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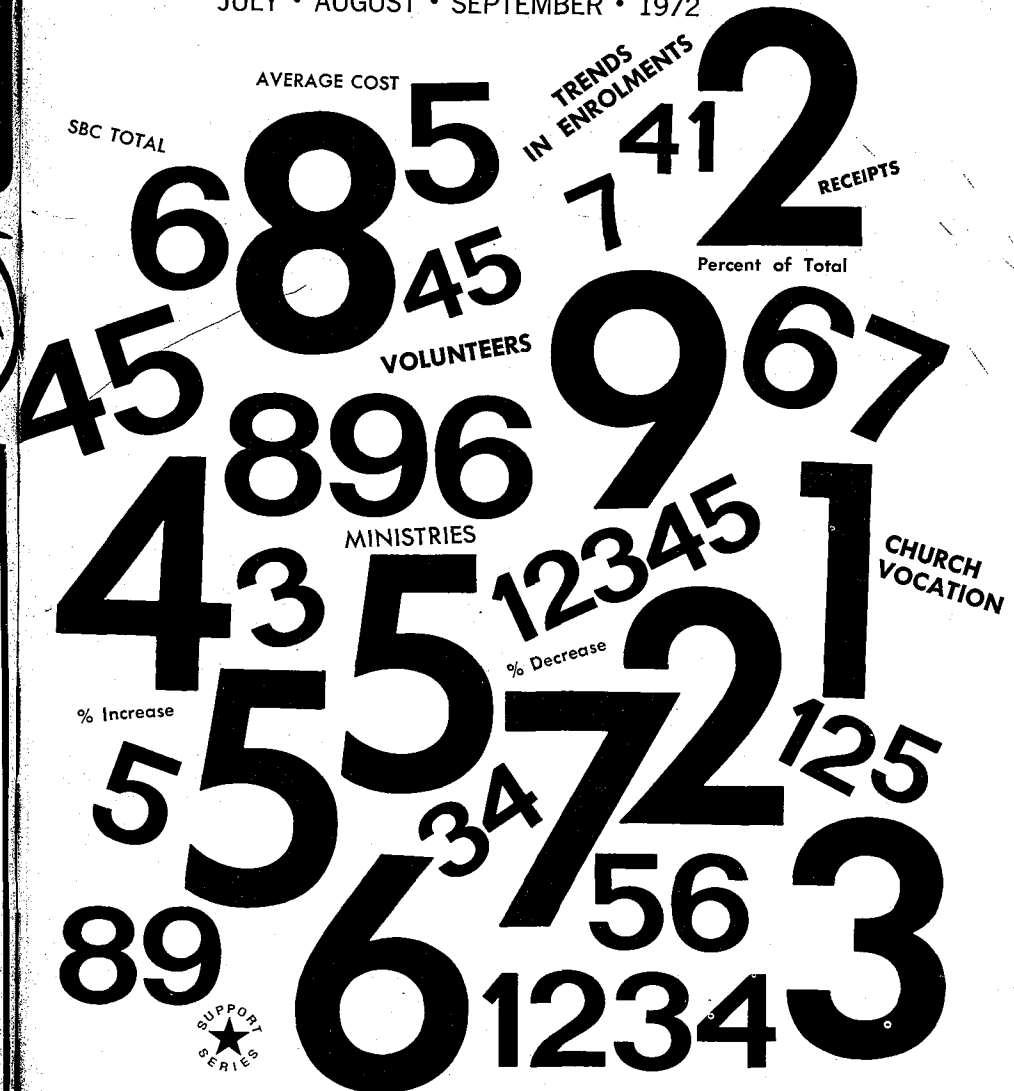
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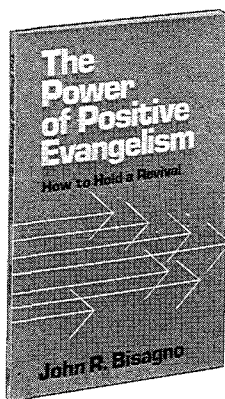
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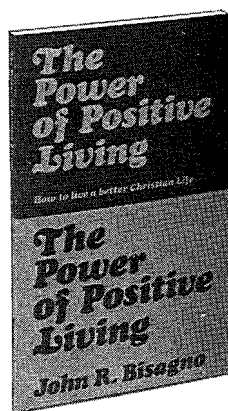

The largest percent of change reported for any item was related to the number of baptisms— an increase of 11.1%.

Total gifts increased 9.1% over the amount of the 1970 total gifts. This increase is the highest percentage increase in total gifts for the past five years. Two of the church organizations experienced an increase in enrolment and three experienced a decrease in enrolment.

The decrease in WMU enrolment and increase in Brotherhood enrolment is believed, in part, to reflect a shift of boys 6-8 years of age from WMU Sunbeams to Brotherhood Crusaders as a result of the New Grouping-Grading Plan.

