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It is satisfying, indeed, to see Southern Baptists looking themselves squarely in the face. The countenance beheld, to many, is shocking. To some, it is utterly disturbing. For others, the view evokes pity. And still others, having looked, are filled with the realization that the image, though marred and shoddy, still reflects the divine touch of God who has fashioned it. There is a discernible spark which, if rekindled by its Creator, could cause infectious "beauty" and radiance to erupt throughout our very world.

All is not right with Southern Baptists—*neither is all wrong*. This is revealed by the statistics presented in this issue. Statistics are powerless, and neutral in themselves. It is within the reader's power, however, to make them vital and exceptionally relevant to an evaluation of Southern Baptists' ministry. Take the figures and summaries for what they are—mere *indications*, not *substance*, of that which is happening. In the reader's hands, they can become what a patient's chart is to his doctor.

A word of caution: Let none of us judge the statistics solely by statistical norms. Let our analysis be ultimately based on a divine standard. Does not that which is viewed as progress sometimes turn out to be mere pusillanimous pussyfooting in light of what God would have us do?

The work of faithful church and associational clerks, staff members, and others has resulted in the gold mine of "facts" in this HANDBOOK. We trust that they will accomplish the virtuous end to which they are dedicated.

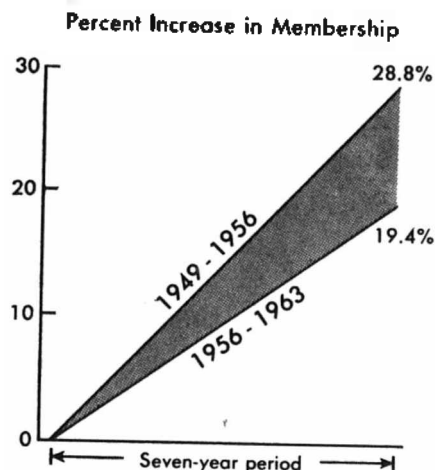

SOUTHERN BAPTIST SUMMARY

1949 - 1956 (two seven-year periods) 1956 - 1963



In recent years the rate of growth in membership has declined. This decrease represents approximately 821,000 less members (4 per Southern Baptist church per year) than would have been the case had growth continued at the 1949-1956 rate.

★ The decrease in rate of growth in recent years is evident in practically all areas of Southern Baptist activity as shown below.

CHURCH LOCATION CLASSIFICATIONS USED IN VARIOUS SUMMARIES FOR THE FIRST TIME THIS YEAR

Open Country church—one located in a rural area such that (1) it is not immediately adjacent to an incorporated township or city, (2) it is likely surrounded by land not used for urban purposes, and (3) a sizable portion of its member families reside in the surrounding non-urban area.

Village—incorporated or unincorporated place (1) having less than 500 population, (2) surrounded by open country, and (3) not adjacent to a town or city.

Town—place having a population between 500 - 2,499.

City (2,500 - 9,999 pop.) church—one located in a city with 2,500 - 9,999 population or its suburbs whose member families (sizable portion) work in a city.

Area in city having population of 10,000 or more



Downtown—central business or main retail store area (see A at left).

Neighborhood—residential and industrial areas between the central business area and the suburbs (see B at left).

Suburban—outlying areas usually adjacent to neighborhood or older areas of city; often new residential areas at edge of city which may or may not be within the city limits (see C at left).

