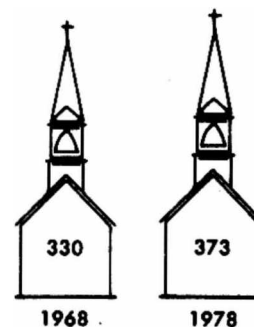

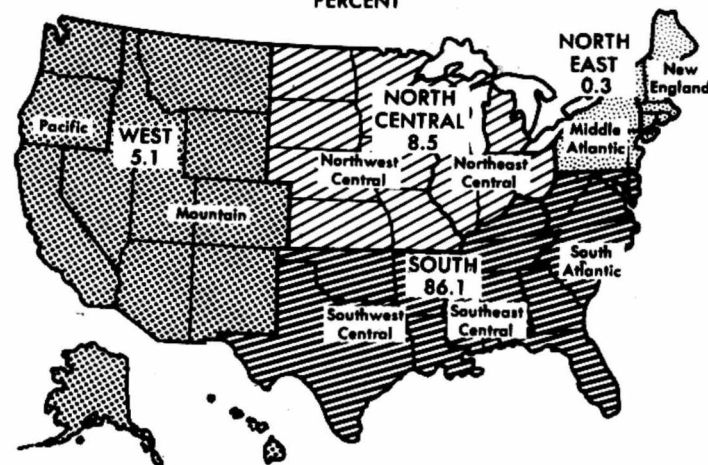

AVERAGE SIZE OF CHURCH MEMBERSHIP, SBC, 1968-1978

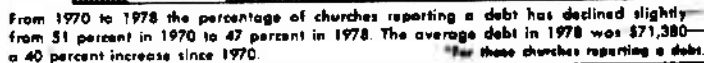

Churches with fewer than 200 members have experienced a decline in numbers while those with 200 or more members have increased in numbers. 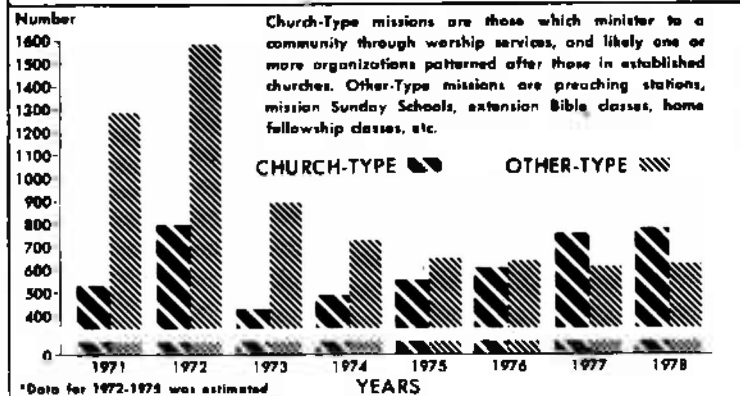

