To hurricane victims

Tennesseans respond with more than money

RICHMOND — Tennesseans are among Southern Baptists who have responded dramatically to the needs of hurricane victims in the Caribbean and Middle America — giving not only money and goods, but themselves.

Across the country, Southern Baptist churches large and small collected money, food, clothing, and medical supplies.


Tennessee Baptists have given almost \$34,000 to the effort. Also, churches have assisted in other ways (see additional story on page 2).

Acteens from Germantown Church collected \$11,000 toward the purchase of 1,000 mattresses requested by missionaries in the Dominican Republic.

The Acteens arranged three displays of mattresses and dressed in flannel pajamas in the foyer of the church, taking up the donations in pillow slips.

Above each display, a sign asked, "What if you didn't have a place to lay your head?"

In addition to the mattress-

es, the Germantown church is in the process of shipping 100,000 pounds of rice, 30,000 to 40,000 pounds of beans, and 10,000 gallons of cooking oil to the Dominican Republic.

Also, a 14-member team, led by pastor Sam Shaw, a former IMB missionary to the Dominican Republic, made a week-long journey to the island to prayer walk and seek ways the church can continue to help both in relief and evangelism.

Frank Drinkard, a former staff member of the Germantown church, is now an IMB missionary in the Dominican Republic.

Previous contacts with Baptists in countries battered by hurricanes Georges and Mitch paved the way for relief efforts.

In September, Adrian Rogers, pastor of Bellevue Church, Cordova, led a 55-member delegation to a Central American pastors' conference in Tegucigalpa, Hon-

duras.

When news of the disaster in Honduras broke, IMB missionary Joyce Harms was in Memphis. She and her husband, David, serve in Honduras.

Mrs. Harms relayed immediate needs to Bellevue and the church responded within three days with \$20,000 and 35,000 pounds of food and medical supplies. Executives of Federal Express who are members of Bellevue arranged for a Boeing 727 to deliver the relief materials to Honduras.

Other Tennessee churches have joined with Bellevue in sending a Federal Express DC-10 to Honduras with clothing, food, and medicine. Federal Express, based in Memphis, also is taking the food and mattresses gathered by the Germantown church to the Dominican Republic.

A team of Southern Baptist volunteer coordinators from Tennessee, Texas, and North Carolina, including Gene Williams of the Tennessee Baptist Convention Executive Board staff, will join IMB volunteer missions coordinator Bill Cashion and the North American Mission Board's Mickey Caison in a 10-day assessment trip to Honduras, Nicaragua, Guatemala, and El Salvador in early December. ■

Belmont receives \$25 million gift

NASHVILLE — The benevolence of a Nashville couple has helped make Belmont University education affordable for Tennessee Baptists and for students from across the nation for many years to come. But it's the relationships which made this gift possible that make the story fascinating.

Ed and Bernice Johnson were very close to Belmont — right across the street. But proximity played a very little role in their decision to leave Belmont University a gift which will eventually exceed \$25 million.

The Johnsons were also very close to a man named Herman Lay — also right across the street. Proximity played a much larger role in their relationship which ultimately made them prominent shareholders in a company named PepsiCo, Inc.

From 1939-55, the Johnsons owned and

operated an Esso station at the southwest corner of Belmont Blvd. and Portland Ave., across from the college. The store was a logical place for Lay's company, located across Portland Ave. to fill and service their delivery trucks before distributing Lay's potato chips and other snacks to the Nashville area. Times were tough for Lay's fledgling business and his credit account at Johnson's Esso often kept his trucks running when they might not otherwise been able to. The business relationship between the Johnsons and Lays became a friendship.

In 1948, H.W. Lay & Co. incorporated and Lay offered his employees, as well as the Johnsons, an opportunity to buy stock in the business. Ed Johnson took the family savings and borrowed what he could to invest \$8,000 into Lay's.

"She (Bernice) cried for more than a day," said Peggy Grow, the Johnsons' niece, who grew up around her aunt and uncle and cared for them during their fi-

nal years. "This was their life savings and she was not a risk taker. But my uncle believed in Herm Lay and as other investors sold their stock, he would buy it."

The company continued to grow and in 1961 merged with The Frito Company to become Frito-Lay, Inc. In 1965, the board of directors for Frito-Lay and the Pepsi-Cola Company announced plans for the merger of the major beverage company with the snack foods company. PepsiCo, Inc., was formed, with Frito-Lay and Pepsi Cola becoming separate operating divisions. Today the company is a \$29 billion corporation and ranked 31st in the 1998 Fortune 500.

