BSU leaders develop community repair service

CLEVELAND — Last spring the Baptist Student Union at Cleveland State Community College here participated in a missions project in Charleston, S.C., which made each participant think.

The 11 people left the home they had roofed and its inhabitants not wondering if, but knowing that they had made a difference in people's lives, said Steve Roper, BSU director. Then they began to wonder why they had to travel 450 miles to make that kind of impact.

Roper and Michelle McCluskey, BSU missions associate, discussed that question and agreed that people just as needy as those they had helped probably lived in Cleveland.

During the past year Roper and McCluskey found their suspicions confirmed. What they learned about their neighbors has led them to organize Ocoee Outreach, which will bring 300 volunteers to help 24 families in the Cleveland area during five weeks this summer.

The volunteers are members of 11 teams which will travel from nine states to Tennessee. They will do construction-related work such as painting, roofing, installing siding, building wheelchair ramps, and repairing decks, reported Roper.

The venture has been a life-changing experience for the

BSU leaders. Their paradigms for the poor, their faith, and BSU ministry have been redefined, said McCluskey and Roper.

The BSU leaders met a family whose house was heated with electric baseboard heaters. Although that sort of heat cost about \$300 a month during the winter, the family could not afford to replace the heating system. Their living conditions revealed how that expense was making them suffer.

McCluskey and Roper met a woman who had been told by an extermination company that her house needed vents installed. She agreed and the company charged her about \$4,000 for the work. The BSU leaders also got to know an elderly couple whose house received a new roof through a government-sponsored program. The only problem was that the roofers didn't use roofing paper under the tiles so the house still leaked.

If these people had recourse to the instances of abuse, many of them don't have the resources or knowledge to fight for their rights, explained McCluskey.

Christians should help these people, said Roper, and not worry that advantage is being taken. "The call of Christ on our lives is to be willing to be taken advantage of," said Roper.

The benefits of Ocoee Outreach are many, Roper and McCluskey agreed. Already they have seen people begin to

work on their houses to prepare for the project because they have been offered help. Roper and McCluskey also have built friendships with the people. They have had many opportunities to share their faith already, they added.

Roper noted another benefit could be that other community members would respond by repairing their property, which could lead to higher property values rising and fewer crimes. "We (Christians) can be so shortsighted. Of all people, we should be long-sighted," he said.

Ocoee Outreach has drawn many helpers, they noted. The board of the not-for-profit organization is made up of Baptists, including Jim Duggan, owner/president, Robinson Building Center, Cleveland; and Eloise Waters, director of the Tennessee Health Depart-

ment Office here. Ocoee Outreach has received a grant of \$5,000 from the Tennessee Baptist Foundation based in Brentwood. The Southern Baptist Home Mission Board has referred volunteer groups to the effort. Eleven local churches will serve as hosts to the volunteer teams. And several community organizations have helped.

BSU members and former members will be assisting Ocoee Outreach. Five are serving the program as BSU summer missionaries.

"It's been like throwing a pebble in a pond to see the people affected by all of this," said McCluskey. "If all that happens has already happened, it's all been worth it."

"It's been a humbling experience," said Roper. "And the need is there to do more." *B&R*

Moral issues up for vote in Tennessee legislature

NASHVILLE — Two bills of wide interest, now before the Tennessee legislature, were re-set last week for votes this week. Both have high impact with Tennessee Baptists.

A plan to set forth religious rights for students may be unconstitutional, according to State Attorney General John Knox. This bill (HB-1922, SB-1792) was rescheduled for this week.

Also rescheduled was a bill (SB-1774, HB-0766) that defines partial-birth abortion and bans such except to save the mother's life.

In earlier legislative action, the Sen-

ate Government Operations Committee voted to disband the Tennessee Racing Commission.

Created in 1988 to regulate applications for racing tracks in Tennessee, the commission has never had to act. It is estimated that the commission has cost taxpayers \$100,000 a year.

Without a commission, future applications for tracks could not be approved, and betting on simulcast races in Tennessee would be moot.