NUMBER OF CHURCH-TYPE AND OTHER-TYPE MISSIONS STARTED BY SBC CHURCHES, 1971-1978*

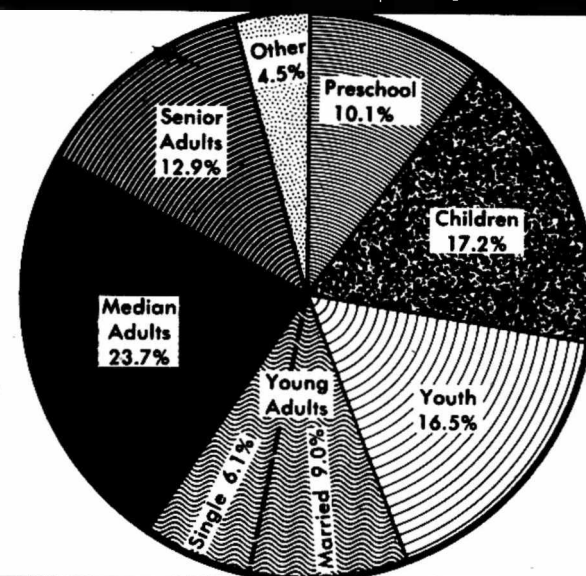

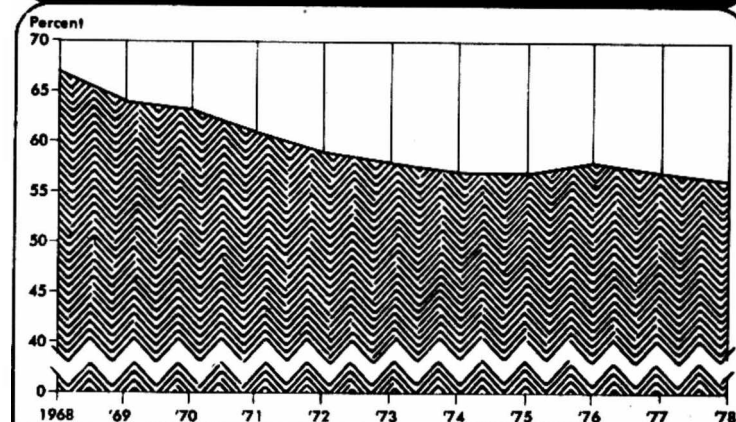

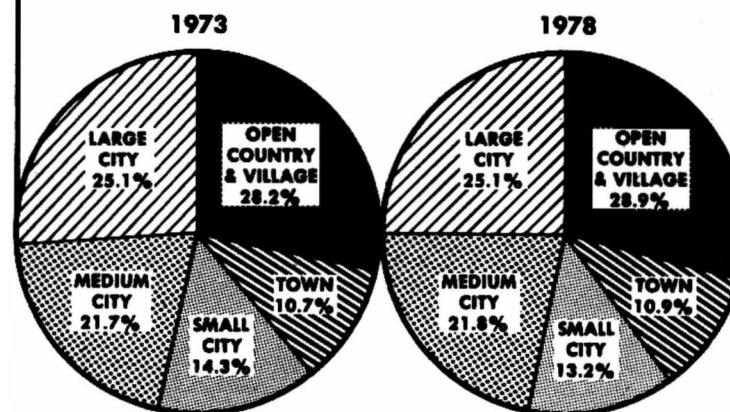

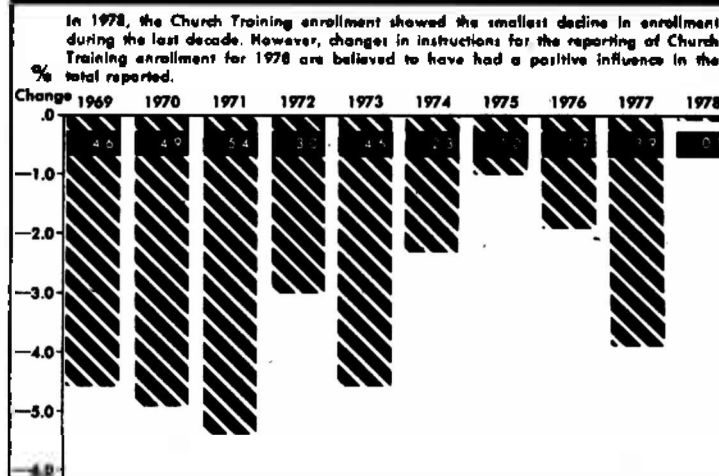

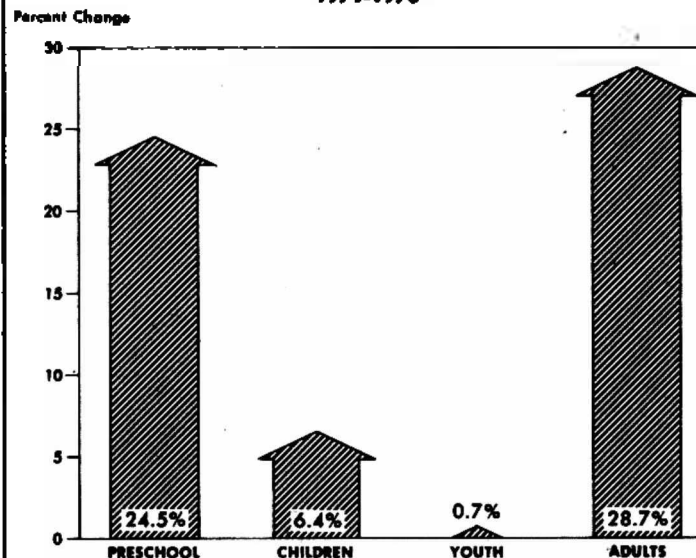

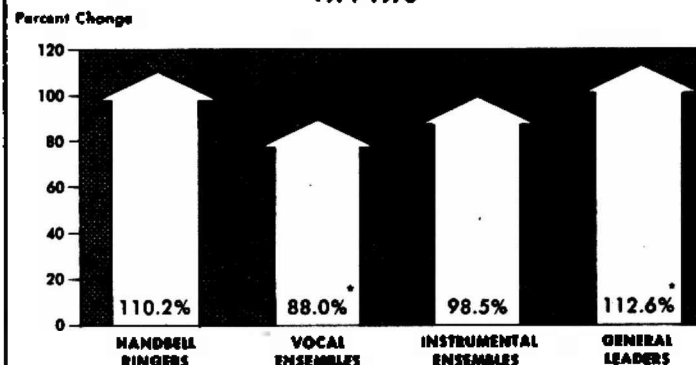

PERCENT CHANGE IN AGE-LEVEL CHOIR ENROLLMENTS 1971-1978

