Say relatives of Dayna Curry

Release of hostages is 'modern-day miracle'

MT. JULIET — Thanksgiving 2001 officially was observed on Nov. 22.

However, for family members of released Afghanistan hostage Dayna Curry, Thanksgiving came a week early on Nov. 15.

That was the day Curry, who was reared in Brentwood, made telephone contact for the first time with family members in Tennessee.

That phone call began the final leg of a roller-coaster journey that started Aug. 3 when Barbara and Harold Cassell received news that their niece had been arrested in Afghanistan, along with her roommate, Heather Mercer, and six others, and charged with preaching Christianity in the Muslim nation.

Initially the family was upset, said Leanne Malone, the Cassell's daughter and Curry's cousin. But after some research they discovered the traditional punishment for her charges would be expulsion from the country in three to 10 days, Malone recounted.

Later, however, the family began to hear their loved one could be facing imprisonment ranging from five years to life, to even death, said Malone, a member of First Baptist Church, Smyrna. Her parents are members of Two Rivers Baptist Church, Nashville.

The tragic events of Sept. 11 added

to the family's concern, Malone said, noting that between Sept. 13-17 they lost contact with Curry's mother, Nancy Cassell, who was in Pakistan. She, in turn, had lost contact with her daughter. Up to that point Nancy Cassell had visited Curry five times, Malone said, adding that after Sept. 11 her aunt did not see Curry again until her release on Nov. 14.

In between Sept. 11 and Nov. 14

were constant postponements in Curry's trial.

Immediately after Curry's imprisonment, the Cassell family began getting the word out on prayer chains at Two Rivers and First Baptist, Smyrna. Those messages soon spread to churches and people all over the United States and even the world, the family reported.

The Cassells and Malone developed a "Remember Dayna Curry" button

which was distributed to approximately 1,500 people, the family said.

The family also talked with Congressman Bob Clement who encouraged them to get the word out about Curry and Mercer's plight. Clement, in turn talked with President George W. Bush, Cassell said. "The administration never forgot Heather and Dayna," he said.

Malone, who worked with Antioch Community Church, Curry and Mercer's home church in Waco, Texas, soon became the media contact for Curry's relatives in the United States, particularly Curry's stepfather, Jim Cassell.

During the past three months, Curry's family members have appeared on national television shows such as "Hannity and Colmes" on the FOX Network, "The View" with Barbara Walters on ABC, the "Today" show with Katie Couric on NBC, and many more, not counting all the local coverage on Middle Tennessee stations, Malone said.

One of the hardest times for the family happened when the United States began bombing Afghanistan.

Malone noted she had been at the church when she received news of the bombing. She went back inside and saw Amy Hood, wife of senior pastor Pat Hood, who prayed with her. "It was scary," Malone recalled. "Ultimately, we asked for everyone to pray that God's will would be done."

Portions of state hit by tornados, flooding

BRENTWOOD — Heavy rains and extensive flooding took their toll on several areas in Middle and West Tennessee last week.

In addition, a tornado struck Henry County near Paris on Nov. 26, leaving behind one fatality. There were at least 11 homes destroyed and 16 more damaged by the tornado, according to American Red Cross officials.

State Disaster Relief Director Tim Bearden, leader of the Tennessee Baptist Convention's Missions Awareness and Involvement Group, led a survey team to Henry County to assess the situation.

Although the Henry County tornado is considered a "minor"

tornado in terms of loss of property and lives, it is a huge matter to those directly involved, Bearden noted.

TBC Disaster Relief teams were not needed on site in Henry County or any other area of the state as of last Friday.

"Things were done locally, which is where disaster response starts," Bearden said.

In Henry County, First Baptist Church, Paris, was called on by the Red Cross to be on standby for emergency shelter, but was not needed as those displaced by the tornado stayed with family or friends (see additional story in next week's issue).

The church allowed its facilities to be used as temporary headquarters for the Red Cross and provided meals for emer-

gency relief workers.

In addition, church members went to the Springville area which was hit by the tornado to assist with cleanup efforts on Saturday.

Western District Baptist Association also was involved in the efforts by providing breakfast on Tuesday to workers, said Director of Missions Jim Twilbeck.

