**Adams church
ravaged by fire**

ADAMS — A historic Robertson County Baptist church was damaged by a fire which began Saturday night, Nov. 29.

About 25 percent of the church, which was begun in 1791 on the banks of the Red River, was burned, according to an article in the Dec. 1 issue of *The Tennessean*. The church moved to its present location on State Highway 76 in 1898.

Included in the part which burned was an office that stored the church's paperwork, according to the article. The sanctuary did not sustain much damage, according to Pastor Chuck Cato.

The church held services on Sunday, Nov. 30, outdoors. Cato reiterated to the congregation that "the church is the people," the article stated.

"Wherever the people meet, there is the church. ... We're determined to persevere, endure, adapt, and overcome," he said.

According to the paper, investigators classified the fire as "accidental." It is believed to have been started by old wiring, some of which was more than 50 years old, in the ceiling.

Volunteer fire fighters in Adams were credited with keeping damage to a minimum, *The Tennessean* reported. □

**Senate introduces
amendment to
protect marriage**

WASHINGTON — The move to protect the traditional definition of marriage within the U.S. Constitution took another step forward Nov. 26 when the Federal Marriage Amendment was introduced in the Senate.

Sen. Wayne Allard, R.-Colo., introduced the amendment on the Senate floor exactly one week after the highest court in Massachusetts legalized same-sex "marriage" in that state. The court issued a 180-day state to give the state legislature time to act.

The proposed amendment reads: "Marriage in the United States shall consist only of the union of a man and a woman. Neither this Constitution or the constitution of any State, nor state or federal law, shall be construed to require that marital status or the legal incidents thereof be conferred upon unmarried couples or groups."

While several senators had expressed support for an amendment in recent months, it had yet to be introduced officially.

The proposal has four cosponsors, all Republicans: Sam Brownback of Kansas; Jim Bunning of Kentucky; Jeff Sessions of Alabama; and Jim Inhofe of Oklahoma.

The proposed amendment now goes before the Senate Judiciary Committee.

This summer Rep. Marilyn Musgrave, R.-Colo., introduced the amendment in the House, where it has 107 cosponsors. It needs passage of two-thirds of both the House and Senate and ratification of three-fourths of the states.

But so far Democrats have been cold to the idea, and on Nov. 23 Senate Minority Leader Tom Daschle, D.-S.D., said he is opposed to an amendment.

The Democratic National Committee's web site has an entire section on "gay and lesbian" issues where it asserts that an amendment would "force states to discriminate against groups of their own citizens."

Two polls released since the ruling show that more than 60 percent of Americans oppose same-sex "marriage." Additionally, three major polls this year — all taken before the Massachusetts ruling — showed that between 54 and 58 percent of Americans support a constitutional amendment. □

**Baptist paper
barred from
MBC meetings**

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo. — In a move unprecedented in Southern Baptist circles, a state convention president will attempt to bar a Baptist publication in Missouri from attending or reporting on state Baptist meetings.

David Tolliver, recently elected president of the Missouri Baptist Convention, informed the editor of the *Word & Way* that the staff of the 107-year-old news journal will no longer be allowed to attend convention meetings, including executive board sessions and committee meetings. Tolliver also will attempt to bar *Word & Way* from the convention's 2004 annual meeting, which are frequently attended by secular media.

In a Nov. 19 letter to Editor Bill Webb, Tolliver explained that his "directive" is a result of the action the *Word & Way* and four other convention agencies took to establish self-perpetuating trustee boards.

In a telephone interview Nov. 24, Tolliver emphasized the lawsuit as his primary reason for expelling *Word & Way* from board proceedings. "This was not done in animosity but in prudence," he said.

Tolliver said the directive would not apply to other news organizations because they are not involved in legal action with the Missouri convention. "If ABP [Associated Baptist Press] calls and asks if they can attend, I will let them. We are not in a lawsuit with them," he said.

The convention president added that he plans to ask all executive board members to refrain from talking with *Word & Way*, although he acknowledged that he cannot force them to comply.

Creed, Sims to write lesson

Samuel A. Creed, pastor of First Baptist Church, Ashland City, for the past 12 years, will write the Explore the Bible series. Prior to serving in Ashland City he was pastor of Cragfont Baptist Church, Castalian Springs, for seven years. He also served a church in Mississippi for five years.

