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Layman's burden for neighbor inspires new Disaster Relief program for churches

SODDY DAISY — One church member's burden for his neighbor has inspired a Soddy Daisy church to take on the role of helping others in a new Disaster Relief program, called "Our Brother's Burden" and based on Galatians 6:2, according to a Tennessee Baptist pastor.

James Bradley, a member of Union Fork Baptist Church here, initiated a Disaster Relief program in his church by convincing his pastor, Clay Moreland of the value of his idea on how to help people who have been victims of fires, tornadoes, and other disasters by supplying the essentials to set up housekeeping.

"James came to me with a burden that God had laid on his heart to begin a ministry

to provide things to disaster victims that were not being supplied by the local agencies," said Moreland. "James had a list of new things that were needed to help a fire victim set up housekeeping."

From there the ministry grew and during the last five months at least 100 people in the church have become involved, and six families affected by disasters have been served. Three of the families were victims of last year's Christmas tornado in Tuscaloosa, Ala., and the others were house fire victims in the tri-state Chattanooga area.

In the Tuscaloosa disaster response, Bradley was instrumental in distributing the boxes when he did an assessment trip and helped Union Fork Church distribute the items to needy victims

through Gilgal Baptist Church in Duncanville.

"We provide the victims with all the stuff that they need to set up housekeeping again; everything from bed

linens to skillets," added Moreland, "The church members go out and purchase the little items, and then we put them together in a big box." — See Layman's, page 2

Cambodian congregation helps fellow Baptists in native land

CHATTANOOGA — When returned to Cambodia in 1999, he saw his native country for the first time in 21 years and his wife, Kay, had the privilege of seeing family

members they had not seen in that period. And they were able to see their country in an improved condition. When they left, the country had been devastated by the Vietnam War and the Communist takeover.

But what really amazed Lim is that he found Baptists

in Phnom-Penh, his home town and the capital of Cambodia.

When he was growing up in Cambodia, most Cambodians were Buddhists, he said. The government wouldn't allow churches because, Lim said, it didn't "want the people to become Christians."

Cambodia in 1999

Lim not only viewed the Baptist churches in Phnom-Penh, but he was introduced to them by a friend he met there who was visiting from California. The man was the former pastor of Cambodia Baptist Mission, Chattanooga, where Lim is a member. Amazingly Lim and his former pastor did not know they would be in Cambodia at the same time. The man was visiting the director of Baptist work in Cambodia.

"I think God planned it," said Lim.

So An and Kay Lim visited Calvary Baptist Church and New Phnom-Penh Baptist Church there.

Calvary Church drew about

15 children and 30 adults to a room in a home. As the Americans visited with the church members, An Lim learned they hoped to buy the building next door.

The building was for sale, empty, would hold about 80 people, and only cost about \$3,000, he found out.

One of the church's leaders asked Lim if he and members of his church would pray about the situation and possibly help them buy the building.

"Okay, I will try, try my best," Lim said he told them.

On his return to the United States as he prayed, he realized he must try to help them.

"The people, they were poor, and they need it," he said.

Fellow Cambodians help

Lim checked with all of the members of the Cambodian Baptist Mission. He already had told many of the members of the need as he told friends and family about his trip. They all agreed Lim should check the finances of the congregation to see if they could help

their fellow Baptists.

The Cambodian Mission has been without a pastor for about three years. So it had accumulated funds which would have been spent paying a pastor.

Soon the mission sent \$3,200 to the church in Phnom-Penh. And since then, as the Tennesseans have learned of other needs, they have sent \$2,775 to renovate and furnish the building and help victims of a flood.

Helping Baptist countrymen

Lim said, "I get to help. I couldn't stand it," he said, referring to the needs of his fellow Baptists in Cambodia.

He said he and other members of the mission can understand the needs of Cambodians because most of the adults lived there and their children know because they have told them of the problems of living in a communist country. It is difficult even though the country's leaders are allowing Baptists to help. — See Cambodian, page 3

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IMB refuses gifts from 'mainstream' Baptists in Missouri

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"We're committed to each other," Rankin said. "As much as we need that support, we're not interested in benefiting to the detriment of others."

