## Germantown congregation multiplies 'talents'

GERMANTOWN — Tommy Joyce Snyder had no idea of God would speak to them when they committed to a 40-day fast from July 28-Sept. 5.

We began the fast with the hope of seeking the Lord concerning our family and ministry," said Snyder, pastor of West Hill Baptist Church.

In the midst of the Snyders' prayer time, "God spoke to our hearts to give \$1,500 over and give our three-year commitment to our FOCUS campaign at West Hill," Snyder said.

He explained the campaign's goal is to alleviate the church's debt and to finish its Family Life Center.

The church, which has about 100 in attendance on Sunday mornings, has a debt of \$1.8 million, the pastor said.

This debt has been like an anvil around our neck."

The unique thing about God's direction was how He wanted us to give the money, the pastor explained.

"Instead of writing a check and give it to the church we felt led to follow the biblical example of Matthew 25:14-30 in the parable of the talents," Snyder said.

He noted that on Oct. 3 he preached on the parable and shared what the Lord had laid on his heart. Following his sermon he placed 202 envelopes on a table. He placed \$10 in 70 of the envelopes, \$7 in 70 of the envelopes, and \$5 in 62 of the envelopes.

"I encouraged the people to come to the altar and pick up an envelope and put the money to work," Snyder said.

In the envelope Snyder enclosed a list of suggestions on how they could put the money to work individually or by joining together with other families.

The members followed their pastor's admonition and put the money to work in a grand way.

Eighteen members pooled their resources of \$133 to have a "pancake dinner" at the church in mid-October. After expenses, the dinner netted more than \$300.

Two other members, Hulon and Janice White, received \$17

in their two envelopes. The couple, who own a hot air balloon, decided to discount their rides and sell "gift certificates" to the public.

One member took his money, bought some Chlorox and pressure washed a neighbor's house as an act of kindness, the pastor reported. "When he got home from church on Sunday night, the man had a thank you note with a \$100 bill attached."

Even the children of the church got caught up in the excitement.

Teresa Moore chose to work with her two grandchildren (Haley and Hunter) and make it a "fun experience" for the three of them. "Haley and Hunter wanted to sell something, so we came up with Pixie Sticks, a flavored powder sugar candy that comes in long plastic straws," Moore said.

The family team found where

they could buy three Pixie Sticks for a dollar and sold them for a dollar each, she explained.

After selling the Pixie Sticks,

they made hair scrunchies (pony tail bands) out of some left over yarn and sold them to family and friends for a dollar each.

Moore noted Haley turned her \$5 into \$42 while Hunter turned his \$5 into \$15.

"This was a fun and rewarding way to raise money for the Lord and to work together as a family," the grandmother said.

On Nov. 7 church members brought in the money they earned from their "talents."

On that day the church received more than \$15,700 from the Snyder's initial investment of \$1,500.

"I'll admit that at first I was a little nervous that this might not work," the pastor said.

"But I just put my trust in God and it has turned out beautifully. This is the most amazing thing I have ever seen," Snyder said. □

## For people of India, Rebekah Naylor defines 'Christian'

BANGALORE, India — Ask

people around Bangalore, India, what a Christian looks like and many would describe Dr. Rebekah Naylor, the Southern

Baptist missionary surgeon who has labored at Bangalore Baptist Hospital for the past 30 years.

Some have seen Dr. Naylor,

the cool, precise, professional medical doctor who has performed countless surgeries and other medical procedures. She has saved lives, delivered babies, and relieved suffering for thousands of people over the years.

But others know her through her soft-spoken but persistent sharing of the gospel, her training and encouragement of Indian Baptists in how to witness and plant churches. In this role she has helped bring eternal life to thousands of people and relieved the spiritual suffering known by many here who fear Hinduism's vengeful gods.

For Naylor, the missionary calling and the drive to become physician were one calling. "I experienced a call to missions specifically when I was 13 years old," she says. "God spoke to me very clearly about personal involvement in foreign missions ser-

vice," she says. That calling combined with her interest in medicine.