Elsewhere across West Tennessee, flooding was reported in ALPHA, Shiloh, Dyer, Gibson County, Weakley County, Shelby, and Beulah Baptist associations.

As of last Friday, reports had not been received from associations in Middle Tennessee, which also had heavy rainfall late last week. ■ — Lonnie Wilkey & Marcia Knox

TBC Cooperative Program giving off to good start in November

BRENTWOOD — Cooperative Program giving for the 2001-2002 calendar year got off to a good start as Tennessee Baptist churches gave \$3,264,546 in November.

The amount was .70 percent or \$22,604 over the receipts of November a year ago, according to William Maxwell, administrative director of the Tennessee Baptist Convention.

It's a good start to a new budget year, Maxwell acknowledged.

TBC Executive Director James Porch expressed ap-

preciation for the good start.

"We are grateful for the commitment to missions, evangelism, and benevolence that Tennessee Baptists have shown through their gifts through the Cooperative Program," Porch said.

"Our convention adopted a challenging budget for 2001-2002 and it is imperative that we continue to give to meet the needs that exist in our state and around the world," Porch added.

Missionary credits prayer for release

LILONGWE, Malawi — Carjackers abducted Southern Baptist missionary Sam Upton Nov. 28 here. He was safely released several hours later, after fellow missionary Tom Patterson jump-started a worldwide prayer network.

Upton and Patterson were returning home about 9:30 p.m. from a meeting in the city. Pulling into the driveway of Patterson's home, they suddenly found themselves surrounded by four armed men. The men pointed AK47s and Uzis in the two men's faces and demanded they turn over the vehicle.

The men pushed Patterson out, forced Upton into the floorboard of the back seat and took off in the truck and their getaway car. As Upton lay scrunched on the floor, Patterson ran into the house to call the police and gear up an international prayer chain.

"I started praying face down in the floorboard ..." Upton wrote in an e-mail to faithful prayer warriors after he reached safety hours later. "I prayed as a guy sat on me with his knee in my back."

The armed robbers drove in circles for what seemed like hours and then finally stopped, pulling Upton out of the vehicle. The missionary made out the lights of nearby Lilongwe but was so disoriented he did not know where he was.

The men forced Upton into the trunk of a car they were driving.

"It was probably about that time that many of you got the

message and started praying," Upton wrote. "And I do so appreciate that, for they put me in the trunk of a getaway car. In there was a gallon of petrol (gas), which sloshed out. The fumes were tremendous, but I had the assurance of God's presence. ..."

Finally after about 45 minutes of driving around, they let Upton out in a remote part of the Lilongwe business district. The missionary walked to a hotel to call home.

"Finding out how quickly [supporters] got the news out is humbling," Upton wrote. "We serve a mighty God who is pleased by the prayers of His people. Thank you all." ■

NAMB appoints missionaries with Tennessee ties

ALPHARETTA, Ga. — The North American Mission Board has appointed five missionaries with ties to Tennessee.

Richard C. and Lucille Lee serve as church planting missionaries in Springfield, Ill., where Richard Lee is national missionary for African and African American church planting.

Lee is a graduate of Calvary Bible College in Kansas City, Mo., and Midwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. Timothy D. Maxwell serves as a porty ministries missionary in Freeport, Texas. He was appointed under the US/C-2 program, which allows young adults to complete two years of mis-

Worship attendance dips after Sept. 11

WASHINGTON — Attendance at houses of worship appears to have returned to normal levels after a short surge related to the events of Sept. 11, pollsters have found.

The Gallup Poll reported that 47 percent of adults surveyed Sept. 21-22 said they had attended church or synagogue in the previous week. That number


was the highest percentage since the 1950s. But by Nov. 8-11, 42 percent said they had attended worship in the previous week, comparable to the 41 percent who said they had done so when surveyed May 10-14.

The Barna Research Group reported that 48 percent of adults surveyed in late October and early November said they had attended a church service in the past week compared to 42 percent polled between late July and mid-August.

"While current levels of adult attendance are higher than before the attack, they are not statistically different than the numbers recorded last November, thus reflecting the usual seasonal increase," the Ventura, Calif.-based research group reported.

Although church attendance increased after the Sept. 11 attacks, researchers found that six other measures of religious behavior, such as Bible reading, were identical in the summer and fall.