Rankin said the decision is consistent with IMB policy of refusing gifts from the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, a moderate group that supports its own missionaries and church programs but in earlier days also forwarded money to selected SBC ministries.

"If a church feels led of the Lord to support the IMB, I would presume they would be obedient to the Lord's leadership and find an appropriate channel to do that," Rankin said. He said no state group other than Mainstream Missouri Baptists has offered to channel funds to the IMB.

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Sager said the organization would continue to honor donor wishes. Sager called Rankin's letter "sort of a thanks, but thanks." He added, "They preferred to receive Cooperative Program funds and not to pass the approved channels CP."

However, because the fund had been designated for IMB churches, "We're seeing that gets to the IMB," Sager said. "There are many ways to that that happens. We're using appropriate channels." MMB president declined to specify how the funds were being forwarded. ■

NAMB appoints new missionaries

JACKSON, Miss. — Sixteen new missionaries commissioned before thousands of onlookers at First Baptist Church here in what is believed to be the first such North American Mission Board service in Mississippi.

In a Sunday morning ship service May 20 that began with prayer and exhortation, the missionaries challenged to be soul-winners by Frank Pollard, First Baptist's senior pastor, and IMB President Robert E. Recco.

"Never lose heart," Recco told the missionaries in Hebrews 1, "praised the missionaries, answering God's call to make a difference in the world."

A special feature of the service was the presentation of a check for \$100,000 to Recco, signifying the church's record gifts to the North American Mission Board. The church has a strong tradition of setting giving records in support of Southern Baptist missions. ■

Brainerd Church responded when it learned of the example set by the Cambodian Mission, explained Burl Newport, member of Brainerd who teaches Sunday School to members of the Cambodian Mission.

Newport, a retired railroad supervisor, said the response

by Brainerd Church is an example of how the members of the mission affect people. They are "unusually sweet people," he said.

Newport became involved in helping internationals through English as a Second Language classes offered at Brainerd Church. The classes are coordinated by Hamilton Baptist Association, based in

Chattanooga.

Helps Americans

Lim said the experience of helping the Baptists in Cambodia has been good for the congregation. He worried it would not survive when the congregation's first and only pastor left and when it moved. The congregation met at Silverdale Baptist Church until it needed bigger facilities provided by Brainerd.

Lim said he thought "maybe all these sheep will get lost again. But it gets better."

Since they began helping their fellow countrymen, members who left have returned and five adults have been baptized.

"We don't want to lose the Cambodian church here in Chattanooga. We want to keep it," he said. ■

An Lim finds faith, freedom in adopted country, he says

CHATTANOOGA — An Lim, 35 years old in 1970 when the peaceful country he called home — Cambodia — began changing dramatically. The 1975 Vietnam War had not ended him and his family much. But in 1970 a civil war broke out. Then in 1975 he was 19 years old Pol Pot and his radical Khmer Rouge government won the war.

At the time Lim believed in communism. But soon he learned about two kinds of communists, explained Lim,

those from the Soviet Union who took over Vietnam and those from China who took over Cambodia. The ones from China were the most brutal, he said. "They kill a lot of people," he added.

He described the next years as "four and a half years of slavery," he said.

The government policy was to send people, especially young men, to the country to labor as farmers. Leaders chose single men first, then married men with no children, and finally married men with children. Many died "because they don't know much about farming."

Lim escaped that fate when he married Kay in 1976.

"You were more safe, but you were still starving," he said.

As the Vietnamese communists took control in 1979, residents lost all of their freedom, Lim described.

That year Lim, 23, and Kay, 21, who was pregnant, and his mother, father, and sister left everything they owned except what they could carry and ran through the jungle to a refugee camp in Thailand.

The Lims requested placement in Switzerland, France, and Germany, respectively. Lim never considered the Unit-

ed States because it was too far from his home and was too expensive to live there, he explained. The family requested France because Lim had studied French in school.

After three months, the family was given one choice — the United States. They are now glad.

"This country is better place for refugees to come to. It's safe and has more freedom. That's important," said Lim.

Lim and his family were sponsored by Silverdale Baptist Church, Chattanooga. There the Lims learned about God and after about a year of

attending the church, made commitments to God.

They also learned English by attending classes offered by the church.