Creed holds degrees from Arkansas State University, Tennessee State University, and Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, where he earned both the master of divinity and doctor of ministry degrees.

Creed has taught American history in public high schools for a number of years. He currently serves as moderator of Nashville Baptist Association and is president of the

Cheatham County Ministerial Alliance.

Sims, pastor of First Baptist Church, Union City, since 1998, will write the Faith Bible Series. He is a former pastor of First Baptist Church, Ashland City, and churches in Ohio and Mississippi.

A native of Jackson, Tenn., Sims holds degrees from Union University and New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary where he earned

master of divinity in pastoral ministry and the doctor of ministry degrees.

He has held numerous positions at both the association and state convention levels, including service as a trustee of Tennessee Baptist Children's Homes. Sims and his wife Nancy, have two children. □

Traditionally, all convention meetings have been open to members of Missouri Baptist churches and to visitors. Tolliver said he does not plan to break that tradition, noting that convention sessions are open to all Missouri Baptists. However, he noted that if a *Word & Way* staffer refuses to leave an executive board meeting, he will simply call the board into executive (closed) session. □

**New England
Baptists express
concern with VBS**

WARWICK, N.H. — During the annual meeting of the Baptist Convention of New England, messengers, through the resolution process, went on record against supporting LifeWay Christian Resources' 2004 Vacation Bible School materials, recommending an alternative LifeWay resource for VBS for the coming year.

The resolution targeted the 2004 VBS material, "Rickshaw Rally." After being contacted by Asian Americans and having numerous meetings on the issue, BCNE leaders felt the step was necessary. Instead, the convention will suggest another LifeWay resource for VBS use during the coming year.

"We believe that, however unintentional, a mistake was made with this year's theme," stated Jim Wideman, BCNE executive director. "Asian Americans in New England have found this theme focusing on the rickshaw to be insensitive and to be a poor representation of Asian culture. Some have found it highly offensive. We did not feel that we could stay sensitive to our culture and context in New England and pro-

note this material."

Wideman added, "We recognize the solid biblical content of the material and the desire of LifeWay to present a fresh, exciting experience for children in VBS. However, the symbolism used in this year's theme was a tremendous stumbling block in our area, and we felt we had no choice but to make this decision."

"The BCNE is not at odds with LifeWay and is grateful for the partnership and support that LifeWay has provided New England through the years," Wideman said. "In the future, we are going to offer another LifeWay resource, 'Down Street and Around the World,' as an alternative for our churches this year. We look forward to being able to enthusiastically promote VBS material from LifeWay in 2005."

LifeWay subsequently issued a statement quoting Mary Katharine Hunt, VBS division project manager, as stating, "We appreciate the gracious way in which the BCNE's messengers affirmed their support of LifeWay, expressed their concern about our VBS curriculum, and pledged to continue working with us in the days ahead. However, we are disappointed in the passing of the resolution and disagree in the strong possible way with its tenets."

"Churches nationwide, including many Asian churches, are telling us they will use our curriculum because of its strong biblical content, clear message of Jesus, and the respectful way in which it lifts up another culture," Hunt said. "For every concern raised by an Asian American, we are receiving dozens of positive responses from Asian Americans that tell us we are fulfilling our intent to lift up other cultures and share the message of hope for all people in Jesus Christ." □

Fountain City church introduces area to 'Operation Inasmuch'

KNOXVILLE — In October Central Baptist Church of Fountain City here conducted their second Operation Inasmuch, a one-day, hands-on missions blitz of their community. The effort involved 425 members of all ages — first graders through octogenarians — participated in 3 dozen projects.

The projects ranged from rapping hundreds of shoe boxes to be used in the church's Operation Christmas Child to building four wheelchair ramps, sewing dozens of walker bags, and adult bibs for nursing home patients to baking and delivering 54 casseroles to a Knoxville facility that houses families of hospital patients, and many, many more.

In a commissioning service at the church sanctuary before the teams disbursed throughout the community, Pastor David Crocker read from Matthew 25:40, the keystone verse for Operation Inasmuch. *Truly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these my brethren, you did it to me.*

"Today we will be visiting people who are lonely, providing meals for people who are hungry, building wheelchair ramps, and providing car repairs," Crocker said.

