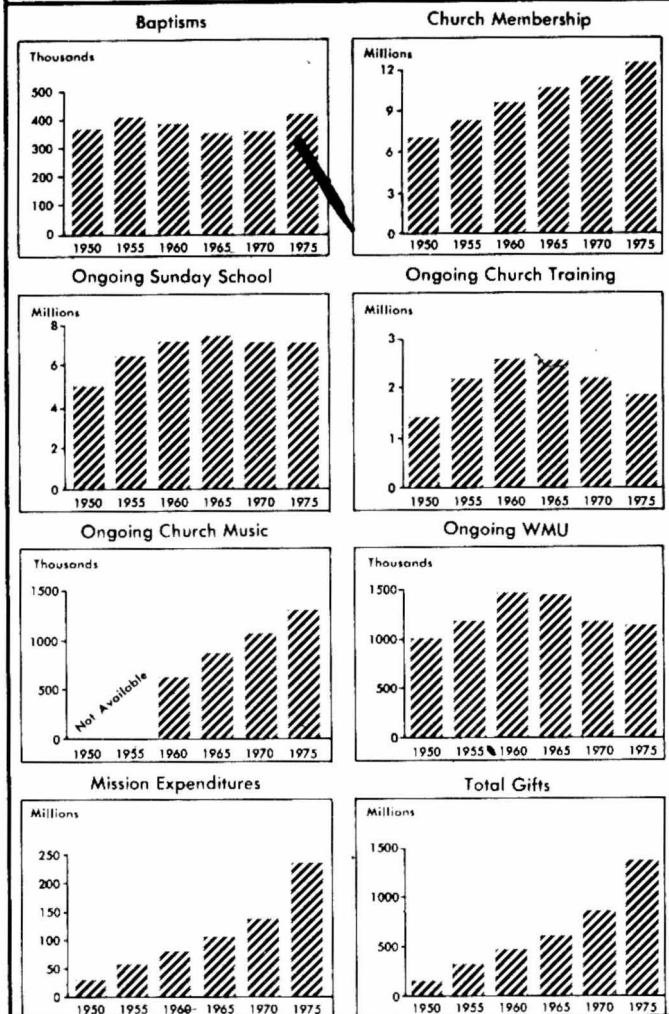

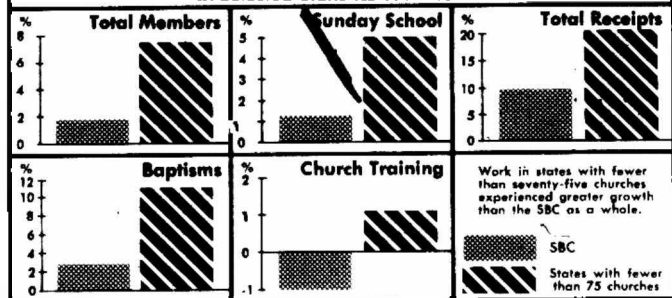

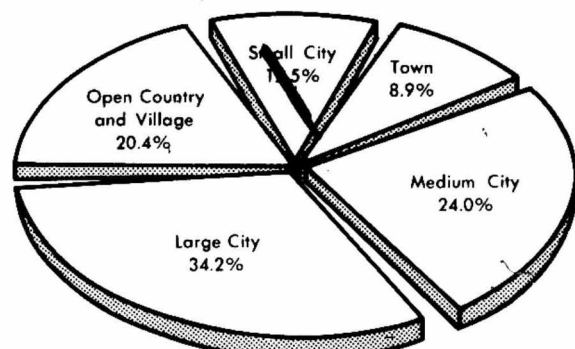

by Church Location

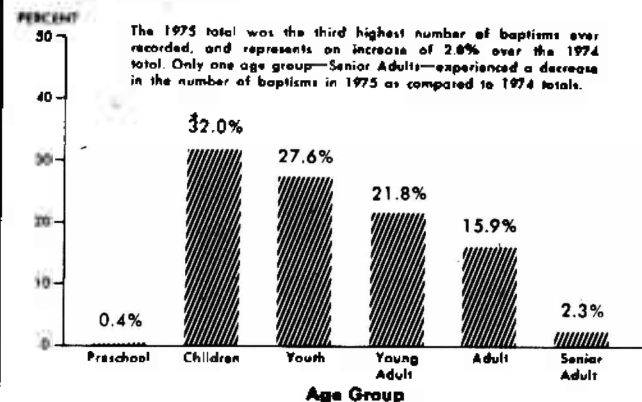

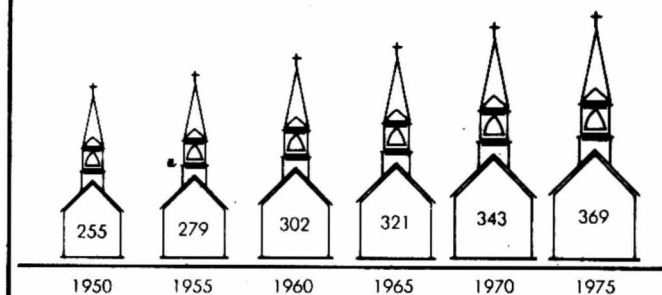

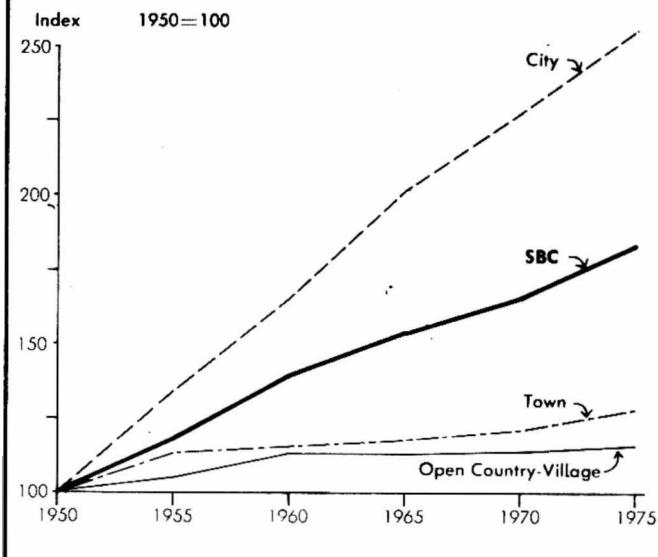

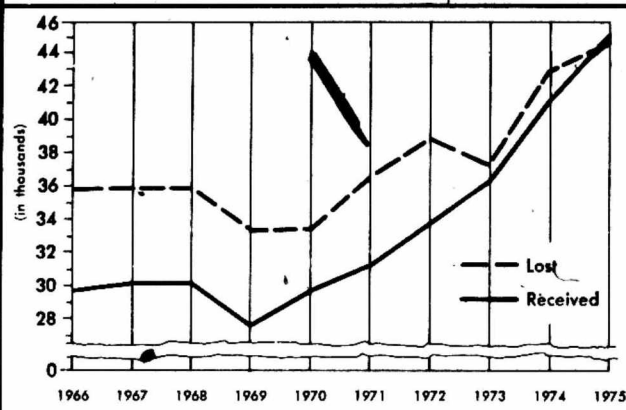

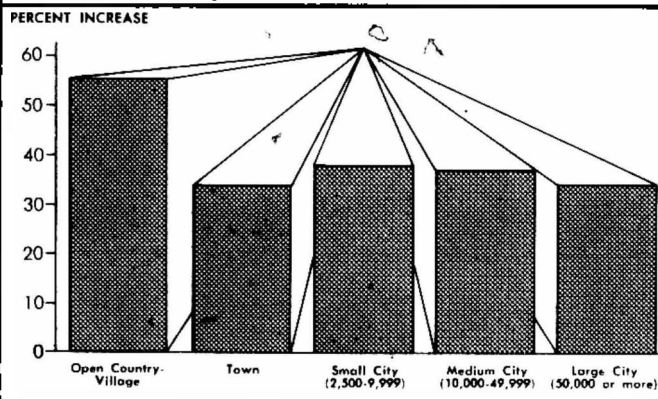

PERCENT CHANGE IN AVERAGE PROPERTY VALUE by location 1970-1975