The Johnsons sold their service station in 1955, breaking their everyday contact with Belmont. But by 1965 the school came back into the picture when the Johnsons enlisted the services of Lawrence Glover, a CPA who taught at Belmont and was a member of Crieveewood Church. — See Belmont, page 2

The Johnsons and Glover developed a very strong relationship, through which the Johnsons' interest in Belmont grew.

In December of 1983, the Johnsons sent an unsolicited check to the university for \$10,000.

"In 1983, we weren't receiving a large number of unsolicited donations and certainly not in the amount of the Johnsons' gift," said Belmont President William E. Troutt. "So, I made a point of going to the Johnsons to thank them personally."

That meeting made an impact on the Johnsons and a new friendship was formed. A few years later, the couple decided to honor their longtime friend and

accountant by establishing the Lawrence Glover Accounting Scholarship.

"They didn't want to take credit for any of their generosity," Grow said. "but one of their greatest pleasures was meeting the students they were helping."

Appropriately enough, Troutt held annual "Pepsi Parties" for the Johnsons and the Glover scholarship recipients, which the couple attended for as long as their health allowed.

In 1996, Belmont honored Bernice Johnson with its highest honor by inducting her into Collegiatius, the university's equivalent of an honorary doctorate. The same year, she established a nursing scholarship at Belmont.

Ed Johnson died on Dec. 31, 1994, while his wife passed away Jan. 26, 1998.

Belmont University became the main beneficiary of the Johnson estate, along

with McKendree Manor and the Salvation Army.

Belmont received the first third of the gift this year and will receive the final two-thirds in 10 years when the investments mature.

In total, the gift is expected to exceed \$25 million, the largest scholarship gift ever received by Belmont University and one of the largest scholarship gifts to any college or university in the Southeast.

"The Johnsons' remarkable gift will make a Belmont education possible for countless numbers of deserving students in the days ahead," Troutt said.

"Our number one challenge is keeping Belmont affordable for Baptist families. Hopefully, the Johnsons' remarkable commitment to making Christian education available to deserving students will inspire others." ■

State Disaster Relief sends four teams to Central America

BRENTWOOD — Tennessee Baptist Disaster Relief will

send four teams beginning Dec. 1 and going through Dec. 19 to Central America to help victims of Hurricane Mitch, according to Tim Bearden, state Disaster Relief director.


"Our four Disaster Relief teams are now fully staffed to go to Central America. We will send more teams after the first of the year. We anticipate a two-year recovery process for these areas," Bearden said.

Tennessee Disaster Relief will send a medical team and a construction team to Nicaragua, and a water distribution team and a translation/medical team to Honduras. Of the 42 teams originally requested for Central America, 38 teams have been filled by Baptist state conventions.


"A lot of Tennessee Baptist individuals, associations, and churches have worked to alleviate the need in Central America," Bearden said.

"No more bulk supplies are being accepted except through individual Tennessee Baptist churches. Financial donations are still being accepted. Almost \$34,000 in financial donations through the TBC has been collected to date to buy relief supplies," he added.

Lottie Moon gifts provide 'Wonder Working Power'

This week all across our nation Southern Baptists are participating in the Week of Prayer for International Missions.

In December churches in Tennessee and elsewhere will be collecting the annual Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions.

Tennessee Baptists traditionally have given strong financial support to this offering and deservedly so. Countless lives have been reached by Southern Baptist missionaries whose work is funded in part by the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering.


The theme of this year's emphasis is "Wonder Working Power." The IMB news office has prepared some news briefs which demonstrate God's "Wonder Working Power" through our missionary efforts overseas. Here are just a few:

► A new mission church on the Indonesian island of Sumatra held evangelistic services. The first night only 40 people came. Someone prayed for God to "shake and wake up everybody" to their need for salvation. At 1 a.m., an earthquake that registered 7.4 on the Richter Scale destroyed a town 50 km away. The next night, attendance at the services more than doubled to 85. The mission church has held weekly services ever since.

► IMB missionary Tim Vaughn and missions volunteer Alan Garnett premiered the "Jesus" film in Nuuk, Greenland, in May. After the first showing, 126

people prayed to accept Jesus Christ as their Savior. Altogether the film was shown nine times. About 250 people reported they prayed to receive Christ, and several missions groups are working together to follow up these decisions. Hundreds of people in Nuuk still want to see the film, which was to be shown again in the fall.