"All of these things ... are not just helping people in our community, but [in accordance with Matthew 25:40] are also ministering to Jesus."

Martha Johnson, coordinator of the event, responded to a reporter's question about Opera-

tion Inasmuch with this summary: "Operation Inasmuch is a large community project where many different teams come together to provide various kinds of services.

"This not only allows our church family to get to know each other better, but also extends our ministry into the community. Our mission at Central Baptist is to be a force for Jesus Christ in the world. Our own community is a great place to start."

Operation Inasmuch began at Snyder Memorial Baptist Church, Fayetteville, NC, in 1995 while Crocker served there as pastor.

According to the Operation Inasmuch web site, the ministry "mobilizes believers in a hands-on local church missions blitz in their community. It offers a proven model of local

ministry for any size congregation in any location.

Since the inception of Operation Inasmuch, it has spread to several hundred churches in North Carolina, and a smaller number in South Carolina, Virginia, and Georgia. Churches in Texas, Indiana, and Florida have plans underway to conduct their own Operation Inasmuch.

When Crocker moved from Snyder Memorial to Central,

ants His church and His teenagers to Connect with people 365 days a year!"

To make connect ser-friendly and to encourage students to bring students who aren't Christians, the events are held regionally so they are closer in distance to most Tennessee students than the YEC. The Connect events don't require registration, booking of a hotel room, or other planning, noted Shingleton. Connect events also do not require a fee. They are free.

He credited youth ministers of churches across the state and especially those in the 10 sites for making Connect possible. For instance, youth ministers helped Shingleton identify a site for each meeting although they didn't know how many to plan for.

Shingleton also credited Tony Nolan, youth evangelist of Woodstock, Ga., for presenting the message at eight of the 10 events. Nolan was the speaker at YEC 2003. Nolan is former college minister of First Baptist Church, Woodstock, Ga.

Shingleton said he tries to use the same speaker at all of the events. If the students liked the YEC speaker and know he is going to speak at Connect, they will be more likely to attend and bring a friend.

Shingleton also credited the Tennessee Baptist Convention for providing the events.

He hopes to offer Connect 2004 in the same 10 cities next year. The cities are Jackson, Cookeville, Clarksville, Columbia, Memphis, Martin/Union City, Knoxville, Cleveland, Gray, and Nashville. □

Nigerian Bible scam pulled on Lifeway ...

It sounds like a whodunit right from the pages of Nancy Drew, but unfortunately for Christian booksellers, the story is real — and potentially costly.

Melissa Mitchell, director of loss prevention at LifeWay Christian Resources of the Southern Baptist Convention, said the call Stewart received is an adaptation of a con known as the Nigerian scam because the thieves who have been caught all have been Nigerian nationals.

"Someone calls or e-mails a store and requests a large number of the same item, in this case Bibles, to be sent to an address somewhere in Nigeria," Mitchell explained. "They pay with a credit card, but the catch is the credit card they use is physically in the possession of the cardholder — it's the number that's been stolen."

By the time the merchant realizes the credit card purchase is fraudulent, the merchandise already has been shipped to an address that's impossible to track. Eventually the merchandise is sold through the Nigerian black market.

Mitchell began noticing early

last spring a pattern of "chargebacks" — credit card purchases that are sent back to the store when a customer denies ordering the items. The common thread was a delivery address in Nigeria.

She immediately shut down all overseas shipments through the bookstores and customers were asked to go through the online catalog store so Mitchell and the catalog store team could recognize anything suspicious.

After a few months of seeing no activity, the call to the Baltimore store alarmed Mitchell because the delivery address was U.S.-based.

"We notified CBA [the Christian Booksellers Association] immediately because we knew if they were getting us, they were also getting independent booksellers," Mitchell said. She quickly learned her hunch had been right and independents and other Christian retail chains also had been hit.

The biggest victims are the Christian booksellers in Nigeria, Mitchell noted.

Since August, LifeWay has prevented more than \$150,000 in fraudulent orders. Mitchell credits

the diligence of the store managers and the catalog store team.

"The store managers have been outstanding in their attentiveness into looking for potential fraud while staying polite and doing their job serving our customers," Mitchell said.

The latest technique to steal Bibles has been through the use of a relay operator, a system used typically by the hearing-impaired that allows a person to communicate through a telephone operator.