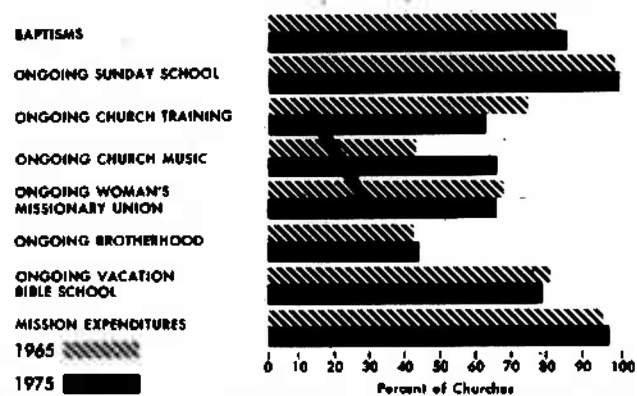

PERCENT OF CHURCHES REPORTING SELECTED ITEMS, 1965-1975

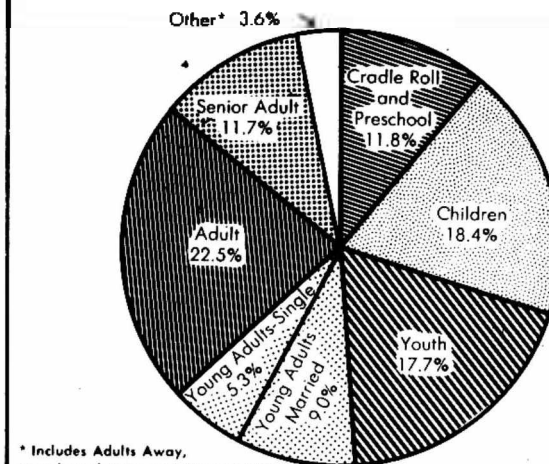

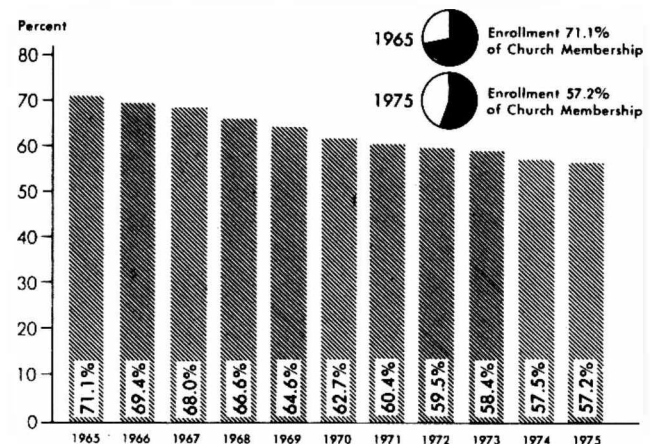

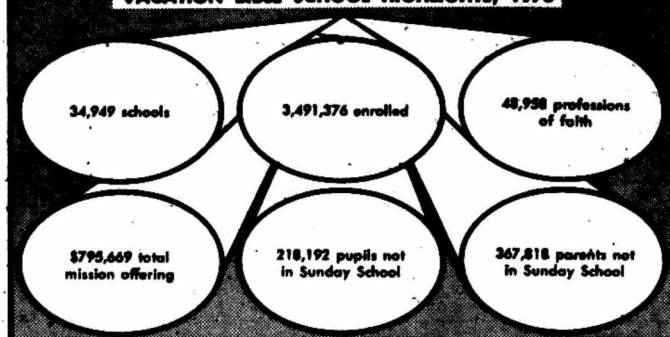

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS, 1975



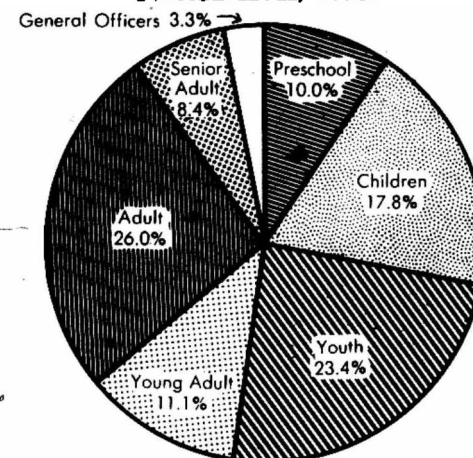

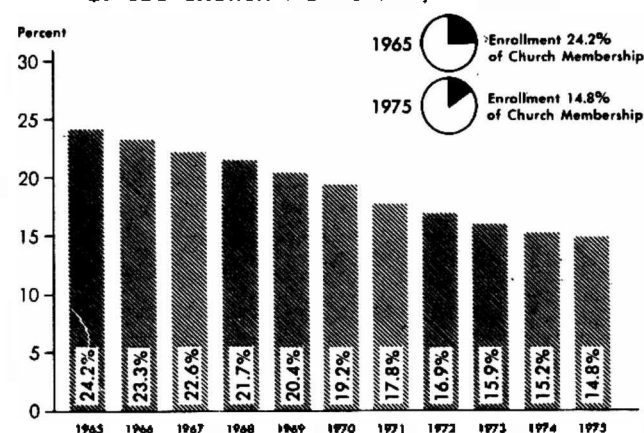

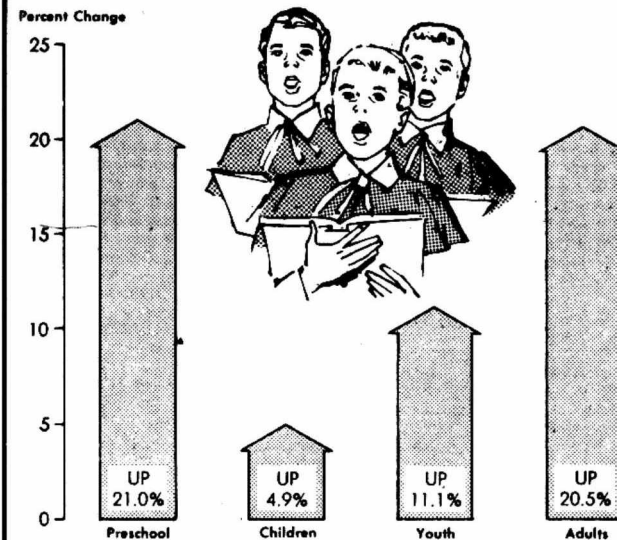

