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Standpoint

Now that the statistical evidence is in, what is its message? What did Southern Baptists really do, or not do, in 1966? Such are the wonderings of analyst and interested member alike.

Actually, the trends are not particularly favorable. The past year saw an extension of downward movement in most church organizational enrollments. The fruits of evangelism may be judged somewhat inadequate in light of potential "harvesters" and the ever enlarged field which is indeed white unto harvest. Financial stewardship seems healthy, yet for years has shown no basic improvement when growth in personal income is taken into consideration.

One more year's delay has apparently occurred in what many perceptive Convention leaders prophesy as imminent—a significant awakening and recovery of previous vitality. If this is to be, then we must hasten to turn the corner before passing the intersection of Challenge Street and Opportunity Avenue.

Resolutely, with church- and agency-shaking vigor, we must learn of, and set about to fulfil, the destiny of a faithful discipleship.

Back to the statistics themselves. Grateful appreciation is recorded here for church and associational clerks, state convention personnel, and department staff members whose devoted service is manifest in this HANDBOOK.

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Effect on Statistics Caused By Revised Procedures in 1965

Certain procedures for processing denominational statistics underwent major revision in 1965 and are also reflected in the 1966 figures reported in this volume.

Contrary to the practice in previous years, no estimates were included in 1965 and 1966 for particular enrolments or other figures not reported by a church. In cases where a church failed to report an enrolment for an organization which had been reported the previous year, efforts were made to verify (by correspondence) the omission. If churches failed to respond to the verification attempt, the omission was taken to be valid. This policy of using only those figures actually reported by churches resulted in a significant downward adjustment for 1965 in the following enrolments: Training Union, Woman's Missionary Union, Brotherhood, and Music Ministry. Sunday School enrolment was affected only slightly, compared to the four above. To a significant, but unknown degree, the decreases in those enrolments were due to procedural revisions. Estimated "real" or true change in those 1965 enrolments could not be determined.

Figures for such items as Vacation Bible School enrolment, baptisms, and additions by letter were not affected by the 1965 change in procedures.

Another revision involved churches who fail to submit any report for three or more consecutive years. Previous to 1965, churches were "dropped" upon their third year of not reporting. Beginning in 1965, such churches have been included in the count of churches but considered as "inactive." No portion of the last-known record of the church was included in other statistics. The number of such "inactive" churches is indicated at appropriate spots in this volume.

Any comparisons involving the 1965 and 1966 figures with those of previous years should be made with caution and with a full awareness of effects caused by the procedural changes. However, comparisons involving the 1966 figures with those for 1965 should closely reflect "real" change.