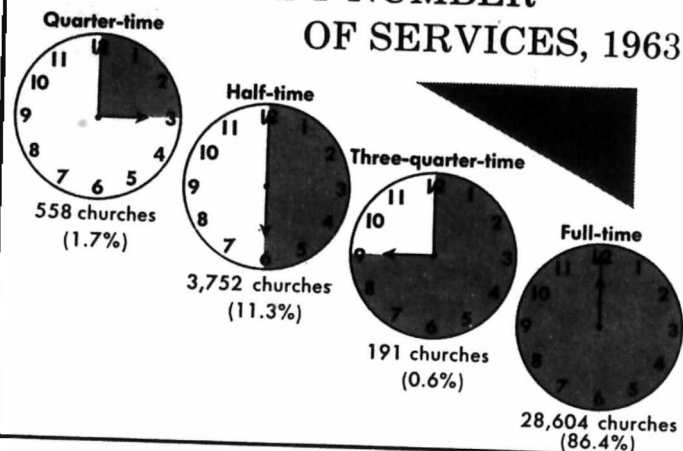

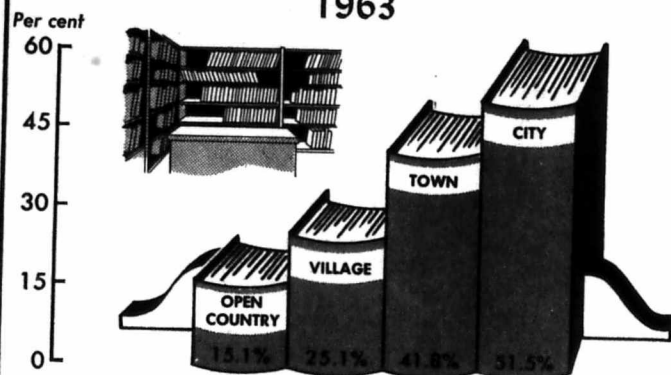

PARTICIPATION IN ANNUITY BOARD'S PROTECTION PLAN, 1963

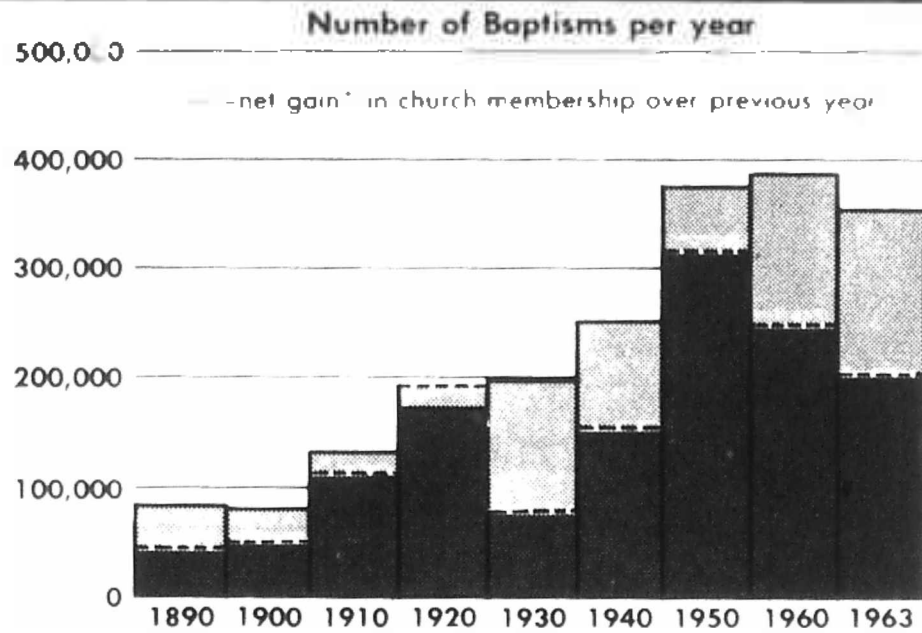

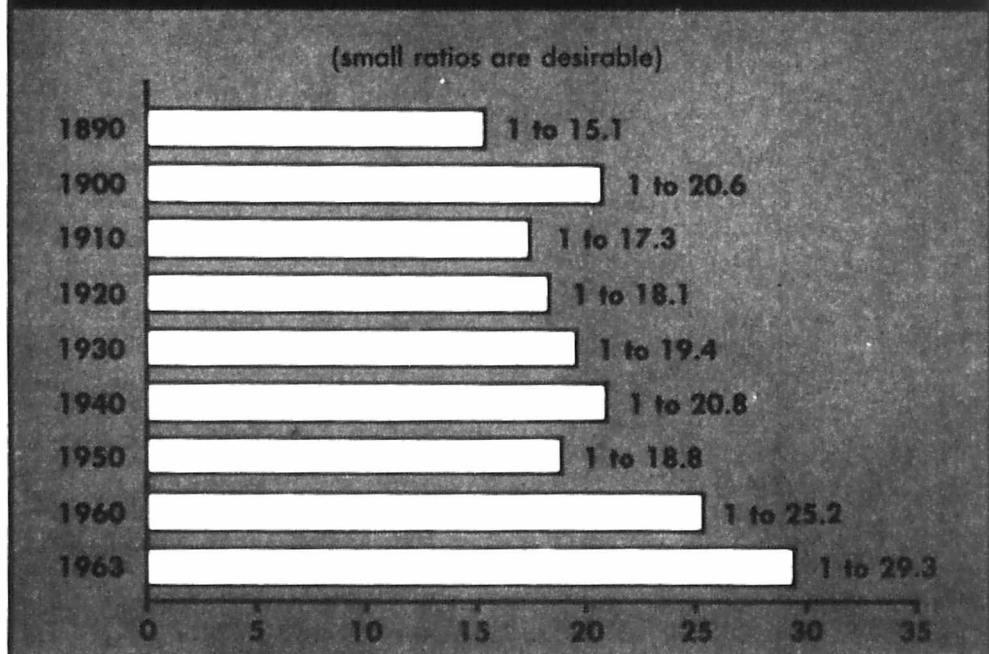

Ratio of Baptisms to Membership

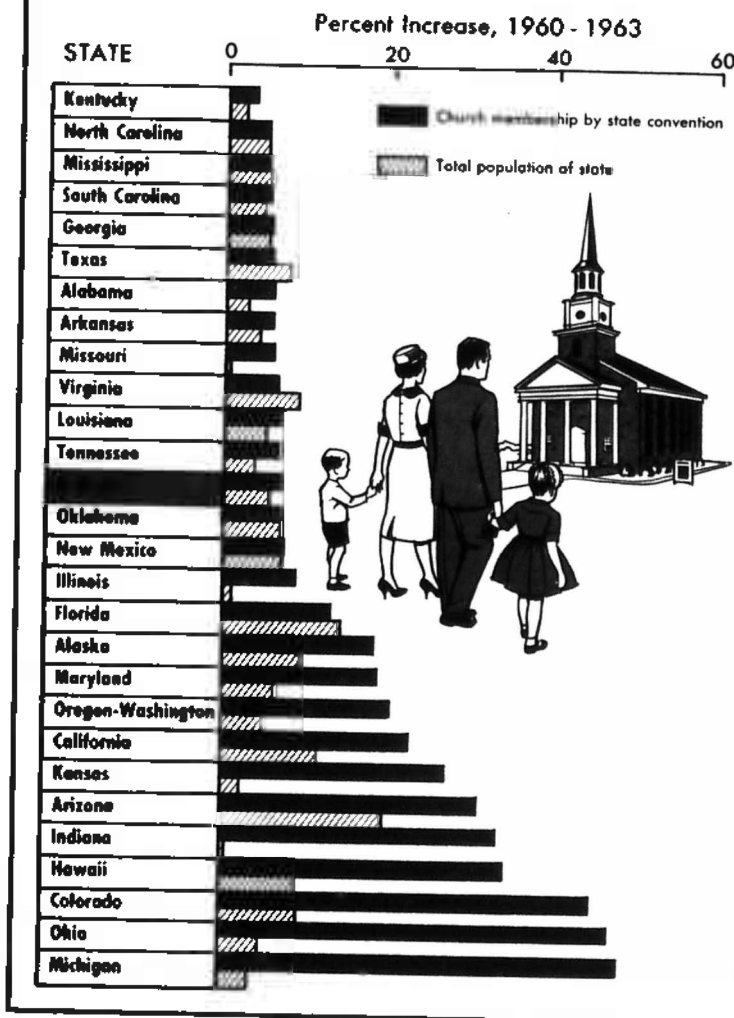