"I have lots of Christian friends there that take care of me just like family, still now," said Lim.

Members of Silverdale helped him get a job and he began his second week in the U.S., he recalled. Now Lim operates a restaurant with his sister and brother-in-law and Kay operates a business which offers nail care.

They owe much to America, Baptists, and God, said Lim. ■

Senator's opposition to bill is puzzling

The headline of the lead story in the local news section of the May 23 issue of *The Tennessean* read, "Lawmakers press for bill to block casinos."

The story noted there are some state lawmakers who fear that casino gambling will not be far behind if a lottery is eventually approved in Tennessee in November of 2002. To alleviate their concerns and the concerns of others, some of these lawmakers are attempting to pass a bill that specifically prohibits casino gambling in the state.

The bill was narrowly passed (5-4) in the Senate Judiciary Committee on May 23 and was to have been considered by the full House of Representatives late last week.

Lottery supporters say that the proposed constitutional amendment that Tennessee voters will ultimately decide would not allow casinos in Tennessee.

According to *The Tennessean* article, gambling foes counter that if a lottery is approved it could open the door to Indian casinos.

Sen. Steve Cohen, one of the leading proponents of a state lottery correctly argued that there are no Indian tribes or reservations in the state and he opposed the anti-casino bill.

Bill sponsor Randy McNally of Oak Ridge, however, told *The Tennessean* that could change. The article noted that one Indian group has an application for federal recognition pending and a Cherokee tribe could open a casino on Tennessee land contiguous to a Cherokee reservation in North Carolina.

McNally's argument is that his proposed bill "gives us extra protection from what

happened in other states where the state passed a lottery and soon saw casinos set up on land owned by Indian tribes," according to the Nashville daily newspaper.

Cohen's response, according to the paper, was that the chance of an Indian casino happening in Tennessee is "fantasy."

If that's the case, why oppose the bill?

Why would four senators vote against a bill that specifically prohibits casino gambling when, according to them, the lottery bill would keep casinos out anyway? Why not approve the bill and satisfy the naysayers?

Could it be that there are some loopholes in the lottery bill that most people are not aware of?

There are some people in the state who believe that regardless of what is being said by lottery proponents, casino gambling could happen if Tennesseans remove the lottery prohibition from the constitution. These senators' opposition of a bill strictly prohibiting casino gambling (which also lists blackjack, craps, roulette, poker, baccarat, keno, and slot machines as types of casino games banned) could lead one to believe the anti-lottery people are on to something.

Those are questions Tennesseans must continue to ask and seek to find answers in the months leading up to November of 2002.

An interesting aspect of the story is that part of Cohen's argument against the bill was that it is backed by Mississippi casinos who do not want to see casinos in a neighboring state. It appears he is throwing up a "smokescreen" to dodge the real issue of whether Tennessee could see casino gambling if the lottery issue is approved.

McNally acknowledged the Mississippi casinos were supportive of his bill but he

sponsored it independently of those interests. He told *The Tennessean*: "I want to make sure casinos do not come into Tennessee for reasons based on sound public policy. The Mississippi casinos' reasons are economics. Our motives are different, but we're going after the same thing."

In the months ahead, we, as responsible citizens of our state, need to look beyond the smokescreens and propaganda. We need to pray and seek the Lord's leadership.

Tennessee is gambling free! As Tennessee Baptists, let's do our part to keep it that way. **B&R**

Guest editorial

Lying in any form has no place in any area of life

Lying carries a price.

Earlier this year, the Oklahoma House of Representatives passed a bill levying fines of up to \$50,000 for lying.

The bill targeted political candidates and their campaign committees who might be tempted to publish or broadcast inaccurate information about the voting record of other candidates for public office. The bill appears to discourage negative advertising — at least if an ad distorts the truth about a political opponent. It is unclear whether a candidate can be fined for lying about his own record.

Since the creation of the human race, lying has been a problem.

The writer of Proverbs noted in 19:22 that it is "better to be poor than a liar." Two of the most famous liars mentioned in the Bible were Ananias and Sapphira. Members of the early church, they sold some property and purported to give all the proceeds as an offering when they did not. First Ananias and then Sapphira died on the spot when they lied about their gift.