The survey also found that statistics before and after the attacks concerning those who have made a "personal commitment to Jesus Christ that is still important in your life today" were identical, at 68 percent. ■

Cassell admitted that at that point "it was questionable if we would ever see Dayna again."

The family's comfort came from the fact they knew Curry was a Christian.

"We knew that if she did not make it, she would be with the Lord," said Barbara Cassell.

"We knew God was in control and would take care of it," Malone agreed. "We all had a peace about it," she added.

The family is convinced prayer is the reason Curry and the others finally were released on Nov. 14.

Malone sent out daily e-mails updating people on the situation. That, along with news coverage, generated countless messages from people who said they were praying for Curry and the others.

One couple from Nova Scotia, Canada,

was visiting Two Rivers and attended the Cassell's Sunday School class, he noted.

When the couple found out the Cassells were related to Curry, they told them they were on the prayer chain at their church in Nova Scotia, Cassell said.

"Probably millions of people prayed for Dayna," her uncle estimated.

And, the prayers paid off when Curry, Mercer, and the other hostages were freed unharmed.

"This was a modern-day miracle, and it came at a time when the world needed one so desperately, because the world is still hurting from Sept. 11," Malone observed.

After talking with Curry, the family noted she is still humble and does not view herself as a "hero" because of her Christianity. Yet, the family knows Curry has become an inspiration to others for what she endured.

Her aunt was especially proud of her niece's response when questioned by the media upon her return to the United States.

"She told them the first thing we want to do is to thank the Lord who is responsible for delivering us," Barbara Cassell said.

Curry also expressed that she was not concerned about her safety. Instead her fears were for the Afghanistan people she had worked with prior to her arrest, Cassell noted.

Curry arrived in Tennessee last Friday for a time with family and friends before returning later to Waco, Texas.

Malone and the Cassells ask for continued prayer in the lives of Curry and the others in the days ahead.

"Dayna has a lot of tough decisions to make," Malone observed. ■

Human cloning — 'nip it in the bud'

Can you imagine what Barney Fife in the "Andy Griffith Show" would have said if someone came to him and said, "We are going to clone Otis Campbell, Gomer Pyle, and Ernest T. Bass."

I imagine it would have been, "Nip it in the bud."

Ever since Dolly the sheep was cloned a few years ago, people from all walks of life have expressed concern about the potential for cloning human beings.

That fear was realized when the Associated Press reported Nov. 26 that a Massachusetts company claimed it is the first to clone a human embryo.

According to the AP article, researchers at Advanced Cell Technology in Worcester say "they hope to develop genetically compatible replacement

cells for patients with a range of illnesses — not human clones."

The walk down the slippery slope has begun — and it must be stopped right away.

While it sounds good that the purpose for the cloning was to help people with a wide range of illnesses and other physical problems, the fact remains that mankind is tampering with something that solely belongs to God — the creation of human life. In addition, these embryos, which are human life, are later destroyed. Regardless of reason and any potential for good, mankind has no business experimenting with the creation of human life, and then destroying that life.

If the cloning is allowed to continue, it will only be a matter of time before someone will attempt to clone a human

baby for birth.

Last July the U.S. House of Representatives voted 265-162 in favor of House Bill 2505 (the Weldon-Stupak Bill), which would ban all cloning of human beings, including human embryos, according to a recent statement from Richard Land, president of the SBC's Ethics & Religious Liberty Commission.

According to Land, the Senate was prepared to deal with similar legislation this coming spring. Land noted in his statement that the action of Advanced Cell Technology makes it crucial that the Senate approve this ban before they adjourn for the Christmas holidays. I concur.

Human cloning must be stopped before it becomes commonplace.

Tennessee Senator Bill Frist, the only doctor in the U.S. Senate, was

quoted in the Nov. 27 issue of *The Tennessean* as being opposed to human cloning. He noted it "crosses a very dangerous moral and ethical line that shouldn't be crossed, even for the potential of scientific gain." Observers to the political scene are confident that Tennessee's other senator, Fred Thompson, would also support such legislation.

Contact the offices of Frist (615-352-9411) and Thompson (615-736-5129) and encourage them to help pass this bill that would ban human cloning.