"My ambition in medicine was basically to use it as an avenue to share my faith in Jesus Christ," she says, summing up in her typically precise way a vision for her life she pursued with steadfast devotion over

the following decades. Already she had plowed new ground; few women became physicians, much less surgeons, in the 1960s.

By the time she arrived in India as newly-appointed missionary in 1974, she had managed to get through university, medical school, and related training. From a comfortable home in Fort Worth, Texas, the medical and missionary newbie found herself stepping through India's poor who slept on sidewalks for want of homes.

**Bare field beginning**

She arrived to Bangalore Baptist Hospital when it had been open for just six months.

## Gibson takes 'high road'

NASHVILLE — Oscar marketing has become a multi-million-dollar task with major stu-

dios and production companies spending lavishly on advertising, parties, and publicity campaigns in order to sway members of the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences to give their film a coveted award. But as he did with the release of "The Passion of the Christ," Mel Gibson is opting for a different promotion method, according to Reuters.

Gibson and his Icon Productions partner Bruce Davey have decided not to spend money on television, radio, or print ads promoting The Passion but plan to distribute thousands of DVD copies of the film to members of the academy and to present promotional screenings, much like the screenings they employed before the film's release.

"This film should be judged on artistic merit, not on who spends more money for advertising," Davey said in a statement, according to Reuters. □

## Yarnell declines LC presidency

PINEVILLE, La. — Malcolm Yarnell announced Nov. 23 that he will not become president of Louisiana College but instead will return to his position at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary.

Yarnell was elected as presi-

dent of Louisiana College in September and was slated to take the helm in January. But in an e-mail to the school, Yarnell said that he and the board of trustees had failed to reach a contract agreement.

The school has 1,100 students. The next president will replace Rory Lee, who announced his resignation March 15.

"After accepting the presidency at Louisiana College, governance issues which would significantly impact my ability to lead the school were fully disclosed during the subsequent negotiations over the contract which the board of trustees desired, Yarnell wrote. "Although the trustee chairman and the Executive Committee and I have sought in good faith to resolve these issues to our mutual satisfaction, we have been unable to arrive at a meeting of the minds.

"As a result, I have withdrawn my name from consideration as president."

Bill Hudson, chairman of the Louisiana College board of trustees, said the presidential search committee will begin again looking for a president.

"We deeply regret that Dr. Yarnell has chosen to decline the office of president, and the Board wishes him and his family well as they continue to serve our Lord and denomination." □

## IMB trustees celebrate overseas stats; give to LMCO

OKLAHOMA CITY — The gospel began making inroads this past year among 131 people groups that previously had little or no access to the Good News of salvation in Jesus Christ, International Mission Board trustees were told during a Nov. 16-17 meeting here.

The trustees also heard a report of more than 600,000 overseas baptisms, adopted a \$283.1 million budget for 2005, and set an example for all Southern Baptists by personally pledging \$88,396 to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions.

Southern Baptist missionaries and their overseas Baptist partners engaged 163 people groups for the first time during 2003, said Gordon Fort, the board's vice president for overseas operations. Of those, 131 unreached groups — representing 152 million souls — had virtually no access to the good news of salvation in Jesus Christ.

International Mission Board workers also reported that 607,132 believers were baptized, a net increase of 97,973 (19.2 percent). Just last year the number of baptisms passed 500,000 for the first time.

The total number of congregations worldwide reached 99,495, a net increase of 15,480 (18.4 percent) over the previous year. That growth was fed by 21,028 new Baptist congregations, an increase of 4,428 (26.7 percent). Of those new churches, 16,891 were produced by church-planting movements among approximately 50 people groups.