The first-century church believed that sin against God was a serious matter. They also believed that when a professing member of the congregation committed sin, their example reflected badly on the Christian faith. There is no indication that

they winked at lying.

Lying has so proliferated in our world that it seems almost as common as breathing. Most of us can name people who seem to find the truth and lies indistinguishable. Sometimes, we wonder if they realize what they are doing. For others, it is clear that the motive is deceit.

We say of a chronic liar, "You have to take everything he says with a grain of salt." Indeed, usually we aren't particularly concerned when we catch someone in a lie. Sadly, we expect it.

"Lie" still sounds a bit harsh, so often we use other words to soften untruth. In Baptist life, we joke that a leader is ministerially speaking when he exaggerates the attendance at an event or the number of decisions during evangelistic meetings.

The rest of us do the same thing when we're not careful with the truth. Deliberately ex-

aggerating is just the opposite of deliberately understating. Both fall short of the truth. Both are forms of lying that go by more presentable names.

There is a reason in a court of law that a witness is required to swear that he will "tell the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth." In fact, a person caught lying from a witness stand is in danger of punishment no less than the person standing trial.

A half-truth is a whole lie. The most vicious lies are distortions of the truth. A person can be guilty of lying by not saying a word. To withhold the truth in the presence of a lie is to help perpetuate that lie.

One of the problems with being soft on lying is that we wind up lying to ourselves. "What will it matter if I don't note that little bit of unexpected income on my tax form?" "It's not my responsibility to tell a potential

home buyer that my house needs a new furnace." "The earth isn't going to stop spinning if I tell a little white lie."

Lying becomes addictive. We can come to a point where we enjoy hearing what other liars have to say. Proverbs 17:4 says that "a liar pays attention to a malicious tongue."

Parents who have trouble with telling the truth unwittingly send mixed messages to their children. To practice mishandling the truth and insist that youngsters avoid the truth and insist that youngsters avoid lying sends a confusing message.

Lying in any form has no place in family life, church life, or even denominational life. It is a temptation to us all. For the Christian, the smallest lie reflects poorly upon ourselves and God, who delights in truth. ■ — Webb is editor of Missouri Baptists' *Word and Way*.

IMB leader steps down after declining to sign BFM

RICHMOND — A Southern Baptist International Mission Board regional leader stepped down from his position May 21 after declining to sign a document affirming the Baptist Faith and Message as adopted by the Southern Baptist Convention in June 2000. His resignation, effective June 30, will not affect his status as a missionary.

"My inability to sign the prescribed form is a matter of personal conscience related to signing such a form and has nothing to do with the content of the Baptist Faith and Message," said Bill Phillips, regional leader for IMB work in West Africa.

"As I stated verbally and in writing to International Mission Board leadership and trustees, I affirm the Baptist Faith and Message as a Baptist statement

of doctrine for life, work, and leadership," Phillips added. "My wife, MaryDean, and I both continue to fully support the global mission of IMB missionaries, staff leadership, and trustees."

IMB President Jerry Rankin affirmed Phillips' doctrinal beliefs and expressed regret at his decision to step down.

IMB policy requires new missionaries and elected leaders to sign statements affirming their agreement with the recently revised Baptist Faith and Message and committing themselves to carry out their responsibilities "in accordance with and not contrary to" the statement of faith. The form also gives them the opportunity to state any areas of disagreement with the BF&M.

In January, IMB trustees affirmed the agency's missionaries and stateside staff members, saying their beliefs already had been adequately screened during the selection process and that nothing more should be required of them. ■

Court reinstates graduation prayer

ATLANTA — Allowing student-led prayer at graduation ceremonies does not violate the constitutionally mandated separation of church and state, the 11th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals ruled May 11.

That means seniors in Jacksonville, Fla., high schools may elect a representative to deliver a brief graduation "message"

that can include a prayer.

The legal status of the Duval County Public School District's 1993 policy had been in limbo since October. That's when the United States Supreme Court ordered the Atlanta-based 11th Circuit to review an earlier opinion upholding the prayers in light of a high court ruling last June banning prayers before school football games in Texas.

The 11th Circuit Court, however, said differences between the Texas and Florida cases were "substantial and material."