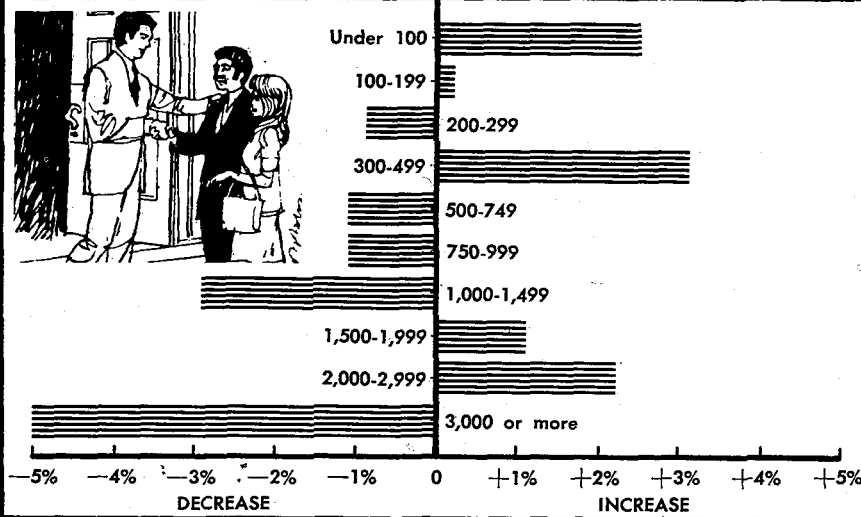

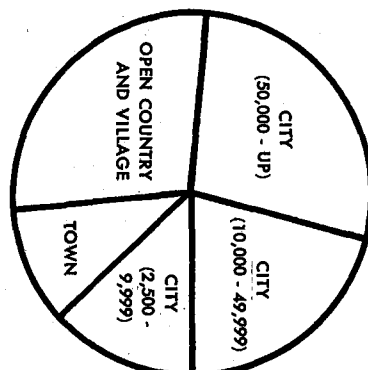

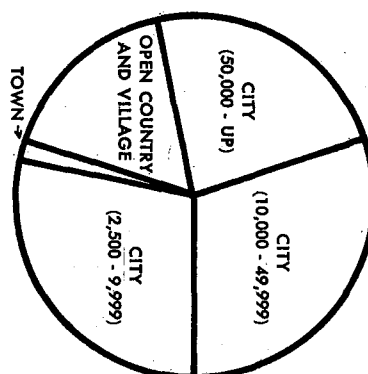

Percent of total by location



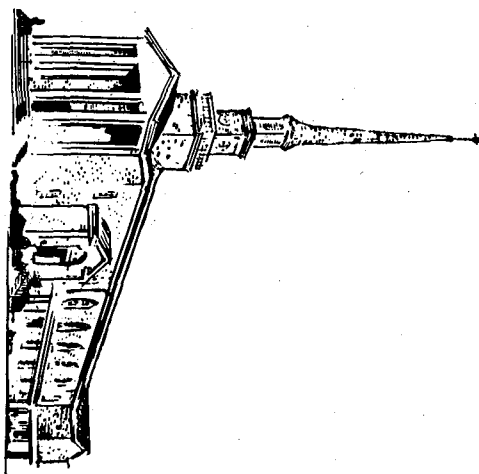
NET DIFFERENCE*

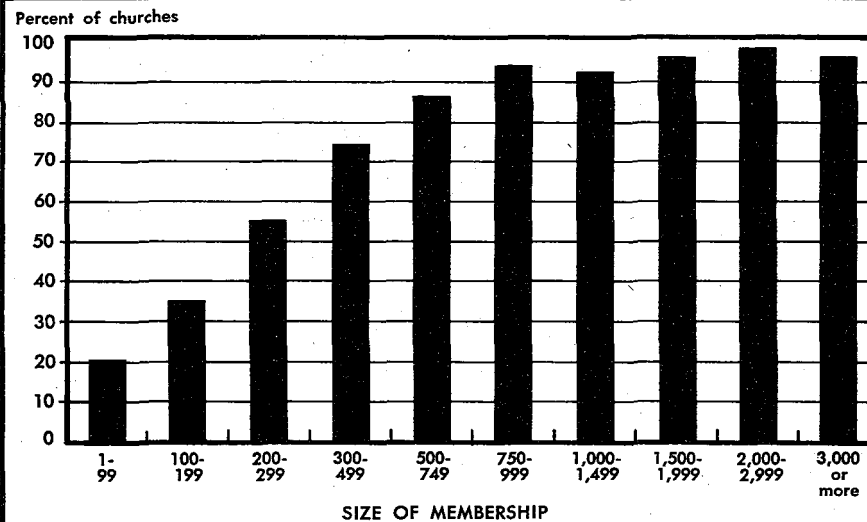

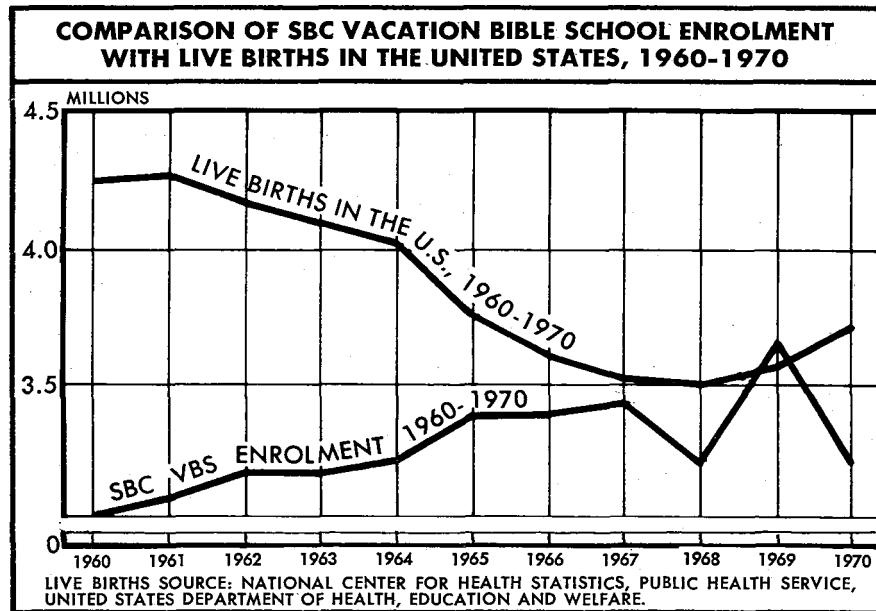

CAUTION

Because of changes for 1971, several factors should be taken into consideration in interpreting the 1971 data:

1. Due to changes for 1971 in what comprises some totals, the data is not comparable to previous years. However, certain 1970 totals were adjusted to obtain figures comparable in make-up with 1971 totals (e.g., the 1970 ongoing Sunday School enrolment included Fellowship Bible Classes but the 1971 total did not). The three adjustments to the 1970 totals were: (1) for Sunday School, fellowship Bible classes enrolment was subtracted; (2) for Church Music, vocal ensembles, band or orchestra, instrument ensembles, and handbell ringers enrolments were subtracted; and (3) local mission expenditures were added to mission expenditures. Percent and numerical changes for the three items are computed on the basis of adjusted totals.

2. Contributing to the decrease in WMU enrolment and increase in Brotherhood enrolment was a shift of

6-8 year boys from the WMU Sunbeam organization to the Brotherhood Crusaders.

3. Two new state conventions are listed this year—Pennsylvania-South Jersey, and West Virginia. The 1971 data for these new conventions are compared with figures for 1970. Accordingly, adjustments were made in the 1970 totals for certain state conventions with which the churches in the two new state conventions were affiliated in 1970: Maryland, Ohio, Kentucky, and Virginia. That is, the 1970 totals shown in this Handbook for these four older state conventions have been reduced by the amounts relating to the churches now included in the two new conventions. Thus, 1970 totals for the four state conventions as carried in last year's Handbook will differ from the adjusted ones shown this year. Percent changes shown for these four state conventions will also reflect removal of the new convention churches from 1970 totals.