In other categories of the annual report:

(1) Total outreach groups grew to 50,297, a net increase of 3,920 (8.5 percent) over the previous year. That increase was made possible by 9,216 new outreach groups, although that number was down 413 (4.3 percent) from the previous year;

(2) Overseas church membership climbed

another 7.2 percent (498,886) to a total of 7,451,242;

(3) Bible teaching enrollment increased by 234,318 (6.3 percent) to 3,942,886;

(4) New believers in discipleship training reached 490,046, an increase of 66,760 (15.8 percent). More than 80 percent of the people baptized this past year were enrolled in discipleship training;

(5) Church members in discipleship training grew by 156,208 (17.7 percent) to 1,037,985;

(6) Non-residential leadership training enrollment jumped 29 percent (24,809) to 110,356;

(7) Residential leadership training recorded an increase of 909 (4.1 percent) to 22,959;

(8) International missionaries fielded by Baptist partners rose 22.6 percent (351) to a total of 1,901;

(9) Baptist partner home missionaries totaled 3,920, an increase of 1,595 (68.6 percent). The large increase in this category was partly the result of better application of the correct definition of "home missionary" during the collection of data.

"These numbers provide a snapshot of the amazing way God is moving lost people all over the world to faith in Jesus Christ," Fort said. "The number of new churches illustrates the serious efforts of our missionaries and Baptist partners to conserve these new believers and extend the kingdom like glowing candles in the midst of vast spiritual darkness.

"The evangelical world is aware as never before concerning the number of people groups and significant population segments that remain without a Christian witness," he added. "This gap in global witness gives us a growing sense of urgency. While waiting for a witness, the eternal destiny of lost men and women hangs in the balance.

"We want to sound a trumpet call to Southern Baptists to assemble all the resources necessary to complete the task in

this generation. It is my conviction that Southern Baptists are a mission people. They will rise to the incredible global opportunities that God has laid before us."

The trustees also adopted a 2005 budget of \$283.1 million that represented an increase of \$7.1 million over the total budget for 2004. The revenue plan anticipates receiving \$99.6 million from Southern Baptists' Cooperative Program giving channels and \$150 million from the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering.

The spending plan allocates \$243.8 million to overseas operations, an increase of more than \$20.3 million (9.1 percent) over 2004. The \$37.7 million allocated to state side administration and promotion represents an increase of \$2.2 million over 2004 but amounts to a decrease as a percentage of the total budget (13.7 percent to 13.3 percent).

As Southern Baptists prepare to give their 2004 Lottie Moon Christmas Offering for International Missions, the trustees set an example by making their personal pledges to the campaign.

With 69 of the 85 trustees reporting, the pledges totaled \$88,396, an average of \$1,281 per trustee. When all trustees have returned their pledges, the total is expected to well surpass the \$100,214 they pledged in 2003.

Trustee Bo Graves of Haysville, Kan., also presented a \$145,000 check for the offering on behalf of the Heart of Kansas Baptist Association in Wichita. The check represented proceeds from a sale of property that the churches in the association wanted to contribute to overseas missions.

The national goal for this year's Lottie Moon Christmas Offering is \$150 million — every penny of which will be used to send missionaries and support their ministries. The International Mission Board relies on the Lottie Moon offering for 51 percent of its annual income. □

# Tennessean founds 'Sweet Sleep' to help Moldovan orphans

NASHVILLE — Jennifer Gash wondered if God had sent her halfway around the world here on a mission trip with a Nashville-based Christian Emergency Relief, International, just to break her heart in the summer of 2003.

Feeling from the stench of the washed children and their matted and soiled mattresses lying over the empty, young children pleading for affection, and angered by the vast needs in a government orphanage in Chisinau, Moldova, she fell to sleep each night asking God what He wanted her to do. And she woke up each morning making the same plea.

Every day she sat on the beds with the children, telling them their stories, sharing her hugs and smiles. One afternoon, "I felt another piece of my heart break when I saw a boy named Mihai put a piece of pizza we had bought him under his pillow," she remembers. "I finally began to hear and understand the voice of my calling in Moldova — really in the world."