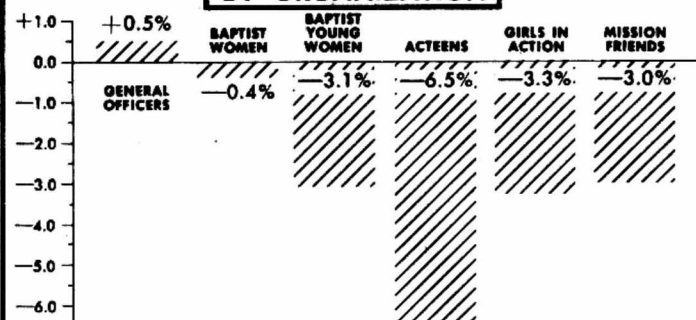


PERCENT CHANGE IN SPECIAL GROUPS ENROLLMENTS 1971-1978

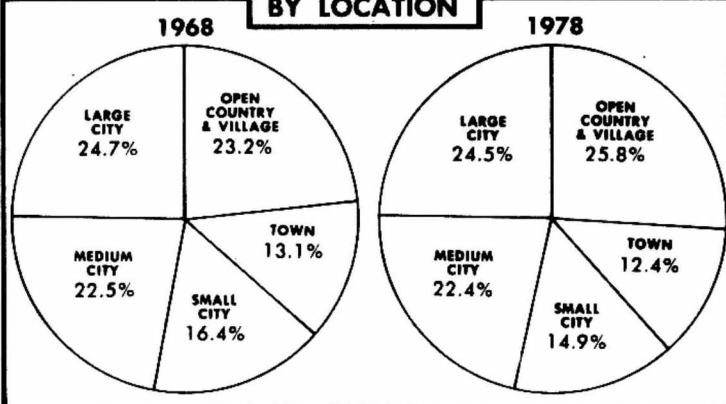

WOMAN'S MISSIONARY UNION ONGOING ENROLLMENT, BY ORGANIZATIONS—1978-1977

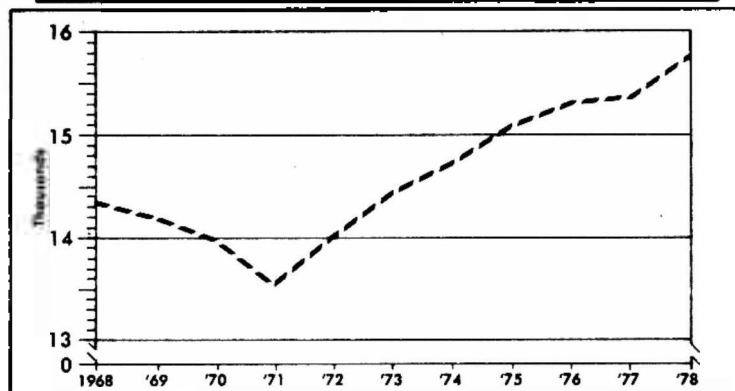

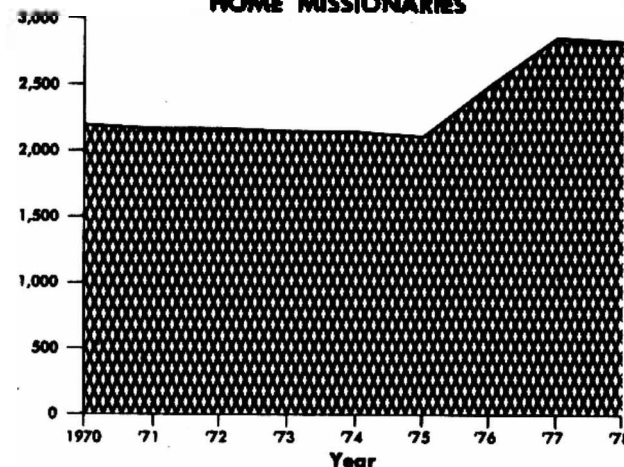
CHURCHES WITH BROTHERHOODS 1968-1978