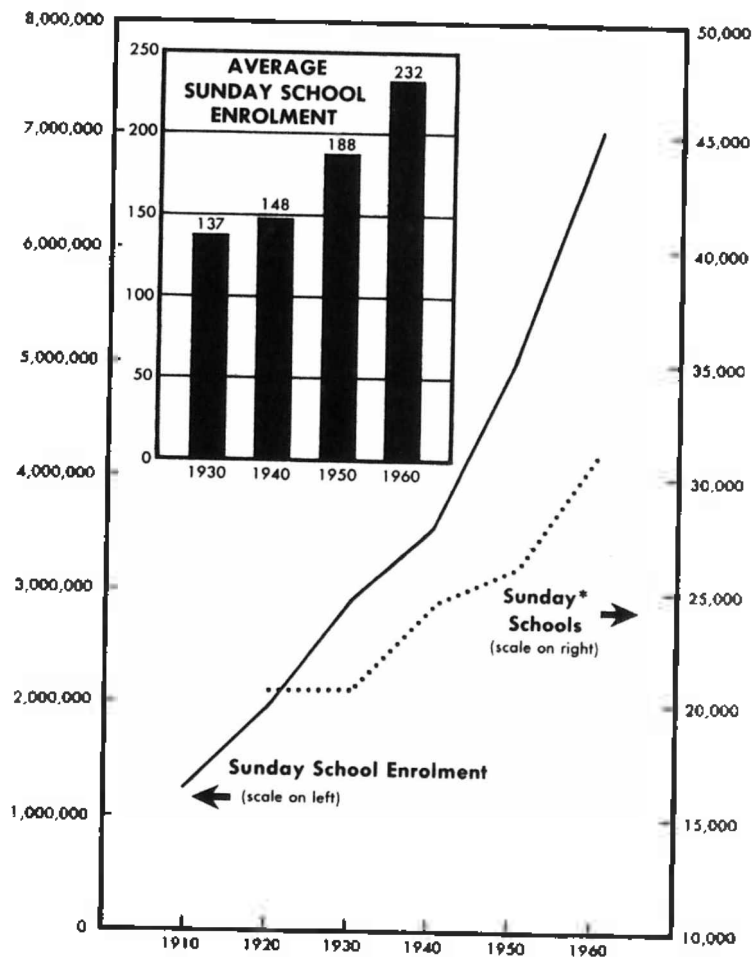

Southern Baptist Convention SUNDAY SCHOOL ENROLMENT 1910 - 1960



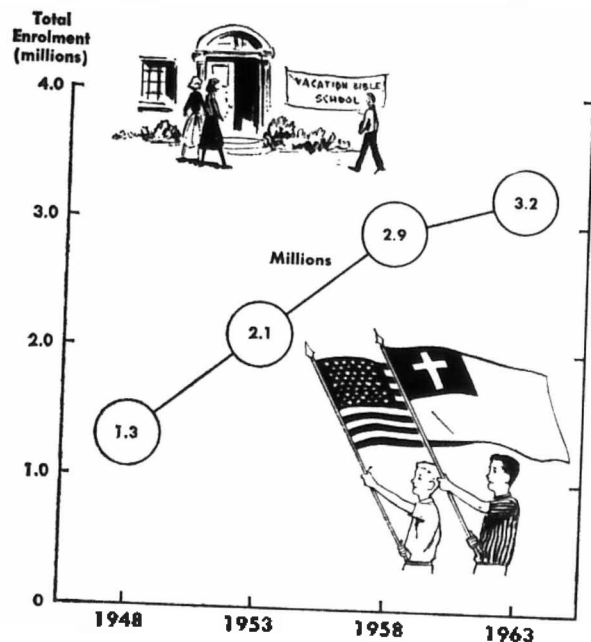

Vacation Bible School 1948-1963



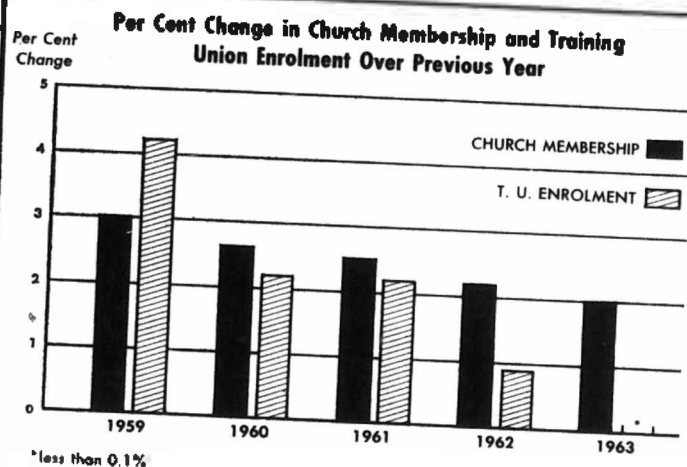

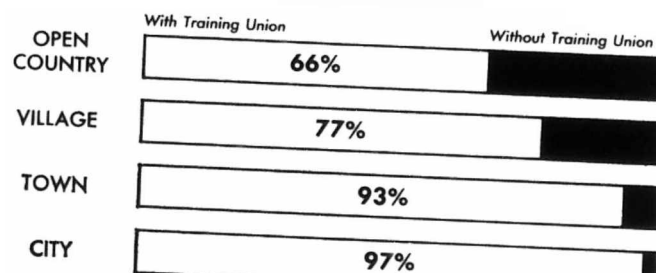