As Barney Fife would so eloquently put it, "Let's nip it in the bud." B&R



Pastors and church staff — take care of your families

making Christ known

Recently, I did a Bible search on my computer and discovered that the word "family" occurs 177 times in the Bible (NIV). That's a lot of times. That shouldn't surprise us, however, because we know that the Word of God affirms the family.

The first institution created by God was the family, and He told Adam and Eve to be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth. We've done a pretty

good job with that part of God's instruction.

But if you think about it, from the very beginning, the family has been characterized by brokenness.

The challenges facing today's families are legion. I believe the church has a positive message for hurting families. The Bible declares unequivocally that Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life. That is certainly true on an individual level. But it holds true, also, for the family.

As the church, we must reach out to the families around us. And as pastors and staff, we must model before our congregations love for and commitment to our families. I think I am on solid ground,

theologically, when I say that commitment to our family is second only to our commitment to God.

I would further maintain that God never intended for there to be conflict or competition between these two commitments. In fact, my commitment to Christ will make me a better spouse and a better parent.

Tragically, some ministers have sacrificed their families on the altar of a mistaken notion that they were married to the church.

Sadly enough, I know some children of ministers who have broken from the church because their daddies made them feel that they were always second to the church. To this day they carry anger with them to-

ward the church because they feel the church robbed them of time with their daddy.

I haven't always succeeded across 30 years of ministry, but I have tried to be intentional about taking care of my family.

Pastor, staff person, here are some ways you can do that:

- (1) Strive to be the same person at home and at church.
- (2) Preach, teach, and model before the people you serve what commitment to the family looks like.
- (3) Set a date with your family every Friday.
- (4) At least twice a month, have a date with your spouse (just the two of you).
- (5) Whatever you do, don't miss the important events in

your children's lives.

Somebody said, "You never get a second chance to make a first impression." There are certain experiences and events in the life of your children and family that if you miss them, you never get a second chance.

The Bible asks the question, "What does it profit a man if he gains the whole world but loses his own soul?" (Matthew 16:26)

I often ask pastors and staff members this question: "What does it profit a minister if he makes it to the top (whatever that is), but loses his family on the way up?" ■ — Northcott is leader of the Tennessee Baptist Convention's Church Staff Leadership Group.

Debt payoff clears way for missions, evangelism

CORDOVA — Staff members at Bellevue Baptist Church here are still overwhelmed by what some are calling a miracle of God. In one single act of selflessness, church members Nov. 18 paid off the remaining \$1,498,000 of a \$25 million loan in one Sunday to retire the church's debt.

"We are still shell-shocked about how this worked out," said Craig Parker, church administrator of the 28,000-member Southern Baptist congregation in suburban Memphis, where Adrian Rogers is pastor.

"This is the hand of God working through a faithful and mature body of believers."

The offering was the climax of Bellevue's 2001 love offering, Reaching Beyond. Bellevue members had pledged or given \$2,826,170, exceeding the previous year's goal. And while the church only needed \$1,491,000 to retire the debt, cash gifts totaled \$1,498,000.

Families and individuals walked down the aisles of the mega-church and gave their love gifts to the Lord in a moving service, Parker said. "The Bellevue people are so generous," he added.

Parker said the miracle is that while Bellevue was paying off the \$25 million loan, it built \$30 million worth of facilities in cash. In other words, Bellevue is virtually debt-free.

The original loan of \$25 million allowed the church to relocate from its original downtown facilities. Bellevue purchased nearly 400 acres of land and built their main worship center. The original loan was taken out in 1987 and the building was occupied in 1989.

Parker said the chief motivating factor behind being debt-free was simple — missions.

"That's what got our people excited," he said. "The vision our people had was realizing that the money would be freed to reach the world for Christ."

Parker said the church's annual debt service was nearly \$1.8 million. That money will now be available for future mission and evangelism projects.

"We had thousands of church families participating in the debt reduction," Parker said.

"That's the beauty of it. There weren't those half-dozen big donors. It was spread across the whole membership. There is strength in numbers."

Parker said he hopes what happened at Bellevue will be an encouragement to the larger body of Christ.

"People might say this was impossible, but it wasn't us, it was God," he said. "It's what Bellevue is built on — the Word of God. Pastor Rogers seldom preaches on giving. We try to teach the lordship of Christ. If someone gives their heart to Christ, their finances are going to follow."