MISSIONARY PERSONNEL—1970-1978 HOME MISSIONARIES



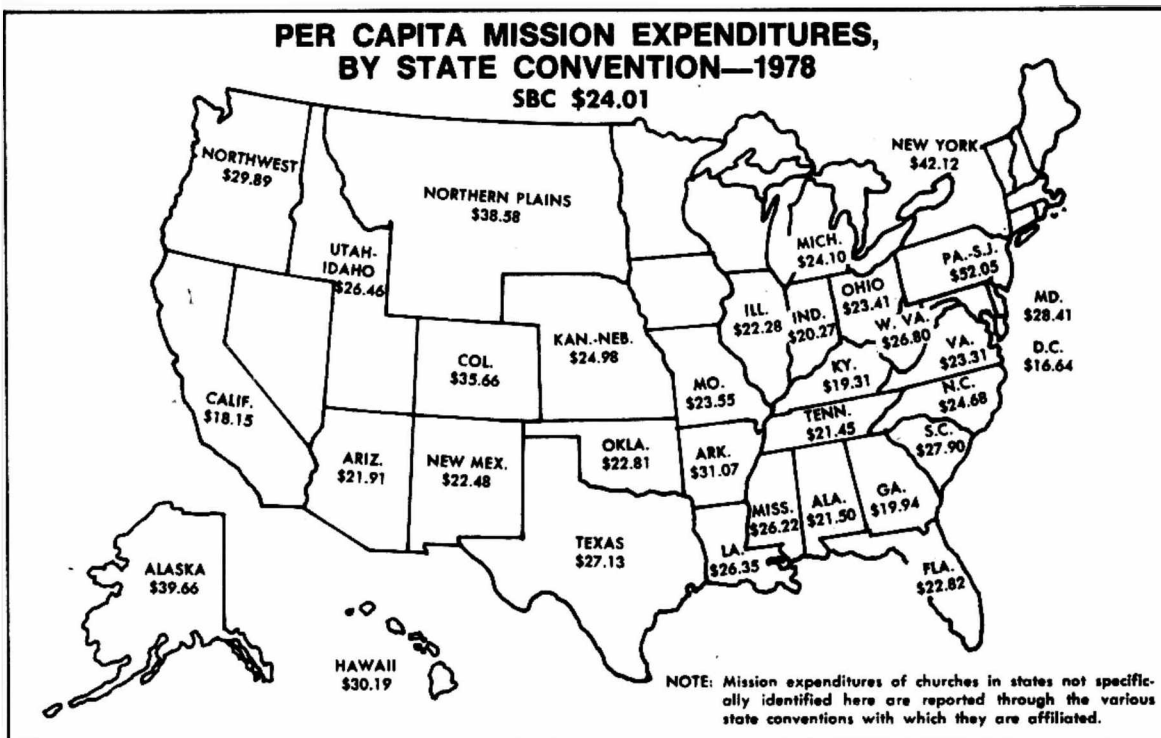
FOREIGN MISSIONARIES

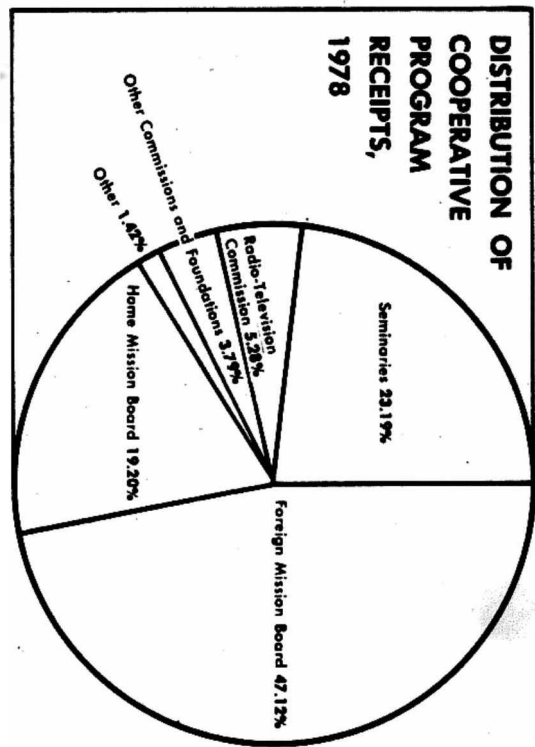

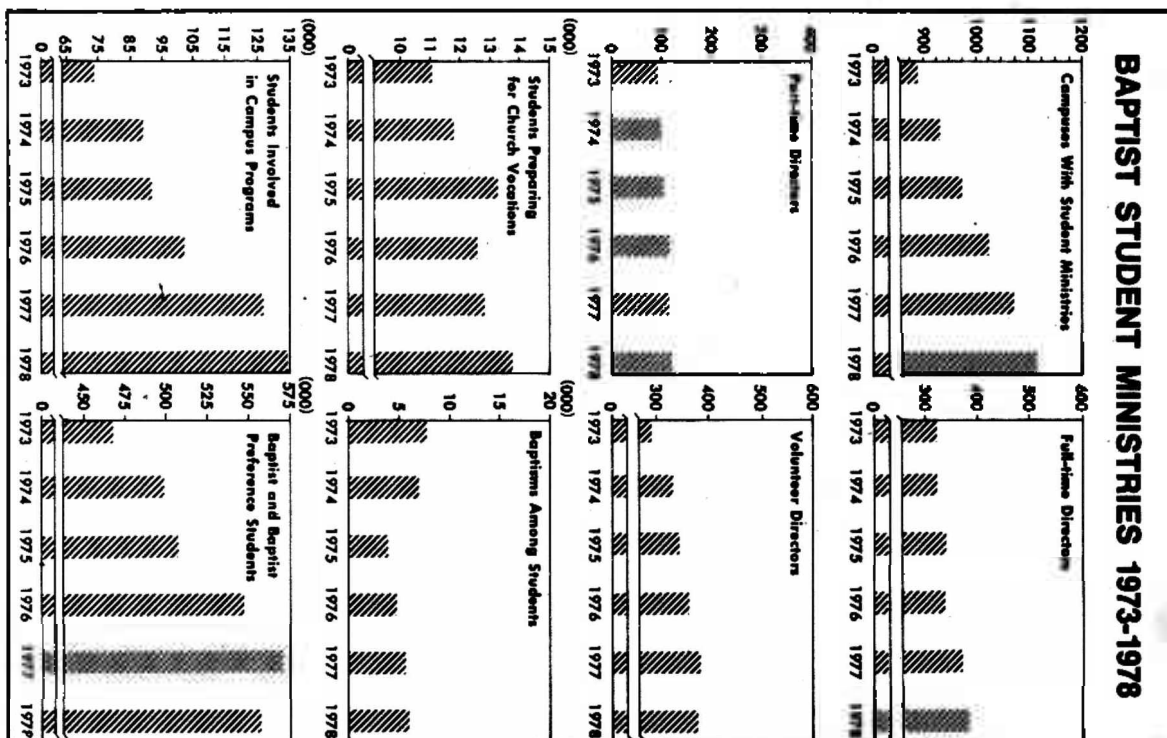

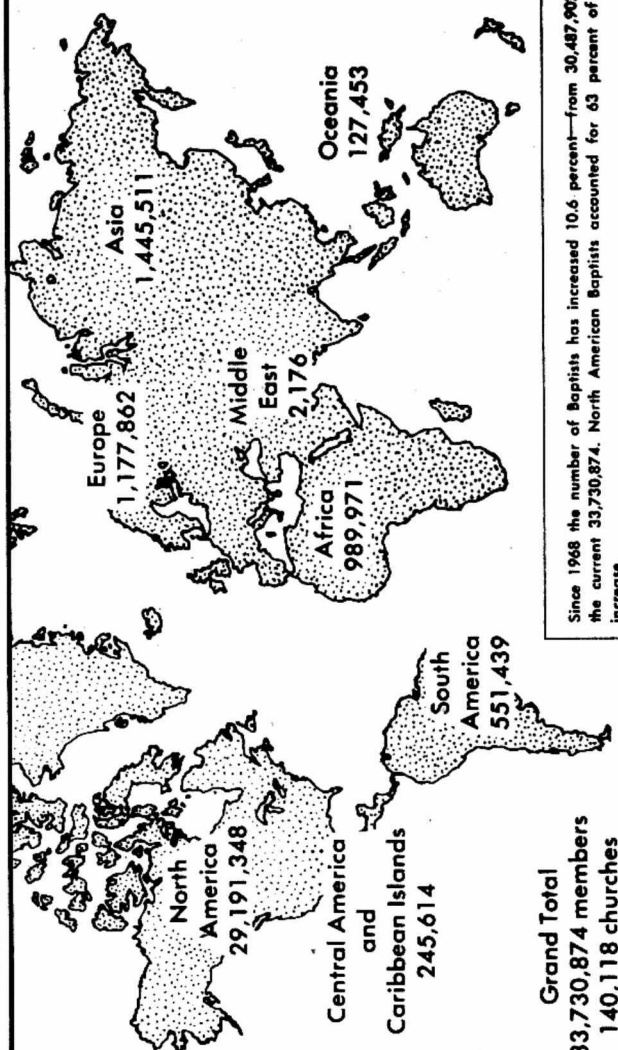

THE WORLD FAMILY OF BAPTISTS—1978

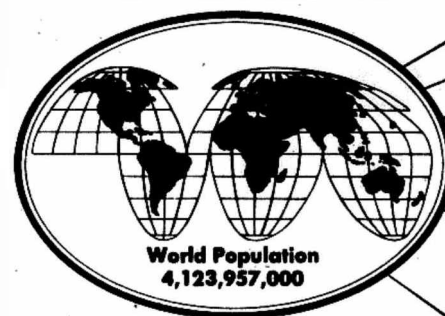

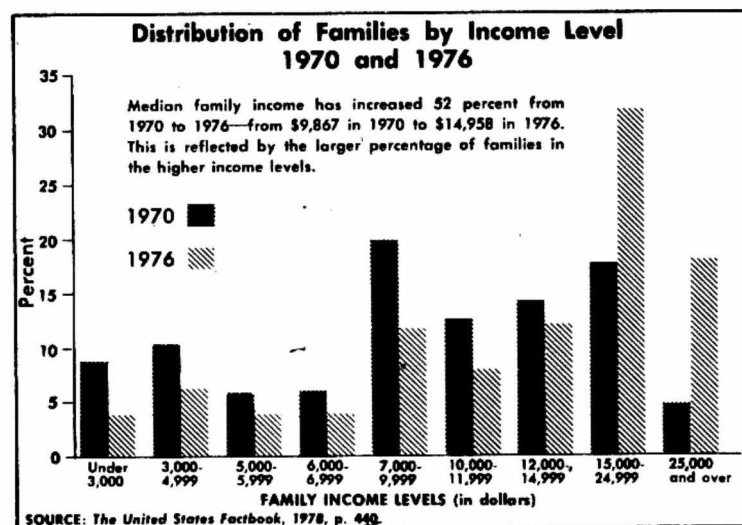
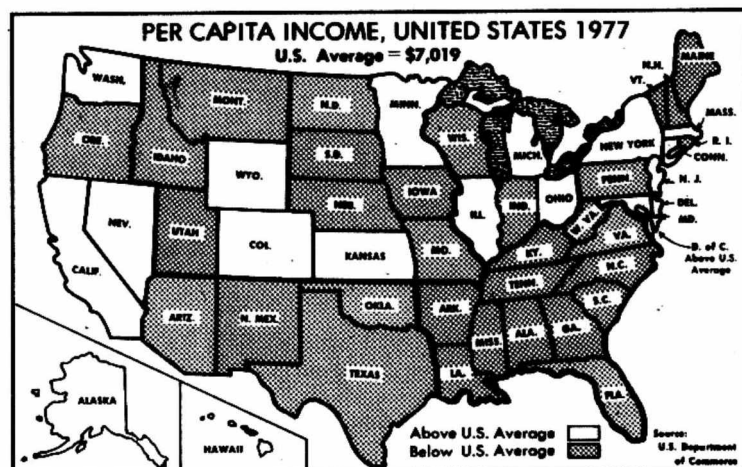