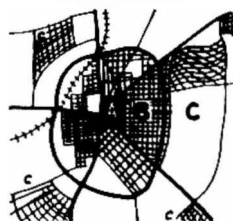

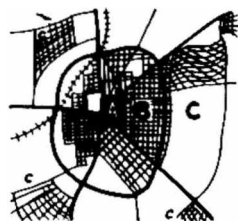

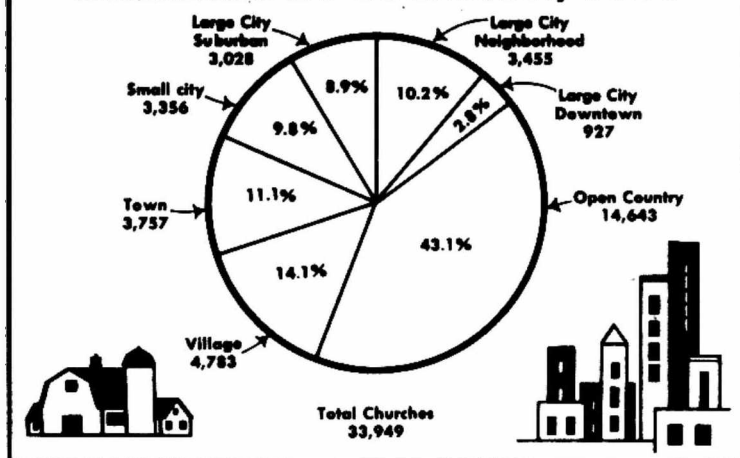

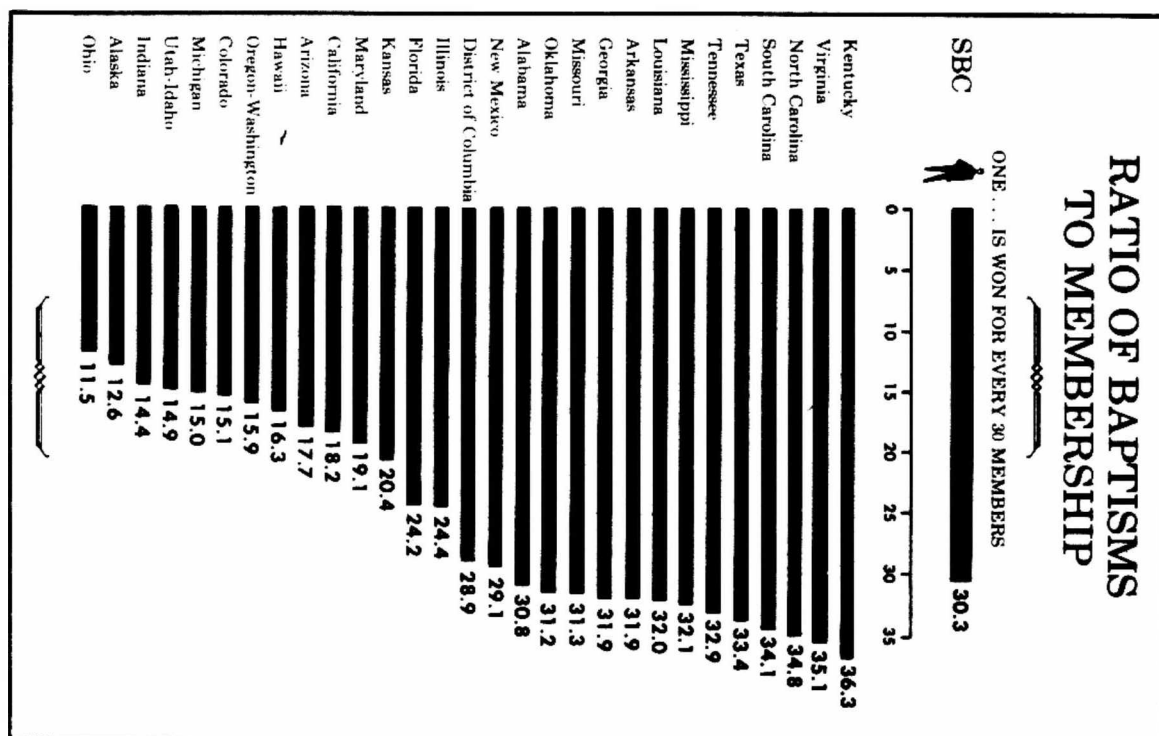

ADDITIONS BY BAPTISM—SOUTHERN BAPTIST CHURCHES, BY LOCATION—1966-1965

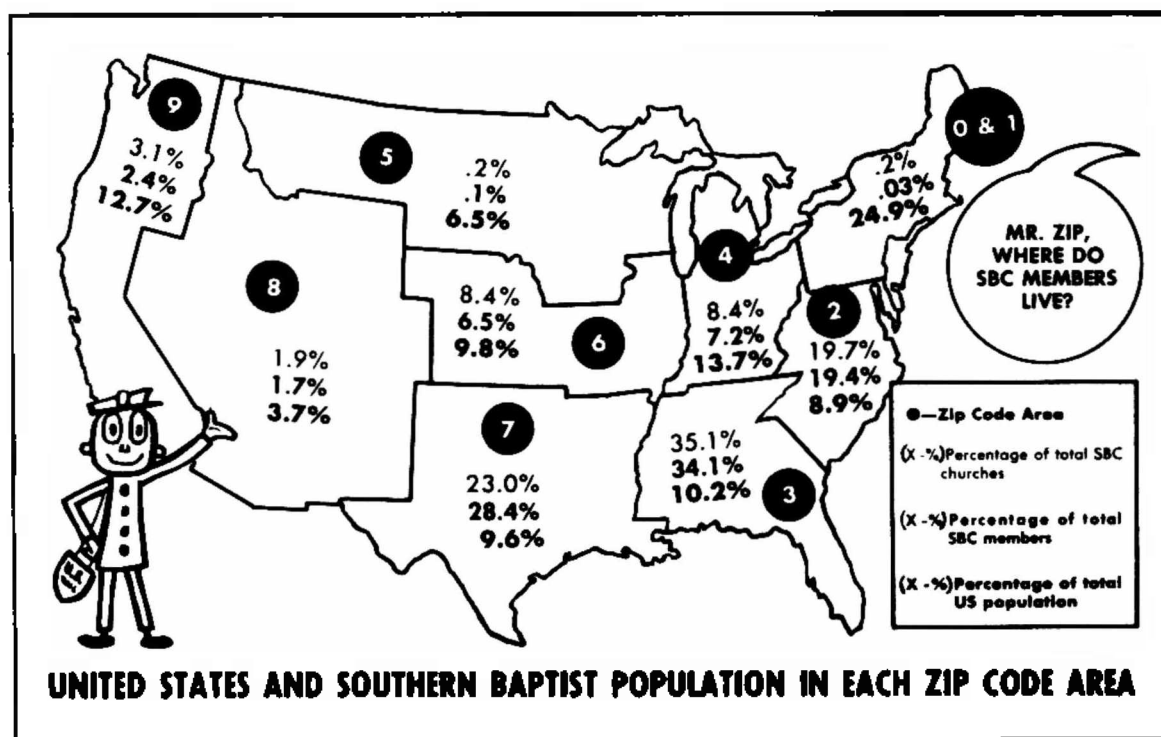

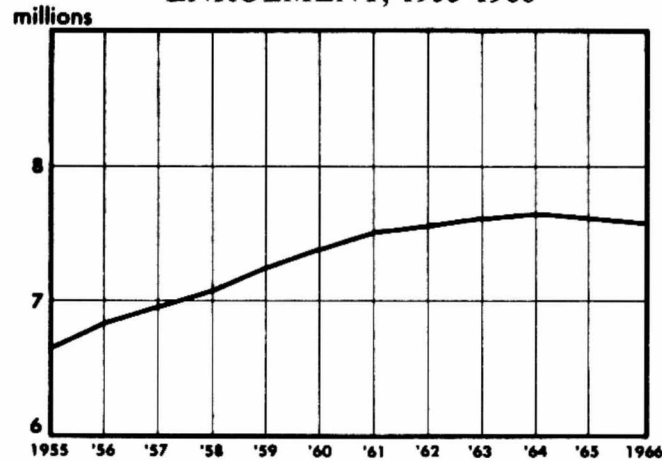