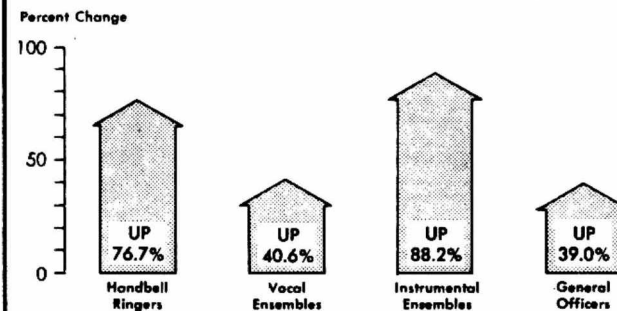

PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN AGE-LEVEL CHOIR ENROLLMENTS 1971-1975

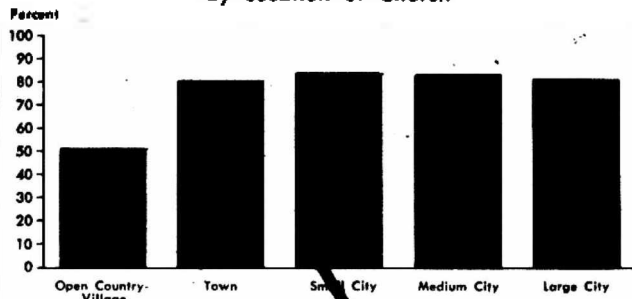


PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN SPECIAL GROUPS ENROLLMENTS 1971-1975

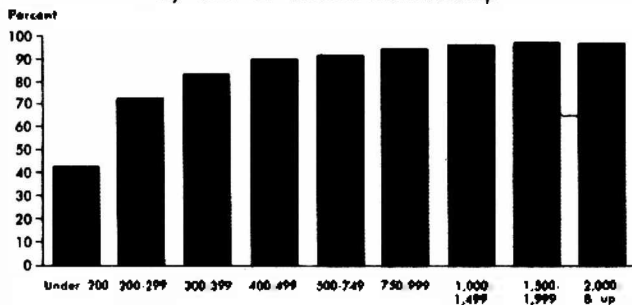


WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION, 1975

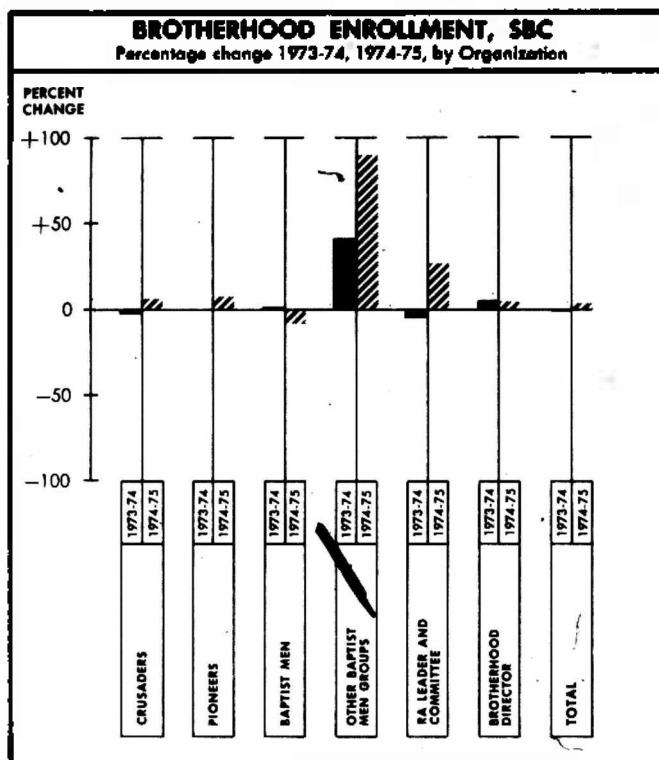

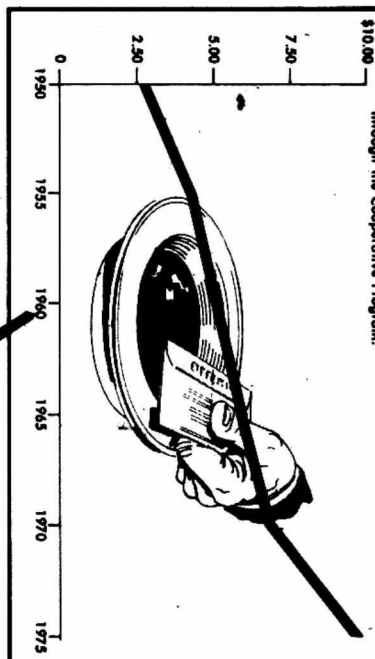

Religious statistics are directly affected by war and persecution. For example, recent events in Uganda, Bangladesh, and Cyprus. There are about 18 million refugees throughout the world who are not yet integrated into the population statistics and religious estimates of their land of temporary (?) residence. No general census has been taken in some, such as Saudi Arabia.

