Layman transfers anger, hurt into ministry

MCMINNVILLE — When Frank Stacy's wife, Inez, was diagnosed with an incurable liver cancer, the Stacys were surrounded with love and concern from friends.

When Inez Stacy died, her husband received comfort leading up to and during the funeral.


Immediately after the funeral, however, the phone calls and visits stopped.

Stacy, a deacon at Gath Baptist Church here, has since learned that it was not intentional, but nonetheless, he was hurt and angered by the lack of contact he received from his home church.

He began to read books on death and the grieving process. In addition to learning where he was in the process he began to get a better understanding "of what other people should be doing but were afraid to do."

Instead of letting his anger drive him to leaving the church and never telling anyone why, Stacy addressed the deacons three weeks after his wife's death and told them his concerns and how he felt about their lack of response.

"They were upset they had not done anything," Stacy discovered. He also realized he may have "gone too far" with the deacons and he later apologized. In additional reading, Stacy learned that it would have been appropriate for him to call his friends and tell them he just needed some-

one to talk to. "The main thing I found I needed was just the presence of someone — someone you can talk to, share feelings with, and not feel uncomfortable with," Stacy related.

Stacy also discovered that what happened with him was not unique to Gath Church, but is symptomatic of churches of all denominations in general. "People just

don't know what to do or say," he said.

"What we experienced with Frank was it was not that the members did not care, but it was they didn't know what to say," said Ray Gilder, pastor of Gath Church and bivocational ministries specialist for the Tennessee Baptist Convention.

"People want to be involved, but they are afraid they will say the wrong thing," Gilder observed.

"We're a stronger church because Frank confronted us with our failure," Gilder said.

"We responded with repentance," Gilder continued. "We realized we made a mistake and wanted to keep it from happening to someone else."

The deacons then began to discuss what they could do in terms of ministry to others who would face crises.

Stacy, who has since re-married, was willing to step in and do his part to see that no one else in the church would have to go through a similar experience. Out of those discussions a Grief and Crisis Ministry Team has evolved at Gath Church. It is chaired by Stacy and currently numbers about 10 other persons, including Stacy's second wife, Marie.

Tennesseans learn vital lesson from medical ban in Venezuela

CARACAS, Venezuela — Everything was ready for the medical missions team to arrive — or so thought Southern Baptist missionary Lloyd Rogers.

Just days before 187 volunteers, including many from Tennessee, were scheduled to arrive from the United States, the Venezuelan government denied permission for the doctors to practice medicine or even give medical advice.

While the missionaries and volunteers watched their carefully laid plans crumble, however, God was preparing something even more marvelous.

It was the first time in 10 years a request like this had been denied. A government transition caused all licensing requests for foreign medical

personnel to be denied. Even though the ban was temporary, it was still bad news for the volunteer project that had taken a year to plan.

Rogers contacted project coordinator Dewey Dunn, a Nashville physician and member of Woodmont Baptist Church, to talk about canceling or at least postponing the project. To his surprise, more than 100 medical volunteers opted to leave stethoscopes and \$76,000 worth of medical supplies behind.

What started out as a normal medical missions project turned into an evangelistic outreach in which 1,174 Venezuelans made decisions for Christ.

There never was any doubt in Dewey and Bobbie Dunn's minds that the trip should go — See Tennesseans, page 2

Tennessee may escape lottery — at least for now

NASHVILLE — Because of the holiday schedule, the *Baptist and Reflector* went to press on Friday.

At press time, it appeared Tennessee may escape the gambling issue again this year, though anything could happen before the legislature's adjournment, scheduled for late Friday.

A vote which would allow a lottery in Tennessee fell short in a preliminary vote in the Sen-

ate on May 26 — 14-17, according to an article in *The Tennessean*, Nashville's daily newspaper.

Also, Sen. Ward Crutchfield of Chattanooga said he would not pursue a Constitutional Convention bill which would provide an easier route for a state lottery because he does not have the votes needed to pass the bill, according to *The Tennessean* article.

In addition, a bill that would have revived the state racing commission was defeated by a 20-12 vote on May 26. ■

"The whole purpose of the medical trip was to give people who come as patients the opportunity to hear about Jesus," said Bobbie Dunn.

"Aspirin will last four to six hours, but Jesus will last forever," she said.

When it became apparent they would not get medical clearance, Bobbie Dunn e-mailed the mission and stated "we felt we should come and share with folks as we could about Jesus."

Mrs. Dunn noted that of the 188 volunteers originally scheduled to go, 115 actually went.

Volunteer Edwin Morris III of Dothan, Ala., was apprehensive about going after the medical permits were denied. After some prayer, he felt God still wanted him to go.