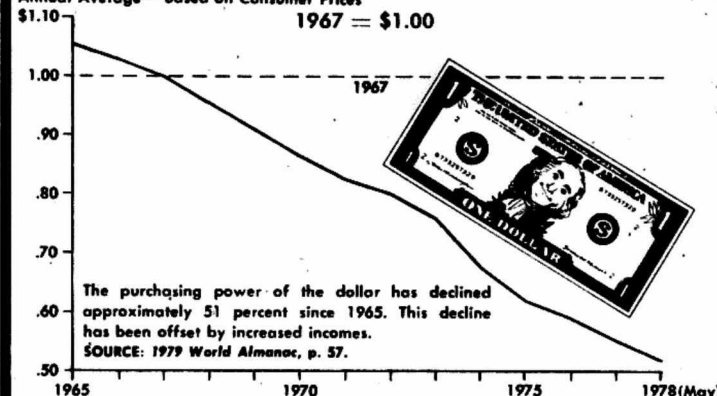

Annual Average—Based on Consumer Prices

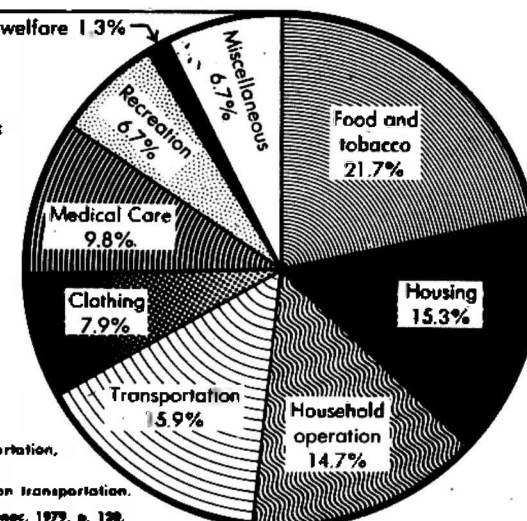

DISTRIBUTION OF PERSONAL CONSUMPTION EXPENDITURES FOR THE UNITED STATES, 1977

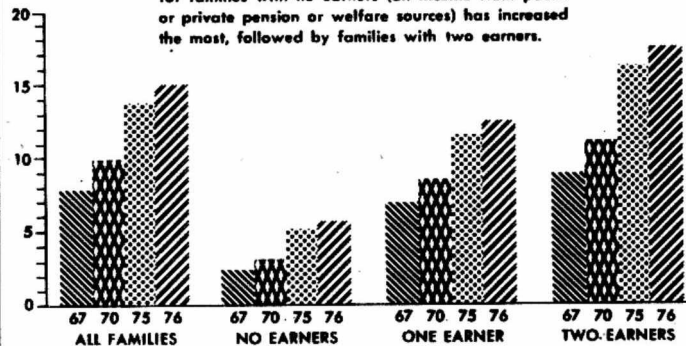

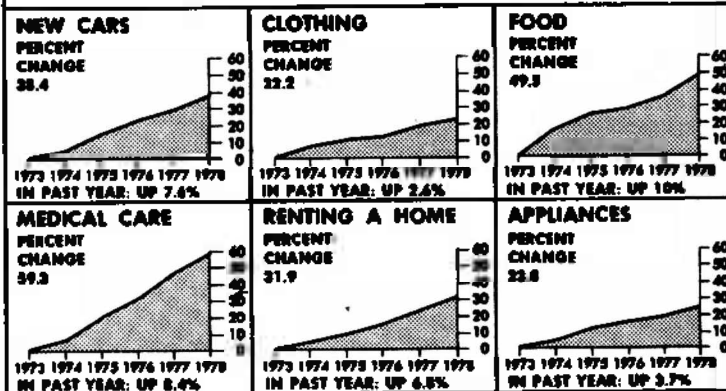
MEDIAN FAMILY INCOME BY NUMBER OF EARNERS & ALL FAMILIES SELECTED YEARS 1967-1976

INFLATION EFFECTS ON SELECTED BUDGET ITEMS, 1973-1978

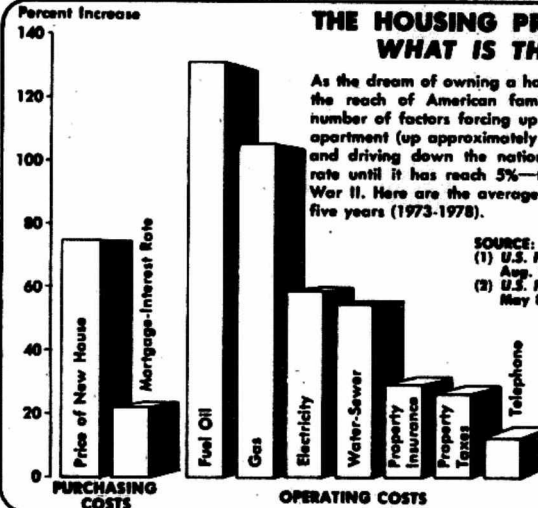

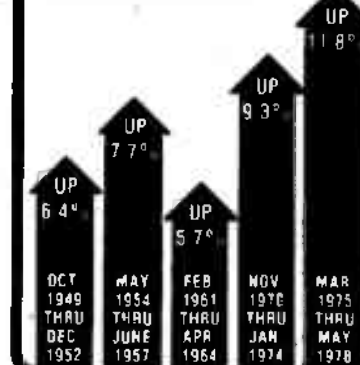
THE HOUSING PROBLEM—WHAT IS THE SOLUTION?