Protestant statistics outside Europe usually include "full members" only, rather than all baptized persons, and are not comparable to religious or churches that count all adherents.

The chief base of Islam is still ethnic, although missionary work has lately been undertaken in Europe and America. In countries where Islam is still the official state religion, minority religions are frequently persecuted and reliable statistics are scarce.

Zoroastrians (Parsees) are found chiefly in Iran and India.

A Japanese ethnic religion, Shinto has declined markedly since the Japanese emperor gave up the claim to divinity in 1945. It neither does it transplant readily with Japanese moving out from the homeland, nor contribute to Buddhism. Japanese religious statistics are problematic because adherents are frequently related to several religions simultaneously.

Figures for China are highly speculative although minimal population growth has apparently been achieved. Religious statistics are problematical with the effect of the Maoist-Maoist revolution not yet measured definitely.

Buddhism has produced several modern renewal movements with energetic missions outside traditional ethnic-Buddhist areas.

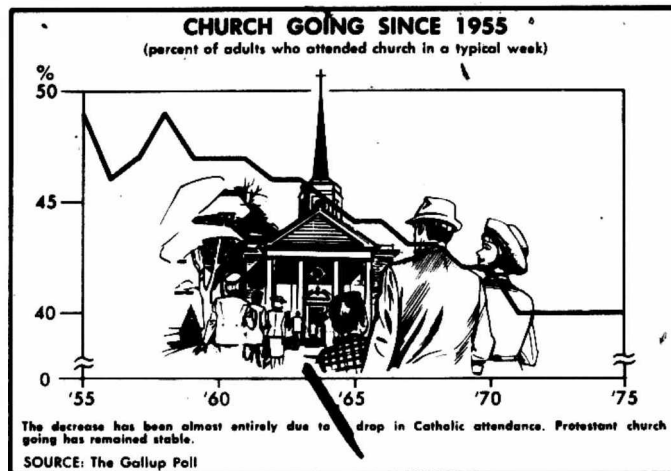
Hinduism's strength in India has been enhanced by nationalism but diminished by industrialization and contemporary secular ideologies. Modern Hinduism has also developed several renewal movements with vigorous missions in Europe and America.

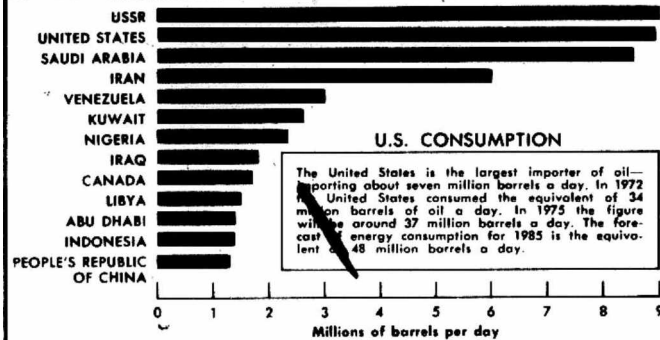

LEADING PRODUCERS OF OIL



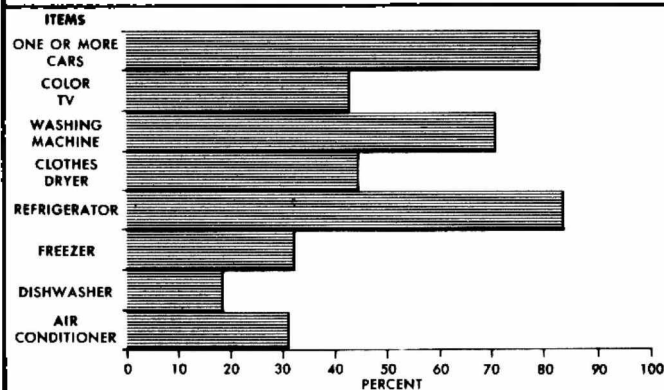
U.S. CONSUMPTION

The United States is the largest importer of oil—importing about seven million barrels a day. In 1972 the United States consumed the equivalent of 34 million barrels of oil a day. In 1975 the figure was around 37 million barrels a day. The forecast for energy consumption for 1985 is the equivalent of 48 million barrels a day.

Two thirds of the world's proven oil reserves are in the Persian Gulf/North Africa area. About 70 percent of the world's known reserves are concentrated within the thirteen-nation organization of Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC).