However, the commission could be revived with changes, according to some reports, since a gaming company has been considering purchase of a site near Memphis.

There has been no attempt this legislative term to bring a vote on a state-sponsored lottery. This does not rule out some late action by gambling proponents in the Senate. There are only a few days left in the session.

The 1995 State Senate approved by a slim margin a bill allowing a referendum on a constitutional amendment to make gambling legal. It had been previously approved by the House.

Such a bill would have to be passed this term or in 1998 in order to be placed on the next gubernatorial ballot.

Senator Roy Herron of Dresden said he is confident the bill on students' religious rights will be approved. *B&R*

Sunday School Board officials meet with NIV-related reps

NASHVILLE — Concerns and questions of the Baptist Sunday School Board were aired May 17 to representatives of three organizations facing controversy over the New International Version Bible translation.

No statements, however, were issued after the meeting by officials from the BSSB or the three organizations — Zondervan Publishing House, the International Bible Society (IBS), and the Committee on Bible Translation (CBT). Zondervan, IBS, and CBT are embroiled in objections by numerous evangelicals to a "gender-neutral" NIV planned for the U.S. market in 2001.

The BSSB uses the current NIV text in

many of its Sunday School and discipleship resources and in various Bible texts and commentaries. First published in 1978 and revised in 1983, the current NIV holds a 45 percent share of all Bibles sold in the United States.

Ted Warren, BSSB executive vice president and chief operating officer, said in a statement two days before the meeting, "We are concerned about the proposed gender-neutral version. We are in the process of gathering facts and identifying their implications before we consider options about the continued use of the current NIV."


Zondervan, the NIV's U.S. publisher, is based in Grand Rapids, Mich. The IBS, the NIV's copyright holder, is based in Colorado Springs, Colo. The CBT, meanwhile, is a 15-member group of scholars

with authority over the NIV translation and the revision now underway of the text into gender-neutral language.

An evangelical magazine, *World*, based in Asheville, N.C., highlighted the NIV gender-neutral issue in articles in its March 29, April 19, and May 3 issues. The magazine reported a gender-neutral NIV already has been published in Great Britain.

Speculation has surfaced that Southern Baptists may address the NIV controversy in the form of a resolution at the upcoming annual meeting in Dallas in June.

Concerns of a number of evangelicals were unchanged by a May 14 statement by Zondervan and the IBS that they are "unequivocally committed to continue to publish" the current NIV text "without any changes or revisions." ■

Senate passes abortion ban; can be vetoed

WASHINGTON — The U.S. Senate passed the Partial-birth Abortion Ban Act by its largest margin to date, but fell short of the two-thirds majority required to override an expected veto from President Bill Clinton.

The Senate voted 64-36 May 20 to prohibit a controversial abortion procedure done on almost totally delivered babies normally in the fifth or sixth month of pregnancy. Supporters of the ban hoped to gain three more votes in order to have a veto-proof majority in case of a veto. The U.S. House of Representatives passed the bill in March with a better than two-thirds majority.

The vote represented a seven-vote pickup from last September when the Senate tried to override a Clinton veto. ■

And what is religious liberty?

Religious liberty is one of those phrases popularized in political circles today. Since Sunday, June 1, is recognized broadly as Religious Liberty Day, let's talk about it.

Historian Edwin Gaustad wrote that John Leland, that fearless 18th century Baptist preacher, argued that whether a man believed in "one god, twenty gods, or no god" was not the concern of the state.

He said that religion is not in any direct way the concern of the state. The law should not favor ministers, for example, nor should it penalize them. Gaustad said that the state, on theological grounds, "has no right to be the armed avenger against 'false' religion nor the armed defender of 'true' religion." And, on Constitutional grounds, the state is not privileged to be either the foe or patron of religion — to any degree.

More than 200 years ago (1781) Isaac Backus said, "As religion must always be a matter between God and individuals, no man can be made a member of a truly religious society by force or without his own consent, neither can any corporation that is not a religious society have a just right to govern in religious affairs."