Thus was the idea of Sweet Sleep ([www.sweetsleep.org](http://www.sweetsleep.org)), a grass-roots effort to provide "clean, warm beds to sleep in and feel loved and protected in," first, the orphans of Moldova and eventually "for all orphans in the world." The project partners with Christian Emergency Relief, International (CERI), the overseas outreach of Baptist Child & Family Services (<http://bcfs.net>), a BGCT agency. But first some background. It isn't just any old and torn mattress and dirty pillow Mihai hid his pizza between. In Moldovan orphanages, the beds

are WWII remnants, the exhausted metal warped and the sagging bed springs, sometimes held together by rope, sagging beneath the weight of the two children who usually share it. Many beds don't have a mattress and the children use 15-year-old blankets to protect them from the harshness of the springs.

The two-inch thick mattresses are up to 47 years old and soiled from the hundreds of children who have slept on them — children, many of whom are bed wetters, who are only allowed to bathe once a week. When the weather allows the mattresses are hung outside to dry, but never washed. There are no sheets or pillow cases.

That night as the mission team, led by Steve Davis, executive director of CERI, had its devotional, a woman prayed that God would give the children "sweet sleep." Gash began to cry — but this time not in frustration and pain but because she felt the clear answer to her prayers. That night, in her private devotions, God brought the phrase back to her, affirming that He wanted Jen to play a part in providing safe, clean places for His children in Moldova to sleep.

Soon after returning to Nashville, Gash, a member of Brentwood Baptist Church, Brentwood, founded Sweet Sleep and began working to answer God's call. Her first day home someone gave her a check for \$30. Two women in her office said their husbands wanted to go to Moldova next trip but weren't sure there would be anything they could do. One was a carpenter, the other a very experienced handyman. With encouragement like that Gash spread the word: Sweet Sleep wanted to

provide 700 beds at a cost of \$100 each. She is about halfway to her initial goal of \$70,000 to buy the needed beds.

Initially she tried to set up contracts with Moldovan companies to produce the beds. "But God had bigger plans," she says. CERI expanded the partnership with Sweet Sleep to set up a vocational training program so that some of the older boys could be trained in carpentry while building the beds and be mentored by Moldovan Christians at the same time. CERI provides the tools and Sweet Sleep provides the materials, mattresses, mattress covers, blankets, and pillows.

This past August she returned to Moldova. And despite her own misgivings about being able to put together a team to start the project ("I can't even get anybody to go to Gatlinburg to look at the leaves in Fall," she claims), 19 people had signed up. And not just from Tennessee — people she had never met, recruited through CERI or through the Sweet Sleep web site went to the tiny Eastern European country from Kansas City and San Antonio — and from Rome, Italy and Burma. All left vowing to return as soon as possible.

As you might imagine this is about more than a vastly improved place to sleep.

"Most of us take for granted the refuge and comfort we feel when we are safe in our own bed," Gash points out. "Yet for most of these children a bed is the closest thing they have to a hug. It is when they are their most vulnerable and when they are the most alone with their thoughts."

"God let me sense the need to make certain these children understand they are loved. I do not

believe most of them know how beautiful and cared about and loved they are. They have never considered the love of a heavenly Father who will always provide, always love, always be there for them.

"A safe, clean bed is a reminder of this amazing truth for those children who have accepted Christ as Savior (as 12 did from her first group of 16 she worked with) and who will grow in their faith as well as for those who will come to know Jesus later as CERI continues to work in Moldova."

The children need all the reminders of God's love they can get.

Moldova, the size of the state of Maryland, has 27 government orphanages. The one in Chisinau where Jen worked has 700 residents. But the facility is poorly heated in the bitterly cold winters. Food is limited and children get two shirts, one pair of pants, and one pair of socks each year and one pair of shoes every other year. No winter hats, coats, or gloves are provided.

At age 18 they are discharged

with no provision for assistance or a job. Ten percent of those discharged commit suicide within a year. Of the boys, 70 percent will wind up in jail or join a gang or the Mafia. Of the girls 70 percent are reportedly sold or forced into prostitution — half of them by their own family, friends, or acquaintances.

During this holiday season Gash cleared her calendar so she could return to Moldova for seven weeks. She left Nov. 29.