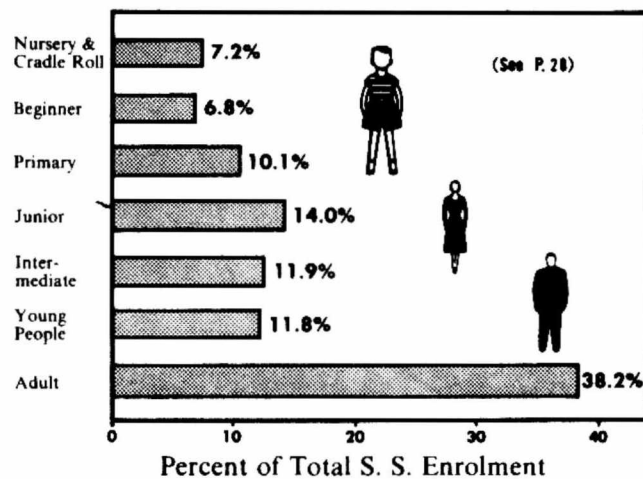

SUNDAY SCHOOL ENROLMENT BY AGE GROUP—1966

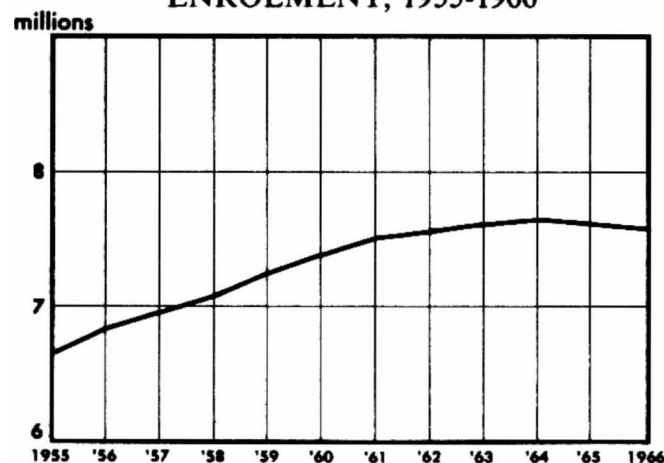


SUNDAY SCHOOL ENROLMENT, SOUTHERN BAPTIST CHURCHES, BY LOCATION—1966-1965

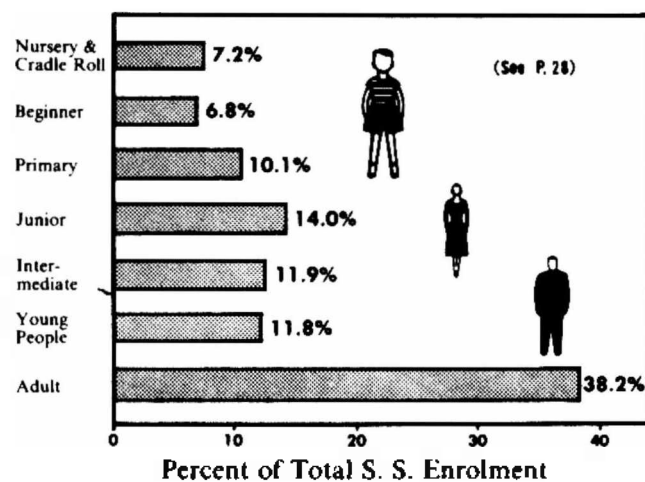

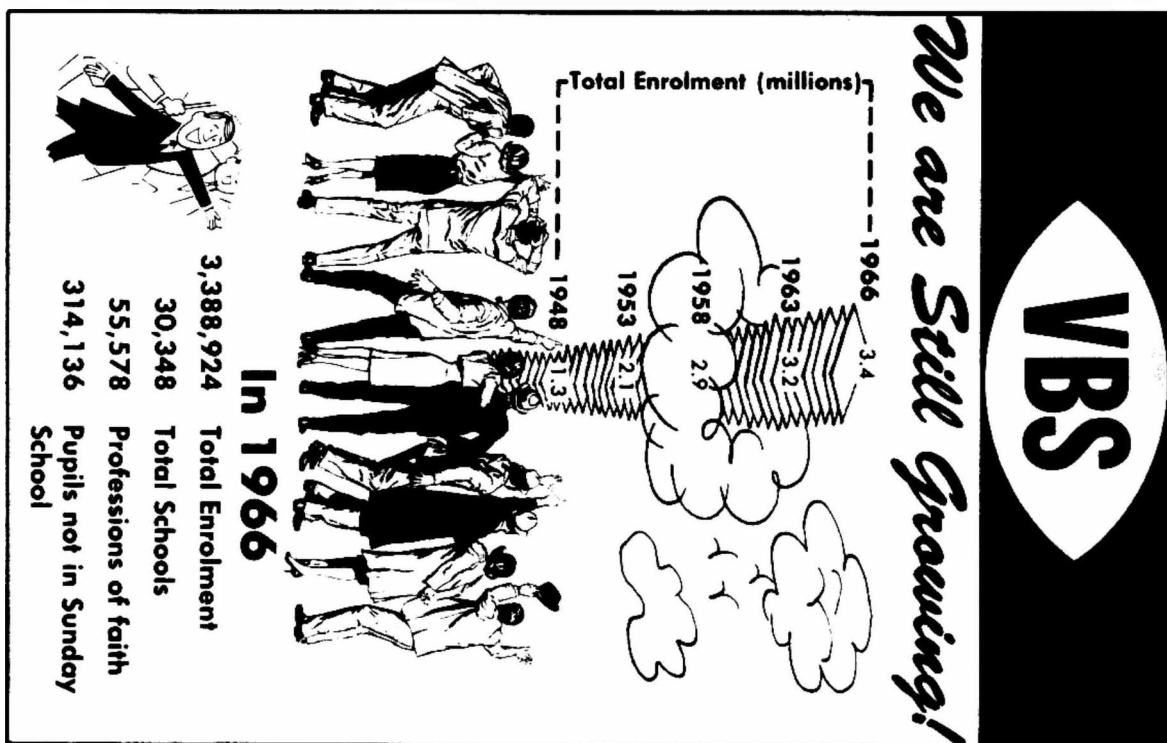

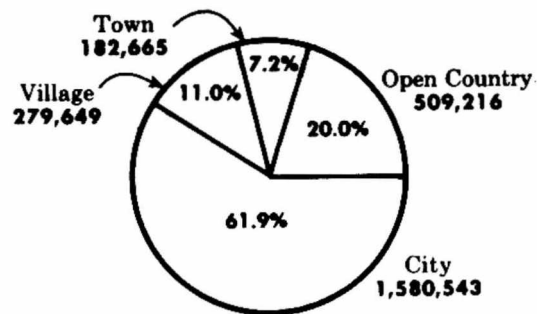

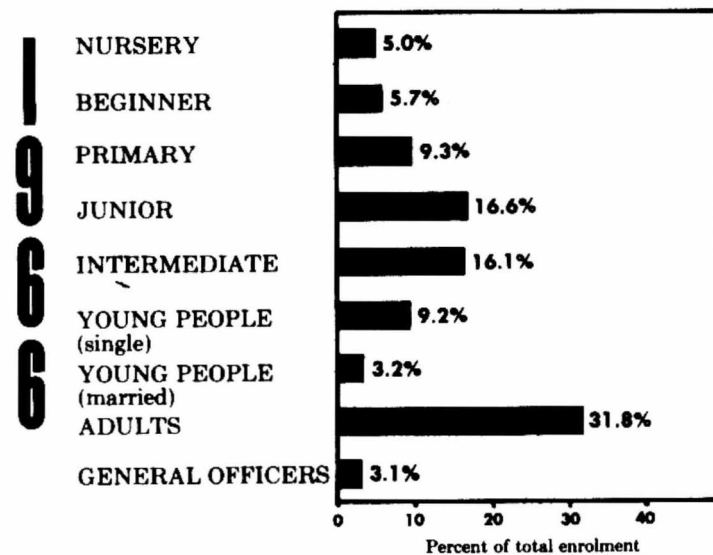