Per Cent of Churches Reporting Training Union Enrolment, by Location, 1963



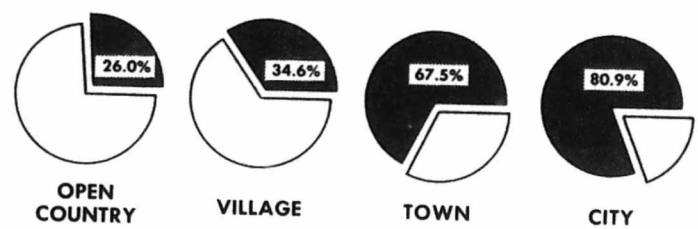

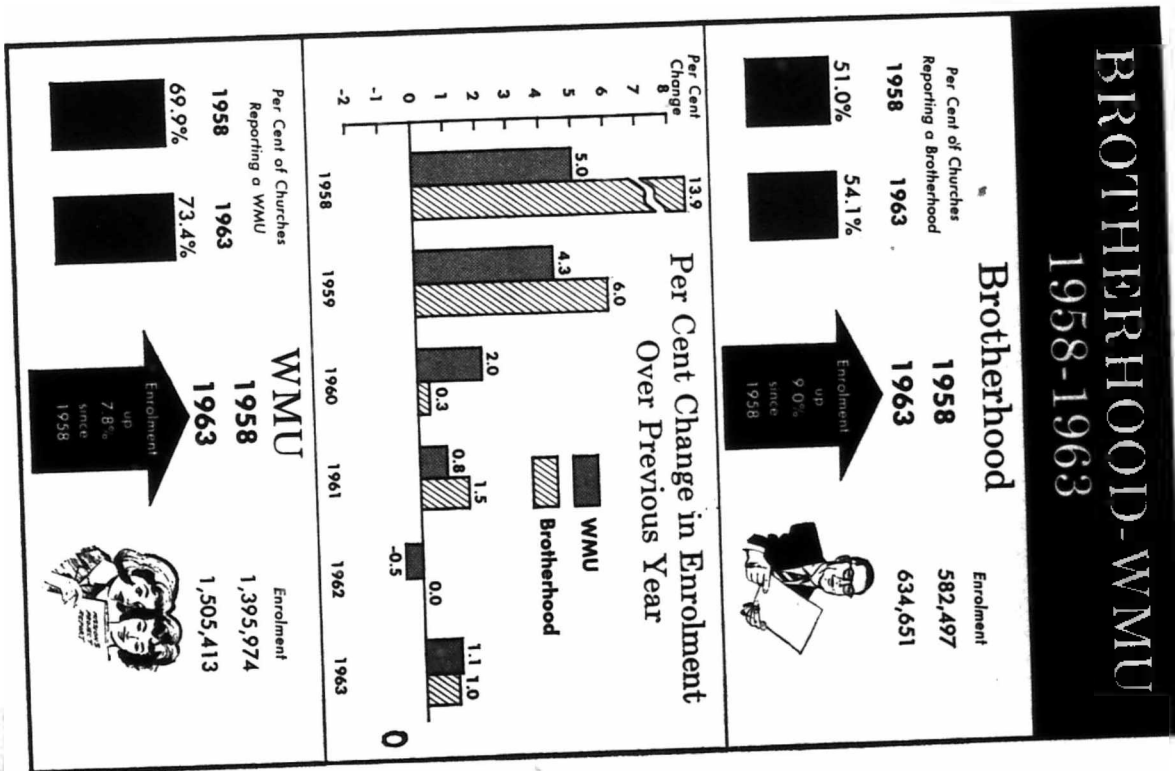

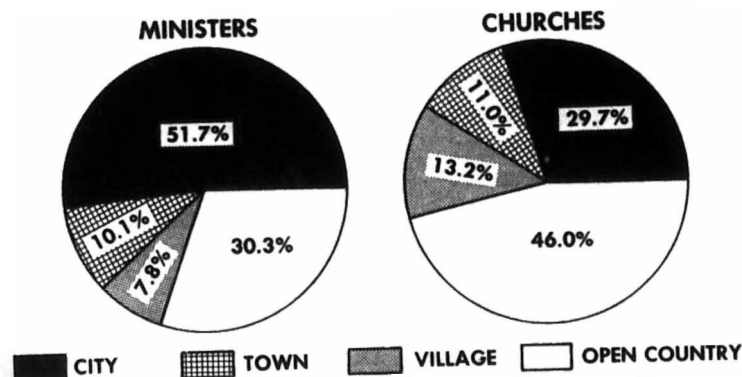

BROTHERHOOD ENROLMENT, SOUTHERN BAPTIST CHURCHES, BY LOCATION—1963-1962

