Significant Effect on Statistics Caused By Revised Procedures

Certain procedures for processing denominational statistics have undergone major revision and are reflected for the first time in some of the 1965 figures reported in this volume.

Contrary to the practice in previous years, no estimates were included for particular enrolments or other figures not reported by a church. In cases where a church failed to report an enrolment in 1965 for an organization which had been reported the previous year, efforts were made to verify (by correspondence) the omission. If churches failed to respond to the verification attempt, the omission was taken to be valid. This policy of using only those figures actually reported by churches resulted in a significant downward adjustment in the following enrolments: Training Union, Woman's Missionary Union, Brotherhood, and Music Ministry. Sunday School enrolment was affected only slightly, compared to the four above. To a significant, but unknown degree the decreases shown by these enrolments are due to procedural revisions. Estimated "real" or true change in the enrolments cannot be determined at this time.

Figures for such items as Vacation Bible School enrolment, baptisms, and additions by letter were not affected by the change in procedures.

Another revision involves churches who fail to submit any report for three or more consecutive years. Previous to 1965, churches were "dropped" upon their third year of not reporting. Beginning in 1965, such churches will be included in the count of churches but considered as "inactive." No portion of the last-known record of the church will be included in other statistics. The number of such "inactive" churches will be indicated at appropriate spots in this and future Handbook volumes.

Because of the revised procedures, the 1965 figures specified above are not conceptually comparable to those of earlier years. Any comparisons involving these figures should be made with caution and with a full awareness of effects caused by the procedural changes.






TOTAL MEMBERSHIP IN SBC BY LOCATION



Open Country church—one located in a rural area such that (1) it is not immediately adjacent to an incorporated township or city, (2) it is likely surrounded by land not used for urban purposes, and (3) a sizable portion of its member families reside in the surrounding non-urban area.

Village—incorporated or unincorporated place (1) having less than 600 population, (2) surrounded by open country, and (3) not adjacent to a town or city.

Town—place having a population between 600 - 2,499

City (2,500 - 9,998 pop.) church—one located in a city with 2,500 - 9,999 population or its suburbs whose member families (able portion) work in a city

Areas in city having population of 10,000 or more



Downtown—central business or main retail store area (see A at left)

Neighborhood—residential and industrial areas between the central business area and the suburbs (see B at left)

Suburbs—outlying areas usually adjacent to neighborhood or older areas of city; often new residential areas at edge of city which may or may not be within the city limits (see C at left)














Percentage of Music Ministry enrolment




INDEX OF PERCENTAGE GROWTH FOR BROTHERHOOD AND WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION 1955-1965










NUMBER OF BAPTIST STUDENTS IN SCHOOLS
WITH A BSU




NUMBER OF BAPTIST STUDENT UNIONS





TREND IN POPULATION AND CHURCH MEMBERSHIP IN THE UNITED STATES

















DISTRIBUTION of EXPENDITURES By Mr. AVERAGE AMERICAN,* 1964





1960-1970