"It was the first time in my life where I went into a ministry service without my stethoscope around my neck," the doctor said. "Through this experience, I found my dependence on God alone one of the most spiritually freeing moments of my Christian life."

Among the Tennesseans who went on the trip were five ladies from Corryton Baptist Church, Corryton. They were led by Betsy Ramsey, wife of the church's senior pastor, Rocky Ramsey.

The Corryton Church family had collected more than \$60,000 in cash, medicines, and supplies toward the trip, including \$34,000 worth of medicines.

Though the group was not allowed to take

the medicines, they were put to good use as they were distributed to the Interfaith Health Clinic in Knoxville, medical mission teams going to Guatemala and Brazil, and a medical clinic in Morristown operated by Montvue Baptist Church.

The Corryton group spent five days speaking in schools on abstinence and sexually-transmitted diseases as well as sharing their faith. As a result of their work there, 119 students prayed to receive Christ.

The teams worked at 30 different sites, doing everything from speaking in public schools to clearing debris from roadways. One team gave more than 160 haircuts in San Cristobal.

Missionary Paul Tinley said contact with the Venezuelans opened many doors for direct evangelism in otherwise closed communities.

"It was amazing to see how the Lord could use them to tell others of the love of Christ," Tinley said. "The Lord opened up many opportunities to share the Gospel during their time there. Most definitely the Lord stripped these volunteers of their dependence on their medical talents to depend totally on him."

Karen Buchanan of First Baptist Church, Joelton, saw commitment to serving Christ over and over again. "I knew God had great plans for this trip, but I had no idea how spectacular it would be.

"The Venezuelans have a strong faith and dedication to their own people and their salvation." ■

I am typing this column on a computer — a Power Macintosh to be exact. When I joined the *Baptist and Reflector* staff 11 years ago I had a typewriter.

Then, we set type and ran it out using smelly chemicals. We let the paper dry, then “cut and paste” it on layout boards to get the paper ready for the printer each week.

Today, we can do an entire page on the computer screen, print it out on 11 x 17 paper

and it is ready for the press.

Another marvel in technology has been the advance of e-mail. It is mind-boggling to think that someone in a country like Israel can e-mail me a message that I can receive and in just minutes, send that person back a reply. It sure beats mail the old-fashioned way.

Not all technology, however, has been for the better.

I can think of several examples of modern technology that we could do without.

First and foremost is blow-dryers in public restrooms. Have you ever noticed the wording on some of the dryers? They are careful to tell us the dryers protect the environment, they save trees, they cut down on trash, and prevent disease. That is great! 

The church has had one training event and more are planned, according to Stacy and Gilder.

Team members are learning what to say and what not to say during this training, the two men said. "By reading and studying, we can help people more," Stacy said.

In addition to death and bereavement, the team will deal with those who have experienced a divorce, those who are terminally ill, people with family members on drugs and alcohol, those who have lost their jobs, those who are victims of a natural disaster (such as fire or tornado), and those involved in accidents (see chart on this page).

"There is a lot of hurt in people's lives," Gilder said. "Unless we make an attempt to get involved with them in their grief, there's a good possibility they will fall by the wayside and we won't know why we lost them."

Stacy readily admits he was one of those who almost fell by the wayside. "I was on the verge of dropping out."

Gilder said the whole experience has made the church more sensitive.

"We can't keep people from having crises and problems, but we can be there to help them through it," he said.

Grief and crisis ministry — be there, care, offer help

McMINNVILLE — The following information details the different aspects of ministry that are being addressed by the Grief and Crisis Ministry Team at Gath Baptist Church here, along with a plan of action for each.

Loss of loved one

- Contact person to share information
- Ministry team member assigned to follow-up
- Booklet of stages of grief provided
- Contact on holidays, birthday, & anniversary of death
- Make books available
- Help them get out, go to lunch, church functions

- Frequent telephone calls
- Stay with person until adjusted to loss

Divorce

- Assign team member with similar experience
- Assure of love, acceptance, and support

by church

- Develop resource library
- Get them involved in a recovery group
- Discuss the importance of forgiveness

Those terminally ill

- More physical support for individual and family
- Help them talk about death, heaven, and those left behind
- Help them celebrate each day
- Help them maintain quality of life
- Provide support for survivor

- Family with drug and alcohol abuse
- Get involved in common bond prayer group
- Provide materials and classes on co-dependency
- Provide resource library

Major job loss

- Offer help with resume
- Help make contacts
- Provide basic financial help
- Spend time with and encourage talk

As for the Grief and Crisis Ministry Team, there is still a lot to learn, the pastor acknowledged. It will take practice and teamwork, Gilder said, adding that the team will honor confidentiality.