TRAINING UNION ENROLMENT BY LOCATION

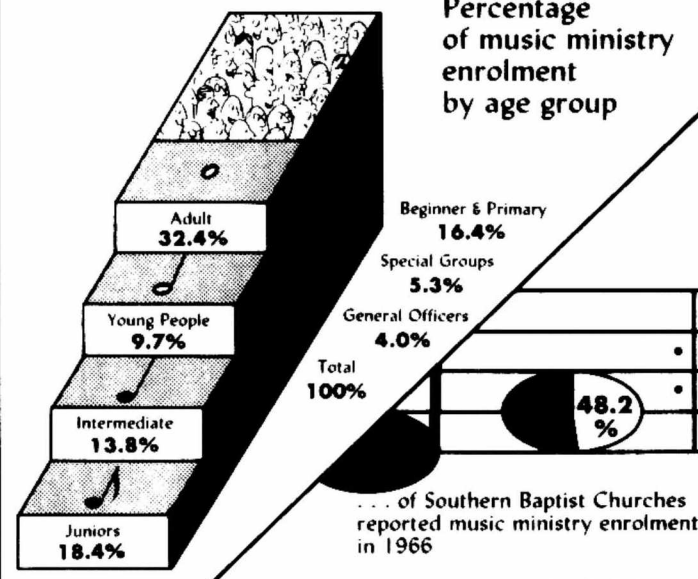

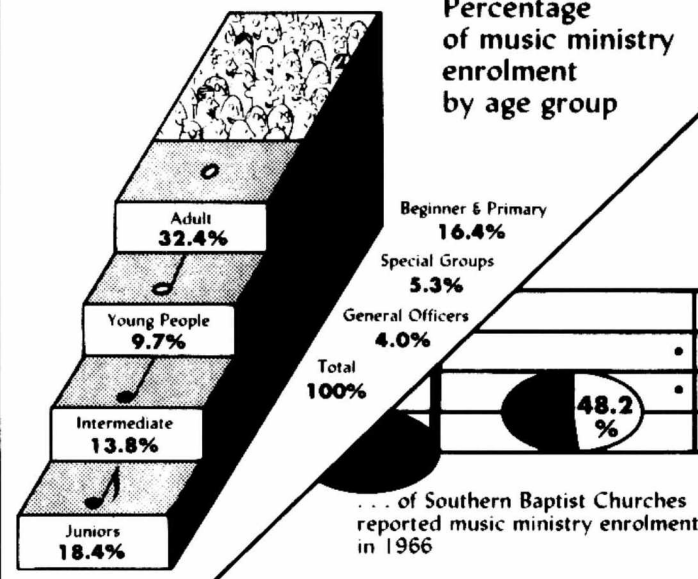

Percentage of music ministry enrolment by age group

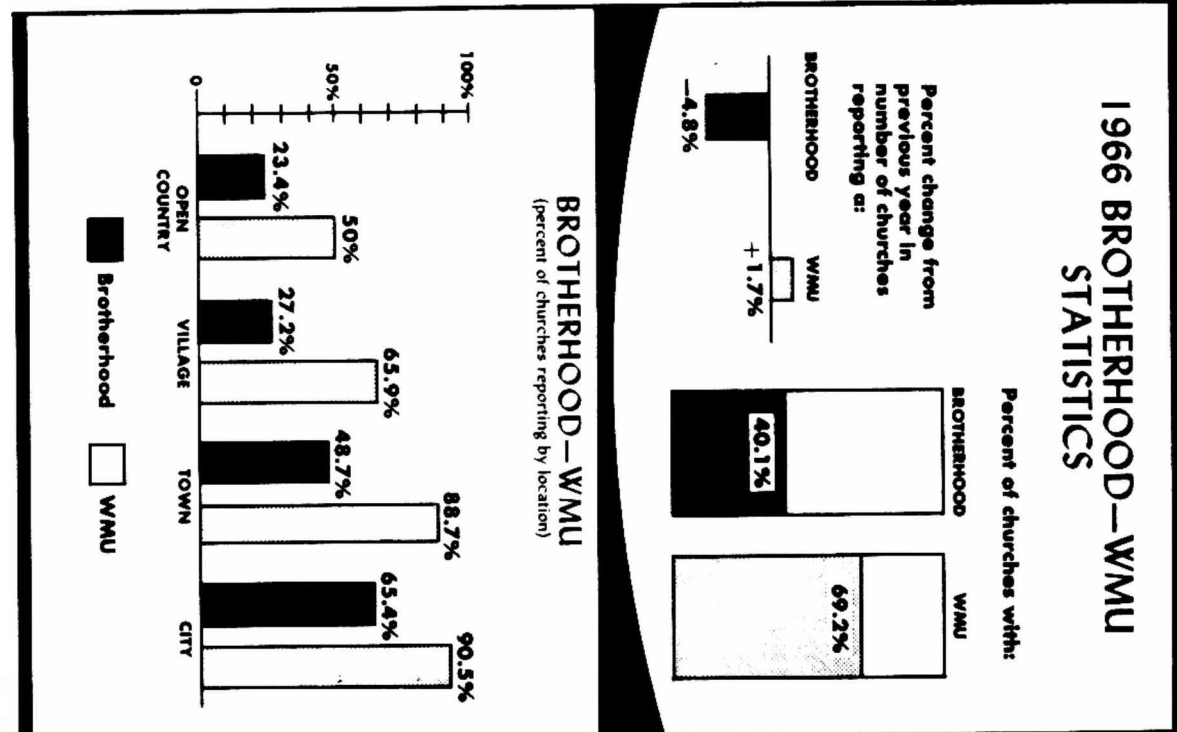

BROTHERHOOD ENROLMENT, SOUTHERN BAPTIST CHURCHES, BY LOCATION—1966-1965

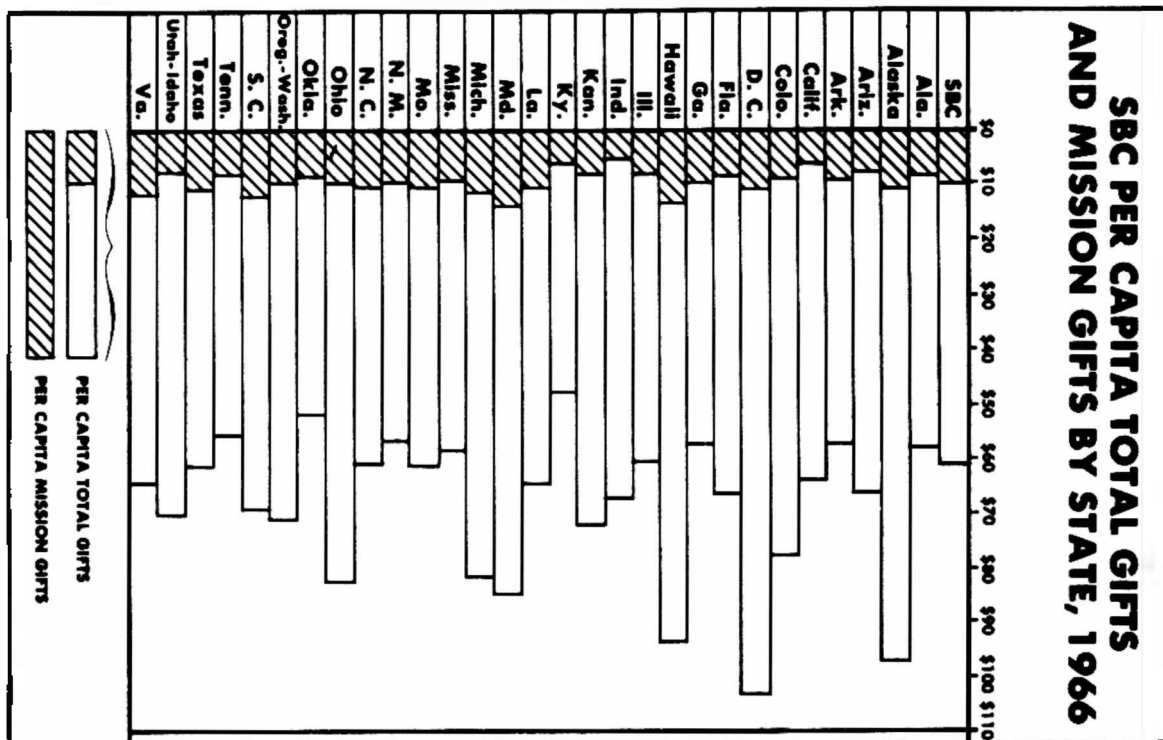