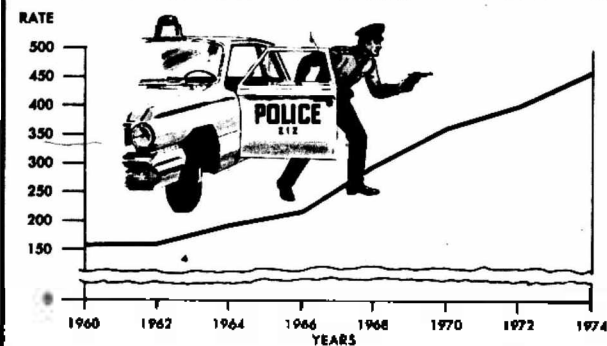

PERCENT OF HOUSEHOLDS OWNING CARS AND APPLIANCES, USA, 1971



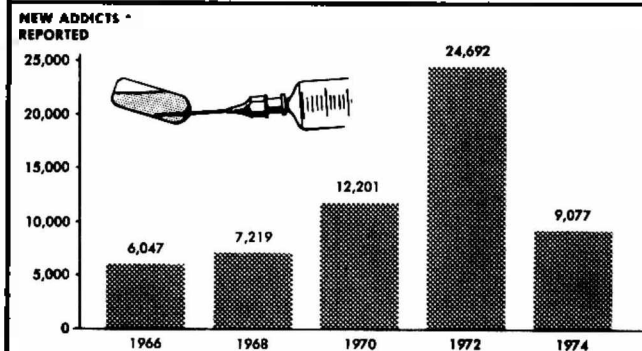

CHANGE IN VIOLENT¹ CRIME, USA, 1960-1974 (RATE PER 100,000 POPULATION)

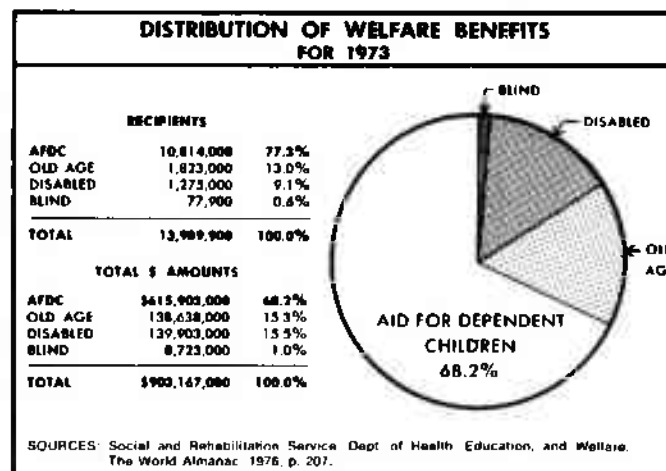
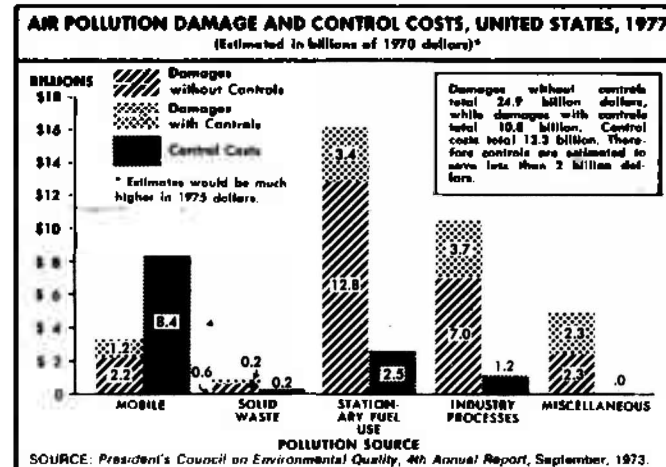
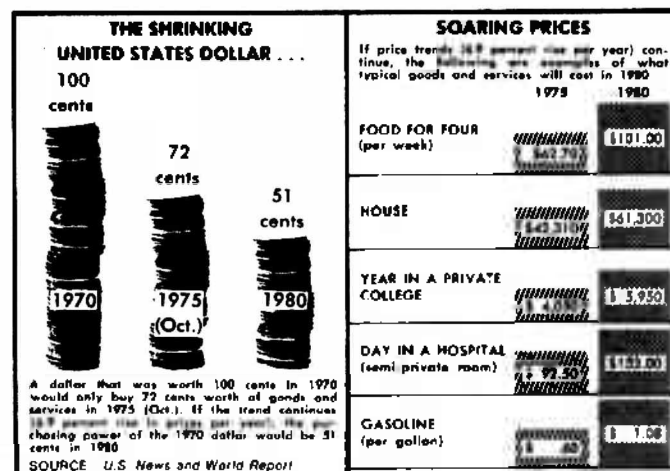
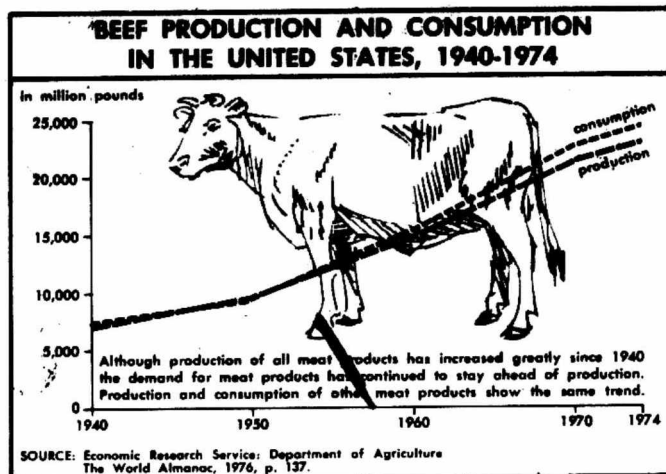