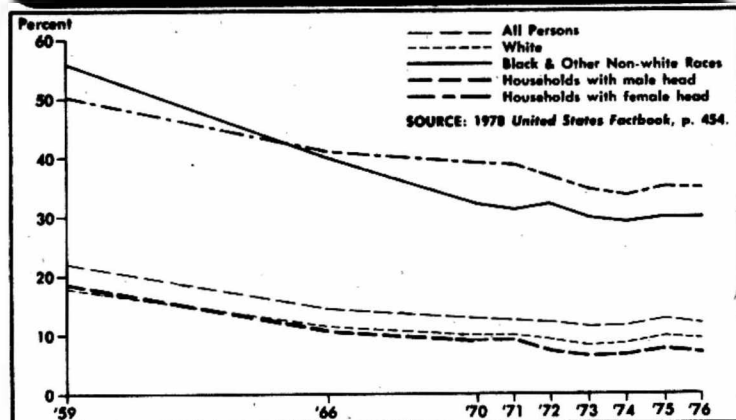

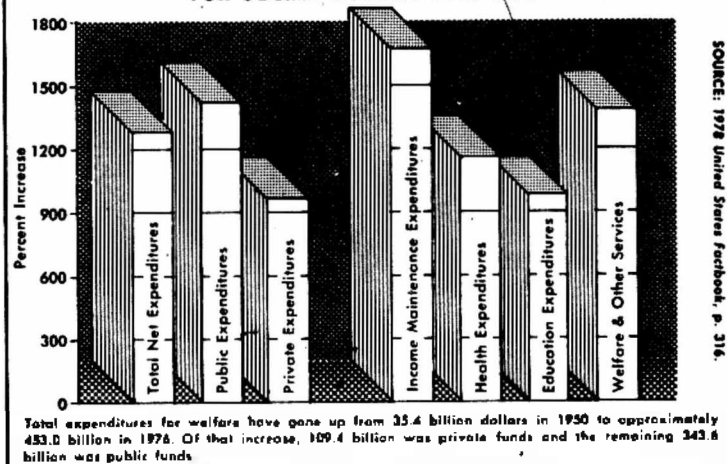

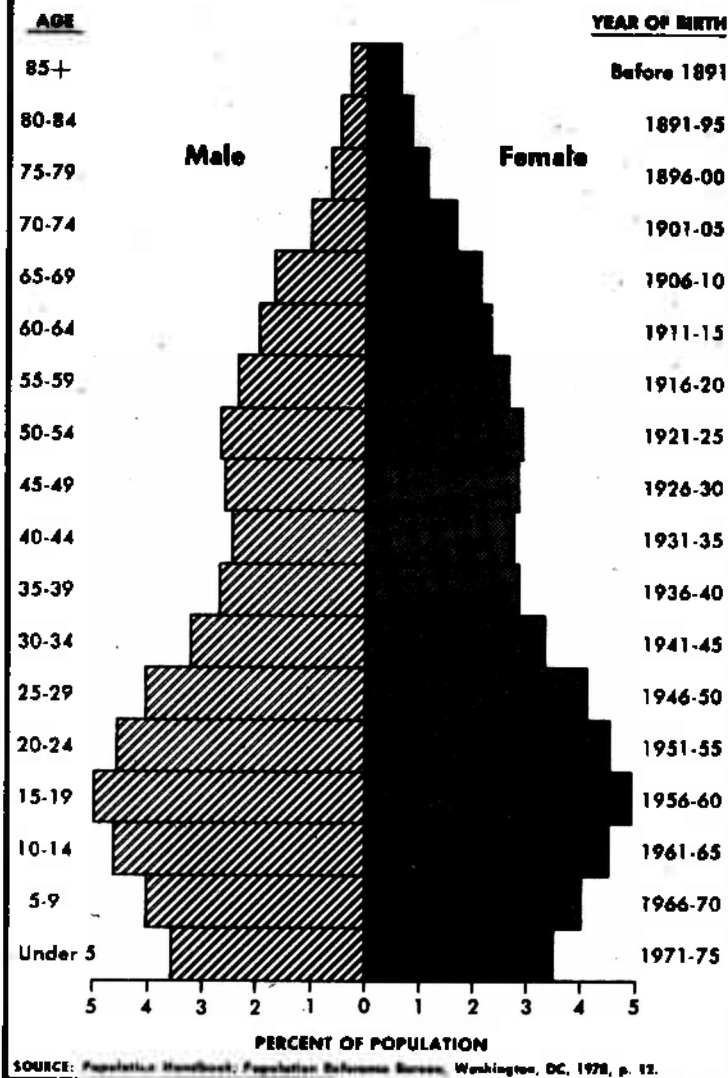
PERCENT OF POPULATION BELOW POVERTY LEVEL