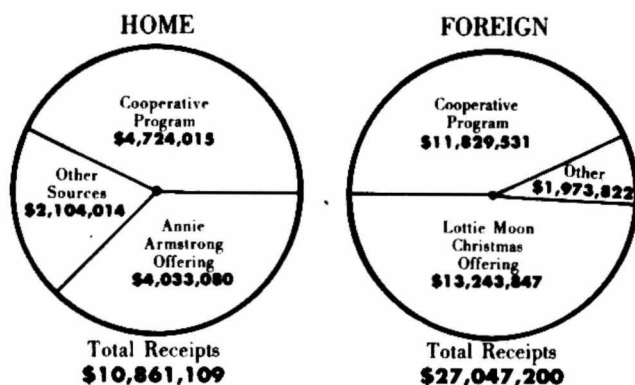


TOTAL GIFTS, SOUTHERN BAPTIST CHURCHES, BY LOCATION—1966-1965

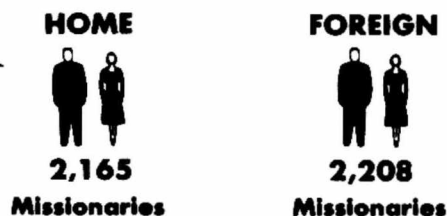

HOME AND FOREIGN MISSIONS 1966 Personnel



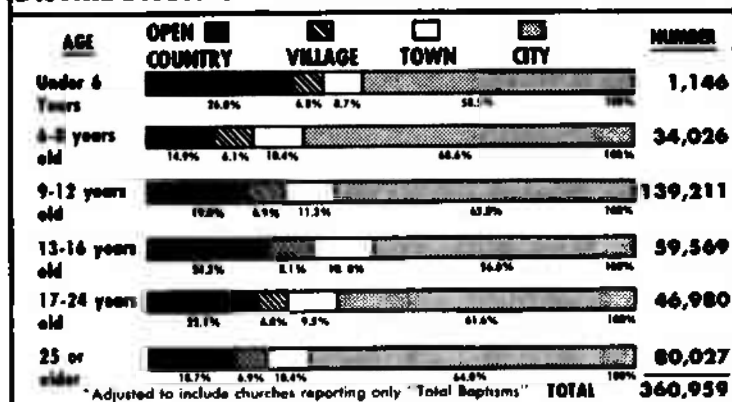

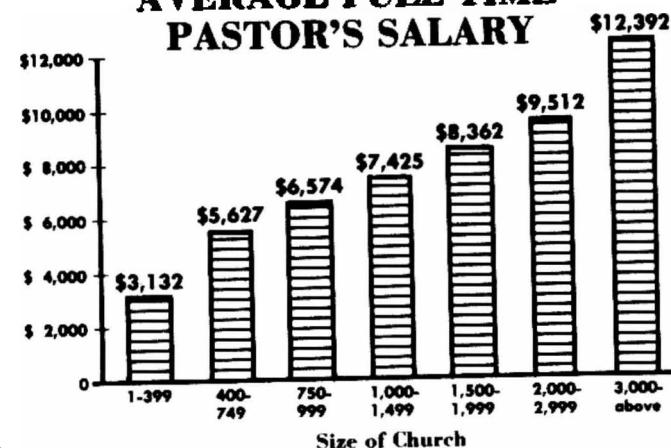
DISTRIBUTION OF BAPTISMS BY AGE AND LOCATION*