The team will try to match members with someone who is experiencing what they have already gone through. "We want to put people together so they can share and interact,"

Gilder said.

"There is no quick solution to grief. This is an effort for long-term involvement and support."

One of the team's primary tasks will be to visit and when possible, such as in a death, provide a resource. The church has a pamphlet on "How to Grieve," which a team member will personally deliver. The church also is acquiring books

on various topics such as grief and placing them in the media library for people to check out as needed.

"We're just getting started. We want to minister to people in crises and help them deal with grief," Gilder said.

"We have a lot to learn, but there are so many folks who have to struggle alone. We want to make a difference and be there for them." **B&R**

tion, contained in a landmark resolution passed the last time the convention met here, will not be lost on convention-goers as they return to Atlanta for this year's annual meeting.

Land said he had been searching for "a visible and symbolic way to reaffirm the intent and meaning" of the resolution on racial reconciliation messengers adopted four years ago.

To that end, the SBC Ethics & Religious Liberty Commission, which Land heads, is sponsoring a historical civil rights tour June 17, the day following the close of convention business. The ERLC president joined with Emmanuel McCall, pastor of Fellowship Baptist Church in metro Atlanta's College Park, in planning the day-long tour to historical civil rights sites in At-

lanta and in Montgomery and Birmingham, Ala.





Renew your worship

Focal Passage — Malachi 1:1-14

Can you imagine? There are people who only pretend to worship. They attend the services, participate in the movements of the music, nod their heads to the beat of the music; later they nod and bob their heads sleepy to the preacher's points. Can you imagine? There are people who take leadership positions in the church and then wish they had not. There are people who sigh every time they think of preparing to teach. Some attend planning meetings grudgingly, if they attend at all. Can you imagine? There are people who attend but would rather be someplace else — anyplace else — than church.

Perhaps no other prophet describes our day so well as does Malachi when he describes his own. Here again the Old Testament serves as a pointed and poignant example for us. When I read Malachi and apply its principles in a modern context, I feel as if I am reading about our nation, our churches, our denomination, and worse, about me.

The word that Malachi uses to describe his message may be translated "oracle" or "burden." It reminds us that anytime we deliver a message of God's displeasure or judgment, it should be with a burdened heart. Judgment should never be announced with a gleeful spirit. Love demands sadness.

Love is the heart of Malachi's message (vv. 1-5). God has loved his people. The tense of the verb reveals a love that is complete, intense, and lasting. In a time of relative abundance the people of God had forgotten the extent of God's love. What was true around 450 BC echoes in 1999. In tribulation we knew his love. In prosperity we have forgotten. The contrast between the nation of Israel (Jacob) and the nation of Edom (Esau) is used to point out the benefits of God's loving attention and the surety of his judgment. He had delivered Israel, guided them, and set them free. The extent of that benefit was seen against the backdrop of a nation cursed.

We forget that God created us as emotional beings because he is an emotional being. The emotion of this passage speaks loudly in verses six through 14. You can feel God's hurt. It is the pain of a rejected parent. "A son honors his father, but you do not honor me." You can sense his incredulity. "Even a servant honors his master, but you, you do not have enough sense to honor the Lord God who is master of the heavenly armies."

The issue of contention was the people of God had lost their heart for worship. The form and function of the sacrifice was maintained, but there was no real meaning for the priest or the people. The indictment is addressed to the priests. Now, in Christ we are priests before God. Israel had allowed worship to become stale and meaningless. So today we have taken the blessings of God for granted. We have too often maintained ritual at the expense of a genuine and vital relationship with God. Instead of a week begun with hardy holy worship, we tend to tack our worship to the end of a too busy week and drudgingly, drearily sing the songs of Zion. In service too, instead of the best, often he receives our worst.

Is it with anger or sadness that we hear him exclaim, "Someone please have the holy fortitude to shut the doors! I would rather have no worship than meaningless empty worship" (Malachi 1:10). — Adkisson is senior pastor of First Baptist Church, Cookeville.

Abundant provision

Focal Passage — Genesis 1:1-2:4a

With this era of history closing to the sound of doom and gloom brought on by the Y2K factor, and everyone seeming to be concerned with the end of time, I think it is only appropriate to go back to the beginning and remember the great things that God has done.

In this study of Genesis we will look at the creation power of God. Starting with his creation of the universe and his creation of mankind, Genesis opens not with an explanation of God, but rather with what God is doing in order to turn chaos and confusion into structured orderliness. The writer of Genesis never doubted that God was the creator of the universe — he simply gave an account of the way everything came into being. Genesis 1:1-2 shows us how in the beginning, as we know physical beginnings, God was there being the active source of order for his "good" creation.