Early Baptist leader Thomas Helwys of London, struck to heart of religious liberty as he stirred the souls of Baptists. It was Helwys who perhaps addressed the religious liberty theme for the first time in the English language. In 1612 he put in his little book, *A Short Declaration of the Mystery of Iniquity*, a

handwritten note to King James:

"Heare O King and dispise not the counsel of the poore, and let their complaints come before thee. The king is a mortall man, not God, therefore hath no power over the immortal soules of his subjects to make lawes and ordinances for them, and to set spirituall lords over them.

"If the king have authority to make spirituall lords and lawes, then he is an immortal God, and not a mortall man ..."

Galatians 5:1 is the Biblical basis for this year's observance of Religious Liberty Day. Wrote Paul, "Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ has made us free."

Baptists are committed to religious liberty because we are committed to proclaiming the truth, free from force or interference by government, church, or individual. No one can choose God for anyone else, or force faith into another person's heart.

George Truett, one of Southern Baptists' greatest leaders, was also our most eloquent spokesman for religious liberty.

"Christ's religion needs no prop of any kind from any worldly source, and to the degree that thus supported, is a millstone hanged about its neck."

Truett was steadfast to the cause. He reminded us that our Baptist forerunners waged a mighty struggle for religious liberty. They were willing to bear the burden of imprisonment, public ridicule, and verbal abuse, not to mention unbridled punishment invoked to discredit them.

"They dared to be odd, to stand alone, to refuse to

conform, though it cost them suffering and even life itself. They dared defy traditions and customs ... They pleaded and suffered, they offered their protests ... and thanks to God, mighty statesmen were won to their cause," he said.

Persecution can be insidious, and often is. In today's political arena, there are those who for reasons of expediency, may seem to put religious liberty at high priority — while twisting reality with fiction.

Read the *Baptist Faith and Message* statement on religious liberty. There is to be no interference or infringement of church or state on the foundation of either. Christians must be on constant guard for any subtle attacks on religious liberty rights. We must never be reckless with this priceless freedom.

We must help government understand the God-given blessing of religious liberty for everyone. And we must educate every new wave of Christians to the absolute necessity of religious liberty. We must demonstrate its strength by exercising its blessings.

Baptist historian Walter Shurden said all believers must have freedom from the state, and participation in the affairs of the state.

"All citizens should have freedom of religious expression," he said, "and the priesthood of believers shouts that conscience cannot be repressed.

Watchmen, stand fast. This is our heritage. *B&R*

Jackson BSU works with Florida children

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. — Thirteen students from the Baptist Student Center at Jackson State Community College recently spent a week working at the Baptist Home for Children here.

Many of the children living at the home have come from difficult family situations. Working with them has shown the college students just how

lucky they are to have good parents, said Maurice Hays, Baptist Student Union director at the Tennessee campus.

"It's made a lasting impression as they think about starting families."

Hays and his wife, Glynda, have been coming to the Baptist Home for Children in Jacksonville every year for the past 15 years.

The SPOTS (Special Projects Other Than Summer) was arranged at first as a one-time mission project for the Jackson State group, but it has grown into an annual event. Hays said the group has missed coming to Jacksonville only once.

During their week at the children's home, students helped paint cottages and clean up the grounds. They also spent time with the children in the afternoons and evenings.

"It's an opportunity to help the children and maybe I can

share my faith with them," said Carol Pennington, a student.

Lisa Parnaby, senior social worker at the home, noted, "The children look forward to this, even though it's just once a year." Many of the children cry because the college students have to leave, Parnaby added.

Leaving isn't exactly easy for the college students either. "It's hard to say good-bye. It's hard to leave," said Brad Smith, who was on his third trip to Jacksonville. ■ — Johnston is a newswriter for the *Florida Baptist Witness*.

Prayer life

Focal Passage — Psalm 86:1-17

Are you growing in your Christian walk? This month's lessons will look at five spiritual disciplines essential for spiritual growth. These disciplines are prayer, Bible study, worship, giving, and witnessing. Armed with these disciplines Christians will be better equipped to respond in different types of crises that comes with life.