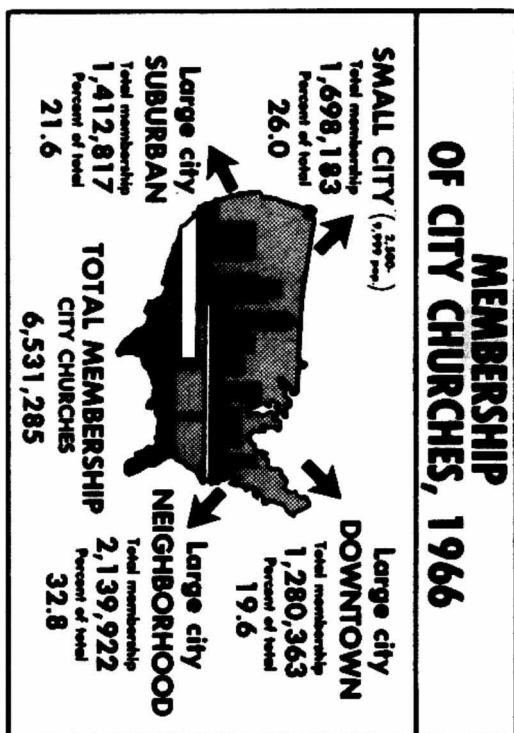

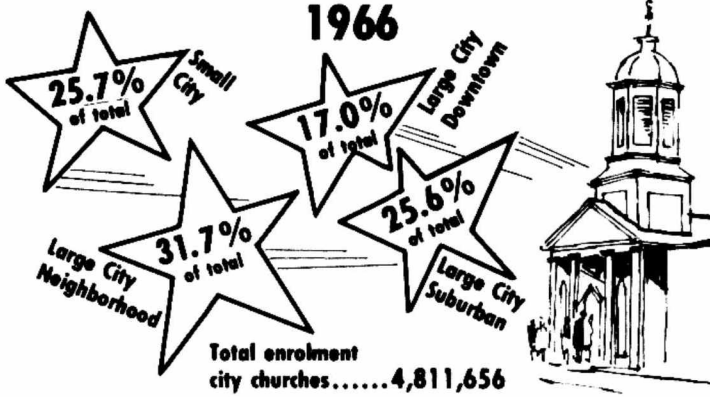

CITY SUNDAY SCHOOL ENROLMENT 1966

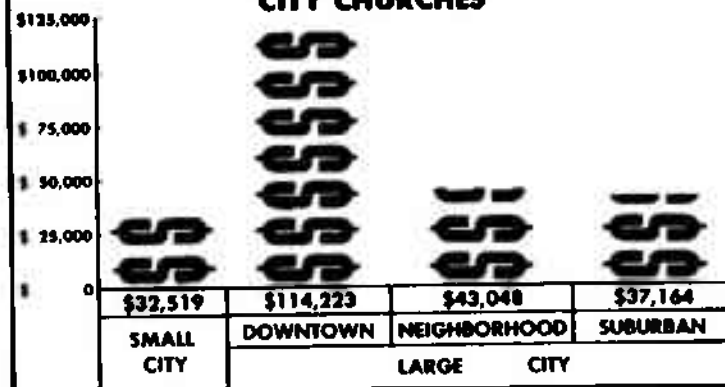

TOTAL GIFTS PER CHURCH—1966 CITY CHURCHES

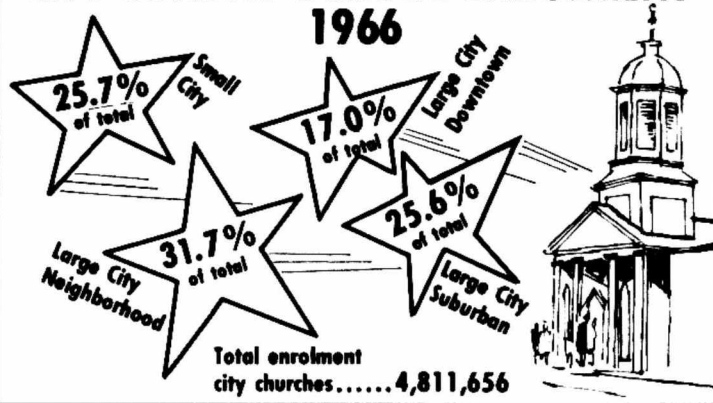

CITY SUNDAY SCHOOL ENROLMENT 1966

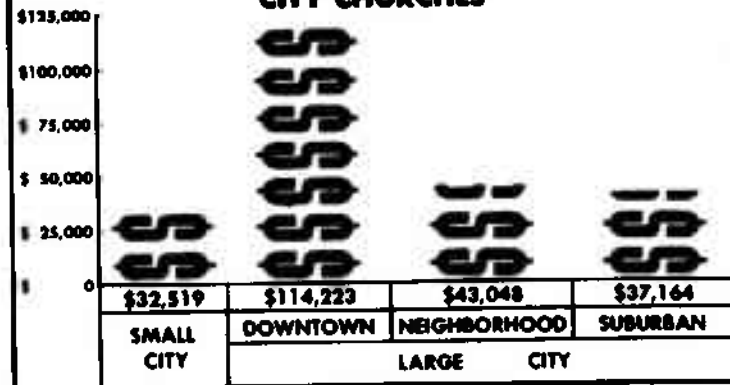

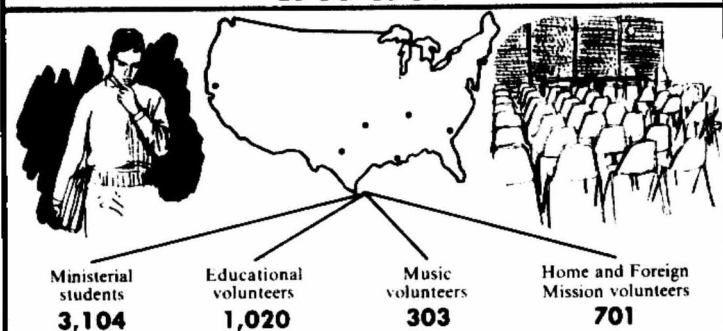

SOUTHERN BAPTIST SEMINARIES 1966-1967



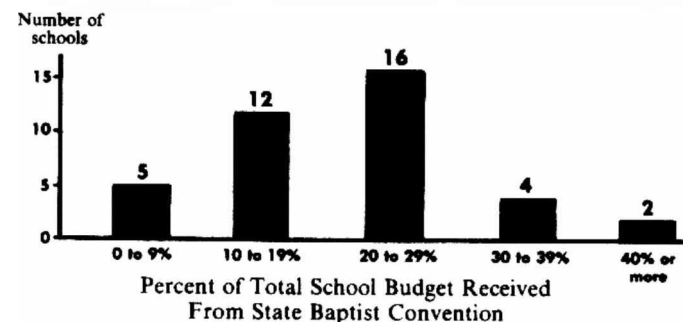