"Moldova and Sweet Sleep is pretty much all God has been doing in my life for the past year and a half."

"I have many prayers for these children and for the work God is doing and will continue to do through all of the hands and feet He has activated for Moldova. I have prayers for the girls to learn how to sew the bedding, giving them the same opportunities and hope as the bed building gives the boys. As the New Testament says, "nothing is impossible." □ — Bird is director of communications for Baptist Child & Family Services in San Antonio, Texas.

## Stone association moves to assist new church

## Union program supplies backpacks to needy children

JACKSON — When 19 children from Youth Village gathered for their weekly meeting recently, they knew they were waiting for something. But they didn't know what.

Talking with parents or foster parents and playing restlessly with the scattered balloons, the children, ages 8-18, were about to be treated to a surprise by some students from Union University.

After a dinner of hot dogs, hamburgers, and holiday-themed cookies, each child received a backpack filled with toiletries, school supplies, and other goodies.

"We chose Youth Village because we were told that the young men and women were having to go from foster home to foster home using just a black garbage bag for their belongings," said Union student Kris Phifer, co-chair for the event. "We're trying to help them out a little. We hope to make a difference in

their lives and maybe someday they can give back to the community."

The backpacks were a gift from Union's Bachelor of Science in Organizational Leadership program. The Nov. 15 event was part of the capstone class for the 10 students of Cohort 27. In the short five-

week course the students planned and organized the charity event and called around to various businesses to solicit donations.

"Pretty much everything you see here is donated," Phifer said. In addition to the room, food, and supplies, every pack also contained a Bible, compliments of Woodville Baptist Church in Ripley. The students and their instructor, Guy DeLoach, paid for 29 backpacks

out of their own pockets.

During DeLoach's short speech he thanked the children for their courage, spirit of hope, and potential, tossing in a few magic tricks to liven things up.

"Each of you is a unique miracle, a special gift," DeLoach said.

Phifer said the program needs more foster parents.

"We want to encourage adults who can find it in their heart to foster a child in their home," Phifer said.

"This is not just a project. It is something all of us have been thankful to do for everyone." □

The building sat then on a bare, 15-acre site outside the city. Anxious though she was, the Indian staff and the 12 patients present welcomed the American warmly.

"The foreign doctors were supposed to know something more than others, so they came hoping that they would find excellent care. They did find excellent care, but they also found people who really cared about them," she says.

As years passed the city grew out to surround the hospital compound and the hospital also grew, from 80 beds to 160. The hospital began to help educate doctors and train Indians to become X-ray and lab technicians.

Today the hospital delivers 1,500 babies a year (average of about four a day), treats more than 100,000 patients a year, and impacts five times that many for the gospel.

Naylor served in several key roles at the hospital, including administrator, coming to be accepted more as family than foreign staffer. She also became honorary "auntie" to hundreds and hundreds of Indian young people and children.

From its inception the hospital maintained pastoral ministry and outreach. "Its reason to exist was to tell people about Jesus Christ," Naylor says.

### Many churches

Today, Indian Baptists point to a map of Bangalore that is dotted with Baptist churches, most the result of the hospital's outreach. When workers went to one community a couple of miles from the hospital years ago, there were no Christians and no churches. Within a year there were 20 baptized believers. Today, Trinity Baptist Church is a thriving congregation that has started 18 other churches and is working in many other communities to start more.

When a man died at Baptist Hospital some years ago, the staff presented the man's wife and family a Bible. Though they grieved, they began reading this strange book they had never seen before.

It was only years later that the hospital staff learned the family had turned to Christ and that all the children had become ministers.

Naylor has a treasury of such stories.

### A new vision

Despite a career most missionaries and physicians would envy, in recent years Naylor has realized that even the many churches started through the hospital's ministry will never be enough to reach all of India. In Karnataka state alone, 52 million people represent 300 language/cultural groups. Mission-

aries have learned that when a group begins to respond to the gospel and start new churches, the growth stays within the group and only rarely crosses into another.