► In Turkey, members of an Islamic group tossed a grenade at a Christian bookstand, hoping to silence the Gospel. Instead, bookstand manager Ibrahim Dogan gained a hearing far beyond any he'd had before — on national television. Dogan was standing directly in front of the grenade when it exploded. Wounded and lying on a stretcher, he repeatedly cried out, "Rab Isa! Rab Isa!" (Jesus is Lord! Jesus is Lord!) Television stations played his proclamations numerous times as news of the terrorist attack was aired repeatedly. Muslims in the town were apologetic and now are more open to the Gospel than

ever.

► Doctors did not think IMB missionaries Tim and Iracema Kunkle should return to Uruguay with their autistic son, Steven. But the Kunkles asked Christian friends to pray for them and returned. Steven, 10, is now social and bilingual. He is in a regular school, has accepted Christ and is witnessing to his friends. One whole family and six other children are coming to church because of his testimony.

Friendship with the wife of Steven's pediatrician has enabled Iracema to meet the director of a women's TV program and place Christian videos on the program. Iracema also has an ongoing ministry with parents of autistic children.

Yes indeed, God's "Wonder Working Power" is at work around the world. Will you be a part of it?

Divorced mom wants children to be close to father

"I have two children by a previous marriage. My present husband wants to move out of the state, but I am very concerned about what this will do to my children's relationship with their father. What would you advise?"

First, I must commend you. Your concern about your children's relationship with their father is remarkable and

Christ-like. It is so at variance with the bitterness, vengefulness, and self-centeredness characteristic of many in your situation. You have clearly put your children first even if that means accommodating an ex-husband you feel alienated from.

Much is said about family values and preserving the family unit, yet in the wake of a divorce, little is said about preserving the remaining family relationships. Though it is gradually changing, most divorces lead to one parent having sole custody and control of the children with the other parent left with perhaps two week-ends of visitation a month.

Children need BOTH parents — even more so after a divorce. That need cannot be met with limited visitation. Bonds between any human beings are only nurtured by time — lots of time — spent together.

Divorce decrees often prohibit a custodial parent from leaving the state. See what your says. If it forbids an out of state move, show it to your husband. If it does not, ask your pastor or some other strong Christian whom your current husband respects to make an appeal to your husband.

If he continues to pressure you to make this move (and you indicated it was not necessary financially or job wise),

you may have no other choice but to talk to your children's father and honestly tell him what is happening. A knowledgeable lawyer can petition the divorce court on his behalf to block any attempt to move the children out of the state.

Throughout all, earnestly pray for God's guidance. In spite of the difficulty of your position, I am confident that some day your children will thank you for the noble unselfishness you have displayed and respect you for it.

The Bible repeatedly attests to God's concern for children (Mark 9:36-37) and he rewards those who show them unselfish love. ■

Churches needed to help end hunger by the year 2015

WASHINGTON — Only a modest effort would be required to end hunger worldwide by the year 2015, but the United States and other countries have not demonstrated the political commitment to reach that goal, an anti-hunger advocacy organization said in its annual report released Nov. 19.

A Southern Baptist hunger specialist, meanwhile, called for churches to become involved in ministering to the needy in order to obey God

and achieve the best results.

In its report, Bread for the World Institute, said, "For the first time in history it is possible to end hunger, and that, rather quickly. The world has the resources, knowledge, and structures. The world's fields, livestock, and oceans produce enough food. The world's economies provide sufficient wealth.

"The key to overcoming hunger, in this era, is changing politics and empowering hungry and poor people."

Bread for the World is a Washington area-based Christian citizens' organization sponsored by 45 religious denominations.

The report says the proportion of the world's hungry has fallen from one-third to one-fifth of the world's population since 1970, but listed sufficient evidence of the continuing problem of hunger.

While Bread for the World officials advocate political action, Steven Nelson says the solution to hunger in the U.S. "will only be found in Jesus Christ and not through government programs."

"The church that cries for the government to fix the problem will find little satisfaction and few results," said Nelson, director of hunger concerns for the Southern Baptist Convention's Ethics & Religious Liberty Commission.

"The church that follows the biblical mandate of ministry to

the poor will see lives changed, souls saved, and experience renewal as it moves closer to the heart of God.