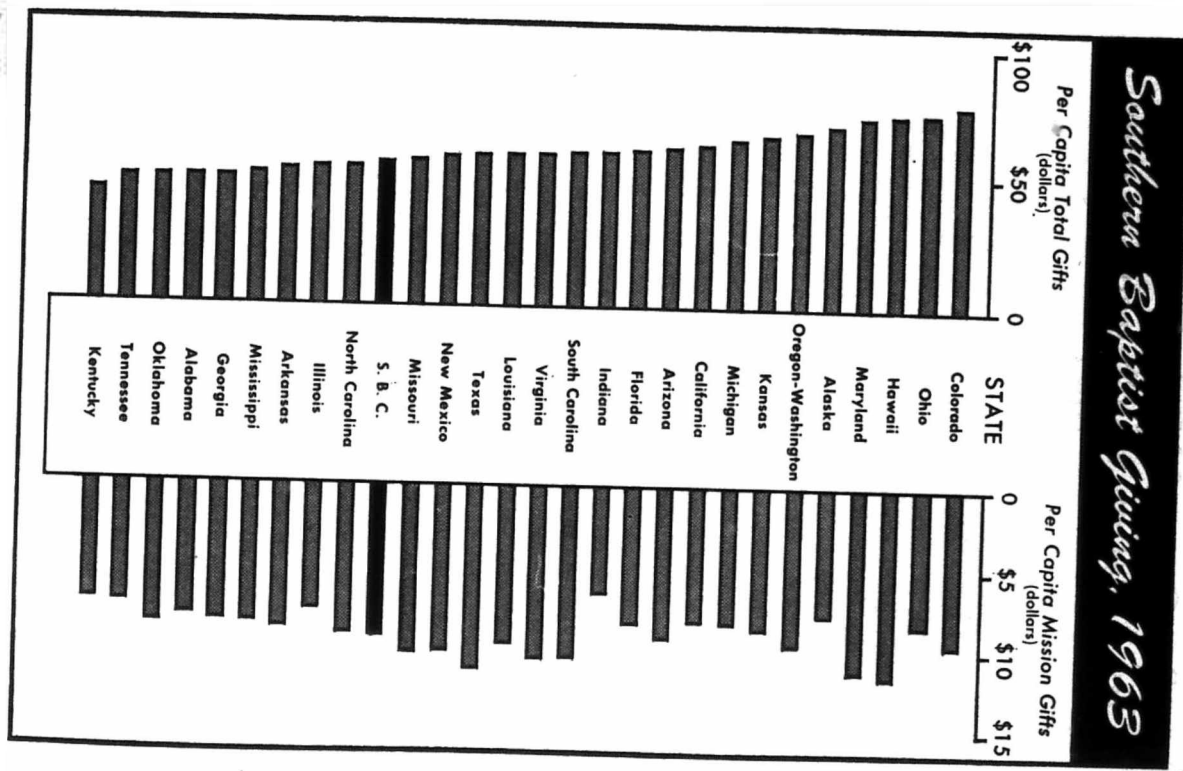

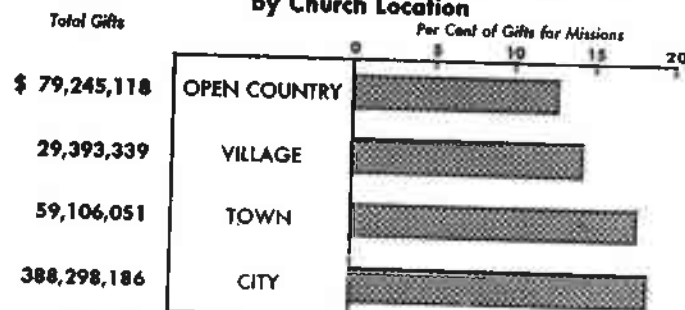

ADVANCE PROGRAM IN FOREIGN MISSIONS 1948-1963

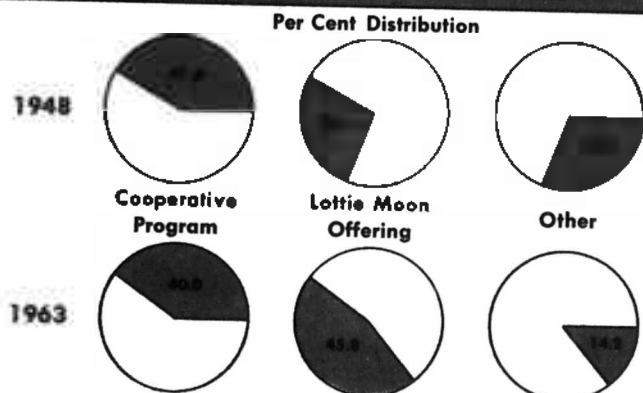

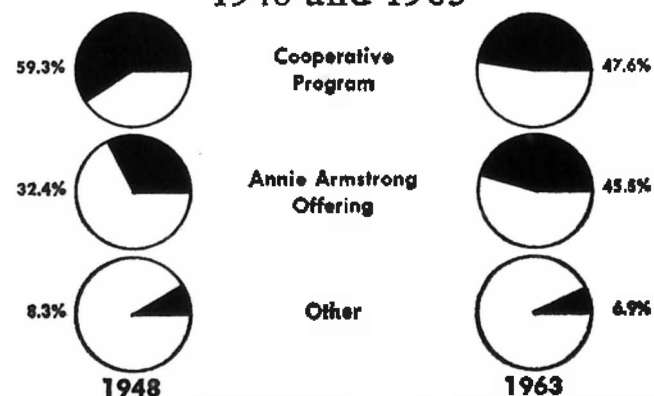

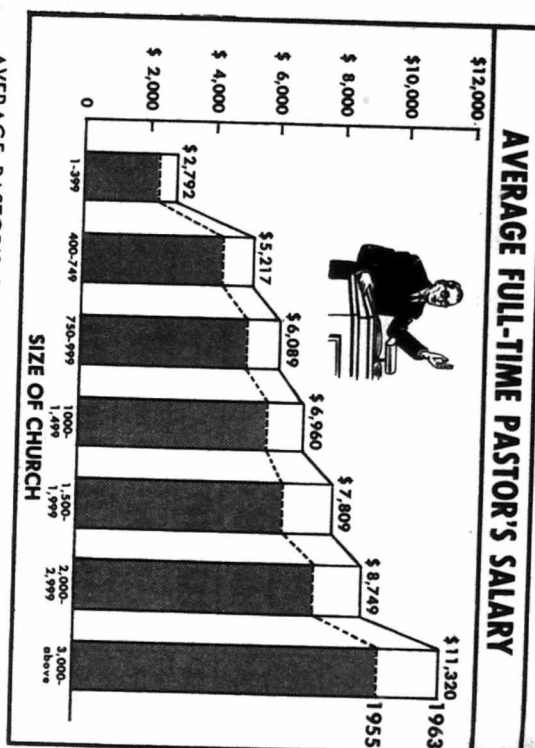
Per Cent of Receipts by Source, 1948 and 1963