TYPE OF CHURCH TRAINING ENROLMENT — 1971

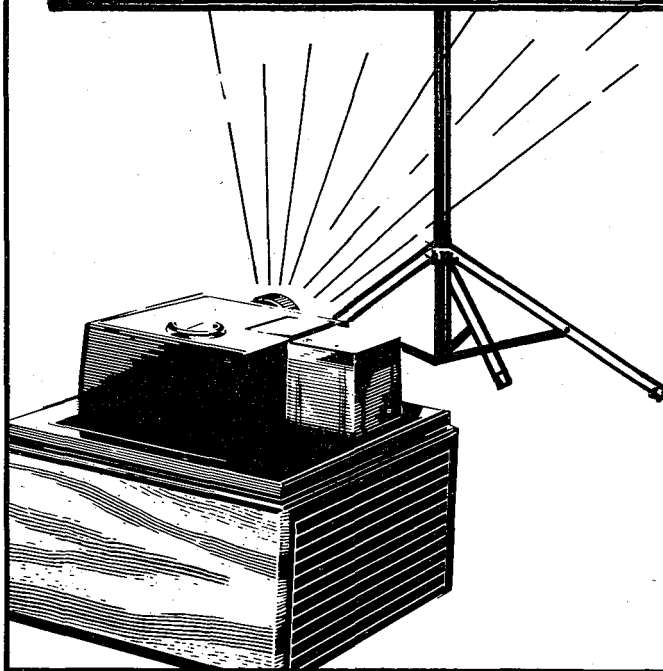

CHURCH MUSIC ONGOING ENROLMENT BY LOCATION—1971

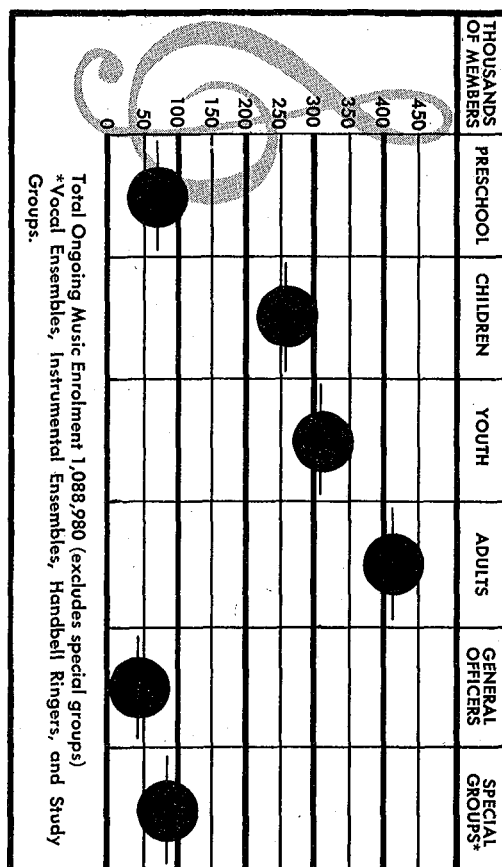

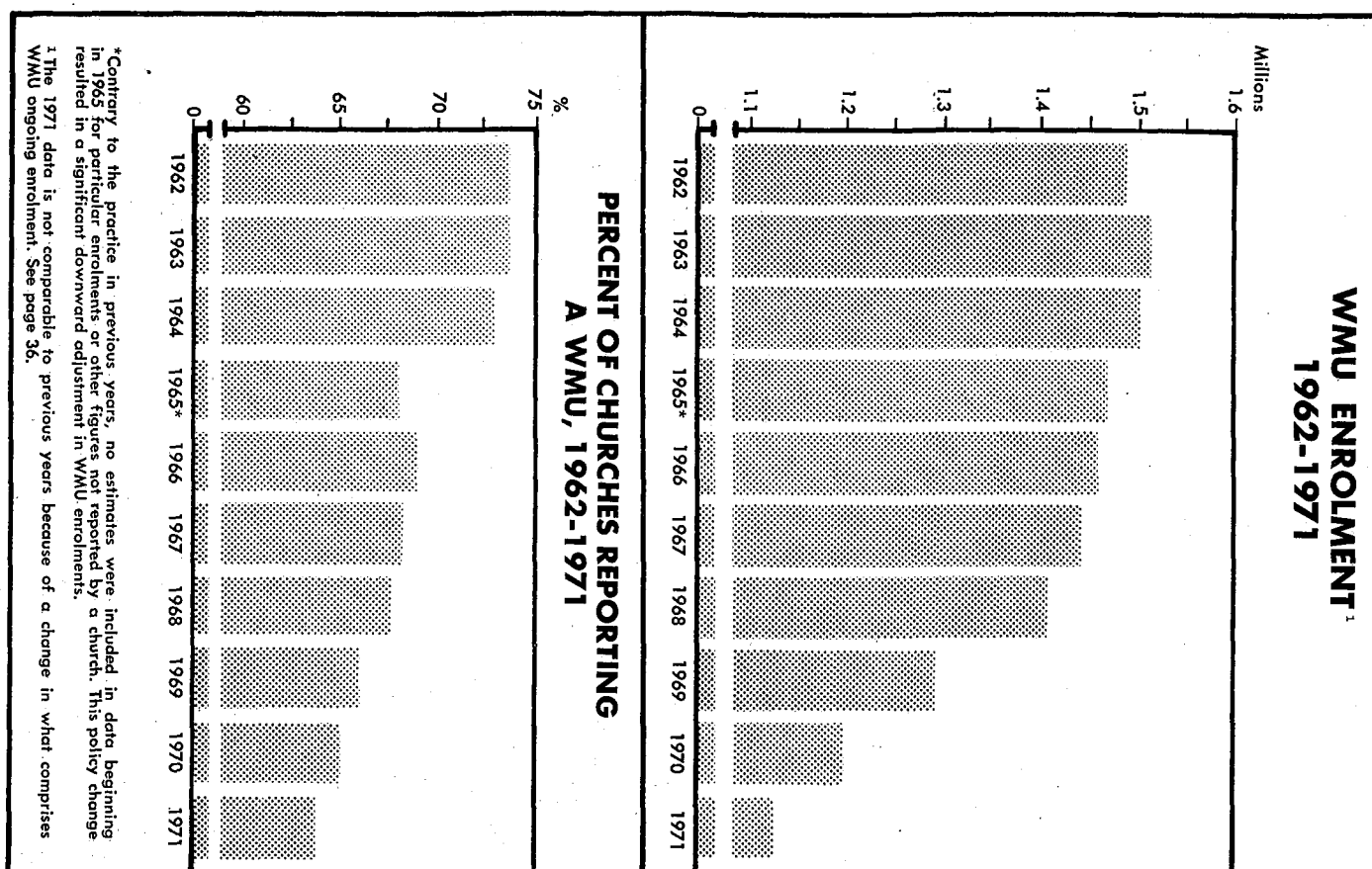

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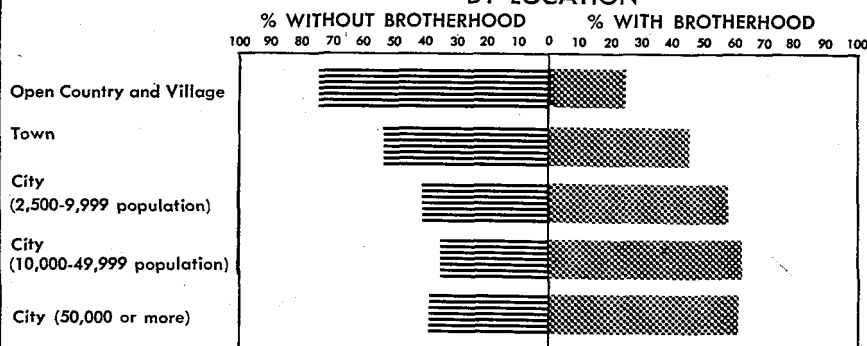
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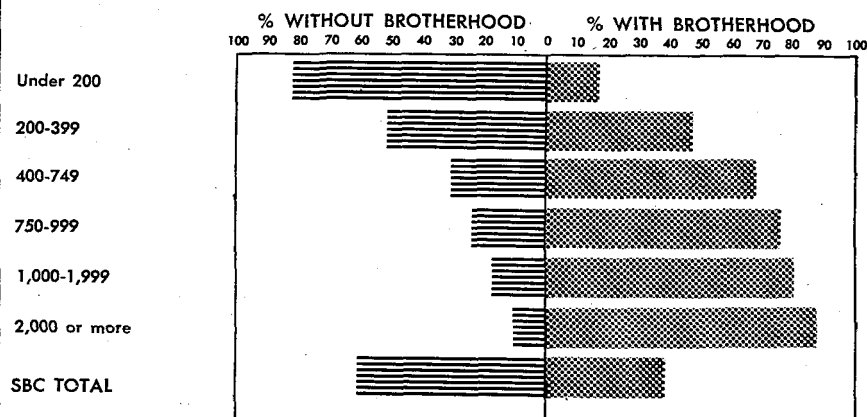