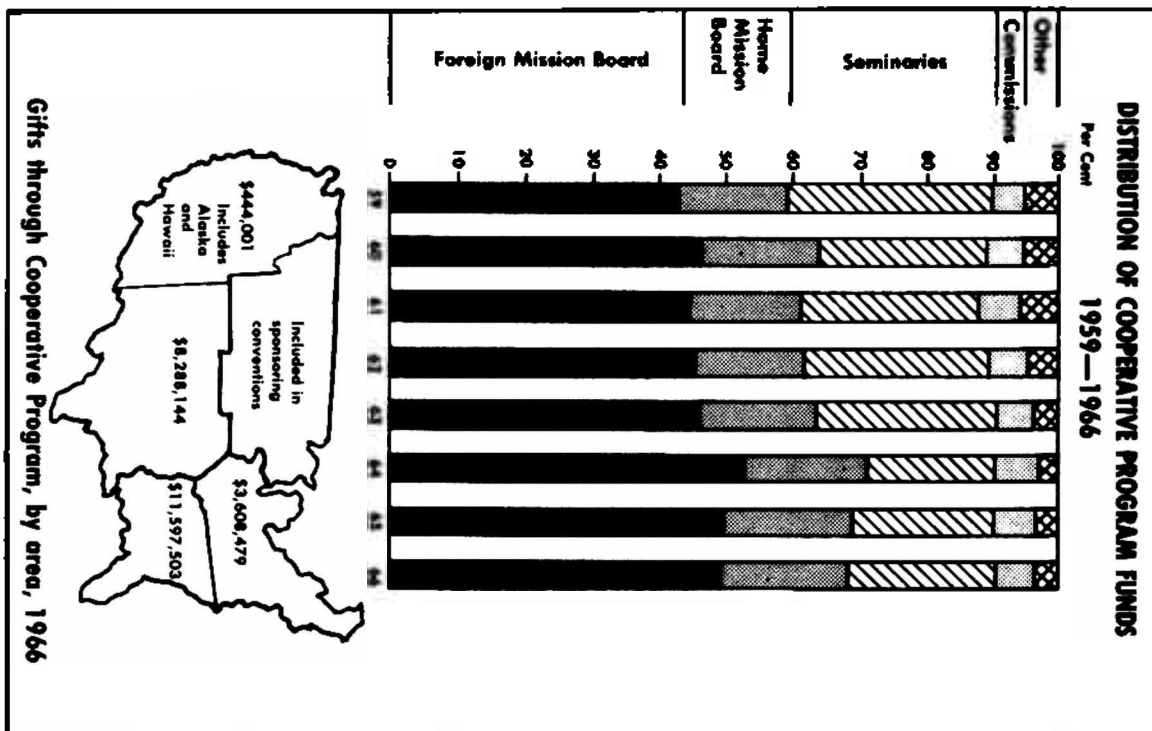

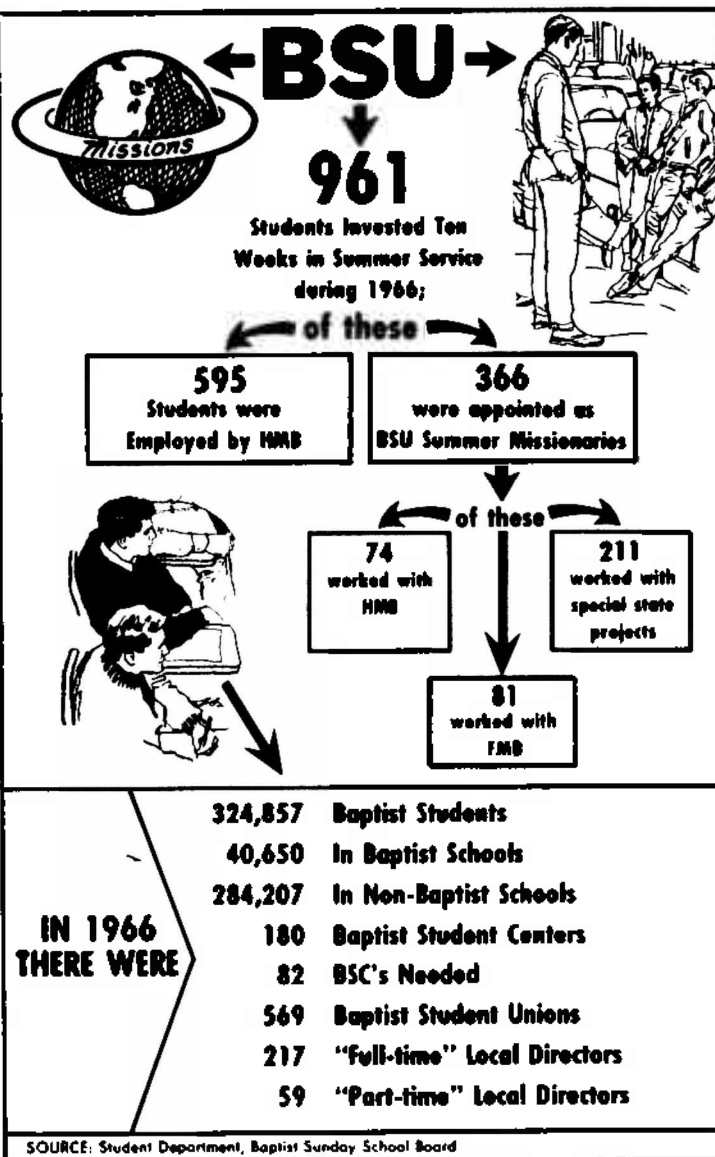

PER CAPITA GIVING OF LARGER RELIGIOUS BODIES in the UNITED STATES 1965

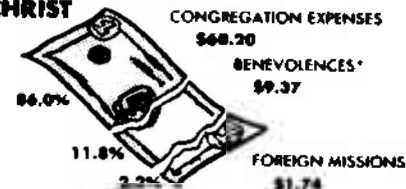

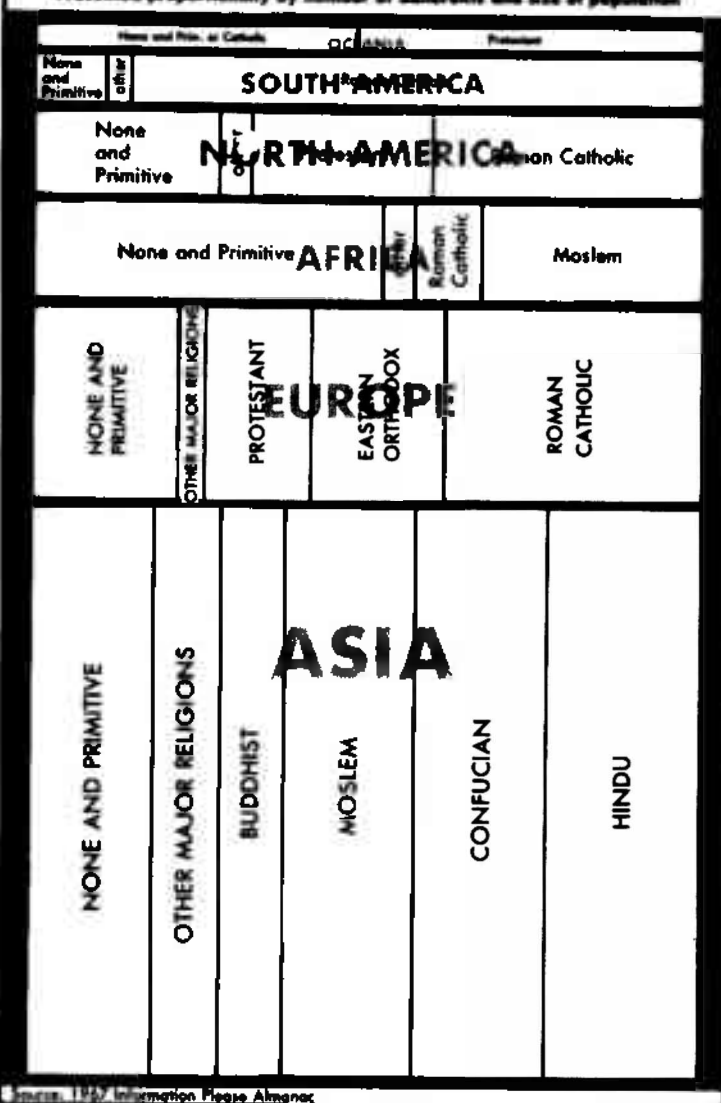

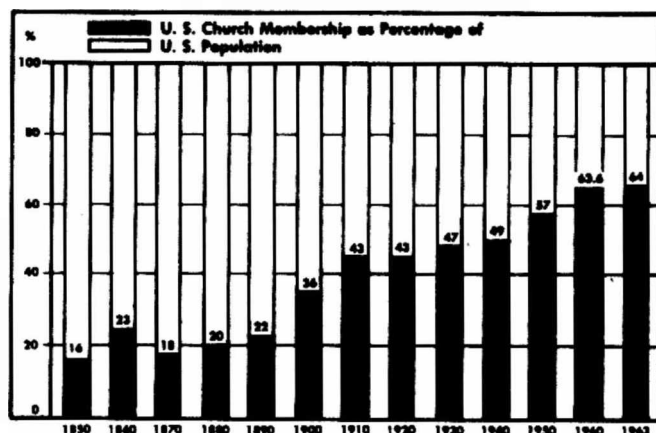

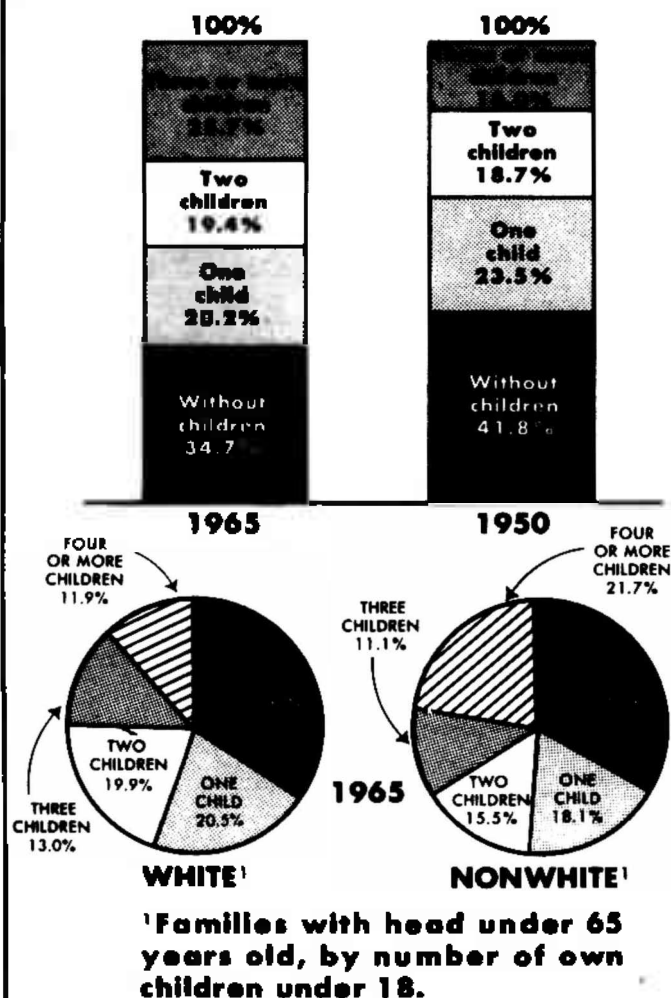

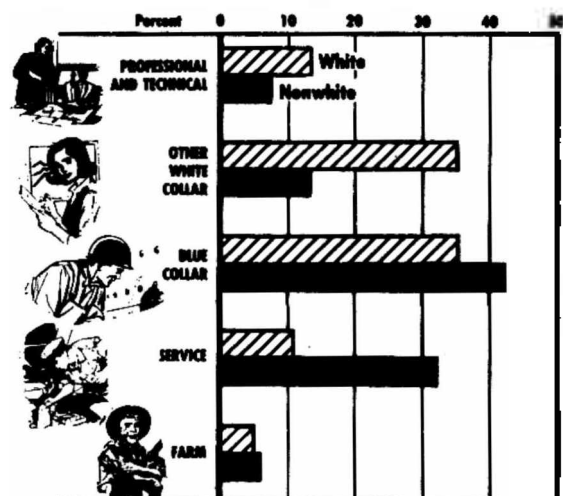

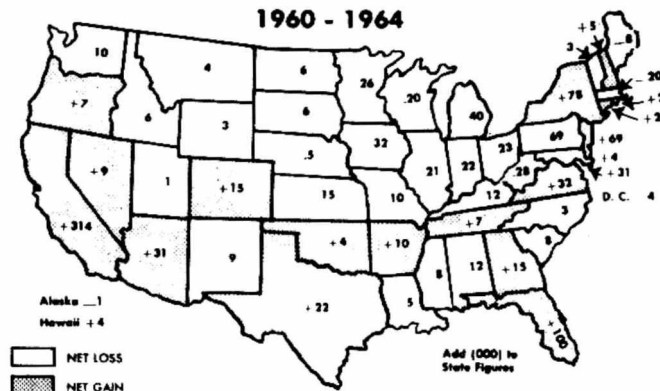
Median Income in 1965 male year-round full-time workers