The church's stewardship also has proved to be a testimony to bankers in the community.

"We don't manage spiritual problems and we don't spiritu-

alize management problems," he said. "And our bankers appreciated that. We try to be faithful stewards and apply good and prudent business principles."

Parker said the bankers will be present Nov. 25 during a church-wide praise service.

"The service is going to be

low-key," he said. "We won't be burning the mortgage, but it's an encouragement for our church to have a formal occasion where we can celebrate what God has done." ■






Louisiana Baptists affirm CP, inerrancy

WESTWEGO, La. — Louisiana Baptists underscored their support of the Southern Baptist Convention's Cooperative Program channel of support for missions and affirmed the inerrancy of Scripture in resolutions adopted during their Nov. 12-13 annual meeting here.

The CP statement commends Louisiana Baptists' ongoing support of the Cooperative Program and calls on them "to reject all attempts to divert all or part of their Cooperative Program giving to other channels; to remain loyal to the Cooperative Program; ... and to consider prayerfully increasing the amount of their budget giving through the Cooperative Program."

The resolution concerning the Bible noted that Baptists always have believed it to be the "holy, inspired, written Word of God."

The statement calls on "all Louisiana Baptists, their churches, institutions, officers, committee members, executives, staff members, faculty, and employees to renew our commitment to these basic Baptist convictions and to demonstrate that commitment by faithful obedience to every word that has proceeded out of God's mouth as recorded in the Holy Bible." ■

Alabama Baptists affirm cooperation

HUNTSVILLE, Ala. — The president of the Alabama Baptist State Convention challenged messengers to have "one mission, the Great Commission; one purpose, global evangelism, discipleship and missions; and one program, the

Cooperative Program."

Mike McLemore, ABSC president and pastor of Lakeside Baptist Church in Birmingham, delivered his remarks during the convention's Nov. 13-14 annual meeting at Whitesburg Baptist Church here, where messengers also approved a record-setting Cooperative Program challenge budget of \$40,425,000, up 3 percent over the current budget. McLemore also was re-elected for another term as president.

Rick Lance, executive director of the Alabama Baptist State Convention, said the budget will continue its 42.3 percent allocation for the base CP budget for Southern Baptist Convention causes and 57.7 percent for state convention causes.

When special offering gifts are counted, Lance said approximately 55 percent of all gifts channeled through the state con-

vention will go to Southern Baptist Convention missions and ministries. In 2002, that will amount to \$30,338,416 if offering goals are met.

The percentage of CP gifts going to SBC causes from Alabama "reflect the effort and ministry that we have as a national body in trying to do the work of evangelistic people of faith," he said. ■

Baptists called to fast and pray on last day of Ramadan

NASHVILLE — The president of the Southern Baptist Convention is calling on all Southern Baptists to fast and pray on Dec. 16, the last day of the Muslim month of Ramadan.

During Ramadan, observant

Muslims abstain from eating, drinking, smoking, and sex between sunrise and sunset. The month, which officially began Nov. 16 in most Arab nations, commemorates the time when Muslims believe God began revealing the Koran, their holy book, to the prophet Muhammad.

James Merritt, president of the SBC and pastor of the Atlanta-area First Baptist Church, Snellville, said the last day of Ramadan is particularly important for Muslims because that is the day they believe God speaks to them.

"We need to fast because we do believe that Christ is the only way to heaven," Merritt said. "Just as they can pray and fast, we want to pray and fast that they will find the true way to heaven, and this is through Jesus Christ." ■



The hope of Christmas

Focal Passage: Romans 15:1-13

Captain Edwin "Buzz" Aldrin was one of the first two men to ever walk on the moon. However, just a few short years after this historic feat, his life turned from success to the brink of disaster. "I had been immersed in just one project — going to the moon," Aldrin said. "I had gone to the moon ... what possible goal could I add now? There simply wasn't one." Aldrin went from the mountain of spectacular achievement to the valley of hopelessness and despair (*Return to Earth*, by Edwin E. Aldrin).