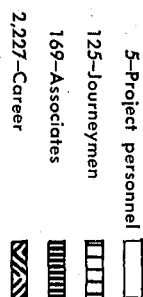

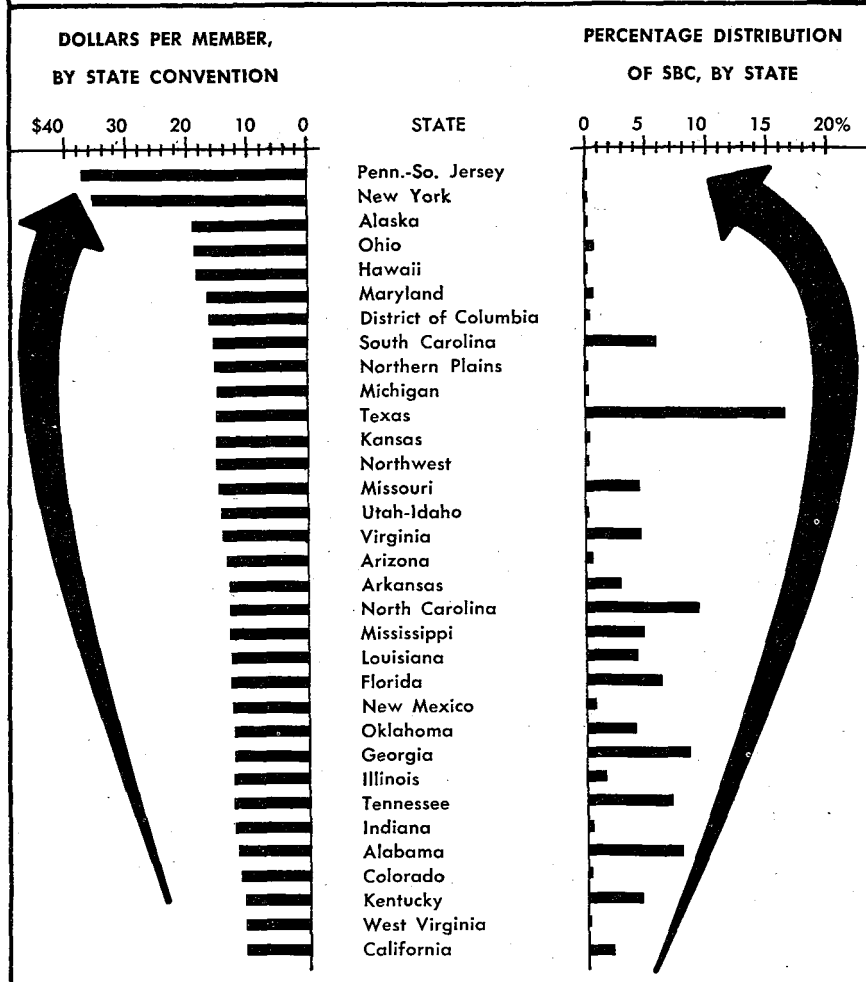

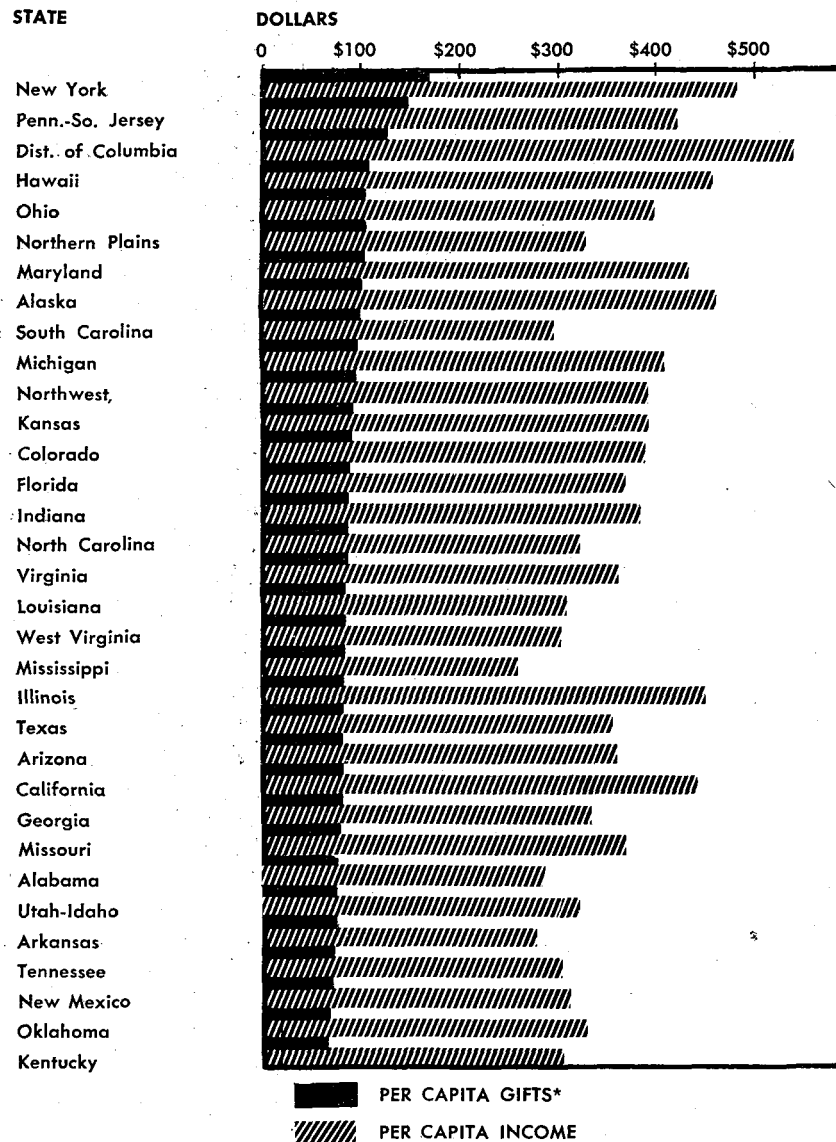

1971 PER CAPITA SBC GIFTS* AND 1970 PER CAPITA INCOME BY STATE CONVENTION



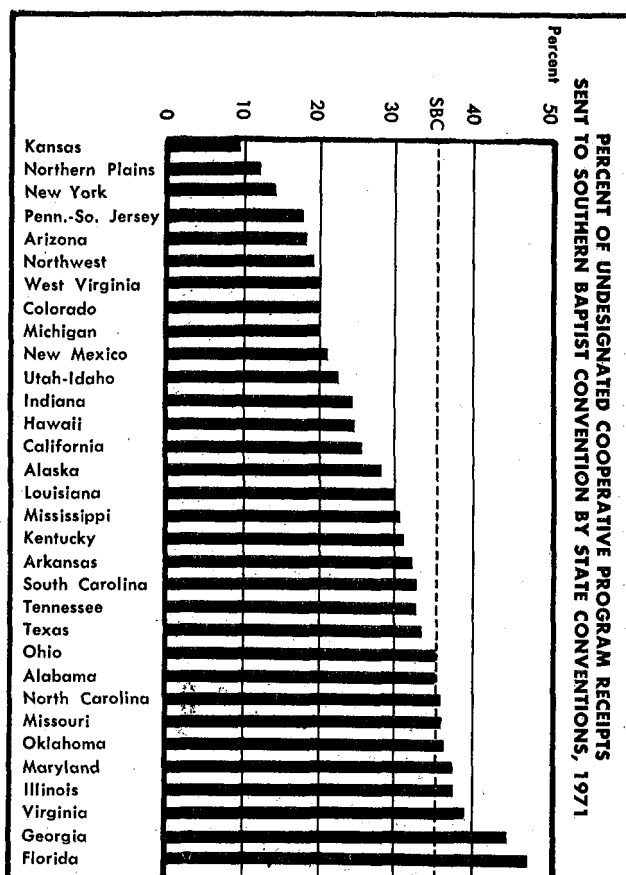

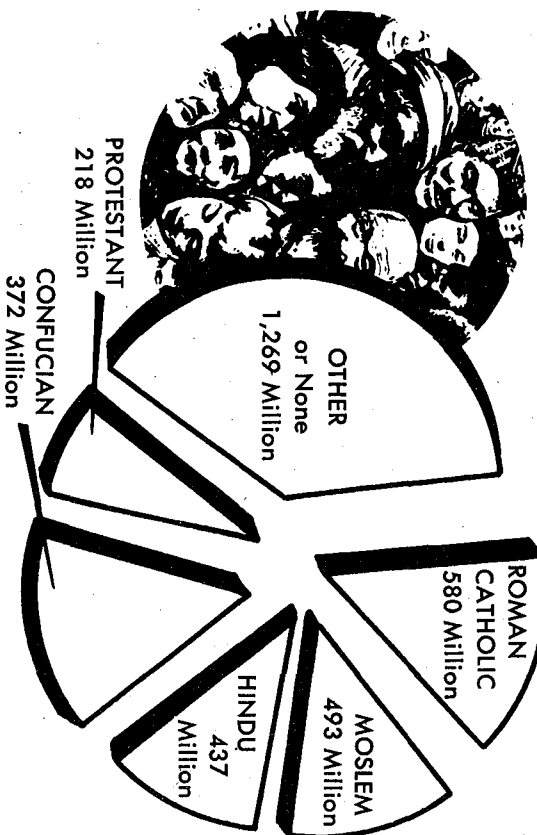

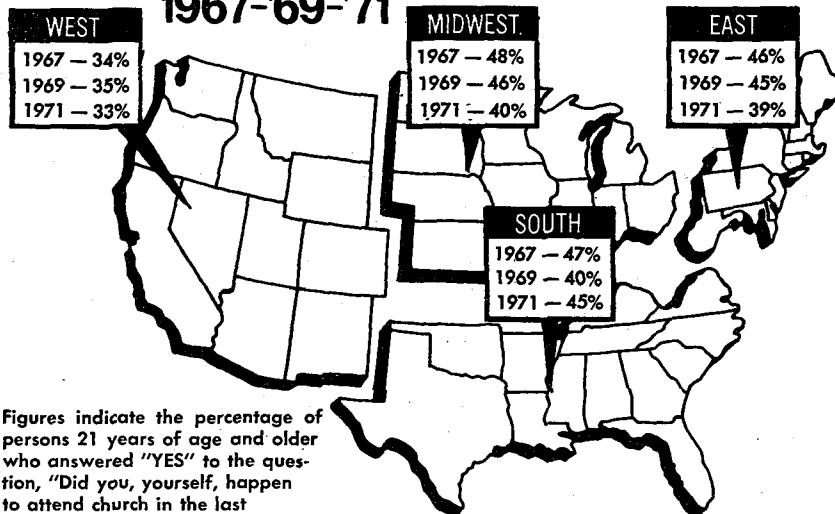