Would you like to improve the quality and the depth of your prayers? As Christians we know that Jesus taught and demonstrated through his experiences the importance of prayer. Therefore, we should want to improve the quality and the depth of our prayer life. This week's lesson gives guidelines for doing this.

Trouble moved David to pray. David prayed with confidence that God would meet his need. He begins this prayer by recognizing the Lordship of God and submitting to his Lordship. David asked God to listen because he was in desperate need, and he was completely dependent on God for the resolution of and relief from the trouble he faced. The way David began his prayer — submitting himself to God — is a good model for Christians. Prayer is a recognition of our relationship to God and our need for him.

In verses 5-7 we are reminded that as Christians we can pray with confidence that God hears and responds to prayer. In verse 5 David acknowledged God's good will to all people who commit themselves to him. People in covenant relationship with God can count on his steadfast love. He always is ready to forgive individuals who acknowledge their sin and their dependence on him. In his time of distress, David called out to God because he was confident God would answer by giving the help needed.

Why was David confident? God had heard his prayers in the past and responded. As Christians we can trust that God will not disappoint us. The way he acts and the timing of his actions may surprise us; yet, we confidently can count on God to act in our behalf when the time is best, in the most appropriate and beneficial way.

In verses 8-13 David turns from his cry for help, to confess his faith, to praise God, and to give thanks. Praise for God sometimes is overlooked in our prayers. We become so consumed by the needs we bring to God that we forget to honor him. Praise helps us focus on God. David comes in the midst of his praising to realize a part of his need is for understanding (v. 11). Thus he prays, "Teach me thy way ..." Because it gives us perspective, praise should be a vital element in prayer.

In verses 14-17 David's prayer returned to his troubles. A gang of arrogant and violent men, whose last concern is God, is determined to take his life. He is not calm in the face of this threat, but his faith does not lag, for his God who is tender and merciful, slow to anger with unchanging love and faithfulness, is present with him to provide what he needs to face the circumstances.

Psalm 86 teaches us some great truths about prayer. In prayer we need to recognize our personal relationship to God and submit to his Lordship. We can pray with confidence that God hears and responds. We can honor God for who he is and for what he has done and continues to do. We can ask that God act in our behalf to help us meet our needs and others' needs. ■ — Rickman is Church Staff Leadership Group Leader, TBC Executive Board.

Setting an example

Focal Passage — 1 Timothy 4: 6-16

Christ's servants should set an example for others to follow. Do you believe that? That is the advice that Paul gave to Timothy in his letter.

After Paul left Timothy, his son in the faith, in Ephesus, he wrote 1 Timothy to urge his co-worker to continue the work there. The letter includes instructions and admonitions about Timothy's life.

A good servant of Christ is nourished by good doctrine, and teaches it to others. Moral and spiritual exercises have earthly and eternal value.

1. A good servant of Christ, Paul said, is simply one who serves him. Jesus taught that true greatness is marked by humble service — and is the mark of all true believers.

Family Bible Lesson

Paul consistently warned believers about false teachings. Verses 1-5 contrasted false and true teachings. And in verse 6, Paul reminds Timothy that he is to teach the truth to the family of Christians. Timothy could do that because he has studied the words of truth and lived by them.

2. Paul, in verses 7-8, reminds Timothy to "exercise" himself to goodness, and put away false teaching. Just as physical wellbeing is good for our bodies, spiritual wellbeing makes us effective servants.

3. Paul uses the words in verse 9 often as a formula for believing teachings of faith. Confident hope, as exhibited in verses 9-10, has great motivating power.

4. Verses 11-16 are some personal words to Tim-

othy. He was a young man, and Paul advised him to show the people his maturity and commitment by how he spoke and lived. His thoughts, words, and deeds were to be pure.

As a church leader, Timothy was to set the example for public meetings of believers. He was to reach, preach, and teach. Paul told him not to neglect God's gift to him, possibly the grace of being a good leader.