"The scam plays on the fact that our store employees are compassionate and want to help people," Mitchell said. "The sad part is that they're tying up relay operators for people who really need them." A block has now been placed on the stores receiving online relay calls. Customers can still use state-operated relay services.

Mitchell currently is working with the CBA Nigeria as well as the Secret Service to explore new ways to prevent these types of scams.

"To shut this down would probably be next to impossible, but we're going to keep reporting what we find," she said. □

Where have you gone Barney Fife? We need you back.

Television programming, in my opinion, has long since hit rock bottom. Unfortunately, the bottom has expanded.

I received an e-mail last week from the American Family Association which informed me that the Federal Communications Commission recently made a decision that basically allows the use of the "F" word on television or radio unless it is used in sexual connotations.

Most prime time television shows do explicit language as it is. We don't need for it to get any worse, but I suspect it will.

We can point fingers at the television networks and the FCC all day long, but the ultimate blame falls on those of us who watch television, Christians included. Like the frog in the kettle, we have been boiled alive as television programming slowly but surely inched toward the state it is in today.

We used to never have to worry about cursing or nudity on TV programs. Homosexuality, if it

was even mentioned, was taboo. Now, television shows promote the lifestyle as "normal." Cursing and nudity are common. Television programs that promote wholesome family values are the exceptions, not the rule.

The Parents Television Council, which monitors television programming, recently rated current television shows. They divided them into three categories — Green Light (shows that are family friendly, promoting responsible themes and traditional values); Yellow Light (shows that contain adult-oriented themes and dialogue that may be inappropriate for youngsters); and Red Light (shows that may include gratuitous sex, explicit dialogue, violent content, or obscene language, and is unsuitable for children).

There were 63 "Red Light" shows, 58 "Yellow Light" shows, and only 15 "Green Light" shows (see www.parentstv.org).

What are we coming to? I was talking with a friend recently and he told me of a friend of his who has three young children who finally took the television out of his home.

His friend told him, "I used to tell myself I would take the TV out when it got too bad." His friend finally realized he was being "boiled in the kettle" because he was becoming immune to the filth being produced. He finally

had to ask himself, "When is 'bad' bad enough?"

That is a question we may all have to consider at some point, especially families who have

young children.

Barney Fife, one of my all-time favorite television characters, no doubt would have said this about the current state of

television: "We have to nip it the bud." I am afraid, however, it is too late for "bud-nipping."

We must now be in the disage-control mode. □

NASHVILLE — RUN, don't walk, to the theater nearest you to see "The Gospel of John."

The New Testament Gospel of John has long been my favorite of the four gospels and it was so moving to experience the Word of God in this setting.

The Gospel of John movie is a spectacular, well-directed, well-acted, word-for-word version of John's Gospel starring Henry Ian Cusick, Daniel Kash, Stephen Russell, Richard Lintern, Scott Handy, and Christopher Plummer as the narrator (whose voice is fabulous).

In a review of the film, conservative commentator Carl Pearlston wrote, "This is a 3-hour film with no intermission, but, surprisingly, the time flies by as you are held in rapt attention by the cinematography, the scenery, the sets, the actors, the music, and, not least, the story. As I understand it,

the actors are largely from the Royal Shakespeare Company or the Royal National Theater, or the Canadian Stratford Festival. The sets and scenery and costumes recreated what seemed like what life must have been like over 2,000 years ago in ancient Judea. The musical score uses ancient instruments, even including a shofar, with reconstructions of ancient Hebraic biblical music and Aramaic chants. All in all, it was a first-rate cinematic production."

I can understand why there is no intermission — it would be so distracting. I cannot begin to describe what it was like for me and my husband to sit in a large theater and LISTEN and SEE only the Word of God for three hours. Also, of all the movies I have seen of this type, the actor portraying Jesus in this movie is the best, most comfortable, most convincing in the role.

In a world that has so much difficulty knowing or recognizing

"truth," it was refreshing and comforting to hear the old repeated declaration, "I tell you the truth" coming from the person who said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life."

As I sat captivated, I could not help but wonder what impact the Word of God had on the actors and everyone involved in the production. God promises that His Word will not return void. These people had to commit to memorize HUGE amounts of Scripture. That's without it changing his life.