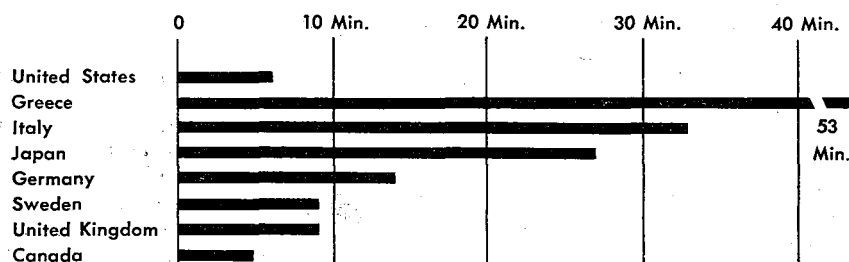

LIVING COSTS ON AN INTERNATIONAL BASIS

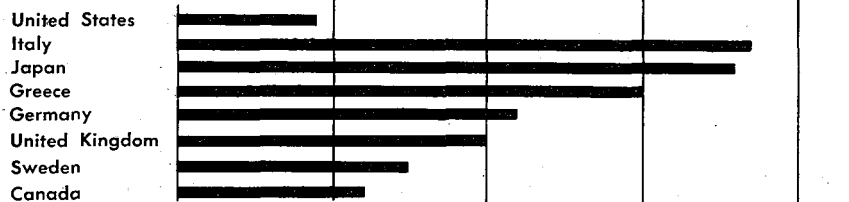

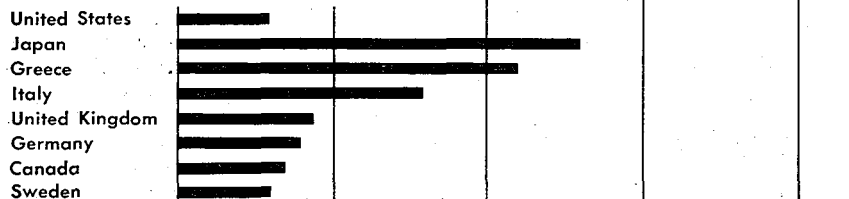

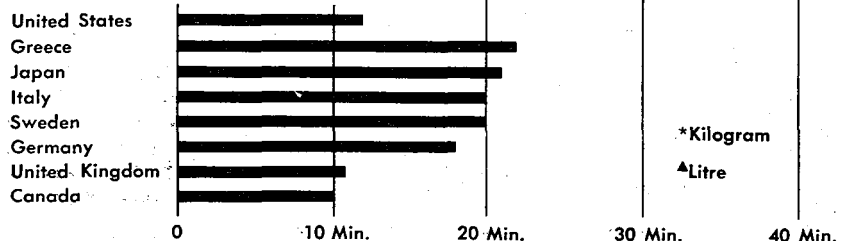

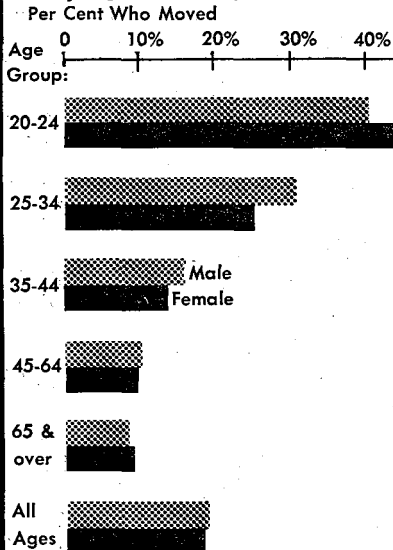

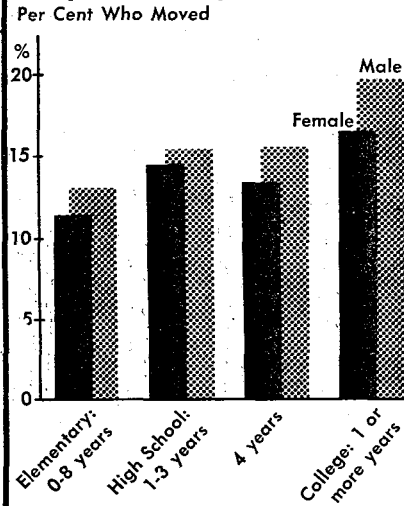

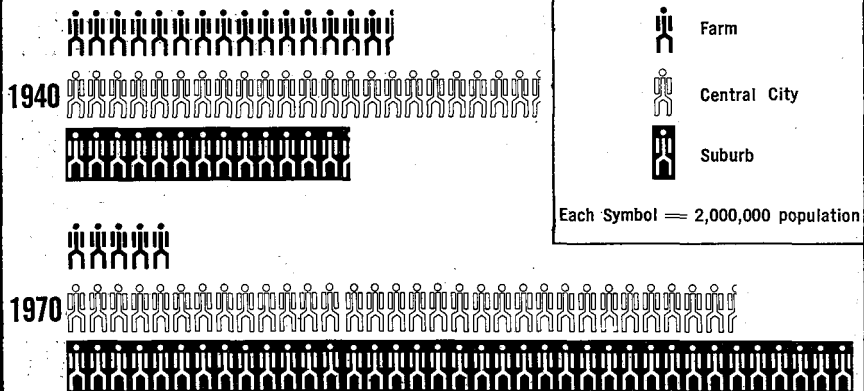

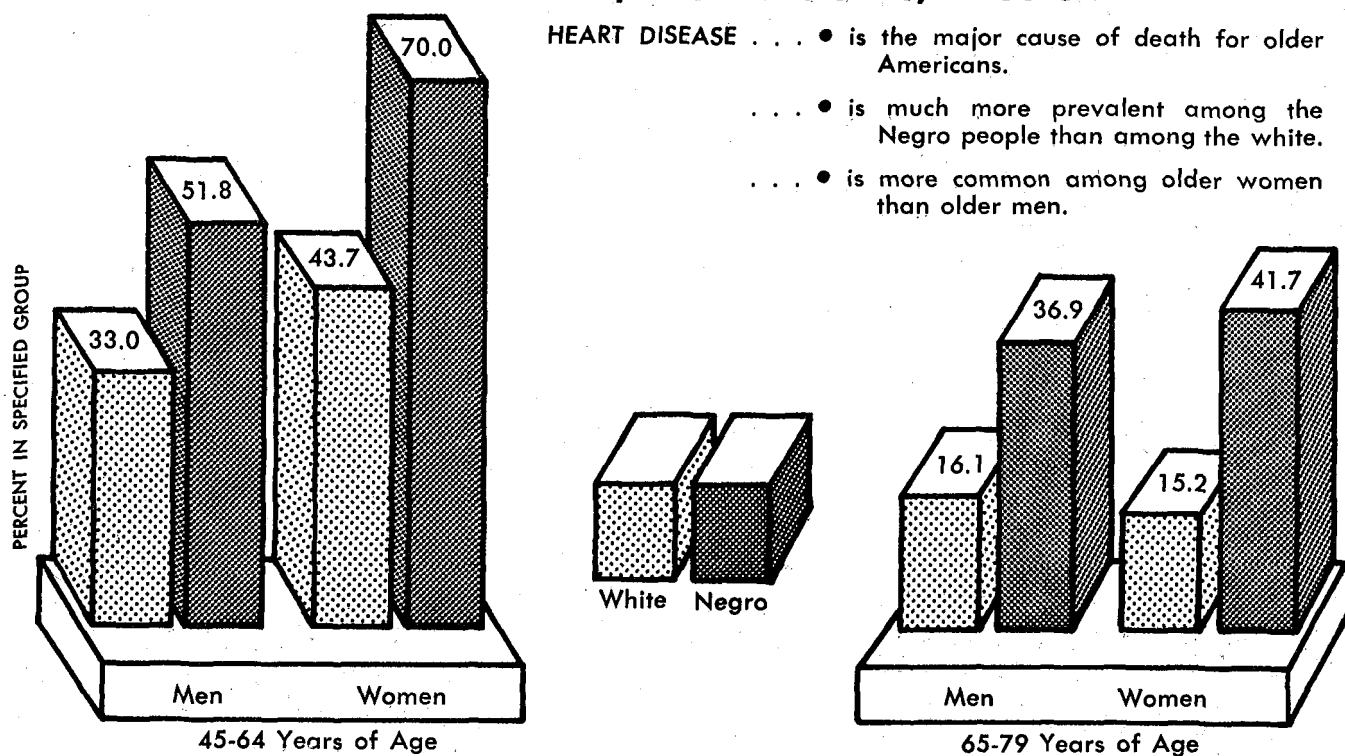