He was to give himself wholly, entirely, to serving Christ, to meditate on God's truth and put it into practice. To be an example to others, his progress had to be apparent to them. He then could be used by God to grow in grace and to lead others to salvation.

Into Timothy's hands had been placed the Holy Scripture, sometimes called the Royal Law of God. Paul told him to feed on it and teach it to the Ephesian believers. God's Word is always relevant.

Paul admonished Timothy to be a "good minister of Jesus Christ." He should serve Christ humbly, lovingly, and faithfully. Paul also advised him to exercise spiritually.

Though Timothy may have felt insecure with older church leaders, Paul told him that though he was young, he should show his spiritual maturity by being an example to the people.

Paul's words to Timothy, a faithful young leader, are good for us today. We are to set an example for others who may follow us. What kind of example are you in your family, your church?

Focusing on what unites us

Focal — 1 Corinthians 1:10-13; 3:3-6, 16-17, 21-23

Some argue the church at Corinth was a Baptist church. Why? Baptists are known as a "fussing and fighting" bunch. And the Corinthian church certainly had its problems. Paul established this church on his second missionary journey. He ministered to the church for 18 months and then left for Syria. In the months to come Paul learned of strife and dissension among the people in Corinth. He wrote 1 Corinthians to address the disunity.

The four sessions in this unit comprise Paul's response to church problems. The first session encourages the Corinthians to focus on their relationship with Christ.

Who unites us? Christ. Paul begins with "grace and peace." After a brief prayer of thanksgiving Paul rejoiced that the Corinthians had received spiritual gifts from God. But his foundational statement was "into fellowship with his Son, Jesus Christ." Paul wanted the Corinthians to know that Christ was the basis for everything, including their unity.

Christ is the person who destroys strife and dissension and serves as the "glue" which holds the body of Christ together.

In verses 10-13 Paul urges them to put aside dissension. The Corinthians needed to learn a lesson we need today: address any faction in the body quickly under the Lord-

ship of Christ. The strife will cease instead of spreading. The whole community soon found out about Corinth's problems.

Paul emphasized unity again in chapter 3:16-17. When a person trusts Christ, his Spirit comes to dwell in their lives. The use of the word you in verse 16 is plural and indicates the entire body of Christ receives God's Spirit. The entire community of believers, the church, is God's temple.

Verse 23 reminds the Corinthians the church doesn't belong to any individual or group. Christ is the Lord of the Church.

What divides us? Man and his ways. Strife, dissension, and factions in the church come in many shapes and forms. Paul discovered that the problems in the church at Corinth were man-centered. There were four factions in the church who had rallied around human leaders — Paul, Apollos, Cephas, and Christ. Paul's three questions indicated Christ cannot be divided. He is responsible for redemption, not man. Even baptism is a picture of what Christ has done in the life of an individual and not what man may have done.

Paul continued this theme in chapter 3:3-6 by saying that jealousy and strife, elements of our worldly nature, create all kinds of problems. Divisions in the house of God was

rooted in spiritual immaturity. It takes spiritually mature believers who turn to Christ to help restore unity to the

fellowship.

How do you overcome this in the leadership department of the church?

Become servants. Servants are people who help others not hinder them. And as a house servant serves his master Christians are to serve Christ. Paul indicated that this servant spirit comes when each of us exercise our spiritual gifts for the upbuilding of God's church.

Ken Medema is a blind artist who plays and sings God's message with amazing conviction. At a concert he told this story. An orchestra had two tuba players. One player had a night off and chose to listen as the orchestra performed. After the encore his fellow tuba player asked what he was doing there. He exclaimed, "I know why we do it." "What?" questioned his partner. "We come here night after night and play the notes on our tubas, and I hear those tuba sounds. But tonight I heard the song. Every person was playing their instrument, and together, it was amazing! I know why we do it now."

The church must play God's song together. When every person works together under the filling power of God's Holy Spirit then Christ is honored and his kingdom grows. ■ — Chapman is Discipleship Coordinator, TBC Executive Board.

ple were saved and many made other spiritual decisions.




