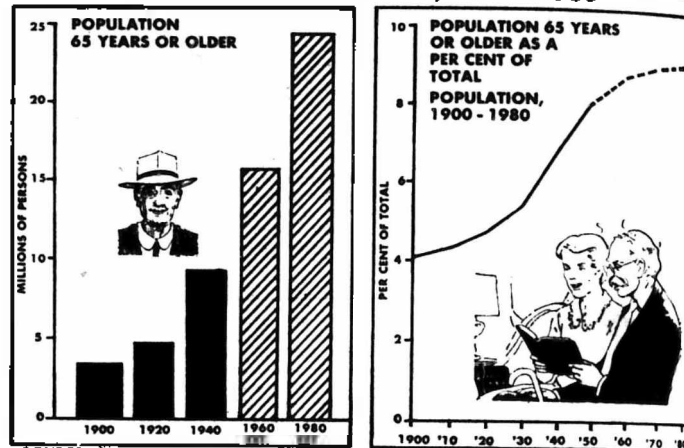

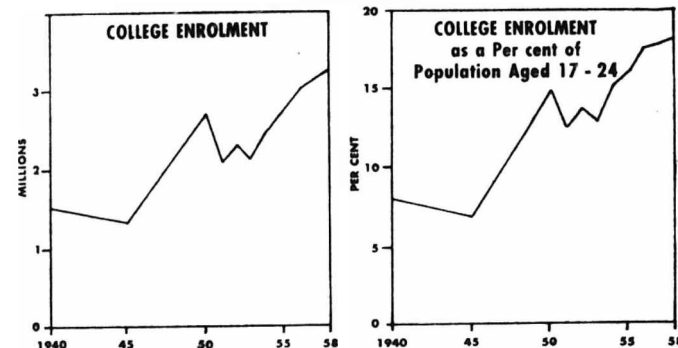

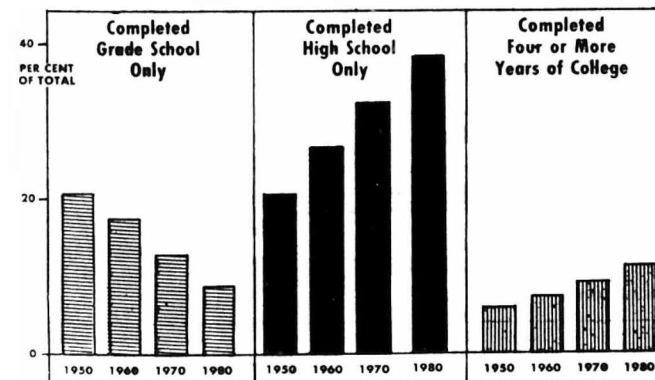
Trends in U.S. Education

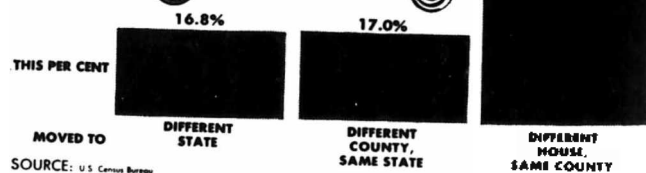

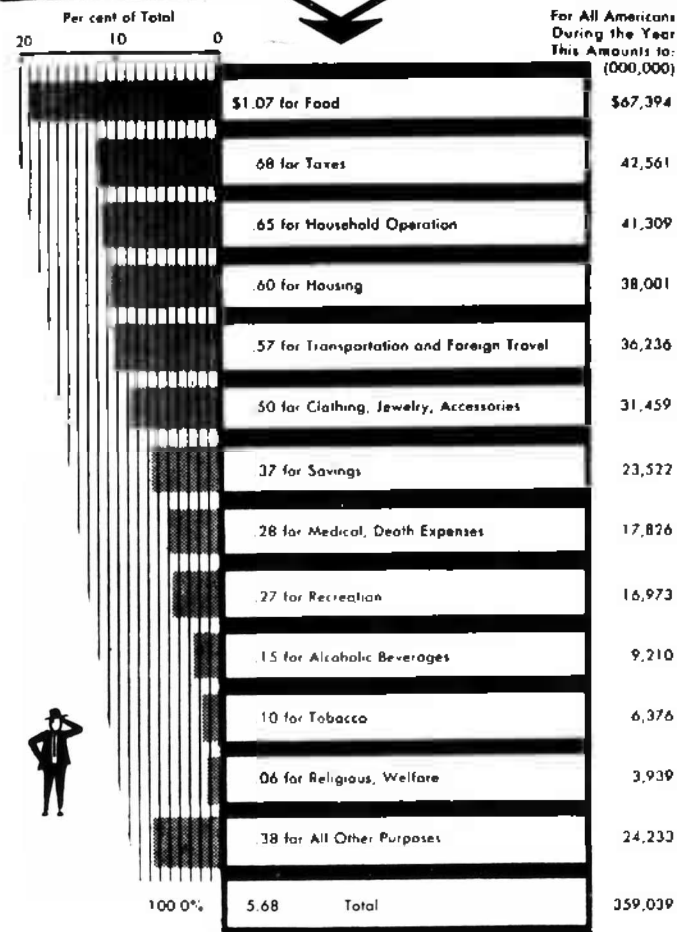

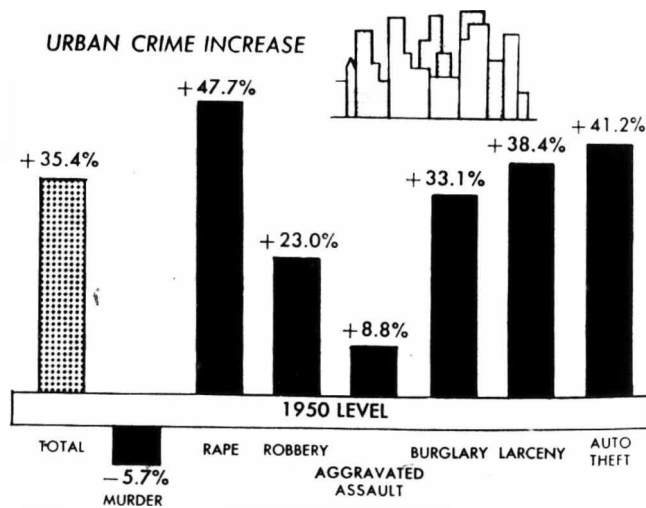
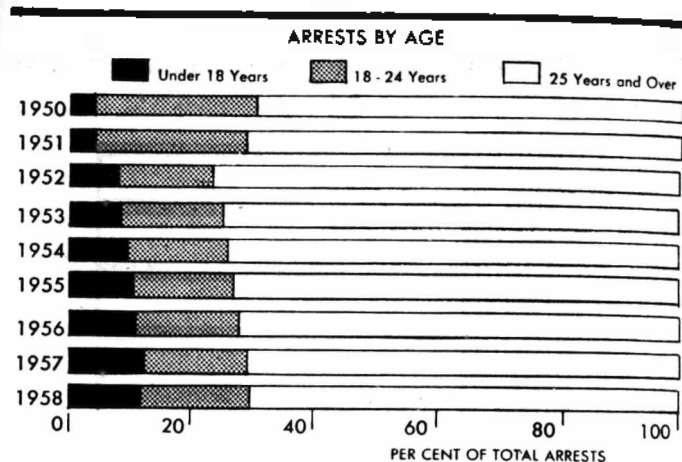