The Duval County policy allows graduating seniors the option of electing a classmate to deliver a two-minute "message" at graduation. The speech is composed entirely by the student and may include a prayer, a poem, or other statement. ■





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Devoted to the King

Focal Passage:
Matthew 21:1-3, 6-16

As I turned on the television the other morning (I know it's a bad habit!) the smiling reporter disclosed that more violence had occurred in the Middle East. More division and hatred will surely be the by-products of this killing in the streets. These people find themselves in a cycle of violence with no way out. They live under the cloud of hopelessness. The Jewish people felt that same sense of hopelessness during Jesus' time. They felt themselves trapped in oppression by the Romans. As Jesus rode into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, the people cried out for God's salvation to come quickly.

As Jesus scanned the crowd that day, he knew that they did not understand his mission. They were oppressed not only by the Romans, but also by their own sins. They failed to see that his true mission was to save them from eternal punishment. They were proclaiming their devotion to the King, but in fact, they were only devoted to their idea of who Jesus was.

What they failed to understand then and what we may fail to comprehend today is that Jesus is bigger than our ideas and conceptions. Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a don-

key, a humble animal. He did not ride on a white stallion symbolic of pompous status. Jesus came as a humble servant. How the adulation of the crowd must have hit Jesus as ironic. They unknowingly were worshipping a King who would rule by serving and suffering, not terror and power. Allegiance to this King would require his followers to serve and suffer likewise. This is not a formula for popularity!

Jesus' first act upon arriving in Jerusalem was to stride into the Court of the Gentiles and disrupt

the temple. In this court, the moneychangers and merchants provided the Passover pil-

grims with needed temple currency and unblemished animals for correct worship. The priests sanctioned the vendors and their transactions. So why did Jesus disrupt these proceedings? The Jews of that time would not have understood his actions. This pivotal act by Jesus had a profound message to all who would hear it. Jesus was pointing out that their rituals had become more important than talking to God. For the temple to be a house of prayer, people must be willing to listen to God. Their hearts must be pliable clay that is willingly molded by God's higher purposes.

As the blind and lame heard that Jesus was at the temple, they came to him for healing. They came and

they were not disappointed. The children squealed with delight their innocent but profound proclamation of faith. The teachers of the Law were indignant. These priests must have blushed with embarrassment that Jesus could create such a stir, that Jesus could inspire so much praise to God. God was at work in the temple and they did not like it. This display of God's power was not in the script and was beyond their control.

Control is a powerful issue in our lives and churches today. People fear letting God be in control. To give God control is dangerous but exciting. What we must accept and embrace is this truth that the true measure of our devotion to God is our ability to surrender control of our lives into his hands. That is what it means to follow Jesus. He must become our ultimate concern and focus. Our devotion must search for the Jesus who exists as revealed to us in the Bible. We must cast aside the idolatry of worshipping our ideas of who we think Jesus is. If we will listen to the voice of God and allow him to guide us, our willful self will bow to the majesty of the one true King. — Frick is pastor, First Baptist Church, Clinton.

Treat others right

Focal Passage: Amos 1:1-5; 2:6-8

In the book *The Day After Tomorrow* researchers revealed the astonishing answers given by Americans who were asked "What are you honestly willing to do for \$10 million?" While three percent of respondents admitted they would put their children up for adoption for \$10 million, 25 percent said they would abandon their entire family and church.

It is sometimes asserted that the lack of values indicated in this study is entirely a modern phenomenon. The eighth century prophet Amos would beg to differ.

Amos was not a professional prophet but had an agricultural background. He was "among the herdsmen of Tekoa" (1:1), a village about 10 miles south of Jerusalem (7:14). Amos owned flocks of sheep as well as grew and harvested sycamore-fig trees.

During the reign of Jeroboam II (786 B.C.-746 B.C.), this bivocational preacher was sent to prophesy to Israel. The middle years of Jeroboam's reign were a time of peace and prosperity in Israel. However, they were also years of self-indulgence. The poor were oppressed (4:2), while the wealthy slept on "beds inlaid with ivory," ate the best foods, "drank wine by the bowlful"

(6:4), and "trampled on the poor" (5:11).

Treating others right was not a characteristic of this selfish and indulgent generation. Amos warned though that "The Lord roars from Zion and thunders from Jerusalem" (1:2).