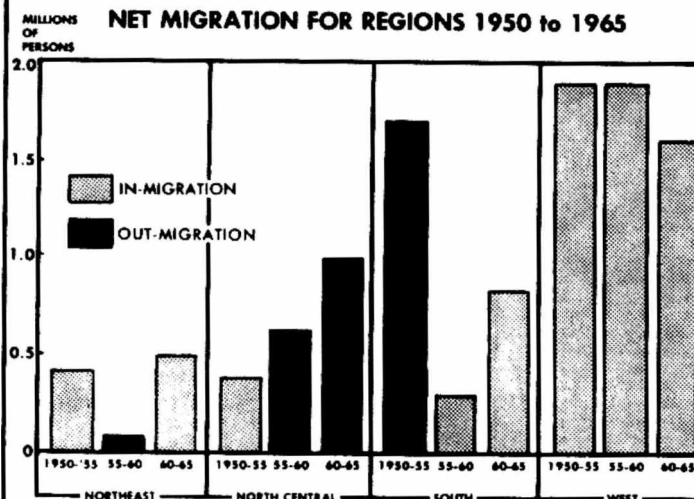
AMERICANS ON THE MOVE

Average Annual U. S. Population Migration 1960 - 1964



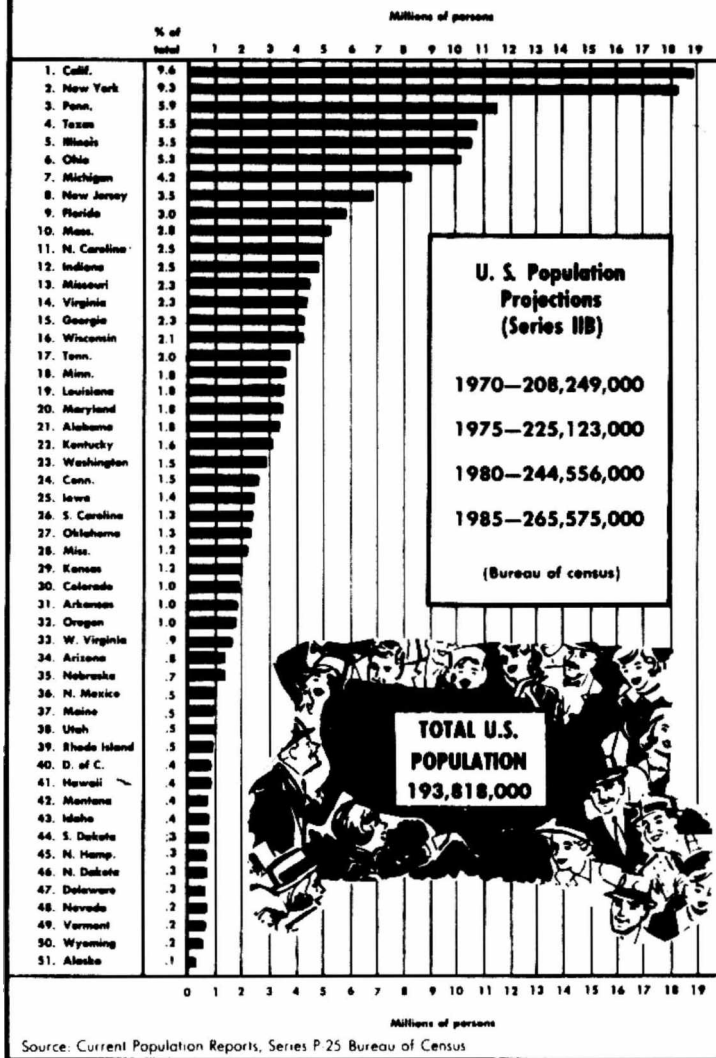

NET MIGRATION FOR REGIONS 1950 to 1965

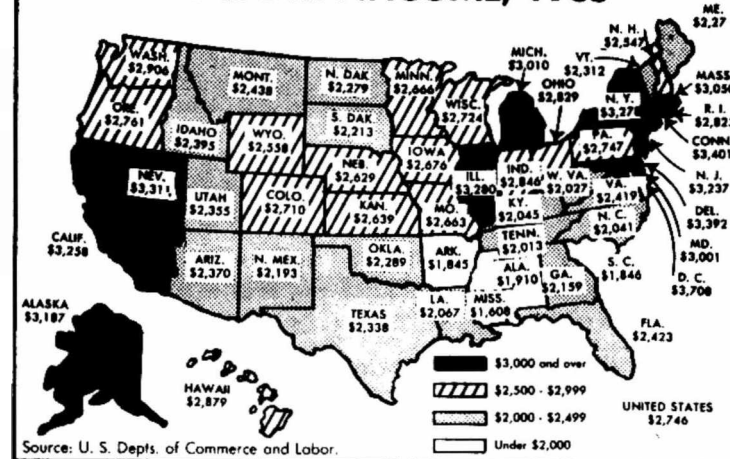

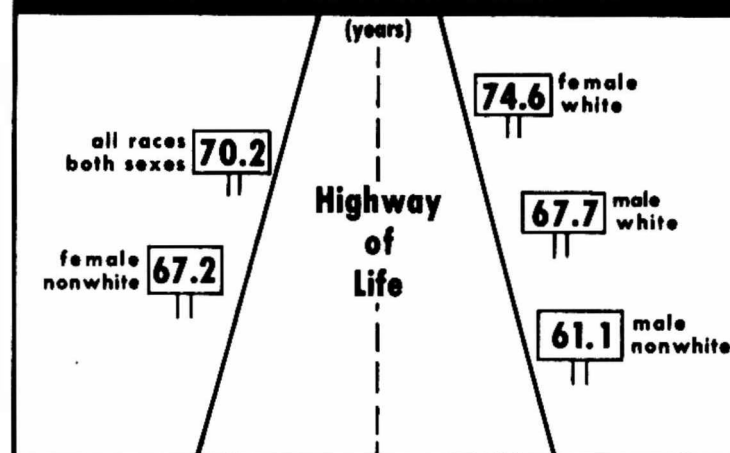
STATES RANKED BY POPULATION—1966

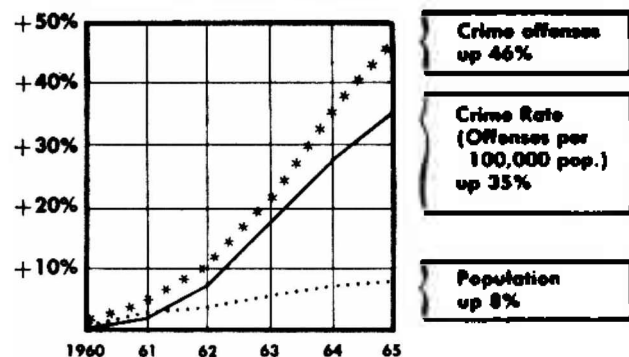

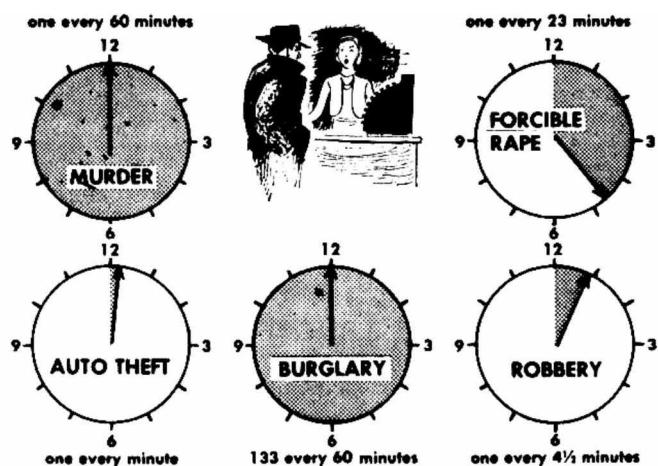
PERCENT CHANGE IN U.S. CRIME 1960-1965

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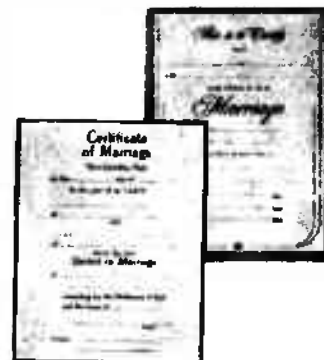
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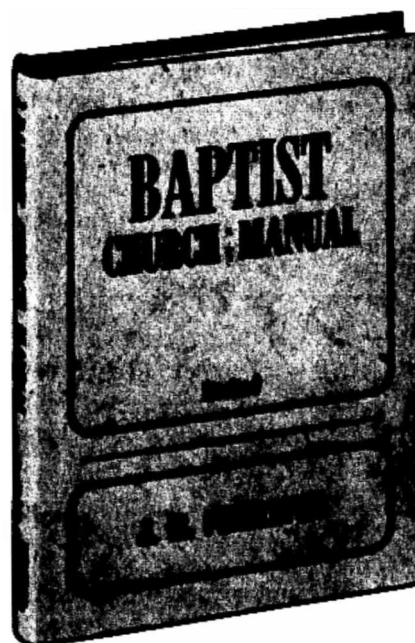
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