Many people today feel the same hopelessness. For some Christmas is not a joy-filled time, but a painful memory of how life used to be when a spouse or child was still alive. For others the absence of family reunions during the holidays is a searing reminder of how alone they are. Even others feel the hopelessness of poverty at Christmas because they do not have the money to put gifts under the tree or cook a big holiday meal. But in all these examples, and in every other circumstance that may exist in someone's life, Christmas is still God's signal of hope for mankind!

After all, the hope of Christmas is not in earthly relationships, as wonderful as it is to share Christmas joy with loved ones. Nor is the hope of Christmas in family re-

unions or large holiday gatherings, as delightful as they are. Despite the pleasure of exchanging gifts and enjoying the smells of turkey and dressing, the hope of Christmas is not in presents or food. The hope of Christmas is Jesus!

Certainly the Roman believers, to whom Paul was writing, had experienced their own circumstances of hopelessness. Yet Paul says his prayer is that "the God of hope [will] fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit" (v. 13). Paul is confident regardless of the Roman believers' situation, the hope available in Christ would overshadow their troubles. They could actually abound in hope!

The Romans faced ... How could the Roman believers abound in hope when Rome was feeding believers to the lions, using Christians for sport with gladiators, and hanging tarred believers on posts along the streets of Rome to burn them at night as human streetlights? How could believers forced to meeting underground have much hope? What hope was there for followers of a religion that was outlawed by the state and any possible conversion to that religion would probably lead to death? Yet, believers in Rome had hope because hope was not tied to their circumstances; hope was tied to Christ.

The God of great power

Focal Passage: Deuteronomy 4:32-40

Ludwig Nommensen, a pioneer missionary to the Batak tribesmen, was told that he could stay for two years. During that time he studied the customs and traditions that ruled the people. At the end of two years the chief asked him if there was anything in the Christian religion that differed from the traditions of the Batak.

"We, too, have laws that say we must not steal, nor take our neighbor's wife, nor bear false witness," the chief said.

The missionary answered quietly, "My Master gives the power to keep His laws."

The chief was startled. "Can you teach my people that?" he asked.

"No, I cannot, but God can give them that power if they ask for it and listen to His Word." The missionary was permitted to stay another six months, during which time he taught just one thing — the power of God. At the end of that time, the chief said, "Stay; your law is better than ours. Ours tells us what we ought to do. Your God

says, 'Come, I will walk with you and give you strength to do the good thing.'"

Moses desired that the people understand the power of God. He pointed to three events that demonstrated the great power of God. The first was in creation. The second was in revelation. God spoke to his people. The third was in deliverance. God delivered his people from Egyptian bondage. The other nations all had their gods, but none of them could point to acts of their gods like that of the God of Israel.

Today, we have many people questioning the validity of the claim that the God we worship and serve is the one true God. After all, they say, there may be more than one way to heaven. However, when one looks at the great and mighty works of God we, like Moses, arrive at the conclusion, the God we serve is the most powerful. He is the one who created this world and us. He is the one who has revealed Himself to us. He is the one who has redeemed us through Jesus Christ.

Since God is so powerful, a logical question to ask is "What should be our response to Him?" Moses answered in verse 40 "Keep His de-

crees and commands." That is to say, be obedient. We to must be obedient unto God.

A businessman who was well known for his ruthless behavior once told Mark Twain, "Before I die I mean to make a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. I will climb Mount Sinai and read the Ten Commandments aloud at the top."

Mark Twain replied, "I have a better idea. You could stay in Boston and keep the Ten Commandments." Nothing is nobler than obedience.

The chorus of an old hymn says, "I'll go where you want me to go, Dear Lord,

O'er mountain, plain, or sea;
I'll say what you want me to say, Dear Lord,

I'll be what you want me to be."

That, says Moses, is what the God of great power wants of His people Israel.

That is the same thing He is looking for in my life and your life.

When the children of Israel were obedient Moses said God would bestow a blessing upon them. "Keep His decrees and commands, which I am giving you today, so that it may go well with you and your children after you and that you may live long in the land the Lord your God gives you for all time" (v. 40). — Jones is director of missions, Big Hatchie Baptist Association.

The center was built mostly by members and cost about \$125,000, reported Stewart. It includes a full gymnasium, educational space, and restrooms so it can house people in crisis temporarily. It was just dedicated March 25.