Family Bible Lesson


As we look to these Scriptures we read that "God saw that it was good." While standing on the South Rim of the Grand Canyon last summer, I overheard a conversation between two men. One of the men seemed almost relieved as he looked over this panoramic view of God's handy work. He shared with his friend, "I am not nearly as worried as I once was. I have heard the news reports that we are running out of places to put our garbage. This place should take care of the next 100 years and after that it won't make me any difference." God, in creating the land and all life as we know it, did not make his "good" creation to be used as a garbage dump for our over indulgence while making

this earth our home.

God's creation was not haphazard, it was very orderly. On day one God brings about order by placing his light into the darkness (ch. 1 vv. 1-5). On day two God divided creation with a firmament which we call heaven (vv. 6-8). God made dry land appear on the third day and the dry land separated the seas. Also on this day he provided for the covering of the earth by bringing forth grasses and fruit bearing trees. This was before any other life was upon the earth (vv. 9-13). The great lights of the heavens were created on day four. Created were a light for the day, the sun, and a lesser light for the night, the moon (vv. 14-19). Fish to swim the seas and fowl to fly in the air were created by God on the fifth day. Afterwards God gave them the commandment to be fruitful and multiply (vv. 20-23).

On the sixth day God created all other living creatures and after seeing his creation he decided there was still something missing. Verse 26 says, "And God said let us make man in our own image." This phrase helps us to understand that even from the very beginning God had a plural identify in his "oneness." God's image encompasses both the male and the female of our species. God did not create one part of his creation better or greater than the other. He created it all to be good.

So as we look at the book of Genesis over the next few weeks let us remember that from the very beginning of time to the very end of time God created all things to be good and to be used for his glory. By looking at the time of beginnings we can find hope to face the Y2K scare and the end times with the assurance that the God of creation is still and always will be in control. — Crossnoe is pastor, West Paris Baptist Church, Paris.



Comfort received, comfort given

Focal Passage — II Corinthians 1:1, 3-11, 21-22

One of the most difficult days in all of my life was the day I received the news about my father's death. Up until that point, I had never lost a relative in my immediate family.

My relationship with my father had been very special, and even more so, after I entered the ministry. He was a good friend, and always was there to offer me wise counsel, when I faced major decisions in my life.

I still miss the relationship with my dad even today. But out of that period of grief, I came to understand better the feelings of others who had suffered such loss.

It is for a Christian to help (comfort) those who suffer various kinds of loss in their life.

Called to be an apostle (v. 1). Paul begins his second letter as he had his first. Since his apostleship had been called into question, he felt the need to state again that the office of the apostleship was ordained of Jesus Christ and that he was called to be an apostle for Jesus Christ through the will of God.

The Greeks' understanding of the word apostle was that this person was a messenger or an envoy.

Paul had spent 18 months during

his second missionary journey preaching in this city of a half-million people. It was during this time that he had established the church.

While his ministry here had produced some encouraging results of people responding to the Gospel, it was also marked by troublemakers who came in claiming to be apostles themselves.

The church greatly needed help at this point, and the apostle's second letter was designed to do just that.

Blessed to be blessed (vv. 3-7). In these verses, the writer shares with the folks at Corinth about how he feels about God. "What a wonderful God we have," he says. He is our source of mercy. It is he who comforts us in times of hardships and trials.

Perhaps after getting through some tough times in your own life, you have looked back and marveled at how God brought you through them. You feel so blessed that you just want to bless and praise him for the peace and comfort that he gave you during such trying situations.

We can best offer our praise to him, as we offer encouragement and comfort to others that may be dealing

with the same kinds of difficulties that we faced. There is no stronger comfort that can be given to a hurting person, than the comfort that is offered by one who has experienced hurt in his own life.

Helpless but helped (vv. 8-12). In these verses, Paul takes his teaching about the wonderful comfort of God during trying times to another level.

His use of the word comfort was closely akin to the word Jesus uses for Comforter in John 14:16. They both come from the root word, paraklete, which meant "to come alongside or to abide with" at all times in all kinds of situations.

You can count on God to be there. Paul could say this because he had experienced God's help so many times before, and he fully expected him to be there for him in the future.

Sincerity produces straightforwardness (vv. 13-22). In these last verses he goes to great lengths explaining why he had to change his plans about coming to see them on his way to Macedonia. Now he wasn't going to be able to see them at all.

Paul was very cautious about his credibility. He put himself in the company of Jesus concerning this matter. You know that when Jesus says yes, he means yes. He always does what he says he will do. — Creel is director of missions, Sweetwater Baptist Association.