ON JANUARY 1, 1976

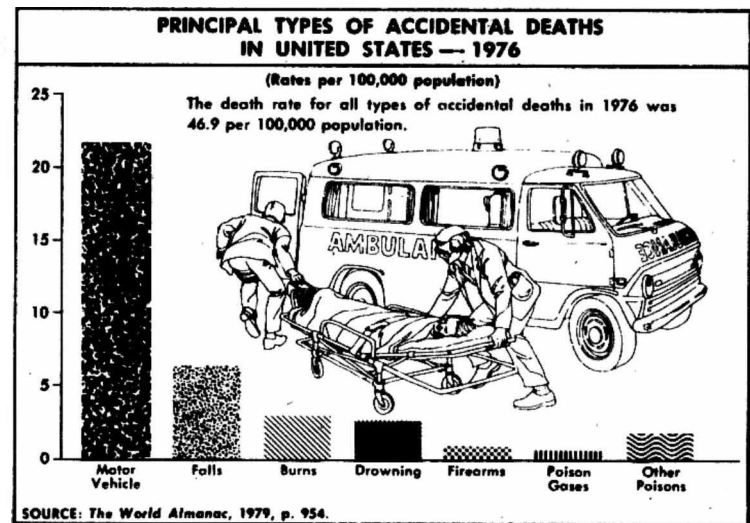
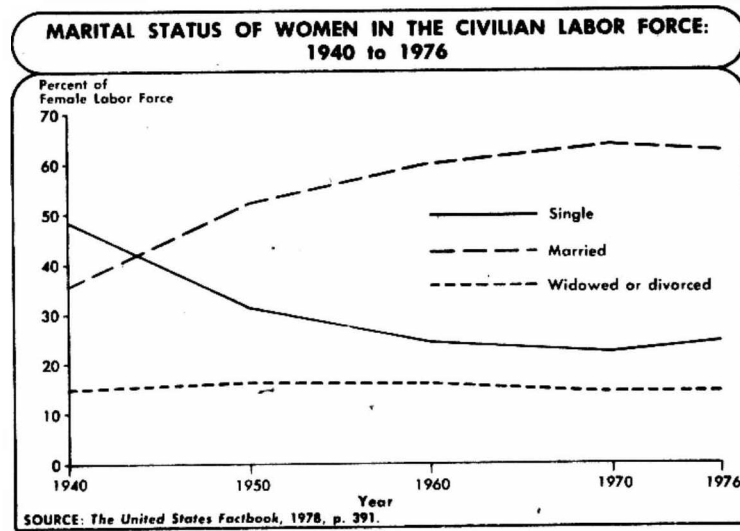
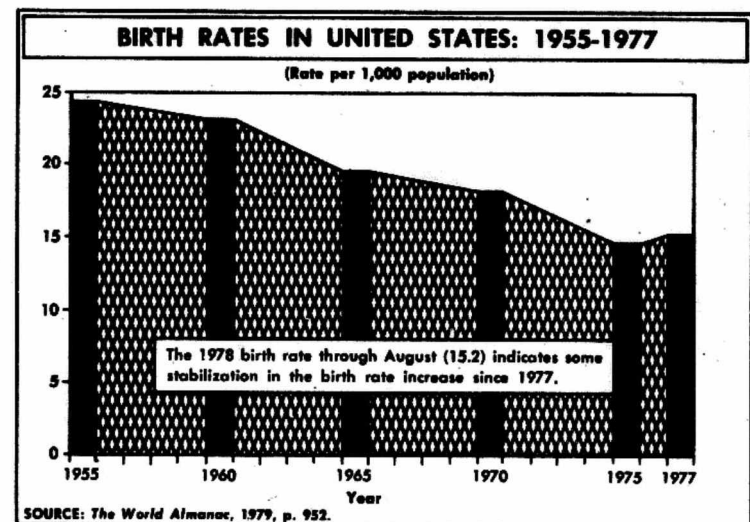
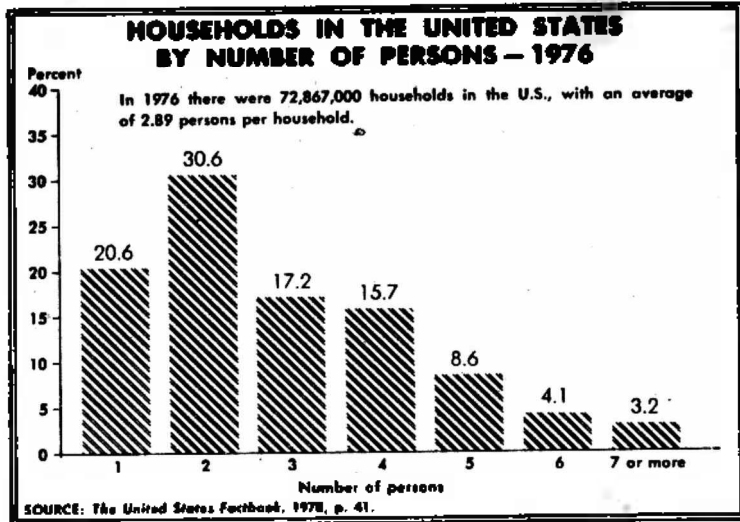


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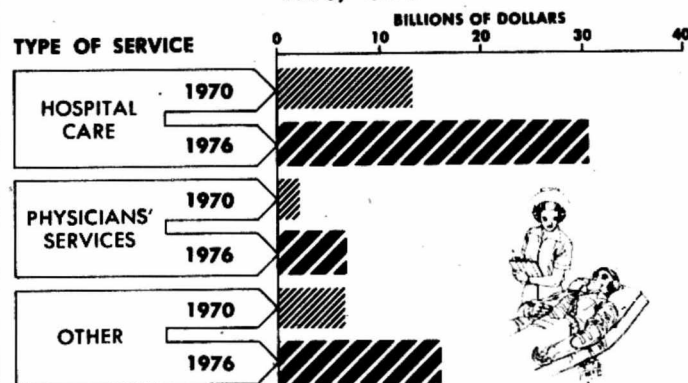
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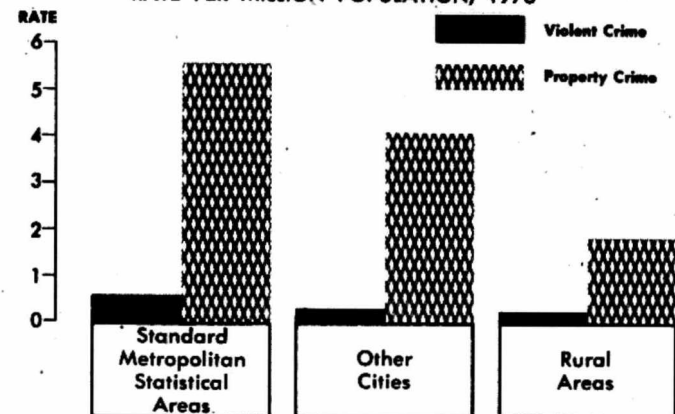
GOVERNMENT EXPENDITURES FOR HEALTH AND MEDICAL SERVICES, BY TYPE OF SERVICE 1970, 1976