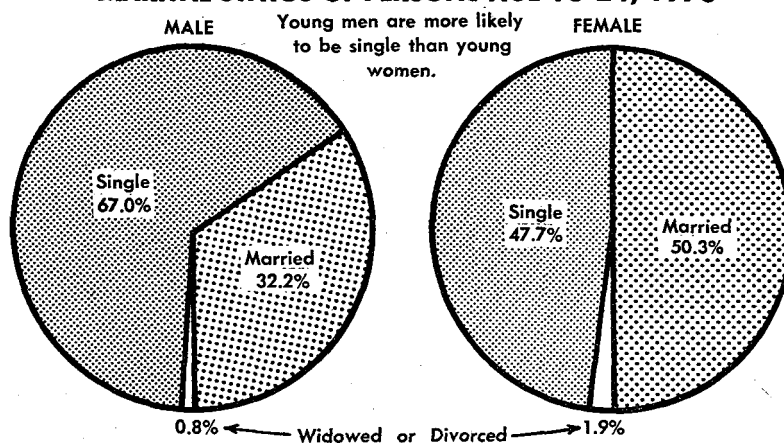
PREVALENCE OF HEART DISEASE AT AGES 45-64 AND 65-79, BY SEX AND RACE, UNITED STATES, 1960-62

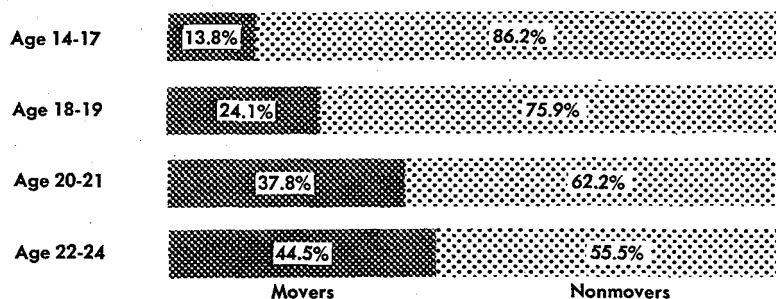
CHARACTERISTICS OF YOUNG ADULTS

Compared to the average for all age groups of 18.4%, young adults are quite mobile, particularly those 22-24 years of age.