To reach the lost people in this one state, Christians must deliver the gospel in 300 different languages and in 33,000 villages, towns, and cities linked by few roads.

"I think this gives you just a small picture of one part of India as to how difficult it is and challenging it is to access all these

different communities and people groups and languages and to communicate effectively," Naylor says.

Beyond the people group divisions, she says, India's social castes create still more barriers. "It is difficult for a person of one caste to reach into another, but I firmly believe that this can happen," she says.

Her experience has made Naylor into a cheerleader for the whole nation and its peoples. "When we think of all of India, our vision is that we would like

to see at least 1,000 workers come into India," she says. Southern Baptist workers have identified 50 mega cities (with populations over 1 million) and 1,100 unreached people groups in South Asia, most in India.

"In order to engage them with the gospel, I think it's evident that many, many, many workers are needed," she pleads.

India's millions are open to the gospel, Naylor insists, as they constitute an open door.

"They are waiting to hear. They are ready to respond." □


Because you gave so unselfishly, the Light of the World is penetrating more darkness than ever

## S.C. Baptists adopt South Asia partnership

COLUMBIA, S.C. — In quiet but efficient fashion, messengers to the 184th annual session of the South Carolina Baptist Convention adopted a 2005 budget

that does not increase from this year, elected a veteran pastor as president, and launched the convention's most ambitious international missions partnership ever.

The Nov. 16-17 meeting in the state's capital of Columbia drew 1,117 messengers.

Jerry White, pastor of River-

side Baptist Church in Greer, was elected president by acclamation.

Messengers approved a budget of \$32 million. Sixty percent of the budget is earmarked for ministry within South Carolina, with 40 percent sent to the Southern Baptist Convention.

Beginning in 2005, the convention's three-year assignment

will be South Asia, which includes Bhutan, Nepal, India, Lanka, Bangladesh, the Maldives, and Pakistan. □

## Confess Jesus, God's Son

## Focal Passage: John 1:19-34

The Christmas season requires gift-giving decisions. "What do we get Mother and Dad and the kids this year?" What do they really need? Shouldn't we as Christians give them a gift that "keeps on giving?" Couldn't we share the good news of Jesus and what He does in our lives each day? We can confess His superiority, His redemptive work, and His deity.

John the Baptist publicly confessed our Lord before his world. John Phillips said of the prophet, "From out of the wilderness had come striding a spiritual giant of a man. His dress, diet, deportment, and demands made his hearers think he was Elijah. His voice thundered until the windows of conscience rattled everyone's souls." The Jews were drawn to his compelling message.

Our world today views the church through eyes of uneasiness, yet with an interest it cannot ignore. I pray our declarations about Jesus will be as compelling to this present generation of the lost and dying. The person of Christmas changes lives and gives purpose, joy, and hope at the holidays, and even beyond.

First, we can share how superior Jesus is, exceeding all the world has to offer (vv. 19-28). After John the Baptist's messianic message, multitudes came, heard, and were bap-

tized to show repentance. The Pharisees questioned why Jews needed baptizing. After all, weren't the Jews, who were descendants of Abraham, already in the kingdom? Some fine, moral people will encircle Christmas trees singing carols of hope, thinking they are a part of the kingdom because they go to church. They are blind to the reality that they need a personal relationship with Jesus as their Savior. John addressed their blindness when he said, *Someone stands among you, but you don't know (Him)* (v. 26). Apparently, Jesus was standing in the crowd listening to what John was saying. This Christmas, and every day of the year, Jesus will be all around us, but will we see Him? Our best prospect of seeing Him — and showing Him to others — will happen through our shared testimonies of what He means to us in our lives.

Secondly, we can share the saving power of His redemptive work (vv. 29-31). John had baptized Jesus and now, nearly six weeks later, he was seeing Him again near Passover, when deliverance from past bondage would be celebrated with sacrificial lambs. Perhaps lambs were bleating in a nearby pasture as John proclaimed that Jesus is not just any lamb, but *the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world* (v. 29). John's reference to man's sin problem was not only for Jews; it was for the whole world. That's good news! He is your deliv-

erer from all of your sin!