It is my hope and prayer that this faithful presentation will be extremely well supported by people all across the nation. Dakota Baptists vote for status as convention

SIOUX FALLS, S.D. — Dakota Baptists celebrated their 50th anniversary in Southern Baptist life by unanimously approving a move to state convention status and a name change from the Dakota Southern Baptist Fellowship to the Dakota Baptist Convention.

The change to state convention status, which will provide Dakota representation on various SBC entities, will become effective Jan. 1, according to action taken by the 80 messengers present for the Oct. 23-24 annual meeting with the theme of "Dakotas: Ripe for the Harvest" at the Ramkota Motel here.

Southern Baptist work in the Dakotas began 50 years ago with two churches in North Dakota and First Baptist in Dickinson and First Baptist in Williston.

The fellowship's executive board, on the Friday after the convention, elected Jim Hamilton, pastor of First Baptist Church in Sellersburg, Ind., as their new executive director.

A budget of \$1,222,401 was

approved for the coming year, up 6.37 percent over the current year. □

Wingfield leaves journalism post

DALLAS — Mark Wingfield, managing editor of the *Baptist Standard*, and former editor of the *Western Recorder* in Ken-

tucky, is leaving denominational journalism after 21 years to join the staff at Wilshire Baptist Church in Dallas. He has been a frequent writer of stories which have appeared in the *Baptist and Reflector*.

At a called church conference Nov. 19, the Dallas congregation overwhelmingly voted to call Wingfield as associate pastor with specific responsibilities in communications, outreach,

and stewardship education. He will assume the new post Jan. 1.

Wingfield, 41, joined Wilshire Baptist five years ago, when he came to the *Baptist Standard*.

"I am passionate about our church and its vision, mission, and ministry," he said. "To be able to invest my full attention

on advancing the work of the church is invigorating and challenging."

Rather than retreating from action, Wingfield said he sees the move to a church staff as putting him at the heart of Baptist life.

"The reality is that the local church is the center of action for Baptist ministry," he said. □

Why I give

Focal Passage: II Corinthians 8:1-5, 7-15, 24

Mother Teresa of Calcutta, India, has become an international symbol of faith and real success. Once she had a dream to build an orphanage. She told her superiors; "I have three pennies and a dream from God to build an orphanage." Her superiors chided, "You cannot build an orphanage with three pennies. With three pennies you can't do anything." "I know," she said smiling, "but with God and three pennies I can do anything."

Grace and giving go hand in hand. Our lesson deals with giving to assist others. The good LORD has blessed us all, and we are more like Him when we give. Paul addressed an issue that occupied much of his interest during his missionary journeys. In II Corinthians, two chapters deal with the subject of the collection for the needy.

Paul begins by mentioning the churches in Macedonia. Despite a great trial of affliction and their own poverty, their abundance of joy resulted in an abundance of giving. Paul exhorted the Corinthians to give by the example of Jesus Christ. Paul reminded them of specific principles that should govern their giving. These principles involved willingness, ability, and equality.

Our background material reflects a great famine that struck in the land of Palestine. Many were deprived of their livelihood. There was a great drought, and many suffered because they did not have enough to eat. Paul heard of this and enlisted the aid of the churches to bring relief. This offering would be a marvelous

way of expressing oneness between Jew and Gentile. When the Macedonian churches heard the need, they responded tremendously. The Macedonian response is a fine example of a true way of giving.

Focus on the gift (vv. 1-5)

Paul took great joy in sharing how the churches in Macedonia gave to help this struggling church in Jerusalem. The Jerusalem church was persecuted by the Jewish community, they were disowned by their families, fired from their jobs, and felt pressure in every particular way. Those Macedonian churches were also in poverty, but when they heard of the need, they gave generously. Imagine when you were younger, your mother asked you to dry the dishes she had washed. What was your typical response? Probably groan, complain, and find some excuse. Then imagine, friends inviting you to play in an activity you really enjoy. What was your response? Immediate joy and delight. Why? Our hearts enjoy pleasure. The Macedonian churches, even through poverty, found great pleasure in helping those in need. Their spirit was one of spontaneous reaction. There was a need, and the Macedonian churches paid the sacrifice.

Focus on the giver (vv. 7-15)

Following this tremendous experience from the Macedonian churches, Paul laid down a challenge to the church in Corinth.