"If churches in America would prioritize ministry to those in need, the hungry in America would all be fed, and the numbers of those in need would decrease." ■

Life and Work Lesson

Gift of life

Focal Passage — Genesis 2:1; Ecclesiastes 5:18-20; Psalm 103:1-5; Revelation 22:1-5

As you read this, chestnuts have begun roasting over an open fire, Jack Frost is nipping at someone's nose, sleigh bells are ringing, a really belligerent optimist in Florida is dreaming of a white Christmas, and a silent night is somewhere being disturbed by the sound of a cash register. It can only mean one of two things: you have listened to entirely too many Christmas tunes, or it is the beginning of the Christmas season, a wonderful time of giving and receiving gifts. Presents are fine but we are really celebrating the Presence of Christ ... the Giver of Life and the Gift of Life.

Our Scripture today leads us to three Old Testament books and John's Revelation. In Genesis and Ecclesiastes we are exhorted to celebrate the physical life God has given us. You do not have to look very far (the nearest mountain, lake, flower, or sunset) to realize we have an extremely creative God. Better yet, look into the mirror. Look at how we were created. I look at dust and see my office. God looked at dust and saw mankind. I like God's vision better. God made something from nothing while we usually do the opposite. The writer of Ecclesiastes tells us God has also given us everything we need, not necessarily everything we want. We have been given the gift of a physical life, but it does not end there.

The Psalmist calls for us to celebrate a full life. Physical existence is important but God created us to have a relationship with him. In this Psalm, David found it easy to praise God for what he had done for him — and he had been through his share of difficult times. I see far too many Christians through the year who concentrate on abundant strife rather than abundant life. These verses should remind us we have a choice in how we will approach life. Celebrating a full life means that through all the difficulties we encounter we acknowledge God's gifts to us and count our blessings. A full life is gratifying, but there is even more.

John writes of an eternal life to celebrate. I do not claim to understand everything there is to know about the Book of Revelation but I do know enough to grasp the central message. In his vision John saw a new heaven and a new earth, a place where there is no more sorrow and suffering, where we will live with God forever. Sounds pretty good. The problem comes when we decide that since our salvation is secured we can live any way we choose. Not good ... and definitely not intended by God when he provided the gift of eternal life. We are to live every day as a gift from God and if we are prepared to spend eternity with God, we need to share with others how they can do the same.

God has given us a wonderful gift of life and we have three choices. We can celebrate. This is where we sell out to whatever is popular and convenient in lifestyle, the world's view of life, or even the pessimistic Christian's view of life. A second alternative is to celebrate. This choice leads us to live our lives imprisoned by the walls of doubt, selfishness, discouragement, and negativity. It is more of an existence. Finally, we can choose to celebrate, taking the words of Jesus literally, that he came to give us abundant life. After all, the great Christian musical of the 1970s was "Celebrate Life," not "Tolerate Life." The Gift of Life ... for those who choose to accept it, is the gift that keeps on giving. — Babb is associate pastor, Springfield Church, Springfield.

Where is your commitment?

Focal Passage — Hebrews 1:1-4; Matthew 16:13-23

There is little doubt that everyone is committed to something. The question is what are we committed to. Many are committed to their work, many to their children and family, which is bad only if you place them before God. We might ask what about our Christian commitment? Are we committed to God, Jesus and his work? A statement such as, "We are looking for a church to meet our needs" sums up many times the Christian commitment. Whatever happened to looking for a place to serve?

If you were God how would you tell the world of your existence? We know that even before God spoke to mankind through the prophets he spoke through the creation. Still you will have to agree that if God does not tell us about himself we could not know anything about him. The diversity of the religions in the world shows us how far men are from the truth in their thinking about who or what, according to many, God is.

Family Bible Lesson

In contrast, God's Word says that God has spoken to humanity in various ways throughout history. Still the clearest and fullest revelation of God was given us with the coming of the one who was God clothed in flesh. These last days tell us he is the final revelation of who God is.

Hebrews 1:2-4 gives us several factors that should motivate us to commitment. He is heir of all things and this reminds us that we are joint heirs with him. He is creator and certainly the creatures should be committed to worship and serve the creator. He alone reveals God to us in his fullest. He also is the one who holds all things together from the atoms to the galaxies. Still the greatest motivation for our commitment is that he alone can cleanse us from our sin.

Remember when the multitude left Jesus and he asked the disciples if they too would leave Simon Peter said, "Lord, to whom shall we go? Thou hast the words of eter-

nal life." Where else can we go for life? Nowhere beloved, nowhere.