Then, thirdly, we need to tell others of His deity (vv. 32-34). As John baptized Jesus, he looked for a sign that would affirm Jesus as the Messiah. When Jesus came out of the water and the dove descended upon Him, John knew Jesus was the Lamb of God. Symbolically, the dove had not found a place worthy enough, pure enough, or clean enough to rest since the judgment flood of Genesis 8.

The question of the Old Testament was, *Where is the lamb?* (Genesis 22:7). Abraham's answer to his son Isaac was breathtaking, *God will provide a lamb.* And now John heralds to the world in Christmas song, "He is here! See Him! Come to know Him!"

As people celebrate the Christmas season many will be searching for a deliverer who will meet all their wants. Jesus came to give us what we need. We should share our personal profession of Jesus, declaring His superiority, redemptive work, and deity. □ — Massey is pastor, First Baptist Church, Paris.

## Relating to others

## Focal Passage: Luke 14:1-35

We live in a world that has many people. How do we relate to these persons? Jesus is very concerned about how we as Christians treat others and relate to others.

In this passage we are studying today Jesus was invited to a home of a leading Pharisee but his hospitality toward Jesus was a sham. Many other Pharisees are also present. They planned to use this occasion to trap Jesus in saying something wrong or doing something they felt was wrong. Jesus knew their agenda had to do with hostility toward Him rather than hospitality.

The Pharisees brought a sick man into the group and he stood in front of Jesus. The Pharisees believed that healing on the sabbath was a violation of their sabbath regulations. Jesus takes the sick man and heals him. Jesus then turns to the Pharisees and asks, *Which of you whose son or ox falls into a well will not immediately pull him out on the sabbath day* (v. 5). The Pharisees had no answer for Jesus. Jesus follows His law of love which was superior to the Pharisees' law of religion.

After relating to the sick man by healing him, Jesus noticed that many of the Pharisees are scrambling for the best seats at the table. These seats represent a position of honor, importance, and prestige. It was the responsibility of the host to decide who sits in certain seats.

Only ill-mannered guests selected their own places trying to show how important they were. In the community where I grew up this type of person was called a "more better" person. They seemed to think they were "more better" than anyone else. Jesus warns those who are seeking prestige and honor by saying, *For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted*, (v. 11).

I am afraid that too many church members have failed to take this lesson seriously.

Ask yourself, "How do you relate to others?" As we evaluate ourselves we need to grow in humility. Jesus never wants His people to claim superiority over others. Our lives, our thoughts, and our actions need to consistently demonstrate humility. Jesus asks His followers to desire humble places of service as a matter of life style. Instead of being self-centered we should eagerly desire to meet the needs of others, just like Jesus did.

An attitude of humility is a mark of greatness. Jesus honors the individual who does not seek preference over others. We must not engage in any activity that exalts us at the expense of others. God humbles the proud and exalts the humble. How we relate to others is decisive in determining our position before God.

Jesus then turns to the host and exhorts him to cease the practice of habitually inviting to his feast only those who were on his social level. Jesus condemns self-serving hospitality as well as a closed circle in society based on class discrimination.

Jesus then says, *But when thou makest a feast, call the poor, the maimed, the lame and the blind; and thou shall be blessed*, (v. 13). Jesus is telling His host that he should invite poor persons, maimed persons, lame persons, and blind persons. Such a statement in Jesus' day would be religious dynamite. For many today it would also be religious dynamite. These persons were both religious and social outcasts and were classified as sinners.

If Jesus were making a list today, he would probably name those whom many may be prejudiced against — the poor, the needy, the blacks, the uneducated, the unfortunate, other races, etc.

As a Christian how do you relate to others? We must care for others and love them as Jesus loved them. You may need to pray for forgiveness for not caring and loving others. Reach out in love to someone today. Jesus expects His children to do it. □ — Porter is a retired employee of LifeWay Christian Resources and former SBC registration secretary. 