Just as the roar of a lion and the sound of thunder warn of the catastrophe for those who encounter a predatory lion or a powerful storm, so would catastrophe come upon Israel. Since God's judgment falls upon those with no regard for others, let's note some characteristics of those like Amos who knew how to treat others right.

Amos' name in Hebrew means "burdened" or "burden bearer." This is an appropriate name for someone who carried a burden not only for the message he preached, but also for the oppressed people of Israel. As a shepherd, Amos had first hand knowledge of the mistreatment of the poor, and it burdened his heart. In fact, verse 1 says that the words of Amos were "what he saw concerning Israel."

The verb "saw" means more than to simply observe the conditions in Israel. It means that Amos "saw" the conditions in Israel from God's perspective and through God's eyes. Just as God has compassion for the poor and insists on treating others right, so did Amos.

Amos uses a masterful preaching technique to speak God's message to Israel. He first speaks the Lord's judgment against Israel's neighbors (1:3-2:5). The people of Israel probably rejoiced at this denunciation of their rivals such as Damascus, a nation that "threshed Gilead with sledges having iron teeth" (1:3).

This phrase refers to the brutal treatment of conquered Gileadites by Damascus. "Sledges" made of wooden boards with iron spikes on the bottom were brutally dragged over the bodies of helpless victims.

Their enthusiasm was quickly dampened as Amos' preaching turned to Israel. The Lord holds all people accountable for how they treat others, and Israel had a bad track record of sins that would rival any of its neighbors. In Israel "they sold the righteous for silver and the poor for a pair of shoes" (2:6), and "trampled upon the heads of the poor" (2:7). The "righteous" refer to innocent persons found guilty and sold into slavery by judges whom accepted bribes.

God declared, therefore, that Israel would fall under his universal and consistent judgment. God held Israel to the same demands as the other nations he condemned. In order to treat others right, we must learn that God is a God of compassion whose standards of justice are applied consistently to all who sin. — Comer is pastor, Sand Ridge Baptist Church, Lexington.

At Dollywood

Churches, associations help Festival of Nations

PIGEON FORGE — The Festival of Nations at Dollywood here is now history.

More than 251 entertainers from 11 countries around the world participated in the event. Each entertainer was given a gift bag which included a Bible in their own language.

Each group also received a "Jesus" video along with witnessing tracts.

The bags contained a cookbook provided by Smoky Mountain Resort Ministries which also contributed to the purchase of the Bibles, according to Pete Owen, Dollywood chaplain who works through Smoky Mountain Resort Ministries, a program of the Tennessee Baptist Convention and Sevier County Baptist Association.

Several area churches and associations assisted in the festival. First Baptist Church, Sevierville, donated money to purchase phone cards so each recipient could call home at least once. WMU members of churches in Sevier County Association baked nearly 5,000 cookies for the ministry project as well. Other contributors included Chilhowee Baptist Association and the Golden State Missions Offering.

Pastor Keith Pierce of Grace Baptist Church, Seymour, helped secure tracts in different languages. They were placed with the phone cards.

Pierce said he thought participating in the Festival of Nations "could be a great opportunity to possibly influence a group of people

who might not otherwise be touched with Gospel of Jesus Christ." Pierce added, "I am amazed at what we can do when we work together as Tennessee Baptists."

Owen and his wife, Pat, distributed bags to each individual country. The response, especially to the Bibles, was exciting, according to Owen.

People from the Czech Republic said the Bible was a very special gift because for years if anyone had a Bible the authorities would come in and tear a house up until the Bible was found, Owen reported. He added that he was told that once found, the Bible would be burned and the family would be enslaved or put to death.

A gentleman from Bulgaria came to the festival with tears in his eyes to say in broken English, "Thank you for very special treasure." Owen recalled.

There were other indirect results from the gift bags. Many of the people who work at Dollywood saw love in action, Owen said, and the role of chaplain was able to be a more visible support to the life of Dollywood.

"Through the ministry at the Festival of Nations, more people have been made aware that there is an active chaplaincy service at this major theme park," Owen said, adding that Dollywood is the only known theme park with a full-time chaplain who provides worship services and spiritual care for employees and guests. ■