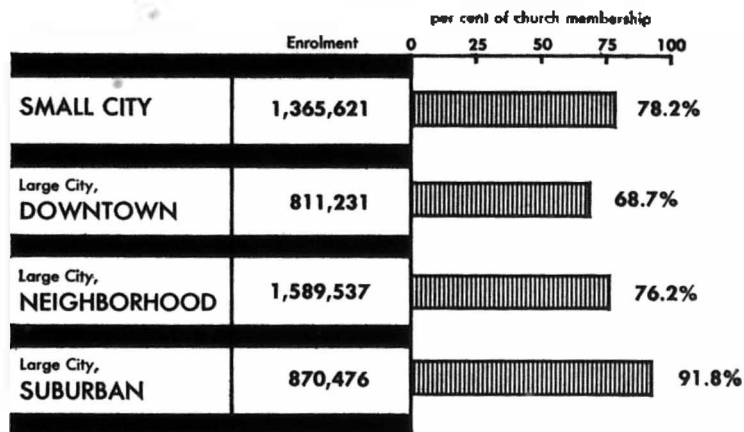

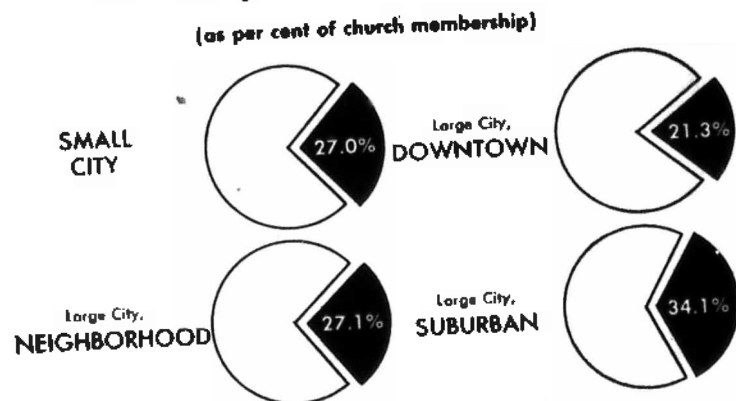
CITY SUNDAY SCHOOL ENROLMENT, 1963

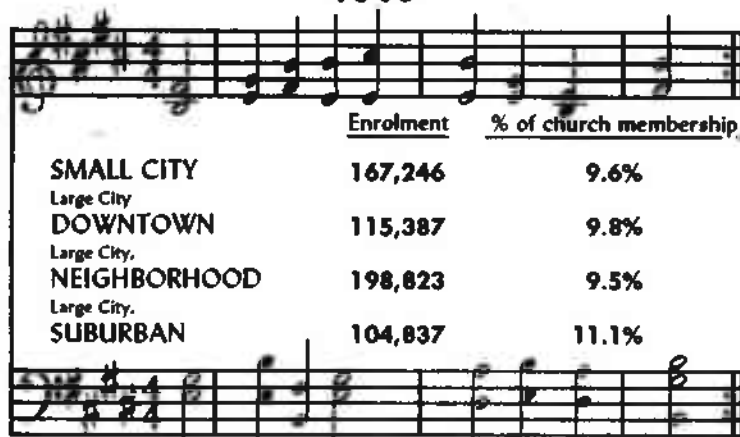

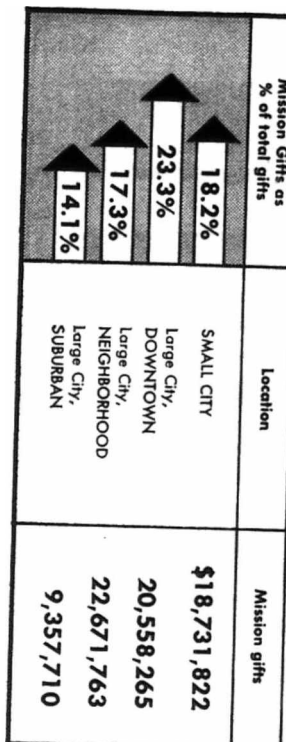

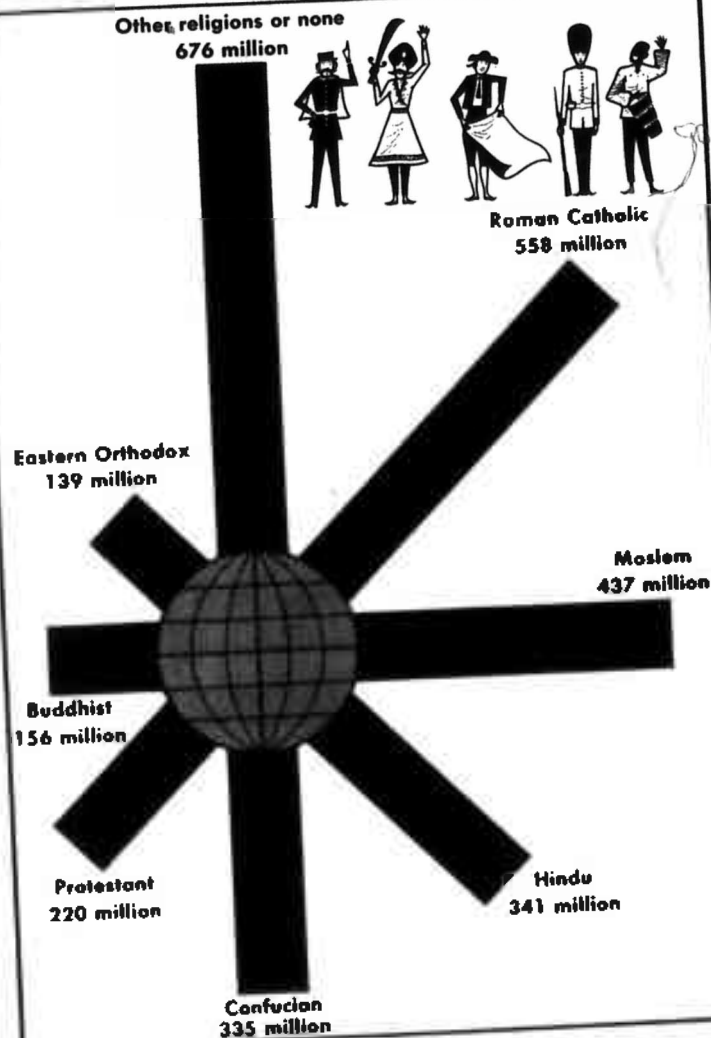

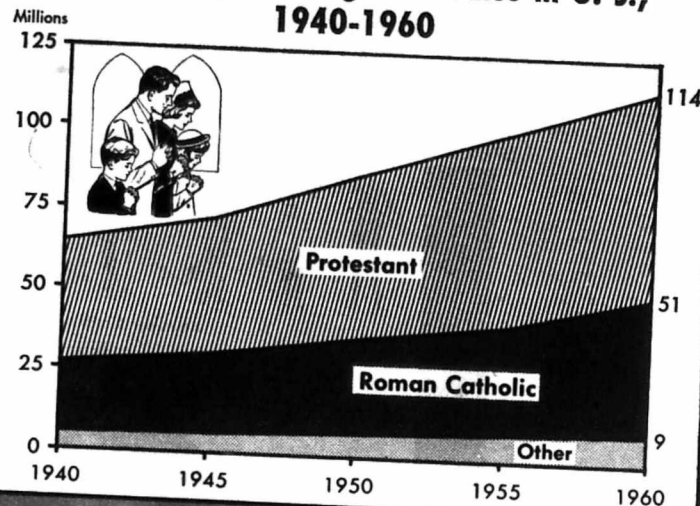
ESTIMATED MEMBERSHIP OF THE PRINCIPAL