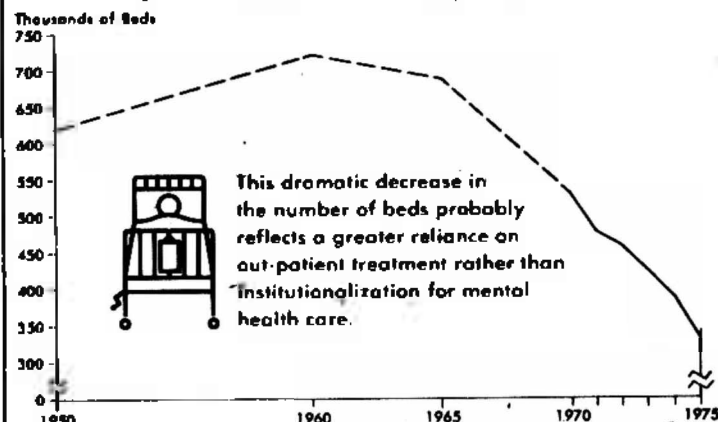
CRIMES KNOWN TO THE POLICE, BY AREA

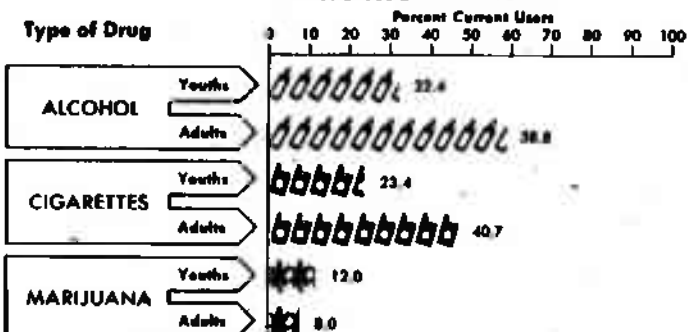
NUMBER OF BEDS IN NON-FEDERAL PSYCHIATRIC HOSPITALS, 1950-1975

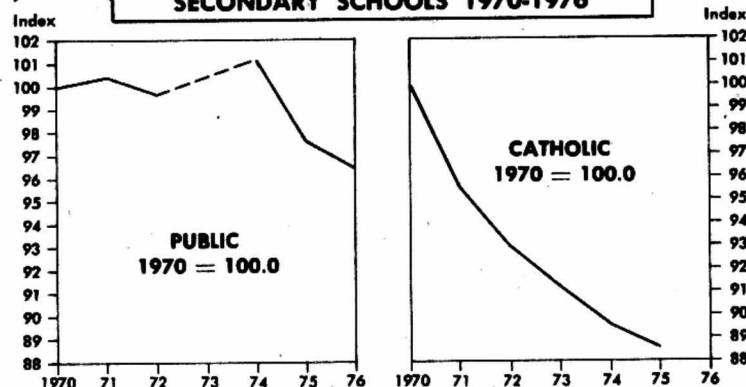
CURRENT USERS* OF ALCOHOL, CIGARETTES, AND MARIJUANA AMONG YOUTHS AND ADULTS 1975-1976



*Current users are those who used drugs at least once within month prior to study. Based on national samples of young people, ages 12 to 17, and of adults, ages 18 and over.

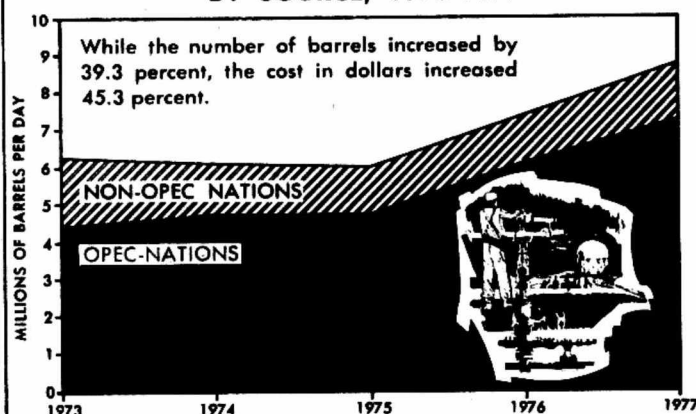

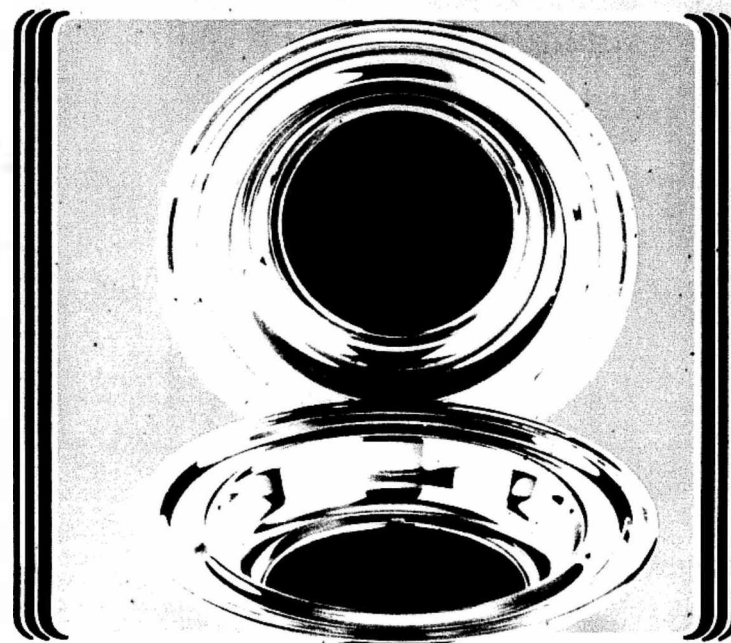

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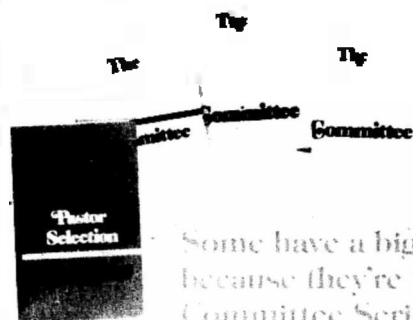