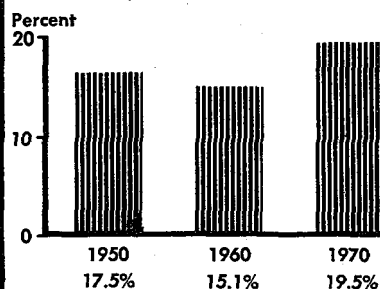

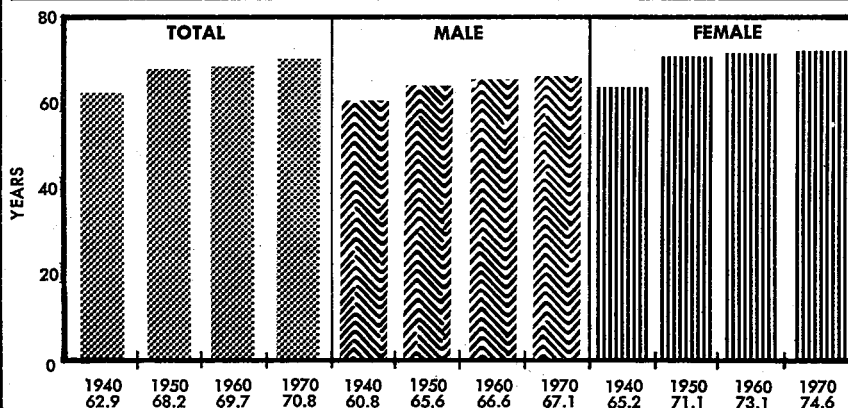

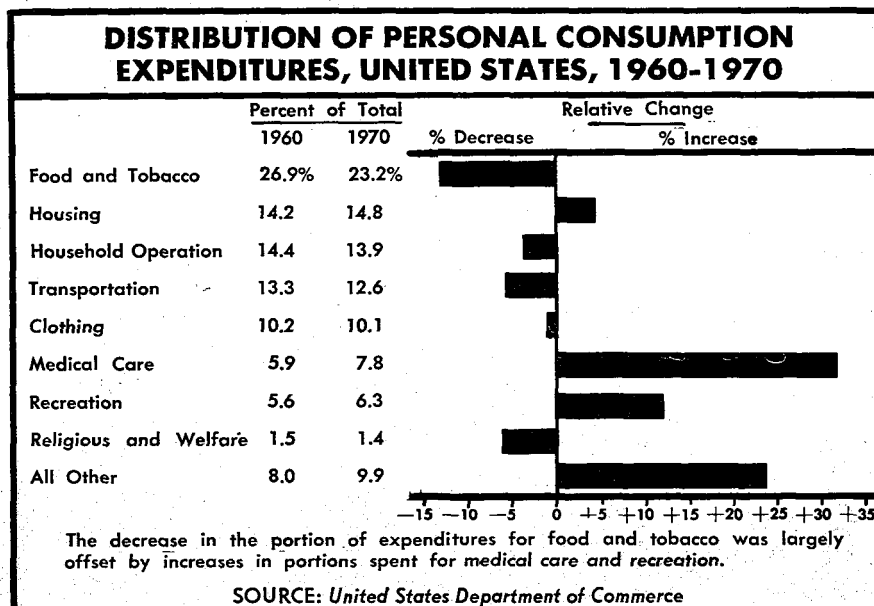
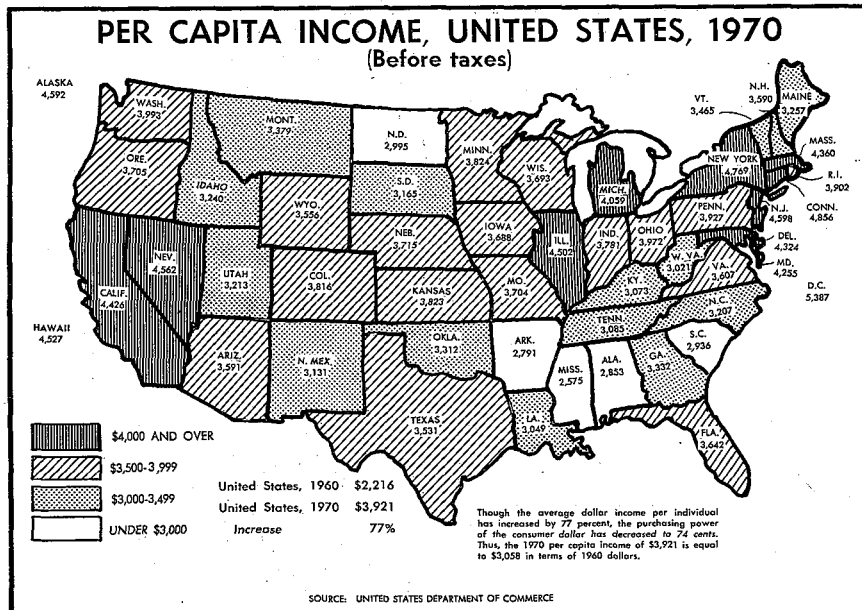
LIFE EXPECTANCY