Paul instilled in the Corinthian church to give as a demonstration of their love to Jesus. This church could receive a blessing, knowing that God used them for kingdom purpose. Paul asked them to give from a willing heart. To those whom God has given, a greater gift can be received, but the

Responding to God's call

Focal Passage: Jonah 1:1-12, 17; 2:1-2

Good literature brings human experiences to bear on challenges to our lives. The Old Testament book of Jonah fits that bill. Jonah, the best known of the Minor Prophets, is an account of the spiritual tug-of-war between God and the humanism of Jonah from which comes a dramatic challenge to all God's people. The challenge is to be a consistent, faithful messenger of God's great grace.

Jonah requires imagination; imagination that turns the reader's faith loose to see God in action, perhaps in most impossible or improbable ways, except it is God who can do the impossible and improbable. Jonah, however, had very little imagination and not much commitment to God's purpose for his life. This combination of Almighty God and a half-hearted preacher makes for the startling story of the Prophet Jonah.

We are desensitized to this shocking story of a prophet of God because it is so familiar to us. Perhaps we see this biblical story of a day in the life of Jonah as one of the very good children's Sunday School, attention keeping, dramas. Children have the imagination to listen wide-eyed as a teacher tells the story of a man who was swallowed by a great

fish, often described as a whale. However, we adults need to grapple with the shocking fact that Jonah refused to obey God, loudly complained about the bother God had caused him, and then got angry because God actually extended grace to some people he didn't like. After all the Ninevehites were the worst of the worst of sinful people from the perspective of a good Jewish person. The 48 verses of the Book of Jonah shout loud and clear that obedience to God is better than sacrifice. Furthermore, these four dozen verses throw the spotlight on Romans 12:2, lighting up the words "the will of God is good, perfect, and acceptable."

Remember, the main character in this dramatic odyssey is God, not Jonah. Jonah, the great fish, Nineveh, the shade plant, and the fantastic revival are all there to flavor and tease our faith. This Bible book is about God, His nature, His purpose, and His call on the life and gifts of His children.

The fact is we can't answer the thorny "why" questions that bloom from a serious reading of Jonah. Why did Jonah refuse to obey God? Why was Jonah able to relax and go sound asleep in a ship's sleeping quarters knowing he had just denied a direct call from God Almighty? How did Jonah survive in the digestive system of a great fish? Why did Jonah get so very upset when the Ninevehites repented and turned to

value of the gift is the same.

Stewardship is not the church's plan for raising money. Stewardship is God's plan for developing people. Giving money will never be a substitute for giving ourselves. Giving is merely an expression of our commitment and gratitude to God.

Focus on the gain (v. 24)

Paul admonished the Corinthian church to give as physical evidence of their love for the church in Jerusalem. What greater proof of our love to Jesus than to give. Giving to those in need, regardless of our situation. The principle of our lesson is as broad as life itself. Unto whomsoever much is given, of him shall much be required. So if God has given you a great opportunity, seize it. If God has given you wealth, share it. One of the wonders of our faith is that every ordinary man and woman can achieve the highest in dedication and service to God. The heights of Christian devotion are not reserved for the clever, intelligent or even the wealthy. They are within the reach of the ordinary. We can become great by serving and giving. We can gain life by dying to self. We can become first by being last. We can give the greatest gift by making the greatest sacrifice. With giving to Jesus, He can multiply our talents, our tithes, and even our testimony.

God after a short seven word sermon? Why was such a short sermon effective when modern Christians hear powerful, hour long sermons, read volumes of Christian literature, and enjoy a feast of Christian television programming, only to witness a few saved and certainly not an entire city? It should be as easy as Jonah's experience, but it is not.

The application of Jonah's experience to our lives is nothing but straightforward. If we obey God we will experience His blessings. If we disobey God He does discipline us to bring our behavior back in tune with His purpose for each believer. To be out of the will of God is to invite discomfort and misery. His purpose can be seared over with selfishness, but not overturned.

The book of Jonah is something like looking through a two way mirror. On this side, we squint and try to figure out the questions raised, but God is on the other side with His own questions. God is asking us, "How big is your God?" "What kind of person are you?" "Will you respond to me?" "Will you be my witness in your city?" Finally, the question for today is "Will you respond to God's call to take His word to our generation?" □ — Creed is pastor of First Baptist Church, Ashland City.