RELIGIONS OF THE WORLD

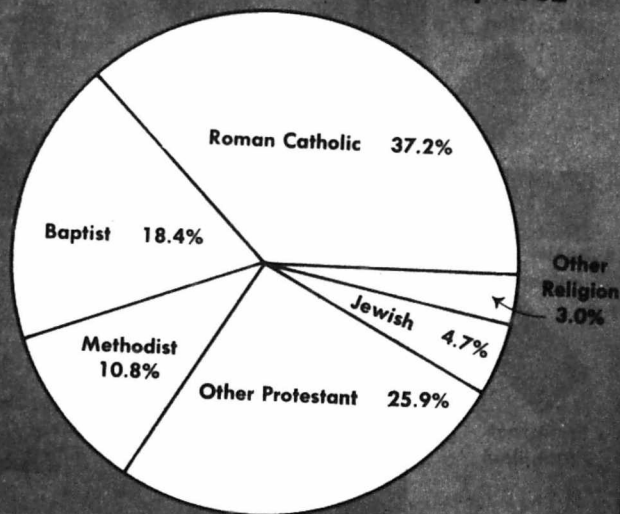

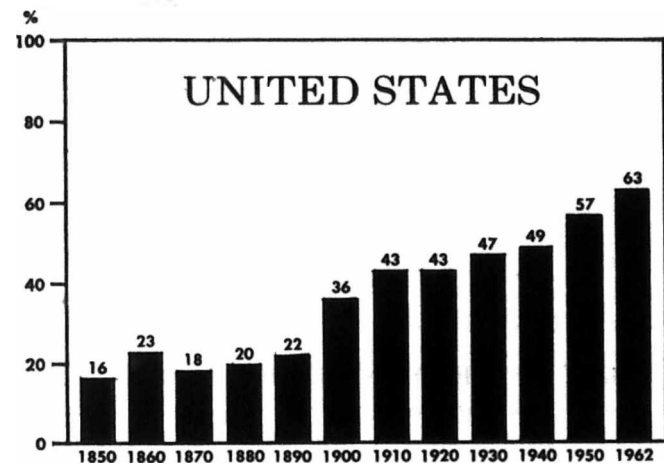

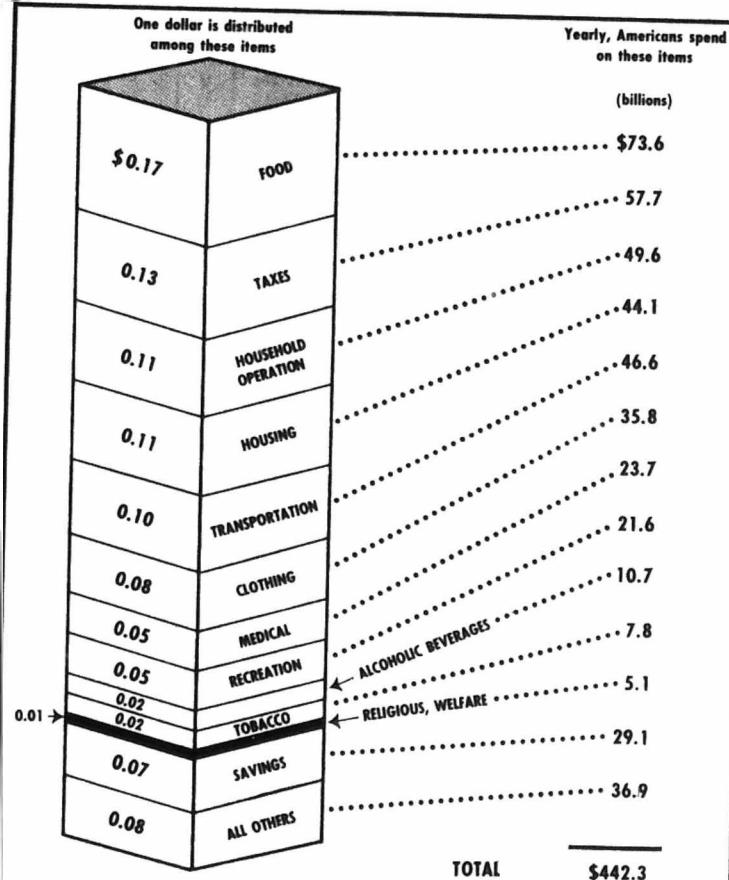

DISTRIBUTION OF THE "AVERAGE AMERICAN'S" DOLLAR, 1962

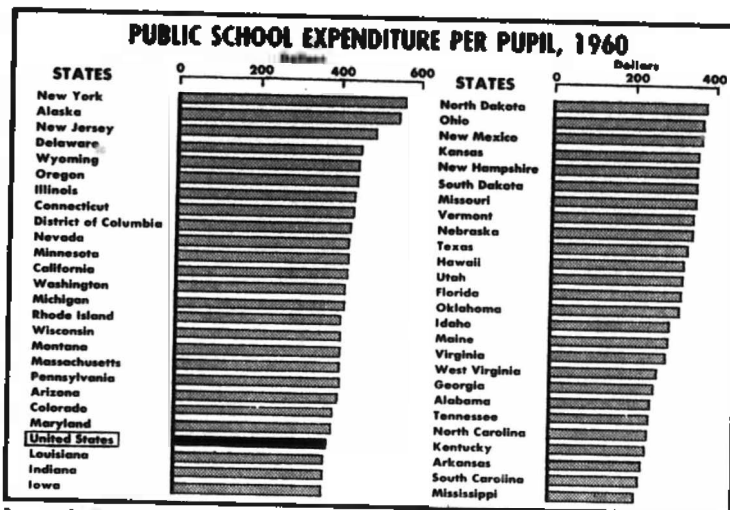

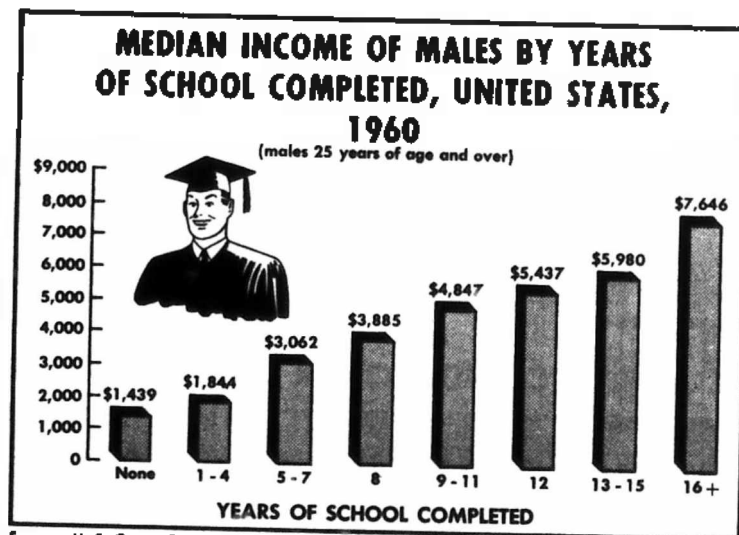

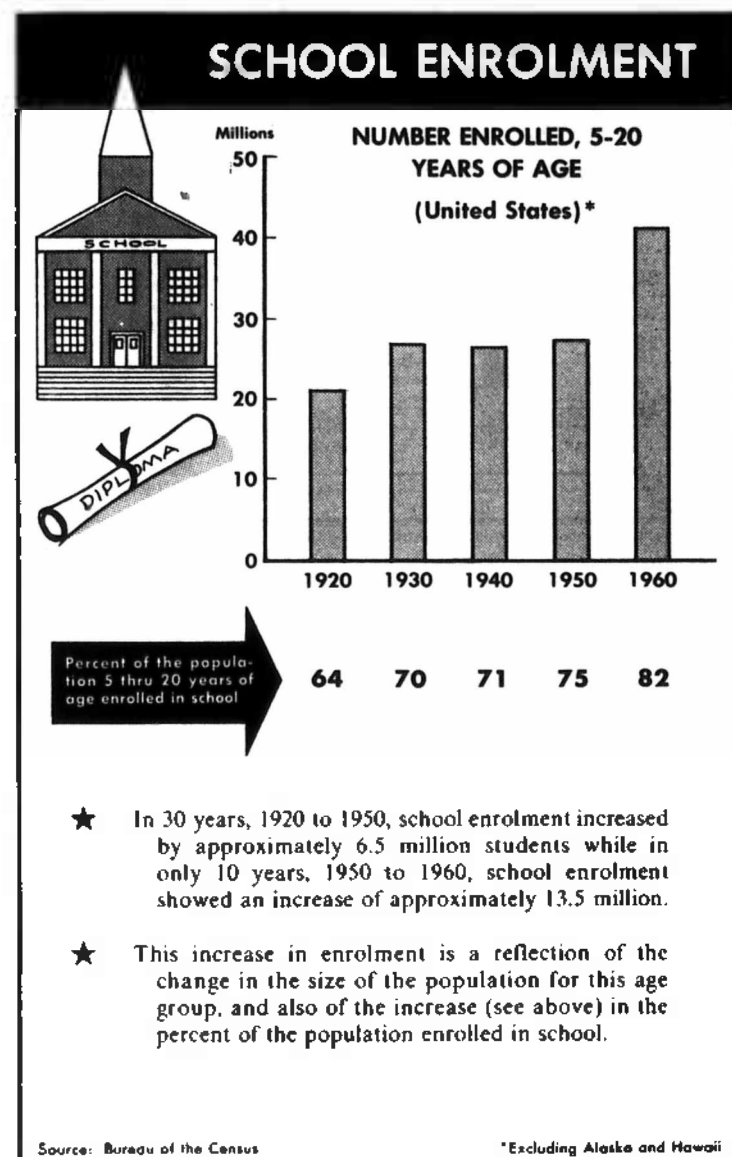

