Church Music Fearlessly Handled. Rev. T. DeWitt Talmage, of Brooklyn, N. Y., in a recent article on "Music on the Sabbath," has written a paper in which he has shown that the music which so many churches employ for the service of song is not only unwarranted in its use, but is also a hindrance to the service of God.

8. The Lord's Supper is a positive and common ordinance to be observed only by a Church of Christ as such (that is, in church fellowship, not as a test of Christian fellowship or personal feeling of one communicant toward another, as Pedobaptists erroneously teach, but only to show forth Christ's death till he comes again; and being a Church set, it becomes incidentally, a symbol of Church relationship; consequently, any individual church can participate in this ordinance that agrees in faith and practice. The member of one church (though of the same faith and order) can come to the communion of another only by an act of consent, and not by right, for each church is independent, being made the guardian of the purity of the ordinance, and invested with the authority to discipline its members whose relationship ordinarily gives the right.

9. The first day of the week is to be observed as the Lord's day, or Christian Sabbath. John xx. 26. 1 Cor. xvi. 1, 2. Acts xv. 7. Rev. i. 10. The Resurrection of the Righteous.