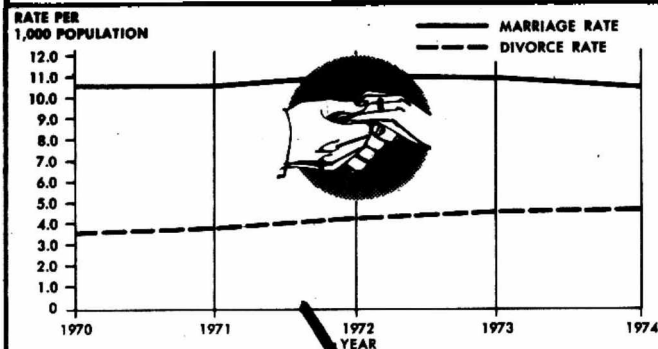
NARCOTIC ADDICTION IN THE UNITED STATES, 1966-1974

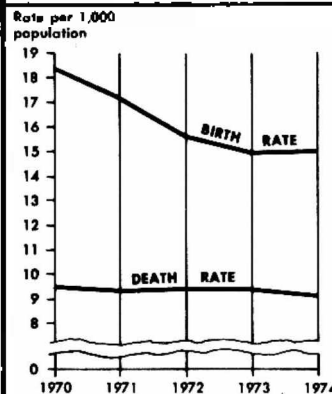


A COMPARISON OF UNITED STATES MARRIAGE AND DIVORCE RATES, 1970-1974 (PER 1,000 POPULATION)

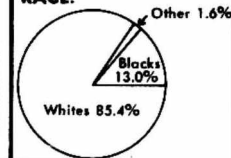

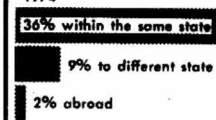

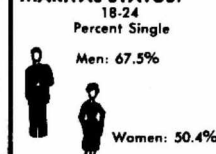

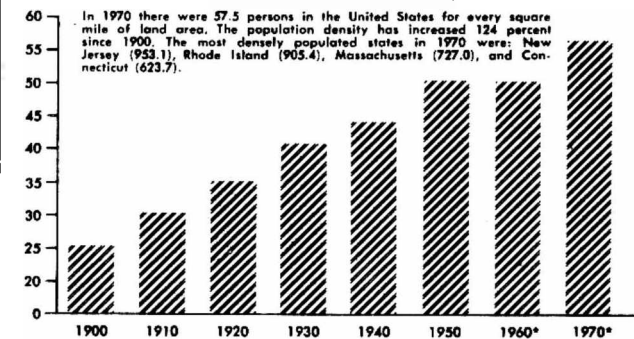

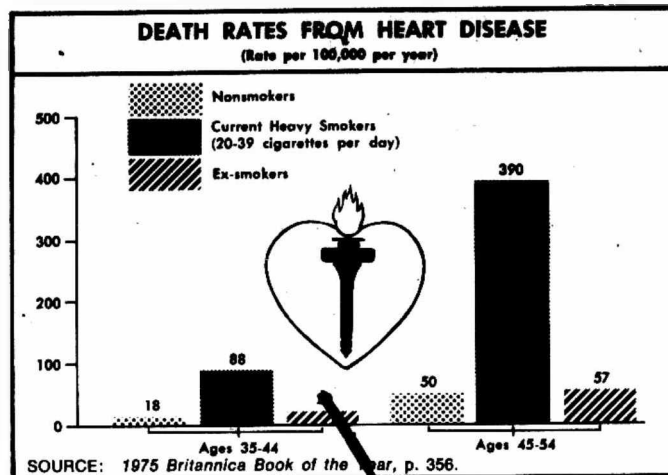
UNITED STATES POPULATION DENSITY, 1900-1970