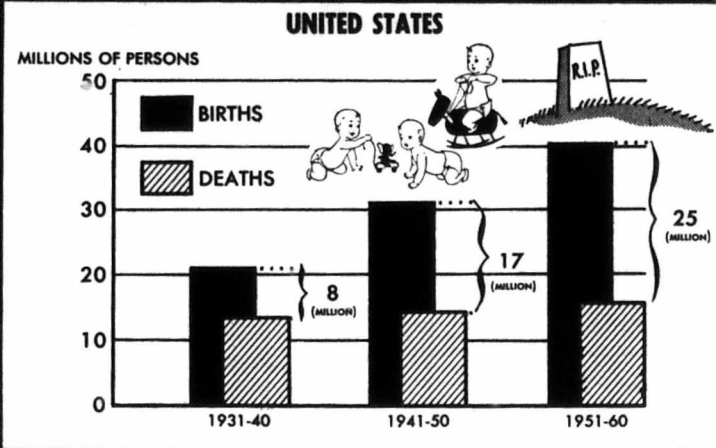

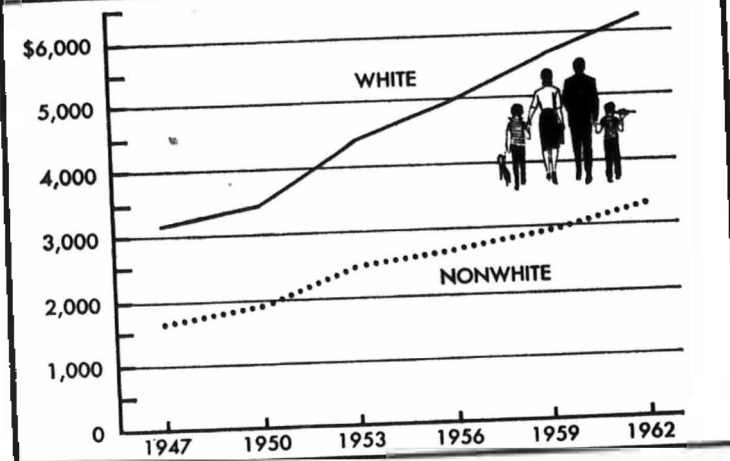

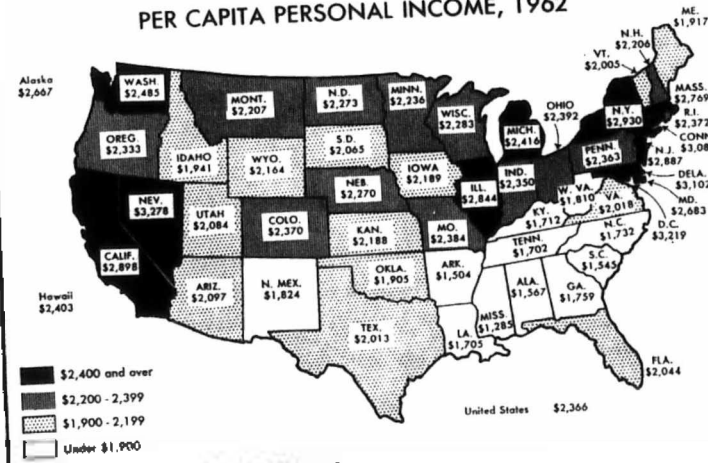

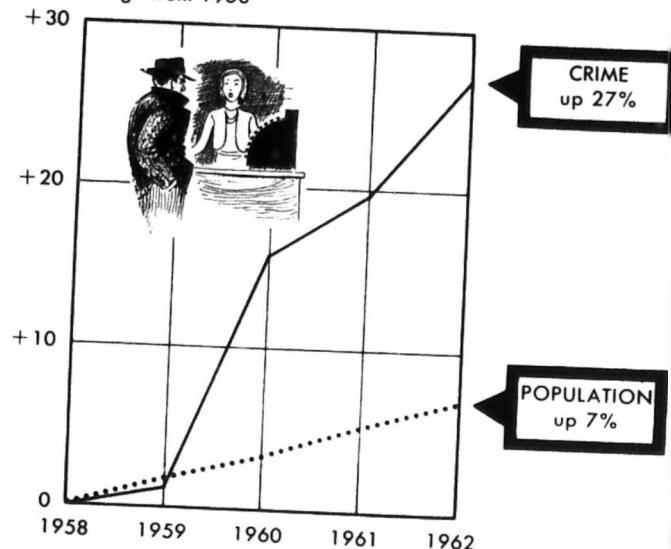
PER CAPITA PERSONAL INCOME, 1962

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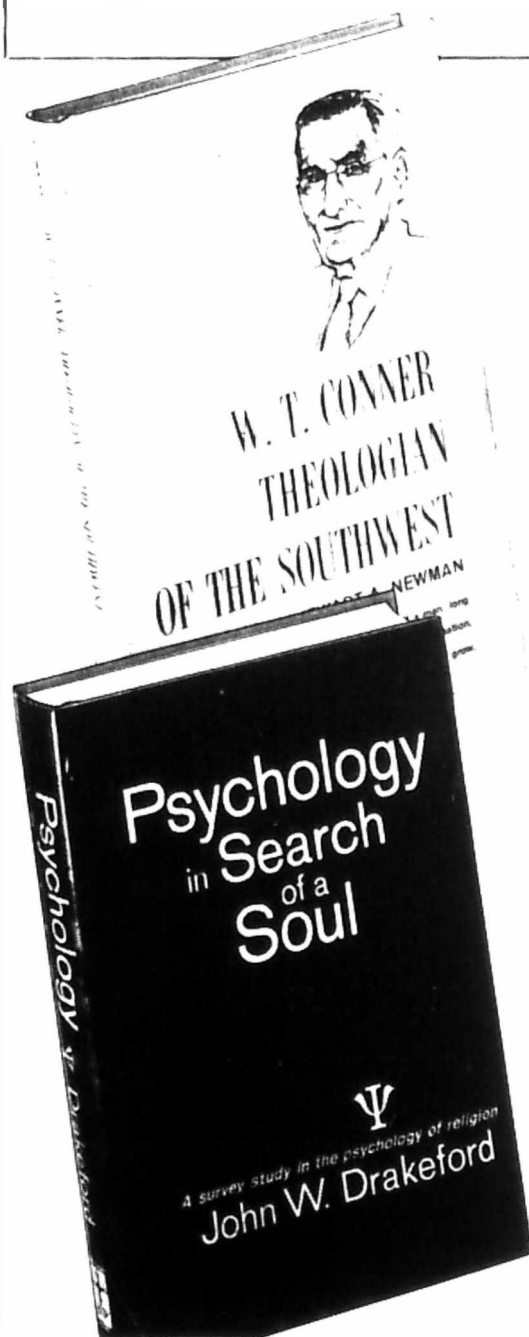
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