So just who is this Messiah? To help us understand, we go to a small town in Israel. Caesarea Philippi is located north of the Sea of Galilee at the foot of Mount Hermon. This is where the springs are that begin one of the streams that become the Jordan River. On a recent trip to Israel this was one of the most picturesque places with its fresh water and lush vegetation. It is also the place of archeology ruins of many pagan temples. It somehow seems fitting that at a place given to such paganism that the great confession of Peter would occur.

Are things much different today? After all some say that Jesus was only a good man, some say only a prophet, some even deny that he was a historical figure. So who is he? Peter said, "Thou art the Christ, the son of God." Being the son of someone means that if you saw them you saw their father. Today when someone's child looks like them we say they are the "spitting image" of their parent. John 14:9 says when Jesus was asked to show the disciples the Father said, "he that hath seen me hath seen the Father."

It was the Father who gave this revelation to Peter. God the Father must make Christ real to our hearts. When this happens we will say like Isaiah, "Here I am send me." Commitment will come when we understand who Jesus is.

Peter rebuked Jesus when he revealed that he was going to be killed. Peter failed to hear the good news of the resurrection. We sometimes live as if he is dead instead of living in the resurrection power. Jesus said we need to take up our cross and follow him. This call to commitment should not surprise us, after all anything worth doing requires effort. The taking up of our cross is not self mutilation but as the words of the Apostle Paul said in Romans 12:1, "that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service." God is calling for our commitment, not necessarily our martyrdom. — Pierce is pastor, Cedar Grove Missionary Church, Kingsport.

Preparing for action

Focal Passage — Mark 1:1-3, 7-13, 16-20

When we attend a great event such as a University of Tennessee football game with 107,000 people it is easy to get caught up in the event and not realize all of the hours, days, and even years of preparation that has brought the event to its happening. So it is as we look at the life and ministry of Jesus. Mark, in writing the Gospel that bears his name, takes the time in chapter one to share just some of the preparation for the almost three years of Jesus' public ministry.

The forerunner — vv. 1-8

From the beginning of time the prophets spoke of the coming of the Christ who is the Gospel, the good news of God to mankind. In verses 2 and 3 not only does Mark speak of the fulfillment of prophecy in the Lord's coming, Jesus, but in the coming of John the Baptist.


In Bible times it was normal before a king would come to a place that a messenger or messengers would proclaim the king's coming and prepare the way if need be, making roads, bridges, or whatever it took to make ready for the king's coming. John the Baptist was the last of the prophets before the ministry of Jesus. Jesus called John the greatest of the

prophets. John was careful to proclaim and uplift Jesus and not himself. He said I am not the one but there is one, Jesus, who is coming, present tense that means imminent happening, that is mightier than I. He is mightier in God's plan (I am not fit to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals) and his baptism is greater, "I baptize with water but he will baptize with the Holy Spirit." John's message was a messianic one that identified Jesus as the Coming One, the Mighty One, and the Son of God.

Jesus' baptism and temptation — vv. 8-13

Mark also shows the last days of preparation in the personal life of Jesus for the work ahead. Without great detail, Mark gives the high and low of preparation events. The high event was Jesus' baptism by John that was an identifying, a beginning, a commissioning, and an empowering. Jesus identified himself with John and himself as the Messiah in the submission for baptism. It also marked the beginning of his earthly ministry. It was also a commissioning and empower-



ing from the Father as he spoke pleasure concerning his Son, Jesus, and the descending of the spirit like a dove empowering Jesus for the coming work.

The temptation was the

low of the preparation, but necessary in the plan of preparing Jesus, the second Adam, who would overcome Satan where the first Adam failed. In our journey of service for Jesus there are highs and lows or difficult times, but all are a part of God's development of our lives.

The first disciples — vv. 16-20

In preparing for his work, Jesus called disciples to aid in the work. He called men who were hard working, who saw truth and life in Jesus, and were willing to forsake all to follow him. Nothing has really changed today. Jesus' message is still repent of sin, put me first (forsake all), and follow with me. People are still accepting that invitation today.

As I work with college students, it is a joy to see those who are serving Jesus now but realize they are in preparation for greater works as they increase in wisdom, faith, and commitment to the Holy Spirit working in and through them. 



can be debt-free. Messengers also voted to move the office to larger space in building owned by First Church, Newport, until the center is completed.


■ The **Food Bank of Polk County Association**, based in Benton, helped a record number of people in September and October. In October it assisted 253 families or 503 individuals.