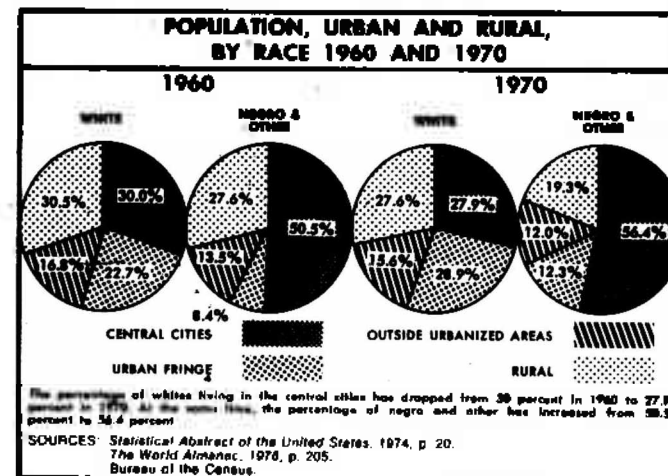

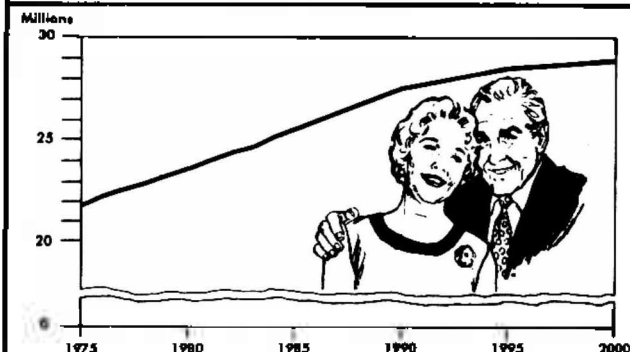

POPULATION PROJECTIONS OF THE UNITED STATES FOR PERSONS 65 AND OVER 1975 to 2000

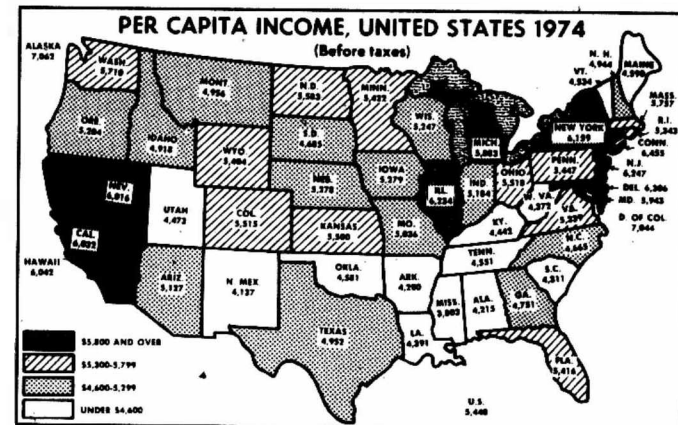

Continued world population growth and increases in income levels will undoubtedly place further strain on food supplies in years to come. While food production rose rapidly during the last quarter of a century, it was offset by high birth rates in developing countries, per capita food production, therefore, improved only minimally. Recently, the rapid growth in food production has begun to level off. Population growth of nearly 3 percent per year in developing countries is expected to continue through the 1980's, but that of developed nations will grow at just under 1 percent.

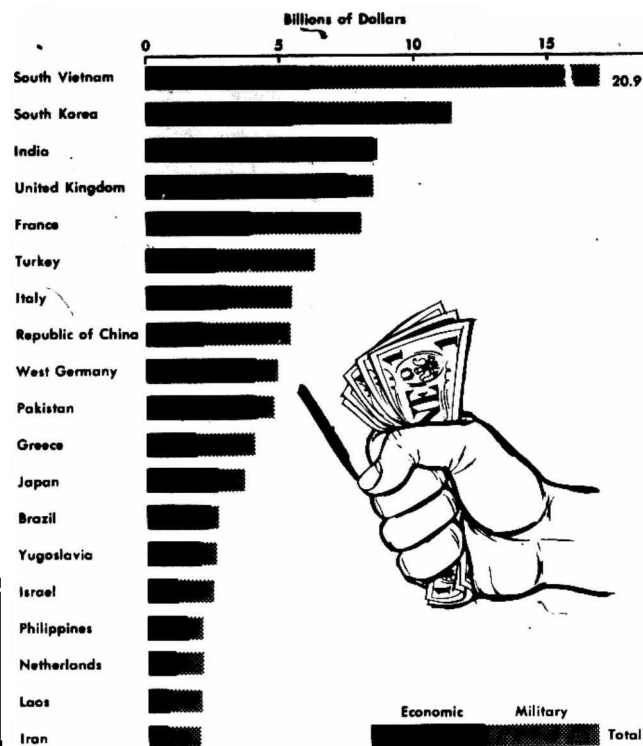

At one time or another, the various grant, loan and sales programs, which collectively make up United States military and economic assistance to foreign countries, have reached more than 100 countries. Over \$160 billion in loans and grants (obligations and loan authorizations) have been committed since the end of World War II, with about 60 percent in military aid and 40 percent in economic assistance. Approximately three quarters of all assistance has been channeled to the less developed countries—70 percent of this in grants; of the loans extended, about one-quarter have been repaid. The developed countries, on the other hand, have repaid (with interest) roughly 80 percent of the loans.