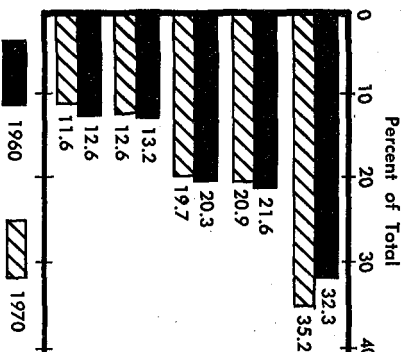

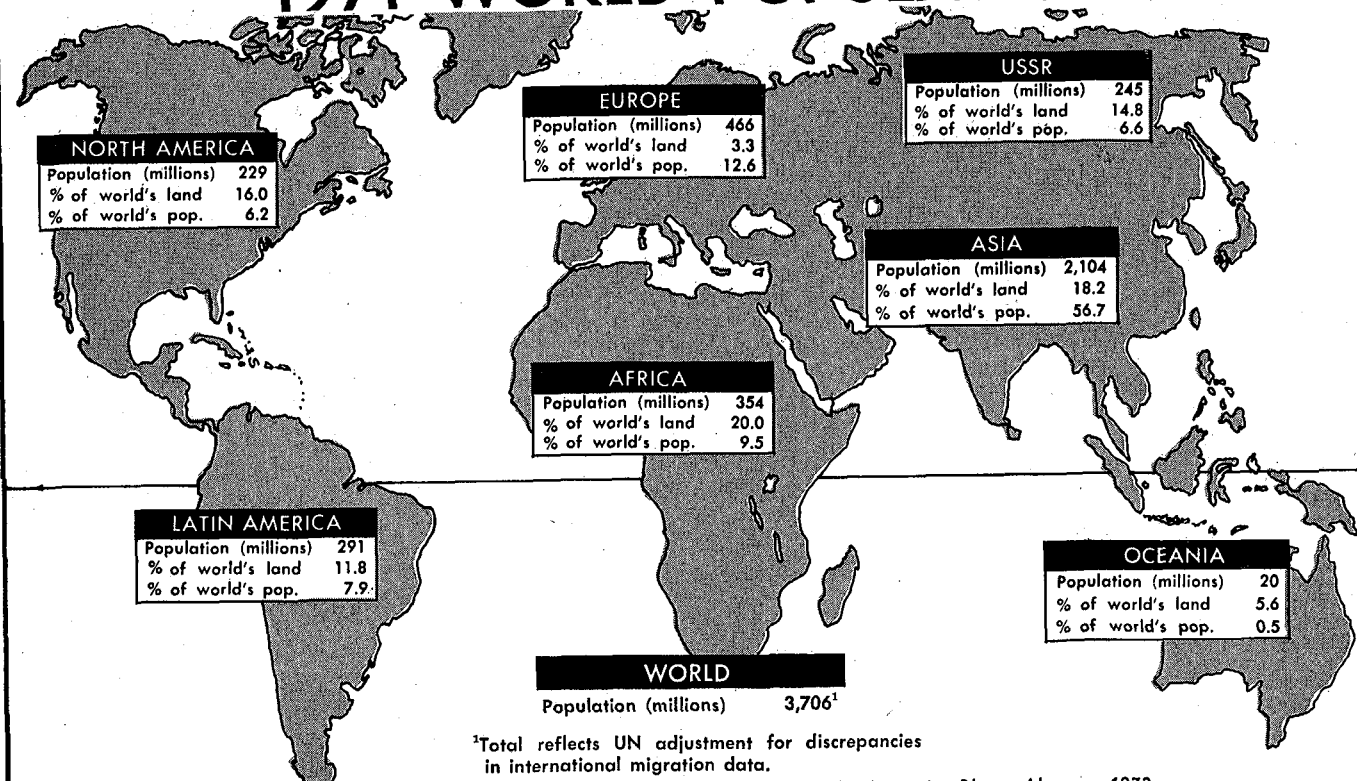

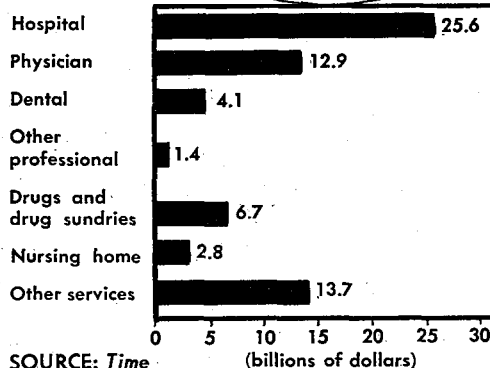

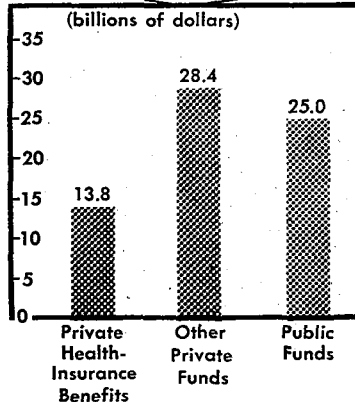
COST OF MEDICAL CARE

HOW MEDICAL CARE WAS PAID FOR

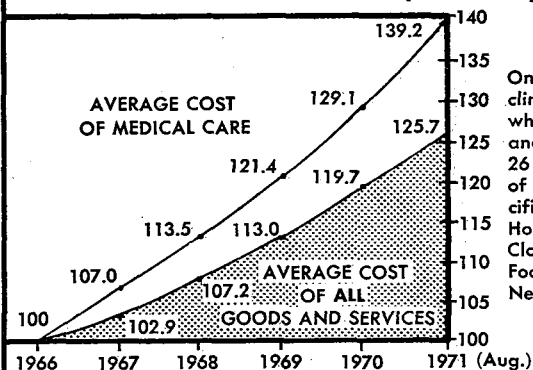

The per capita expenditure for medical care in 1970 was \$324. This amounted to a national expenditure of \$67.2 billions or 6.9 percent of the Gross National Product. Of this \$67.2 billions 38 percent went to hospitals and 19 percent went to physicians. Twenty-one percent of the \$67.2 billions bill was paid for by private health-insurance benefits, 37 percent by public funds (including Medicare and Medicaid), and 42 percent by other private funds.

On the average medical costs have climbed nearly 40 percent since 1966, while the average cost of all goods and services have increased nearly 26 percent. During the same period of time, cost increases in some specific areas were:

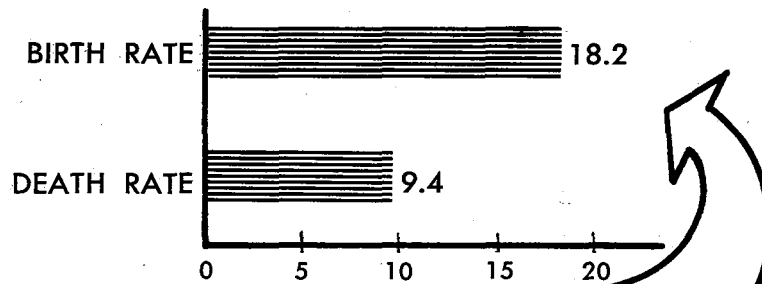

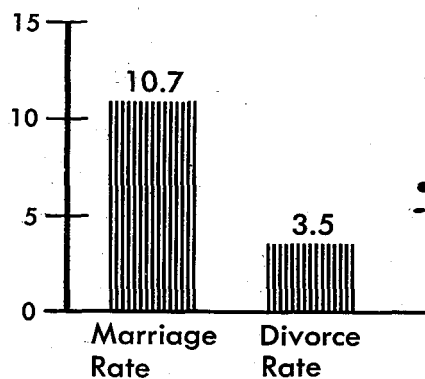
**A COMPARISON OF

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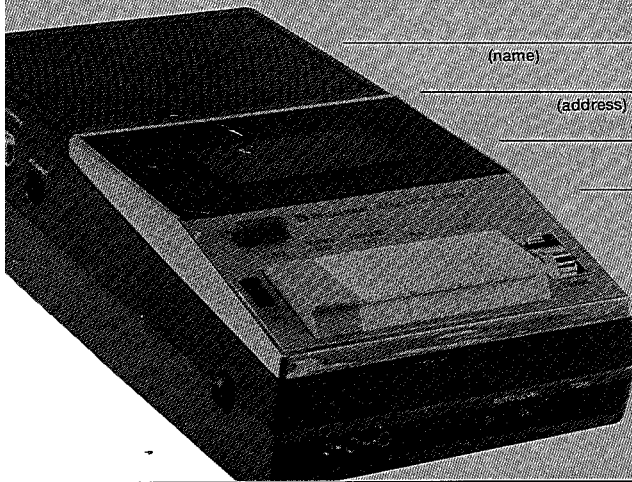
